Commission to Inquire Into Explosion and Fire at Seaview, Hutt Valley

GREETING:

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that an inquiry should be made into the cause of the explosion and fire which occurred at the premises of Chemicals Manufacturing Company Limited at Seaview, Hutt Valley, on the 26th day of September 1974 and matters incidental thereto:

Now therefore, pursuant to the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, I, Sir Edward Denis Blundell, the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby appoint you, the said Eric Francis Rothwell, Roger Brian Keey, and David Lynley Weston, to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon the following matters:

(a) The cause of the explosion and fire:

(b) Suggestions for the prevention of similar explosions and fires in the future:

(c) The necessity or expediency of any legislation for the prevention of this type of explosion and fire:

(d) Such other matters as are brought to your notice or initiated by you and are thought by you to be relevant to your functions as defined in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) above:

And with the like advice and consent I do further appoint you, the said Eric Francis Rothwell, to be Chairman of the Commission:

And for better enabling you to carry these presents into effect you are hereby authorised and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry hereunder, in accordance with the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, at such times and places as you think expedient, with power to adjourn from time to time and place to place as you think fit, and so that these presents shall continue in force and the inquiry may at any time and place be resumed although not regularly adjourned from time to time or place to place:

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, save to me in pursuance hereof or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by you or any evidence or information obtained by you in exercise of the powers hereby conferred on you except such evidence or information as is received in the course of a sitting open to the public:

And it is hereby declared that the powers hereby conferred shall be exercisable notwithstanding the absence at any time of any one member of the Commission so long as the Chairman and one other member are present and concur in the exercise of those powers:

And it is hereby further declared that you have liberty to report your proceedings and recommendations hereunder from time to time if you judge it expedient to do so:

And, using all due diligence, you are required to report to me in writing under your hands not later than the 31st day of July 1975 your findings and opinions on the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you think fit to make in respect thereof.

Boundaries of County of Masterton and Borough of Masterton Altered

PURSUANT to the Local Government Act 1974 and the Local Government Commission Act 1967 (to the extent that it continues in force in relation to this order), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order shall come into effect on 1 April 1975.
2. The boundaries of the districts of Masterton County and Masterton Borough are hereby altered by excluding from the district of Masterton County the areas described in the First Schedule hereto and including them in the district of Masterton Borough; and by excluding from the district of Masterton Borough the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto and including them in the Opaki Riding of Masterton County.

3. For a period of not more than 10 years from the date of the alteration of boundaries herein prescribed the Masterton Borough Council may apply the provisions of sections 111A to 111o of the Counties Act 1956 as if for the purposes thereof the borough were a county.

4. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967 (to the extent that it continues in force in relation to this order), the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 and the Counties Act 1956 shall apply as appropriate to the alterations of boundaries herein provided.

5. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the alteration of boundaries hereby provided.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(Areas proposed to be excluded from Masterton County and included in Masterton Borough)

WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICT—MASTERTON COUNTY

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month, the date of the first occurrence is given.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER 1974

General—There was an unusually high frequency of north-easterly winds and this was a warm month besides being one of the sunniest Decembers on record. For some areas, especially Canterbury, it was the second successive month with very low rainfall. In Manawatu, Wellington, and Wairarapa, and in eastern districts of the South Island, farmers were finding conditions too dry.

At Oakura, west of New Plymouth, a small local tornado caused some damage on the 8th.

Rainfall—Rainfall was below normal over nearly the whole of the South Island and also as far north as Palmerston North and in Wanganui and Taranaki, Northland, and eastern areas of Hawke's Bay. It was less than half the normal value in most of Canterbury and Marlborough. In parts of Bay of Plenty and Taupo rainfall was more than double the normal value.

Thunderstorms were unusually frequent. They were comparatively widespread over both Islands on the 1st, 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th, 9th, 17th, and 31st.

A severe hailstorm caused serious damage to crops in the Darfield-Hororata area of the Canterbury Plains on the 6th. Another one with some hailstones the size of marbles was reported at Moeraki, North Otago, on the 8th.

Temperatures—Mean temperatures were above normal, mainly by 2°C. Highest departures of 3°C were recorded in the King Country and in the east of Central Otago.

Sunshine—Sunshine was mainly above normal, by up to 100 hours. Southern areas of the North Island were especially favoured. Highest December totals in 35-40 years of observation were recorded at New Plymouth with 305 hours, Masterton with 278 hours, Wallaceville, Upper Hutt, with 306 hours, and Blenheim with 321 hours.

Weather Sequence—At the beginning of December a trough was advancing on to the North Island from the west, associated with a small depression off the Southland coast, while pressures were high to the east. In the northerlies showers were reported in northern districts of the North Island and on the West Coast. During the next 3 days the trough remained almost stationary over the North Island, where considerable rain was reported, especially in northern and north-eastern districts. Flooding occurred around Ruatoria. Some rain also persisted on the West Coast. This trough moved away to the east, and on the 5th and 6th another trough associated with a depression near Campbell Island crossed the country from west to east. The distribution of rain remained rather similar, but some light rain extended also to western districts in the southern half of the North Island and to eastern districts of the South Island.

From the 7th to the 9th a deep depression, initially over the South Tasman Sea, passed far to the southwest, and the associated troughs of low pressure crossed the country. Rain was fairly general, with some considerable falls in western and central districts of the North Island. On the 8th temperatures became cooler. During the next 3 days an anticyclone was centred far to the south, with a ridge of high pressure extending on to New Zealand. Showers were reported in the southerlies in eastern districts at first, but later the weather was generally fine.

On the 13th pressures remained high to the east and south-east of New Zealand, while depressions were centred over the North Tasman Sea and far to the south-west. A trough of low pressure brought rain to the West Coast besides Southland and parts of Otago. From the 14th to the 16th a depression was centred to the north-west of Northland with the associated trough of low pressure slowly crossing the North Island, while an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea extended across the South Island and to the east. Rain was reported in districts exposed to the north-east, especially

Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, and the central plateau of the North Island. At first the northern half of the South Island was also affected. Temperatures became warm in the North Island. During the next 2 days a depression passed far to the south-west, with the associated trough crossing the South Island. Showers were reported still in parts of the North Island and in coastal districts of the South Island. On the 19th and 20th another similar trough brought considerable rain to the West Coast, with light falls in most other parts of the South Island. Temperatures became warm, especially in the east.

The period from the 21st to the 29th was very dry. From the 21st to the 24th an extensive belt of high pressure covered New Zealand and extended over the South Tasman Sea and also eastward to the Chatham Islands, while a depression was nearly stationary off the northern coast of New South Wales. The weather was mainly fine

and sunny but a few showers were reported, especially in the Gisborne district and around Auckland. During the next 5 days the main centre of the anticyclone lay initially to the south-west of New Zealand with a ridge extending over the country, and the whole system moved slowly eastward. Isolated showers were reported, especially over the central plateau of the North Island, but also at times in Northland and on the West Coast.

On the last 2 days of the month the main centre of high pressure lay far to the south-east of the Chatham Islands, while a small depression passed close to Southland and another one was near North Cape. Rain affected most of the North Island, besides the West Coast, Southland, and parts of Otago.
