ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Whangamomona Pest Destruction District Order 1972.

2. The boundaries of the Whangamomona Pest Destruction District, which was constituted by Order in Council on the 22nd day of February 1926*, are hereby altered and redefined and, as from the commencement of this order, the boundaries of the said district shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

Constitution of the West Coast Electric Power Board

ARTHUR PORRITT, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 27th day of March 1972

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Electricity Distribution Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Interpretation—In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,

 - "Appointed day" means 1 April 1972.
 "The Board" means the West Coast Electric Power
 Board constituted under clause 3 of this order.
 "Original boards" means the Grey Electric Power Board,
 the Westland Electric Power Board, and the Amethyst
 Electric Power Board, as constituted on the appointed
 - "Original districts" means the districts of the original boards.
- Constitution of West Coast Electric Power District-The original districts are hereby united and together extended to form the West Coast Electric Power District as defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. Constitution of West Coast Electric Power Board-The West Coast Electric Power Board is hereby constituted for the purpose of administering the supply of electricity in the West Coast Electric Power District, and is hereby deemed to be a board constituted under the Electric Power Boards Act 1925.
- 4. Original Boards Dissolved—(a) The original boards are
- hereby dissolved.

 (b) All assets, liabilities, credits, debts, and choses in action of the original boards, including all unpaid rates levied by the original boards and the benefit of or liability of or for any legal proceedings by or against the original boards, shall become the assets and liabilities of the Board on the appointed day, and the Board shall have the full right and privilege to get in all such assets and liabilities and to sue for and recover all such debts and other matters and things as the original boards would have been entitled to do but for this order.
- (c) The assets and liabilities of the original boards shall be shown in the Board's accounts at the values shown in the current audited statements of accounts of the original boards.
- 5. Representation—(a) On and after the appointed day each group of constituent districts which is bracketed together in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto shall be a combined district for the purposes of the Electric
- Power Boards Act 1925.

 (b) The local authority of the constituent district distinguished in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto by the letter "P" shall be the principal local authority of the combined district of which that constituent district forms part.

(c) The number of representatives of each constituent district or combined district shall be the number specified in the Second Schedule hereto opposite the name of that constituent district or combined district.

(d) The first representatives of the constituent districts, and combined districts shall be those persons who, prior to the appointed day, have been nominated by the original boards to occupy seats on the Board.

The first representatives shall hold office until the next triennial local body election, and all subsequent representatives of the constituent districts and combined districts shall be elected by the electors of those districts.

- 6. Tariffs—The tariffs charged by each of the original boards as at 31 March 1972 shall remain in force until new tariffs are fixed by the Board. The equalisation of tariffs throughout the area shall be effected by the Board within 3 years of the appointed day.
- 7. Staff—As required by the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963, the Board shall continue to employ all permanent employees of the original boards.
- 8. Fox Glacier Hydro-Electric Ltd.—The Board shall acquire without undue delay, all assets of Fox Glacier Hydro-Electric Ltd., excepting the stand-by diesel plant, at a price and with a method of payment to be approved by the Electricity Distribution Commission. The Board shall extend the system constitution for the New Zeel and the system of the control of the system of the sy extend the system supplied from the New Zealand Electricity Department to include the district now supplied by Fox Glacier Hydro-Electric Ltd. and shall take whatever steps are necessary to ensure an adequate supply in that area.
- 9. Orders in Council Revoked and Effective Date—
 (a) The Orders in Council specified in the Third Schedule hereto, relating to the original boards, are hereby revoked.
 (b) This order shall come into force on the appointed day.

Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of an application by the Secretary for Justice for a decision in respect of the book *The Little Red School-book* by Soren Hansen and Jesper Jensen, published by Alister Taylor.

The Tribunal comprised: Mr R. S. V. Simpson (Chairman), Mrs Joan Cochran, Mr S. F. W. Johnston, Mr D. M. Wylie, and Mr L. M. Graham.

Hearing: 13 and 20 March 1972. Mr B. J. Cameron appeared for the Secretary for Justice and Mr H. C. MacNeill, counsel for the publisher.

Decision: 28 March 1972.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

The Little Red School-book by the Danish writers Soren Hansen and Jesper Jensen was translated into English by Berit Thornberry, and from this translation a British version was produced. The New Zealand edition submitted to the Tribunal by the Secretary for Justice was based on this British version which was the subject of a prosecution in the British Courts last year. As a result of the prosecution, a revised British edition was published and is now on sale. It was accepted by all parties that the prosecution of the British edition was not relevant in New Zealand because of the differences in the law.

It was stated, in evidence, that the New Zealand book was edited and revised by a group comprising a teacher, an editor, a journalist, a university student, and a secondary school student—a rough draft then being referred to a diverse number of people, amongst them doctors, government departmental officials, teachers, and a lawyer for their comments, criticisms, and suggestions. In the light of their remarks the text was settled and published as the New Zealand edition.

The book is a paperback of pocket-size and retails at \$1.50. It has been on sale in many bookshops throughout New Zealand and we have been advised that the sales have been heavy.

The book has basically four sections; the educational section, which falls at the front and the back of the book and which is by far the largest section; the sex section, which covers about 10 percent of the book; the drugs section; and lastly, the appendices, which list organisations able to assist young people.

The stated purpose of the book is that it should be a reference book used by young people when needed, and the hope is expressed by the authors that it will help to solve problems which they claim are much the same for schoolchildren everywhere, and to show some of them how they can influence their own lives. It suggests that young people should think things out for themselves and base their judgment on what they really believe.

At the hearing, Mr B. J. Cameron appeared for the Secretary for Justice and addressed the Tribunal on the written submission of the Secretary, but did not offer evidence. Mr Cameron drew attention to the opening paragraph of the submission in which the Secretary states that "this book is submitted to the Tribunal because it is considered to present an issue of public interest and importance . . ". During the course of the proceedings, Mr Peter Robert Wilkinson, a school-teacher, applied to be joined as a party to the proceedings under section 14 (6). The application was declined but, at the suggestion of the Tribunal, Mr Cameron agreed to call him as a witness and to put in his written submission.

Mr. H. C. MacNeill, counsel for the publisher Mr. Alictor

Mr H. C. MacNeill, counsel for the publisher Mr Alister Taylor, made lengthy submissions on his behalf, called him in support of the submissions and also eight other witnesses. The Tribunal does not consider it necessary to traverse this evidence.

As this decision will be of considerable public interest and read by many people who are not conversant with the workings of the Tribunal, the members think that it would be appropriate to outline briefly the functions and obligations conferred on the Tribunal by the Act.

The functions of the Tribunal are given in section 10 of the Act and the parts relevant to these proceedings read as follows:

"(a) To determine the character of any book . . . submitted to it for classification:

"(b) To classify books . . . submitted to it as indecent or not indecent or as indecent in the hands of persons under a specified age or as indecent unless their circulation is restricted to specified persons or classes of persons or unless used for a particular purpose, as the case may be."

In section 2 of the Act the term "indecent" is defined as: "'Indecent' includes describing, depicting, expressing, or otherwise dealing with matters of sex, horror, crime, cruelty, or violence in a manner that is injurious to the public good.'

In classifying or determining the character of a book the Tribunal must take into consideration certain matters. These are given in section 11 (1) as follows:

"(a) The dominant effect of the book . . . as a whole:
"(b) The literary or artistic merit, or the medical, legal,
political, social, or scientific character or importance
of the book . . . :

"(c) The persons, classes of persons, or age groups to or amongst whom the book . . . is intended or is likely to be published, heard, distributed, sold, exhibited, . . given, sent, or delivered:

"(d) The price at which the book . . . sells or is intended to

be sold:

"(e) Whether any person is likely to be corrupted by reading the book . . . and whether other persons are likely to benefit therefrom:

"(f) Whether the book . . . displays an honest purpose and an honest thread of thought or whether its content is merely campullage designed to render acceptable any merely camouflage designed to render acceptable any indecent parts of the book"

Subsection (2) of section 11 states:

"Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) where the publication of any book . . . would be in the interest of art, literature, science, or learning and would be for the public good, the Tribunal shall not classify it as indecent."

In determining the character of a book the Tribunal invariably has found it necessary to consider the scope of the term "indecent" as it is used in the Act. Since the case of Robson v. Hicks Smith and Sons Ltd. 1965, NZLR 1113, the Tribunal has accepted the interpretation placed on the term by the Court. The facts of that case are of no importance one) that has been taken on appeal to the Supreme Court, which under section 19 (4) of the Act must comprise three Judges, the Court thought it desirable to discuss the relevant provision of the Act, which had not previously been interpreted.

Woodhouse, J. at p. 1122, referring to the definition of "indecent" as given in section 2, stated:

"This is not a comprehensive definition, and on this ground we were invited to hold that the term "indecent" was used in the Act with its ordinary meaning. But in my opinion there are two principal reasons against this submission. In the first place the definition itself deliberately includes, as indecent, noxious material which has a capacity to injure the public good. In this way a distinction seems to be drawn between such material and that which has a less harmful tendency whether it is otherwise noxious or not. To put the matter in another it is otherwise noxious or not. To put the matter in another way, I think that if it has been thought necessary to include in express terms such description of sexual matters, for example as are injurious to the public good, then anything less than this can hardly be brought in by implication. Secondly, I think that this interpretation of the word is in accord with the development of legislation of this type. For many years the test of indecent material has not been equated with that which is merely unwholesome or offensive; it has involved something with a more malignant flavour, and the power of the material to contaminate." to contaminate."

Again, at p. 1123, he says:

"In the exercise of either of its functions the issue before the Tribunal must be decided in relation to the word "indecent" as that word is used in the Act, and this is a question of degree to be tested against that level of harm which can be recognised as injurious to the public good. It is a practical question involving an exercise of informed judgment. There must be an adequate understanding of contemporary standards and aspirations and the decision must be made in terms of the real world as it actually is today."

We would also like to refer to the judgment of Haslam, J. in which at p. 1120, in discussing section 11 (2) of the Act (see ante), he says:

"The words of subsection (2) leads me to the conclusion that the effect of the publication of a book upon the 'public that the the remainder of the publication and the subsection are subsection to the subsection of the subsection of the subsection are subsection. that the effect of the publication of a book upon the 'public good' is to be the primary element in its classification, and that this expression of variable content, designed to direct attention to the impact of a published work upon the community, is expressly left undefined, so that the Tribunal may exercise its statutory powers with due regard to changing conditions."

In applying these provisions of the Act to The Little Red Schoolbook, no question of the treatment of horror, crime, cruelty, or violence arises. The question of indecency arises in

respect of the treatment of sex and it can be settled only by relating the section of the book dealing with sex to the rest of the contents of the book, and by relating the book as a whole to the situation in the community. The principal issues raised in the submissions and evidence will be discussed in relation to this premise.

First, the dominant effect of the book as a whole. The Secretary for Justice doubted whether this test would be of much assistance as only one chapter (that dealing with sex) was really in issue. With respect, we disagree. Although the was really in issue. With respect, we disagree. Although the greater part of the submissions dealt with that section of the book, the Tribunal is required to consider it only in its particular context, that is, the 1972 New Zealand edition of *The Little Red Schoolbook*. The Tribunal is not required to say, for example, what its attitude might be if the section on sex had been published on its own or in any other context.

Second, the relevance of the material in the book dealing with educational issues. This is the major part, about two-thirds, of the total contents. We heard a number of witnesses on this material, and we received some written statements as well. In the eyes of some, it is intended to be totally destructive of the school system and anti-authoritarian and therefore to be banned. In the eyes of others, it is intended to be constructive and to improve the school system for all concerned, pupils, teachers and parents. They see it as productive, potentially at least, of good. Even among the witnesses who generally supported the publisher's action in producing the New Zealand edition, there were caveats entered about some statements in it as inadequate, inaccurate, and too sweeping in their generalisations. Some letters sent to the Tribunal give the impression that their writers fear the book will incite schoolchildren to violent revolutionary action. Against this can be set the view that the book informs them how they can act within the system and advises them to try dialogue before direct action. Whatever view may be taken of this material—that it is irres-Whatever view may be taken of this material—that it is irresponsible, that some of its statements are misleading, that it is in places contradictory, that fact and value judgments are confused—it does not of itself raise the issue of indecency. It does, however, remain relevant to the consideration of the possible indecency of *The Little Red Schoolbook* as a whole. It is convenient to note at this point that the section on drugs (including tobacco and alochol) gives advice and clear explanations about undesirable effects of drugs in a way that can only be beneficial and this also contributes to our essential. can only be beneficial, and this also contributes to our assessment of the book as a whole.

Third, the question of the honesty of purpose of those responsible for the book, in this case both the Danish authors and the New Zealand publisher. The Act requires us to consider whether the content is camouflage designed to render acceptable any indecent parts of the book. Having established that indecency can only arise in respect of the treatment of sex in the book we would have to find that well over 80 percent of the book was "camouflage". The general question of honesty of purpose is related to the next two issues disof honesty of purpose is related to the next two issues discussed, but the matter was most fully canvassed by the Secretary for Justice in regard to the omission of any reference to certain provisions of the law. These concern the age of consent, the provisions of the Child Welfare Amendment Act consent, the provisions of the Child wellare Amendment Act 1954, relating to delinquent children, and the provisions of the Police Offences Amendment Act 1954, relating to the supply of contraceptives to those under 16 years of age. We noted that the publisher, in his evidence, declared his intention in any future edition to expand the reference to "16 age of consent" as it appears at present. The omissions referred to may in themselves be a matter of poor judgment and reinforce the view that the authors and publisher have adopted an amoral tone in their treatment of sex. Those omissions, however, do not have compelling weight in our overall assessment of the book.

Fourth, the issue of language. This centres on the use of certain words (commonly called Anglo-Saxon) for sexual organs and actions, and whether it would be better to have used exclusively the more clinical words of Latin derivation. While different views are strongly held as to which set of words is in more common use (i.e. the true vernacular), it would be difficult to maintain that in the context of a chapter which sets out to give a plain account of the physical side of sexual relationships in the language of young people these words can play a very significant part in determining the issue of the book's indecency.

Fifth, the question of the adequacy of the treatment of sex. The book's specifically concedes at the beginning of the sex section that it "says nothing about love and very little about feelings". While many people might prefer it to have included consideration of the emotional, psychological and spiritual sides of the sex relationship, it is not necessary for a treatment of sex to be approaching inclusiveness before it becomes tolerable within the Act. Indeed, the Tribunal has become acutely aware in considering this book of the difference between weighing its acceptability within the Act. on the one between weighing its acceptability within the Act, on the one

hand, and, on the other, assessing it, as in a review, as a contribution to education. The Tribunal was interested to learn of the differences between the English and the New Zealand editions in this section, and specifically that the parts dealing with contraception and venereal disease had been considerably expanded. As was stated by Mr Culliford, the person siderably expanded. As was stated by Mr Cullitord, the person responsible for supervising the editing and revision of the book for New Zealand publication: "We had to take into account the current situation in New Zealand, where we have one of the highest illegitimacy rates in the world and where the vast majority of illegitimate children are born to girls under the age of 25 years. New Zealand has an exceptionally high VD rate, once again the majority of those contracting the disease being under 25." The changes made to the sex section, do, in our view, tend to support the claim of those responsible for the New Zealand publication to have acted with an honest purpose. with an honest purpose.

Sixth, the effect of the treatment of sex, specifically in relation to the age group principally aimed at, those of secondary school age. It can well be argued that an emphasis solely upon the physical side of sex has in this publication a certain dehumanising effect, which is rather at odds with the stress laid elsewhere in the book on the importance of human relationships in the school situation, but this is far from saying that this section is likely to corrupt those who read it, or that it is dealing with sex in a manner injurious to the public good. There is no false glamour attached to the presentation of sex information and the information conveyed about venereal disease and abortion could be construed as about venereal disease and abortion could be construed as more likely to discourage promiscuity than to promote it. As with earlier aspects we have discussed, the assessment of this issue involves a weighing of diverse effects.

In reaching our decision on this book we have sought to consider the cumulative effect of the above considerations in the light of the requirements of the Act and are of the opinion that the book's faults still fall short of conclusively showing that the publication is injurious to the public good, which we seem to consider more robust than do some who have expressed great concern to us about the book.

The Tribunal is well aware that whatever decision it makes, some sections of the community will disagree. The fact that the book is controversial, and that it discusses issues on which society is divided, inclines us not to declare the book indecent, as does our view that provocative, even offensive, presentation of attitudes to sex is not as likely to have injurious effects, given a context of public discussion of the attitudes, as the prurient portrayal of sexual experiences intended for private and passive reading. The judgment of Woodhouse, J. in Robson v. Hicks Smith and Sons Ltd., already cited is quite clear that the Tribunal should be guided by its overgrees and clear that the Tribunal should be guided by its awareness and understanding of contemporary community standards. There is not any one common community standard of sexual behaviour and we must take account of that. Those who disagree strongly with this book have it open to them to rebut it by positive presentation of their own views.

There remains the question of a possible age restriction. It is clear that some parents have no objection to children of younger than secondary school age reading the book or to discussing it with them, while to other parents such an idea is totally repugnant. Decisions of the Tribunal do not abrogate parental responsibility; that remains, and parents are fully entitled to exercise control over their children's reading if

they so wish. No clear age division suggests itself even if we were convinced that such a limitation would serve the public good. The prolonged publicity the book has received in the press since the original publication and the awareness we have of much critical discussion of it already taking place, lead us to the conclusion that the balance of public interest lies in allowing the book to circulate openly and without hindrance and so be susceptible to challenge and refutation.

The Tribunal classifies The Little Red Schoolbook as not indecent within the meaning of the Indecent Publications Act 1963.
