The Golden Bay County Council Foreshore Control Order 1973

DENIS BLUNDELL, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 18th day of June 1973

THE HON. H. WATT PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (a) This order may be cited as the Golden Bay County Council Foreshore Control Order 1973.
- (b) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Gazette.
 - 2. In this order-

"The Act" means the Harbours Act 1950:
"The Council" means the Golden Bay County Council:
"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

"Minister" means the Minister of Transport, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the Council for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, subject to the provisions of section 165 of the Act and to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule to this order, the control of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

- (a) All that area of foreshore at Takaka abutting the causeway leading to the Waitapu Wharf.
- (b) All that area of foreshore at Takaka abutting Section I, Block VI, of the Waitapu Survey District.
- (c) All that area of foreshore at Collingwood commencing at a point in line with the common boundary of section 372 and Section I (Custom House Reserve) of the Town of Collingwood in Block XV of the Pakawau Survey District and thence generally northerly, easterly, and southerly around the headland of Aorere Harbour abutting Gibbs Town to a point in line with the common boundary of Sections 1 and 2 of Pt. I, D.P. 1501, Block XV, of the Pakawau Survey District.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

(1) Her Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty shall, at all times, have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order.

(2) Nothing in this order shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any provisions of the Harbours Act 1950, that is or may hereafter be in force.

(3) The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order for the purpose of holding sports meetings or games, and may, by bylaws, fix a charge for admission to any such enclosed part or parts: provided that the total number of days on which any particular part of that foreshore is so enclosed shall not exceed 6 in any 1 calendar year.

(4) Nothing in this order shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed from the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order any stone, shingle, sand, boulders, silt, mud or other material without the consent in writing of the Minister being first obtained.

(5) The rights, powers, and privileges conferred on the Council by this order may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment or any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council at least 6 months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This paperback novel tells the story of two scientists who conduct a research project on erotic human behaviour. The conduct a research project on erone numan behaviour. The accounts of some of the sexual exploits studied make the book unsuitable for young persons but it does not dwell unduly on prurient detail, nor employ obscene language. The book has no literary merit and the dominant effect is a rather laboured satire on scientific method but it is not devoid of some humour. We see no grounds for denying it to mature readers. it to mature readers.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Bathgate appeared on behalf of the applicant. Mr Downey, solicitor, appeared on behalf of the publisher's representative in New Zealand and made submissions.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This book, translated by Howard Nelson, claims to be by the famous French author, Guy de Maupassant. Although the Library of Congress catalogues this edition under Maupassant's name, we prefer to follow the standard work of Talvart and Place, Bibliographie des auteurs modernes de la langue française (1801–1956), Volume 13. This unequivocally states that the original of this work, Les Cousines de la Colonelle, has been falsely attributed to Maupassant and was actually written by Madam la Vicomtesse de Coeur-Brûlant, who was an old friend of Georges Sand and the widow of a French naval officer. She was the author of other erotica besides this one which was published in two volumes in 1880 and 1885. The book tells of the experiences, chiefly sexual, of two sisters in nineteenth century France. The sexual incidents predominate and are related in great detail.

The book displays little or no literary merit, and its attempt to masquerade as a genuine work of a notable author does nothing to redeem it.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

An abridged version of this book published under the title *Promiscuous Pauline* was found by the Tribunal to be indecent in its decision No. 325, delivered on 30 July 1971.

This edition claims to be a complete translation of the German original Aus den memoiren einer Saengerin, published in two parts in 1868 and 1875. There does not appear to be any substantial difference between the two versions, other than that of length. The singer's memoirs are in each case of her sexual rather than her musical prowess. The book is a series of sexual encounters told in very explicit detail and covering a wide range of activities, including some which are clearly perversions. The fact that it was originally written a century ago does not of itself confer either literary merit or social importance upon the book, and we do not find that it possesses either. It must be considered on the same standards as those we would apply to a book written at the present time, and we find no reason to depart from our previous decision.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

Mr Campbell, on behalf of the importers, explained that the magazine Sun-dial, an issue of which came before the Tribunal on 28 October 1969 and, in decision No. 170, was classified as not indecent, had ceased publication. In its place the publishers were now distributing Sundisk, the first three issues of which were before the Tribunal. The publication deviated from the ordinary sun-worship nude type magazine which was no longer in demand. He referred to a number of decisions on nudist publications which he submitted supported a restrictive classification.

The Tribunal is unable to accept this view. Although the text is generally unexceptionable, the illustrations, which dominate the publications, rarely relate to it. They are for the most part unnatural, provocative, and contrived. They clearly bring the magazine within the third category of the classifications which are defined in the Waverley decisions No. 93–103 of 15 July 1968.

The Tribunal classifies these three issues of the magazine as indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

Like the publications classified as indecent in decisions No. 626 and 627, these three picture books have brief introductory texts or cover descriptions aimed at whetting the appetite for the sequences of photographs of sexual activity which follow.

In the first two books there are ludicrous claims to be providing answers about lesbian relationships to the pressing questions which readers must have. The books simply seek to exploit contemporary acceptance of more open presentation of sexual behaviour. The third book makes no claim to any informative purpose. It is said to be based on two typical days in the life of its subject, the photographer, of whose "incredible sexual antics" the reader is favoured with "a tantalising glimpse". Its portrayal goes beyond what we consider acceptable within the provisions of the Act.

The Tribunal classifies these three books as indecent.

This is a cheaply produced paperback translation of what is claimed to be a French erotic novel of the midnineteenth century. It has no literary merit and is a flimsy account of a young woman's obsession with sexual pleasure, told with prurient detail and without any honesty of purpose.

Mr Bathgate appeared on behalf of the applicant and made submissions. Mr Taylor the importer appeared and made submissions.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

It was stated for the Customs Department that this book had been submitted to the Tribunal to get a ruling on the question of an age limitation, which had been the subject of disagreement between the Department and the New Zealand distributors. We were informed that several shipments of the book had already entered New Zealand and been on sale in some shops.

The book is basically a collection of photographs of the birth of a child, with a linking descriptive text. The photographs are very clear and explicit, but we do not find this treatment of natural childbirth as a human rite of celebration, to be in any way serving a salacious purpose. Lucidity, naturalness, and honesty are its hallmarks; and this realistic portrayal of childbirth should be freely available in New Zealand. We do not consider that an age restriction would serve any useful purpose.

The Tribunal classifies this book as not indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This book consists of a number of photographs of naked and recumbent women whose sleeping positions are said to reveal their zodiac signs. Accompanying notes purport to interpret what these positions mean in terms of the human personality, especially its sexuality. All this interpretation seems to be no more than a spurious trimming to gain currency for a set of photographs aimed at a much less cerebral response. For instance, there is an index of the Zodiac signs listing the appropriate page numbers in the book, but the pages which follow have no numbers at all. Some of the poses portrayed are worse than others but the effect of them all is to pander to prurient absorption in sexual matters.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

We have only a single issue of Fapto to consider and are therefore unable to judge whether this is fairly representative of its normal contents. In contrast to Oz, this issue of Fapto indicates that it has a rather greater and more overt concentration on sex than on general sociopolitical comment.

It is another representative of the group of publications frequently described as the alternative press, and we would not wish to see it totally restricted.

However, because of the explicitness of some of the sexual side of its contents, we consider an age restriction is required.

The Tribunal classifies Fapto, No. 9 as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

Mr Quirke, solicitor, appeared on behalf of the publisher's representative in New Zealand and made submissions.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This is the third issue of a new monthly magazine published in Australia. There is no indication in the issue before us as to when it commenced publication.

It is quite frankly homosexual in character. Its editorial policy is the subject of an article in this issue. It states that the "straight societies' [sic] attitude towards the homosexual is a great injustice. As their attitude is ignorance and lack of understanding the only way to change it is to show them the true character of the Australian homosexual. . . We want William and John to be . . . a publication that, whilst not forgetting that homosexuals relate better to their own sex, treats them as the normal people that they are by providing interesting and informative articles."

Including soft covers, it comprises a total of 60 pages. Twelve of these are devoted to nude photographs of males which out of the context in which they are placed, we would not necessarily judge to be indecent. There is also advertising on twelve pages and some of this offends. Some of the classified advertisements have a homosexual implication, and books which have been classified by the Tribunal as indecent are displayed in one advertisement. The remaining 32 pages comprise stories, articles, cartoons, and reviews, and a little less than half of this space is devoted to homoseuxality.

The treatment of this subject appears to go beyond accepting the practice as a fact of life to be sympathetically understood or compassionately condoned. There appears in places a conscious effort to show the homosexual life as attractive and glamorous, and this we feel could have in the wrong hands a corrupting influence and hinder the development of healthy patterns of behaviour, particularly in the immature. We cannot accept that glamourising the homosexual life is not socially harmful. To allow this publication unrestricted circulation would be contrary to the intention of the Indecent Publications Act.

Mr Quirke, in making submissions to the Tribunal, said that it was not the intention of the publishers that the magazine should be freely displayed and on sale on bookstalls, but it would be for subscribers only. The Tribunal accepts that a restriction of this kind would be helpful in meeting the objections we have to free circulation and the display and advertising for sales. The magazine Evergreen was, in decision No. 190 of 16 December 1969, restricted in this way.

The Tribunal therefore classifies this number of the magazine William and John as indecent except in the hands of those persons who have current annual subscriptions.

DECISION AND REPORT

Mr Rabone submitted that the issue of the magazine before the Tribunal was substantially the same in content, presentation, and object as Vol. 5, No. 17, which the Tribunal classified as indecent in decision 568 (New Zealand Gazette, 31 October 1972) delivered on 10 October 1972. He also

submitted that a substantial proportion of the photographs were contrived for salacious appeal so as to come within the third category of magazines described in the Waverley decisions (No. 93 to 103).

We agree with Mr Rabone. The series of photographs depict a variety of sexual poses and incidents in a crude and offensive way.

The Tribunal classifies this issue as indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This book is a collection of graphic art works by Lee Conklin, who, according to Mr Taylor, is one of America's leading graphic artists.

The meanings of the various works contained in this book are concerned with the human body and apparently, its are concerned with the numan body and apparently, is various mutations, and with various aspects of copulation. The illustrations seem to have been developed from the realm of the artist's imagination and are intended to expand the consciousness and awareness of the viewer. The designs are highly stylised, extremely intricate and detailed and have a grotesque and nightmarish quality which appears to be a current trend in graphic art.

Apart from one or two of the illustrations, aspects of copulation are not immediately obvious since the illustrations deal more in optical illusion than in sexual blatancy.

This collection of art works is representative of the current trends in graphic art and would appeal mainly to those interested in this field of art

The Tribunal classifies this book as not indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

These two issues of The Image contain articles, photographs, and graphic illustrations by various British artists, most of whom—the biographical notes state—are employed as photographers, designers, and illustrators.

The articles featured in these two issues concern current trends and new developments in the field of the graphic arts. The photographs and illustrations give visual effect to the subject under discussion. In some instances, however, there is no written presentation apart from the biographical notes on the artist and the photographic series or graphic illustrations stand on their own to convey their message.

The photography and graphics contained in these two magazines have artistic merit and while nudity forms two magazines have artistic merit and while nudity forms the subject of some of the photographic series and sex the subject of some of the graphic illustrations, neither subject is dwelt upon or given undue emphasis, nor are they treated in any perverse fashion. Indeed, the magazines contain some fine examples of the artistic standards that can be achieved in black and white nude photography. In their treatment of sex, the graphic illustrations are either satirical, humorous, or allegorical. In some instances all three elements are present. Taking each issue as a whole and having regard to the persons amongst whom they are likely to be distributed we see no reason to restrict them in any way.

The Tribunal classifies these two issues of The Image as not indecent.

He has to reckon with a radically disturbing uncertainty as to whether his aggressive possessing of others is not being turned against him so that it is he who is being exposed and made vulnerable to others' perversities. Younger readers may find parts of the novel disturbing and the interests of adult readers are adequately served by allowthe interests of adult readers are adequately served by allowing the book to circulate with an age restriction.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

It is claimed to be an intermingling of satire, social comment, sex, suspense, and adventure and perhaps a scathing indictment and a frightening portent of things to come. The "American visual", which has apparently come to stay, is a story told by a series of drawings and captions in the comic strip style.

In the 120-odd pages of illustrations and writings there are scenes of sexuality and violence which out of context could be regarded as objectionable and perhaps harmful to young persons. However, considering the book as a whole we do not think those parts sufficiently indecent within the meaning of the Act to justify a classification of indecency.

The Tribunal classifies this book as not indecent.

Everything about this book—its contents, its format, and its cover material—make its purpose unmistakable: to exploit prurient interest in "case history" recitals of sexual behaviour. It is simply another crude example of a genre with which the Tribunal has become all too familiar.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal

DECISION AND REPORT

In his submissions to the Tribunal, Mr Rosenberg said that these 37 comic books were imported in small numbers, for the purpose of reprinting select portions for distribution in New Zealand. The delay since their seizure had, he said, prevented this, and he asked that they be judged on the basis of being potentially for sale in New Zealand.

Comic strips and comic books have developed into a genre Comic strips and comic books have developed into a genre of entertainment regarded as predominantly catering for and affecting children and the semi-literate. They have, as well, been used for various informative and satirical purposes. Mr Rosenberg argued that the comics before the Tribunal were to be distinguished from the popular commercial product and that they were, indeed, directly satirical of the conventions and values of that product. He said that these 37 comics were not written for nor would they be appreciated by were not written for, nor would they be appreciated by, those who currently read the commercial comics. They were published for people who remember the influence commercial comics had on them and are now prepared to laugh at them. He submitted that they should be read as a social phenomenon and maintained that each comic should be looked at as a whole, so that the satirical exposure of "straight" society became apparent.

In considering these submissions the Tribunal must have regard to section 11 (3) of the Indecent Publications Act 1963. This section says that "When the Tribunal decides that any picture-story book likely to be read by children is indecent in the hands of children under a specified age that picture-story book shall be deemed to be indecent in the hands of all persons." The legislature apparently recognised the practical difficulties involved in placing an age restriction on an art form which made a particular appeal to children. appeal to children.

Quite apart from this consideration, however, it is the Tribunal's view that the content of these comics cannot be regarded as controlled by, or as serving any such sophisticated regarded as controlled by, or as serving any such sophisticated social or artistic purpose as Mr Rosenberg contends. Their treatment of sex, horror, crime, cruelty, and violence is so gross and extreme as to negate any such purpose; they simply use the comic book form to convey images of degrading behaviour in a crude and sensational manner. This and their standards of morality, art, and literacy nullify any satire or humour some pages may contain, and when it is found that in every one of the comic books there are frames or enjsodes depicting indecency and violence, and obscept words. episodes depicting indecency and violence, and obscene words are freely used, the public good would not be served by permitting their free circulation.

The Tribunal classifies these 37 comic books as indecent. 15 June 1973.

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month, the date of the first occurrence is given.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MAY 1973

General—May was a mild, windy month with an unusually high frequency of winds from between west and south-west. This caused cloudy, wet weather in Southland and on the West Coast but sunny, dry weather in areas such as Gisborne and Northland. The mild weather was appreciated by the farmers, who found conditions generally favourable, with quite good growth for the time of the year. However, in Marlborough and North Canterbury the persistence of a below-average rainfall for the seventh successive month caused a serious shortage of feed.

A small local tornado caused some damage at Weymouth, on Manukau Harbour, on the 9th.

Rainfall—Rainfall was above normal in nearly all western districts south of Auckland, also in Southland with most of Otago and in Wairarapa. The surplus exceeded 50 percent in North Taranaki, Manawatu, Buller, and north Westland, Fiordland, and most of Southland. Elsewhere rainfall was below normal, with a deficiency of more than 50 percent in eastern Northland, Gisborne, and northern Hawke's Bay, and a considerable part of Nelson and Marlborough.

Temperatures—Temperatures were mainly above normal by 1° C. Departures were somewhat greater over the North Island than over the South Island.

A cold spell on the 21st brought snow to low levels in parts of the South Island.

Sunshine—Sunshine was below normal by 20-50 hours over the greater part of the South Island and also in Manawatu, with greatest deficiencies on the West Coast, where Greymouth received only 58 hours. Northern and most eastern districts of the North Island were favoured with 20-35 hours above normal.

Weather Sequence—On the first 2 days of May pressures were high over the country and to the south, but a weak south-westerly trough brought scattered showers, especially in Taihape, Manawatu, and Westland. Pressures remained high to the north on the 3rd and 4th, but a depression was moving eastward from Tasmania and its warm front brought rain to western districts from Waikato southward. The depression next moved to the east of the South Island and on the 5th and 6th conditions remained somewhat similar, except that rain also spread to some eastern districts.

On the 7th a very deep depression near Macquarie Island moved eastward and during the next 2 days there was considerable rain west of the ranges and also on the Southland coast, while gales buffeted Cook Strait. Westerly conditions persisted on the 10th as another depression over the south Tasman Sea passed close to Southland, causing rain there and in Fiordland.

The next 4 days were particularly unsettled. During the 11th and 12th a secondary depression formed and moved north-eastward, over New Zealand with an associated trough, while pressures rose rapidly over Campbell Island. Rain was general except in parts of Hawke's Bay and Gisborne, and gales buffeted Canterbury and Cook Strait. During the next 2 days a depression over the north Tasman Sea crossed Northland while pressures were high to the south and east of the South Island. The weather cleared over the South Island but further considerable rain was reported in the North Island. From the 15th to the 17th this depression was off East Cape while further troughs crossed the country associated with depressions far to the south. Rain was reported over the whole of the South Island and most of the North Island.

During the 18th and 19th a very deep depression passed to the south and the associated trough of low pressure brought rain mainly to western districts of both Islands and Southland. On the 20th and 21st a cold south-westerly change brought fairly general rain, with snow to low levels in parts of the South Island. For the next 2 days conditions were once more of the westerly type, with depressions passing far to the south, causing rain on the West Coast. Another south-westerly change on the 24th extended the rain to Southland and some western areas of the North Island.

A ridge of high pressure extending from an anticyclone to the north brought settled conditions on the 25th. However, there was a return to westerly conditions once more on the following 4 days, with rain affecting western districts of both Islands and the Southland coast. One of the troughs of low pressure associated with these westerly conditions became slow-moving near Auckland on the 30th with rain still affecting some western districts. On the last day of the month an anticyclone was centred near Northland but westerlies once again brought some rain to Fiordland.
