# DENIS BLUNDELL, Governor-General A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 216 of the Public Works Act 1928, I, Sir Edward Denis Blundell, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke that part of the Proclamation dated the 15th day of June 1972, published in the Gazette, 22 June 1972, No. 51, p. 1279, No. 927443, Wellington Land Registry, commencing at the words "Lot 1, D.P. 7889 (C.T. 365/196)" and concluding after the words "Sections 1 and 2 (Crown Land)", and hereby proclaim and declare that the amended middle line shall be that delineated on the plan specified in the Schedule hereto and the land affected shall be that set forth in the Schedule hereto and situated within varying distances on either side of the middle line as shown on the plan aforementioned.

# DENIS BLUNDELL, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 27th day of June 1977

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. B. E. TALBOYS PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Local Government Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

### ORDER

#### Commencement

1. This order shall come into force on the 8th day of October 1977 except that insofar as it is necessary to provide for the elections of councillors and in accordance with clause 7 of this order, the constitution of ridings, this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the date of its making.

#### Constitution

- 2. The districts of the County of Taieri and the County of Waikouaiti shall be united to form the County of Silverpeaks (referred to in this order as "the county").
- 3. The council of the county shall be a county council under the name of the Silverpeaks County Council (referred to in this order as "the council").
- 4. The Taieri County Council and the Waikouaiti County Council shall be dissolved.
- 5. Except as otherwise provided for in this order, the provisions of the Counties Act 1956 shall apply.

#### Communities

6. The communities and community councils already in existence in the counties of Taieri and Waikouaiti shall enure as if they had been constituted by the council.

#### Ridings

- 7. The area of the former County of Taieri shall be divided into six ridings to be determined by the council.
- 8. The area of the former County of Waikouaiti shall be divided into three ridings, namely:
  - The Hawkesbury Riding, being the combined areas of the Hawkesbury and Waikouaiti Ridings of the former County of Waikouaiti as described in the New Zealand Gazette 1968, page 1207;

The Merton Riding, being the area of the Merton Riding of the former County of Waikouaiti as described in the New Zealand Gazette 1968, page 1207; and The Blueskin Riding, being the area of the Blueskin Riding of the former County of Waikouaiti as described in the New Zealand Gazette 1968, page 1207.

#### Representation

- 9. For the purposes of the 1977 triennial general election of councillors the county shall comprise nine ridings as provided by clauses 7 and 8 of this order, and each riding shall have one councillor.
- 10. The first meeting of the council shall be convened by the County Clerk of the Taieri County Council and the Chairman shall be chosen by and from the members of the council at that meeting.

#### Finance

- 11. Until the 31st day of March 1981 the county shall be divided into the following financial divisions.
  - (a) The Southern Financial Division, comprising the area of the former County of Taieri; and
    (b) The Northern Financial Division, comprising the area
  - of the former County of Waikouaiti.
- 12. The accounts of each financial division shall be kept in the manner provided for in form 7 of the Local Government Accounting Regulations 1974, and the opening balances of such accounts shall be the closing balances of the general and separate rates and general appropriation accounts of the former Taieri County Council and of the Waikouaiti County Council respectively at the date of their dissolution; and any money to the credit of each account shall, after all liabilities have been provided for, be expended to the benefit of the residents of the financial division in respect of which the account was established and any deficiency shall be found from within that financial division:

Provided that the accounts of the financial divisions shall not be credited or debited with the closing balances of the accounts of the community councils.

#### Rating

13. The system of rating in the county shall be the capital value system:

Provided that before the 1980 triennial general election of councillors the council may resolve, or the ratepayers may demand, as the case may be, in accordance with the Rating Act 1967, that a system of rating other than the system prescribed in this clause be adopted; and for this purpose and until that election section 11 (6) (a) and section 13 (5) (a) of the Rating Act 1967 shall not apply to the county.

14. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 13 of this order, for the period during which financial divisions are maintained the system of rating in the Southern Financial Division shall be the land value system and the system of rating in the Northern Financial Division shall be the capital value system:

Provided that should a change of rating system be made as provided for in clause 13 of this Order during the period in which financial divisions are maintained and before the 1980 triennial general election of councillors, that change shall have effect for the purposes of rating in the two divisions.

15. Notwithstanding anything in clauses 13 and 14 of this Order, the rateable capital value of the Southern Financial Division and the rateable capital value of the Northern Financial Division shall be the rateable value for the purposes of section 134 (3) of the Counties Act 1956.

16. The provisions of Part IX of the Rating Act 1967 (which relate to the valuation equalisation) shall apply as if each financial division were a riding of a county.

#### Transitional

- 17. For the purposes of the Local Authorities (Petroleum Tax) Act 1970 the council shall be the successor of the Taieri County Council and the Waikouaiti County Council.
- 18. The council shall prepare a district planning scheme in accordance with section 28B (2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1953.
- 19. The valuation rolls, electoral rolls, and rate records in force in the former County of Taieri and the former County of Waikouaiti shall continue in force in the county until new such rolls and records are made for the county.
- 20. For the purpose of arranging for and conducting the election of the council to be held on 8 October 1977 the County Clerk and returning officer for the county shall be the County Clerk and returning officer of the Taieri County Council.

Decision of the Broadcasting Tribunal

Decision No. 1/77

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of a complaint, pursuant to section 67 (1) (b) of the Act, between Gavin Watson Dobie, complainant, and Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand, respondent:

BEFORE THE BROADCASTING TRIBUNAL

Members: B. H. Slane (Chairman), Lionel R. Sceats, and Janet C. Somerville.

Co-opted members: D. M. Wylie, and H. M. McPhail. Hearing at Wellington on the 30th day of May 1977. DECISION

The Programme: At 9 p.m., on Sunday, 27 February 1977, in "Seven Days", Television One broadcast a programme entitled "A Fate Worse than Death". A 22-year-old student recounted her experience of an attempted rape in the Botanical Gardens in Wellington. The programme mainly comprised her narration of the events and their effect on her.

The unprovoked attack was by a man she did not know. She said the man was sitting on a rock in the gardens.

"He stood up and started following me. I took off. He grabbed hold of me and said something like, 'Do you want a fuck?', or something. I said 'No'."

She then told how the man offered her money.

The rest of the programme largely consisted of her relating the events that followed and explaining her feelings then and later.

The Complaint: Mr G. W. Dobie, of Wainuiomata, complained to Television One and then to the Broadcasting Corporation's Complaints Review Committee.

His submissions were thorough and carefully reasoned. His complaint was of the broadcast of the word "fuck". He claimed the word was obscene. He submitted that the word was in effect spoken in a public place, that no warning was given that "obscene language" would be used on the programme, that thousands of children would have been watching. He said the broadcast was a breach of the Radio Regula-

He said the broadcast was a breach of the Radio Regulations 1970 (S.R. 1970/40). Regulation 51 forbids the transmission of any radio-communication of an obscene nature, or

of an offensive nature or meaning.

He also referred at some length to a previous occasion in which the word had been used in another television programme.

Mr Dobie submitted that the inclusion of the word was not necessary to convey the brutal act of aggression. Factual acts of aggression and atrocities had been adequately reported on television in the past without the use of obscene language. He further submitted that a word which is classed obscene

The Corporation's Decision: The Complaints Review Committee gave the following decision after considering Mr Dobie's submissions and those of Television One:

"The Complaints Review Committee of the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand (Messrs C. J. Freeman and M. P. Whatman) met on 4 April to hear a complaint from Mr G. W. Dobie, Wainuiomata, about the use of a four letter word in a 'Seven Days' programme ('A Fate Worse than Death') broadcast by Television One on 27 February 1977. The hearing was private and informal, and counsel were not heard.

The committee first considered a full written submission from the complainant, who was unable to be present. Mr Dobie argued that the word in question is, without

doubt, obscene, that it is contrary to public decency, that its use in a broadcast is against the law, and that its use in the programme was not necessary in order to convey what happened. He reminded the Committee that, following an 'Edwards on Saturday' programme, the Police had warned Television One that they might be prosecuted if certain language was repeated. He said that a decision to support Television One on this matter would set a precedent for future standards.

In its plea of justification for the use of the word Television One (Mr D. Monaghan, Controller of Programmes; Mr Richard Thomas, Producer) first detailed public reaction to the broadcast: they received three phone calls, two of which complained of the language, and twelve letters, two of which were hostile, but only one of these two referred to the particular word. Whereas the complaint maintained that a word which is classed obscene remains obscene whatever the circumstances, Television One claimed that the use of a particular word must always be judged in the context of the programme as a whole and in the light of the intention of the producer of the programme. Answering questions from the committee, the producer said the protagonist of the programme had not been briefed beforehand, but had told her story in her own words. He had given careful consideration to the use of the word in question and sincerely felt it was necessary to leave it in so as to convey the crudity and the shock of the verbal assault. Answering a further question the producer said that the decision to retain the word was his own and had not been referred upwards.

In working towards a decision the committee felt that it was not proper for it, as a lay body, to try to define the precise legal meaning of the word "obscene" in relation to section 51 of the Radio Regulations, cited by Mr Dobie. Rather they saw it as their duty to judge the complaint under section 24 of the Broadcasting Act 1976 and the programme rules of the Corporation, as a problem in broadcasting ethics against the background of community standards. In reaching its decision the committee members laid particular emphasis on context and intention; they acknowledged that the programme was a serious attempt to grapple with one side of a grave and distressing type crime, and they were convinced that the makers of the In the context of the whole programme they found that the use of the word was justifiable, and that any shock it would convey would be in keeping with a portrayal of that received by the victim. However, the committee qualified its findings with some criticism of the way in which the programme decision was made. The members felt that such decisions should not be taken lightly and they were surprised that in this instance the producer of the programme had not referred the problem to his superiors, as is believed to be standard practice in the BBC. With this qualification, the committee found it could not sustain the complaint against Television One.

The Tribunal has been informed by the Secretary of the Broadcasting Corporation that the corporation accepted the committee's finding without modification at a meeting on 3 May 1977.

Reference to Tribunal: Mr Dobie lodged a complaint with the Broadcasting Tribunal pursuance to section 25 (5) Broadcasting Act 1976.

In this complaint he stated the word was classed as obscene and its use in a public place was a criminal offence. The exoneration of TV 1 created a precedent for a repetition of the word in certain future programmes such as documentaries and dramatised documentaries.

He referred the Tribunal to the submissions he had made

to the Corporation.

Mr Dobie considered the Corporation should have

1. Censured TV 1 for bad judgment in allowing the use of the word on a pre-recorded programme. 2. Given a direction to TV 1 to disallow the use of the

obscene word on any programme.

Hearing: The Tribunal is required, for the purposes of any particular complaint, to co-opt two persons whose qualifications or experience are likely, in the opinion of the Tribunal, to be of assistance in dealing with that complaint. The Tribunal co-opted Mrs Helen McPhail, of Benio, Southland and Mr D. M. Wylie, of Wellington.

The Tribunal, including the co-opted members, viewed the tape of the programme and considered written submissions made by Mr Dobie who did not wish to be heard in person. The Corporation did not wish to make any further submissions, relying on the decision of the Complaints Review Committee which had been adopted by the Corporation.

Committee which had been adopted by the Corporation.

Decision: The Tribunal considers that the use of the word

in the context of the programme was unexceptionable.

The word was not used in an insulting or indecent way.

The Tribunal notes that the word was used in its functional sense rather than its insulting or offensive sense.

It was used by a young woman who was relating the events as she had experienced them. Repetition of the actual words used to her reinforced the impression made on the viewer

of the integrity of her story.

She did not dwell on the word; she passed over it in a manner which indicated that she was embarrassed to be dis-

cussing this part of the incident.

No attempt was made by the producer to dramatise or draw attention to the word which was neither used nor referred to again.

The use of any particular word must be considered in the context in which it occurs in relation to the whole programme. It is impossible to lay down any rule that a word will always be acceptable or unacceptable.

In making its decision, the Tribunal emphasises that the use of this word at present in most contexts would not be generally acceptable to the community; in some instances it would be obscene.

The Tribunal considers that to have given a warning of the use of the word in this programme would have been quite irresponsible. It would have led to an undesirable concentration on the existence of the word in the programme and would have advertised and highlighted its use

As far as children are concerned, any child who was old enough to have heard and understood the word would not have been harmed by its use in the context in which it appeared in this programme. If a child had never heard the trend he form he are the world he would be are the world he would be well had never heard the word before, he or she would be unlikely to have been impressed by its use in this programme.

However, these were subsidiary points since the complainant objects to the broadcasting of the word in any circum-

stances whatsoever

We do not find the use in this programme constitutes a failure to observe standards of good taste and decency under section 24 1 (c) of the Broadcasting Act 1976.

We find the use of the word in this programme was not

obscene, indecent or offensive.

The Tribunal does not consider the broadcast breached Regulation 51 Radio Regulations 1970 or the Programme

The Tribunal therefore upholds the decision of the Corpora-

tion on Mr Dobie's complaint.

The Tribunal notes that the Complaints Review Committee expressed surprise that the producer of the programme had not referred the problem to his superiors.

As it is likely situations will occur where decisions have to be made on use of language it agrees with the Complaints Review Committee that such decisions should be referred upwards by a producer.

Note: Co-opted members of the Tribunal, Mrs McPhail and Mr Wylie, as provided in the Act, have attended the meeting of the Tribunal and have viewed the film and taken part in the deliberations. Special Order of the Paparua County Council, made by the passing of a resolution at a special meeting of the Council held in the Council Chambers, Sockburn, on Monday, 4 April 1977, and confirmed at an ordinary meeting held in the Council Chambers, Sockburn, on Monday 2 May 1977.

RESOLVED:

Amount

That the following adjustments be made to the riding boundaries within the county:

(a) Yaldhurst/Hornby/Sockburn Boundary

The existing boundary presently lying a section depth along the north side of Buchanans Road be repositioned along the centre-line of Buchanans Road from the point where the boundary crosses Buchanans Road in a westerly direction to Gilberthorpes Road

Note: This will result in the properties encompassed within the narrow strip along Buchanans Road being transferred from Hornby to Yaldhurst riding. In addition a further small alteration is required where the joint boundary crosses Buchanans

Road to include the whole of Lot 15, D.P. 24639, within the Yaldhurst riding. This will result in the boundary being re-positioned along the dividing line between Lots 15 and 16.

#### (b) Yaldhurst/Islington/Hornby Boundary

The existing boundary presently lying a sectiondepth along the west side of Gilberthorpes Road to be repositioned along the centre-line of Gilberthorpes Road from Buchanans Road in a southerly direction to Foremans Road.

The new boundary is then to continue along the centre-line of Foremans Road until it links up with the existing boundary. The boundary between Yaldhurst riding and Islington riding lying between Buchanans and Roberts Roads is to be extended to the centre-line of Gilberthorpes Road to meet the new boundary.

Note: The effect of this alteration will be to transfer those properties along the western side of Gilberthorpes Road, presently lying in Hornby, to Yaldhurst and Islington ridings.

### (c) Islington/Hornby Boundaries

(a) The existing boundary presently running through the sections on the east side of Montague Street, from Foremans Road to the Main South Road, be repositioned along the rear boundary line of these properties. #### NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MAY 1977

General-Pressures were lower than normal over the whole country, with an unusually high frequency of winds from a southerly quarter, especially about central New Zealand. The colder southerly winds were reflected in the temperatures which were below normal over the whole country. Although some areas did have the occasional warm spell during the month, most of the country experienced a number of very cold days. Farmers in Southland and Otago suffered extensive damage when a small depression passed over the area on the 2nd and 3rd. Heavy rain and gale-force winds caused flooding and damage to private property in many areas. Stock losses were high with estimates of more than 3,000 sheep and 130 cattle lost during this storm. Potato, wheat, and other crops were destroyed. On the 17th and 18th gale force winds, snow, and cold temperatures affected most areas of New Zealand. Communications, road, and electricity services were disrupted in many areas from Southland to Auckland. Heavy snowfalls closed roads as far north as Hawke's Bay on the east coast, and further to the north in central New Zealand. The first fall of snow in many years in the hill suburbs of Wanganui occurred during this period. Stock in most areas was reported to be in good condition, except in the hill country where it was affected by cold wet conditions. Some farmers were concerned at lack of grass growth which would cause a shortage of green feed through the

Rainfall—Rainfall was below normal by as much as 60 percent in parts of Hawke's Bay and Poverty Bay, with some areas of Northland, Nelson, West Coast, and Canterbury below normal by up to 50 percent. Parts of Auckland, Waikato, Taranaki, Manawatu, and Wellington were above normal by 30 to 60 percent Certain areas of Otago and Southland were above normal by as much as 120 percent. Stations at Invermay and Musselburgh (Dunedin) recorded their wettest May since 1957; more than half the monthly total for these stations falling in the first six days of the month. A severe thunderstorm in the Wellington region, early on the 2nd, brought heavy rain and flooding to areas in the Hutt Valley, nearly 40 mm being recorded in 24 hours at Stokes Valley.

Temperatures—Temperatures were below normal over the whole country during May. In the central North Island many areas were more than 2°C below the average, and many areas in both the North and South Islands had departures of greater than 1°C below average. Nelson recorded 26 ground frosts in the month, the highest number ever recorded in May since the station opened in 1943. The coldest spell was the 17th–19th when temperatures fell well below normal.

Sunshine—Sunshine was above normal by more than 20-30 hours in Auckland, Waikato, Bay of Plenty, Taranaki, Buller, Nelson, and Marlborough. In Wairarapa, Otago, and Southland it was below normal by 20-40 hours. The rest of New Zealand had near normal sunshine for the month.

Weather sequence—The depression which had been moving towards the South Island at the end of April had become complex, with one low pressure centre near Fiordland and another to the west of Buller. On the 1st and 2nd the former of these two centres, with associated cold front, passed eastwards across Southland and Otago. Heavy rain in Fiordland, Southland, Otago, and Westland, and gale-force winds caused major damage in many areas. Heavy rain and gales were also reported in the Wellington region on the 2nd. Pressures remained low over the country until the 3rd, when a ridge of high pressure extended from Australia into the south Tasman Sea. On the 4th and 5th an anticyclone became established in the Tasman, and a cold southerly airstream covered New Zealand bringing showers to many parts of both islands.

On the 6th a complex depression to the east of New Zealand deepened, and a cold front associated with this depression moved northwards across the North Island. The cold southerly flow persisted as the anticyclone in the Tasman moved onto the country on the 7th. Rain was reported in most areas and temperatures were cold, east of the ranges in both the North and South Islands, during this period. The low to the east of the country moved slowly eastwards on the 8th with pressures remaining high over New Zealand. A small depression which had formed in the north Tasman Sea moved southwards but filled rapidly.

The anticyclone began to move slowly north-east on the 12th, and a depression near Tasmania moved south-east. A cold front passed quickly across the South Island on the 13th as the depression moved to the south of the country. Showers were reported in many areas of the South Island, heavy at times in Fiordland. Pressures remained high over the North Island on the 14th and 15th with lower pressures to the south of the country. Early on the 15th a cold front moved northwards over the South Island and brought rain to the West Coast and parts of central New Zealand. Temperatures were warm in most areas of the South Island.

By the 16th a ridge of high pressure extended into the Tasman Sea, with a depression south-east of the country deepening. The pressure gradient between these two systems increased and by the 17th there was a strong southerly airstream covering the whole of the country. This gradient did not decrease appreciably until the afternoon of the 18th. Gale-force winds were reported during this period in most parts of New Zealand. Heavy falls of snow were reported in Otago, Southland, Canterbury, and Nelson, and lighter falls in Wellington, Manawatu, Wanganui, Wairarapa, and Hawke's Bay. Temperatures were well below normal throughout the whole of New Zealand on the 18th and 19th.

The anticyclone had moved onto the country late on the 19th, and a depression, which had formed off the Queensland coast, started to move southwards. Pressures remained high over New Zealand until the 21st. The depression in the north Tasman Sea moved south-east and another near Tasmania also moved in the same direction. Early on the 22nd the situation had become complex, with a depression to the north of the country and a trough of low pressure in the Tasman Sea. A cold front passed onto the South Island and a warm front crossed over the North Island bringing heavy rain to Westland and most of the North Island.

By the 24th a depression in the south Tasman Sea had moved across Southland. Rain was reported in most areas west of the ranges. Temperatures were warmer than normal in Canterbury. Another depression had formed near Tasmania and had begun to move towards New Zealand, with higher pressures to the north of the country. The depression and associated cold front passed across central New Zealand on the 25th and 26th. Heavy rain was reported in Wellington, Taranaki, and Waikato with lighter falls over most of the country. A ridge of high pressure had moved onto the South Island by the afternoon of the 26th and the depression continued to move east away from the North Island. An anticyclone was situated over the country on the 27th and 28th, but this weakened and moved north-east to be replaced by a trough of low pressure which had moved onto the South Island by the 29th. A wave depression formed on the cold front in this trough and moved eastwards to pass over the country on the 30th. The only area which did not receive rain as this depression crossed the country was Central Otago.

On the 31st the depression had moved to near the Chatham Islands, and was replaced by a weak ridge of high pressure, with a depression moving eastwards south of Tasmania. Temperatures were cold in the east coasts of both the North and South Islands.

# STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The general accounting principles recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of profits on an historical basis have been followed. Particular accounting policies used which significantly affect the measurement of the Bank's profit and its financial position, are set out below:

- (a) Personal Loan Interest: Interest on personal loans is apportioned over the term of the loan, using the "Rule of 78" method.
- (b) Depreciation: Fixed assets are being depreciated on a straight line basis at rates which will write off the cost over their estimated useful lives. The principal write off periods are:

Buildings 40-100 years. Furniture, fittings and office equipment 10-15 years. Motor vehicles—3 years to estimated residual value of 60% of cost.

In previous years depreciation was charged on a diminishing value basis on assets other than buildings. The effect of the change is to increase net profit after taxation by \$77,200.

(c) Taxation: Taxation charged against net profit includes both current and deferred tax.

Deferred taxation arises from timing differences related to:

- (i) Interest accrued on investments.
- (ii) Depreciation charges.

The previous policy of providing for the ensuing year's provisional taxation has been discontinued. The resultant over provision for taxation made in prior years, has been transferred to the appropriation account.

(d) Valuation of Investments: Investments are recorded at cost. Both New Zealand Government and local authority securities are normally held to maturity and their value on redemption approximates cost.

#### Notes to the Accounts

# Note 1: Accounting Policies

The accounting policies which the bank considers appropriate for the measurement of its results and financial position under the historical cost convention are as follows:

- A. Recognition of Income: Income shown in the Profit and Loss Account is earned in the current year. In the case of Personal Loans the policy is to add interest to the advance at the commencement of the loan, and to bring this interest into revenue during the appropriate financial years in accordance with the "Rule of 78".
- B. Expenditure:
  - (1) Interest credited to depositors—Interest on open accounts at the 31st March represents the interest paid for the year. Accounts which are credited with interest

during the year have had an appropriate adjustment made for the interest accrued to 31st March.

(2) Other expenses—Other expenses, including expenditure on computer programme development, are charged to the accounts in the year in which the expenditure is

incurred.

\$73,543,170

(3) Depreciation—Fixed assets, other than freehold land, are generally depreciated on a straight line basis at rates estimated to write off the cost less residual value over the useful life of each class of asset. The principal annual rates in use are:
Buildings: 1% to 2½%.
Office furniture and equipment: 10% to 15%.

(4) Taxation—Taxation charged against profits for the year is the estimated expense for the year. Tax allocation accounting has been adopted by the Bank for significant timing differences in respect of accrued investment income, depreciation, and capital profits and losses on Government stock purchases and sales.

#### C. Valuation of Assets:

(1) Current Assets and Investments—All current assets and investments are shown at cost with the exception of New Zealand Government stock. On the basis that Government stock will normally be held to maturity, the bank considers it appropriate to record such stock at face value. Differences between cost and face value are transferred to the reserve fund at the date of purchase.

NOTE 2: The taxation provision includes a tax benefit of \$105,700 arising from switches to higher yielding Government stock, and as a result profit after taxation transferred to the profit and loss appropriation account is increased by this amount.

The capital loss on these transactions has been charged to the

reserve fund.

#### Notes to the Accounts

Statement of Accounting Policies: The general accounting principles recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of results on an historical basis have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The particular accounting principles which the Bank considers appropriate for the measurement of profit and financial position are detailed below.

- 1. Revenue:
- (a) Interest accrued on investments has been taken into account.(b) Personal Loans—The "Rule of 78" has been used in determining interest earned.
- 2. Depreciation: Calculation has been made on basis of Inland Revenue Department rates. First year depreciation and special depreciation have been claimed where applicable. Straight line basis for calculation of depreciation has not been adopted as it is considered the difference in the amount of depreciation would not be material.
- 3. New Zealand Government Stock: In accordance with established policy New Zealand Government stock has been shown at face value. Prior to 1 April 1975 certain parcels of New Zealand Government stock were purchased at a discount.
- 4. Taxation: No provision has been made for "deferred taxation".
