Rights Conferred on the Minister of Electricity to Dam, Use, Discharge, and Divert Waters of, or into, Lakes Tekapo, Pukaki, and Ohau

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the 11th day of November 1968, published in the *Gazette* of 1968, Volume III, page 2071, the waters of the Fork Stream, Lake Tekapo, Lake Pukaki, and Lake Ohau and the waters flowing from Lake Tekapo, Lake Pukaki, and Lake Ohau, whether in their natural channels or in artificial channels, to the points where they discharge into Lake Benmore were declared to be of national importance;

And whereas the Minister of Electricity has applied for the right to dam, use, discharge, divert, and take the said waters for the purpose of generating electricity:

Now therefore, pursuant to section 23 of the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby grants to the Minister of Electricity the right to dam, use, discharge, divert, and take the said waters, as set forth in the First Schedule hereto, for the period set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the conditions set forth in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

THE rights so granted comprise the rights:

1. To dam the waters of the Fork Stream in the vicinity of the place marked "A" on the plan marked M.O.W. 23405 and deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington.

2. To divert the waters of the Fork Stream as required, by a channel from the vicinity of the place marked "A" on the said plan to the vicinity of the place marked "B" on the said plan.

3. To continue to dam the waters of Lake Tekapo, by a dam in the vicinity of the place marked "C" on the said plan, at a maximum controlled level of about 2,333 ft above sea level and a maximum flood level of about 2,340 ft above sea level, with the right to exceed those levels temporarily in exceptional circumstances, for use in the existing powerhouse, at the place marked "D" on the said plan, and thence to discharge those waters into a canal in the vicinity of the place marked "E" on the said plan.

4. To divert water by a canal and tunnel system from the vicinity of the place marked "E" on the said plan to the vicinity of the place marked "G" on the said plan, for use in two powerhouses to be constructed in the vicinity of the places marked "F" and "G" on the said plan, and thence to discharge the water into Lake Pukaki in the vicinity of the said place marked "G".

5. To continue to dam the waters of Lake Pukaki, by a dam in the vicinity of the place marked "H" on the said plan, at a maximum controlled level of about 1,751 ft above sea level and a maximum flood level of about 1,761 ft above sea level, with the right to exceed those levels temporarily in exceptional circumstances, and to discharge the waters into a canal in the vicinity of the place marked "I" on the said plan for use in a powerhouse to be constructed in the vicinity of the place marked "J" on the said plan.

6. To dam the waters of Lake Ohau, by control works constructed in the vicinity of the places marked "L" and marked "M" on the said plan, at a maximum controlled level of about 1,707 ft above sea level and a maximum flood level of about 1,716 ft above sea level, with the right to exceed those levels temporarily in exceptional circumstances.

7. To divert water from Lake Pukaki, by a canal from the vicinity of the place marked "J" on the said plan, to the vicinity of the place marked "K" on the said plan and to divert water from Lake Ohau, by a canal from the vicinity of the place marked "M" on the said plan, to the vicinity of the said place marked "K" on the said plan, for use in a powerhouse to be constructed in the vicinity of the said place marked "K", and thence to discharge the water into the natural bed of the Ohau River in the vicinity of the said place marked "K".

8. To dam the waters of the Ohau River in the vicinity of the place marked "N" on the said plan; to dam waters, by control works in the vicinity of the place marked "O" on the said plan; to divert water, by a canal from the vicinity of the said place marked "O" to the vicinity of the place marked "Q" on the said plan, for use in two powerhouses to be constructed in the vicinity of the places marked "P" and marked "Q" on the said plan; and thence to discharge the water into Lake Benmore in the vicinity of the said place marked "Q".

9. To discharge waters, as required from time to time, into the natural channels of the Fork Stream, the Tekapo River, the Pukaki River, and the Ohau River.

SECOND SCHEDULE

The rights hereby conferred on the Minister of Electricity are granted for a period of 21 years from the date of this Order in Council, with successive rights of renewal for further periods of 21 years for so long as the Minister of Electricity requires the use of the water for the generation of electricity.

THIRD SCHEDULE

1. The rights hereby conferred on the Minister of Electricity are granted in respect of all the waters declared by the aforesaid Order in Council, dated the 11th day of November 1968, to be of national importance; except that the Regional Water Board may from time to time grant the following rights:

- Rights to dam, use, discharge, divert, and take water for irrigation purposes may be granted up to a maximum of 520 cusecs and a total volume of 140,000 acre-feet during any one irrigation season.
- Rights to dam, use, discharge, divert, and take water up to a total of 20 cusecs may be granted for purposes other than domestic needs, the needs of animals, and irrigation.
- Rights without limit may be granted to the use of water if it is returned to the source from which it was taken at substantially the same level:
Provided that the rights do not prejudice the exercise of any right hereby granted to the Minister of Electricity.

(d) Rights to take or divert water into systems for distribution for domestic needs and the needs of animals may be granted up to a total of 140 cusecs.

2. The Minister of Electricity shall facilitate the construction of works enabling the holder of rights granted by the Regional Water Board under clause 1 of this Schedule to obtain water from canals or ponding areas subject to the costs involved being met by the holder, except as may otherwise be agreed with the Minister of Electricity.

3. The rights hereby conferred on the Minister of Electricity are subject always to the proviso that any person may take or use any of the water available that is reasonably required for his domestic needs and the needs of animals for which he has any responsibility and for, or in connection with, fire-fighting purposes.

The New Plymouth Foreshore Control Order 1969

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the New Plymouth Foreshore Control Order 1969.

(2) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this order—

"Council" means the New Plymouth City Council.

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides.

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by, or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the Council, for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, the control of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order, subject to the provisions of section 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, and to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION OF FORESHORE

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District comprising that part of the foreshore (being also part New Plymouth Harbour Reserve A comprised in deeds index 4, folio 585) bounded to the east by a line being the production of the south-western boundary of Section 200, Hua District, and to the west by a line being the production of the south-western side of Belt Road in the City of New Plymouth; part of the said area being also part of the New Plymouth Harbour Roadstead, contained in certificate of title, Volume 102, folio 148, Taranaki Registry.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty shall, at all times, have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order.

2. Nothing in this order shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 that is or may hereafter be in force.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this order shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at the commencement of this order or may be at any time subsequently laid down within that foreshore.

4. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order for the purpose of holding sports meetings or games, and may, by bylaws, fix a charge for admission to any such enclosed part or parts:

Provided that the total number of days on which any particular part of that foreshore is so enclosed shall not exceed six in any one calendar year.

5. Nothing in this order shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed from the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent in writing of the Minister being first obtained.

6. The powers, functions, duties, and authorities conferred on the Council by this order may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment or any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council at least 6 calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the Council at its public office.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JULY 1969

General—Pressures were high over New Zealand in July, and rainfall was below average over almost the whole country. In the North Island the weather was also unusually frosty. A shortage of feed was reported in most districts of both Islands. With the aid of supplementary feed, stock were reported to be wintering well. However, in parts of Canterbury the ground was too dry. Lambing commenced in many districts, under favourable conditions.

Rainfall—Rainfall was mainly half the average value. Over the greater part of North Otago and South Canterbury, Central Marlborough, and the Waimea Plains of Nelson it was less than a quarter. Oamaru received a total of only 0.10 in.

The only areas with rainfall close to or somewhat above average were Fiordland with part of South Westland, and northern Wairarapa.

Temperatures—Over the greater part of the North Island, including especially northern districts, temperatures were more than 2 degrees below average. On the other hand, in many inland districts of the South Island and in coastal Southland temperatures were 1-3 degrees above average.

On the 23rd, in a general northerly flow, some unusually low relative humidities were recorded in Canterbury. At 9 a.m. the value at the Hermitage was 7 percent; at Glentanner, 8 percent; and at Highbank Power Station, 7 percent.

Snow falls to comparatively low levels were reported in Southland and West Otago, Banks Peninsula, and Wairarapa on the 1st and 2nd; in mid Canterbury and the central North Island from the 9th to the 11th; and in the Gisborne high country on the 19th and 20th.

Sunshine—Sunshine was above average in northern and eastern districts of the North Island by 20-50 hours. Parts of Northland were especially favoured, Kaitiaki receiving 186 hours. In the Wanganui-Manawatu area and also in Buller sunshine was 20 hours below average.

Weather Sequence—At the beginning of July pressures were low to the east and south-east, with an anticyclone centred over the Tasman Sea. South to south-west winds prevailed, continuing from the end of June, with rain over most of the North Island and in Marlborough, North Canterbury, and Southland. Snow was reported to low levels in Southland, West Otago, and Banks Peninsula; also in the Rimutaka Ranges. During the next 2 days an anticyclone crossed the North Island and the weather was mainly fair.

During the 5th and 6th a depression passed to the south, and the associated trough of low pressure commenced to cross New Zealand, bringing rain to the greater part of the South Island and western districts of the North Island. The trough became slow moving over the North Island, with rain there on the 7th and 8th, besides the West Coast. Pressures remained low to the east, and a second trough soon crossed the country with fairly general rain on the 9th and 10th. On the 2 following days, yet another trough brought snow to the high country in Canterbury and the North Island, besides rain in Southland, on the West Coast, and in Northland.

On the 13th an anticyclone covered the North Island and the weather was generally settled. This anticyclone remained centred west of the North Island while a weak trough moved north-eastward over the South Island on the 14th, affecting Westland and Buller. During the 2 following days the trough became stationary over the North Island, with light rain there and also in Marlborough and on the West Coast. Another trough brought fairly general light rain during its passage over the country on the 17th and 18th. On the following day a depression developed to the north-east, causing rain in northern and eastern districts of the North Island. In the cold south-easterlies considerable snow was reported on the Gisborne high country. On the 20th an anticyclone covered most of New Zealand but rain still persisted in the Gisborne district. However, on the 21st and 22nd, as the anticyclone moved slowly eastward, the weather was generally settled.

From the 23rd to 25th a depression over the north Tasman Sea crossed the North Island with an associated trough, bringing fairly general rain to the whole country. The rain was heavy on the West Coast on the 23rd and in Auckland city in the evening of the 24th, with some serious street flooding. By the 26th a depression lay to the north-east and there were more cold south-easterlies, with rain in the North Island east of the main ranges. On the 27th a ridge of high pressure extended over the country from the Tasman Sea, bringing fair weather. Light rain was reported in western districts of both Islands besides Wairarapa and Marlborough during the next 2 days with the passage of a trough of low pressure. On the following day the trough became slow-moving and a small depression formed on it near Cook Strait, causing some further rain in that area. On the last day of the month this depression had moved to the east and another trough of low pressure moved on to the South Island with strong westerlies, bringing rain to the West Coast.
