PURSUANT to subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act 1949, I, Sir Edward Denis Blundell, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Southland Education Board as a site for a school, shall be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.

Pursuant to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. This order shall come into force on 1 September 1974.
- 2. The districts of the Counties of Geraldine and Levels shall be united to form one county under the name of the County of Strathallan (hereinafter called the "said county").
- 3. The councils of the former counties of Geraldine and Levels shall be dissolved.
- 4. For the purpose of representation the said county shall, for a period of 12 years, be divided into divisions as follows:
 - (a) The Geraldine Division comprising the district of the former county of Geraldine.
 - former county of Geraldine.

 (b) The Levels Division comprising the district of the former county of Levels.
- 5. Separate accounts shall be kept for the Geraldine and Levels Divisions as hereinbefore defined for such period of not less than 3 nor more than 10 years, as the council of the said county may decide; and the provisions of section 110 of the Counties Act 1956 shall, as far as they are applicable and with any necessary modifications, apply.
- 6. The following special funds of the former Geraldine and Levels County Councils shall be retained and used only for the purposes for which they were raised within the Geraldine and Levels Divisions of the said county:

Geraldine Division: Bridge Fund. Flood Damage Restoration Fund. Housing and Property Maintenance Fund. Levels Division: Roads and Bridge Fund.

- 7. The system of rating in the said county shall be on the basis on the capital value. Until such time as a revised valuation of the said county shall come into effect the provisions of the Rating Act 1967, shall, where applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to the said county as if for the purposes of Part IX of that Act the said county were a "special purpose authority" and each division hereinbefore prescribed were a "constituent district" within the provisions of that Act.
- 8. For the purposes of the Local Authorities (Petroleum Tax) Act 1970, the following provisions shall apply:
 - (i) The district of the said county shall be deemed always to have been a constituent district of the South Canterbury Tax area;
 - (ii) The rate revenue of the said county for the previous financial year shall be the sum of the rate revenue for that period of the former counties of Geraldine and Levels.

- 9. Except as provided in clause 12 hereof, for the period specified in clause 4, the council of the said county (hereinafter referred to as the "said council") shall consist of 10 members, of whom 5 shall be elected by the electors of the Geraldine Division and 5 by the electors of the Levels Division.
- 10. For the divisions hereinbefore prescribed, the ridings of the said county and representation of the ridings on the said council shall be as follows:

(a) Geraldine Division

Ridings

(i) Mount Peel - Rangitata Riding comprising the sum of the areas of the Mount Peel and Rangitata Ridings of

(ii) Temuka Riding comprising the sum of the areas of the Temuka and Waitohi Ridings of Geraldine County

(iii) Geraldine Riding comprising the sum of the areas of the Geraldine and Kakahu Ridings of Geraldine County ..

(b) Levels Division

(i) Tengawai Riding comprising the area of the Tengawai Riding of Levels County

(ii) Point Riding comprising the area of the Point Riding of Levels County (iii) Seadown Riding comprising the area of the Seadown Riding of Levels

County

(iv) Hadlow Riding comprising the sum of the areas of the Waimataitai and Claremont Ridings of Levels County

(v) Otipu Riding comprising the area of the Otipu Riding of Levels County Subject to the provisions of clause 9 nothing provided in clause 10 hereof shall operate to prevent the said council from redefining from time to time the ridings of each division or rearranging the representation of the riding members of each division in accordance with the provisions of the each division in Counties Act 1956.

11. The first election of members of the said council shall be held on the date fixed for the triennial general election of members of county councils to be held in October 1974 pursuant to the provisions of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1966.

12. Until the said council elected at the October 1974 triennial elections takes office the council shall consist of:

(a) The 9 members representing the ridings of the former Geraldine County;

(b) The 8 members representing the ridings of the former Levels County.

13. For the purposes of sections 60 and 61 of the Counties Act 1956, the person appointed to make up rolls of electors of the several ridings of the said county shall be the county clerk of the former Geraldine County who shall also be responsible for convening the first meeting of the interim council which shall at that meeting elect one of its members to be the interim chairman.

14. All valuation rolls, other rolls, and lists and rate records 14. All valuation rolls, other rolls, and lists and rate records in force within the areas comprising the said county shall be deemed to be the valuation rolls, other rolls and lists and rate records of the said county until new valuation rolls, other rolls, and lists and rate records are made for the said county and any action or procedure commenced or in progress in respect of the preparation of those rolls and lists and not completed by the date this order comes into force may be continued and completed by the said council, and on completion of the said rolls and lists these records shall be the rolls and lists of the said county.

15. The transfer of any members of the staffs of the former Geraldine and Levels County Councils to the service of the said council shall be deemed to be transfers of permanent employees within the meaning of section 4 of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963, and the provisions of that Act shall, with any necessary modifications, apply accordingly.

16. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the union hereby effected.

17. Except as otherwise provided herein the provisions of section 10 of the Counties Act 1956 shall apply to the union of the counties hereby effected as if the former counties of Geraldine and Levels had been united under that Act.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF WOOLPACKS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any woolpacks to which this order applies shall be:

 - (a) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business at one of the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, Dunedin, Timaru, Bluff, or Napier: \$1.75 each.
 (b) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the ports mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof: \$1.75 each, increased by the appropriate proportion of the freight charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store: to his store:

Provided that, where any woolpacks to which this paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store, the increase authorised by this paragraph shall not exceed the appropriate proportion of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the woolpacks had been obtained from that port and if delivery had been effected at current freight rates.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may

require.

(3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer otherwise than f.o.r or f.o.b., the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.h. as aforesaid. f.o.b. as aforesaid.

(4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum retail prices in respect of any woolpacks to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of woolpacks or may relate generally to all woolpacks to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Commission of Inquiry into the Distribution of Motor Spirits and Ancillary Products

1. For the purpose of taking evidence, the above commission will be holding public hearings at Wellington and elsewhere. Public hearings will commence in Wellington at the boardroom of the Tariff and Development Board, Cumberland House, Upper Willis Street, at 10.30 a.m., on Monday, 23 September 1974.

- 2. Any person who intends to tender evidence or make submissions should forward, in typewritten form, 50 copies thereof to be presented at the public hearing. This evidence is to be lodged with the commission no later than 13 September 1974.
- 3. The purpose of the inquiry is to examine the storage and distribution of motor spirits and ancillary products within New Zealand for the general purposes of recommending what changes are necessary and what should be done to promote the economic development of the distribution industry, and the service to and protection of the consumer industry, and the service to and protection of the consumer, and matters incidental thereto.
- 4. The commission has been directed to have particular regard to points (a) to (h) below.
 - (a) The extent of competition in the wholesaling and retailing of motor spirits and ancillary products, and whether in the public interest steps should be taken whether in the public interest steps should be taken to modify the present practices in the industry, and any legislation relating thereto.

 (b) The efficiency of the present distribution of motor spirits and ancillary products, and any specific changes that the commission considers necessary to improve the efficiency of the industry.

improve the efficiency of the industry.

(c) The changes in patterns and terms of trade which have taken place in the wholesaling and retailing of motor spirits and ancillary products, with particular reference to consumer demand, density of retail outlets, hours of trading, credit facilities and development of highway service stations.

(d) Any changes which have taken place in the service rendered to the consumer, and whether any further specific changes are now seen to be desirable.

specific changes are now seen to be desirable.

(e) The reasonableness or otherwise of the costs, gross profits, and net profits achieved or incurred by wholesalers and retailers of motor spirits and ancillary

- (f) The extent and manner in which overseas interests influence the supply, storage, and distribution of motor spirits and ancillary products within New Zealand.

(g) The motor spirits price-fixing structures and procedures at wholesale and retail level.
(h) The steps, if any, which in the light of the findings on the preceding terms of reference should be taken in the public interest to achieve the most economic, socially desirable, and equitable means of distribution of motor spirits and ancillary products.

The commission has also been asked generally to inquire into and report upon such other matters arising thereout, as may come to its notice and which it considers should be investigated, and to report upon any relevant matters which it considers should be brought to the attention of the Government and, in particular, to report its opinion whether any additional legislation is necessary and the scope of the same. of the same.

- 5. Evidence submitted to the commission should be directed to the general purpose of the inquiry as set out in paragraph 3 above and should be presented as far as possible in the order set out in paragraph 4 above.
- 6. The Order in Council authorises and empowers the commission to take into account any information obtained by or supplied to the Committee of Inquiry into the Distribution of Motor Spirits and Ancillary Products.
- 7. While it will conduct investigations in public, the commission reserves the right at its discretion to hear evidence in private.
- 8. In appropriate circumstances the commission may decide to hear oral submissions from persons who have not submitted written evidence.

Decision of Indecent Publications Tribunal

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of an application by the Comptroller of Customs for a decision in respect of the book *The Westbank* Group by Henry Sackerman, published by Arlington (Sphere) Books Ltd., England.

Mr Murray appeared on behalf of the Comptroller of Customs and made submissions. Mr Heron appeared on behalf of the distributors and made submissions.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

This novel (which was first published in 1970 in the United States and in 1971 in Great Britain) concerns a group marriage experiment in Minneapolis. It is presented in the form of an account by one of the participants, with a spurious sounding introductory account of its sponsorship by an American foundation. The focus is, inevitably, on the sexual basis of the group marriage, and a wide variety of sexual practice and what would normally be considered deviant behaviour is described. The novel attempts to make deviant behaviour is described. The novel attempts to make a case for the benefits of group marriage compared to the alleged deficiencies of monogamy but fails in this respect because of its concentration on only one aspect.

A large part of the book is devoted to the details of sexual encounters, and in view of the explicit nature of many passages as well as of the general theme itself, the Tribunal classifies *The Westbank Group* as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Decisions of the Indecent Publications Tribunal

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of an application by Viva International Ltd., for a decision in respect of the magazines Viva, No. 1, 2, and 3, published by Viva International Ltd., New York.

Mr Heron appeared on behalf of the applicant, Viva International Ltd., and made submissions.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

Viva is a monthly publication for women which appeared on the market for the first time in late 1973. Its aim, according to the editorial comment in Viva, No. 1, is to promote "knowledgeable opinions", mould "positive attitudes towards life, love, and sex" and to create "above all, character and personality".

Each issue covers a broad range of subject matter and most of the articles are intended to be serious and informative. In their approach to sexual matters these publications are frank and open but do not exhibit the same degree of aggressiveness which characterizes many male-orientated magazines. The sexual explicitness of some of the photographs and written material, however, makes these magazines unsuitable for younger readers.

The Tribunal classifies these magazines as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, and in the matter of a reference by the Magistrate's Court, Wellington, in respect of the book Oh! Calcutta! devised by Kenneth Tynan, directed by Jacques Levy, and published by Grove Press, U.S.A.

Mr Hawkes appeared on behalf of the Comptroller of Customs and made submissions. Mr Alister Taylor appeared on behalf of the importer and made submissions.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

When this paperback was previously the subject of an application by the Comptroller of Customs to the Tribunal in 1970, there was no appearance on behalf of either the applicant or the publisher's representative in New Zealand. In its decision No. 220, of 5 November 1970, the Tribunal by a majority of 3 to 2 classified the book as indecent.

The present hearing originated in proceedings before the Magistrate's Court, but prior approval to submit the book to the Tribunal for reconsideration, in terms of section 20 of the Act, had been obtained from the Minister of Justice by one of the parties to the proceedings, Alister Taylor Publishing Company Limited.

Mr Hawkes for the Comptroller of Customs said he did not wish to make any submissions and his instructions were to take a neutral stand in the proceedings. Mr Taylor sub-mitted that the standard of what was acceptable in the

community had so developed in the interim that the previous decision was no longer valid. He also contended that the book had circulated in the interim without causing offence.

In its decision of 5 November 1970, the Tribunal agreed on a description of the book which we cannot do better than quote on the present occasion.

"Briefly, the book is the libretto of the series of dramatic sketches which make up the stage performance known as Oh! Calcutta! which has achieved considerable notoriety as one of the first modern dramatic performances featuring complete nudity of the actors.

"We are agreed that the work is a minor one of no particular intrinsic merit. It is amusing and shocking rather than unhealthy, but we have had to consider whether its lighthearted treatment is a manifestation of simple natural exuberance or of a disposition to debase and trivialise sex. In arriving at our respective conclusions we have been able to accept accounts of the performance which suggest that in the stage context, with skilful lighting and appropriate music, and played rapidly, the impact of this work could well be quite different from that made by this illustrated printed script. We are, however, neither required or empowered to make any classification of the performance as a whole, nor do we believe that our judgement in the matter of the particular script before us is, in fact, a prejudgement of any production of the review."

Reconsideration of books (as distinct from subsequent issues of a previously considered serial publication) has been infrequent since the Tribunal began functioning in 1964. Last Exit to Brooklyn was first considered in 1967, and in 1971 given a less restrictive classification (Decision No. 281, New Zealand Gazette, 15 April 1970, Vol. I, p. 669). The existence of section 20 in the Act is clear indication that changes of classification as a result of changing community attitudes were contemplated by the legislature at the time of enactment. On the only occasion the Supreme Court considered an appeal from a decision of the Tribunal, 2 of the judges in their decisions made points which are particularly relevant. Woodhouse, J. said:

"There must be an adequate understanding of contemporary standards and aspirations, and the decision must be made in terms of the real world as it actually is today", and Haslam, J. said that the Tribunal should "exercise its statutory powers with due regard to changing conditions", Robson v. Hicks Smith & Sons Ltd. [1965] N.Z.L.R. 1112-3.

Factors in this reconsideration include:

(1) The history of the stage production. It was first produced in 1969, so was not much more than a year old when the book was first considered by the

Tribunal. It has been produced since in several parts of the world, and in particular has been running continuously in London for over 4 years where it has undoubtedly been seen by thousands of visiting New Zealanders. It is part of the contemporary theatre and as such we feel it should be reasonably available in New Zealand where interest in contemporary theatre (not by any means confined to the major cities) has markedly increased in the past 4 years.

(2) The changed nature of what is generally available in this country today in the way of published material reflected also, for example, in changing attitudes towards sexual relationships, attitudes which for significant sections of society are a lot less restrictive than they were 10, or even 5 years ago.

Our reconsideration leads us to the view that general availability for adults of this book is not injurious to the public good.

The Tribunal classifies Oh! Calcutta! as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

The "normal" refers to the present site of the instruments. Standard periods for normals are: Temperature 1931-60, Rainfall 1941-70, Sunshine 1935-60. No normals are available for stations with only short records.

*Indicates that the sunshine recorder is not located at the station but is in the near vicinity.

A rain day is a day with rainfall equal to or greater than 0.1 mm.

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month the data of the first state.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JULY 1974

General—This was one of the wettest Julys on record and also one of the mildest. It was a cloudy month and was notable for frequent strong winds from a westerly quarter over the North Island. Growth was mainly quite good for the time of the year, but many farmers found conditions too wet, affecting the health of stock. Lambing commenced in the North Island under rather variable conditions.

Rainfall—Rainfall was above normal over most of the country. It was more than double the normal value in western districts from Kawhia to Wellington, over most of Otago and south-eastern Southland, and in parts of Nelson and the Marlborough Sounds. Stratford Mountain House received 1573 mm, one of the highest monthly totals ever recorded in New Zealand. Southern and western districts of the North Island had considerable falls on the 2nd, 3rd, and 17th, with local flooding and the development of many slips. In Otago the wettest period was from the 28th to the 30th, and parts of North Otago received as much as 170 mm on these 3 days. Many Otago rivers were in flood on the 30th, including the Taieri and Tokomairiro; and extensive dislocation of road and rail traffic both north and south of Dunedin was reported.

Temperatures—Temperatures were above normal over the whole country, mainly by 1½°C. Departures were higher over the North Island than over the South Island. Rotorua had its mildest July on record, equal with 1949, in many years of observation. The coldest spells were from the 3rd to the 6th; and also, mainly in the South Island, from the 9th to the 11th. During both of these periods snow was reported to low levels in the South Island and on the high country of the North Island.

Sunshine—Sunshine was below normal by up to 60 hours over the greater part of the country, largest deficiencies being from Bay of Plenty to Waikato, Waitomo, and Taupo. However, South Westland had 30 hours above normal; and most areas near the east coast of both Islands had totals close to normal. Sunshine was also about normal in central Northland.

Weather Sequence—At the beginning of July a complex trough lay across New Zealand with one depression centred west of Auckland and another to the south of Southland. At first there was only scattered rain, but on the 2nd there were considerable falls over the North Island and the northern part of the South Island. On the following day the northern depression moved slowly southeastward and the other one slowly eastward, while the trough moved north-eastward; and an anticyclone was centred far to the southwest. Conditions remained somewhat similar but the belt of heavitrain moved northward from the area of Cook Strait to the Egmont-Wanganui-National Park area. Flooding affected many areas, especially the Wairarapa, and many slips were also reported. Temperatures became much colder, and snow was reported to low levels in the South Island and on the high country of the North Island. On the 4th the northern depression lay just east of Auckland, while the southern one was far to the south-east. Rain became lighter and affected mainly eastern districts in the southerlies. The

anticyclone moved towards Campbell Island while pressures remained low for another 2 days east of the North Island. Southerlies persisted with rain mainly east of the ranges from Christchurch to East Cape. A brief, temporary improvement occurred on the 7th with the passage of a long narrow ridge across the country, but some showers were still reported.

On the 8th a depression over the Central Tasman Sea was moving eastward and rain once again covered nearly the whole of the North Island, besides northern and some western districts of the South Island. However, temperatures became milder. During the two following days one centre moved to the east of the South Island while another remained to the west. Rain became general, and temperatures again became cold in the south with snow to low levels. From the 11th to the 13th south-westerlies predominated with clearing weather over most of the South Island.

Conditions became more westerly on the 14th with milder temperatures. Pressures were very low far to the south and a small depression was also passing to the north. Rain was reported in western districts of both islands and in Southland, with similar conditions persisting on the following day. During the 16th and 17th a trough became stationary over the North Island with the formation of a small depression. Considerable rain once again affected most of the North Island and the northern part of the South Island.

On the 18th a deep depression was centred to the south of Tasmania and during this and the following day it moved eastward while the associated trough of low pressure crossed New Zealand with general rain west of the ranges. Temperatures remained rather mild. These westerly conditions persisted also from the 20th to the 24th with a similar distribution of rainfall. Gales were reported in many districts from the 21st to the 23rd, and also heavy seas.

On the 25th a small depression formed on a trough during its passage over the country. With pressures rising rapidly to the south, winds soon changed to colder southerlies to south-westerlies, and rain became general. Pressures remained low to the east on the following day and there was a clearance over the South Island. On the 27th a complex depression over the Tasman Sea commenced to affect New Zealand, causing rain west of the ranges. On the following day, with the passage of a small centre across the North Island rain became general. The complex depression crossed New Zealand during the 29th and 30th with the main centre across the South Island and a smaller centre across Northland. Pressures were high to the west of Campbell Island. Rain became general again except east of the ranges north of Timaru. On the 30th there were some heavy falls in South Canterbury and Otago, with flooding in the Taieri and Tokomairiro Rivers. On this day the rain cleared over most of the southern half of the North Island and the northern half of the South Island. On the last day of the month conditions remained somewhat similar. The whole system was losing intensity and the rain was becoming lighter.
