THESE two issues of an English monthly journal devoted to the ventilation and discussion of all aspects of sexual be-haviour raise serious questions about the purposes of the publications. The contents are almost entirely textual and the format is restrained and cultivated. Some of the articles which form the first half of each issue appear genuine attempts to help to remove unhealthy and socially harmful attitudes towards sex. While the sexual mores which are frankly discussed in some of them are not generally approved in our New Zealand way of life, these articles could not be classified

On the other hand, the second half of each issue contains a good deal of material that appears to be suspect. The case histories from contributors and many of the letters from readers published in Forum Adviser appear contrived and become vehicles for discussing sexual deviations not merely with frankness, but with approval and in some cases irresponsibility. In the hands of mature adults the magazines are unlikely to be harmful but a restriction is clearly desirable to protect younger readers.

The Tribunal, by a majority decision, classifies both issues as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THE Sexual Freedom League advocates sex freedom—the right for all people to be in command of their own desires and behaviour. The movement started in San Francisco in 1964 and spread all over the United States and indentified itself with the political and social aims of Women's Liberation and Homosexual (Gay) Liberation. It is stated that when the emphasis shifted towards nude parties membership grew rapidly.

This book is, according to Herbert Gold who wrote the introduction, "an instructive tour of the world of troubled sexuality looking for sexual trouble".

The book consists of case histories recounted with considerable frankness. The objects and activities of the League may not be accepted by the majority of people but there is no reason why this book should not be available to the adult reader.

Because of its frankness and sometimes sordid description of case histories the Tribunal considers that it should be restricted.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Its honesty of purpose is suspect and its circulation could not be for the public good.

*The sunshine recorder is not located at the station but is in the near vicinity.

A "rain day" is a day with rainfall equal to or greater than 0.1 mm.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JUNE 1972

General—After a relatively warm autumn, temperatures fell rapidly towards the end of May accompanied by very early snowfalls which persisted for most of the month, and there were further snowfalls to low levels. Losses of several thousand stock and other damage also occurred as a result of flooding in South Otago and Southland on the 12th. For the country as a whole it was the coldest June for many years, although only a little colder than June 1969. Conditions were, however, in marked contrast to the very mild temperatures experienced during the two intervening winters of 1970 and 1971.

Rainfall-Rainfall was below normal over most of the country, mainly by about 25 percent. Some unusually low totals were recorded in Manawatu.

In Southland and most of Otago rainfall was above normal. In an area extending 50 miles inland from just east of Invercargill to just south-west of Dunedin it was more than double the normal value. The heaviest rain in this area was on the 12th, with daily values of up to 150mm, causing floods in the Clutha River at Inchclutha, in the Tokomairiro River at Milton, and also in the Taieri and Mataura Rivers. Southland was isolated by road and

Temperatures—Temperatures were appreciably below normal except in Otago and Southland and western Northland, where they were close to normal. Departures averaged 1½°C over the North Island and 1°c over the South Island. In Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, Manawatu, and Wellington this was the coldest June for more than 40 years.

Snow was unusually frequent in both Islands. The main snow-falls were on the 6th and 7th, from the 11th to the 13th, and on the 18th and 19th. Parts of Otago reported snow falling on about half the days of the month, and in the mountainous area to the west and north-west of Dunedin some places were isolated for several days.

Sunshine—Over the greater part of the country sunshine was 20-50 hours above normal. However, in Southland and Otago it was normal or, up to 30 hours below; while in Northland, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay it was close to normal.

Weather Sequence—At the beginning of June and on the 2nd an anticyclone was centred near Melbourne and a depression near the Chatham Islands. South-westerlies covered the country, with scattered rain. During the next two days an anticyclone covered New Zealand, with settled weather. This anticyclone soon collapsed, and with pressures low again to the east, southerly winds predominated from the 5th to the 7th. Light rain was reported in eastern districts and in Southland with snow in some areas, especially the North Island high country. The main centre to the east moved northward and southerlies persisted from the 8th to the 10th, with similar conditions.

The main centre of high pressure was still centred near Melbourne. A trough of low pressure moved on to New Zealand from the west and a depression developed on it east of Otago with a second centre west of the North Island. On the 11th and 12th rain was general except in the east of the North Island. Some heavy falls were reported on the 12th with serious flooding in South Otago and Southland, while snow affected many inland areas of the South Island. The southern centre moved away eastward but the other centre crossed the North Island on the 13th and 14th with considerable rain, more especially in the east. Snow was reported over much of the North Island high country. Conditions

showed some improvement on the following day as the depression moved away to the east. On the 16th and 17th pressures were low to the south and winds became more south-westerly. Rain affected mainly western districts but it persisted in Southland and most of Otago.

On the 18th a deep depression developed off the Otago coast and moved slowly north-eastwards. Rain was fairly general at first but it became scattered on the following day. This was another period with widespread snow in both Islands. An anticyclone was now centred near Tasmania, while another one was passing to the north of Northland, and pressures remained low to the south-east. South-westerly conditions persisted from the 20th to the 23rd, with further rain in Southland and scattered falls elsewhere.

During the 24th and 25th a complex depression from the North Tasman Sea crossed the North Island while anticyclones were centred over the South Tasman Sea and near Campbell Island. Considerable rain was reported in northern and eastern districts of the North Island with scattered light falls elsewhere, except on the West Coast, the Alps, Nelson, and inland Canterbury and Otago. During the next three days the depression was moving away to the north-east of Auckland while an anticyclone crossed the South Island. In the easterlies, rain persisted in northern and eastern districts of the North Island though gradually decreasing in extent and amount.

During the last two days of the month a deep depression near Tasmania moved eastward and an associated trough of low pressure crossed New Zealand. Rain affected most of the country except for eastern districts and Northland.
