Building Industry Technician Training Council Order 1969

IN PURSUANCE to the Technicians Training Act 1967, His
Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the
advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes
the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Building Industry Tech-
nician Training Council Order 1969.

2. In this order:

"the building industry" means the industry of workers
employed substantially in connection with carpentry
and joinery and in site work and work related to the
activities of junior management by employers engaged
in building construction and civil engineering.

3. There is hereby established a technician training council
in respect of the building industry.

4. The Schedule to this order is a copy of the principal
training scheme formulated in respect of building cadets
engaged in the building industry.

5. (i) Every person other than a worker who commits a
breach of any provision of the training scheme, a copy of which
is annexed as the Schedule to this order, shall be liable to a
penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars.

(ii) Every worker who commits a breach of any provision
of the said training scheme shall be liable to a penalty not
exceeding fifty dollars.

SCHEDULE

PRINCIPAL TRAINING SCHEME FOR BUILDING CADETS

1. Preamble

1.1 The object of the training scheme is to enable technician
trainees, who will be known as building cadets, to become
sufficiently well acquainted with all normal techniques used
in the industry to be able to appreciate the work of each
trade. They are also to be introduced to the problems of
control of building operations on the site and in the office
and all of the preliminary commercial and technical planning
related thereto.

1.2 The building cadet in his training should be given as
varied a practical experience as possible in all aspects of the
building industry covered by his academic studies.

1.3 The building cadet should acquire sufficient theoretical
and practical knowledge to relieve professional staff of much
supervisory work and to be able to oversee the work of skilled
tradesmen, as a means of ensuring greater efficiency and
productivity in the industry at both site and administration
levels.

2. Entry to the Training Scheme

2.1 While the road to technician status must always remain
open to tradesmen and trade apprentices who have proved
their ability to cope with the course of study, technician
trainees will for the most part be direct entrants to the in-
dustry.

2.2 In the event of a building cadet finding the course of
studies beyond his capabilities he should, subject to the
approval of the New Zealand Carpentry and Joinery
Apprenticeship Committee, be entitled to apply for an
apprenticeship in carpentry with an appropriate credit of time.

3. Industry to Which the Training Applies

3.1 Building cadets shall be trained for the building, con-
struction, and civil engineering industry.

4. Application of Training Scheme and Conditions of
Employment

4.1 The provisions of the training scheme and conditions
of employment shall apply to all employers of building cadets
throughout New Zealand (whether bound by an award or
agreement relating to the industry or not), and to all Build-
ing cadets employed by such employers in such industry, and
to all contracts of building cadetship (including those in
force at the time of the establishment of the Building Tech-
nicians Training Council).

5. Interpretation

5.1 The interpretations as provided for in section 2 of the
Technicians Training Act 1967 shall apply.

6. General

6.1 The applicants for the establishment of the Building
Technicians Training Council are conscious that it is necessary
for employers to be able to give the necessary practical
training envisaged in the training scheme. It is therefore
recommended that when the Council is considering any appli-
cation to enter into a contract, matters such as the size of
the employer's operations, the number of tradesmen employed,
and the variety and scope of the practical training which can
be given, should be considered.

PRINCIPAL TRAINING SCHEME FOR BUILDING CADETS

A.1 Introduction

A.1.1 The building cadet in his training should be given as varied a practical experience as possible in all aspects of the building industry covered by his academic studies.

A.1.2 The academic studies to be undertaken by the building cadet will lead to the examinations for the New Zealand Certificate in Building, as prescribed by the Technicians Certification Authority of New Zealand.

A.1.3 Provided that by mutual consent of the parties to a contract of building cadetship, and subject to the approval of the Council and to the requirements of the Technicians Certification Authority of New Zealand, the contract may be varied to permit a building cadet who has passed the third-year examinations for the New Zealand Certificate in Building, to change to the course for the New Zealand Certificate in Draughting (Architectural) or the New Zealand Certificate in Quantity Surveying during the term of his contract.

A.2 Academic Instruction

A.2.1 The New Zealand Certificate in Building may be taken at technical institutes, including the Technical Correspondence Institute, or in other teaching institutions approved for the purpose by the Technicians Certification Authority of New Zealand and listed in its handbook.

A.3 Practical Training

A.3.1 The practical training of building cadets, which is to be related to the syllabus of the New Zealand Certificate in Building, must include the following:

- Fundamental trade knowledge and the use of tools;
- Office administration;
- Contracts, including the legal aspects, conditions of contract, tender procedure, contract analysis, and contract administration;
- Job costing and estimating;
- Schedules of quantities;
- Site administration, including control of labour and industrial relations and control of sub-contractors;
- Legal aspects of building, including workers' compensation, the Construction Regulations, etc.;
- Building accounting procedure;
- Ordering, supply, and control of materials;
- Accident prevention;
- Public relations, including suppliers, clients, and the professions;
- Knowledge of machinery and equipment used in the building industry; and
- Control of labour and industrial relations.

A.4 Transfer to Supplement Training

A.4.1 Where the Council considers it necessary to enable a building cadet to acquire proper practical training, it may, on the application of any party to the contract, approve the transfer of the cadet for a limited period to another employer in order to supplement the training of the building cadet.

A.5 Minimum Age

A.5.1 The minimum age at which a person may enter into a building cadetship shall be 16 years.

A.6 Prerequisite Education

A.6.1 It shall be necessary for a person desiring to become a building cadet to produce satisfactory evidence that he has obtained a pass in English and mathematics at School Certificate level, or to produce evidence to the Technicians Certification Authority of New Zealand of his eligibility for enrolment as a student.

A.7 Contracts to be Registered

A.7.1 All contracts and any alterations or variations thereto entered into between an employer and a building cadet shall be approved by the Council.

A.7.2 Copies of all contracts and any alterations or variations thereto approved by the Council shall be lodged with the Secretary of the Council.

A.7.3 Before registration the Council shall satisfy itself that the document submitted is in accordance with the Act, this scheme, and any determination of conditions of employment in the industry.

A.7.4 Contracts shall be in the form annexed hereto as Appendix I.

A.8 Term of Cadetship

A.8.1 The term of cadetship shall be for 5 years from the date of commencing employment as a building cadet.

A.9 Period of Probation

A.9.1 The period of probation shall be 6 months from the date of commencing employment as a building cadet.

A.9.2 The employer shall be responsible for notifying the Council if the contract of cadetship is terminated by either party during the probationary period.

A.10 Termination of Contract

A.10.1 Upon completion of the probationary period, contract of building cadetship shall be terminated during its term only with the consent of the Council, and providing the Council is satisfied that such termination is in the best interests of both parties to the contract.

A.10.2 Where the employer of any building cadet for any reason ceases to be engaged in the industry and the building cadet is thereby deprived of the employment he was otherwise entitled to under his contract of building cadetship, the Council may order payment to the cadet of an amount up to but not exceeding 3 months wages in respect of any period intervening between the time when the building cadet was deprived of his employment and the time when he obtains other employment as a building cadet.

A.10.3 A contract of building cadetship may be terminated by mutual consent at any time during its currency.

A.11 Suspension and Discharge

A.11.1 Where a building cadet so misconducts himself as to prove himself so incapable that if he were an employer other than a building cadet it would be reasonable for him to employ to discharge him, the employer may immediately suspend him and apply to the Council for leave to discharge him.

A.11.2 Every such application shall be made to the Council within five working days after the building cadet is suspended, and, subject to the decision of Council, the employer may withhold any wages accruing due to the building cadet during the period of suspension.

A.11.3 The Council shall consider the application, after giving the employer, the building cadet, and his parent or guardian (if any) an opportunity to be heard, and may grant or refuse leave to discharge the building cadet.

A.11.4 Where leave is granted the employer to discharge the cadet, such discharge shall be as from the date of his suspension and the contract of building cadetship shall be deemed to be cancelled.

A.11.5 Where leave to discharge the building cadet is refused by the Council, the Council may make such order as it thinks fit with respect to payment of wages to the building cadet during the period of his suspension and if no such order is made the employer shall pay to the building cadet all wages that would have been payable to him had he not been suspended.

A.12 Certificate of Service

A.12.1 Upon the termination of the contract for any reason including its due completion, the employer shall issue a certificate of service to the cadet. The certificate shall be in a form approved by the Council, and there may be different kinds of forms of certificate according to the circumstances under which the contract is terminated.

A.13 Classes of Building Cadets

A.13.1.1 Building Cadets who are full-time students defined herein shall be known as "Class A building cadet" for the purpose of computing wages.

A.13.1.2 Building cadets who are part-time students defined herein shall be known as "Class B building cadet" for the purpose of computing wages.

A.13.2.1 A full-time student is a building cadet who during the first and/or second year of his contract attends a technical institute full time during normal school hours and who is otherwise employed by his employer during normal school holidays; and who during the third and fourth year of his contract is employed full time by the employer, subject to release for a minimum of 6 hours per week during normal working hours to attend technical classes and/or complete assignments provided by a Technical Correspondence Institute course.

During the fifth year of his contract the building cadet will be employed full time by the employer. During the fourth and fifth year of his contract a building cadet who has completed his New Zealand Certificate in his third year will be employed full time by the employer.

A.13.2.2 A part-time student is a building cadet who during the term of his contract is employed full time by the employer, subject to release for a minimum of 6 hours per week during normal working hours to attend technical classes and complete assignments provided by a Technical Correspondence Institute course.

A.13.3 Time spent by building cadets in technical education as provided for in subclauses 13.2.1 and 13.2.2 of this clause shall be counted as ordinary hours of work and as time served.

A.13.4 The Council may, in lieu of release for a minimum of 6 hours a week, approve the attendance by the building cadet at a block training course.

APPENDIX I

CONTRACT OF BUILDING CADETSHIP

This Deed, made the day of 19....., between [Full name of Employer] of [Address and occupation] hereinafter called "the employer", the first part, and [Full name of Building Cadet's parent or guardian] of [Address] hereinafter called "the guardian", of the second part, and [Full name building cadet] of [Address] a minor born on the day of 19....., hereinafter called "the building cadet", of the third part: Witnesseth as follows:

1. The employer hereby covenants with the building cadet: and the employer, as a separate covenant with the guardian, also covenants with the guardian that the employer take the building cadet into his employment as a building cadet in the building, construction and civil engineering industry and the building cadet and the guardian hereby jointly and severally covenant with the employer that the building cadet will serve the employer as a building cadet for the term and on and subject to the condition set forth in the Determination of the Building Technician Training Council established provided for in section 3 of the Technician Training Act 1967.

2. The employer covenants to employ the building cadet as:
(a) A part-time student
(b) A full-time student
[Strike out category not applicable] as defined in clause 13 of the Schedule—Training Scheme for Building Cadets.

3. The term of the building cadetship hereby created shall be 5 years commencing on the day of and shall be served at such place or places as may from time to time be mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto as expedient and necessary to the proper performance of the contract.

4. The building cadet covenants that he shall diligently and faithfully obey and serve the employer as his building cadet for the hereinbefore prescribed term and that he will not commit or permit or be accessory to any hurt or damage to the employer or his property but will do everything in his power to prevent any such hurt or damage occurring.

5. The employer covenants during the prescribed term of the building cadetship to the best of his power, knowledge, and skill to train and instruct the building cadet or cause him to be so trained and instructed to the extent that at the expiration of the said time he will have been given the opportunity to become competent in all such branches of the building industry as are required in the fulfilment of the course of study laid down by the Technicians Certification Authority of New Zealand for the New Zealand Certificate in Building.

Without limiting the generality of this contract the employer further covenants that the employer will train the building cadet in each and all the operation and skills set out and described in the Schedule—Training Scheme for Building Cadets.

6. The building cadet covenants further that he will enrol and diligently carry on with such courses of study as will enable him, during the term of his contract, to sit for the examinations in the New Zealand Certificate in Building conducted by the Technician Certification Authority of New Zealand.

7. It is agreed between the parties that in the event of the building cadet finding the course of study for the New Zealand Certificate in Building beyond his capabilities, and subject to his obtaining a certificate to that effect from the principal of the technical institute concerned, it may be mutually agreed between the parties that this contract may be amended to permit the employer to train the building cadet in draughting (architectural) or quantity surveying to enable him, during the period of his contract, to change to the New Zealand Certificate in Draughting (Architectural) or the New Zealand Certificate in Quantity Surveying, and in such case this contract shall be endorsed accordingly.

8. It is further agreed that, as an alternative to the form of stipulation of this contract proposed in clause 7 of this contract, the building cadet shall be entitled to apply to the New Zealand Carpentry and Joinery Apprenticeship Committee for an apprenticeship with any employer with any time approved by that committee.

9. The employer shall supply the building cadet with a copy of the Conditions of Employment for Building Cadets and the Training Scheme for Building Cadets.

10. The building cadet covenants further that he will not engage otherwise than in the discharge of his duties, to any person whomsoever any information, whether in the nature

of trade secrets, financial information, or otherwise whatsoever, acquired by him in the course of his duties or in any other way in his capacity of building cadet.

and to relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work, or to the issue of permits, or to the payment for overtime or extended hours, or to holidays and half holidays, or to the closing of shops.

1. Forty hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in 5 days of the week, and 8 hours shall constitute a day's work in or about the exhibition, and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, the daily hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than 4 hours without an interval of least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. 4. No male under 18 years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5.
