A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928, I, The Right Honourable Sir Keith **Jacka** Holyoake, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the middle line of portions of roads desired to be constructed in the Borough of Cromwell and County of Vincent, **viz**, a relocation of the Timaru-Milton and Blenheim-Invercargill via Nelson and Greymouth State Highways shall be that defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto; and I also declare that this Proclamation shall affect only the land situated within the limits of the areas shown shaded on plans **S.O.** 18848 and 18854 referred to in the Schedule hereto.

THE RT. HON. R. D. **MULDOON** PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967, His Excellency The Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive **Council**, hereby varies the Order in Council made on the 27th day of October 1970, and published in the *Gazette* on the 5th day of November 1970, at page 1992, by revoking the Second Schedule thereto and substituting the following, such variation to take effect on the 1st day of April 1978.

SECOND SCHEDULE

THE areas in respect of which special provisions apply:

(A) COUNTY OF MOUNT HERBERT

At that area in the Canterbury Land District commencing at a point at mean high-water mark of the sea at the head of Big Bay Block **III**, Pigeon Bay Survey District; thence in a southerly direction to and along the western boundary of the road passing through Rural Sections 27872, 33229, 24764, 24758, and 24762, to the southern boundary of the **last-named section**; thence westerly along the said southern boundary of **Section** 24762 to the **Maori** Reserve 874, and south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of that Reserve, to and along the eastern and southern boundaries of R.S. 28979 to the eastern boundary of R.S. 33517, Block V,

Pigeon Bay Survey District; thence southerly along the said eastern boundary of R.S. 33517, and the eastern boundaries of Rural Sections 28980 and **26939**, to and along the western side of the road running through Rural Sections 28291, 24293, and 32152, to its **junction** with the Summit Road (on the north-west boundary of **Morice Settlement**); being the northern boundary of the **Wairewa County** as described in N.Z. Statutes No. 8, 1912, page **307**; thence generally in a westerly direction along that boundary to the summit of the Port Hills; thence generally in a north-easterly direction by the summit of the said Port Hills to the north-eastern boundary of Maori Reserve 875 (**Raupaki**) at the western boundary of the Borough of Lyttelton; thence in a south-easterly direction along the said north-eastern boundary of Maori Reserve **875** to the Lyttelton **Harbour**; thence by a right line in a south-easterly direction to mean high-water mark at **Church Gully** in Church Bay, and thence in an easterly direction generally by mean high-water mark of the sea to a point opposite the northernmost corner of Rural Section **243E**; thence to and south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of said Rural Section 243E to the easternmost corner of that section; thence south-westerly across a right-of-way following along the south-eastern boundary of said R.S. 243E to the south-western side of that right-of-way; thence in a south-easterly direction along the south-western side of that right-of-way to the Charteris Bay Road; thence easterly generally along the northern side of that road and the southern boundary of R.S. 22982 and its continuation to **mean** high-water-mark of the sea; thence again generally easterly along mean high-water-mark of the sea to the head of Big Bay, the point of commencement.

(B) COUNTY OF AKAROA

All that area in the Canterbury Land District commencing at a point on the mean high-water mark of the sea, at the head of Big Bay, Block **III**, Pigeon Bay Survey District, and in line with the western boundary of a road passing through Rural Sections 27872, 33229, 24754, 24758, and 24762; thence south-easterly, southerly, and south-westerly generally along the mean high-water mark of the sea to T&I Point, Block **XII**, Akaroa Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Timutimu Head; thence westerly along the mean high-water mark of the sea to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 22707, Block XI, Akaroa Survey District; thence north-easterly generally to and along the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of the said Rural Section 22707, the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 22755, the south-western, north-western, and north-eastern boundaries of Rural Section 23314 and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of Maginnes Road; thence north-easterly along the middle of **Maginnes** Road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Rural Section 4547; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to the westernmost corner of the said Rural Section 4547; thence northerly along a right line to Trig. Station C (Bossu), Block VII, Akaroa Survey District; thence north-westerly and northerly generally along the summit of the range passing through **Carews** Peak, Saddle Hill, **Wainui** Pass, and French Hill, to the south-eastern side of the **Christchurch**-Akaroa State Highway No. 74 at Barrys Pass (Hill Top); thence south-westerly generally along the south-eastern side of the said State highway to a point opposite the southernmost corner of Reserve 1259; thence northerly generally along a right line to the said point; thence along the western boundary of Reserve 1259 aforesaid and its production to the northern side of a road forming the northern boundary of the said reserve (**Harmans** Track); thence easterly generally along the northern side of that road, the Christchurch-Akaroa State Highway No. 74, and the Little River to Pigeon Bay Summit Road, to the eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 11894; thence north-easterly generally along that boundary, the eastern boundary of part Lot 11, D.P. 4902, and the south-eastern boundary of Lot 5, D.P. 4902, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of Purau or Summit Road; thence north-westerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the western side of a road passing through Rural Sections 32152, 33405, **24203**, and 28291; thence northerly to and along that roadside to the northern boundary of Rural Section 28291; thence northerly and north-easterly generally to and along the eastern boundary of Rural Section **26939**, the crossing of a public road, to and along the western and northern boundaries of Lot 3, D.P. 8086, to the western side of a road passing through Rural Sections 24762, 24758, **24754**, 33229, and 27872; thence northerly generally along that roadside and its production to the mean high-water mark of the sea at the head of Big Bay, being the point of commencement.

Commerce Act 1975—Public Notices

As required by section 103 of the Commerce Act 1975 public notice is hereby given of the following decisions of the Commerce Commission. These decisions are presented here in abridged form. The full text of the decisions are available for public inspection at the Commission's offices, sixth floor, Chase-NBA Building, 163 The Terrace, Wellington. Photocopies are also available on application to P.O. Box 10-273, at the prices specified.

Decision No. 18 (Abridged)

On 10 May 1977 Akrad Radio Corporation Ltd. and Pye Ltd. (the appellants) fled appeals against decisions of the Secretary of Trade and Industry (respondent) as contained in special approvals F25 and F26 relating respectively to the wholesale and retail selling prices of certain colour television receivers. (In addition appellants filed applications pursuant to section 100 of the Act. These applications were decided by the Commerce Commission in its decision No. 12 dated 7 June 1977).

The grounds of the appeals were:

- (a) That respondent was not justified in departing from the Price Tribunal Decision No. 5300 formula of 30 percent on factory cost in approving the wholesale prices.
- (b) However, if the Commission should find that respondent was so justified then—
 - (i) That factory costs, and the value of assets, should be allowed on the basis of "replacement" or "current" cost accounting and not on the historical cost basis.
 - (ii) That depreciation of fixed assets should be allowed on the "straight line" method on the replacement cost of assets.
 - (iii) That, if the value of assets is to be taken as their written-down historic cost, the appellants require a profit return not of 15 Percent but of "at least 20 percent".
 - (iv) That certain exchange losses suffered by the appellants on moneys borrowed overseas should be allowed as a cost.
- (c) That in either case the sum of \$440,000 which the respondent claimed represented an amount of costs over-recovered by appellants in a certain past period, should not be brought into account to reduce appellants' prices.

The Commission received submissions and had a considerable amount of evidence presented to it by the parties and after consideration of these and for the reasons set out in the text of the full decision decided as follows:

- (a) That the appellants' submission that the respondent was not justified in departing from the Price Tribunal Decision No. 5300 formula of 30 percent on factory costs in approving wholesale prices, be rejected.
- (b) That the appellants' submission, that factory costs and the value of assets should be allowed on the basis of "replacement" or "current" cost accounting and not on the historical cost basis, be rejected.
- (c) That the appellants' submission, that depreciation of fixed assets should be allowed on the "straightline" method on the replacement cost of assets, be rejected.
- (d) That the appellants' submission, that, if the value of assets is to be taken as their writtendown historic cost, the appellants require a profit return not of 15 percent but of at least 20 percent, be rejected.
- (e) That the appellants' submission, that exchange losses should be taken into account, was considered by the Commission in its overall consideration of the appellants' submissions but the Commission considers, that for the purposes of this appeal, it can take this question no further, pending any decision the Minister may take following the commission's report and recommendations arising out of the recent inquiry into this topic.
- (f) That the appellants' submission, that a sum of \$440,000, claimed by the respondent to represent an amount of costs over-recovered by appellants in a past period, should not be brought into account to reduce appellants' wholesale prices, be upheld and accordingly the Commission orders, pursuant to section 101 (3), that the sum of \$440,000 be not brought into account in determining the appellants' prices resulting from this determination by the Commission or in any subsequent applications made by the appellants to the respondent.

Decision No. 21 (Abtided)

This decision follows upon and correlates with the Commission's decision No. 18. It relates to appeals tiled by Akrad Radio Corporation Ltd. and Pye Ltd. (the appellants) against decisions of the Secretary of Trade and Industry (respondent) as contained in special approvals F40 and F41 relating to the wholesale and retail prices respectively of "Pye" and "Ultimate" brands of wLOUR television receivers manufactured by the appellants incorporating the new Vidmatic-SRU-CT103 technology.

Decision 18 of the Commission in effect resolved certain issues of principle but did not have any effect on actual prices as it related to wLOUR television receivers, manufactured using an earlier technology, which had all been sold prior to the hearing of the appeals concerned.

It was acknowledged by respondent that, in making his decisions embodied in those special approvals Nos. F40 and F41, he applied the same principles, and made the decisions upon the same grounds, as he had applied in making his decisions embodied in the earlier special approvals No. F25 and F26, the subjects of the original appeal. Further, it was agreed by appellants and respondent that the evidence before the Commission was comprehensively applicable to both the original and this further appeal and the Commission was satisfied that that was so.

The Commission received a joint statement by appellants and respondent which is set out in the text of the full decision.

In the circumstances of the grounds of appeal being the same as those of the original appeal, respondent's decisions having been made applying the same principles and upon the same grounds, and the evidence before the Commission applying comprehensively to both the original and this later appeal, the Commission applied its determinations on the original appeal, stated in its decision No. 18, in this later appeal with, however, one exception. That exaption concerns the rate of profit return to be applied to average assets for the purpose of this later appeal.

The grounds of appeal and the Commission's determinations on these is summarised below as stated in decision No. 18:

- (a) That respondent was not justified in departing from the Price Tribunal Decision No. 5300 formula of 30 percent on factory cost in approving the wholesale prices.

Appellants' submission is rejected.

- (b) That factory costs and the value of assets should be allowed on the basis of "replacement" or "current" cost accounting and not on the historical cost basis.

Appellants' submission is rejected.

- (c) That depreciation of fixed assets should be allowed on the "straight line" method on the replacement cost of assets.

Appellants' submission is rejected.

- (d) That, if the value of assets is to be taken as their written-down historic cost, the appellants require a profit return not of 15 percent but of at least 20 percent.

The Commission determined in decision No. 18 that 15 percent was a fair rate of return. However, for the reasons set out in the full text of this decision the Commission determined that the appellants be allowed a rate of return on average assets, before interest and before income tax, of 16 percent and that that rate of return should be allowed until appellants make their first application to respondent for amendment of prices subsequent to their audited accounts for the year ending 31 December 1977 being presented to the respondent

- (e) That exchange losses on moneys borrowed overseas should be taken into account.

The Commission wnsider that, for the purpose of this appeal, it can take this question no further, pending any decision the Minister may take following the Commission's report and recommendations arising out of its recent inquiry into the subject of exchange gains or losses on moneys borrowed overseas.

- (f) That a sum of \$440,000, claimed by respondent to represent an amount of costs over-recovered by appellants in a past period, should not be brought into account to reduce appellants' wholesale prices,

Appellants' submission is upheld and accordingly the Commission orders, pursuant to section 101 (3), that the sum of \$440,000 be not brought into account in determining appellants' prices resulting from this determination by the Commission or in any subsequent applications made by appellants to respondent.

The Commission determined, pursuant to section 102 of the Act, that appellants' application of 11 July 1977 and respondent's related decisions embodied in special approvals No. F40 and F41 be referred back to respondent for reconsideration and that the matters specified in (d) and (f) above should be taken into account in such reconsideration.

Decision dated 7 December 1977. Copies of the full text of this decision are available at a cost of 90c.

Decision No. 23 (Abridged)

On 6 September 1977 the Golden Bay Cement Co. Ltd. (the appellant) filed an appeal against a decision of the Secretary of Trade and Industry (respondent) given effect to in special approval D829 dated 17 August 1977. This decision discontinued a grant of 57c per tonne for bagged and bulk cement given to the company by decision No. 2 of the Commerce Commission in March 1976.

The appellant's submissions were that the appeal should be upheld on the grounds that the decision of the respondent was erroneous in law (for the reasons stated in the full text of the decision). Alternatively if the decision of the respondent was not erroneous in law, that it is just and equitable that the grant of 57c per tonne for bagged and bulk cement should be continued.

The respondent submitted that the appeal should be dismissed on the following grounds:

- (1) That the grant of 57c per tonne for bagged and bulk cement had been given effect to.
- (2) That the grant of 57c per tonne made by the Commerce Commission in its decision No. 2 was an unauthorised exercise of the powers wnferrred on the Commission by the Commerce Act 1975 and was invalid for the reasons set out in the full text of the decision.

In addition the respondent lodged an application to the chairman (pursuant to section 122) "To state a case for the opinion of the Supreme Court on the following questions of law:

- (1) Whether the grant of 57c per tonne for bagged and bulk cement made by the Commerce Commission in its decision No. 2 on the 12th day of March 1976 had any effect in law other than authorising the maximum selling prices recorded in Schedule B attached to the said decision, and, if so, what effect?
- (2) Whether the said grant of 57c was valid?
- (3) On an appeal in respect of an application based on annualised accounts is the closing date for the accounts that date which was the basis of the application to the Secretary of Trade and Industry?
- (4) On an appeal under section 99 of the Commerce Act 1975 against a decision of the Secretary under section 92 (4) of the Act:
 - (a) What weight should the Commerce Commission attach to the Secretary's decision?
 - (b) What is the nature of the appeal?"

The Commission considered the submission of both parties and for the reasons set out in the decision resolved:

- (i) To dismiss the application, lodged by the respondent pursuant to section 122 of the Commerce Act, for a case to be stated on certain questions of law.
- (ii) To determine the appeal before the Commission by ordering that the grant of 57c per tonne for bagged and bulk cement, be continued until such time as the company receives a decision from the Secretary following an application by it either for a review of its allowed profitability rate or for a price adjustment, based on annualised accounts, to enable it to achieve its allowed rate of return, whichever of such applications is made the earlier.

DECISION

This group of books, magazines, and photographs **comes** before us on reference from the Magistrate's **Court** in Christchurch in proceedings under the Customs Act 1966. Because this matter has taken an unusual course over a longer time than **is customary it is proper that** before dealing **with** the items we should set out the background facts. We should say at once that these facts in no way influence our decision.

The information laid by the Collector of Customs at Christchurch allege importation on or about **28 August 1974**. **The** material was referred to us in October 1976 following a hearing in the Magistrate's Court on 12 October 1976. The matter was first set down for hearing before this Tribunal on 22 November 1976. **Mr** Maling sought an adjournment of that hearing which was granted. **Endeavours** were made to have a hearing on a number of occasions after that but as Mr Maling was unable to attend, no hearing was held. On 3 May 1977 a hearing was set down and submissions by the Customs Department were **presented** in writing to **us**. **Mr** Maling was again unable to attend, but by direction of the Tribunal the department's submissions were forwarded to him and he was invited to reply within 2 weeks. Following that hearing there has been a continuing correspondence with Mr Maling in our desire to give hi every opportunity to present submissions to us. Submissions were **finally** received from him on 31 October 1977. These comprise some five pages of submissions on one magazine and short submissions on four other books. On the other matters Mr Maling states that he has been unable to complete and type his submissions.

We consider that more than ample opportunity has been given to Mr Maling notwithstanding any health or other disability which may have impeded him. We therefore have considered the books and magazines on the material before us and make our finding on those and on our examination of the books and **magazines**.

We do not make any **finding** or decision on the photographs. The Tribunal's functions are limited to determination of the character and the classification of books, **which** by definition **include magazines and sound recordings**. Single photographs such as **these** are outside our functions and **authority** and the decision on those must remain with the Magistrate.

The first four items named are books. Mr Maling in his short submissions on these states:

"They are frankly pornographic. However that does not render them indecent."

They are simply a collection of sexual incidents put together in the form of a novel but with no attempt at either character or plot development. Having read them the Tribunal has no hesitation in finding each of them indecent.

Of the remaining items, three have already been considered by the Tribunal and found indecent. They are Mankind, No. 4, Decision 855 (New Zealand Gazette, 13 May 1976), Australian Golden Boys, Vol. I, No. 1, Decision 772 (New Zealand Gazette, 23 August 1973), and Q Q Magazine, March/April 1971, Vol. 3, No. 2, Decision 790 (New Zealand Gazette 4 April 1974). As he is entitled to do under section 18 (2) of the Indecent Publications Act 1963, Mr Maling challenges the previous decisions to which he was not a party and we must therefore reconsider them.

These remaining items consist entirely or almost entirely of photographs of naked young men photographed so as to emphasize the penis or consist of articles, photographs, and advertisements for homosexuals.

We have given careful consideration to the submissions made to us and have had regard to all the matters and considerations in section 11 of the Act. We have noted that two of the earlier decisions were made some years ago but do not feel that there has been any change in community standards in this area which leads us to any different view. We have also noted that these are importations of single copies and there appears to be no intention of distribution.

In the end we conclude as we did on similar publications and one identical in Decision 855, that the dominant effect of each is objectionable and injurious to the public good and without any redeeming merit on literary, artistic, scientific, or other grounds.

The Tribunal makes no decision on the 10 photographs. The Tribunal classifies each other book and magazine as indecent.

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month, the date of the first occurrence is given.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER 1977

General-Winds were predominantly westerly over New Zealand in December. However, although the mean temperature and total sunshine recorded during the month reflected the predominantly westerly wind flow, the total rainfall did not. This was because most of the rainfall was associated with three or four major troughs of low pressure moving over the country, and the rainfall was not evenly distributed throughout the month.

Low temperatures in many areas retarded crop growth. In most places the rainfall was adequate for good pasture growth, except in parts of South Canterbury and North Otago.

Rainfall—Over the country as a whole the December rainfall was a little above normal. However, in Northland, parts of Taranaki, South Westland, Fiordland, the Kaikoura coast, South Canterbury and North and Central Otago it was drier than normal though these areas generally had at least half their normal rainfall. In the remainder of the country the excess of rainfall above the normal exceeded 50 percent in only a few places, notable amongst them being in the vicinity of Gisborne (80 percent above) and Dunedin (130 percent above).

Temperatures—Apart from Poverty Bay and some east coast areas of the South Island temperatures were below normal over the whole country. The largest departures from normal were in Northland, Auckland, Waikato, Taranaki, Manawatu, Wellington, Buller and parts of Westland. In some parts of these regions the mean temperature was below normal by at least 1.0°C, and in some cases by more than 1.5°C.

Sunshine—Over the North Island the duration of bright sunshine was within 10 percent of the average value, except in the east of Northland where it was above normal by more than 20 percent. In the South Island the majority of the east coast had 10 to 20 percent more sunshine than usual, some stations in coastal Otago having 45 to 55 hours more than normal.

WEATHER SEQUENCE

The anticyclone which had become nearly stationary over New Zealand at the end of November, persisted until the 2nd of the month. The weather was fine over the whole of the country, with warm temperatures on the east coast of both the North and South Islands. A small depression had formed to the north of the country on the afternoon of the 2nd, and a cold front associated with a depression to the south of the country was moving towards the South Island.

Early on the 3rd the anticyclone had moved east away from New Zealand, and the depression to the north was moving slowly southeast. The cold front approaching the South Island moved slowly onto Southland. A small depression formed on the cold front in the North Tasman Sea but dissipated rapidly. Late on the 4th the depression to the north had moved away from the North Island and the cold front continued to cross the South Island. Showers, heavy in some places, were reported in Fiordland and Westland, and isolated showers were reported over most of the country as the front crossed both Islands.

On the 6th another cold front moved onto the South Island from the Tasman Sea and brought rain to the West Coast. A trough of low pressure near Tasmania was moving slowly towards New Zealand, with high pressures over the Australian continent. As the cold front, and later the trough of low pressure, moved across New Zealand on the 7th, 8th and 9th, most areas of the country reported rain, sometimes heavy on the West Coast. The anticyclone moved eastwards to pass to the north of the country on the 11th, and a depression with associated cold front moved quickly onto central New Zealand by the afternoon of the same day. Very heavy rain was recorded in Westland, Buller, Nelson, Marlborough and Wellington as the system crossed the country.

Early on the 12th another depression had moved on to the South Island bringing more heavy rain to Westland. The situation became complex on the 13th with a slow moving depression over the North Island, and ridges of high pressure to the south of the country extending from the Tasman Sea and from near the Chatham Islands. As the depression crossed the country on the 14th and 15th heavy rain was reported in Waikato, Hawke's Bay, Poverty Bay and Wairarapa. Temperatures were cold in most of the North Island during this period.

By the 16th the ridge of high pressure in the Tasman Sea had weakened and another trough of low pressure had moved east onto the South Island. There was a strong westerly flow onto the country with pressures high to the north and low to the south of New Zealand from the 17th to the 20th. Disturbances in this flow brought heavy rain to the West Coast, and lighter falls to many areas west of the ranges. Temperatures were very warm in Hawke's Bay and Canterbury. On the 21st an anticyclone had moved from the Tasman Sea onto New Zealand and this persisted until the 28th, when it started to move away to the east. Some areas of the North Island had showers during this period as a small depression formed on a nearly stationary front to the north of the country on

the 24th and moved slowly southeast to pass down the east coast of the North Island.

Late on the 28th a further depression formed on a cold front in the Tasman Sea and began to move southeast towards New Zealand. The anticyclone had moved further east by the 29th and a strong northerly flow was established between the two systems. The

depression and cold front crossed most of New Zealand on the 30th and brought widespread rain especially in the South Island. A very cold southerly flow behind the depression became established over the South Island on the 31st and there were showers in many places.
