GREETING:

Whereas it is deemed expedient that an inquiry should be made into the cause of the disaster which occurred at the Kaimai Tunnel on the 24th day of February 1970, and matters incidental thereto:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, I, Sir Arthur Espie Porritt, Baronet, the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby appoint you, the said Alfred William Yortt, Kenneth Edwin Andrews, and Francis Joseph Handcock, to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon-

(a) The cause of the disaster at the Kaimai Tunnel on the 24th day of February 1970;
(b) The selection of the tunnel site, and the design and method of driving the tunnel, particularly in relation to the geological nature of the country;
(c) The efficiency of the management in relation to the tunnelling operations:

tunnelling operations;
(d) The efficiency of the inspection of the tunnel by all or any of the persons who are responsible for such

inspection;

(e) Suggestions for the prevention, as far as possible, of similar disasters—

similar disasters—
and generally to inquire into and report upon such other matters arising thereout as may come to your notice in the course of your inquiries and which you consider should be investigated in connection therewith, and to report upon any matters affecting the premises which you consider should be brought to the attention of the Government, and, in particular, to report your opinion whether any additional legislation is necessary and the scope of the same, and whether the regulations included in the existing law provide for reasonable and proper safeguards against similar disasters, or whether any amendment or addition to them is required:

And with the like advice and consent I hereby appoint you, the said ALFRED WILLIAM YORTT, to be the Chairman of the said Commission:

And for better enabling you to carry these presents into effect you are hereby authorised and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents, in accordance with the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, at such times and places as you deem expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and so that these presents shall continue in force and the inquiry may at any time and place be resumed although not requirely adjourned. time and place be resumed although not regularly adjourned from time to time or from place to place:

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, except to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you or any evidence or information obtained by you in exercise of the powers hereby conferred on you except such evidence or information as is received in the course of a sitting

open to the public:
And it is hereby declared that the powers hereby conferred shall be exercisable notwithstanding the absence at any time of any one member of the Commission hereby appointed, so long as the Chairman and one other member are present and

concur in the exercise of such powers:

And it is hereby further declared that you have liberty to report your proceedings and recommendations under this Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient

so to do:

And using all due diligence you are required to report to me in writing under your hands not later than the 1st day of October 1970 your findings and opinions in the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you think fit to make in respect thereof.

(e) Every person who paid provisional tax in respect of income for the year ended 31 March 1970.

(f) Every person to whom section 104 of the Land and Income Tax Act 1954 applies. Section 104 relates to aggregate assessments of husbands and wives and, in general terms, now applies only where—

(i) Income is derived by one spouse under a transfer or settlement of income by the other spouse and the assets producing the income are retained by or

In addition to IR 3, farmers are to complete supplementary return IR 3r, and persons in business or in a profession are to complete supplementary return IR 3B. Companies are to use IR 4, and estates and trusts IF 5A. Each form indicates the IR 4, and estates and trusts IF 5A. Each form indicates the classes of taxpayers who are to use that form and, where applicable, the due dates for payment of provisional tax. Generally, the first instalment of provisional tax must accompany the return when furnished and is due on 7 August 1970. It must be paid on or before 7 September 1970 in order to avoid the 10 percent additional tax for late payment. The second instalment is, in general, due on 7 February 1971, with a 10 percent additional tax if not paid by 7 March 1971. In some cases a third instalment is, in general, due on 7 May 1971, with a 10 percent additional tax if not paid by 7 June 1971. Taxpayers who are not required to furnish (and do not furnish) a final return by the expiration of 1 month after the due date for payment of the first instalment of provisional tax, are required to furnish an interim return IR 5B unless they have been otherwise advised. This return is to be furnished not later than 1 month after the due date for payment of the first instalment of provisional tax. Fuller details are given in the interim return form. the interim return form.

4. All return forms are available at district offices of the Inland Revenue Department; and forms, other than interim return forms, are also available at post offices. Company returns are available at post offices in urban areas with a population of 5,000 or more, not having an Inland Revenue district

office.

5. Any person or company failing to furnish a return within the prescribed time is liable to a fine not exceeding \$200 and not less than \$4.

6. Any person who is not required under paragraph 1 to furnish a return and who has derived income from employment may elect to furnish a return, using IR 5 if he requires an adjustment:

(a) Because he paid life insurance premiums.(b) Because he considers that tax deductions made from his income were excessive.

(c) Because he was entitled to exemptions which were not included in his tax code during the year.

(d) Because he is entitled to deductions from income

7. Any person furnishing a return of income, who derived income taxed at time of payment, should securely attach all tax deduction certificates (IR 12, IR 13, or IR 55) to the return form.
