 - (ii) Sorting or tallying (if incurred) at the rate for the port concerned.
- (f) Where the flour or wheatmeal is sold "ex New Zealand Wheat Board's or its agent's store":
 - (i) The amount of any cartage incurred for delivery from mill, wharf, or rail to a store of the New Zealand Wheat Board or its agent, provided the amount so included shall not exceed the amount of the charges that would have been incurred had delivery been effected at current transport rates:
 - (ii) Storage or through store charges at the approved rate for the area concerned.
- (g) Any transport charges beyond the New Zealand Wheat Board's point of sale, which are paid by the Board or its agent on behalf of the buyer:

Provided that if the maximum price so calculated is not an exact number of cents, the maximum price shall be calculated to the nearest whole cent.

6. WHOLESALERS' PRICES IN RESPECT OF SALES TO MANUFACTURERS AND RETAILERS

Subject to the following provisions of this order, the maximum prices that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any flour or wheatmeal to which this order applies, shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts (provided that the prices charged shall include only that part of the following amounts which relates to the questioned). of the following amounts which relates to the quantity sold):

- (a) The cost to the wholesaler that would have been incurred had the wholesaler purchased the flour or wheatmeal from the New Zealand Wheat Board or its agents, less the 1½ percent early payment discount allowable by the New Zealand Wheat Board whether or not the discount is obtained.
- (b) The flour levy.
- (c) The cost (if applicable) of sacks,
- (d) Charges actually incurred in obtaining delivery to wholesale store.
- (e) An amount calculated as follows:
 - (i) for flour and wheatmeal which is delivered to manufacturing or retail premises without charge for delivery-
 - 7 percent of the sum of the foregoing items (a) to (d):
 - (ii) for flour and wheatmeal which is sold "ex wholesaler's store".
 - percent of the sum of the foregoing items (a) to (d) plus any amount for transport charges which are paid by the wholesaler on behalf of the buyer:

Provided also that if the maximum price calculated in accordance with this clause is not an exact number of cents, the maximum price shall be calculated to the nearest whole cent:

Provided further that an additional sum may be added to the total so calculated to provide for any discount which is customarily deducted for payment within a specified time.

7. RETAILERS' PRICES FOR FLOUR AND WHEATMEAL

(a) Subject to the following provisions of this order, the maximum prices that may be charged or received by any retailer for any flour or wheatmeal to which this order applies shall not exceed-

(i) In the case of flour or wheatmeal sold by a retailer in the package in which it was purchased, the sum of an amount not exceeding the into-store cost of the goods and a mark-up of 10 percent

applied to that cost.

(ii) In the case of flour or wheatmeal sold by a retailer other than in the same package in which it was purchased, the sum of the into-store cost of these goods and a mark-up of 331 percent applied to that cost.

8. SPECIAL PRICES

Any authority given by the Secretary under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot, type, or consignment of flour or wheatmeal, or may relate generally to all flour or wheatmeal to which this order applies that is sold while the order remains in force.

- 1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 40 and shall come into force on the 17th day of January 1977.
- 2. (1) Price Order No. 36* shall be revoked on the coming into force of this order.
- (2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the
- coming into force of this order.

 (3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 36, any approvals given under clause 10 of that price order shall continue to have effect as if the said order had not been revoked.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies to all bread referred to in clauses 4 and 5 of this order sold in New Zealand by a wholesaler or by a retailer, but does not apply to bread sold on Stewart Island or to bread sold as part of a meal.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF BREAD TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 4. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the First Schedule to this order shall be the maximum retail prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as:
 - (a) Standard white bread.
 - (b) Standard brown bread.
 - (c) Wholemeal bread.(d) Vienna bread.

 - (e) Wheat-germ bread.
- 5. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Schedule Second to this order shall be the maximum retail prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as protein-enriched bread, that is, bread in the making of which there is for each 100 kg of flour used not less than 3.75 kg of dry gluten and not less than 2.4 percent of nitrogen calculated on a dry basis. Nothing in this paragraph shall affect the sale of those loaves of protein enriched bread for which there is an approved special price.
- 6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in Part II of the First and Second Schedules to this order shall be the maximum retail prices which may be charged or received for any bread described in clauses 4, and 5 of this order which is sliced or unsliced and enclosed and securely wrapped at the bakehouse in clean unused paper.
- 7. Subject to the provisions of this order, the maximum wholesale prices that may be charged or received for any bread subject to this order shall be the maximum retail prices set out in the First and Second Schedule to this order reduced by 12½ percent.
- 8. The wholesale prices fixed by this order apply to bread delivered to the retailer's premises. In any case where bread is not so delivered the prices shall be such as are agreed upon between the baker and the retailer, or failing such agreement, as may be approved by the Secretary.

9. A booking fee at the rate of one quarter cent (½c) per loaf for loaves of not more than 1lb weight and one half cent (½c) per loaf for loaves exceeding 1 lb weight may be made for any bread sold by a retailer to which this order applies, provided that payment for the bread so sold has not been made prior to, or at the time of, the customer's taking delivery of the bread at the shop.

10. The maximum retail selling prices provided for in this order shall include the service of wrapping where this service is provided by the

retailer.

DECISION

These two comics are intended for an audience well beyond the normal juvenile one; their obvious appeal is to what Americans call the college generation. Although there is some degree of emphasis on sex and violence this really takes second place to satirical comment on contemporary society. We can see no harm in their circulation to adults and to the mature teenager. This is following fairly closely a previously established conclusion of the Tribunal. In its decisions numbers 767–786 given on 14 December 1973 (New Zealand Gazette 1974, Vol. 1, p. 19-20) the Tribunal in dealing with a large group of comics was able to divide them into three groups, of the third of which it was noted: "The sexual contact is minimal." third of which it was noted: "The sexual contact is minimal and lacks the blatancy of other comics in this set. Indeed there is little which could be considered harmful to the more mature reader." The Tribunal stated that this group "could, if it were possible be allowed restricted circulation". The Harold Hedd comics generally belong with the third group so identified on that occasion.

Their form, however, does present us with a problem. The provisions of s. 11 (3) of the Act refer to "any picture story-book likely to be read by children", and in effect require us either to give a complete clearance or to impose a complete ban—the middle ground of an age restriction is not available to us for this type of publication. The two now before us clearly fall within the intention of the legislature in placing this subclause in the Act of bringing comics under closer scrutiny. It may be questioned whether such publications as the Harold Hedd comics would be likely to be read by children, but their whole appearance is outwardly similar to the ordinary comic produced specifically for children and therefore likely to

be picked up and read by them.

This type of comic publication—the so-called "underground comic"—was little known even in its home, the United States, when the Act was passed 13 years ago, and the Tribunal regrets that it is now restricted in its dealing with comics clearly intended for an adult market, and a sophisticated one at that. The Tribunal accordingly finds Collected Adventures of Harold Hedd, No. 1, and Adventure with Harold Hedd, No. 2, to be indecent.

The comment made in decision 816 applies equally to these four magazines.

The Tribunal classifies these four magazines as indecent.

DECISION

These 4 magazines are consecutive issues of the New I nese 4 magazines are consecutive issues of the New Zealand edition. Forum is published in England, America, Australia, France, and Belgium/Holland on a basis which allows a free interchange or republishing of articles appearing in any edition. The New Zealand edition is nearly all republished from English, American, and Australian editions. There is therefore very little editing in the accepted the sense. The issue may be said to reflect rather the accepted ions. There is therefore very little editing in the accepted sense. The issue may be said to reflect rather the policies and ideas of the overseas editions than the New Zealand edition. The magazine has been distributed in New Zealand for about 5 years and in its present format, as a New Zealand edition, for over 4 years. It was previously considered by the Tribunal in 1972 (Decisions 518 and 519) when 2 issues of the English edition were classified as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years.

These 4 issues have been submitted to us by the Secretary for Justice and in a lengthy hearing we have heard evidence from New Zealand and United Kingdom witnesses and have received full submissions from the parties and from

have received full submissions from the parties and from the Society for the Promotion of Community Standards

Inc. and the Concerned Parents Association.

While we have heard and given careful consideration to the evidence presented to us we express our reservations as to the usefulness or relevance of a great deal of that evidence in making our decision. No doubt evidence can be useful and relevant in considering some of the matters listed in section 11 (1). In this case expert medical and psychological witnesses can guide us in matters of medical, social, or scientific character or importance and medical, social, or scientific character or importance and general evidence may be of some use in assessing the purpose and motives of the persons associated with the publication and distribution of the magazine. In the end however it is the Tribunal which must exercise its own judgment and experience in determining the character and classifying the magazines or books before it. Evidence by others as to the desirability of censorship, the standards of the community here or elsewhere and the witnesses views as to indecency generally or in relation to the book in question are unaccentable and indeed impertinent if conin question are unacceptable and indeed impertinent if considered as an endeavour to replace the function of the Tribunal.

Tribunal.

In the end evidence given by Doctors Bremner, Sparrow, and Miss Colgan is of some assistance though limited to a small part of our considerations. On the other hand the evidence of Mr. Hodson and the Rev. Mr Varah given as it was with little New Zealand experience is of very little value and even if the honesty of purpose of those men is not in doubt, it is the honesty of purpose of the book or magazine which is referred to in section 11 (1) book or magazine, which is referred to in section 11 (1) (f). This is to be gathered from the magazine itself, read as a whole, rather than from what may be unexceptionable honesty of purpose in the writers or publishers. We have of course considered each magazine separately and have been guided by the prescriptions of the Act in our consideration. In the end we have made our decision on indecency in accordance with our view of the standards of contemporary society believing that in this case there is no ground to suggest that the magazines deal with sex in a manner that is "injurious to the public good". Indeed counsel for the Secretary did not, in his submissions, rely on that particular definition in section 2 of the Act.

Each of the magazines deals, almost exclusively, with sex in a manner which is explicit and with freedom of language and subject matter. We were told that Forum is dedicated to honesty about sex. There is a didactic purpose behind the magazine but a necessity to make it entertaining and thus commercial. There is an apparent conflict between these aims and purposes which permits the insertion of light-hearted and trivial material such as the "Molly Parkin" articles, which on their own are indecent, beside restrained simple articles in a popular style which could be informative and helpful. Some of the subjects and the manner in which they are presented have given the Tribunal cause for concern.

Again, as in 1972, we have had most difficulty with "The Forum" which republishes letters said to be sent from readers describing real or fantastic sexual experiences. We remain unconvinced that all these letters are "expression of genuine opinions, experiences, criticisms, or interests" as the magazine alleges. We were impressed however by the evidence of Dr Sparrow and Miss Colgan which indicated that even such fantasising can be helpful to those with sexual problems. We have no doubt that any reader of reasonable maturity would distinguish the genuine from the spurious and would not suffer harm in the process.

with sexual problems. We have no doubt that any reader of reasonable maturity would distinguish the genuine from the spurious and would not suffer harm in the process. Some of the articles and "The Forum" in each issue are in themselves on the border line or on the indecent side of acceptability but taking account of the whole of each magazine in light of the matters in section 11 (1) and our view of present-day standards of the community we do not think that these magazines are indecent. We feel however that parts of each of them are unsuitable for reading by younger people who could easily buy this magazine and who might have only a prurient interest in the contents. We believe that a restriction to 18 is appropriate for there magazines.

in the contents. We believe that a restriction to 18 is appropriate for there magazines.

We were requested to make a restriction order under section 15A of the Act. We refuse to do this on the basis of these 4 issues. We are entitled to make such a restriction order but we believe that this is inappropriate in this case. One of the reasons for making such an order is this a magazine has come under notice of the Tribunal on a number of occasions and perhaps because of a deteriorating standard or because it is undesirable to avoid repeated applications to the Tribunal a restriction order is suitable to provide a standard for the future. Such a reason does not apply here. Our reason for not making a restriction order is that the magazines should be kept under review by the appropriate authorities in case there is a decline in the standards of the magazine which could lead the Tribunal to reconsider the view it presently takes on these issues.

The Tribunal accordingly finds each of these issues of Forum to be indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

These two magazines were submitted to the tribunal by the Customs Department. They are the issues of February and July 1976 in the American edition of the magazine. Submissions and evidence were presented to the tribunal at hearings on 12 and 19 October. Since then the members of the tribunal have read and re-read the magazines and have deliberated on the determination and classification of the magazines on a number of occasions.

Penthouse magazine has been before the tribunal on six occasions, namely in 1966, 1969, March and October 1972, 1974, and June 1975. A distinction has been noted between the English and American editions. The English editions have, generally, fallen within the classification of indecent while the American editions have been held to be suitable for these the American editions have been held to be suitable for those over 18. At the same time there has been a clearly discernible change in the sexual content of both editions but the American editions have had the redeeming feature of a substantial section of more serious articles and features.

What we have to decide, in light of today's standards in New Zealand, is whether the present two magazines fall within the classifications previously imposed, or whether their style and content show a deterioration or change which would lead us to find them indecent simpliciter. In our view there can be no question of finding them not indecent.

The Customs Department in their submissions claimed that there was a marked deterioration in standard compared with issues previously before the tribunal. Comparison was made with Oui (Decision No. 854) which was held indecent and reference was made to certain articles and photographic sequences in the two Penthouse magazines. We note at once that the type of article to which Customs referred us have been included in previous issues submitted to us and we do not find any particular change in its style or content when not find any particular change in its style or content when compared with the more recent issues of the magazine submitted to us in 1974 and 1975.

The publishers and distributors of *Penthouse* made lengthy submissions and called evidence both on affidavit and viva voce. As with the recent Forum case a substantial part of the evidence we set aside as irrelevant to New Zealand conditions and as purporting to usurp our own functions. There remains however some evidence which we find helpful as to question of literary merit of some part of each magazine and as to the possibility of some general benefit, in the evidence of sociologists and psychologists, being gained by some readers

in the presentation of the sexual material.

The essence of the submissions and evidence on behalf of the magazines is that they provide entertainment, information, and advice for adults with sex taking a significant part but

without harm to the reader.

Clearly in both text and photographs there is a predominant emphasis, in each magazine, on sexual matters. This is always frank, sometimes fantastic and sometimes, in particular items, objectionable and indecent. The editors, in the July 1976 issue, say "To Penthouse sexual freedom is a way of life" and this is plainly both the policy and dominant effect of the magazine. There is in addition a quantity of non-sexual. serious, and informative material in each magazine. The balance of these sexual and non-sexual parts remain substantially the same as in past issues of the American editions which have been before the tribunal. What has changed, in our view, is the emphasis in photographs which increasingly concentrate attention on the female genitalia. In addition in the February 1976 issue there is a sequence of photographs which depict, albiet fantastically, a sadistic and lesbian episode.

It is this change which has caused us concern and which indicates a deterioration in the magazine because there has not been any discernible change in other parts of the magazine which would balance or redeem this. In our view this brings the magazines very close to crossing the borderline between the acceptable and unacceptable. At the same time two general observations may be made. The presentation of nudity is not indecent if it is not prurient or salacious. Fantasy or fantastic presentation can lessen the indecency of sadism or other sexual matters which, in other ways of

presentation, are obscene and pornographic.

We think that these magazines are at the limit of acceptance but having regard to the whole of each magazine and to the matters which under the Act we are required

to consider, we hold that today in New Zealand they may be distributed subject to the same age restriction as applied before.

The tribunal accordingly finds each of these issues of Penthouse to be indecent in the hands of persons under 18

years of age.
