#### King Country Electric Power Board—Consent to Generation 1971

PURSUANT to the Electricity Act 1968, the Minister of Electricity hereby consents to the generation of electricity by the King Country Electric Power Board, subject to the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS

1. The conditions directed by the Water Power Regulations 1934 to be implied in every licence to use water for the purpose of generation or storing electricity shall be deemed to be conditions of this consent as if it were such a licence.

2. This consent is subject to compliance with the Water Power Regulations 1934, the Electrical Supply Regulations 1967, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961, the Radio Interference Regulations 1958, and all regulations hereafter made in amendment of or in substitution for any of those regulations, as if in the case of the Water Power Regulations 1934 it were a licence under the Public Works Act 1928 to use water for the purpose of generating electricity as well as a consent under the Electricity Act 1968 to generate electricity by the use of water.

3. The generation of electricity by the use of water, pursuant to this licence, shall be carried out by means of the works described in the Schedule hereto.

4. This consent shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force for a period of 21 years from the 30th day of June 1971.

5. This consent confers no rights to water under the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967 or otherwise.

6. For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this consent, the maximum generating capacity of the scheme shall be assessed at 6,000 kW.

7. The station should be operated to supply the normal electricity demand of the King Country Electric Power Board and to conform reasonably to the pattern of the supply authority's daily load curve.

The water for the generation scheme shall be diverted from the Mangahuehu Stream at a point immediately downstream of the confluence of the Tokiahuru and Mangahuehu Streams, and shall be returned into the Whangaehu River, in Section 8A of Block 13, Karioi Survey District. The water shall be used for the generation of electricity by means of the following works:

- (a) Headworks consisting of an earth dam, headgate, and spillway at the point of diversion.
- (b) An open cut canal conveying the diverted water for a distance of 3½ miles, commencing at the said earth dam and proceeding in a westerly direction to and under Oruakukuru Road in Sections 6 and 4, D.P. 29343, Block IX; thence southerly to a second earth dam situated near the southern boundary of Section 4, Block IX; thence generally south-westerly to and under Fields Track Road in Section 4, Block XIII, to a third earth dam in Section 5, Block XIII; thence generally south-westerly to and under Fields Track Road in Section 5, Block XIII, into a reservoir formed by a fourth earth dam in Section 6, Block XIII; thence southerly in Section 7, all being situated in Karioi

Survey District; thence to its termination at a forebay and penstocks in Section 8A, Block III, Ngamatea Survey District.

(c) A powerhouse with turbines and all necessary equipment for generating electricity, having a maximum capacity of 6,000 kW.

(d) A tailrace leading from the powerhouse to the Whangaehu River.

*Prices of Butter Intended for Export*

PURSUANT to the Dairy Board Act 1961, the Dairy Products Prices Authority has fixed the prices to be paid for all butter manufactured from milk, or cream delivered to a dairy factory in the season commencing on the 1st day of June 1971 and acquired by the New Zealand Dairy Board, pursuant to Part II of the said Act, at the several prices and upon the terms, stipulations, and conditions following, that is to say:

1. In the case of creamery butter to which is assigned one or other of the following respective grades and which is allotted points in grading within the range of the following respective grade points under the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938—

- For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 27.50c per pound;
- For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the basic price of 27.35c per pound;
- For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the price of 27.20c per pound;
- For "First" grade, 90 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 26.70c per pound;
- For "Second" grade, the price of 25.70c per pound;
- For "Third" grade, the price of 22.35c per pound.

2. In the case of whey butter to which is assigned one or other of the following grades under the said regulations—

- For "First" grade, the price of 25.70c per pound;
- For "Second" grade, the price of 25.35c per pound.

3. Butter shall be packed in boxes each containing a net weight of 56 lb 2 oz of actual butter, excluding wrapping paper.

4. In computing the weight of butter for which payment is to be made by the Board, the weight of all butter comprised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:

- Each box of butter containing a net weight of 56 lb 2 oz of actual butter, excluding wrapping paper, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be computed at 56 lb;
- The weight of all butter in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of the several boxes selected by him for weighing and set out in the grader's certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the boxes of butter so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of butter comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in each such certificate in relation to the prescribed weight of 56 lb 2 oz per box;
- If the average weight, ascertained as aforesaid, of the butter comprised in any grader's certificate be less than 56 lb 2 oz per box, such deficiency shall be deducted from a weight of 56 lb per box for the purpose of computing payment therefor;

(d) If the average weight, ascertained as aforesaid, of the butter comprised in any grader's certificate exceeds the prescribed weight of 56 lb 2 oz per box, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purpose of computing payment therefor.

5. The prices fixed by the Authority shall not be paid for any butter manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

6. The price to be paid by the Board for any butter which, with the approval or at the request of the Board, is manufactured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities, or otherwise in any special manner, shall be the appropriate price payable for that butter as hereinbefore provided, adjusted by such appropriate addition or reduction as corresponds with the additional costs or the reduced costs incurred in such special manufacture, preparation, or packing. Any such approval or request of the Board may include a stipulation limiting the additional costs to be incurred and may dispense with the requirements of paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof, and, in that event, payment shall be made for the actual net weight of the butter exported. The adjustment to prices referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Board and the computation of the Board shall be final.

- For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 21.42c per pound;
- For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the price of 21.22c per pound;
- For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the basic price of 20.37c per pound;
- For "First" grade, 91 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 20.17c per pound;
- For "Graded", 88 points or over but under 91 points, the price of 19.32c per pound;
- For "Seconds", 80 points or over but under 88 points, the price of 17.27c per pound.

2. In the appropriate cases the following amounts shall be added to or deducted from the prices fixed in paragraph 1 hereof where cheese has been classified by the Department of Agriculture in respect of cheese sediment test:

- Classification A—an addition of 0.10c per pound;  
Classification B—no alteration;  
Classification C—a deduction of 0.05c per pound;  
Classification D—a deduction of 0.10c per pound.

3. Cheese shall be packed in fibreboard cartons each containing a net weight of 60 lb 3 oz of actual cheese, excluding wrapping.

4. In computing the weight of rindless cheese for which payment is to be made by the Board, the weight of all cheese comprised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:

- Each carton of cheese containing a net weight of 60 lb 3 oz of actual cheese, excluding wrapping, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be computed at 60 lb;
- The weight of all cheese in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of the several cartons selected by him for weighing and set out in the grader's certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the cartons of cheese so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of cheese comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in each such certificate in relation to the prescribed weight of 60 lb 3 oz per carton;
- If the average weight, ascertained as aforesaid, of the cheese comprised in any grader's certificate be less than 60 lb 3 oz per carton, such deficiency shall be deducted from a weight of 60 lb per carton for the purpose of computing payment therefor;

(d) If the average weight, ascertained as aforesaid, of the cheese comprised in any grader's certificate exceeds the prescribed weight of 60 lb 3 oz per carton, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purpose of computing payment therefor.

5. The prices fixed by the Board shall not be paid for any cheese manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

6. The price to be paid by the Board for any cheese which, with the approval or at the request of the Board, is manufactured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities, or otherwise in any special manner, shall be the appropriate price payable for that cheese as hereinbefore provided, adjusted by such appropriate addition or reduction as corresponds with the additional costs or the reduced costs incurred in such special manufacture, preparation, or packing. ##### *Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal*

IN the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of an application by the Comptroller of Customs for a decision in respect of the book *The Tour* by Aldo Lucchesi. Published by the New English Library, London.

There was no appearance of the applicant nor of the publisher's representative in New Zealand. Accordingly no submissions were made.

##### DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS paperback novel uses a thin narrative about two magazine writers preparing an exposé of all-inclusive tours as the opportunity for the portrayal of a variety of sexual encounters which for some of the tour party are their main experience of Europe. This portrayal is not as all-inclusive as the cover promises ("every sexual excess in one wild package") and its appeal to prurient interest and excitement will affect younger readers rather than adults. The book is objectionable enough in its treatment and tone to justify restricting its circulation.

The Tribunal classifies the book as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

##### *Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal*

IN the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and in the matter of an application by the Secretary for Justice for a decision in respect of the book *Her*, anonymous. Published by Lyle Stuart Inc. of New York.

Mr Armstrong appeared on behalf of the Secretary for Justice but made no submissions.

##### DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THE Tribunal was not unanimous in its decision.

The majority of the Tribunal comprising Messrs Stuart Perry, D. M. Wylie, and Mrs Joan Cochran classify the book as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. The minority comprising Mr S. F. W. Johnston and the Chairman (Mr R. S. V. Simpson) classify the book as indecent.

##### MAJORITY DECISION

*Her* is not a literary masterpiece but it is skilfully written and is a good example of the erotic novel. The author's defence of his anonymity seems valid, and his purpose is plain: to "tell a true and simple love story" with explicit physical details and using (in D. H. Lawrence tradition) the Saxon words in recounting sexual experience. Such stark treatment of erotic activity may interest, stimulate, shock, or bore but it is not likely to corrupt. There is no cruelty, violence, or perversion; deviations are realistically assessed; personality is taken seriously. The story is sometimes sentimental, sometimes crude, sometimes faintly absurd.

We do not consider that simple lack of high quality combined with the erotic nature of the subject requires us in terms of the Act to ban this book. We think it is in the

category which adults should be able themselves to decide about, to accept or reject as soon as they become aware of its nature.

As it is confined entirely to mature adult experience it could be disturbing to younger people and we therefore classify the book as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years.

#### MINORITY DECISION

*Mr Johnston*

My view is that *Her* presents a trivial and debased view of sex. The descriptions of sexual intercourse serve no theme or ideas. Some of them are so offensive to community standards of decency as to bring the book within the provisions of the Act. The preface is banal and confused and this makes suspect the author's honesty of purpose in assuming anonymity and his justification for using "the earthy language of love". The novelettish quality of the writing and portrayal throughout is sufficiently indicated by the final paragraph: "Now I would have to begin to learn how to forget her. Learn loneliness again; and this time as my life's companion, until death became my only friend". There is no artistic insight in the book to mitigate its offensive aspects and I consider that the book should be classified as indecent.

*Mr Simpson*

I also dissent from the majority decision basically for the reasons given by Mr. Johnston in his dissenting decision and consider that the book should be classified as indecent.

The majority decision prevails and the book is accordingly classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

#### DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS is a paperback book which we understand is at present on sale throughout New Zealand at a retail price of 80c per copy.

The somewhat dramatised description of the book on the front and back covers states *inter alia* that it is "the revealing story of a lifetime of sexual obsession".

It is perhaps better described as the story of a man who never marries and his passionate love for five women and his conquest of them. The theme is a well worn one and as would be expected in such a story, the sexual behaviour of the lovers is described in detail. It cannot be said of the book that it is written for the purpose of exploiting sex, perversion, or cruelty. It is rather a love story with a considerable emphasis on sexual adventures but no more than is currently tolerated in novels of this type.

Miss Bartlett, the applicant, drew the Tribunal's attention to specific passages of the book which she considered as indecent but the Tribunal in reaching its decisions must "take into consideration the dominant effect of the book as a whole" as stated in section 11 (1) (a) of the Act.

The Tribunal classifies the book as not indecent.

## NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MAY 1971

*General*—May was mild and rather wet. Good growth was reported for the time of the year in most areas, but in Canterbury and western and southern districts of the North Island some pastures were still recovering from the effects of several months of dry weather.

Pressures were comparatively high to the south and south-east and low over the North Tasman Sea. As in the 6 previous months, the general wind flow showed an excess of easterly to north-easterly winds.

*Rainfall*—Rainfall was above normal over most of the country, mainly by about 50 percent. The Kaingaroa Plains south-east of Rotorua received more than double the normal value. The main area with rainfall below normal, by up to 40 percent, was Canterbury.

A small but rather intense depression off the coast of Northern Hawke's Bay caused heavy rain with slips, considerable flooding, and disruption of transport, in Gisborne and Hawke's Bay on the 3rd and 4th.

*Temperatures*—Mean temperatures were above normal, mainly by 2–3°F. (1–2°C). This was the twelfth month in succession with temperatures warmer than normal from Christchurch northward.

Most eastern and southern districts had exceptionally warm weather in northerlies for the first fortnight followed by a decidedly cooler spell in southerlies from the 15th to the 26th.

*Sunshine*—East of the ranges in the North Island sunshine was 30–60 hours below normal. Masterton's total of 70 hours was the second lowest for May in 57 years of record. Sunshine was also well below normal in Otago, about Cook Strait, and about Christchurch. By contrast, Northland, Auckland, Waikato, and Wai-tomo, besides the north-western part of the Southland Plain, were favoured with 30–60 hours above normal.

*Weather Sequence*—The first fortnight of May was marked by northerly winds with unusually warm temperatures.

The weather on the 1st was similar to that of the last week in April, when an anticyclone was centred near the Chatham Islands. Pressures were low near Raoul Island and over the Tasman Sea, and the weather was fine apart from showers in Gisborne and Northland, and some thunderstorms, particularly over Kaitaia. The anticyclone continued to move away only slowly to the east of the Chatham Islands; while a depression over the Tasman Sea crossed the South Island and one near Raoul Island moved southward on to the North Island off the coast of Hawke's Bay, where gales were reported. From the 2nd to the 4th rain spread over the greater part of the country from the north and east. Heaviest falls were reported in Hawke's Bay and Gisborne, with some flooding. For the next 2 days the depression over the North Island continued to move southward past Cook Strait, while pressures were low over the South Tasman Sea, and a trough of low pressure

crossed New Zealand. On the 5th rain was restricted to northern and western districts of both Islands, but on the 6th it was again general over the whole country.

On the 7th an anticyclone was centred to the north with a weak ridge extending on to New Zealand. In the westerlies showers were reported in many districts.

During the 8th and 9th a trough of low pressure associated with a depression far to the south moved north-eastward over New Zealand. Light rain covered most of the South Island and western districts of the North Island, besides Bay of Plenty and Gisborne. On the 10th an anticyclone extended over the North Island from the east and the weather was fair apart from some light rain in Northland, Gisborne, and Fiordland.

On the following day the anticyclone was centred to the east of the Chatham Islands, while depressions were centred over the North Tasman Sea and to the west of Macquarie Island. Rain spread over northern districts of the North Island besides South Westland and Fiordland. From the 12th to the 14th the complex trough of low pressure crossed New Zealand, the northern depression reaching the area west of Egmont. Rain was general again in the northerlies, with some heavy falls in Bay of Plenty and Nelson, causing floods.

During the period from the 15th to 26th southerly winds covered the country, with much colder temperatures. On the 15th the depression west of Egmont moved over Northland, while an anticyclone centred near Bass Strait moved eastward. Southerlies spread over the country from the west, with general rain in the North Island, but only scattered falls in the South Island. From the 16th to the 18th the depression moved slowly north-eastward while pressures were also low to the east of Campbell Island; and scattered showers were reported east of the ranges in both Islands. On the 19th a trough of low pressure moved northward over New Zealand with rain spreading to some western areas, especially in the North Island. From the 20th to the 23rd the anticyclone near Tasmania moved towards Campbell Island and southerlies persisted, with showers in some eastern districts. Similar conditions continued for the next 3 days as the anticyclone continued on its course, at first to the south-east of the South Island but later on to the South Island.

By the 27th the anticyclone extended across the North Island and temperatures became warmer; however, some scattered light showers were reported. During the 28th and 29th a weak trough of low pressure crossed the country with scattered areas of light rain. On the last 2 days of the month an anticyclone was centred to the east of the North Island while pressures were low over the Tasman Sea. Successive troughs of low pressure crossed the country. In the northerlies, as at times during the first fortnight, rain was again fairly general, with heavy falls in some northern and western districts.
