PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order shall come into force on the 1st day of May 1970.

2. The districts of the County of Grey and the Borough of Brunner shall be united to form one county to be known as the County of Grey (hereinafter called the "said county").

3. The Council of the Borough of Brunner is hereby dis-

solved. 4. For representation purposes only, the said county shall be divided into four ridings, with the following names and boundaries:

(i) North Riding, comprising the North Riding of the former County of Grey;
(ii) South Riding, comprising the South Riding of the

former County of Grey

(iii) East Riding, comprising the East Riding of the former County of Grey; and
(iv) Brunner Riding, comprising the area contained in the district of the former Borough of Brunner.

5. The Council of the said county shall consist of 10 mem-

bers, with representation as follows:

North Riding—three members South Riding—three members East Riding—three members Brunner Riding—one member

6. The first election of the members of the Council of the said county shall be held on the date prescribed by law for the first triennial general elections of members of county councils to be held after the 1st day of May 1970.

7. Until the members of the Council of the said county, to be elected at the first triennial general election of councillors after the 1st day of May 1970, shall come into office, the Council of the said county shall consist of 10 members, as follows:

(a) the nine members of the Grey County Council holding office immediately prior to the union hereby effected; and

(b) one member of the former Brunner Borough Council to he memoer of the former harmonic process of the chosen by that Council to represent the Brunner Riding; and for the purpose of making that choice, and for no other purpose, the said Borough Council shall, if necessary, continue in office after the date of the said union.

8. The first County Clerk of the said county shall be the County Clerk of the former County of Grey and shall be responsible for calling the first meeting of the Council of the said county.

9. For a period of not less than 5 years from the date of the union hereby effected, the said county shall be divided into two divisions, as follows:

(a) the Grey Division, comprising the district of the former

County of Grey; and

(b) the Brunner Division, comprising the district of the former Borough of Brunner.

10. Separate accounts shall be kept for each such division, and the Council of the said county shall, for the period referred to in paragraph 9 of this order, make and levy the general rate separately in each division of the county.

11. All special works shall be charged against the separate accounts of the division which receives the benefit of such

works.

12. The public debt and contingent liabilities of the County of Grey shall be debited to the Grey Division, and the public debt and contingent liabilities of the former Borough of Brunner shall be debited to the Brunner Division.

13. (a) The Grey Division shall not be liable for the payment of interest and sinking fund or interest and principle on any loans raised for the benefit of the district of the former

Borough of Brunner. The Brunner Division shall not be liable for the payment of interest and sinking fund or interest and principle on any loans raised for the benefit of the former County of Grey.

14. The system of rating in the said county shall be on the unimproved value system:

Provided, however, that in the Brunner Division all rates shall be made and levied on the capital value system for a period of 5 years from the date of the union and for such purposes the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) Where any rate is made and levied on all rateable where any rate is made and levied on all rateable property within the whole of the said county or within a part of the said county which includes the Brunner Division, the Council shall, instead of levying that rate on rateable property within the Brunner Division on the system of rating in force in the said county, make and levy on the rateable property within the Brunner Division on the capital value rating system a rate calculated to produce a total amount that would have been produced. equal to the amount that would have been produced from all the rateable property in the Brunner Division if it had been levied on the system of rating in force
- if it had been levied on the system of rating in force in the said county.

 (b) Notwithstanding that under the provisions hereof a system of rating is in force in the Brunner Division which differs from that in force in the said county, the number of votes to which the occupier of any rateable property in the Brunner Division is entitled under section 51 of the Counties Act 1956 shall be determined having regard to the rateable value of the property as appearing on the valuation roll of the said county and as if the system of rating in the said county were also in force in the Brunner Division. county were also in force in the Brunner Division.
- (c) All the valuation rolls, electors lists, electors rolls, and rate books in force in the Borough of Brunner on the 30th day of April 1970 shall continue in force and be deemed to be the valuation rolls, electors lists, electors rolls, and rate books in force in the Brunner Riding of the said county until new valuation rolls, electors lists, electors rolls, and rate books are made
- for the Brunner Riding.

 (d) All the valuation rolls, electors lists, electors rolls, and rate books in force in the County of Grey on the 30th day of April 1970 shall continue in force and be deemed to be the valuation rolls, electors lists, electors and the county of the North Riding. rolls, and rate books in force in the North Riding, the South Riding, and the East Riding of the said county until new valuation rolls, electors lists, electors rolls, and rate books are made for the North Riding, the South Riding, and the East Riding.
- 15. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967, the provisions of the Counties Act 1956 shall, with the necessary modifications and so far as they are applicable, apply to the union hereby effected as if the Borough of Brunner were a town district to which section 28 of the Counties Act 1956 applies.
- 16. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications, the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the union hereby effected.

PURSUANT to the Electricity Distribution Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. MERGER OF DISTRICT

THE licensed area of supply of the Mackenzie County Council, as defined in the Mackenzie County Council Electric Lines Licence dated 25 January 1955 and published in the Gazette on 3 February 1955, at p. 105, is hereby included and merged in the South Canterbury Electric Power District. For the purposes of the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, this merger shall be deemed to have been effected under that

2. BOUNDARIES

The boundaries of the South Canterbury Electric Power District are hereby altered so as to include therein the outer areas described in the Proclamation of 18 April 1967, published in the Gazette on 27 April 1967, at p. 773.

3. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF SUPPLY AUTHORITY

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Electricity Distribution Commission Act 1967, the South Canterbury Electric Power

Board shall exercise all rights and undertake all obligations previously exercised by the Mackenzie County Council in carrying on its electricity undertaking.

4. Representation

As from the date of merger and until the next triennial local body election, the South Canterbury Electric Power Board shall be reconstituted to allow for the inclusion of an additional member representing that part of Mackenzie County formerly supplied by the Mackenzie County Council's electricity undertaking. The Order in Council apportioning representation on the South Canterbury Electric Power Board, dated 17 November 1922 and published in the Gazette on 23 November 1922, as amended by an Order in Council dated 21 March 1955 and published in the Gazette on 31 March 1955, at p. 589, is hereby amended to give the Board an interim membership of 13, as specified in the following schedule: following schedule:

The first representative of that part of Mackenzie County Council's electricity undertaking shall be appointed by the Mackenzie County Council and shall hold office until the next triennial local body election. Thereafter, pursuant to section 10 of the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, the number of representatives of each constituent district shall be determined by the Governor-General by Order in Council, and the number of members on the South Canterbury Electric Power Board shall revert to 12.

5. PURCHASE PRICE

THE South Canterbury Electric Power Board shall pay to the Mackenzie County Council the sum of \$55,000 for the purchase of the Council's electricity undertaking, property and assets. Payment is to be made over a period of 2 years, as stipulated in the agreement made between the Board and the Council the Council.

6. DISPOSITION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

As from the date of merger, the South Canterbury Electric Power Board shall take over and become the absolute owner rower Board shall take over and become the absolute owher of all assets of whatsoever description forming part of the undertaking of the Mackenzie County Council. The Board shall also assume responsibility and liability for all loans, sundry creditors, and other liabilities applicable to the electricity undertaking of the County Council at the date of merger.

7. TARIFFS

As from the date of merger, the Board's tariff and conditions of supply shall apply to all consumers previously supplied by Mackenzie County, provided that until metering alterations are carried out to farm installations, such consumers shall pay at the Board's domestic rate. The Board, with all due diligence, shall carry out at its own expense all such work as is necessary to implement farm metering, and thereafter such consumers shall pay the Board's farm tariff in respect of farm installations. of farm installations.

8. STAFF

THE South Canterbury Electric Power Board shall continue to employ, as required by the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963, the two persons employed on the staff of the Mackenzie County Council's electricity undertaking.

9. PRIVATE GENERATING PLANTS

THE South Canterbury Electric Power Board shall in future support the renewal of all licences in force at the date of the merger in respect of private electrical plants located in that part of Mackenzie County formerly supplied by the County Council's electricity undertaking.

10. DATE OF MERGER

The merger shall come into force on 1 April 1970.

Corrections to the rainfall departures from normal for February 1970 should be made as follows: Westport,—2.6. Cobb Dam,—4.0. Hokitika Aerodrome,—3.8. Totara Flat,—3.5. Franz Josef,—4.9. Haast,—3.2. Milford Sound,—2.0.

The "normal" refers to the present site of the instruments. The standard periods for normals are: for temperature 1931-60, for rainfall 1921-50, and for sunshine 1935-60. No normals are available for stations with only short records.

Notes on the Weather for March 1970

General—March was wet and warm. The very dry conditions which had been affecting most of the North Island and a considerable part of the South Island were relieved in nearly all districts by good rains, commencing mainly from the middle of the month. Pastures were reported to be making a rapid recovery, with the countryside changing from brown to green, but stock were recovering condition more slowly. The lack of rain still gave cause for concern in a few areas, notably southern Manawatu. Army worm was reported in Northland and facial eczema in Waikato.

Rainfall—Rainfall was more than double the normal value in Taihape, Hawke's Bay, and Wairarapa, besides most of Marlborough and parts of Canterbury, Coromandel, and Bay of Plenty. Greatest excesses were reported in southern Hawke's Bay, where some stations received four to eight times the normal value, with totals up to 14 in., the highest recorded there in any month of the year.

Elsewhere rainfall was mainly above normal or close to it.

In Hawke's Bay most of the rain fell from the 17th to the 19th, in south-easterlies, with a depression centred off the east coast of Northland. Oruawharo, near Takapau, received 8.74 in. for the 17th and 18th.

Temperatures—Mean temperatures were mainly 3 degrees above normal in the North Island, and 1-2 degrees above normal in the South Island.

The first 13 days were exceptionally warm and the last 8 days were also rather warm. The period 15-21 March, when southerly to easterly winds predominated, was several degrees cooler than normal.

Sunshine—Sunshine was 40-80 hours below normal over most of the South Island besides Wellington and southern Wairarapa. It was particularly low in the Christchurch-Ashburton area. The total of 82 hours at Ashburton was the lowest ever recorded in March in any part of New Zealand. Weather Sequence—For the first 13 days of March temperatures were unusually warm.

On the 1st an anticyclone was centred over Tasmania and a series of weak troughs of low pressure crossed the country bringing only scattered light showers. For the next 4 days the anticyclone moved eastward across the country to the Chatham Islands and the weather was fine and warm.

During the 6th and 7th a trough of low pressure associated with a depression to the south-east of Victoria became stationary over the South Island, and another trough moved eastward over the North Island. Rain covered the whole of the South Island and northern districts of the North Island. For the next 3 days the anticyclone was still centred to the east, and the weather improved at first. However, a small depression with an associated trough soon crossed the South Island with rain there once again, except in Marlborough and North Canterbury. Western and northern districts of the North Island were also affected. Conditions were particularly humid, with patches of fog and very low cloud in many places. As the trough moved away to the north-east on the 11th it brought further rain to northern districts of the North Island. During the 12th and 13th a depression over the north Tasman Sea moved south-eastward and the associated extensive trough of low pressure moved on to the South Island. Rain commenced in Fiordland and soon spread over the whole country, with some considerable falls in Southland Waikato, and Bay of Plenty.

The 14th brought a marked change from very warm weather mainly with northerlies, to much colder weather with southerlies and easterlies, lasting until the 23rd.

As another centre formed in the depression and the main centremoved across Cook Strait to the east on the 14th, a vigorous trough of low pressure crossed the country, with a change to south erly winds. Rain continued over most of the country but the weather cleared in Fiordland and south Westland, and temporarily in Wairarapa and Hawke's Bay. From the 15th to the 19th oncentre of the depression moved eastward towards the Chathan

Islands, while another moved northward to become stationary off the Northland coast. Rain affected mainly eastern and northern districts of the North Island, Wellington, and Manawatu besides Marlborough and north Canterbury. Some particularly heavy falls were reported on the 18th in Hawke's Bay especially around Napier, with some flooding. The northern centre later moved to the east of the North Island, and another small depression crossed the South Island and combined with it, while an anticyclone was centred over Campbell Island. On the 20th and 21st in the southerlies, rain was restricted to eastern districts of both Islands south of Gisborne and the Cook Strait area. Conditions improved on the next 2 days as the complex depression moved away to the east and an anticyclone moved on to New Zealand. However, a heavy downpour was reported in Nelson on the 22nd.

With the return to northerly winds on the 24th, the remainder of March was comparatively warm, but not as warm as the spell from the 1st to the 13th.

During the 24th and 25th a depression over the North Tasman Sea moved slowly eastward while the associated trough of low pressure crossed the North Island. Rain was reported first on the West Coast, extending over the Alps into the high country of Southland, Otago, and Canterbury. It soon cleared in these areas but then affected nearly the whole of the North Island, with Nelson and Marlborough. Conditions remained somewhat similar on the following day with the passage of the depression across the North Island. Considerable rain was reported in Bay of Plenty and Taupo. The weather improved on the 27th as the depression moved away to the east, but some rain was still reported in eastern and northern districts of the North Island. Pressures remained high to the east. From the 28th to the 30th a depression passed to the south-west of the South Island and the associated trough of low pressure became stationary over that island. Considerable rain was reported on the West Coast, with some scattered falls elsewhere. On the last day of the month the trough remained slow moving, now over Cook Strait, and was linked to a depression off the Queensland coast. The weather cleared on the West Coast but rain was reported in Nelson and Marlborough, besides most of the North Island. There were some considerable falls in northern Manawatu.

Decisions under the Sales Tax Act 1932-33-Notice No. 56

- 1. The following decisions in interpretation of the Sales Tax Act 1932-33 are published for public information.
- 2. The decisions numbered 1 to 9 published as the "Supplement to the New Zealand Gazette of Thursday, 21 December 1961", No. 83, as subsequently amended, are hereby cancelled.

Decision No. Decision 1. The following persons need not be licensed under the Act: A. A wholesaler who satisfies the Collector that the total sale value of taxable goods sold by him during the last financial year of his business did not exceed \$1,000 and that the estimated value of the taxable goods likely to be sold by him during the current financial year is not expected to exceed that sum:

Provided that this exemption shall not apply to any person unless he is the holder of a certificate of exemption for the time being in force issued to him by the Collector of Sales Tax upon application made in a form to be supplied by the

- B. A person manufacturing taxable goods, not being a "contractor" referred to in section 3 of the Sales Tax Amendment Act 1933, who satisfies the Collector-
 - (i) That the total sale value of the taxable goods manufactured by him during the preceding 12 months did not exceed \$1,000 and that the estimated sale value of the taxable goods likely to be manufactured by him during the next ensuing 12 months is not expected to exceed that sum; or
 - (ii) That the proportion of the selling price of the taxable goods manufactured by him during the preceding 12 months represented by his labour, overhead, and profit did not exceed \$500 and that the proportion of the selling price of the taxable goods manufactured by him during the next ensuing 12 months is not expected to exceed that

Provided that this exemption shall not apply to any person unless he is the holder of a certificate of exemption for the time being in force issued to him by the Collector of Sales Tax upon application made in a form to be supplied by the

For the purposes of the above decisions the sale value of goods manufactured shall in all cases be deemed to be the fair market value of the goods as if they were sold to a retailer in the ordinary course of business, and not the sale value as ascertained or determined in accordance with the provisos to paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 13 of the Act.

C. (i) A person manufacturing taxable goods, being a "contractor" as referred to in section 3 of the Sales Tax Amendment Act 1933, who satisfies the Collector that the total price charged for work done by him during the preceding 12 months did not exceed \$500 and that the total estimated charge for work to be done by him during the next ensuing 12 months is not likely to exceed that sum:

Provided that this exemption shall not apply to any person unless he is the holder of a certificate of exemption for the time being in force issued to him by the Collector of Sales Tax upon application made in a form to be supplied by

(ii) A person being a "contractor" as referred to in section 3 of the Sales Tax Amendment Act 1933, who does work on taxable goods which are the property of a licensed wholesaler and which are for resale by the licensed wholesaler:

Provided that this exemption shall not apply to any person unless he is the holder of a certificate of exemption for the time being in force issued to him by the Collector of Sales Tax upon application made in a form to be supplied by the

And provided also that any such certificate of exemption issued to the contractor will be applicable only to the abovementioned work and not to any other taxable work done or to taxable goods sold.

D. A person engaged in the bona fide repair, alteration, or renovation of second-hand goods which have been used in New Zealand, who carries on such work only.

For the purposes of this decision a person shall be deemed to be engaged in the bona fide repair, alteration, or renovation of secondhand goods if he manufactures parts of articles which require repair, alteration, or renovation, and incorporates such parts in those articles. In such cases sales tax shall be payable on the sale value of the taxable materials used in the manufacture of such parts and not on the sale value of those parts.

For the purposes of this decision a person shall not be deemed to be engaged in the bona fide repair, alteration, or renovation of secondhand goods if he manufactures parts of articles which require repair, alteration or renovation, and sells them to be incorporated by another person.

Such parts of articles shall be liable to sales tax under paragraph (a) or (b) (as the case may be) of subsection (1) of section 11 of the Act.

- E. A person whose manufacturing operations consist of one or more of the following:
- The breaking down or reducing the strength of spirits.
- The manufacture of ready-mixed concrete.
- (c) The manufacture of ready-involconcrete.
