The Air Transport Services Standard Terms and Conditions Order 1975

(T. 40/4/16/6)

WHEREAS by section 26A of the Air Services Licensing Act WHEREAS by section 26A of the Air Services Licensing Act 1951, the Air Services Licensing Authority made an order prescribing terms and conditions applicable to licences to carry on classes of air transport services specified in the order; and whereas it is provided in subsection (9) of the said section 26A that every such order of the Air Services Licensing Authority shall be published in the Gazette. Now therefore, the Air Services Licensing Authority pursuant to section 26A of the said Act and any other powers in that Act in that behalf enabling, hereby notifies that order:

- 1. This order may be cited as the Air Transport Services Standard Terms and Conditions Order 1975.
- 2. The order prescribing standard terms and conditions for Air Transport Services dated the 31st day of October 1972 and amendments thereto are hereby revoked.

3. Unless otherwise ordered by the Licensing Authority in respect of a particular licence, the following terms and conditions shall apply to the extent indicated to licences to carry on air transport services of the classes specified:

(a) Schedule Service—(i) The licensee shall be under an obligation to publish its timetable and to operate in accordance with the published timetable unless for reasons of safety it is inexpedient to do so or unless he is prevented by circum-

it is inexpedient to do so or unless he is prevented by circum-

stances beyond his control.

(ii) The licensee may at any time on any of the days of flights beyond what is stated in that timetable but he may not reduce the number of such flights without the prior approval of the Licensing Authority or unless authorised by the terms of the licence to do so.

(b) Non-Scheduled Service—(i) Where a non-scheduled passenger service is carried on over the same or substantially the same route or sector of a route as operated by a scheduled service the minimum fare per passenger shall be 10 percent in excess of the fare payable by a like passenger in the scheduled service or of the lowest fare if there are more than one such service; provided however, that such excess shall not apply if there is no scheduled service operating during the same day or if the full capacity on the scheduled service has been taken or if in the course of such route the non-scheduled service involves intermediate stops at points or traffic areas not included in the scheduled service.

(ii) If the licensee publishes a timetable of his proposed the same route or sector of a route as operated by a scheduled

(ii) If the licensee publishes a timetable of his proposed services he shall indicate prominently therein that such services may not be adhered to for reasons of safety or unless sufficient business is offering and subject to the foregoing, the licensee shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that the services prescribed in such timetable are maintained.

(c) Air Charter Service—(i) All charges for air charter services shall be based on an hourly rate as authorised in

the licence

(ii) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (iv) herein, all air charter services shall be deemed to originate from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes or traffic areas as are designated in the licence; and if the actual flight as required by the hirer commences from some other aerodrome or traffic area the licensee shall

rrom some other aerodrome or trainc area the incensee shall charge and shall record separately a reasonable amount being not less than 50 percent of the charter charge-out rate for the cost of positioning the aircraft from the place of origin.

(iii) Where the charter flight or flights is or are to terminate elsewhere than at the place of origin, as referred to in subparagraph (ii) herein, the licensee may include in the hire charge a reasonable additional amount for the cost of flying the aircraft back to the place of origin, but in such event the licensee may not enter into any agreement with event the licensee may not enter into any agreement with any other person, except on the basis as set out in sub-paragraph (ii) herein, unless he refunds to the original

hirer the amount of such additional charge.

(iv) Where a charter flight has terminated elsewhere than at the place of origin, as referred to in subparagraph (ii) herein, and no charge for the cost of flying the aircraft back to the place of origin has been made or, if made, it has been refunded, the licensee may enter into a new agreement for an air charter service and for the purpose only of that agreement the place of origin of the charter service. of that agreement the place of origin of the charter service shall be deemed to be where the previous flight terminated; but if such new charter service is to terminate elsewhere than at any place or aerodrome designated in the licence, the licensee shall include in the hiring charge a reasonable amount being not less than 50 percent of the charter charge-out rate for the cost of flying the aircraft back from where such flight terminates to the said place of origin designated in the licence.

(v) Any person authorised to operate an air charter service may also carry on a scenic flight or joy-ride service from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes

or traffic areas designated in the licence.

(d) Air-Taxi Service—(i) Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (ii) herein, an air-taxi service may originate only from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aerodromes or traffic areas as are designated in the licence.

(ii) From the place where an air-taxi service has terminated the licensee may operate a like service, but only back to the place or places of origin as referred to in subparagraph

(i) herein.

(iii) Where an air-taxi service operates over the same or substantially the same route or sector of a route as operated by a scheduled service the minimum fare per passenger shall be 10 percent in excess of the fare payable by a like passenger in the scheduled service or of the lowest fare if there are more than one such service; provided however that such excess shall not apply if there is no scheduled service operating during the same day or if the full capacity on the scheduled service has been taken or if in the course of such route the air-taxi service involves intermediate stops at points or traffic areas not included in the scheduled service.

(iv) Any person authorised to operate an air-taxi service may also carry on a scenic flight or joy-ride service from the aerodrome or traffic area or from any one of the aero-

dromes or traffic areas designated in the licence.

4. Unless otherwise ordered by the Licensing Authority in respect of a particular licence it shall be a condition of all licences to carry on air transport services that:

(1) Replacement of Aircraft—Subject always to there being no increase in the number of aircraft as are authorised in the licence, the licensee may at any time replace an air-craft with another of equivalent seating capacity, provided written notification of the change is given to the Licensing Authority within 7 days.

(2) Insurance—(a) The licence holder shall maintain during the currency of the licence in respect of all aircraft a minimum

insurance cover of \$50,000 against all liability for property damage in respect of any one accident.

(b) Notwithstanding that the licence may authorise the carrying on of an air transport service as from a specific date, such service shall not be commenced until there has been deposited with the Licensing Authority a certificate endorsed by the insurers of due insurance in accordance

with the requirements in paragraph (a) herein.

(c) No later than 4 p.m. on the due date for renewal of any such insurance, there shall be deposited with the Licensing Authority a certificate endorsed by the insurance of the due renewal or replacement of the insurance in accordance with the requirements in paragraph (b) herein. If the certificate is not so deposited within that time on that date the licence shall be deemed to be suspended until such certificate is deposited.

(3) Transfer of interest in licences—(a) Where:

(i) The holder of a licence is an individual and by any means whatever his controlling interest in the business in respect of which the licence applies passes to any other person or persons; or (ii) The holder of a licence is a company and by any

means whatever the controlling interest in that company passes to any person or persons other than those named as shareholders or intending shareholders when the application for a licence was made

then, in either such event, the licence shall be deemed to be suspended as from the date of such passing unless the prior approval of the Authority has been obtained, or unless and until full details of the transaction or proposed transaction involving the passing of the controlling interest, as aforesaid, have been given to the Authority and its approval to such passing has been granted.

(b) Where by reason of transmission on death the provisions of paragraph (a) herein would apply, the licence shall not be deemed to be suspended until after the expiration of 3 calendar months from the date of death.

The "normal" refers to the present site of the instruments. Standard periods for normals are: Temperature 1941-70, Rainfall 1941-70 Sunshine 1941-70. No normals are available for stations with only short records.

A rain day is a day with rainfall equal to or greater than 0.1 mm.

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month, the date of the first occurrence is given.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JUNE 1975

General—June was marked by a greater frequency of southeasterly winds than usual, and it was the first month since August 1974 with temperatures colder than normal. Frosts cut back pasture growth but most stock appeared to be wintering well.

Rainfall—Rainfall was above normal over the greater part of the North Island and also over most eastern districts of the South Island from Timaru northward. The main areas where the surplus amounted to more than 50 percent were the Canterbury Plains with Banks Peninsula and coastal North Canterbury, districts around Cook Strait, and eastern Northland from about Whangarei to Whangaroa.

Rainfall was more than 25 percent below normal in Fiordland, most of Westland, Otago, and Southland, and parts of South Canterbury, Nelson, and Manawatu.

In many districts, including Auckland, Wellington, and most of Canterbury, well over half the rain fell in the 3 days from the 13th to the 15th, during the passage of a depression across the North Island. In southern and eastern districts of Banks Peninsula the total rainfall for these 3 days was unusually high, up to 340 mm. Many areas throughout the country reported local flooding, and at the same time, gales.

Temperatures—Temperatures were mainly below normal by about ½°C. The last week was particularly cold and frosty. At Twizel in the Mackenzie Country the minimum air temperature fell below freezing every day after the 7th. On the 17th, 24th, and 25th the air temperature remained below freezing all day. Considerable snow fell in this and neighbouring areas from the 14th to the 16th.

Parts of inland Canterbury reported the ground frozen to a depth of 10 cm by the end of the month.

Sunshine—Sunshine was mainly close to normal or above it. Parts of Canterbury, Central Otago, and inland Southland were favoured with a surplus of 15-30 hours.

Weather Sequence—At the beginning of June pressures were high over the Tasman Sea and the South Island and also over the Chatham Islands, while a complex depression was centred to the east of the North Island. Rain was reported mainly in eastern districts from Napier northward. On the following 2 days, as the depression moved away eastward another shallow depression approached Northland. Showers were reported over most of the North Island and also in the far south of the South Island.

The weather on the West Coast deteriorated on the 4th and 5th with the approach of a trough of low pressure associated with a depression far to the south-west. Some rain was also reported in Nelson and parts of the North Island, with temperatures becoming milder. This trough crossed New Zealand on the following 2 days,

with considerable rain west of the ranges in both islands and some lighter falls in the east. On the 8th some further rain was reported in eastern districts of the North Island with a general change to cold southerlies. For the next 2 days south-westerlies prevailed, and a few showers were still reported, especially in Fiordland and on the Southland coast. On the 11th an anticyclone centred over the North Island covered the country, with generally settled weather.

On the following day depressions were centred over the North Tasman Sea and far to the south, with an associated trough of low pressure moving on to the country from the west. Rain was reported on the West Coast and the Southland coast. During the 13th and 14th the northern depression moved on to the North Island while the trough of low pressure moved slowly eastward over the country. Rain became general over the North Island and part of the South Island, with many considerable falls. Local flooding was reported in some areas and gales were widespread. Snow fell in the MacKenzie Country of Canterbury. By the 15th the depression had deepened and was centred east of Hawke's Bay. Cold southerlies prevailed over the South Island, and further rain was reported over the greater part of the country. In most districts these 3 days were by far the wettest of the month. On the following day the depression was centred near the Chathams, while an anticyclone was centred near Melbourne. Cold southerlies covered the country with some further showers, mainly in the east.

From the 17th to the 19th the anticyclone over Victoria advanced slowly eastward, and the winds over New Zealand became southwesterly to westerly. A few showers were still reported, especially in Fiordland and on the Southland coast. Temperatures became warmer in the east. During the following 2 days a trough of low pressure associated with a depression to the south, crossed the country. Rain affected mainly western and southern districts of the South Island.

By the 22nd the anticyclone was centred near Campbell Island and a depression was centred off the coast of New South Wales, with a trough of low pressure extending from there close to Northland and away to the east. During the next 2 days the depression moved eastward and became complex, one centre crossing the North Island. At first rain affected mainly Northland and Auckland but later it spread over the whole of the North Island with some considerable falls, especially in Waikato, Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, and parts of Hawke's Bay. On the 25th the trough extended to the north-east of the North Island and rain was reported mainly in Northland and Gisborne. During the last 5 days of the month the anticyclone moved on to the South Island. Pressures were still low to the north-east and some further showers were reported at first east of the North Island ranges. Otherwise the weather was settled. The whole period from the 22nd to the 30th was cold and very frosty.
