ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of January 1973

Present:

THE HON. N. E. KIRK PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order shall come into effect on 1 April 1973.
2. The boundaries of the County of Hutt and the City of Upper Hutt shall be altered by excluding from the district of the said county and including in the district of the said city the areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto.
3. For the purpose of representation only, the district of the City of Upper Hutt herein prescribed shall, for a period of 10 years, be divided into three wards as follows:
 - (a) The Rimutaka Rural Ward, comprising the area described in the First Schedule hereto;
 - (b) The Rimutaka Urban Ward, comprising the area described in the Second Schedule hereto; and
 - (c) The Upper Hutt City Ward, comprising the area described in the Third Schedule hereto.
4. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, nothing contained herein shall operate to prevent the Upper Hutt City Council, pursuant to section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, from subdividing the area described herein as the Upper Hutt City Ward into further wards, not exceeding five in number, for the period specified in clause 3 of this order.
5. Nothing herein provided shall operate to prevent the Council of the City of Upper Hutt from continuing a ward system for representation purposes beyond the period hereinbefore prescribed in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.
6. For the purpose of finance the City of Upper Hutt herein prescribed shall, for a period of not less than 5 nor more than 10 years, be divided into two divisions to be known as:

- (a) Rimutaka Rural Division, comprising the areas described in the First Schedule hereto; and
- (b) Upper Hutt Urban Division, comprising the areas described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto.

7. The provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 in respect of ward rating, finance, and accounts shall, with any necessary modifications, apply to the above divisions as if they were wards of the City of Upper Hutt.

8. (a) The system of rating shall be on the basis of the unimproved or land values as the case may be.

(b) Until such time as a revised valuation of the whole of the city herein prescribed shall come into effect the provisions of the Rating Act 1967 shall, where applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to the said city as if for the purposes of Part IX of the said Act the said city were a "special purpose authority" and as if the area described in each Schedule hereto were a "constituent district" within the provisions of the said Act.

9. For such a period as the wards specified in clause 3 of this order are maintained, the Council of the City of Upper Hutt shall comprise 17 members exclusive of the Mayor, and ward representation shall be as follows:

Rimutaka Rural Ward	1 member
Rimutaka Urban Ward	4 members
Upper Hutt City Ward	12 members

10. The first election of the Council referred to in clause 9 of this order shall be held on the date fixed for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities pursuant to the provisions of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1966.

11. Until the members of the Council of the City of Upper Hutt come into office following the triennial general election referred to in clause 10 of this order, the Council of the said city shall comprise the Mayor of the City of Upper Hutt and 17 councillors, as follows:

- (a) One councillor to represent the Rimutaka Rural Ward who shall be elected at an election as hereinafter provided.
- (b) Four councillors to represent the Rimutaka Urban Ward, of whom one shall be the member of the Hutt County Council representing the Rimutaka Riding of Hutt County and holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect, and three shall be elected at an election as hereinafter provided.
- (c) Twelve councillors to represent the Upper Hutt City Ward who shall be the 12 councillors of the Upper Hutt City Council holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect.

12. (a) The Returning Officer of the present City of Upper Hutt shall be the Returning Officer for the purpose of conducting the elections called for by the provisions of sub-clause (a) and subclause (b) of clause 11 of this order.

(b) For the purposes of preparing the rolls for use in such elections the provisions of subsection (3) of section 38 of the Local Government Commission Act 1967 shall, with any necessary modifications, apply.

(c) Every elector shall have one vote only for any such election at which he may be qualified to vote.

(d) The elections shall be held not later than 1 calendar month prior to the date on which this order takes effect.

(e) The persons declared to be elected shall come into office on the date on which this order takes effect.

(f) This clause shall come into force immediately upon the making of this order, notwithstanding anything in clause 1 hereof.

13. The transfer of any members of the staff of the Hutt County Council to the service of the Upper Hutt City Council in terms of the agreement with the Councils of the Cities of Wellington, Porirua, Lower Hutt, Upper Hutt, and the County of Hutt shall be deemed to be transfers of permanent employees within the meaning of section 4 of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963 and the provisions of that Act shall, with any necessary modifications, apply accordingly.

14. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

15. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967 the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District containing 176 square miles, more or less, being portion of the County of Hutt bounded by a line commencing at a point on the summit of the Rimutaka Range and on the southern watershed of Narrow Neck Stream in Block IX, Rimutaka S.D., and proceeding generally northerly along that watershed to and along the eastern and northern boundaries of Lot 4, D.P. 3864, the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Lot 3, D.P. 3864, the south-western boundaries of Sections 97, 69, and 30, Upper Mangaroa District, a right line across Whitemans Valley Road to and along the south-eastern boundary of Lot 8, D.P. 25419, the south-western boundary of Section 120, Upper Mangaroa District, the south-western, northern, and western boundaries of Section 96, Upper Mangaroa District, the western boundaries of Sections 244 and 615, Hutt District, the abutment of a road, the western and southern boundaries of Section 286, Hutt District, the southern boundary of Section 763, Hutt District, the north-eastern side of Blue Mountains Road, the abutment of No. 1 Line, the eastern boundary of Section 206, Hutt District, the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Section 285, Hutt District, the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of Section 168, Hutt District, the western boundary of Section 166, Hutt District, the north-western boundaries of Sections 164, 162, 160, 158, 156, and 154, Hutt District, and the south-western side of a road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 272, Hutt District; thence easterly and northerly along the boundaries of the City of Upper Hutt as described in *Gazette*, 1927, p. 3287, to the northern side of the Wellington-Napier Railway; thence easterly along that side to a point in line with the eastern boundary of the land shown on D.P. 9522; thence generally southerly along a right line to and along the eastern and southern boundaries of the land shown on D.P. 9522 to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 10351, along a right line to and along that boundary and its production to the north-western boundary of Section 146, Hutt District, and along that boundary and the northern side of Wallaceville Road to the north-western side of Parkes Line Road; thence generally north-easterly along that side to and along the western boundary of Section 219, Hutt District (including a right line across railway land), the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 295, Hutt District, the north-western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 29395, a right line across Mangaroa Hill Road, and the north-western boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. 26392, and Sections 138, 137, and 136, Hutt District, to the southern side of the Wellington-Napier Railway; thence generally easterly along that side, the south-western boundary of Section 141, Hutt District, the north-western side of Parkes Line Road, the north-eastern boundary of Section 141, Hutt District, to the northern side of the Wellington-Napier Railway, along that side to and along the northern boundary of part Section 299, Hutt

District, containing 17.6 perches as shown on S.O. Plan 24516 and along the north-western boundary of Section 787, Hutt District, to its northernmost corner; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Section 299, Hutt District, and easterly along the northern boundary of Section 9, Block XV Akatarawa S.D., to a point in line with the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 21425; thence generally southerly along a right line to and along the western boundaries of Lots 1, 2, and 3, D.P. 21425, and the south-western boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. 30434, and Lot 6, D.P. 21425, to the southernmost corner of the said Lot 6; thence generally northerly along the south-eastern boundary of the said Lot 6 and its production to the north-eastern side of Plateau Road, along that side to and along the northern boundary of Section 9, Block XV Akatarawa S.D., the western boundary of Section 438, Hutt District, the southern boundaries of Lots 2 and 1, D.P. 25159, the western boundary of the said Lot 1, the southern side of No. 2 State Highway to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 181, Hutt District, and along a right line to and along that boundary and its production to the middle of a road; thence south-westerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Lot 5, D.P. 28647; thence northerly along a right line to and along the eastern boundaries of Lots 5 and 2, D.P. 28647, to the north-eastern corner of the said Lot 2; thence generally westerly along the southern and western boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. 1820, the southern boundaries of Sections 364 and 363, Hutt District (including the crossing of Akatarawa Road), to the right bank of the Akatarawa River; thence generally south-westerly along that bank to and along the northern boundaries of Lots 2 and 1, D.P. 23431, the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 23431, the abutment of a road, the north-eastern and northern boundaries of Lot 13, D.P. 8723, the north-eastern boundary of Lot 12, D.P. 8723, the north-western boundaries of Lots 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, and 3, D.P. 8723, the southern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 8723, the western side of Bridge Road, the northern boundaries of Lots 13-18 (inclusive), D.P. 12486, the western boundaries of Lots 19-27 (inclusive) and 29, D.P. 12486, the southern boundaries of Lots 29 and 30, D.P. 12486, the right bank of the Hutt River, and the north-western boundaries of Lots 3 and 2, D.P. 27815 to the westernmost corner of the said Lot 2; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. 29844, and Section 806, Hutt District, to the easternmost corner of the said Section 806; thence westerly along the boundaries of the City of Upper Hutt as described in *Gazette*, 1927, p. 3287, to the easternmost corner of Lot 1, D.P. 13385; thence generally north-westerly along a right line to the easternmost corner of Lot 1, D.P. 9256, and along the northern boundary of that lot and the generally north-eastern boundaries of Sections 28, 27, and 26, Block XIII, Akatarawa S.D., to the southern boundary of Section 23, Block XIII, Akatarawa S.D.; thence easterly along the production of that boundary to the middle of Bulls Run Road and generally north-westerly along the middle of that road and Cook Road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 29, Block X Paekakariki S.D., to and along that boundary, the eastern boundaries of Lots 13, 5, and 11, D.P. 8106, the northern boundaries of Lots 11 and 5, D.P. 8106, the western boundary of Lot 4, D.P. 8106, and its production to and along the middle of a road to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 2, Block VII, Paekakariki S.D., and to and along that boundary and the western boundaries of Section 1, Titi District, to the easternmost corner of Lot 1, D.P. 11960; thence generally north-easterly along right lines to Trig Station Wainui and to the southernmost corner of Section 9, Block IV, Paekakariki S.D., and along the western boundary of Section 1, Titi District, to the south-eastern watershed of the Maungakotukutuku Stream; thence generally easterly along that watershed passing through Trig Stations Titi and Maunganui to the north-eastern boundary of Section 1, Titi District, and along the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of the said Section 1, the north-eastern boundaries of the land shown on D.P. 10581 to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 5, Block II, Akatarawa S.D. to and along that boundary, the eastern boundaries of Sections 5, 4, and 3, Block II, Akatarawa S.D., the southern boundary of Section 413, Hutt District, and its production to and along the western and northern boundaries of Section 412, Hutt District, the eastern boundaries of Sections 412, 411, 408, and 407, Hutt District, the northern boundary of Section 2, Block III, Akatarawa S.D., and its production to and along the middle of a road to a point in line with the western boundary of Lot 6, D.P. 10208, to and along that boundary and the northern boundaries of that lot to the road angle opposite the north-western corner of Lot 1, D.P. 10208, along a right line to that corner and along the northern and eastern boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. 10208, along a road side and the eastern boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. 10208, along a road side and the northern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 10208, along a road side and the northern boundary of Lot 4

D.P. 10208, along a road side and the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of Lot 5, D.P. 10208, to the eastern-most corner of the said Lot 5, along the south-eastern boundary of a trig. reserve to Trig. Station G (Renata), and along the watershed of the Hutt and Waitotauru River to the summit of the Rimutaka Range in Block I, Eritonga S.D.; thence generally south-easterly and south-westerly along the summit of the Rimutaka Range to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District containing 7.6 square miles, more or less, being portion of the County of Hutt bounded by a line commencing at the easternmost corner of Section 806, Hutt District, in Block XIV, Akatarawa S.D., and proceeding north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of the said Section 806, and Lot 1, D.P. 29844, to the westernmost corner of Lot 2, D.P. 27815; thence generally north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of Lots 2 and 3, D.P. 27815, the right bank of the Hutt River, the southern boundaries of Lots 29 and 30, D.P. 12486, the western boundaries of Lots 29, 27, 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, 21, 20, and 19, D.P. 12486, the northern boundaries of Lots 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, and 13, D.P. 12486, the western side of Bridge Road, the southern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 8723, the north-western boundaries of Lots 3-12 (inclusive), D.P. 8723, the north-eastern boundary of Lot 12, D.P. 8723, the northern and north-eastern boundaries of Lot 13, D.P. 8723, the abutment of a road, the western boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. 23431, the northern boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 23431, and the right bank of the Akatarawa River to the southern boundary of Section 363, Hutt District; thence generally easterly along that boundary and its production to and along the southern boundary of Section 364, Hutt District, and the western and southern boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. 1820, to the north-eastern corner of Lot 2, D.P. 28647; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Lots 2 and 5, D.P. 28647, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of a road; thence north-easterly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 181, Hutt District; thence generally southerly to and along that boundary and its production to the southern side of No. 2 State Highway, along that side to and along the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 25159, the southern boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 25159, the western boundary of Section 438, Hutt District, the northern boundary of Section 9, Block XV, Akatarawa S.D., the north-eastern side of Plateau Road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Lot 6, D.P. 21425, and to and along that boundary to the southernmost corner of the said Lot 6; thence generally northerly along the south-western boundaries of the said Lot 6 and Lot 1, D.P. 30434, and the western boundaries of Lots 3, 2, and 1, D.P. 21425, and their production to the northern boundary of Section 9, Block XV, Akatarawa S.D.; thence westerly along that boundary and southerly along the eastern boundary of Section 299, Hutt District, and the north-western boundary of Section 787, Hutt District, to the northern boundary of part Section 299, Hutt District, containing 17.6 perches, as shown on S.O. Plan 24516; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said part Section 299 to and along the generally northern side of the Wellington-Napier Railway to the north-eastern boundary of Section 141, Hutt District, along that boundary, crossing the aforesaid railway, to the north-western side of Parkes Line Road, and along that side and the south-western boundary of the said Section 141 to and along the southern side of the aforesaid railway to the north-western boundary of Section 136, Hutt District, thence generally south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of Sections 136, 137, and 138, Hutt District, and Lot 1, D.P. 26392, a right line across Mangaroa Hill Road, the north-western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 29395, the north-eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Section 295, Hutt District, the western boundary of Section 219, Hutt District, including a right line across railway land, and the north-western side of Parkes Line Road to the northern side of Wallaceville Road; thence westerly along that side to the north-western boundary of Section 146, Hutt District; thence generally northerly along that boundary to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 10351, and to and along that boundary and its production to the southern boundary of the land shown on D.P. 9522, and along the southern and eastern boundaries of the land shown on D.P. 9522, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the northern side of the Wellington-Napier Railway; thence westerly along that side to the eastern boundary of Section 121, Hutt District; thence northerly along the boundaries of the City of Upper Hutt as described in *Gazette*, 1927, p. 3287, to the point of commencement.

Boundaries of County of Hutt and City of Lower Hutt Altered and Hutt Valley and Bays Fire Board Constituted

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 15th day of January 1973

THE HON. N. E. KIRK PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- This order shall come into effect on 1 April 1973.
- The boundaries of the districts of the County of Hutt and the City of Lower Hutt shall be altered by excluding from the district of the said county and including in the district of the said city:
 - The area described in the First Schedule hereto;
 - The area described in the Second Schedule hereto; and
 - The area described in the Third Schedule hereto.
- The areas described in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be included in the district of the said city.
- For the purpose of representation only, the district of the City of Lower Hutt herein prescribed shall, for a period expiring on completion of the 3-year term of office of the councillors to be elected to the Lower Hutt City Council at the triennial election of councillors to be held in 1974, be divided into two wards as follows:
 - The Epuni Ward, comprising the area described in the Second Schedule hereto; and
 - The Lower Hutt City Ward, comprising the areas described in the Fifth Schedule hereto.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (e) of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, nothing contained herein shall operate to prevent the Lower Hutt City Council, pursuant to section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, from subdividing the area described herein as the Lower Hutt City Ward into further wards, not exceeding five in number, for the period specified in clause 4 of this order.
- Nothing herein provided shall operate to prevent the Council of the City of Lower Hutt from continuing a ward system for representation purposes beyond the period hereinbefore prescribed in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.
- For the period determined in clause 4 of this order, the Council of the City of Lower Hutt herein prescribed shall comprise 16 members, exclusive of the Mayor, and ward representation shall be as follows:

Epuni Ward	1 member
Lower Hutt City Ward	15 members
- The first election of the Council referred to in clause 7 of this order shall be held on the date fixed for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities pursuant to the provisions of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1966.
- Until the members of the Council of the City of Lower Hutt come into office following the triennial general election of councillors referred to in clause 8 of this order, the Council of the said City shall comprise the Mayor of the City of Lower Hutt holding that office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect, and 16 councillors as follows:
 - Fifteen councillors to represent the Lower Hutt City Ward who shall be the 15 councillors of the Lower Hutt City Council holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect; and
 - One councillor to represent the Epuni Ward who shall be the member of the Hutt County Council elected to represent the Epuni Riding of Hutt County and holding such office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect.
- The rating system in the district of the City of Lower Hutt shall be the annual rental value system.

11. The transfer of any members of the staff of the Hutt County Council to the service of the Lower Hutt City Council in terms of the agreement between the Councils of the Cities of Wellington, Lower Hutt, Porirua, Upper Hutt, and the County of Hutt shall be deemed to be transfers of permanent employees within the meaning of section 4 of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963 and the provisions of that Act shall, with any necessary modifications, apply accordingly.

12. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

13. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967, the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

14. On the coming into effect of this order, the Hutt Valley and Bays United Urban Fire District shall be abolished and the Hutt Valley and Bays Fire Board shall be dissolved.

15. The district of the City of Lower Hutt, following the alteration of boundaries herein provided, but excluding therefrom the areas described in the First and Fourth Schedules hereto, shall be constituted an Urban Fire District to be known as the Hutt Valley and Bays Urban Fire District.

16. The Urban Fire Authority for the Hutt Valley and Bays Urban Fire District shall be a fire board to be known as the Hutt Valley and Bays Fire Board and shall comprise:

- (a) One member to be elected by the fire brigades in the said fire district in accordance with rules approved by the Minister of Local Government;
- (b) Three members to be elected to represent the Lower Hutt City Council; and
- (c) Three members to represent insurance companies carrying on business in the Hutt Valley and Bays Urban Fire District to be elected in accordance with section 29 of the Fire Services Act 1972.

17. Until the members of the Hutt Valley and Bays Fire Board come into office following the next election of members of Fire Boards and Fire Committees held pursuant to subsection (1) of section 28 of the Fire Services Act 1972, the said Board shall comprise the members of the Hutt Valley and Bays Fire Board holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect.

18. The Order in Council made on 24 March 1959 and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on 25 March 1959, at page 386, constituting the Hutt Valley and Bays United Urban Fire District, is hereby revoked.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District containing 1.7 square miles, more or less, being portion of the County of Hutt and reclamations bounded by a line commencing at a point on the mean high-water mark of Wellington Harbour in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 17, Harbour District, in Block XIII, Belmont S.D., and proceeding generally northerly to and along that boundary and its production to and along the middle of Horokiwi Road to a point in line with the eastern boundaries of Section 156, Porirua District, and Section 40, Horokiwi Road District, and to and along the eastern boundaries of the said Section 156 and Sections 41 and 19, Horokiwi Road District, to the south-western corner of part Section 20, Horokiwi Road District (C.T. 444/197); thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said part Section 20 to its south-eastern corner; thence southerly along the boundaries of the Borough of Petone as described in *Gazette*, 1967, p. 2250, to the mean high-water mark of Wellington Harbour; thence south-westerly along the mean high-water mark of Wellington Harbour to the point of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District containing 13 square miles, more or less, being portion of the County of Hutt bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost corner of Maungaraki 7 in Block VIII, Belmont S.D., and proceeding generally north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 22 and 24, Horokiwi Road District, the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 25, the generally eastern boundaries of Section 26, the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 39, 33 and 34, Horokiwi Road District, the northern boundary of Section 343, Hutt District, and its production to the middle of a road, and along the middle of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 349, Hutt District; thence generally easterly to and along that boundary and its production to and along the middle of Belmont Road to a point in line

THE HON. N. E. KIRK PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967 His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1973.

2. The boundaries of the districts of the County of Hutt and the City of Wellington are hereby altered by excluding from the district of the said county and including in the district of the said city the area described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall be included in the district of the said city.

4. For representation purposes only, the district of the City of Wellington herein prescribed shall, for a period expiring on completion of the 3-year term of office of the councillors to be elected to the Wellington City Council at the triennial general election of councillors to be held in 1974, be divided into two wards with the following names and boundaries:

- (a) The Makara Ward, comprising the area described in the First Schedule hereto; and
- (b) The Wellington City Ward, comprising the areas described in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (e) of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, nothing contained herein shall operate to prevent the Wellington City Council, pursuant to section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, from subdividing the area described herein as the Wellington City Ward into further wards, not exceeding five in number, for the period specified in clause 4 of this order.

6. Nothing herein provided shall operate to prevent the Council of the City of Wellington from continuing a ward system for representation purposes beyond the period hereinbefore prescribed in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.

7. For the period referred to in clause 4 of this order, the Council of the City of Wellington herein prescribed shall comprise 16 members, exclusive of the Mayor, and ward representation shall be as follows:

Makara Ward	1 member
Wellington City Ward	15 members

Provided that nothing herein shall preclude the Wellington City Council from altering the number of councillors to represent the Wellington City Ward in accordance with and subject to the provisions of section 53 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, and for this purpose the Wellington City Ward shall be deemed to be an "undivided borough".

8. The first election of the Council referred to in clause 7 of this order shall be held on the date fixed for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities pursuant to the provisions of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1966.

9. Until the members of the Council of the City of Wellington come into office following the triennial general election referred to in clause 8 of this order, the Council of the said city shall comprise the Mayor of the City of Wellington and 6 councillors as follows:

- (a) One councillor to represent the Makara Ward who shall be the member of the Hutt County Council elected to represent the Makara Riding of Hutt County and holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect.
- (b) Fifteen councillors to represent the Wellington City Ward who shall be the 15 councillors of the Wellington City Council holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect.

10. (a) The system of rating shall be on the basis of the unimproved or land values as the case may be.

(b) Until such time as a revised valuation of the whole of the city herein prescribed shall come into effect the provisions of the Rating Act 1967 shall, where applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to the said city as if, for the purposes of Part IX of the said Act, the said city were a "special purpose authority" and as if the area described in the First and Third Schedules hereto were constituent districts" within the provisions of the said Act.

11. The transfer of any members of the staff of the Hutt County Council to the service of the Wellington City Council in terms of the agreement between the Councils of the Cities of Wellington, Lower Hutt, Porirua, and Upper Hutt and the County of Hutt shall be deemed to be transfers of permanent employees within the meaning of section 4 of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963 and the provisions of that Act shall, with any necessary modifications, apply accordingly.

12. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

13. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967, the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

THE HON. N. E. KIRK PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order shall come into effect on 1 April 1973.
2. The boundaries of the districts of the County of Hutt and the City of Porirua shall be altered by excluding from the district of the said county and including in the district of the said city, the areas described in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, and Fifth Schedules hereto.
3. The area described in the Sixth Schedule hereto shall be included in the district of the said city.

4. For the purpose of representation only, the district of the City of Porirua herein prescribed shall, for a period of 10 years, be divided into three wards as follows:

- (a) The Pukerua Bay Ward, comprising the area described in the Fifth Schedule hereto;
- (b) The Taupo Ward comprising the area described in the Fourth Schedule hereto; and
- (c) The Porirua City Ward, comprising the areas described in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (e) of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 nothing contained herein shall operate to prevent the Porirua City Council, pursuant to section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, from subdividing the area described herein as the Porirua City Ward into further wards, not exceeding five in number, for the period specified in clause 4 of this order.

6. Nothing herein provided shall operate to prevent the Council of the City of Porirua from continuing a ward system for representation purposes beyond the period hereinbefore prescribed in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.

7. For the purposes of finance the City of Porirua herein prescribed shall, for a period of not less than 5 years nor more than 10 years, be divided into two divisions to be known as:

- (a) Taupo - Pukerua Bay Division, comprising the areas described in the Fourth and Fifth Schedules hereto; and
- (b) Porirua Division, comprising the areas described in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

8. The provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 in respect of ward rating, finance, and accounts shall, with any necessary modifications, apply to the above divisions as if they were wards of the City of Porirua.

9. (a) The system of rating shall be on the basis of the unimproved or land values as the case may be.

(b) Until such time as a revised valuation of the whole of the city herein prescribed shall come into effect the provisions of the Rating Act 1967 shall, where applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to the said city as if, for the purposes of Part IX of the said Act, the city were a "special purpose authority" and as if each of the areas described in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Schedules hereto, and the City of Porirua as described in *Gazette*, 1968, p. 2123, were a "constituent district" within the provisions of the said Act.

10. For such period as the wards specified in clause 4 of this order are maintained, the Council of the City of Porirua shall comprise 15 members, exclusive of the Mayor, and ward representation shall be as follows:

Pukerua Bay Ward	1 member
Taupo Ward	2 members
Porirua City Ward	12 members

11. The first election of the Council referred to in clause 10 of this order shall be held on the date fixed for the next triennial general election of members of local authorities pursuant to the provisions of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1966.

12. Until the members of the Council of the City of Porirua come into office following the triennial general election referred to in clause 11 of this order, the Council of the said city shall comprise the Mayor of the City of Porirua and 15 councillors as follows:

- (a) One councillor to represent the Pukerua Bay Ward who shall be the member of the Hutt County Council representing the Pukerua Bay Riding of Hutt County and holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect;
- (b) Two councillors to represent the Taupo Ward of whom one shall be the councillor of the Hutt County Council elected to represent the Taupo Riding of Hutt County and holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect, and the other shall be a member of the Plimmerton/Paremata County Town Committee holding office immediately prior to the said date who shall be appointed by the Hutt County Council on the nomination of the said County Town Committee; and
- (c) Twelve councillors to represent the Porirua City Ward who shall be the 12 councillors of the Porirua City Council holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect.

13. On the coming into effect of this order, the Plimmerton Urban Fire District shall be abolished and the areas described in the Fourth and Fifth Schedules hereto shall be included in the Porirua United Urban Fire District.

14. Upon the alteration of the boundaries of the Porirua United Urban Fire District as herein provided, the membership of the Porirua Fire Board shall be increased to seven members with representation as follows:

- (a) One member to be elected by the fire brigades in the Porirua United Urban Fire District, in accordance with the rules approved by the Minister of Local Government;
- (b) Three members to represent the contributing local authorities of the Porirua United Urban Fire District to be elected as follows:
 - (i) Two members by resolution of the Porirua City Council; and
 - (ii) One member by resolution of the Tawa Borough Council.
- (c) Three members to represent insurance companies carrying on business in the Porirua United Urban Fire District to be elected in accordance with section 29 of the Fire Services Act 1972.

15. Until the members of the Porirua United Urban Fire District come into office following the next election of members of fire boards and fire committees held pursuant to subsection (1) of section 28 of the Fire Services Act 1972, the said Board shall comprise the members of the Porirua Fire Board holding office immediately prior to the date on which this order takes effect; and

- (a) One further member to be appointed by the Porirua City Council to represent the constituent local authorities within the Porirua United Urban Fire District hereby constituted; and
- (b) One further member to represent the insurance companies carrying on business in the Porirua United Urban Fire District to be elected in accordance with section 29 of the Fire Services Act 1972.

16. The following Orders in Council are hereby revoked:

- (a) Order dated 31 March 1958 and published in the *Gazette* on 2 April 1958 at page 415.
- (b) Order dated 30 January 1963 and published in the *Gazette* on 7 February 1963 at page 145.

17. The transfer of any members of the staff of the Hutt County Council to the service of the Porirua City Council in terms of the agreement with the Councils of the Cities of Wellington, Lower Hutt, Upper Hutt, Porirua, and the County of Hutt shall be deemed to be transfers of permanent employees within the meaning of section 4 of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963 and the provisions of that Act shall, with any necessary modifications, apply accordingly.

18. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

19. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967 the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries herein provided.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Clifford Ernest Beard, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Trade and Industry acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2208 and shall come into force on the 18th day of January 1973.

2. (1) Price Order No. 2169* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

3. References in this order to metropolitan areas are references to the metropolitan areas described in the Schedule hereto.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This order applies with respect to Island bananas sold by way of retail in New Zealand.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF ISLAND BANANAS

5. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for Island bananas to which this order applies shall be:

(a) When sold by a retailer carrying on business in any of the metropolitan areas of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, or in any of the Cities or Boroughs of Whangarei, Takapuna, Hamilton, Tauranga, Rotorua, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Stratford, Hawera, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Napier, Hastings, Masterton, Blenheim, Nelson, Greymouth, Timaru, Westport, Oamaru, Balclutha, Gore, or Invercargill—

15 cents per lb.

(b) When sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere—

1 lb, 16 cents;
2 lb, 31 cents;
3 lb, 47 cents;
4 lb, 62 cents;
5 lb, 78 cents;
6 lb, 93 cents.

Fractions of a pound shall be calculated at the rate of 16 cents per lb. Quantities in excess of 6 lb shall be calculated at the rate 15½ cents per lb.

(2) If in respect of any lot of bananas the price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of cents, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest whole cent.

PROVISIONS FOR SPECIAL PRICES

6. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any Island bananas to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of bananas, or may relate generally to all Island bananas to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON RETAILERS

7. Every retailer who offers or exposes for sale in any shop any Island bananas to which this order applies shall keep in a prominent position, in such proximity to the bananas to which it relates as to be obviously in relation thereto, a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the following particulars:

(a) The retail price per pound of the bananas. Retailers to whom clause 5 (1) (b) of this order applies shall state at least the prices for 1 lb and 2 lb lots.
(b) The word "Island".
