PURSUANT to the Electricity Distribution Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

# ORDER

#### 1. Interpretation

In this order, unless the context otherwise requiresmeans the North Canterbury Electric Power "Board"

Board.

"Council" means the Rangiora Borough Council.

"Borough consumers" means the consumers of electric power situated in the Borough of Rangiora.

#### 2. MERGER OF DISTRICT

THE licensed area of supply of the Council, as defined in the Rangiora Borough Council Electric Lines Licence 1960, dated 17 August 1960 and published in the Gazette on 18 August 1960 at p. 1233, is hereby included and merged in the Board's electric power district. For the purposes of the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, this merger shall be deemed also to have been effected under that Act.

#### 3. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF SUPPLY AUTHORITY

PURSUANT to section 34 of the Electricity Distribution Commission Act 1967, the Board shall exercise all rights and undertake all obligations previously exercised by the Council in carrying on its electricity undertaking.

# 4. REPRESENTATION

(i) On the date of completion, the Borough of Rangiora shall become a constituent district of the Board which from that date shall consist of nine members.

(ii) The North Canterbury Electric Power District Representation Order 1965, dated 1 September 1965 and published in the Gazette on 9 September 1965 at p. 1500, is hereby amended by adding the following to the Schedule thereto:

Constituent District

Number of Representatives

Rangiora Borough

(iii) The first representatives of the Borough of Rangiora on the Board shall be appointed by the Council and shall hold office until the next triennial local body election. All subsequent representatives of the Borough shall be elected by the electors of the Borough of Rangiora.

# 5. PURCHASE PRICE

THE purchase price to be paid by the Board to the Council for the purchase of the electricity undertaking, property, and assets, as defined in the Schedule hereto, excepting only motor vehicles, stock in hand, and tools and equipment, shall be the sum of \$423,000, provided that the said sum of \$423,000 shall be increased by the amount of any capital expenditure incurred by the Council in respect of the said electricity undertaking, property, and assets between 19 October 1971 and the date of completion.

The price to be paid for the purchase of the motor vehicles, stock in hand, and tools and equipment shall be determined by agreement between the parties as at the date of completion and the price when determined shall be added to the purchase price.

# 6. DISPOSITION OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

On the date of completion the Board shall take over from the Council the electricity undertaking, property, and assets described in the Schedule, hereto.

All liabilities of any kind whatsoever incurred by the Council up to the date of completion shall remain liabilities of the Council only.

#### 7. Tariffs

(i) Borough consumers shall remain on the Council's tariff as at the date of completion for a period of 2 years, after which the Board's tariff shall apply to them; provided however that if during this 2-year period the Board is required to pay to the New Zealand Electricity Department increased charges for electricity supplied to it, the Board may then increased charges for electricity supplied to it, the Board may then increase the tariff applying to Borough consumers in order to cover or recoup such increased charges. Provided also that if it becomes legally permissible during this 2-year period for the Board to increase its tariffs, the tariffs applying to Borough consumers may be increased by the amount by which the Council would have increased them if not restrained by the provisions of the Electricity Price Stabilisation Regulations 1972.

(ii) Meter readings for Borough consumers shall remain on

(ii) Meter readings for Borough consumers shall remain on

a 2-monthly basis.

(iii) As from the date of completion, the Board shall charge the Council a special tariff for pumping the Borough water supply.

# 8. Staff

THE Board shall continue to employ, as required by the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963, all persons permanently employed in the Council's electricity undertaking at the date of completion.

# 9. DATE OF COMPLETION

THE date of completion of the sale and purchase shall be 30 June 1972 and the merger shall come into force on that date. Possession of all property included in the sale and purchase shall be taken on that date.

# **SCHEDULE**

The whole of the Council's electricity undertaking for the supply of electricity to the Borough consumers together with all the property and assets owned by the Council whether real or personal and all stock, chattels, and things owned by the Council, and all rights of all kinds belonging to the Council in connection with the said electricity undertaking excluding however the following assets which shall remain the property of the council, namely:

- (1) The Rangiora Borough Council's Electricity Department's Depreciation Fund.
- (2) All moneys represented by the credit balance in the electricity account of the Council's electricity undertaking.
- (3) All debts owing to the Council in respect of its said electricity undertaking at the date of completion.

Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 282—Inquiry Concerning Protection for Inflatable Plastic Beach Balls and Other Inflatable Plastic Toys—Public Hearing

Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 283-Inquiry Concerning Protection For Sensitised Polyester Film-Public Hearing

- 1. Following receipt by the Minister of Customs of a report from the Emergency Protection Authority, the Government has accepted the recommendation of the Authority that, pending inquiry and report by the Tariff and Development Board, a temporary duty of 15% be imposed, in addition to the duties already in force, on all polyester film sensitised for development by a diazo process from all sources except Australia. The Authority has further recommended that provision be made for entry under the approval items for particular types of film, where it can be shown that a suitable substitute is not available from the local industry. In this connection the Tariff provisions in respect of the goods in question, which prior to acceptance of the E.P.A. recommendation were as set out in Schedule A to this notice, have been temporarily amended, effective on 28 April 1972, in the manner indicated in Schedule B.

Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 285—Inquiry Concerning Protection Affecting the New Zealand Industry Producing Ceramic Products, Including Tableware, of Tariff Headings 69.11, 69.12, 69.13, and 69.14.—Public Hearing

- 1. Following receipt by the Minister of Customs of a report from the Emergency Protection Authority, the Government has accepted the recommendation of the Authority that, in respect of tableware classified in Tariff headings 69.11 and 69.12, all the prices appearing in the "minimum price list" in Appendix V to the current Import Licensing Schedule be uplifted by 85 percent and Note (1) to Appendix V be amended to allow transfers, to the extent of 5 percent of the amount of licence held under item code 69.135 to item code 69.130, only on application by the importer and to cover only such classes of goods enumerated in the "approved list" as are not made in New Zealand. The appropriate amendments to the import licensing provisions took effect on 1 June 1972.
- 2. In accordance with the provisions of the Tariff and Development Board Act, the Minister of Customs has requested the Board to inquire and report on the nature and degree of protection, if any, it considers necessary to protect the New Zealand industry producing tableware, classified in Tariff headings 69.11 and 69.12. The Minister has since extended the reference to include all the goods classified in Tariff headings 69.11, 69.12, 69.13, and 69.14. The Tariff provisions relating to these goods are set out in the Schedule to this notice.
- 3. The Board will, in accordance with its normal procedures, conduct a public hearing in the Hearing Room, Eighth Floor, Cumberland House, Upper Willis Street, Wellington, on Monday, 30 October 1972, commencing at 10.30 a.m.
- 4. Any person who intends to tender evidence should lodge, in typewritten form, 14 copies of public evidence and 12 copies of confidential evidence, to be presented under oath at the public hearing, at the Board's office no later than Friday, 6 October 1972. In preparing this evidence the "Notes for Information and Guidance of Interested Parties" prepared by the Board may be of assistance. Copies of these notes may be obtained from the Board's office.

### NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MAY 1972

General—May was marked by a greater frequency of south-westerly winds than usual, and it was predominantly a wet month but rather sunny. Excessive cloud and rain in parts of Southland and Otago made the ground too wet for farmers but elsewhere conditions were mainly favourable.

The heaviest rains were reported from the 13th to the 16th, and gales were widespread over this period with some damage, especially from easterlies in Greymouth.

Rainfall—Rainfall was above normal over almost all the South Island. It was more than double the normal value in an area mainly on the east coast of the South Island and 50 miles inland from Timaru to Balclutha but extending also northward to the upper Waimakariri catchment and westward in the south as far

as Gore. Some unusually high totals of more than four times the normal were recorded inland from Oamaru. Duntroon received 165 mm, the highest rainfall for May in 57 years of observation, and of this amount 102 mm fell on the 16th.

Rainfall was somewhat above normal over the greater part of the North Island. However, it was below normal there in most eastern districts besides Bay of Plenty and northern Northland.

Temperatures—Temperatures were mainly ½°C below normal over the North Island and on the West Coast, but the same amount above normal over the remainder of the South Island.

Snow was reported to low levels in Southland and Otago and on the high country of both Islands from the 29th to the 31st. Lighter falls were reported in some areas on the 13th and 14th and on the 24th and 25th.

Sunshine-Sunshine was mainly above or close to normal but it showed wide variations. Eastern districts of the North Island were favoured with 40-55 hours above normal, Napier's total of 198 hours being a record high value for May in 38 years of observation. On the other hand, parts of Southland received nearly 40 hours below normal, and the West Coast was down by 25 hours.

Weather Sequence—At the beginning of May an anticyclone was centred over the Western Tasman Sea with a ridge extending on to New Zealand. On the first two days some rain was recorded in northern Hawke's Bay, Gisborne, and Northland. During the 3rd and 4th a deep depression passed to the south and the associated trough of low pressure brought a south-westerly change with fairly general rain, mainly light.

From the 5th to the 10th the anticyclone moved slowly eastward over the Tasman Sea. South-westerlies prevailed with mainly settled weather. However, light showers were recorded in some coastal districts at times. During the next two days a complex trough of low pressure was approaching New Zealand and the weather deteriorated from the south-west, with rain extending over the greater part of the South Island.

The period from the 13th to the 18th was particularly unsettled, with the heaviest rains of the month falling during the first four days. Rain became fairly general on the 13th as the trough of low pressure crossed the South Island, with some considerable falls. pressure crossed the South Island, with some considerable falls. Snow was reported in the high country. During the 14th and 15th an anticyclone developed just east of the South Island, while a depression formed on the trough and moved slowly southward, west of Northland. Heavy rain persisted, spreading further northward, and many gales were reported. By the following day the depression was centred west of Cook Strait and the weather was clearing in some areas, especially Gisborne and Hawke's Bay. During the 17th and 18th the depression moved southward while a second small centre developed over Northland. Rain was still fairly general but mainly light.

The period from the 19th to the 25th was one with a predominance of south-westerlies. Three successive troughs of low pressure crossed the country, while the main centre of high pressure was almost stationary near Melbourne. This was a period of unsettled weather in Southland with frequent rain also on the West Coast, becoming heavy on the 23rd. Most other parts of the South Island and parts of the North Island also received some rain during this period, mainly light.

Yet another trough of low pressure moved on to the South Island on the 26th with considerable rain in Fiordland and South Westland, and lighter falls in Southland and North Westland. On the following day the rain became heavier and spread over the South Island and parts of the North Island with the formation of a depression west of Northland. During the 28th and 29th this depression moved eastward. Rain was reported in Northland, Auckland and Waikato, besides a number of eastern districts and Southland. The main centre of high pressure was still centred near Victoria, and the last two days of the month were marked by a return to south-westerlies with yet another trough of low pressure crossing the country. A depression formed on this trough as it moved north-eastward. Rain was fairly general but mainly light, and snow was reported to low levels in Southland and around Dunedin, and also on the high country of both Islands.
