Commission of Inquiry Into Psychiatric Services at Oakley Hospital

GREETING:

WHEREAS it has been alleged that questions have arisen out of or concerning the administration by the Department of Health of Oakley Hospital in Auckland in relation to alleged deficiencies in the staffing of the said hospital and in the psychiatric services provided in the said hospital, and it is desirable that inquiry should be made into the deficiencies so alleged and into the cause or causes and the cure or cures thereof, and into any means whereby the said services may be improved:

Now therefore, pursuant to the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, I, Sir Arthur Espie Porritt, Baronet, the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby appoint you, the said Charles Pierrepont Hutchinson, David John Harding Barlow, and William Hutchings to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon the following matters:

- 1. The staffing needs of the said hospital and the extent of any deficiencies therein.
- 2. The state of the psychiatric services at all levels in the said hospital.
- 3. The cause or causes of any deficiencies found to exist in respect of such staffing or such services and the means whereby such deficiencies may be cured and such services improved.
- 4. Any other matters arising out of the premises which may come to your notice in the course of your inquiries and which you may consider should be investigated in connection therewith, and any matters affecting the premises which you consider should be brought to the attention of the Government.

And, with the like advice and consent, I do hereby appoint you the said Charles Pierrepont Hutchinson to be Chairman of the said Commission:

And for the better enabling you to carry these presents into effect you are hereby authorised and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents, in accordance with the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, at such times and

places as you consider expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and so that these presents shall continue in force and the inquiry may at any time and place be resumed although not regularly adjourned from time to time or from place to place: And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you or any evidence or information obtained by you in the exercise of the powers hereby conferred upon you except such evidence or information as is received in the course of a sitting open to the public:

And it is hereby declared that the powers hereby conferred shall be exercisable notwithstanding the absence at any time of any one of the members hereby appointed so long as the Chairman or a member deputed by the Chairman to act in his stead and one other member is present and concurs in the exercise of such powers:

And it is hereby further declared that you have liberty to report your proceedings and findings under this Commission from time to time if you judge it expedient so to do:

And, using all due diligence, you are required to report to me in writing under your hands not later than the 6th day of September 1971 your findings and opinions on the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you think fit to make in respect thereof.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Clifford Ernest Beard, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2168 and shall come into force on the 30th day of July 1971.

2. (1) Price Order No. 2148* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said price order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies only with respect to sales by way of retail of 42-in. woolpacks.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF WOOLPACKS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any woolpacks to which this order applies shall be:
 - (a) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business at one of the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, Dunedin, Timaru, Bluff, or Napier: \$1.97 each.
 - (b) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the ports mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof: \$1.97 each, increased by the appropriate proportion of the freight charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store:

Provided that, where any woolpacks to which this paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store, the increase authorised by this paragraph shall not exceed the appropriate proportion of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the woolpacks had been obtained from that port and if delivery had been effected at current freight rates. had been effected at current freight rates.

- (2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding sub-clause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may require.
- (3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer other-(3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer otherwise than f.o.r. or f.o.b., the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.b., as
- (4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of 5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum retail prices in respect of any woolpacks, to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal moder this clause may apply with respect to a specified let or under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of woolpacks or may relate generally to all woolpacks to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

The "normal" refers to the present site of the instruments. The standard periods for normals are: for temperature 1931-60, for rainfall 1921-50, and for sunshine 1935-60. No normals are available for stations with only short records.

Notes on the Weather for June 1971

General—For a considerable part of the country, especially in the North Island, this was the warmest June in over a century of observations. The mildness of early winter was appreciated by farmers, who found growth good for the time of the year.

There was an unusually high frequency of northerly to easterly winds, as in the previous 7 months.

Rainfall—In the South Island rainfall was above normal except on the Kaikoura coast and in parts of North Canterbury. Departures were mainly 50 percent. However, a considerable area extending from the Rangitata River to Dunedin and from the coast to 40 miles inland received more than double the normal value. Parts of Nelson and Marlborough also received more than double.

Over the North Island the range of variation was greater. Hawke's Bay and the southern part of Gisborne received from 7 percent to half of the normal value. Wairoa's total of 26 mm (1.08 in.) was one of the lowest June values in 40 years of records. On the other hand, in parts of Bay of Plenty rainfall was more than double the normal value.

The period from the 3rd to the 7th was the wettest in the month. Flooding occurred in Bay of Plenty following on rainfalls of up to 300 mm (12 in.) in the 4 days 3-6 June; and it occurred in parts of Otago after rainfalls of 150 mm (6 in.) on the 6th and 7th.

Temperatures—Temperatures were above normal over the whole country. Departures of 2-3°C (4-6°F) were recorded over almost all the North Island and in Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland

and there were indications that in nearly all of this area except the West Coast and parts of Northland the month was the warmest June recorded since temperature observations first began in the 1860s. The average departure over the North Island was 2.5°C (4.6°F) and over the South Island 1.8°C (3.2°F). Over the whole country it was 2.1°C (3.8°F). This was the 13th successive month with temperatures above normal in the North Island and the northern half of the South Island, and the 9th successive month in the southern half of the South Island, and the 9th successive month in the southern half of the South Island.

Sunshine—Sunshine was mainly below normal by up to 40 hours. An area from Bay of Plenty through Waikato and Waitomo to North Taranaki was worst affected. In Otago and Southland and about Cook Strait sunshine was close to normal, except around Inver-cargill, where it was 30 hours above normal.

Weather Sequence—On the first 2 days of June a depression was centred west of the North Island and another one south-east of the South Island, and these two were connected by a trough of low pressure, while an anticyclone was centred to the south-east. Rain was fairly general but clearing soon in Southland and Otago. By the 3rd the anticyclone was centred south of the Chatham Islands with the main depression stationary over the eastern Tasman Sea. The anticyclone moved north-eastward, while the depression developed a second centre and moved southward. From this date until the 7th the weather was very unsettled in the north-eastward. easterlies. Some considerable rainfalls were recorded, with flooding in Bay of Plenty and later, Otago. On the 8th and 9th the complex depression covered New Zealand but was losing intensity, and the weather gradually improved, with only scattered falls on the latter

On the 10th and 11th a complex depression covering the south Tasman Sea and the area to the south of the South Island moved south-eastward, while the associated trough of low pressure crossed the country with westerly winds behind it, causing rain in western and northern districts of both islands. During the next 2

days a small depression crossed northern districts of the South Island, with another associated trough. Rain was reported mainly in western areas from Auckland to Hokitika and also in eastern districts of the South Island besides Wairarapa. A depression formed on this trough near North Cape on the 14th and travelled south-eastwards while yet another trough moved on to the South Island. Rain now affected mainly northern districts of the North Island and Gisborne besides the West Coast and Southland. On the following day yet another trough of low pressure caused rain to persist on the West Coast and in Southland, while some was also reported in Taranaki.

On the 16th a large anticyclone centred over New South Wales extended on to the Tasman Sea and New Zealand; however, there were still a few scattered showers. As the anticyclone moved eastward during the next 2 days the weather was mainly fine. However, on the 19th and 20th the weather in Northland and Gisborne was marred by rain in easterlies as a depression passed to the north of the country.

On the 21st and 22nd a small depression crossed the South Island with an associated trough, causing rain in Northland and also in western districts as far south as Hokitika. During the next 2 days a somewhat similar depression crossed the North Island, with rain there except in southern districts; and some rain also in Fiordland, Southland, and Otago. The period from the 25th to the 27th was one of westerlies, with pressures high to the north and low to the south. Rain was fairly general except in eastern districts.

During the last 3 days of the month a small depression formed over the northern half of the South Island and moved slowly eastward while an anticyclone was centred to the east of Campbell Island. In the easterlies, Canterbury and Otago reported misty conditions with considerable rain. Rain was also reported in western districts of the North Island and about Cook Strait.
