*Amending Declaration of Land in the North Canterbury Acclimatisation District to be a Wildlife Refuge*

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Sir Edward Denis Blundell, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim as follows:

1. (i) This Proclamation may be cited as the Bromley Wildlife Refuge Declaration;

(ii) This Proclamation shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The Proclamation made on the 17th day of May 1961\*, declaring the area described in the First Schedule hereto to be a wildlife refuge for the purposes of the Wildlife Act 1953, is hereby revoked.

3. The area described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a wildlife refuge for the purposes of section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, City of Christchurch, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the western shore of the estuary of the Avon and Heathcote Rivers and in line with the south-western boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 20268L, and proceeding north-westerly and north-easterly to and along the south-western and north-western boundaries of that lot and its production to the north-eastern side of Ruru Road; thence north-westerly along that roadside to the south-eastern boundary of part Lot 4, D.P. 8686, contained in Proclamation No. 353099; thence north-easterly and north-westerly along the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of that part lot to the south-eastern side of Cuthbert's Road; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along that roadside and the south-western side of Breezes Road and the production of the last-mentioned roadside to the western shore of the estuary of the Avon and Heathcote Rivers; thence southerly along that shore to the point of commencement. (Christchurch Drainage Board, owners.)

As shown on the plan marked I.A. 52/508 deposited in the Head Office, Department of Internal Affairs, at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CANTERBURY LAND DISTRICT

ALL that area in the City of Christchurch containing 716 acres, more or less, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the western shore of the estuary of the Avon and Heathcote Rivers in line with the south-western boundary of Lot 3,

ORDER

1. (i) This order may be cited as the Wanganui Hydatids Control District Order 1972.

(ii) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The respective districts of the County of Wanganui and the City of Wanganui as from time to time constituted are hereby declared to be united to form a hydatids control district to be called the Wanganui Hydatids Control District.

3. The Wanganui County Council is hereby appointed the hydatids control authority for the Wanganui Hydatids Control District.

*Amendments to the Rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand*

PURSUANT to section 11 of the Sharebrokers Act 1908, the Governor-General in Council, on 16 October 1972, approved the following amendments to the rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand.

*Rule 44*—The following is to be added to Rule 44:

Every consent given under this rule shall be in writing stating its conditions and the period for which it is given. Each Exchange shall maintain a complete register setting out details and conditions of all consents given by it under this rule, this information to be supplied to the Association for promulgation to all Exchanges and to be available to the Inspectors appointed for the purposes of the Fidelity Guarantee Fund.

*Rule 85*—Rule 85 (i) (c) is to be deleted and the following substituted:

On the bonds, debentures, and debenture stock whether registered or not of companies and all other corporations and on note issues not carrying the rights of conversion into shares—

Unlisted: Double the above rates.

If the final or advised date of maturity is within 12 months of the date of sale, then brokerage shall be charged at half rates.

Provided that the concessional rate in (2) and (3) above shall apply only when there is a single instruction given at the one time to buy or sell on behalf of the one beneficial interest securities in the one company of the same class (although not necessarily of the same interest rate and/or maturity) on that part of the order completed within 1 calendar month from the date of such instruction.

*Rule 87*—Rule 87 1 (b) is to be deleted and the following substituted:

87 1 (b)—On flotation of all securities excepting bonds, debentures, or debenture stock (other than placement of existing securities), selling or issuing brokerage (based on the issue price or nominal value whichever is the greater) shall be payable to members lodging applications in respect of so much of such applications as is accepted at the rates prescribed by Rule 85 (i) (d) provided that the foregoing rates may be reduced with the prior consent of the Executive.

87 1 (c)—On flotation of bonds, debentures, or debenture stock and term deposits, selling or issuing brokerage shall be payable to members lodging applications in respect of so much of such application as is accepted at a minimum of 1 percent. Provided that in respect of such securities of a maturity of 2 years and under, the foregoing rate may be reduced with the prior consent of the Executive.

Consequently, that Rule 87 1 (c) be renumbered 87 1 (d).

*Rule 119*—The word "working" is to be inserted after "tenth" at the end of line 3 of Rule 119.

*Rule 129A*—A new rule, numbered 129A is to be inserted after Rule 129, to read:

*Rule 129A*—(i) In the event of a member's client failing or refusing to complete a contract or a number of contracts on demand (which demand need not be in writing) the member may resell or repurchase as the case may be, the securities the subject of the contract or contracts at the clients risk and expense, which expenses shall include brokerage and stamp duty.

(ii) Any deficiency arising from any such resale or repurchase shall constitute a debt owing by the client to the member and in any case where there shall be a surplus arising from any such transaction the member shall account to his client accordingly subject in either instance to any right of set-off which may exist.

(iii) Any written communication (including any demand) from a member to his client shall if sent by cable, telegram, or prepaid letter addressed to the last known address of the client, be deemed to be delivered to the client on the next business day following the day of posting or sending.

*Rule 137A*—Rule 137A is to be rescinded and the following Rule be substituted:

*Rule 137A*—Consent to Act

Upon receipt of an application for consent pursuant to Rule 137 for a member to act in a flotation which he is underwriting whether wholly or in part or in conjunction with any other person, the committee of the Exchange may require the inspector appointed under Rule 145 to verify, by examination of the records of the applicant, the details contained in the application in so far as they relate to the underwriting of the flotation and to report to the Committee on the accuracy of such application with any comments which he considers may affect the Committee's consideration of the application. In considering the application the Committee shall satisfy itself that the obligations likely to devolve upon the member are within his financial capacity.

1. (a) This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2206 and shall come into force on the 10th day of November 1972.

(b) Price Order No. 2180\* is hereby revoked.

## 2. In this order—

"Flue-cured leaf" means leaf that has been treated in the kiln for at least 3 successive days immediately after picking for the purpose of yellowing, fixing colour, drying, and drying mid-ribs:

"Air-dried leaf" means leaf other than flue-cured leaf:

"Raw tobacco" means unmanufactured tobacco and includes the leaves and stems of the tobacco plant before they have passed through any process of manufacture other than curing:

"Sale" includes a contract for sale, agreement to sell, and offer for sale; "purchase" includes a contract for purchase, agreement to purchase, and offer to purchase; and "sale" and "purchase" include barter and exchange.

## APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies with respect to all raw tobacco leaf grown in New Zealand during the 1971-72 season: Provided that the Tribunal may, in any case where it considers it proper to do so and subject to such conditions (if any) as it thinks fit, exempt any such tobacco from the operation of this order.

## FIXING AVERAGE PRICES OF RAW TOBACCO LEAF TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The average price to be paid by any tobacco manufacturer for raw tobacco leaf to which this order applies shall be not less than—

- (a) For flue-cured leaf—(i) hanked: 78.5c per pound  
(ii) loose: 75.5c per pound  
(b) For air-dried leaf—(i) hanked: 74.5c per pound  
(ii) loose: 71.5c per pound

(2) For the purpose of this clause the weight of any raw tobacco leaf shall be deemed to be its weight at the time and place of delivery by the grower to the manufacturer or to his agent in the district in which it is grown: Provided that the manufacturer may reject leaf in accordance with the provisions of the agreement between the grower and the manufacturer which relate to the moisture content of tobacco leaf at the time of its delivery to the manufacturer.

5. No raw tobacco shall be sold by the grower thereof or purchased from him at less than 20c per pound free on board ship Motueka or Nelson in the case of tobacco grown in the Nelson Provincial District, and in the case of tobacco grown in any other district at less than 20c per pound free on board ship or free on rail at the port or railway station which is nearest to the place at which such tobacco is grown.

6. No raw tobacco shall be sold by any person other than the grower thereof or purchased from such other person at less than 20c per pound free on board ship or free on rail at the port or railway station which is nearest to the place at which such tobacco is, at the time of sale thereof, being held or stored.

7. Notwithstanding anything in the provisions of clauses 5 and 6 hereof, the Tribunal may, in any case where it considers it proper so to do, authorise the sale and purchase of tobacco at a price less than the price fixed by either of those clauses.

The effect of its recital of the sexual adventures of a young girl on a brief visit to Stockholm is similar to that of another book by this author, *Juliette de Sade*, which the Tribunal recently classified as indecent in decision No. 504.

Of that book the Tribunal remarked, "Although the sexual incidents... are neither as detailed nor as numerous as those in many novels rejected as indecent by the Tribunal, the tone is just as objectionable. The novel seeks to glamorise what it presents and what it alludes to." *Maid in Sweden* has the same emphasis but to a lesser degree. Complete rejection is not called for but an age restriction is justified.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

The story is about the production of a movie—a blue movie. The director, named Boris, is ambitious to make a movie that is genuinely erotic and beautiful. The producer, a "past master at hustling cash for any opus to promise a profit" is more down to earth and talks about "the three million-dollar dirty picture". And that aptly describes the movie in the book. Sexual perversion and crudity pervade this story—a story which is thin and contrived and purely a vehicle for sexual activities natural and perverted.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS magazine bears some resemblance to *Penthouse*, which has been the subject of several Tribunal decisions, the most recent being No. 560-563 covering Issues Vol. 7, No. 1-4, which we found to be indecent except in the hands of persons over the age of 18 years. *Penthouse* has somewhat radicalized the *Playboy* formula (not without some effect on the latter) by a reduction in the proportion of material of literary merit and social concern and by more revealing photography.

In the case of *Mayfair*, the material of serious interest is still further reduced in proportion to the barely minimal, and the standard of photography has degenerated still further to the artificially posed and provocative. The line of demarcation between the acceptable and the unacceptable in a plural society is frequently a narrow one in the case of publications of a periodical nature, but the Tribunal has come to the conclusion in this case that taking all the criteria laid down in the Act into account, *Mayfair* falls on the other side of the line from *Penthouse*.

The Tribunal classifies these issues of *Mayfair* as indecent.

The 'factual' accounts read like cheap novelettes and seem to delight in the cruder detail of their stories.

Submissions were made concerning this magazine by the Secretary for Justice in which he stated that in his view it "is a meretricious publication devoid of the honesty of purpose required by section 11 (i) (f) of the Act, that its appeal is to the prurient and the potential sadist, and in short that it describes and depicts matters of sex, horror, and cruelty in a manner injurious to the public good". With this submission we agree.

*Order Prescribing Standard Terms and Conditions in Respect of Licences for Aerial Work Services*

PURSUANT to section 26A of the Air Services Licensing Act 1951, the Air Services Licensing Authority hereby orders that the orders prescribing standard terms and conditions,

dated the 28th day of May 1969 and the 20th day of December 1971 and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 29th day of May 1969 and the 22nd day of December 1971 respectively, are hereby revoked and that the terms and conditions set out hereunder be substituted therefor:

1. Unless otherwise ordered by the Licensing Authority in respect of a particular licence, the following standard terms and the meaning thereof shall be applicable in all licences for aerial work services in so far as they may apply to the type or types of such services as are authorised in the licences:

- (i) "Aerial topdressing service" means any service by aircraft (whether fixed-wing or rotary-wing) for hire or reward whereby any fertiliser or lime, insecticide pellet or dust is released from aircraft during flight in such a manner as to provide for the direct application of the material to the soil or to plant life thereon, or whereby any poisonous agricultural chemical whether alone or with any other substance is released from aircraft during flight for the purpose of destroying or repelling noxious animals.
- (ii) "Aerial liquid topdressing service" means any service by aircraft (whether fixed-wing or rotary-wing) for hire or reward whereby any liquid fertiliser is released from aircraft during flight in such a manner as to provide for the direct application of the liquid to the soil or to the plant life thereon.
- (iii) "Aerial spraying service" means any service by aircraft (whether fixed-wing or rotary-wing) for hire or reward whereby any agricultural chemical in the form of a liquid spray is released from aircraft during flight in such a manner as to provide for the direct application of the chemical to the soil or to plant life thereon.
- (iv) "Miscellaneous aerial work service" means any aerial work service by rotary-wing aircraft for hire or reward other than an aerial topdressing service, an aerial liquid topdressing service, or an aerial spraying service.

2. In these Standard Terms and Conditions—

- (i) "Fertiliser" means any non-liquid substance, other than an agricultural chemical, but including lime, which is in a state suitable for application to land or plants for the purpose of increasing the growth or productivity of beneficial plants.
- (ii) "Liquid fertiliser" means any substance (other than an agricultural chemical) in the form of a liquid suitable for application to land and plants for the purpose of increasing the growth or productivity of beneficial plants.
- (iii) "Agricultural chemical" means any substance (other than a fertiliser or a liquid fertiliser), whether mixed with any other substance or not, sold for the purpose of protecting any form of plant life from injury caused by any organism or virus, or for the purpose of curing any such injury or any disorder of plant life of a physiological nature, or for the purpose of destroying, preventing, or in any other way influencing the growth of any form of plant life, and includes any animal poison.

3. Categorisation of licences and replacement of aircraft:

(a) Licences for aerial topdressing services will be categorised in the following manner—

*Category I Licence*—Granted to operators utilising aircraft with a payload exceeding 4,480 pounds.

*Category II Licence*—Granted to operators utilising aircraft with a payload not exceeding 4,480 pounds.

- (b) Within the above categories the Authority will approve in respect of each licence granted a maximum fleet payload capacity in pounds.
- (c) An operator may use any number or type of aircraft appropriate to the category of licence to achieve the fleet capacity authorised by the licence, but the aggregate payloads of the aircraft used shall not exceed the prescribed maximum fleet capacity.
- (d) An operator may replace any aircraft in his fleet within the category for which the licence is granted, provided that the maximum fleet capacity is not exceeded. Written notice of any replacement shall be made to the Authority within 7 days of such replacement being effected.
- (e) For the purpose of this paragraph—  
"Payload" means the maximum agricultural hopper load permissible as provided by the Ministry of Transport for the particular aircraft, with fuel sufficient for 1 hour's operation, plus pilot (170 lb) and oil.

- (f) Nothing in this section shall apply to helicopters.
- (g) Licences current at the date of this order will be amended in accordance with the above procedure on 1 July 1969. All operators affected are required to submit to the Authority within 30 days of the date of this order notification of such details of their authorised fleet as will enable the Authority to establish the category of the licence and the maximum fleet capacity applicable to it.

#### 4. Boundaries:

- (a) As from the date of this order, where any boundary of the area authorised for an aerial topdressing service or an aerial liquid topdressing service passes through any part of a farming property, the licensee may enter into an agreement with the owner of such property for the carrying out of aerial topdressing services or aerial liquid topdressing services on the whole or any part of that property provided a substantial part thereof is within the licensee's licensed area.
- (b) Where in any aerial topdressing licence or aerial liquid topdressing licence a boundary is defined *inter alia*, as being a line running from the mouth of a river or other waterway, such line shall be deemed to run from the northern side of the mouth of such river or other waterway unless the licence otherwise provides.
- (c) Any zone, or limitation of area, of operation which the Authority shall impose on an aerial topdressing service or on an aerial liquid topdressing service shall not apply to the release from aircraft during flight of poisonous agricultural chemicals for the purpose of destroying or repelling noxious animals.

#### 5. Insurance:

- (a) It shall be a condition of all aerial work service licences that the licence holder shall maintain during the currency of the licence:
- In respect of all aircraft a minimum insurance cover of \$50,000 against all liability for third party personal injury or death, or for property damage in respect of any one accident.
- (b) Notwithstanding that the licence may authorise the carrying on of an aerial work service as from a specific date, such service shall not be commenced until there has been deposited with the Licensing Authority a certificate endorsed by the insurers of due insurance in accordance with the requirements in paragraph (a) herein.
- (c) No later than 4 p.m. on the due date for renewal of any such insurance, there shall be deposited with the Licensing Authority a certificate endorsed by the insurers of the due renewal or replacement of the insurance in accordance with the requirements in paragraph (b) herein. If the certificate is not so deposited within that time on that date the licence shall be deemed to be suspended until such certificate is deposited.

#### 6. Transfer of interest in licences:

##### (i) Where:

- (a) The holder of a licence is an individual and by any means whatever his controlling interest in the business in respect of which the licence applies passes to any other person or persons; or
- (b) The holder of a licence is a company and by any means whatever the controlling interest in that company passes to any person or persons other than those named as shareholders or intending shareholders when the application for a licence was made

then, in either such event, the licence shall be deemed to be suspended as from the date of such passing unless the prior approval of the Authority has been obtained, or unless and until full details of the transaction or proposed transaction involving the passing of the controlling interest, as aforesaid, have been given to the Authority and its approval to such passing has been granted.

- (ii) Where by reason of transmission on death the provisions of subparagraph (i) herein would apply, the licence shall not be deemed to be suspended until after the expiration of 3 calendar months from the date of death.

This order shall come into effect on the 1st day of December 1972.

#### Order Prescribing Standard Terms and Conditions in Respect of Licences for Air Transport Services

PURSUANT to section 26A of the Air Services Licensing Act 1951, the Air Services Licensing Authority hereby orders that the orders prescribing standard terms and conditions, dated the 28th day of May 1969 and the 20th day of December 1971 and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 29th day of May 1969 and the 22nd day of December 1971 respectively, are hereby revoked and that the terms and conditions set out hereunder be substituted therefor:

1. Unless otherwise ordered by the Licensing Authority in respect of a particular licence, the following standard terms and the meaning thereof shall be applicable in all licences for air transport services in so far as they may apply to the type or types of such services as are authorised in the licence:

- (a) "Scheduled service" means an air transport service carried on between such fixed terminals or traffic areas and by such route or routes and with or without intermediate stopping places as are authorised and in accordance with a timetable and, in respect of passenger services only or of combined passenger and freight services, for such fares for the carriage of passengers as are authorised and published.
- (b) "Non-scheduled service" means an air transport service carried on between such fixed terminals or traffic areas and by such route or routes and with or without intermediate stopping places as are authorised and in respect of which the licensee may determine from time to time when or to what extent such service shall be carried on.
- (c) "Air charter service" means an air transport service wherein the licensee hires out to a person or to a group of persons, having a common interest in the purposes of the hiring, the exclusive use of the aircraft for a particular flight or series of flights and one payment for such hire is made.
- (d) "Air-taxi service" means an air transport service wherein an aircraft is used for a particular flight or series of flights and in respect of each such flight the licensee charges to each passenger a fare on a per seat basis or, as the case may be, to each consignor of freight a charge for each separate item of freight carried.
- (e) "Scenic flight or joy-ride" means an air transport service involving a flight without intermediate stops from and to a designated aerodrome, the primary purpose of which is for sightseeing.

2. Unless otherwise ordered by the Licensing Authority in respect of a particular licence, the following conditions shall be deemed to apply to each type of air transport service as is specified hereunder:

##### (a) Scheduled service:

- (i) The licensee shall be under an obligation to operate the service in accordance with the authorised and published timetable unless for reasons of safety it is inexpedient to do so or unless he is prevented by circumstances beyond his control.
- (ii) The licensee may at any time on any of the days specified in the authorised timetable increase the number of flights beyond what is stated in the authorised timetable but he may not reduce the number of such flights without the prior approval of the Licensing Authority or unless authorised by the terms of the licence to do so.

##### (b) Non-scheduled service:

- (i) Where a non-scheduled passenger service is carried on over the same or substantially the same route as operated by a scheduled service the minimum fare per passenger shall be 10 percent in excess of the fare payable by a like passenger in the scheduled service or by the lowest fare if there are more than one such service; provided, however, that such excess shall not apply if there is no scheduled service operating during the same day or if the full capacity on the scheduled service has been taken or if in the course of such route the non-scheduled service involves intermediate stops at points or traffic areas not included in the scheduled service.

- (ii) If the licensee publishes a timetable of his proposed services he shall indicate prominently therein that such services may not be adhered to for reasons of safety or unless sufficient business is offering and, subject to the foregoing, the licensee shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the services prescribed in such timetable are maintained.



## (c) Air charter service:

- (i) All charges for air charter services shall be based on an hourly rate, either as authorised in the licence or otherwise as determined by the licensee.
- (ii) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (iv) herein, all air charter services shall be deemed to originate from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes or traffic areas as are designated in the licence; and if the actual flight as required by the hirer commences from some other aerodrome or traffic area the licensee shall charge and shall record separately a reasonable amount for the cost of positioning the aircraft from the place or origin.
- (iii) Where the charter flight or flights is or are to terminate elsewhere than at the place of origin, as referred to in subparagraph (ii) herein, the licensee may include in the hire charge a reasonable additional amount for the cost of flying the aircraft back to the place of origin; but in such event the licensee may not enter into any agreement with any other person, except on the basis as set out in subparagraph (ii) herein, unless he refunds to the original hirer the amount of such additional charge.
- (iv) Where a charter flight has terminated elsewhere than at the place of origin, as referred to in subparagraph (ii) herein, and no charge for the cost of flying the aircraft back to the place of origin has been made or, if made, it has been refunded, the licensee may enter into a new agreement for an air charter service and for the purpose only of that agreement the place of origin of the charter service shall be deemed to be where the previous flight terminated; but if such new charter service is to terminate elsewhere than at any place or aerodrome designated in the licence, the licensee shall include in the hiring charge a reasonable amount for the cost of flying the aircraft back from where such flight terminates to the said place of origin designated in the licence.
- (v) Any person authorised to operate an air charter service may also carry on scenic flights and joyrides from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes or traffic areas designated in the licence.

## (d) Air-taxi service:

- (i) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (ii) herein, an air-taxi service may originate only from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes or traffic areas as are designated in the licence.
- (ii) From the place where an air-taxi service has terminated the licensee may operate a like service, but only back to the place or places of origin as referred to in subparagraph (i) herein.
- (iii) Where an air-taxi service operates over the same or substantially the same route as operated by a scheduled service the minimum fare per passenger shall be 10 percent in excess of the fare payable by a like passenger in the scheduled service or by the lowest fare if there are more than one such service; provided, however, that such excess shall not apply if there is no scheduled service operating during the same day or if the full capacity on the scheduled service has been taken or if in the course of such route the air-taxi service involves intermediate stops at points or traffic areas not included in the scheduled service.
- (iv) Any person authorised to operate an air-taxi service may also carry on scenic flights and joyrides from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes or traffic areas designated in the licence.

## 3. Replacement of aircraft:

Subject always to there being no increase in the number of aircraft as are authorised in the licence, the licensee may at any time replace an aircraft with another of equivalent seating capacity, provided written notification of the change is given to the Authority within 7 days.

## 4. Insurance:

- (a) It shall be a condition of all air transport service licences that the licence holder shall maintain during the currency of the licence:
- (i) In respect of any aircraft in which one or more passengers may be carried a minimum insurance cover of such amount per passenger against liability for the death of or bodily injury to such a passenger as the Authority shall deem reasonable, pursuant to section 22 of the Air Licensing Act 1951, as amended.

(ii) In respect of all aircraft a minimum insurance cover of \$50,000 against all liability for third party personal injury or death or for property damage in respect of any one accident.

(b) Notwithstanding that the licence may authorise the carrying on of an air transport service as from a specific date, such service shall not be commenced until there has been deposited with the Licensing Authority a certificate endorsed by the insurers of due insurance in accordance with the requirements in paragraph (a) herein.

(c) No later than 4 p.m. on the due date for renewal of any such insurance, there shall be deposited with the Licensing Authority a certificate endorsed by the insurers of the due renewal or replacement of the insurance in accordance with the requirements in paragraph (b) herein. If the certificate is not so deposited within that time on that date the licence shall be deemed to be suspended until such certificate is deposited.

## 5. Transfer of interest in licences:

## (i) Where:

- (a) The holder of a licence is an individual and by any means whatever his controlling interest in the business in respect of which the licence applies passes to any other person or persons; or
- (b) The holder of a licence is a company and by any means whatever the controlling interest in that company passes to any person or persons other than those named as shareholders or intending shareholders when the application for a licence was made

then, in either such event, the licence shall be deemed to be suspended as from the date of such passing unless the prior approval of the Authority has been obtained, or unless and until full details of the transaction or proposed transaction involving the passing of the controlling interest, as aforesaid, have been given to the Authority and its approval to such passing has been granted.

- (ii) Where by reason of transmission on death the provisions of subparagraph (i) herein would apply, the licence shall not be deemed to be suspended until after the expiration of 3 calendar months from the date of death.

This order shall come into effect on the 1st day of December 1972.

- (f) (i) The building and fitting of bodies to commercial trucks or delivery vans,
- (ii) The fabrication of body panels for commercial trucks or delivery vans.

**Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 307—Inquiry Concerning Protection Affecting the New Zealand Industry Producing Monofilament for Use as Fishing Lines (Ex Tariff Items 39.01.041, 39.01.049, 39.02.041, 39.02.049, 51.02.009, 51.02.109)**

1. Following receipt by the Minister of Customs of a report by the Emergency Protection Authority, the Government has accepted the recommendation of the Authority that the exemption under item codes 39.095 and 50.135 for monofilament, not put up for retail sale, on declaration for use as fishing lines be withdrawn. The Authority proposed that the monofilament of item code 39.095 should be transferred to item code 39.120, and that of item code 50.135 be given a new item code with an allocation of 50 percent of the value of the same goods imported in the 1970–71 period. Additionally the Authority recommended that monofilament packed for retail sale as fishing line and at that time included in item code 50.190 be transferred to the new item code recommended above, and within the same allocation. However, in order to maintain New Zealand's obligation to Australia under the provisions of the NAFTA, Government has decided that import licensing will not be reimposed on nylon monofilament of Australian origin, classified in Tariff item 51.02.009. The appropriate amendments to the import licensing provisions took effect on 6 October 1972.

2. In accordance with the provisions of the Tariff and Development Board Act, the Minister of Customs has requested the Board to undertake an inquiry and report on what permanent form of protection, if any, it considers necessary to protect the New Zealand industry in relation to the importation of monofilament for use as fishing line, classified in Tariff items 39.01.041, 39.01.049, 39.02.041, 39.02.049, 51.02.009 and 51.02.109.

3. The attention of interested parties is drawn to the fact that the Board has already given notice of its intention to conduct a public hearing affecting all the goods of Tariff items 39.01.041, 39.01.049, 39.02.041 and 39.02.049, including monofil, in Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 281 (*New Zealand Gazette* dated 29 June 1972). This hearing will take place, as advertised, on Thursday, 9 November 1972, and any representations made at it affecting monofilament for use as fishing line, and classified within the above four Tariff items, will be taken into

account by the Board in reaching its conclusions on these goods in terms of the current reference. It will not be necessary, therefore, for parties presenting evidence on monofilament for use as fishing line at the public hearing on 9 November to resubmit evidence at the public hearing notified in paragraph 4 below. Parties may, however, tender supplementary evidence affecting monofilament for use as fishing lines at the later hearing and should lodge new representations if they wish to be heard on monofilament for use as fishing line of Tariff items 51.02.009 and 51.02.109.

4. The Board will, in accordance with its normal procedures, conduct a public hearing in the Committee Room, Seventh Floor, Cumberland House, Upper Willis Street, Wellington, on Friday, 15 December 1972, commencing at 10.30 a.m.

5. *Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 315—Inquiry Concerning Protection for Slate, Marble, Granite, Pebbles, Dolomite, etc., of Tariff Headings 25.14, 25.15, 25.16, 25.17, and 25.18*

1. The Minister of Customs has referred to the Tariff and Development Board for inquiry and report the question of the nature and extent of the protection, if any, which it considers appropriate for New Zealand industry in respect of the importation of the goods listed in the attached Schedule. This reference arises from the publication, in a *Supplement to the New Zealand Gazette*, dated 7 October 1971, of a Notice of Proposed Exemptions from Import Licensing and from representations received in response to that notice.

2. For the purpose of taking evidence the Board will hold a public hearing commencing at 10.30 a.m., on Tuesday, 27 February 1973, in the Hearing Room, Eighth Floor, Cumberland House, Upper Willis Street, Wellington.

3. Parties intending to make representations or requests about appropriate rates of customs duty are asked to take into account the statement by the Minister of Overseas Trade of 6 September 1972 about changes in the New Zealand Customs Tariff. Copies of this statement can be obtained from the undersigned. Parties intending to make representations or requests about the exemption from import licensing of goods at present not so exempt are asked to take into account the statement in the 1972 Financial Statement (page 19) that "the Government has also decided that where the industry is to be exempted from import licensing there should be provision in appropriate cases for a phase-out period which in general will be for up to three years".

4. Any person who intends to tender evidence should lodge, in typewritten form, 14 copies of public evidence and 12 copies of confidential evidence, to be presented under oath at the public hearing, at the Board's office no later than Tuesday, 6 February 1973. In preparing this evidence the "Notes for Information and Guidance of Interested Parties" prepared by the Board may be of assistance. Copies of these notes may be obtained from the Board's office.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR SEPTEMBER 1972

**General**—September was a warm month marked by exceptionally strong winds from a westerly quarter. Over most of the North Island and in Nelson, Marlborough, and Canterbury conditions were rather too dry but the weather was favourable for lambing. However, in Southland and Otago this was a particularly wet month and it followed 6 months of predominantly wet weather, especially in Southland. Besides stock losses due to flooding, there were many reports of losses of both lambs and ewes from the wet weather and lack of feed. Many gales were reported, especially in the South Island on the 13th, with some damage. On this occasion Dunedin suffered particularly severe damage. At the Airport the wind reached gale force during nearly all the afternoon and evening, the highest mean speed over a 10-minute

period being 59 kts and the highest gust 84 kts. Two small local tornadoes were reported, the first at Frankton, Hamilton, on the 17th, the second at Levin on the 21st. Considerable damage was done, especially at Levin.

**Rainfall**—Rainfall showed wide variations. It was below normal except in western and southern districts of the South Island. On the Canterbury Plains and in most of Marlborough, also in the Waimea Plains of Nelson and in Gisborne and Northern Hawke's Bay, it was less than half the normal value. By contrast, over nearly the whole of Fiordland, Southland, and Otago rainfall was from 2 to 4 times the normal value. Over most of Otago and part of Southland more than half the month's rain, amounting to 70-150 mm, fell during the 8th and 9th, causing serious flooding of the Clutha and Mataura Rivers.

**Temperatures**—Temperatures were above normal by  $\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  to  $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  C, with highest departures in Canterbury and Marlborough. Blenheim had its warmest September in 40 years of observation. Snow was reported in parts of Southland and Otago and in a few areas of inland Canterbury from the 7th to the 9th and from the 27th to the 29th.

**Sunshine**—Eastern districts north of Timaru together with Bay of Plenty and Northland were favoured with 30–55 hours more sun than normal. Western districts of both islands received 30–40 hours below normal.

**Weather Sequence**—During the first three days of September a depression from the North Tasman Sea crossed the North Island and moved away to the east. Rain was reported over the North Island and the greater part of the South Island with some considerable falls in Bay of Plenty, Auckland, and Northland on the 1st and 2nd. For the next three days a ridge of high pressure extended on to the country from an anticyclone passing east to the north, and the weather was mainly fine. However, showers were reported in a few coastal districts. A southerly gale buffeted Wellington on the 4th.

A slow-moving trough of low pressure, orientated west to east, moved on to Southland on the 7th with rain there and on the West Coast. A depression formed on this trough over the South Island and as the whole system moved eastward during the 8th and 9th rain became general. Some heavy falls were reported in Westland and the Alps and in Southland and Otago; and serious flooding occurred in the Mataura and Clutha rivers. Gales affected Hawke's Bay, Wairarapa, and Wellington. As the depression moved away to the east of the South Island on the 10th showers were fairly general in the south-westerlies.

The period from the 11th to the 18th was one of strong westerlies. Three depressions passed far to the south-west during this period, those on the 12th and 17th being particularly intense. This was a

period of almost continuously unsettled weather on the West Coast and in parts of Southland, and rain became general over the South Island on the 13th, and over both Islands on the 14th and 16th. These periods of general rain were associated with the passage of troughs of low pressure. Some particularly strong gales were reported in eastern and inland districts of the South Island on the 13th.

On the 19th a trough of low pressure which was crossing the country developed a small wave on it. Rain was reported in western districts of both Islands with light falls also in the east and north of the North Island. On the following day the depression was centered just east of Cook Strait and very strong south-westerlies covered the country with some gales, particularly in Auckland. Rain was fairly general. On the 21st, with the depression to the east, light rain still covered the North Island.

The period from the 22nd to the 26th was another one of westerlies, with pressures high to the north and low to the south. Rain again affected the West Coast, extending also at times to Southland, the Canterbury high country, and parts of Otago.

On the 27th and 28th a trough of low pressure associated with a deep depression to the south moved north-eastward over the country forming a small wave near Cook Strait. General rain was reported, but it was quite light in many districts. On the following day another weak trough of low pressure brought a change to south-westerlies with further rain on the West Coast, besides Southland and parts of Otago. On the last day of the month an anticyclone was centred over the South Tasman Sea with a ridge extending on to New Zealand, and the weather was fine.
