

The Waitarere Domain Board Foreshore Control Order 1977

DENIS BLUNDELL, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of January 1977

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Waitarere Domain Board Foreshore Control Order 1977.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 18th day of January 1977.

2. In this order—
"The Act" means the Harbours Act 1950;

"The Board" means the Waitarere Domain Board; "Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;

tides; "Minister" means the Minister of Transport and includes

"Minister" means the Minister of Transport and includes any officer, person or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the Board for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, subject to the provisions of section 165 of the Act and to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule to this order, the control of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that portion of the foreshore in Horowhenua County commencing from a point 302 metres northward of the mouth of the Wairarawa Stream and extending generally southward a distance of 1308 metres.

SECOND SCHEDULE

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty shall, at all times, have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the foreshore described in the First Schedule

to this order, without payment
2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to 2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to do, or cause to be done, anything repugnant to, or inconsistent with, any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder that are, or may hereafter be, in force.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present, or may be at any time laid down.

within the said area of foreshore.

4. The Board may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore, described in the First Schedule hereto, for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games and may, by bylaws, fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts:

Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed 6 in any 1 year.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

6. The Board may, subject to the provisions of section 178 of the Harbours Act 1950, erect or license or permit the erection of bathing sheds, boat sheds, boat building sheds, jetties, or slipways on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make bylaws regulating the use Schedule hereto, and may make bylaws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use: Provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment or any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board 6 calendar months' notice in writing. Class II may only comply with the minimum requirements of, or its export be economically justified to a restricted number of countries.

In order to certify produce fit for export an inspector may require information to the effect that the property on which the fruit was produced has been cleared to pack fruit for export inspection. It is the responsibility of the exporter to obtain this information from the Senior Horticultural Inspector, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, for the district of origin. The most satisfactory way is to have the fruit inspected and passed for export in the district of origin, if at all possible.
- 4. To avoid delays in the entry of consignments to European markets, they should in addition to the plant health certificate, be accompanied by a control certificate which lists the details of the consignment including grade, and is signed by an authorised inspector.

Standard Grade for the Export of Cherries Notice 1977 (No. 1628 Ag. 12/2/14)

And whereas the Commission is of the opinion that the effects of the said trade practices, as modified, are not and are not likely to be contrary to the public interest in accordance with section 21 of the Commerce Act 1975;
Now, therefore, the Commission hereby resolves, in terms of section 40 (4A) of the Commerce Act 1975:

(1) To dispense with an inquiry pursuant to section 41

of the Act.

(2) To authorise the A.C.W.A. and its members to continue to operate in conjunction with the M.T.A. and the C.T.F. and their members the trading plans and the C.T.F. and their memoers the trading plans with respect to automotive and cycle parts and accessories, as modified by the A.C.W.A., and as described in Appendices A and B attached to the Examiner's report to the Commission, dated 30 November 1976, they being as registered with the Commerce Commission for approval under registra-

tion No. 36, 295 and 261.

Subject to the A.C.W.A. and its members, as agreed with the Examiner, abandoning forthwith the collective pricing practices applied in the determination of selling prices, margins and discounts for the sale of automotive and cycle parts and for the sale of automotive and cycle parts and

accessories and refraining from reviving or renewing such practices in any form at any future date.

(3) To authorise the A.C.W.A. to continue the trade practice to determine on a collective or industry basis the charge made for the delivery of automotive parts and accessories, subject to compliance with any price control or price restraint requirements for the time being in force and further subject to the collectively determined delivery charge being subject to review if on any future occasion the amount of that charge should equal or substantially equal or exceed the total amount of the delivery costs of wholesalers or of any of them, who customarily apply such delivery charge.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER 1976

General-In December barometric pressures were low over New Zealand, with a high frequency of winds from a westerly quarter. The rainfall was more than normal over much of the country. Cloudy conditions prevailed over the greater part of the country.

Grass growth in some areas was good but haymaking and shearing conditions in other areas were poor. Hail storms on the 22nd caused widespread damage to apple and pear orchards in the Nelson province.

-Rainfall was above the normal December value throughout the whole of the South Island and in parts of the North throughout the whole of the South Island and in parts of the North Island, especially east of the ranges. It was more than twice the normal value in Otago, Nelson, Wellington, and parts of Marlborough and southern Wairarapa. In the remaining areas of the North Island it was at least half of the normal. Exceptionally heavy rainfalls of 200-300 mm were recorded in the Wellington/Hutt Valley area on the 20th. 85 mm of rain was recorded in six hours at Kelburn and this is the highest value recorded since measurements began in 1928. At Taita (Hutt Valley) 258 mm was recorded in a twelve hour period. It is estimated that damage caused by major flooding and many slips in these areas could reach a total value of flooding and many slips in these areas could reach a total value of approximately 30 million dollars.

Temperatures—Temperatures were close to normal over most of the country. In some areas of the North Island and parts of Canterbury they were below normal by ½°.C Coastal districts from Dunedin to Invercargill and some inland areas were 1°C warmer than normal.

Sunshine—Sunshine was above normal by 25 to 75 hours in places north of Auckland. Kaitaia with 264 hours had its highest December total in 25 years of observations. In Wellington, South Canterbury, and parts of Otago and Westland, sunshine was below normal by up to 65 hours. The Wellington total of 174 hours was the lowest for at least 40 years.

Weather Sequence-The depression which had been almost stationary over the Tasman Sea during the last three days of November moved over central New Zealand on the 1st and 2nd of

December, bringing some rain to most districts.

From the 3rd to the 9th a disturbed westerly airstream flowed over the country. Disturbances in this flow brought occasional rain to many South Island places, but only scattered light falls to the North Island. A slow-moving cold front crossed the North Island on the 9th and was accompanied by moderate rain. Behind this front an anticyclone moved from the Tasman Sea onto New Zealand.

Over most of the country the weather was settled from the 10th to the 13th, as a ridge of high pressure lay northwest-southeast across New Zealand.

Late on the 13th a cold front moved from the west onto the South Island. As this front moved slowly over the country a depression developed on it on the 14th but by the 15th the whole system lay to the east of New Zealand. Rainfalls of over 30 mm were recorded in many western areas with the passage of this front, while eastern areas received about 5 to 10 mm.

The ridge of high pressure that had covered the country from the 10th to the 13th was re-established on the 15th and it persisted until the 17th.

On the 17th a cold front moved slowly westward onto the South Island. The rainfall accompanying it was confined to the West Coast on the 17th where 20-50 mm was recorded. By midnight on the 18th the front had still not crossed the South Island and a depression had formed on the front to the west of the North Island. This depression moved south-eastwards across central New Zealand on the 19th while a second depression moved eastwards over the North of the North Island on the 20th. zealand on the 19th while a second depression moved eastwards over the North of the North Island on the 20th. A very small scale convergence area in the Wellington District on the 20th produced exceptionally heavy rainfall. Falls in the region of 250–300 mm in 24 hours were recorded in the Wellington/Hutt Valley area.

From the 21st to the 25th a depression lay to the east of the North Island and a cold southerly flow covered the South Island and the south of the North Island. On the 22nd a cold front in this southerly flow brought a period of heavy rain to many eastern

southerly flow brought a period of heavy rain to many eastern areas north of Banks Peninsula and to the Cook Strait area.

On the 25th a ridge of high pressure like the one that had been over the country from the 15th to the 17th, became established over the South Island. This ridge moved northeastwards to lie to the north of the North Island by the 28th. A disturbed westerly air-stream began to spread onto New Zealand on the 27th and persisted over the country for the rest of the month. Disturbances in this flow brought some rain to all parts of the country except for parts of Gisborne and Hawkes Bay. On the West Coast over 150 mm of rain was recorded in some places over the last four days of the month.
