ORDER

- 1. This order shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1972.
- 2. The areas described in the first Schedule hereto are hereby excluded from the County of Southland and included in the city of Invercargill.
- 3. The area described in the second Schedule hereto is hereby excluded from the City of Invercargill and is included in the County of Southland,
- 4. The alteration of boundaries hereby made shall be deemed to have been effected under the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.

FIRST SCHEDULE

FIRSTLY, all that area in the Southland Land District, containing 16 acres 1 rood 25 perches, more or less, bounded by a line commencing at the north-west corner of Section 38, Block XV, Invercargill Hundred, and proceeding easterly

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April
- 2. The districts of the Borough of Taumarunui and of the Town District of Manunui are hereby united to form one borough to be known as the Borough of Taumarunui (hereinafter called the "said borough").
- 3. The Council of the Town District of Manunui is hereby dissolved.
- 4. Subject to the provisions of this order, the Council of the said borough shall consist of 9 Councillors, exclusive of the Mayor.
- 5. The first election of members of the Council of the said borough shall be held on the date prescribed by law for the next triennial general elections of members of borough councils.
- 6. Until the members of the Council of the said borough to be elected at the said first election shall come into office, the Council of the said borough shall consist of 9 Councillors exclusive of the Mayor, being:
- (a) The 7 Councillors of the Council of Taumarunui Borough in office on the 31st day of March 1972; and (b) Two Councillors of the Council of Manunui Town District in office on the 31st day of March 1972 to be chosen by that Council and, for the purpose of making that choice but for no other purpose, the Council shall, if necessary, continue in office after the 31st day of March 1972.
- 7. Until the Mayor to be elected at the said first election shall come into office, the Mayor of the said borough shall be the Mayor of the Borough of Taumarunui who was in office on the 31st day of March 1972.
- 8. For the purposes of the said first election only, the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall apply as if the said borough were divided into 2 wards with boundaries as follows:
- (a) The boundaries of the former Borough of Taumarunui as they existed at the 31st day of March 1972;

- (b) The boundaries of the former Town District of Manunui as they existed at the 31st day of March 1972;
- and the Council elected for the 3-year term of office following that election shall include 2 Councillors, exclusive of the Mayor, who each possess one of the qualifications specified in section 29 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 in respect of the area with the boundaries described in paragraph (b) of this clause.
- 9. The first Town Clerk of the said borough shall be the Town Clerk of the Borough of Taumarunui holding that office on the 31st day of March 1972.
- 10. The system of rating in the said borough shall be on the land value system subject, however, to the provisions of section 8 of the Valuation of Land Amendment Act (No. 2) 1970.
- 11. Until the valuation roll of the said borough is revised under section 10 of the Valuation of Land Act 1951, the provisions of Part IX of the Rating Act 1967 shall apply as if the said borough were the area of a special-purpose authority and the areas of the former districts of Taumarunui Borough and Manunui Town District were constituent districts of such special-purpose authority.
- 12. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967, the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall, with the necessary modifications and so far they are applicable, apply to the union hereby effected as if the former Borough of Taumarunui and the former Town District of Manunui had been united under that Act.
- 13. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications, the provisions of Section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the union hereby effected.
- 14. The Taumarunui Borough Council shall be the urban fire authority for the Manunui Secondary Urban Fire District as constituted immediately prior to the 1st day of April 1972.

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967, the Local Government Commission Act 1967, and the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941, His Excellency the Governortion and Rivers Control Act 1941, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby revokes the Order in Council made on the 13th day of December 1944, and published in Gazette, on the 14th day of December 1944, at pages 1503 and 1504, constituting the Rangitikei Catchment District, and revokes the Order in Council made on the 13th day of December 1944, and published in Gazette, on the 14th day of December 1944, at pages 1504 and 1505, declaring number of members and apportioning representation on the Rangitikei Catchment Board and hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title—This order may be cited as the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment District Order 1972.
- 2. Constitution of District and Water Region.—The area described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby constituted a catchment district within the meaning of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941, which district shall be known as the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment District, and shall become a water region within the meaning of the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967.
- 3. Interim constitution of Board—Until the members of the Board of the said catchment district are elected at the first triennial election of members after the constitution of the said catchment district, the Board shall consist of 5 non-elective members and 12 elective members, such elective members being:
 - (a) The 10 elective members of the former Rangitikei Catchment Board holding office immediately prior to the dissolution of that Board;

- (b) One member who shall be appointed on the nomination of the Councils of Wanganui City (P), Waitotara County, and Stratford County to represent the districts or parts of the districts of those local authorities;
 (c) One member who shall be appointed on the nomination of the Councils of the Taumarunui (P), Waitomo, Otorohanga, Taupo, and Clifton Counties, the Taumarunui Borough, and the Manunui and Ohura Town Districts to represent the districts of those local authorities. authorities.
- 4. Constitution of Board—Except for the period referred to in paragraph 3 of this order, the Board of the said catchment district shall consist of 5 non-elective members and 10 elective members with representation of such elective members being as follows:

Appointment of principal local authorities—The local authorities with the notation (P) immediately following their name, in paragraphs 3 and 4 of this order, are hereby appointed principal local authorities, within the meaning and for the purposes of subsection (3) of section 42 of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941.
- 6. Non-elective members Previous Orders in Council appointing non-elective members of the Rangitikei Catchment Board are revoked and the persons holding, for the time being, the offices of:

Farm Advisory Officer, Department of Agriculture, Wanganui:

Senior Forest Ranger, New Zealand Forest Service, Palmerston North;

District Civil Engineer, Ministry of Works, Wanganti; Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Wellington, Department of Lands and Survey, Wellington;

Scientist, Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, Wellington;

are appointed non-elective members of the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment Board.

- 7. Special provisions affecting part of catchment district—In respect of that part of the said district that comprises the area described in the Second Schedule hereto (being the greater parts of the Taumarunui and Waitotara Counties, parts of Otorohanga, Waitomo, Clifton, Stratford, Taupo, Waimarino, and Wanganui Counties, the City of Wanganui, the Borough of Taumarunui, and the Town Districts of Manunui and Ohura) the following provisions shall apply:
 - (a) The provisions of Part V of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941 shall not apply:

 Provided that they shall apply to the extent of any

Provided that they shall apply to the extent of any agreement to operate the whole or any part of the said Part V made, with the approval of the National Water and Soil Conservation Authority, between the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment Board and any territorial local authority having jurisdiction in the said area in respect of the whole or any part of the district of that local authority;

(b) The provisions of section 126 of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941 shall not apply:

Provided that they shall apply to the extent of any agreement to operate the provisions of that section made with the approval of the National Water and Soil Conservation Authority between the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment Board and any territorial local authority having jurisdiction in the said area in respect of the whole or any part of the district of that local

of the whole or any part of the district of that local authority;

(c) The provisions of subsection (1) of section 20 of the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967 shall be restricted to conform with the provisions of para-

graphs (a) to (d) of this clause; (d) Each territorial local authority having jurisdiction in the said area shall make by way of an annual contribution to the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment Board towards the administration costs incurred by the said Board in carrying out its functions under the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967 such sum or rate as may from time to time be fixed by any Act or regulation in that behalf.

Unless and until any such sum or rate has been so fixed the amount to be so paid shall be such sum as may be agreed upon between the territorial local authority and the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment Board; and, in the event of the failure of the territorial local authority and the said Board to agree on any such sum, then such sum as may be determined by the National Water and Soil Conservation Authority. In addition, the Rangitikei-Wanganui Catchment Board may levy any of the said territorial local authorities having jurisdiction over the said area for the cost of any work undertaken or proposed to be undertaken in the district of that local authority for the murposes of the Water and Soil Conservation for the purposes of the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967 as hereinbefore restricted; and the cost of the work may be increased by a percentage to provide the work may be increased by a percentage to provide for administration and other expenses in respect of the work as more particularly described in subsection (2) of section 84 of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Council Act 1941, which for this purpose shall be read as if the references in that subsection to that Act were references to the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967, such percentage being from time to time determined by agreement between the said local authority: said Board and the said local authority:

Provided that, where an agreement as referred to in the foregoing paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause is entered into with any territorial local authority, the provisions of this paragraph shall cease to operate or shall be modified in respect of the district of that territorial local authority to ensure compliance with the terms of the agreement.

8. The provisions of section 36 of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941 shall, with the necessary modifications, apply as if the constitution of the said district had been a union of districts under that section.

T-bar Lift: A surface lift having an inverted "T"-shaped device attached to the haul rope with passengers located on either or both sides of the stem of the "T".

Platter Lift: A surface lift having suspended from the haul rope a single stem with a platter or disc attached to its lower end upon which the passenger positions himself astride the

Ski Lift: The terms "ski lift" and "lift" includes both chair lifts and surface lifts.

Rope Tow: A device for the transportation of passengers uphill while remaining in contact with the snow, propulsion being by means of a circulating natural or synthetic fibre rope which the passenger graps or to which the passenger attaches himself by means of a rope gripping device.

The term "tow" includes a rope tow.

Qualified Engineer: A person approved by the Board to carry out inspections of ski lifts and tows.

Licensee: A licence holder operating a ski lift and/or a tow in the Tongariro National Park under the terms and conditions of a licence issued by the Tongariro National Park Board.

Chief Ranger: The Chief Ranger of the Tongariro National Park.

Haul Rope: The rope on a lift or tow moving up-hill.

Return Rope: The rope on a lift or tow moving down-hill.

Board: The Tongariro National Park Board.

Rope: Means wire rope or wire cable except for rope tows where "rope" means natural or synthetic fibre rope.

- 2. RECORDS: A licensee shall maintain the following records for each lift or tow:
- 2.1 Operational Log: An operational log book to be entered for each day of operations shall be maintained for each ski lift or tow specifying the following minimum information:

- (a) Date.
 (b) Operating hours.
 (c) Temperature, wind, and weather conditions.
 (d) Record of compliance with a daily operational inspection.
- (e) Position of tension carriage and counterweight. (f) Accidents, malfunctions, or abnormal occurrences during operation.

 (g) Names of attendants.
- 2.2 Maintenance Log: A record book shall be kept showing the execution of all maintenance and repair work, components serviced, components replaced, and the reason for the maintenance or repair.
- 2.3 Wire Rope Log: A record book shall be kept for each lift using wire rope showing:
 - (a) Specification of the rope in use.(b) Test reports.(c) Date installed.

- (c) Date instance.
 (d) Details of each splice.
 (e) Records of each lubrication, including type of lubricant, and date applied.
 (f) Records of each maintenance and annual inspection.
 (g) Reports of injury to rope.
- 2.4 The above records shall be produced on request to any statutory inspecting authority, to the inspector conducting annual inspections and to the Chief Ranger.

3. Inspection and Machinery:

3.1 Inspection:

- (a) The licensee shall, each winter, prior to the use of a surface lift or rope tow by the public, obtain a report from a qualified engineer as to the mechanical and/or structural integrity of all machinery, wire or fibre rope, pylons, sheaves, safety devices, foundations, and any other matter which, in the inspector's opinion, may affect the safety of the public while using the lift or tow.
 (b) The licensee shall ensure that the tow is in full operational condition for the inspection as aforesaid.
- said.
- (c) A copy of the inspector's report shall be deposited with the Board immediately on receipt by the licensee.
- (d) The licensee shall comply immediately with any requisitions of the Board arising from the inspector's
- report conveyed to him in writing.

 (e) A chair lift shall not carry a fare-paying passenger or passengers unless it is operated pursuant to a valid inspection certificate issued by the Marine Department.

3.2 Machinery:

- 3.2.1 All ski lift and tow driving machinery accessible to the public shall be housed, guarded, or screened in a manner that will prevent the public coming into contact with the machinery.
- 3.2.2 Except in the case of guide sheaves installed for the haul rope of a rope tow, all moving machinery including sheaves and rope return wheels shall be screened in a manner to prevent any person or his equipment coming into contact therewith unless the machinery is erected at least 7 ft above the snow surface.
- 3.2.3 When an internal combustion engine is used as a prime mover and is housed in a building accessible to the public the building shall be ventilated to prevent the products of combustion or fuel fumes from contaminating the atmosphere in the engine room.
- 3.2.4 Engine exhaust pipes shall discharge to the atmosphere and shall not pass within 2 in. of any wooden member or flammable material.
- 3.2.5 Fire extinguishers shall be installed in every engine room.
- 3.2.6 An exit shall be provided in every engine room to permit a person to leave rapidly in case of flash fire.
- 3.2.7 Guy wires or struts supporting any pylons, towers, or machinery which are likely to be struck by skiers and which are not in themselves obvious in adverse weather conditions shall be adequately marked and protected.

4. Counterweights and Tensioning Devices:

- 4.1 Counterweights or other suitable devices shall be provided to determine and regulate the tension of all haul ropes.
- 4.2 Counterweights, if used, shall be arranged to move freely up and down.
- 4.3 Enclosures for counterweights shall be provided where necessary to prevent snow or ice from accumulating under and around counterweights or otherwise interfering with their free movement.
- 4.4 Where enclosures are not provided, guardrails or screens shall be provided to prevent any person from coming into contact with or passing under counterweights.
- 4.5 A wire rope holding the counterweight shall not contain a splice.
- 4.6 End connections on counterweight ropes shall be such as to prevent failure or slippage under a tension equal to 80 percent of the strength of the rope and such end connections shall comply with the recommendations of the manufacturers of the wire rope and end fittings respectively.
- 4.7 Sections of wire rope permanently deformed or damaged shall not be used in any load bearing capacity.
- 4.8 Limit switches shall be installed to stop the lift or tow before any counterweight or tension carriage reaches either end of its travel.
- 4.9 If a counterweight is not used to tension a rope tow, an effective mechanical or hydraulic tensioning system shall be provided and the licensee shall ensure that the haul rope tension does not exceed a value of one-fifth of the design strength of the rope under the most unfavourable accumulation of stress due to loading and operating conditions.
- 4.10 Tension on the haul rope of rope tows shall be maintained at the minimum required to keep the haul rope above the snow surface but not exceeding the maximum tension provided in the preceding bylaw.

5. Brakes:

- 5.1 Chair lifts in addition to service and emergency brakes shall be fitted with an automatic overspeed control which shall interrupt the power to the prime mover and actuate the service brake or similar independent brake.
- 5.2 A backstop brake to prevent an unintended reverse rotation shall be fitted to all lifts and tows.
- 5.3 The service brake, emergency brake, and backstop brake shall be independent systems such that the failure of one system will not impair the function of the other systems.
- 5.4 Unless otherwise specified herein, braking systems actuated by emergency stop devices shall be capable of stopping the rope within a distance of 3 ft under no-load conditions.

6. ELECTRICAL

- 6.1 1. All high voltage electrical installations shall comply with the standard set by the local territorial power supply authority whether that authority supplies the power or not.
- 6.2 2. All high and low voltage cable shall be buried underground in a line approved by the Board and for which a site plan has been deposited with the Board.
- 6.3 3. All electrical stop control circuits including emergency or safety stop systems shall be energised circuits, so that, in the event of malfunction of a switch or of electrical power failure, the lift or tow shall be inoperative.
- 6.4 4. Terminal machinery, towers, and wire rope shall be effectively grounded.

7. COMMUNICATIONS:

- 7.1 A chair lift shall be provided with an effective means of communication between both terminals and with any intermediate station.
- 7.2 Communication and control cables may be supported by the towers supporting the lift or tow but low voltage circuits only shall be installed.

8. LOADING AND UNLOADING AREAS:

8.1 Chair Lifts:

- 8.1.1 A loading ramp shall be level, in the same plane as the wire rope, and so constructed that a passenger can stand comfortably on skis without sliding forwards or backwards.
- 8.1.2 If any side of a loading or unloading ramp or platform has a steep drop, a guardrail shall be provided for the protection of passengers, lift attendants, and bystanders.
- 8.1.3 If the chair exit end of a loading ramp or platform has a steep drop-off exceeding 6 ft from the chair seat a safety net shall be erected and maintained in a safe condition, extending a distance of at least 15 ft from the end of the loading area, and those portions of the supporting structure likely to be struck by a falling passenger shall be effectively protected to prevent injury to the passenger.
- 8.1.4 The entry to an unloading ramp shall be so constructed that skis worn by passengers cannot be caught under the edge of the ramp or platform and will be guided upwards towards the unloading point.
- 8.1.5 An unloading place shall be level to enable foot passengers to disembark and shall be followed where possible by an inclined ramp, sloping sufficiently downwards from the exit of the unloading area to enable passengers to ski away from the chair clear of any machinery.
- 8.1.6 A tower adjacent to a loading point shall be guarded in such a manner to prevent skis worn by passengers becoming caught in the tower when they are becoming settled in the chair.
- 8.1.7 Where passengers on double chair lifts are required to embark from and disembark to the same side of the chair, the loading and unloading areas shall be the subject of special design and shall be approved by the Board before use.

8.2 Surface Lifts:

- 8.2.1 Unless the terrain at the loading point is naturally suitable, the licensee shall construct and maintain easy access to the lift.
- 8.2.2 The loading area shall be as nearly flat as is possible and of sufficient length to permit the passenger to embark safely.
- 8.2.3 Unless the terrain is natually suitable, the licensee shall construct and maintain a flat or downward disengaging area for the passenger to disembark safely from the towing device.

8.2.4 The distance between the end of the unloading area and the upper terminal machinery shall be sufficient to allow the towing devices to become fully retracted and to permit their oscillations to diminish adequately before they enter the terminal.

8.3 Rope Tows:

- 8.3.1 The loading area shall be level, free of obstructions, and fenced in a manner to guide passengers to the loading point.
- 8.3.2 The unloading area shall be either flat or graded downwards and outwards from the line of the uphili track to provide movement away from the tow.
- 8.3.3 In the case of a rope tow using intermediate guide sheaves requiring the use of a rope gripping device, the loading area shall extend at least 30 ft before the first pylon is reached.

9. LIFT AND Tow LINES: (Surface Lifts and Rope Tows)

- 9.1 With the prior approval of the Board, a track width along the lift or tow line shall be cleared and maintained in such a manner that no rocks or other obstructions project above the snow surface for the full usable length of the lift or tow to a distance of 3 ft on either side of the centre line of the uphill track.
- 9.2 The designated track width shall be maintained free of snow ridges, wind scour, and humps and hollows likely to unbalance a passenger of ability constent with the lift or tow in use.
- 9.3 With the prior approval of the Board, the licensee shall fill with rock all downhill sections along the usable length of the lift or tow over the designated width.

10. CLEARANCES:

10.1 Chair Lifts:

- 10.1.1 Where ski-ing is permitted beneath the lift line there shall be maintained a minimum vertical distance of 10 ft between the snow surface and the lowest point of a chair under conditions of maximum rope sag.
- 10.1.2 Where, because of abnormal snow build-up beneath the lift line, the minimum vertical distance of 10 ft cannot be maintained at any point, the licensee shall erect an effective barricade to prevent persons ski-ing or walking beneath the lift at that point or points.
- 10.1.3 The licensee shall not operate the chair lift in the event of abnormal snow build-up permitting chairs to strike the snow at any point.
- 10.1.4 Chair-lift terminals and towers shall not be constructed containing provision for change of the design height of the wire rope.

10.2 Surface Lifts:

- 10.2.1 Terminals and towers shall be located so that under the most adverse conditions, the towing device will not lift a passenger from the snow surface.
- 10.2.2 The haul rope shall, at all times, be high enough to clear a passenger's head by at least 2 ft.
- 10.2.3 The return rope shall be of sufficient height to keep down-coming towing devices clear of the snow.
- 10.2.4 The towers shall be of such a height and so located, that, if the up-going haul rope comes off the sup-porting sheave or sheaves of one tower, the towers (or terminal) on either side will support the rope clear of the snow by a minimum of 2 ft.
- 10.2.5 Where towers have provision to vary the height of the sheaves above the snow, changes in height of the sheaves shall be controlled in a manner to prevent overloading or underloading the tower sheave assemblies and any such changes shall be made only in accordance with the designers or manufacturers specifications.

10.3 Rope Tows:

- 10.3.1 The return rope and its supporting sheaves shall be kept at all times not less than 7 ft above the snow surface.
- 10.3.2 Where for technical reasons the return rope runs in the same plane parallel to or intersects the up-going haul rope and the return rope is less than 4 ft horizontally from the haul rope, this portion shall be barricaded off and shall not form part of the usable length of the tow.
- 10.3.3 There shall be a minimum distance of 3ft between the haul rope and any pylon located between the loading and unloading areas.
- 10.3.4 Spikes, hooks, or other projections shall not be placed on rope supports lower than 7 ft above the snow surface.

- 11. Speeds: Lifts and tows shall not be operated at speeds greater than those specified by the manufacturer.
- 12. LOADING: Lifts and tows shall not be operated with loadings greater than those specified by the manufacturer.

13. STRUCTURES AND FOUNDATIONS:

- 13.1 All structures and foundations shall be adequate for the highest loading to be imposed and design loads shall include all loads which will be encountered during operations.
- 13.2 Structures and foundations located in snow creep areas shall be capable of bearing such loading or shall be protected by adequate snow breakers or snow shears.
- 13.3 Rope tow pylons shall be firmly supported in the ground below ground level.
- 14. FUEL: Liquid fuel shall be used and stored in accordance with the Dangerous Goods Act 1957.
- 15. Signs: The following signs either written or conveyed pictorially shall be displayed at the appropriate places:

CHAIR LIFTS:

- 1. "IF NOT FAMILIAR WITH USE OF LIFT ASK ATTENDANT FOR INSTRUCTIONS."
 2. "PREPARE TO DISMOUNT."
 3. "KEEP SKI TIPS UP." (ahead of any point where skis
- may come in contact with a platform or the snow surface.)
- 4. "DISMOUNT HERE."
- 5. "REMOVE POLE STRAPS FROM WRISTS."
 6. "IF CHAIR LIFT STOPS . . . " (Passenger to be told what he must do.)
- 7. A sign showing the correct method of using safety bars. SURFACE LIFTS:

 - 1. "IF NOT FAMILIAR WITH USE OF LIFT ASK ATTENDANT FOR INSTRUCTIONS."

 2. "PREPARE TO DISMOUNT."

 3. "STAY IN TRACK."

 4. "DISMOUNT HERE."

 5. "REMOVE POLE STRAPS FROM WRISTS."

 6. "IF EMERGENCY STOP USED ADVISE ATTENDANT, LIFT WILL NOT BE STARTED UNTIL YOU DO."

 7. "STOP LIFT IF T-BAR (POMA DISC) DOES NOT RETRACT."

Tows:

- OWS:

 1. "IF NOT FAMILIAR WITH USE OF TOW ASK ATTENDANT FOR INSTRUCTIONS."

 2. "NO LOOSE SCARVES,
 NO LOOSE CLOTHING,
 NO LONG HAIR EXPOSED."

 3. "REMOVE POLE STRAPS FROM WRISTS."

 4. "RELEASE ROPE IF OBSTRUCTION ON TRACK."

 5. "IF EMERGENCY STOP USED ADVISE ATTENDANT, TOW WILL NOT BE STARTED UNTIL YOU DO." (To be used when attendant cannot see the full length of the tow line.)

16. OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE MANUALS:

- 16.1 A licensee operating a chair lift or surface lift shall obtain from the manufacturer or designer, 2 copies of an operational manual for each installation, one of which shall be deposited with the chief ranger.
- 16.2 The operational manual shall contain the design criteria in respect of the chair lift or surface lift and shall describe the function and operation of the components and instructions for the correct usage of the installation and specifications for wire rope used in any load bearing capacity.
- 16.3 A licensee operating a chair lift or surface lift shall obtain from the manufacturer or designer, 2 copies of a maintenance manual, one of which shall be deposited with the chief ranger.
- 16.4 The maintenance manual shall describe recommended maintenance procedures including:
 - (a) Types of lubricants required and frequency of application.
 - (b) Definitions and measurements to determine excessive wear.
 - (c) Recommended frequency of service to specific components including relocation of fixed grips if applicable.
 - (d) A specific period of time which shall represent one complete cycle of maintenance operations for all component parts assigning a time or times within that cycle for the inspection of and the maintenance work on each component either on an hours run or other periodic basis.

- 16.5 A licensee operating a chair lift, surface lift, or tow shall prepare daily and other routine inspection and maintenance schedules, a copy of which shall be deposited with the Chief Ranger.
- 16.6 Compliance with the inspection and maintenance procedures shall be entered in the operational and maintenance leg books.

17. OPERATIONS:

- 17.1 A licensee shall prepare ski lift or tow operating instructions, a copy of which, as well as amendments thereto, shall be deposited with the Chief Ranger.
- 17.2 The operating instructions shall be directions to the licensee's staff for the safe operation of the licensee's facilities and shall include emergency operations and shall contain a direction that a lift or tow shall not be restarted after an emergency stop has been actuated unless the attendant has been told of the reason for the stoppage and is satisfied that it is safe to restart the lift or tow.
- 17.3 No person shall start a lift or tow after a stoppage unless he has been informed of the reason for the stoppage and he is satisfied that it is safe to restart.
- A licensee shall ensure that each staff member is fully conversant with procedures to evacuate passengers from a chair lift whether for emergency reasons or not.
- 17.5 The licensee shall ensure that, where a chair lift stops during adverse weather conditions likely to subject passengers to exposure (hypothermia), passengers are removed from the chair lift in the quickest possible time.
- A licensee operating a chair lift shall, at the request of the Board, ensure that all ski patrol members and Park Rangers are conversant with chair lift evacuation procedures.
- 17.7 An attendant in charge of a lift or tow who is fully conversant with the operation of all braking systems and is conversant with the methods of starting the lift or tow after a stoppage including the use of auxiliary drive motors on chair lifts shall be stationed at the terminal containing the driving machinery.
- 17.8 If directed by the Board, a licensee operating a chair lift shall install a wind gauge on the most exposed point along a chair lift line and which shall operate a conspicuous warning device when wind velocity reaches a designated maximum. When wind conditions, as determined by the warning device, or by observation by a lift attendant make the continued operation of the chair lift dangerous, emergency procedures covering such a situation shall be used for the unloading of passengers and use of the lift shall be discontinued.

18. MINIMUM OPERATING PERSONNEL:

- 18.1 Chair Lifts: The licensee shall provide one qualified person to be in charge of the chair lift when operating and at least one attendant on duty at each loading area and one attendant at each unloading area, provided that:
 - (a) The person in charge shall be stationed at the loading area immediately adjacent to the driving machinery and may serve concurrently as an attendant at that area unless his duties as an attendant preclude his maintaining surveillance of the operation of the lift.
- (b) An area used for both unloading and loading may be manned by a single attendant when both loading and unloading of chairs is not carried out simultaneously and the loading and unloading can be adequately supervised by one attendant.

 18.2 Surface Lifts: The licensee shall provide at least one qualified person to be in charge of the lift who shall be stationed at the loading area immediately adjacent to the driving machinery.
- driving machinery.

Where the operator in charge cannot see the entire length of the lift including the unloading area, the licensee shall, at the direction of the Board, station one or more attendants at a point or points along the line of the lift or at any unloading point as designated by the Board.

18.3 Tows: The licensee shall station at least one attendant at each tow at each loading point provided that if 2 or more tows are immediately adjacent to one another and the attendant can see the entire length of each tow and the attendant can adequately keep the use of the tows under surveillance and he has effective means to stop each tow under his immediate control then one attendant may, at the discretion of the licensee, supervise the operation of more than one tow.

19. EMERGENCY STOP DEVICES:

19.1 Chair Lifts:

19.1.1 Each chair lift shall be equipped at each loading and unloading area, in a position immediately adjacent to the attendant, with a device to stop the chair lift.

- 19.1.2 Each such device shall be clearly marked "Emergency Stop".
- 19.1.3 An automatic stopping device shall be fitted to stop the chair lift in the event of the rope departing from its normal running position or derailing from any sheave or sheave train.

19.2 Surface Lifts:

- 19.2.1 Each lift shall be equipped at each loading and unloading point with a device to stop the lift.
- 19.2.2 If the attendant in charge cannot see the entire length of the lift line further lift stop devices shall be installed at points designated by the Board along the lift line.
- 19.2.3 Each stop device shall be clearly marked "Emergency Stop".
- 19.2.4 Each lift shall be equipped at or near the upper terminal with an automatic safety stop which will be actuated when a passenger who has not released the towing device at a predetermined distance from the upper terminal installation and which will bring the rope to a stop within half the distance between the stop device and the upper terminal installation or in every case before the passenger or his equipment comes into contact with any machinery or other obstacle.

19.3 Fibre Rope Tows:

- 19.3.1 Each tow shall be equipped adjacent to and in front of the loading point with a device to stop the tow.
- 19.3.2 Further stop devices shall be installed at points along the tow line as designated by the Board.
- 19.3.3 Each stop device shall be clearly marked "Emergency Stop".
- 19.3.4 An effective automatic tow stop device shall be erected at the unloading point across the tow line in such a manner that it is actuated by a passenger who has passed the unloading area.

The automatic tow stop device shall be capable of bringing the tow to a full stop in half the distance between the stop device and the tow terminal machinery and in every case before the passenger or his equipment can come into contact with the machinery or any other obstacle.

19.3.5 In the case of fibre rope tows having intermediate guide sheaves requiring the use of a rope gripping device, emergency stop devices shall be installed on each rope support pylon and clearly marked "Emergency Stop" provided that in place of emergency stop devices on each pylon, a mechanical stop system of rope or wire may be employed along the length of the tow in such a manner that a pressure of no more than 15 lb applied at any point to the safety rope or wire will actuate the tow stop mechanism and provided also that in the event of breakage or other failure of the safety rope or wire, the tow is brought to a stop.

20. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

20.1 Chair Lifts:

- 20.1.1 Each tower shall be fitted with an anti-crash bar designed to prevent chairs or the arm of the chair striking any part of the tower unless the designer of the chair lift certifies to the satisfaction of the Board that either an anti-crash bar is unnecessary or would create a greater hazard than that desired to be avoided by the fitting thereof.
- 20.1.2 Chairs shall be equipped with a railing at each side, to a height of not less than 6 in. above the seat for a distance of not less than 12 in. from the back of the seat.
- 20.1.3 Chairs shall have rounded corners and have no projections which may catch clothing, straps, or any equipment carried by the passenger.
- 20.1.4 The licensee shall not permit the use of the lift by any person carrying anything likely to impede that person in using the lift in a safe and proper manner.
- 20.1.5 Each chair shall be fitted with a safety bar in front of the passenger fitted in such a manner that a passenger is unable to fall forward out of the chair unless the designer of the chair lift certifies to the satisfaction of the Board that because of the design of the chair a safety bar is unnecessary or would create a greater hazard than that desired to be avoided by the fitting thereof.
- 20.1.6 Adequate rescue equipment shall be provided for each chair lift for removing passengers from suspended chairs in the shortest possible time in the event of a complete stoppage.
- 20.1.7 Except in an emergency or for the conveyance of sick or injured persons, no person shall be permitted to use the chair lift except in the chairs provided.

- 20.1.8 Passengers on a chair lift shall remain seated and shall use the facility in an orderly and proper manner and shall not throw or expel therefrom any object or do any act or thing which shall interfere with the operation of the chair lift.
- 20.1.9 A person shall not embark or disembark at other than attended loading and unloading points.
- 20.1.10 Each chair lift shall be fitted with an auxiliary internal combustion motor which shall be maintained in such a condition that it can be brought quickly into use in the event of a power failure or other stoppage requiring the immediate unloading of passengers.

20.2 Surface Lifts:

- 20.2.1 Any towing device which envelopes the passenger, such as a strap, shall not be installed.
- 20.2.2 If any retractable towing device fails to retract, the lift shall be stopped immediately and the device removed from the rope.
- 20.2.3 Except with the specific approval of the Board given under such terms and conditions as it thinks fit, a surface lift requiring the passenger to hold the towing device while it retracts shall not be permitted.
- 20.2.4 Towing devices shall be of sufficient length so that the shortest passenger remains in firm contact with the snow at all times.
- 20.2.5 T-bar type towing attachments shall be of durable material and shape and of sufficient width so that the passenger is held into the bar and does not tend to slip off the end.
- 20.2.6 Wooden T-bars shall be constructed of wood which does not splinter in the event of damage.
- 20.2.7 Disc or platter type attachments shall have rounded edges and shall be of sufficient width to enable the passenger to position himself comfortably during travel.
- 20.2.8 Towing devices which do not accelerate the passenger smoothly from a standing start shall be removed from the rope.
- 20.2.9 A surface lift shall not be operated if any part of the usable length between the loading and unloading points has a reverse (downward) slope.

20.3 Fibre Rope Tows:

- 20.3.1 Novice rope tows shall not contain intermediate guide sheaves on the haul rope between the loading and unloading areas.
- 20.3.2 The prime mover of a rope tow shall have sufficient power output to start the tow when fully loaded and speed reducers shall have ample capacity to withstand starting the tow when fully loaded.
- 20.3.3 Where used, clutches shall be of ample size to carry the load and permit controlled slipping for smooth acceleration during starting without overheating.
- 20.3.4 A satisfactory method shall be provided to ensure smooth acceleration when starting from a full stop whether under no load or maximum load conditions.
 - 20.3.5 Constant operating speed shall be maintained.
- 20.3.6 Rope drive and idler sheaves shall be of such design and so arranged as to prevent undue stressing, wear, or disfiguration of the rope.
- 20.3.7 Rope drive sheaves, idler sheaves, return or head sheaves and deflection sheaves shall be sheaves, pulleys, or wheels grooved for the diameter of rope in use.
- 20.3.8 Counterweights or other tensioning devices shall be adequate to prevent the rope slipping on the drive sheave but shall not impose excessive tension on the haul rope.
- 20.3.9 When the haul rope is correctly tensioned but tension is insufficient to retain the return rope in the grooves of one or more of the return rope sheaves at all times, a suitable device shall be used to prevent the rope leaving the sheave or sheaves.
- 20.3.10 A head sheave positioned at the end of the tow opposite the drive mechanism shall be grooved and mounted so that the rope cannot jump off the sheave. It shall be mounted in a manner to prevent the sheave falling to the ground if the rope breaks.
- 20.3.11 The licensee shall each day, before use by the public, ensure that the tow is inspected for satisfactory operation and that all safety devices are functioning.
- 20.3.12 The rope shall be manila or synthetic fibre rope of a type selected as suitable for ski tow use with a special lay or braid to minimise twist.

- 20.3.13 The licensee shall ensure that a new fibre rope has been reeled by the manufacturer in a manner to minimise twist, and the manufacturers' instructions for unreeling and installation shall be followed.
- 20.3.14 Ropes shall not be used unless rotation of the up-going haul rope is minimal and in no case is greater than one complete revolution in 200 ft of travel.
- 20.3.15 Temporary short splices may be used to join a rope which breaks during towing operations, but the licensee shall ensure that a short splice is replaced by a long (transmission) splice before use by the public on the next day of opera-
- 20.3.16 The haul rope shall be maintained at all times above the snow at a height convenient for use.
- 20.3.17 A tow shall not be operated if any part of the usable length has a reverse (downward) slope except for gradual inclines at loading and unloading points.
- At no point between the loading and unloading areas shall the rope exert a downward force greater than 35 lb nor an upward force greater than 30 lb when held at a height of 2 ft above the snow surface by a single passenger.
- 21 ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR FIBRE ROPE Tows which have intermediate guide sheaves between the loading and unloading points on the up-going haul rope.
- 21.1 A licensee operating this type of rope tow shall not permit the use of the tow by any person not using a rope gripping device and shall display a notice to this effect.
- 21.2 No person shall use a rope tow with intermediate line sheaves without employing a rope gripping device.
- 21.3 The licensee shall not permit the use of a rope gripping device which does not release the rope when the user releases his grasp.
- 21.4 The licensee shall not operate the tow if snow conditions are such that any passenger is being lifted clear of the snow surface at any point.
- 21.5 Intermediate sheaves between the loading and unloading areas shall be adequately grooved to accept the diameter of the rope in use.
- 21.6 Intermediate sheaves shall be fully adjustable vertically and shall be adjusted to keep the rope at a convenient level for the passengers at all times.
- Each intermediate sheave shall have a ropeguard on the top and bottom to prevent the rope coming off the sheave to the inside of the sheave nearest the support pylon and shall be so constructed as not to impair the passage of the rope gripping device over the sheave or cause any additional hazard to the passenger.
- 21.8 Where sheaves are used in tandem and the rope passes 21.0 where sheaves are used in tandem and the rope passes over the top of one and underneath the other, the circumference of one sheave shall not be closer than 8 in. to the cirumference of the other and the loading of the rope on either sheave shall be kept to a minimum.

22. Specific Departures:

- 22.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any of the preceding bylaws the Board may in writing on such terms and conditions as it deems fit grant a specific departure from any bylaw if the Board is satisfied that such specific departure is an adequate substitute for the bylaw or that the bylaw does not adequately cover the device operating condition or any other circumstances.
- 22.2 An application for a specified departure shall be made in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Board. Each application shall contain full reasons for the departure sought together with a previous history of operations carried out in the proposed manner and details of any accidents that have occurred under such operation.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY 1972

General-February was dry and sunny; in the South Island it was one of the driest months on record. An unusually high frequency of southerly winds brought more relatively cool and cloudy weather east of the ranges than elsewhere. In most districts conditions were considered to be too dry, and in parts of the North Island dairy production was falling rapidly. On the other hand, in Otago and Southland the dry weather was welcomed after the unsettled spell in January as giving an opportunity for harvesting.

Rainfull—The only area with rainfall above normal was part of the ranges of Gisborne and Hawke's Bay with Wairoa. In the North Island totals were about half the normal value, in the South Island only a third. Westland, the Alps, the Canterbury high country, and the greater part of Central Otago received less than a quarter of the normal rainfall. Lakes Wakatipu, Hawea, Wanaka, and Ohau with an area extending to Paringa in South Westland had totals of less than a tenth of the normal.

Temperatures—Temperatures were below normal east of the ranges, except in Otago, by up to nearly 2°c (in Hawke's Bay).

They were above normal by up to 1°C on the West Coast, in the Alps and in Central Otago. On the average the North Island was 0.7°C cooler than normal while the South Island was close to normal. The coolest period was the first 10 days.

Sunshine—Sunshine was above normal by up to 90 hours, except in eastern districts, where it was mainly close to normal. Western districts, the Taumarunui-Taupo-Taihape area, and inland Canterbury were especially favoured. Lake Tekapo's total of 276 hours was a record for February but New Plymouth's 281 hours was the highest.

Weather Sequence—During the first 2 days of February a trough and its associated small depression moved off to the east while an anticyclone was centred over the Tasman Sea. In the cool southerlies rain was reported in eastern districts of the North Island besides Marlborough and Nelson. From the 3rd to the 7th the anticyclone remained over the Tasman Sea, and a ridge of high pressure extended over New Zealand. The weather was settled apart from isolated showers. However, in Gisborne the showers were quite frequent, especially on the 5th. On the 8th and 9th an anticyclone was centred near Tasmania and a trough of low pressure crossed New Zealand, with a small depression forming to the east. Cool southerlies predominated once again, with general rain, mainly light. During the next 2 days the anticyclone was centred over the Tasman Sea while pressures were low to the north-east of the North Island. In the southeasterlies there was considerable rain in Gisborne on the 10th, and on the following day light showers affected the northern half of the South Island and eastern districts of the North Island.

The period from the 12th to the 19th was one of mainly settled

The period from the 12th to the 19th was one of mainly settled weather. From the 12th to the 16th an extensive belt of high pressure covered the South Tasman Sea and the South Island and extended out towards the Chatham Islands, while pressures were low to the north-east of the country. During this period the weather was unsettled over eastern Northland with frequent showers in the easterlies. For the next 3 days the anticyclone moved slowly north-eastward over New Zealand. Showers were reported at times over the southern half of the South Island, and Fiordland had considerable rain on the 19th.

Pressures were comparatively low over New Zealand on the 20th and 21st, with a shallow low pressure centre over the country and one also over the Tasman Sea. The weather was unsettled over the North Island and parts of the South Island with light rain at times. There was a temporary improvement on the following day but the weather deteriorated again on the 23rd and 24th as a shallow depression passed through Cook Strait and the associated trough of low pressure crossed New Zealand. General rain was reported, with some considerable falls in parts of the North Island.

On the 25th an anticyclone extended over New Zealand from the Tasman Sea but conditions remained rather unsettled in the easterlies in some northern districts, with light showers at times. The anticyclone remained centred over the northern Tasman Sea, and for the last 4 days of the month the weather was settled over the whole country.
