DECISION

Public Hearing

The complainant urged the tribunal to hear the complaint at a public hearing. No objection to this was taken on behalf of the corporation by Mr Andrews.

After considering Mr O'Neill's submissions which related

principally to the importance of the abortion issue itself the Tribunal decided that the hearing would be held in private. The Tribunal has no rigid view on this question.

In this instance Mr O'Neill had requested that the hearing be held in **Dunedin** because he wished to call witnesses. The Tribunal readily agreed. There is however a danger that complainants will lose sight of the purpose of the Tribunal and the fact that its members after knowing the substance of the complaint have had an opportunity of **viewing** the programme. Knowing the grounds **for complaint** and **viewing** the programme in this light enables the Tribunal to have a **first-hand** opinion of the programme.

first-hand opinion of the programme.

Mr_O Neill is concerned with the wider issue of abortion.

The Tribunal fortunately deals with a far narrower issue-

his specific complaints **regarding** the programme.

There is also a grave danger that the complaints procedure (which Mr O'Neill acknowledged as an important privilege which Mr O'Neill acknowledged as an important privilege and right of the individual) may be converted into an opportunity for a public inquisition of those concerned in the production of programmes. Apart from the diversion of people from their productive role it would almost certainly result in an increasing formality of the hearings and the representation of broadcasting by counsel. Possibly individual staff members would want to secure legal representation to protect their personal careers which might be in jeopardy as a result of reports of allegations made which might be peripheral to the hearing of the complaint itself.

There is another aspect' which we think should be clearly established. While there is a complainant and there is a broadcasting organisation which has broadcast the programme complained of, the procedures are not the conventional adversary situation. The Tribunal has the powers of a commission of inquiry and, particularly in dealing with this type of complaint, should be seen rather as adjudicating on a programme itself rather than between two adversaries.

It would be most unfortunate if the ordinary citizen were discouraged from lodging a complaint with the Tribunal be cause of the fear he would have to attend personally to pursue the complaint and may be liable to be cross-examined in public and possibly have his views ridiculed.

The personal views of the complainant may in particular cases only be of limited relevance to the complaint itself.

Nor **do** we want to see the situation as an adversary one between complainants and staff membem of the broadcasting **organisations**. The Tribunal **takes** the view that the warrant holder has the responsibility for the broadcasting of programmes and there should not be any question of a contest between individual broadcasters on the one hand and their **accusers** on the other.

The atmosphere of a trial could develop.

There may well however be some circumstances where some or all of a **complaint** should be dealt with in **public** and the Tribunal has **an open** mind on the situations **which** could arise which would justify that course.

It has however found that there is no **justification** for a

nublic hearing in the present case and indeed that such a hearing would have been inimical to the purpose of the Act which is to enable the Tribunal to determine the complaint about a programme-not to enable it to determine whether the media generally had put Mr O'Neill's views on abortion adequately and foirly

adequately and fairly

adequately and tairly.

It is appreciated that there are dangers of such matters being dealt with in private particularly such as happened in this case where one witness called by Mr O'Neill, Dr C. T. H. R. Ehrhardt made dramatic references to the fact that the hearing was in private likening the procedure of the Tribunal to that of the Star Chamber. He has since given publicity to his views with an inaccurate report of what he said and a complete misunderstanding of the reasons given by the Tricomplete misunderstanding of the reasons given by the Tribunal to Mr O'Neill for holding the hearing in private.

That is a risk that has to be taken.

Complaint

Mr J. S. O'Neill. a **Dunedin** solicitor, lodged a complaint with the Tribunal on 2 September 1977 concerning a **Perspective** programme broadcast by TV2 on 29 March 1977. Mr O'Neill was dissatisfied with the outcome of a complaint to the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand because the corporation had "not acknowledged that there was a gross failure to give the facts in respect to the existence of an unborn child **in** the abortion operation and to



show what the abortion operation in fact involves." He also criticised the answers given to him by the corporation and Two.

He considered that a decision should have been taken by the corporation "to explain to viewers that a complete oversight had been made on the part of the corporation in failing to show the stage of development of the unborn child at the time of the operations of the Aotea Abortion Hospital and to show what the abortion operation in fact involves and why there is **such** a deep controversy about it."

A specific complaint about the programme related to the cross-sectional diagram of the female reproductive *organs* "without showing the body of a foetus in the uterus" and to the "general bias of the programme". As examples of that, he said the programme showed hard working doctors, counsellors, etc., at the abortion clinic carrying on a simple

He objected to the programme on the grounds that in New Zealand the media and particularly television had failed

to show what abortion was and had failed to give adequate coverage to the development of life from conception.

At Mr O'Neill's request because he was calling witnesses the hearing was held in Dunedii and arrangements were made for him to see a replay of the programme for the benefit of expert witnesses,

The Tribunal had the benefit of very well presented and detailed submissions from Mr O'Neill in writing before it viewed the programme. It also had at the time it viewed the programme the response to these submissions from South Pacific Television (TV2).

In his initial nine page submission, Mr O'Neill made his personal views on **abortion** perfectly clear. It would not be unfair to say that he takes an uncompromising view, **considering** the law laid down by Macnaghten J. in *R. v. Borne* in 1938 as a serious erosion of the position regarding the unborn **child**. He assisted in the formation of the Society for the Protection of the Unborn Child in Dunedin in 1971 and

has campaigned for what he regards as a human rights issue. He said, 'The right to life is intrinsic and intended killing of innocent and defenceless lives whether born or unborn is a matter which must be prescribed by the law universally. One sees in the attempt to discriminate in this respect then that an inviolable principle will have been breached and further inroads upon it **will** inevitably follow." And later, "I do not agree with the intended killing of unborn children in the property of in any circumstances and I am not alone in this belief . . . It is a view which should be given place by the media together with the explanation of the **facts** on which it is based. I and those sharing this view look forward to the attainment of a society which does not condone intended killing of unborn children in any circumstances and where every child will be accepted and welcomed and taken care of.

Mr O'Neill's views have been set forth since he wanted them to be known to the Tribunal and further because it was clear that because of his view and the interpretation he placed on a number of matters that it was quite impossible for him to take a neutral view of any programme concerned with abortion. The Tribunal therefore had to look at the substance of his complaints and try to apply some more objective assessment of the programme than **that** which he or a person of similarly strong views on the other side of the debate could provide..

The fact, therefore of Mr O'Neill considering the programme to be biased was not considered particularly relevant to our consideration except to the extent that it was the reason why the complaint was before us and that the points that he considered to be biased should be considered carefully by the Tribunal. He prepared a thorough case against

the programme.

Mr O'Neill asked the Tribunal for a decision that would require Television Two to show a programme which would correct what he considered to be the **deficiences** and that this decision should be made and the programme screened before the debate on the impending legislation took place at the end of the Parliamentary session. However, because of the view taken by the members of the Tribunal it was not found necessary to issue a decision in haste.

The Tribunal has therefore had the opportunity of carefully considering all the evidence, the submissions most cogently put forward by Mr O'Neill and the submissions from the executive producer of the programme, Mr George Andrews, who represented the corporation.

Decision

Mr O'Neill's complaint that the media in New Zealand and particularly television have failed to show what abortion is and has faifed to give adequate coverage to the development of life from conception is not a matter which this Tribunal can rule upon.

Suffice it to say that the Tribunal considers that in relation to the objectives of the programme it does not consider it necessary to set out again to a public (which has had the abortion debate and a Royal Commission with the reporting of submissions and the impending issue of its report) a detailed explanation of what is being aborted. It would be quite wrong to suggest that in every programme a comprehensive definition should be entered **upon** before some aspect of the subject could be discussed. In this case the programme was about the Aotea Hospital and it is considered unlikely that anybody could possibly have seen the programme with-out knowing what the function of the hospital was.

The programme complained about was one of a topical documentary series produced by Mr Andrews for Television Two and was designed to coincide with the publication of the report of the Royal Commission on Contraception, Sterilisation, and Abortion which would be of major public interest and which might determine the future of the Aotea Hospital.

Mr Andrews considered that, "The backdrop to its delibera-

tions and indeed to all of the recent debate in New Zealand about abortion was the existence and continuing operation of the Auckland Medical Aid Centre. Just as clearly, thoutstanding advantage of the film documentary is its abilityunlike the print medium or radio-to show what actually occurs at an event or location and allow viewers to make up their own minds on the **issues** involved."

More than usual time was available for the preparation of the **programme** which enabled the assembly of **library** footage from Television One, Television Two, and the BCNZ.

It was therefore decided to separate from the actual filming of the activities at the centre the polarised comment which had always surrounded it. Mr Andrews said it was decided the comment would be provided by the spokesmen of the opposing groups in the historical sequences; the facts of the clinic's day-to-day routine would by contrast be presented without comment or **interpretation** of any kind. To underline the distinction a male voice was used for the historical sequences and the centre's activities were narrated by a woman's voice.

The Tribunal in viewing the programme in the light of the

submissions it had received came to this conclusion:

While detecting some technical faults explicable in the exigencies of topical television the Tribunal found it to be a fair compilation of the public history of the clinic and its current operations.

The reasons for presenting the programme seemed to have been in the best traditions of public information broadcasting. The hospital had been the centre of the controversy and was perhaps the most visible sign of challenge to accepted laws and morality on abortion,

A Royal Commission which had sat so long on this and related issues of **population** control might well have offered some decisive guidance to legislators **which** would in turn affect the future of the clinic in some decisive way.

The alternative presentation of yet another debate on the abortion issue would have been singularly inappropriate on the eve of such a report, In the context of the commission's activities and the constraints on the television medium such a definitive exercise would also have been impracticable.

The Tribunal does not consider that the programme was biased.

In a highly controversial issue such as the continuing debate on the law and practice of abortion hard-liners on both sides will have become polarised and tend to become incensed when anything appears which is not favourable to their viewpoint. The very fact therefore that the Auckland Medical Aid Centre should be depicted on television would be an

affront to a number of sincere anti-abortion campaigners.

There is in fact an element of promotion when anything or anybody is featured in a programme. There is publicity. But the fact that the centre was carrying out a type of work which many people in New Zealand are violently opposed to is not justification for declining to present **a** programme on what it did.

It is also true that the depiction of something or someone in a nrogramme reveals aspects which are unfavourable to the subject and that was certainly so in the opinion of this Trihunal in relation to the centre.

The Tribunal rejects the approach of Mr O'Neill in his evidence of analysing each 30 seconds or minute segment of the programme and giving it a rating for or against abortion or for or against the hospital, but even on this analysis it was clear that some of the items which he regarded as being favourable to the hosuital were in the opinion of this Tribunal unfavourable to the hosuital.

The complainant also claimed that the segment of news films which showed Catholics saying the rosary outside Parliament buildings was inserted to produce anti-Catholic feeling which would react against the Society for the Protection of the Unborn Child, His witness, Dr $\mathbf{C_2}$ T. H. R. Ehrhardt, an



Anglican layman gave evidence of his prejudice against the rosary and the offensiveness of showing it on television which implied that people who were members of SPUC were also persons who said rosaries. We found this argument quite extraordinary and an indication of the lengths to which people will go to find prejudice and bias in a programme.

Objection is taken to the failure of the programme to explain the existence of an unborn child. In fact news film of Dr Diana Mason and Mr J. D. Dalgety set that view out clearly and succinctly and there was no attempt made to express any opposing point of view. No viewer saw the abortion sequence at the end of the programme without first having heard the views of those opposed to the centre.

There is a tendency in such a hearing to produce ingenuous reconstructions of the complaint or the programme in order to criticise or to justify steps taken in the preparation of the programme. While the Tribunal considers there are minor criticisms which could be made of the way in which the programme was prepared and presented, few programmes could be expected to be free of such imperfections.

More serious is the question of the diagrams. The principal objection was that the diagrams which were produced to objection was that the diagrams which were produced to objection the programme of the operation and the

More serious is the question of the diagrams. The principal objection was that the diagrams which were produced to show the procedures carried out in the operation and the instruments used did not depict a foetus in the uterus. Obviously there was a space in the uterus but it was not clear what filled that space. Logically there must have been something present or the space would not have occurred.

The reason stated by the executive producer was that the foetus is the central issue in an emotional, moral, and medical debate and to attempt any representation of the contents of the uterus would have involved a judgment of his own on these issues.

He claimed that the cross-section diagram was consistent

He claimed that **the** cross-section diagram was consistent with the style of the graphics used and advanced his argument partly on the grounds of good taste and partly on the grounds of ambiguity over **the size** of the foetus. He **relied** on an activist handbook for a diagram of the operation, and the absence of the foetus from the handbook and consequently from the **television** graphic appeared to the Tribunal to sidestep the issue that a human foetus was being aborted.

For the producer to rely on good taste as his reason for not showing the foetus could lend substance to Mr O'Neill's claim that a vital fact had been supressed. If it is bad taste

claim that a vital fact had been supressed. If it is bad taste to supress the unsavoury aspect of the operation, that might be interpreted as favouring one view over another.

It is obvious however that something must be being sucked from the uterus in the operation and the script made it clear in neutral words (not dissimilar from those used by the Royal Commission in its report issued later) "the doctor then switches on the vacuum pump and the contents of the uterus are sucked through the tube into the vacuum container."

Mr. Andrews' other argument that he supressed the graphic

Mr Andrews' other argument that he supressed the graphic representations of the S-week foetus being discussed because he could not get a definitive size, has greater validity. Mr O'Neill's expert witness Associate Professor Gwynne conceded

that there **was** some room for disagreement **as** to **the** likely size of an S-week foetus.

However, it is clear that there is a foetus and it would have a likely shape and in a true representation of the reproductive organs it would have adopted a **recognisable** shape of a foetus. In a **stylised** representation it would not be essential that exact shape be shown, but perhaps **colouring** or opaqueness could have indicated **there was** something more than just some vague "matter" in the uterus. We do not. **consider** that **this** amounted to a bias nor that it was more than a misjudgment in what was generally a carefully

balanced program&—
The Tribunal does not consider this matter should be elevated beyond its importance, but does consider the **programme** would have been improved **if** it had been better dealt with by the producer. It is perhaps pertinent to suggest that in such matters it **might** have been **appropriate** to have approached **a** university or-other **authoritative medical** sources the approached a university or-other **authoritative medical** sources.

rather from consulting only one doctor who had, albeit occasionally, worked at Aotea, and a partisan handbook.

I: is unfortunate that Mr O'Neill's complaint was dealt with in a somewhat cavalier approach by Television Two. The corporation now accepts it was wrong in stating that the foetus was not included as it would only have amounted to a dot on the television screen, Regardless of the lengthy arguments we heard about the size of the foetus it was quite clear that it would not have been a dot and Mr Andrews conceded this. Correct information would have been available from medical sources independent of the clinic or other lobbies on the topic

While it is likely that this particular complainant would not have **been** satisfied with **any** answer from **the** corporation that did not fully meet Mr **O'Neill's** personal position, care should be taken to ensure that answers given to complainants

are vetted for accuracy.

Another matter which possibly **led** to the complaint being Jodged was the television credit to Marcia Russell as writer Jodged was the television credit to Marcia Russen as white for the **programme**. She bad been named as a person supporting the establishment of the Aotea clinic and was **known** to have a public position **on** the matter of the debate. **Mr** Andrews informed us that her use in the **programme** had been referred upwards and had been approved. He considered that it was a further incentive to him as executive producer to ensure that the programme was completely unbiased.

We do not rule out an activist as a person who may be employed in some news capacity, but great care has to be taken when using such people in key positions to interpret sensitive issues with which they are strongly identified. In this case, Marcia Russell was not just identified with the abortion issue but with the establishment of the clinic itself.

It might be seen as a courageous step on the part of South Pacific Television to identify her as one of those responsible for the production, but it must have been obvious that the appearance of her name in the credits would produce a response from some viewers **that** if she were **involved** in the programme there would be no possibility of **it being** unbiased. This attitude, while not necessarily **logical**, is one which the administration should take into account in the preparation of such programmes.

In the event we are satisfied that the executive producer took real responsibility for the compilation, production, and editing of the programme and that the vital decisions taken were his. We therefore consider that Marcia Russell's participation in the production of the programme did not compromise its impartiality.

promise its impartiality

Evidence for Mr O'Neill was given by Mr John Kennedy, editor of the *Tablet*, who bad attacked the **programme** in an editorial in the *Tablet*. He considered **inter alia there were** some slipshod journalistic techniques and that the programme might have shown simulated rather than actual procedures. In fact actual operations were shown and his other objections and criticisms were satisfactorily explained by Mr Andrews.

There was **no** dispute between the produce; and this witness on what acceptable **journalistic** standards should be The Tribunal **could** not, however, accept that Mr Kennedy's was **an** unbiased professional **opinion** of the programme and in **Yiew** of **his** own lapses from strict adherence to accuracy some doubt was cast upon his judgment on this programme.

Mr O'Neill sought to introduce evidence from three other people who had been wncemed by the **programme** and one who had not apparently seen it. It was ruled that the evidence would not have been relevant to the allegation of bias but the statements prepared were accepted as submissions. In the event the Tribunal has found no reason to place any weight on these submissions.

Mr O'Neill submitted finally that the only way in which satisfaction could be obtained and a just and fair **presentation** ensured would be by two program&a prepared-from each point of view and jointly presented. This is an impracticable suggestion in relation to this particular **programme**. While the adversary system may serve justice well, there appears to be no justification for its use **in this** instance on television.

The Tribunal does not **consider** that **the programme** was in breach of the programme **rules** or of section 24 (1) (e) or in **breach** of regulation 50 of the Radio Regulations, nor does it consider that it was an advertisement in breach of the advertisement rules.

Membership

When Mrs Sommerville a permanent member of the Tribunal, realised that one of the points raised by Mr O'Neill related to her sister Mrs Stanton, who worked at the centre and who was shown on the programme Mrs Sommerville asked that it be made clear to Mr O'Neill from the outset that this relationship existed in case he had any objection to her hearing the complaint. Mr O'Neill courteously objected to her continuing and asked that the remaining members of the Tribunal deal with the complaint.

The Tribunal took time to consider the points raised and

The Tribunal took time to consider the points raised and although it did not uphold the objection, Mrs Sommerville herself decided that she would prefer not to continue in view of the objection having been taken. She withdrew from the hearing. Both the corporation and Mr O'Neill consented to the remaining members continuing with the hearing which was agreed to because Mr O'Neill was keen to have the wmplaint

disposed of without delay.

Sister M. Murray and Mr G. C. EJJ were co-opted to the Tribunal as persons whose qualifications or experience were likely, in the opinion of the Tribunal, to be of assistance to the Tribunal. They took part in the hearing and in the deliberations, but the decision in accordance with the Act, is that of the two permanent members.



Costs

In **final** submissions Mr Andrews on behalf of the corporation has asked for costs in the event that the **complaint** is found to be without *merit*. The Tribunal is surprised that such an application should be made, particularly in view of the corporation's correspondence with Mr O'Neill after the programme. There will be no order as to costs.

A rain day is a day with rainfall equal to or greater than 0.1 mm.

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month, the date of the **first** occurrence is given.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR NOVEMBER 1977

General-During November pressures were higher than normal over the whole of New Zealand with a predominance of winds from a westerly quarter. Over most of the country **this** was a cold, dry, a westerly quarter. Over most of the country trus was a cord, dry, sunny month, with occasional spells of warm fine weather. Many farmers in the North Island reported good grass growth and stock in good condition, but in many parts of the South Island grass growth was poor. In Hawke's Bay and Wairarapa farmers in most areas reported that grass growth was not good because of the continuing warm dry weather, and more rain was needed to rejuvenate grass damaged in the August and September wet spell. In some control of New Zealand berry fruit was not ripening as well as could

areas of New Zealand berry fruit was not ripening as well as could be expected at this time of year.

On the 9th the fishing boat "Lindberg" was stranded on the rocks near North Cape during a period of gale force winds. Yachts in the One Ton Cup race had to seek shelter in the Hauraki Gulf after beig battered by gale force winds and high seas on the 9th.

Rainfall—The only areas with above normal rainfall for the month were parts of Waikato, Taranaki, Manawatu, Wellington, and Marlborough. The largest departures above normal were in the Wellington region, where nearly half the month's total rainfall fell from the 20th to 22nd. At Kelbum (Wellington) more than 40 mm was recorded in 6 hours on the 20th, and at Taita (Lower Hutt) nearly 50 mm was recorded in 6 hours on the 22nd, and more than 70 mm in 12 hours on the 21st/22nd. Roads and railway lines were blocked by land slips and floodwaters at Petone and Porirua, and some houses in the Hutt Valley were evacuated. At Cape Reinga (Northland) more than 80 mm was recorded in the 48 hours to 9 a.m. on the 10th.

Areas with rainfall totals appreciably below normal were Poverty

Areas with rainfall totals appreciably below normal were Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay, parts of Wairarapa, Nelson and the east **coast** of the South Island.

Temperatures-The monthly mean temperatures were below normal throughout New Zealand, in many areas of the North Island by more than 1°C, and in the South Island by at least ½°C. The coldest speil occurred during the first three days of the month with maximum temperatures well below normal, The longest warm spell was from the 19th to 22nd.

Sunshine-Most areas of New Zealand had sunshine hours near or above normal for the month, many places being above by 25 to 35 hours. At Christchurch Airport the total of more than 25 0 hours was about 20 percent above normal. Parts of Auckland and Southland were slightly below normal.

WEATHER SEQUENCE

The depression lying to the southeast of New Zealand at the end of October **continued** to move east, and the cold front associated with the depression moved across the North Island. Pressures were high to the north **of** the country on the **ist**, with a small low pres-

sure area near Tasmania. Temperatures were cold on the east coast of the North Island and Canterbury. By the 2nd the **depression** near Tasmania had moved to the south of the country, and its associated cold front had passed onto New Zealand bringing rain to **Westland** and Fiordland, and showers to most of **the** country. Temperatures continued to be cold on the east coast of both Islands. On the 3rd a small wave depression had formed on a cold **front** in the Tasman Sea, and by the afternoon had moved onto central New Zealand moving northeast. Heavy rain was recorded in Northland, Bay of Plenty, Taranaki and Poverty Bay. Following the passage of this depression a ridge of high pressure extended into the Tasman **Sea** from Australia, with pressures low to the south of New Zealand. As an anticyclone moved onto the country on the 4th a strong As an anticyclone moved onto the country on the 4th a strong westerly airflow became established over the South Island. Small

westerly airflow became established over the South Island. Small disturbances in this flow brought showers to the West coast, occasionally heavy.

Early on the 5th the anticyclone had started to move east away from the country, with a trough of low pressure moving into the Tasman Sea. Between these two systems a strong northwest airflow persisted until the evening of the 6th. with winds of near gale force being reported in the Wellington and Marlborough areas. As the trough of low pressure crossed the country most areas of New Zealand reported rain, heavier in Westland, Fiordland, Southland and Otago. Temperatures were colder than usual in Wellington, Waira-Tapa, Hawke's Bay, Otago and Southland. An anticyclone moved onto New Zealand early on the 7th. but by the 8th had started to move quickly east. Pressures were low in the north and south move quickly east. move quickly east. Pressures were low in the north and south Tasman Sea.

A small depression in the north Tasman Sea moved onto Northland early on the 9th, and heavy rain and gale force winds were reported at Cape Reinga lighthouse. A fishing vessel was stranded on the rocks at North Cape, and more than 80 mm of rain was recorded in 48 hours at the lighthouse. Heavy rain was also reported in other parts of Northland and the Coromandel peninsula. Gale force winds were also recorded in the Hauraki Gulf on the 10th. A ridge of high pressure extended onto New Zealand from the north Tasman Sea, but had weakened early on the 1 lth. A complex trough of low pressure had started to move east onto the country late on the 11th. the llt h.

Small disturbances in the flow ahead of the low pressure trough

Small disturbances in the flow ahead of the low pressure trough brought showers to most areas west of the main ranges. Temperatures were warm in Canterbury, Otago and Southland. As the wld front associated with the trough **passed** over New Zealand on the 12th and 13th heavy rain fell in the South Island with lighter falls elsewhere in the country. By the 14th an **anticyclone** had become established in the Tasman Sea and had begun to move cast onto New Zealand. Pressures were low to the southeast of the country. near Tasmania. As the anticyclone moved across the country on the 15th it was replaced by a **cold** front associated with a depression to the south, which moved quickly onto the country. By the 16th



a depression had formed on the front and the only area that did not record rain as the system passed over the country was **Hawke's**

A ridge of high **pressure** over the North Island, and **low** pressures to the south of the country on the 17th caused a **strong** westerly flow over most of New **Zealand**. Disturbances in this flow **br**ought heavy rain to **Fiordland** and Westland. Late on the 18th the ridge had started to move east, and a cold front associated with a depression in the south **Tasman Sea** moved onto the South **Island** early on the 10th and moved worth. Point was recorded in the late of the North 19th and moved north. Rain was recorded in the whole of the North Island with very heavy **falls** in the **Wellington** area and the southern Wairarapa during the afternoon of the 20th. Later that day a ridge of high pressure had become established in the Tasman Sea and

onto New Zealand.

This ridge of high **pressure** moved away on the **21st** and a depression formed on a cold front in the Tasman Sea. Early on the 22nd this depression was lying just to the west of the South Island moving east. The cold front associated with the depression brought heavy rain to Westland, Marlborough and Taranaki. More than 40 **mm**

was recorded at **Wellington** in 12 hours on the **night** of the **21st/22nd**, and 24 hour **falls** of more than 80 mm in the **Hutt** Valley. Temperatures were very warm in Poverty Bay on the 21st.

A strong westerly **airflow** wered the country from the **23rd** to late on the **25th**, and during the period heavy **rain** was **recorded** in

late on the 25th, and during the period heavy rain was recorded in many areas west of the main ranges. Areas in central New Zealand experienced gale force winds from the 23rd to 25th. On the 26th an anticyclone had moved onto the country from the Tasman Sea and persisted until the 28th, bringing mainly fine weather to most of the country. Temperatures were very warm in Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay, Wairarapa, Canterbury and Otago during this period. On the 29th a weak cold front passed northwards across New Zealand and had cleared the country early on the 30th. Isolated showers were reported in both Islands, heavy at times on the West Coast. Temperatures were again very warm in the Wairarapa. Later on the 30th an anticyclone had become stationary over New Zealand.
