2. Returns are required to be furnished by posting or delivering the same to the office of the Inland Revenue Department nearest to the place of residence of the taxpayer, or if the taxpayer's records are held in another office of the Department, then to the latter office.

#### 3. Returns are due on:

(a) 7 June 1972 when income was derived from salary, wages, superannuation (not Universal), pensions, taxable allowances, etc., and-

(i) No other income whatsoever was derived, or (ii) The other income derived consisted exclusively of not more than \$200 in total from dividends, net

rents, interest (after \$100 exemption).

(b) 7 August 1972 in all other cases or within 2 months of balance date, whichever is the later. No action for failure to furnish a return due on 7 August 1972 will be taken if it is furnished by 7 September 1972.

The return to be used is IR 5 (green print) in the case of paragraph 3 (a) above, and the IR 3 (black print) in the case of 3 (b) above.

In addition to return IR 3, farmers are to complete supplementary return IR 3r and persons in business or in a profession are to complete supplementary return IR 3B. (The supplementary returns are not required if a copy of the annual accounts is furnished with the return.) Companies are to use IR 4, estates and trusts IR 5A, and superannuation funds IR 44. Each form indicates the classes of taxpayers who are to use that form and, where applicable, the due dates for payment of provisional tax. Generally, the first instalment of provisional tax must accompany the return when furnished and is due on 7 August 1972. It must be paid on or before 7 September 1972 in order to avoid the 10 percent additional tax for late payment. The second instalment is, in general, due on 7 February 1973 with a 10 percent additional tax for late payment. 1973 with a 10 percent additional tax if not paid by 7 March 1973. In some cases a third instalment is, in general, due on 7 May 1973 with a 10 percent additional tax if not paid by 7 June 1973.

- 4. All return forms are available at district offices of the Inland Revenue Department, and at post offices. Company returns are available at post offices in urban areas with a population of 5,000 or more not having an Inland Revenue District Office.
- 5. Any person or company failing to furnish a return within the prescribed time is liable to a fine not exceeding \$200 and not less than \$4.
- 6. Any person who is not required under paragraph 1 to furnish a return and who has derived income from employment may elect to furnish a return using IR 5 if he requires an adjustment:

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of an application by the Comptroller of Customs for a decision in respect of the book *The Sexual Anatomy of* Woman, by W. Francis Benedict, M.D., published by Polybooks Ltd., London.

There was no appearance by the applicant. Mr P. J. Downey, solicitor, appeared on behalf of the publishers and made submissions.

#### DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This "pictorial manual" is suspect and unconvincing. Most of the text is plain enough but the inclusion of, and treatment given to, such topics as female masturbation and sex aids, as well as the use made of photographs to illustrate points sufficiently made already in the text, do not square with the statement on the cover that the book is intended "for responsible, intelligent adults who have a medical interest in the intimate parts of woman". The separate section of full-colour photographs clearly caters for a prurient interest in the details they emphasise. Taken as a whole this book treats sex in a way that offends against the Act.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

It is an unrelieved account of one sexual incident after another, with no claim to literary merit or honesty of purpose.

The Organization is described as "a group of sexual conspirators, who, with an apparent scientific detachment investigate and enact all known sexual activities". The accounts of episodes of sexual depravity and cruelty are built around the initiation into the organisation of a young girl of 15, and the contrived vocabulary adds to the unwholesome and degrading character of the book. This book deals with matters of sex in a manner that is injurious to the public good. It has no redeeming features.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

The book gives an insight into group behaviour and activities of these rebels against society. There is a great deal of sex activity that is of a depraved, brutal, and sordid nature, and this treatment of sex and the portrayal of violence in the Tribunal's view would be injurious to the public good.

# DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This is a well-produced hardback of reputable authorship covering "all anyone needs to know about sex", and fully illustrated in somewhat glorious technicolour. The text is in German but we were supplied with an English translation. The Tribunal was informed that if the German edition were cleared by the Tribunal an English language edition would be published in New Zealand. Judging from the translation supplied, the book is serious and neutral in tone, factual in content, and makes on the whole a favourable impression.

It would seem, however, to be geared to a society which differs from ours in some ways, a society where, for instance, group sex activity, pedophilia, zoophilia, male and female homosexuality, are accepted not only with charity but with approval. Many of the illustrations are unnecessarily explicit and repetitive; some by their excellence as photographs tend to glamorise the deviations mentioned as well as the activities of the voyeur, the sadist, the exhibitionist, the fetishist, and the prostitute. While these aspects of sex are dealt with in the text in an objective and eminently reasonable way, we do not consider their inclusion in this pictorial "atlas" to be appropriate to the prevailing opinion and law in this country at present.

Pursuant to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following price order:

#### **PRELIMINARY**

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2193 and shall come into force on the 8th day of May 1972.

2. (1) Price Order No. 2188\* is hereby revoked.

- (2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.
  - 3. In this order the expression "f.o.r." means "free on rail".

#### APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This order applies with respect to the wire products manufactured by G.K.N. (New Zealand) Ltd. of the several kinds specified in the First Schedule hereto.

#### FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF WIRE PRODUCTS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

#### Manufacturer's Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum factory selling price that may be charged or received by G.K.N.

(New Zealand) Ltd. for any wire products to which this order applies shall be the appropriate price fixed in the First Schedule hereto:

Provided that where the quantity of wire of one kind or more than one kind ordered by the buyer for delivery to any one destination outside the Auckland metropolitan area is less than 10 tons, the prices specified in the First Schedule may be increased by an amount not exceeding the difference between any railage rate per ton that would have been incurred by G.K.N. (New Zealand) Ltd. in delivering in lots of 10 tons or more and the railage rate per ton that would be incurred in delivering the lesser quantity from Otahuhu to the freight paid point nearest to the destination to which the wire is to be delivered;

And provided further that any such price may be increased where applicable by the appropriate extra charges referred to in the Second

Schedule hereto.

- (2) The maximum prices as aforesaid are fixed for deliveries as follows:
- (a) f.o.r. Whangarei, Hamilton, Rotorua, Tauranga, Gisborne, Napier, Hastings, Palmerston North, New Plymouth, Wanganui, Masterton, Lower Hutt, Porirua, Wellington, Blenheim, Christchurch, Invercargill.
  (b) Landed on wharf at Lyttelton, Timaru, Oamaru, Nelson, Greymouth, Dunedin, and Bluff.
  (c) Sales not served by the freight paid points mentioned in (a) and (b) to be on the basis of f.o.r. Otahuhu or f.o.r. nearest freight paid

point at buyers option except that in the Auckland metropolitan area sales may, at the buyer's option, be ex works Otahuhu or on the basis of delivered to store at the company's approved basic prices plus an addition of \$1.40 per ton thereto.

(d) The Auckland metropolitan area is defined as follows:

- The cities of Auckland and Takapuna, the Boroughs of Henderson, New Lynn, Mount Albert, Mount Eden, Mount Roskill, Onehunga, Newmarket, One Tree Hill, Ellerslie, Mount Wellington, Otahuhu, Papatoetoe, and Papakura, the commercial centre of Pakuranga and all commercial areas along or adjacent to the Great South Road between Otahuhu and Papakura not otherwise included.
- 6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit the Tribunal may authorise special prices in respect of any wire to which this order applies where special circumstances exist.

# NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MARCH 1972

General—This was the wettest March for at least 50 years over the North Island. It was also generally warm and cloudy. South of Auckland winds from a westerly quarter were more frequent than usual. The warm wet weather was generally appreciated by farmers after the dry weather of February, and good growth was reported. However, in Bay of Plenty, the persistent rain reduced dairy production at times; while in Canterbury conditions remained very dry with stock short of feed in some areas.

Rainfall—Over the North Island rainfall was two-and-a-half times the normal value. Bay of Plenty and most of Waikato and Auckland had more than three times. Greatest excesses were recorded between Tauranga and Whakatane; near the tip of the Coromandel Peninsula; and on the east coast, north of Auckland from Warkworth to Waipu. In these areas the totals of 300–700 mm were the highest ever for March.

In the South Island rainfall was mainly above normal, being more than double in Fiordland, parts of Southland, and parts of Nelson. However, it was below normal in Canterbury, being less than one-half in some inland areas.

In northern districts of the North Island 90 percent of the rain fell in one week, from the 4th to the 10th, with a trough of low pressure stationary from west to east over the area. Stony Bay on

Coromandel Peninsula received a total of 661 mm for the month, of which 605 mm fell during this week. The worst flooding reported was in Bay of Plenty, on the Rangitaiki Plains.

Temperatures—Temperatures were above normal by 1-2°C with highest departures in the east from Canterbury to Southern Hawke's Bay.

Sunshine—Sunshine was below normal by 30-50 hours west of the main ranges and over most of Southland. Greatest deficiencies were recorded in Northland and Auckland. The only area favoured with sunshine appreciably above normal was the Kaikoura coast with part of coastal Canterbury.

Weather Sequence—On the first 2 days of the month a large anticyclone extended across New Zealand with centres to the west of the South Island and to the north-east of the North Island, and the weather was fine.

On the 3rd a complex trough of low pressure moved on to the country associated with a depression to the west of Southland. Rain commenced in Northland and Auckland and on the West Coast. The period from the 4th to the 10th was one of particularly persistent rain over northern and eastern districts of the North Island as the northern part of the trough became stationary through Auckland to East Cape owing to the presence of a depression to

the south-west of Noumea, which moved slowly towards South-land. The trough itself also eventually moved southward. Rain extended to many other districts on the 4th and 9th, and to the whole country on the 10th. Flooding was reported in Bay of Plenty, Northland, and Coromandel.

The period from the 11th to the 23rd was one of westerlies. From the 11th to the 14th pressures were high to the north. The depression over Southland deepened and moved southward. Later a second very deep depression moved towards Campbell Island. Rain affected mainly the West Coast and the Alps but extended at times to Southland and Central Otago with some light falls further to the east. Gales were reported on the 11th. Conditions deteriorated over northern districts of the North Island with rain there on the 15th and 16th as a depression passed to the north, while the westerlies still persisted in the south. From the 17th to the 23rd an anticyclone crossed the North Island while a series of deep depressions continued to pass far to the south. The distribu-

tion of rainfall was similar to that of the 11th to 14th, but there was only a little light rain in parts of the West Coast on the 19th and 20th. Gales were reported on the 17th in Manawatu and Wellington, and on the West Coast.

From the 24th to the 29th the anticyclone was centred to the east while a depression was almost stationary over the South Tasman Sea, finally crossing Southland. During this time there was some rain over all of the South Island, with light falls extending at times to Wellington, Manawatu, and Taranaki. On the 30th a small depression and its associated trough brought rain to northern districts of the North Island On the last day of the month a ridge of high pressure extended over the country and the weather was mainly fine.
