 (c) Persons convicted of theft, burglary, receiving stolen goods, robbery, unlawful taking or conversion of a motor car or other vehicle, false pretences, forgery, utterings, possession of counterfeit coin, or assault;
 (d) Persons convicted of any offence under the Gaming Act 1908, or of any of the following offences under the Crimes Act 1961: murder, attempted murder, manslaughter (not based on negligence), sections 188-204 (which relate to assaults and injuries to the person), sections 294-297 (which relate to arson or attempt thereat), crimes involving dishonesty or conspiracy to commit a crime, indecent acts, sexual offences, and the reference to the foregoing Acts shall be deemed to apply to any subsequent Act consolidating or in substitution thereof; thereof;
- (e) Persons convicted of an offence against any of the paragraphs of subsection (1) of section 5 of the Narcotics Act 1965, or against any of the para-

In every other respect such revoked rules thereafter have no effect. 3. No person shall park a vehicle in Iwikau village except in a parking place.

(i) Six dollars per day or part of a day payable on the day of parking provided that the fee may in any case and in the Board's discretion be reduced to \$2.00 per day or part of a day if the fee has been prepaid; or alternatively;

(ii) Fifteen dollars for a season ticket;

and on payment of the prescribed fee the driver of the vehicle

shall be issued with a receipt.

5. A receipt for the proper parking fee issued for the vehicle concerned and current for the day of parking shall at all times during the season while such vehicle is parked in a parking place be displayed by the driver, on the windscreen in the case of vehicles equipped with a windscreen, but in all cases conspicuously and in a manner enabling it to be read from the front of the vehicle, provided that it shall be a good defence to a charge of a breach of this bylaw if the good defence to a charge of a breach of this bylaw if the driver produces to the secretary of the Board within 28 days of the alleged offence a receipt evidencing that the appropriate fee had at the proper time been paid for the vehicle concerned.

6. The driver shall not park a vehicle between the hours of 5 p.m. and 9 a.m. in parking places designated for day-

time parking only by a conspicuous official notice.
7. The driver of a vehicle shall park considerately and in a manner that will not obstruct the ingress and egress of other vehicles and shall comply with all directions as to parking given to the driver by an officer, and with all directions as to parking given by a conspicuous official notice.

8. The costs of towing and storage which are incurred by the Board, when in its sole discretion it is necessary to remove a vehicle to prevent the continuation of a breach of these bylaws, shall be paid by the driver of the vehicle within 28 days of being so requested.

9. On being informed of any breach of these bylaws alleged to have been committed by a driver of a vehicle and on being requested so to do by the Board or an officer, whether orally or in writing, the owner of that vehicle, and also in the case of a vehicle let on hire the person to whom it is let on hire shall, within 14 days after the receipt of the request, give to the Board all information which the owner or hirer may have or can obtain which may lead to the identification of the driver.

Amendment to the Rules of the Royal Society of New Zealand

SECTION A-ADMISSION AND DUTIES OF MEMBER BODIES

A1. Council shall consider applications for admission as member bodies from the following:

(a) any duly constituted organisation having declared objectives of promoting science as a whole within a region of New Zealand; and
(b) any duly constituted body of scientists which is active in promoting a branch of science on a national basis in New Zealand.

A2. When considering the merits of such applications, Council shall have regard for whether the applicant body:

(a) holds periodic meetings or conferences at which scientific papers are delivered or specific topics discussed in a scientific manner;

(b) publishes scientific research papers or reports;
 (c) assists or encourages visits by scientists from other parts of New Zealand or overseas;

(d) maintains a public museum, library or observatory; or (e) represents a majority of the professional scientists in the appropriate field working in New Zealand.

A3. Admission shall be by resolution carried by a two-thirds majority of Council members present at a meeting held as laid down in section C of these Rules.

A4. Council shall from time to time review the activities of member bodies and shall have power to discontinue affiliation of a member body which in its opinion has ceased to qualify for membership. Such disaffiliation shall be by resolution carried by a two-thirds majority of Council members as under A3. above.

A5. Each member body shall pay to the Society a membership fee not later than May 1 of each financial year. The fee shall be \$20 (NZ) or such greater sum as the Council may determine.

A6. Each member body shall send to the Society an annual report due on May 1 each year. This report shall list its activities during the year and include an audited statement of income and expenditure.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR APRIL 1978

General-During April pressures were below normal over the whole of New Zealand but higher to the east and north of the country. Winds were predominantly northerly over the whole country, stronger in the south than the north. The month was warm, but cloudy and wet in many areas especially east of the main ranges. Drought conditions were relieved in most areas with substantial rainfalls being recorded about the middle of the month, some places having more than 7 consecutive days with rain. Although grass growth improved during the month some farmers were still short of feed for stock. In some areas milk production ceased at the beginning of the month, 4 weeks earlier than usual. Stock was reported to be regaining condition after the long dry spell in most districts.

Rainfall-The only areas with rainfall totals below normal for the month were Poverty Bay, Southland, and parts of Northland, Central Districts of the North Island, Hawke's Bay, Westland, Mariborough, Otago, and inland Canterbury. Many parts of Mariborough, Kaikoura, and Canterbury had monthly rainfall totals of 200-300 percent above normal. At Spotswood (Canterbury) the total was more than 500 percent above normal. The majority of the heavy rain fell on the 16th/17th of the month. At Kaikoura 164 mm was measured in 12 hours, and 52 mm in 2 hours on the 17th. The worst hit area was around Cheviot where several roads were closed by slips and flood waters. The main north/ south railway line was closed on the afternoon of the 17th because of slips.

On the 13th/14th Greymouth experienced the worst flooding the town has had for many years. In the 12-hour period from midnight on the 13th to noon on the 14th nearly 214 mm was recorded. Almost 255 mm was measured in a 48-hour period from the 13th to 15th. Land slips and floodwaters cut communications, and railway lines were under water in many places. People were evacuated when flood waters entered homes and other homes were endangered by slips.

Temperatures—Unusually high minimum temperatures during the month were reflected by the higher than normal mean temperatures over the whole of New Zealand. Many areas were above average by at least 2°C, and in some parts of both the North and South Islands mean temperatures were above by more than 3°C. The greatest departure was 4°C at Reefton, the mean temperature

for the month being the highest recorded in any April since the station began in 1961. Temperatures were exceptionally high, especially on the east coast, during the period 5th to 7th.

Sunshine—The total sunshine hours recorded for the month were

below normal over the whole country, with the exception of a small area around Auckland which was slightly above. Stations in Taranaki, Wellington, Wairarapa, Nelson, Marlborough, West Coast, and Canterbury had 40-60 hours less sunshine than usual. Nelson and Blenheim had over 70 hours less sunshine than normal, the lowest April totals for over 40 years. Many districts had 5-7 days without sunshine during the prolonged wet spell from the 14th to 22nd.

WEATHER SEQUENCE

The cold front that had been lying across the South Island at the end of March continued to move northwards over New Zealand bringing rain to most areas of the country, heavy on the West Coast. By the 3rd the front had moved away to the north-east, and a ridge of high pressure extended onto the country from an anticyclone in the south Tasman Sea. A low pressure area had developed to the north-east of Tasmania, and had started to move slowly east towards New Zealand on the morning of the 4th. Temperatures were warmer than usual at the beginning of the month.

During the evening of the 4th a cold front, associated with the depression moving across the Tasman Sea, moved onto the South Island and this brought heavy rain to Fiordland and later Westland, with lighter falls elsewhere west of the main ranges and in Southland. The ridge of high pressure started to move slowly eastwards away from the country early on the 5th, and the depression in the Tasman Sea moved to the south of the country. Pressures were low in the north Tasman Sea early on the 6th, and an anticyclone moved east from near Tasmania to lie over New Zealand early on the 8th. A weak cold front crossed the South Island during the 8th, with light showers being reported in many areas of the South Island and parts of the North Island. The anticyclone persisted until the 11th when it started to move away from the country. The weather was fine over the majority of the country, with higher than normal temperatures for several days

On the 13th a depression which had developed near New Caledonia began to move south into the Tasman Sea. A frontal zone

associated with this depression moved onto the South Island bringing heavy rain to Fiordland and later Westland. The worst flooding for many years occurred in Greymouth on the 13th and 14th when 145 mm fell in 24 hours. As the depression moved southeast towards New Zealand it deepened and became slower moving, the centre lying to the west of the North Island until the 19th. The situation became complex early on the 20th with additional areas of low pressure forming to the west of the country, and the main depression centre moving to the east of New Zealand. The whole system did not move to the east of the country until early on the 23rd. During the period of the main depression's passage down the west coast of the North Island and across the country, heavy rain was reported in most areas of New Zealand. Many areas of the country had at least 7 consecutive days on which rain was recorded. Temperatures were warmer than usual until the 15th, but then cooler east of the main ranges until the 20th.

By the 24th a weak ridge of high pressure extended onto New Zealand from an anticyclone lying south-east of the country. A cold front associated with a depression moving south of the South Island moved onto Fiordland later on the 24th. Rain was recorded over most of the South Island, apart from Canterbury and Marl-

borough, during the passage of this front. Heavy falls were reported in both Fiordland and Westland.

The ridge of high pressure moved slowly east and a trough of low pressure in the Tasman Sea passed onto New Zealand early on the 26th. A depression in the north Tasman Sea had also moved towards New Zealand, and by the 27th was lying just to the west of the North Island. Heavy rain was recorded in Westland, Buller, Taranaki, Auckland, and Northland as the depression crossed the North Island. Most areas west of the main ranges and Poverty Bay experienced moderate falls. Temperatures were considerably higher than normal along the east coast of both Islands.

On the 29th a trough of low pressure had moved onto the South Island, with a ridge of high pressure extending onto the north of the North Island from the Tasman Sea. Pressures were low over the greater part of New Zealand until the end of the month, with the anticyclone to the west becoming almost stationary. Hawke's Bay was the only area in the country that did not record some rain at the end of the month.
