LOCAL RATES SCALE OF CHARGES

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Local Rates Scale of Charges

Pursuant to the Government Railways Act 1949, the Minister of Railways hereby fixes the following local rates or scales of charges and hereby imposes the following terms and conditions in respect of the New Zealand Government Railways; and hereby declares that such local rates or scales of charges and such terms and conditions shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1974 on which date all local rates or scales of charges, and terms, and conditions previously made, fixed, or imposed in this behalf in respect of the said railways shall be revoked.

As witness my hand this 8th day of November 1973.

THE following rates or scales, terms, and conditions may be cited as the Local Rates Scale of Charges, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the scales, terms, and conditions fixed and imposed on the 1st day of April 1974 and therein cited and hereinafter referred to as the General Scale of Charges:

The following rates or scales shall be charged upon the portions of the railway hereinafter specified instead of the classified rates set forth in the General Scale of Charges.

Except as expressly provided hereinafter:

- (i) The terms and conditions prescribed by the General Scale of Charges with respect to goods (which expression means goods, luggage, or chattels of any description, and includes live or dead animals) shall apply to goods charged at or according to the following rates or scales.
- (ii) The following rates or scales shall not apply to goods conveyed through the parcels departments.
- (iii) The following rates or scales shall apply only between the stations named and cannot be combined with other local rates or with standard rates for the purpose of computing freight charges.

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7. Bulk Tonnage

- 1. Goods of Classes C, C plus percentages (except explosives), D, E, E plus percentages, G, P, P plus percentages, and section 85, General Scale of Charges will be conveyed at the rates specified in paragraph 2 hereof subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) The minimum quantity forwarded each and every week shall be the weight specified in paragraph 2 which shall include goods railed in the reverse direction and an average of 5 tonnes per four-wheeled wagon and 10 tonnes per bogie wagon based on each week's outward loadings. In no case will the quantity of goods consigned under the provisions of this section be less than 1 tonne per four-wheeled and 3 tonnes per bogie wagon.
 - (b) Cranage—Cranage will be charged on the daily aggregate weight of lifts at 41c per
 - (c) The goods carried under the provisions of this section will be conveyed at owner's risk.
 - (d) Participation in the rate is subject to written agreement with the Department.
 - (e) All loading and unloading to be performed by owners.

Note—Parcels traffic from or to all stations and goods traffic from or to stations other than those listed in this section will be charged at the appropriate rail rates to or from Maungaturoto, plus cartage charges from or to Maungaturoto as scheduled in the "General Instructions for Through Bookings".

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9. Traffic to or from Port Whangarei Wharf

The haulage charge on goods between Whangarei and Port Whangarei will be computed as per subpara. (a), para. 4, section 96, General Scale of Charges. Minimum loads: General cargo, 3 tonnes per four-wheeled wagon; other goods, 6 tonnes per four-wheeled wagon. For handling and/or sorting at Whangarei charges as per subpara. (c), para. 4 and subpara. (a), para. 1 section 96, General Scale of Charges, will be enforced. The charges on goods conveyed between the wharf and stations beyond Whangarei will be computed on the Whangarei distance plus 3 kilometres.

10. Haulage and Storage Charges, New Plymouth - Breakwater Line

1. (a) Except as provided in subparas. (b) and (c) hereof, goods of Classes C, D, E, E plus 25 percent, E plus 50 percent, G, P, P plus 25 percent, and P plus 50 percent between New Plymouth and New Plymouth Breakwater will be charged \$3.15 per tonne or \$2.83 per cubic metre whichever is greater, and will be conveyed at owner's risk.

- (b) In cases where loading and/or unloading is performed by the department, the charges for goods of Classes N and R in less than the prescribed minimum wagon loads will in no case be less than when computed on actual weight at the classified rates for such goods plus the prescribed loading and/or unloading charges.
- 2. Classes E and P goods, and goods conveyed under the provisions of section 81, General Scale of Charges, consigned between New Plymouth Breakwater and stations beyond New Plymouth and which require to be handled at New Plymouth goods shed will be charged \$3.67 per tonne (including handling and sorting at New Plymouth) in addition to railage from Breakwater. The charges at Class E single rate and the rates specified in section 81, paragraph 3, General Scale of Charges plus \$3.67 per tonne added shall not be greater than when computed at Class E plus 25 percent plus \$0.99 sorting. The charge at Class P single rate plus \$3.67 per tonne added shall not be greater than when computed at Class P plus 25 percent plus \$0.99 sorting.

- 4. Small consignments of goods hauled between Burnside Station and the Dunedin Saleyards Co. Ltd., private siding will be charged for such haulage at the rate of 19c for each 13 kg or part thereof with a minimum charge of 73c per consignment, or under the provisions of section 97, General Scale of Charges, whichever is the cheaper.
