STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

THE general accounting principles recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of results on an historical basis have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

The particular accounting principles which the Bank considers appropriate for the measurement of profit and financial position are detailed below.

1. *Revenue*—

- (a) Interest accrued on investments has been taken into account.
(b) Personal loans—The Rule of 78 has been used in determining interest accrued.

2. *Depreciation*—Calculation has been made on basis of Inland Revenue Department rates. First year depreciation and special depreciation have been claimed where applicable. Straight line basis for calculation of depreciation has not been adopted as it is considered the difference in the amount of depreciation would not be material.

3. *New Zealand Government Stock*—In accordance with established policy New Zealand Government stock has been shown at face value. Prior to 1 April 1975 certain parcels of New Zealand Government stock were purchased at a discount.

4. *Taxation*—No provision has been made for deferred taxation.

WE, the undersigned, being the Auditors of the Southland Savings Bank, appointed in terms of section 29 (3) of the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948, report—

1. That we have examined the books, accounts, and vouchers of the Bank and have received all the information and explanations we have required.

2. We have verified the cash, investments, securities, and assets of the Bank as at 31 March 1978.

3. The General Manager has certified that to the best of his knowledge and belief, all requirements of the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948, and regulations thereunder, have been complied with.

This edition includes a new and extra caution on page 9 to illustrate the effect on tidal streams and the perchable increase in associated wave heights to be anticipated during spring tides at those irregular intervals when the moon comes closest to the earth. This caution will be of particular interest to the owners and navigators of small craft likely to be affected by strong tidal streams.

An additional 18 new places have been added to the list of secondary ports for which tidal information is now available.

A compact and valuable publication which should be held by all persons with an interest in the New Zealand coastline and adjacent waters.

Paremata Barracks were built during the Maori Wars when incidents reached down to Cook Strait during the early days of settlement in Wellington which was then Port Nicholson.

The report of a study of the biological and social effects on perinatal mortality in New Zealand which was prepared for the Health Statistics of the World Health Organisation. Seven other countries presented similar reports to the WHO.

This New Zealand data prepared for the international study provides very useful information, previously unavailable, about New Zealand.

THE PLANNING AND CONTROL OF GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES

Records some of the improvements in management systems that have been made within the Government in recent years to help Ministers, members of Parliament, and public servants deal with the problem of planning and controlling expenditure. (The Treasury.)

PLANTS IN NEW ZEALAND POISONOUS TO MAN*By Jose Stewart. Revised by H. E. Connor*

39 p. 1975. \$2.25

This revised edition of Mrs Stewart's book, which was first published in 1964, is a handy colourful guide to the 50 or more plants in New Zealand known or suspected to be toxic to man. The plants are listed in alphabetical order by their common names and each entry has a colour photograph identifying the poisonous part of the plant. The botanical name, a general description of the plant, the toxin, and the symptoms of poisoning are also given. Plants that are toxic if eaten, and touch irritants are dealt with in separate sections. A general instruction on what to do if poisoning occurs or is suspected is featured prominently at the beginning of the book for ready access in emergency. The material in the booklet is useful, succinct, and attractively presented. Although it has wide appeal generally, it is particularly valuable to parents of the young and curious.

POISONOUS PLANTS IN NEW ZEALAND*By H. E. Connor*

247 p., 16 colour plates, line drawings by Nancy M. Adams 1977, second revised edition \$9.75

This enlarged and revised edition of the book, first published 25 years ago describes and illustrates the plants in New Zealand that are poisonous.

Details are given on the frequency of poisoning, the toxins and the clinical signs that result when these plants are eaten or touched.

Invaluable for veterinarians, hospital casualty officers, botanists, farm advisers, farmers, and parents. Well illustrated. Includes glossary, references, and index.

POLICIES FOR REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN NEW ZEALAND*Edited by G. A. Town*

124 p. \$3.50

In this book, the authors discuss the criteria which they feel should determine any sound policies in the field of regional planning and development. Although many different points of view are presented, there is unanimity that economic considerations alone should not dictate future policy. Essentially, it is for New Zealanders to consider all the relevant factors and decide what pattern of development they wish to see emerge. This book is intended as a constructive contribution to the public debate currently under way. Series No. 17. (New Zealand Institute of Public Administration.)

POPULATION AND MIGRATION 1975-77 PART A--POPULATION

In addition, total crude birth and death rates and the latest available age and sex distribution of the total population are provided.

The title for this book was provided by Nopera Panakarero, a Kaitiaki chief of much influence, who, in May 1840, believed that only the "shadow of the land" had gone to Queen Victoria whilst the substance remained with the Maoris. Less than a year later he revised this opinion convinced that only the "shadow" would be the Maori portion.

The author examines the British acquisition of New Zealand. The Maoris trust in the Treaty of Waitangi and their confidence that its terms would be honoured and explains it was only by accident that the Maoris were guaranteed the possession of their lands and ancient privileges.

It is under these circumstances that the book considers the use of military force in New Zealand, analyses the arguments surrounding the provision of troops and concludes that, beyond any reasonable doubt that there was never an attempt to govern by "moral suasion".

New Zealand followed the normal nineteenth century British pattern of territorial acquisition.

The book is an essential introduction to the Maori wars of a later date.
