## The Complaint-

Mr C. C. Werry, of Waipukurau, has complained about a 20-second film sponsored on TV Two by Leopard Breweries

By the device of a three stage zoom the viewer is rapidly transported from a high angle view of broad coastline to a close up of rubbish on the beach with a clean Leopard Export beer can prominently exposed. The sound track runs, "Our beautiful coastline—Yours to enjoy—don't throw

it away.'

contrasting shot in white animated line on black shows a kiwi dropping an outline can into a litter basket. The words, "Be a tidy Kiwi"

Synchronise with this. Then follows a white caption saying, "Only lazy people litter," reinforced by the same information on the sound track. The caption is then supplemented with a coloured Leopard logo and a line of type,

"A Leopard Breweries Community Service."

## Decision-

1. The Tribunal is satisfied that the film constitutes an advertisement for the Leopard Export brand of beer.

The advertisement rules which applied at the time of the complaint prohibit any advertisement which, directly or by implication, is designed to promote the general consumption of alcoholic beverages. The rule sets out the conditions under which advertisements for alcohol may be made and broadcast. Advertisements must not use brand names as such

The advertisement clearly falls within the definition of an advertisement under the rules and is clearly in breach of those rules.

2. On 1 July, Broadcasting Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3, imposed in every warrant a condition "that the holder of the warrant shall not broadcast any programme that promotes the consumption of liquor, being a programme

for which payment is made for that purpose to the holder

of the warrant, whether in money or otherwise."

Leopard Breweries have paid for this advertisement which we find is a "programme that promotes the consumption of liquor". The advertisement is therefore in breach of the conditions imposed in TV 2's warrants by the regulation.

Co-opted Members

Under section 61 the Tribunal is required to co-opt two persons whose qualifications or experience are likely in the opinion of the Tribunal to be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with a complaint. The Tribunal co-opted Mr S. H. Gardiner and Mr G. C. Ell who took part in the hearing and in the deliberations of the Tribunal. However the decision, in accordance with the Act, is that of the permanent members

Constable Kerry James BORROWS, New Zealand Police. Constable Gerard PRINS, New Zealand Police.

At about 7.40 p.m. on 2 April 1978 a 22-year-old man, who was in an extremely emotional state after a domestic dispute, left his Miramar home armed with a .308 Brno rifle and a .303 calibre rifle, and ammunition for both. He fired a shot at a passing motor cyclist but just missed him. He then shot and killed an 18-year-old youth who was innocently sitting at a lighted window talking on the telephone. He then fired shots at a woman and at the murdered youth's mother but missed both. Further down the road he discarded the .303 rifle and ammunition.

Constables Borrows and Prins were on patrol duty. Both were unarmed, and although aware that a person had been shot, the circumstances surrounding the incident were unknown to them. On sighting the offender they approached him and, despite being threatened, attempted to apprehend him.

Inspector Huggard arrived on the scene, approached the offender and was warned that he would be shot if he came closer. The offender then released the safety catch of the rifle in an attempt to stall Inspector Huggard who, with complete disregard for his own safety, lunged at the offender, knocking the firearm aside and pushing him to the ground.

The rifle, on later inspection, contained five live rounds of ammunition in the magazine. It is evident that further loss of life would have resulted if Inspector Huggard had not taken the action he did. He displayed outstanding courage.

The manner in which this extremely dangerous situation was handled by Inspector Huggard and Constables Borrows and Prins is in the highest traditions of the New Zealand Police

- (2) The average of a trading bank's holdings of Reserve Bank notes for a calendar month shall be the average of the figures shown in all weekly returns of Banking Statistics by that trading bank under the Statistics Act 1975 received during that calendar month.
- (3) The average of a trading bank's balances at the Reserve Bank and holdings of New Zealand Government securities for a calendar month shall in each case be the average of the figures for balances and such securities held by that trading bank on each day during that calendar month.
- (4) Government securities held by a trading bank shall consist of Government stock and Treasury bills (all at nominal value) held by that trading bank.
- (5) The average demand deposit liabilities and the average time deposit liabilities of a trading bank in a calendar month shall, in each case, be the average of the figures for days within that calendar month, as shown in that trading bank's weekly returns of Banking Statistics under the Statistics Act 1975.

## WEATHER NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER 1978

General-Pressures were above normal over most of New Zealand during September, and exceptionally high to the east and south of the country. Winds were considerably lighter than usual throughof the country. Winds were considerably lighter than usual throughout the month. At Paraparaumu no gusts of over 34 knots were reported, and this has never occurred before in September since records began in 1948. Cloudy conditions prevailed over most of the country with parts of Canterbury and Otago experiencing their fourth consecutive month with rainfall well above normal. Hydro storage levels were nearly 70 percent of the normal capacity in the South Island. Temperatures were slightly cooler than usual east of the main ranges. Most farmers reported that more supplies and the main ranges. Most farmers reported that more sunshine and warmer temperatures were needed to improve grass growth. Lambing progressed well in the North Island, but in parts of Canterbury losses were high in some areas because of the wet conditions. Other stock was said to be in good condition.

Rainfall—Rainfall was slightly above normal in parts of Northland, Auckland, Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay and the Wellington area. In the South Island the only areas with totals below normal were parts of Nelson, Westland, inland Otago and most of Southland. The greatest departures were in Canterbury, where many stations recorded more than 200 percent above their usual September totals. At Methven 242 mm were recorded during the month, and this was more than 370 percent of normal. Most of the heavy rain fell a sout the middle and last week of the month. At Highbank Power Station 46 mm were recorded in 12 hours on the 16th, and in 48 hours from the afternoon of the 15th nearly 87 mm.

The four months from June to September have been exceptionally wet in parts of inland Canterbury. One of the worst affected areas has been mar Hororata where more than 500 mm have been measured in this period, the normal value for these four months being about 240 mm. The only access to many farms on the clay foothills is by foot or horseback, and one farmer was unable to use his four wheel drive vehicle to cross paddocks during September.

Temperatures-Temperatures were below normal in parts of Northland, Bay of Plenty, Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay, Wairarapa and most of the South Island east of the main ranges. The greatest departures of nearly 1°C below were in Hawke's Bay and inland Canterbury. Areas of Taranaki, Nelson and Westland were above normal by about ½°C to 1°C.

Sunshine—The only areas with sunshine hours above normal were parts of Northland, Taranaki and Southland. In Bay of Plenty, Hawke's Bay, Wairarapa, Nelson, Marlborough and Canterbury the month's totals were below normal by 40 to 50 hours. At Hanmer only 95 hours were measured. This is the lowest recorded at this station in September since the station began in 1930,

## WEATHER SEQUENCE SEPTEMBER 1978

The cold front which had been moving northwards over New Zealand at the end of August was lying across Northland at the beginning of the month. A ridge of high pressure extended onto the country from the Tasman Sea and on the 2nd an anticyclone had moved onto New Zealand. This anticyclone persisted until the morning of the 6th, and brought fine weather to most of the country, apart from some isolated showers in eastern districts of the North Island. Temperatures were cooler than usual over most of the country during the first week of the month, but slightly warmer in Southland and Otago from the 4th to the 8th.

During the afternoon of the 7th a weak cold front moved across the South Island, and isolated showers were reported in parts of Fiordland and Westland. Disturbances in a moist northwest flow onto the country brought rain to many areas west of the main ranges on the 8th. Heavy falls were recorded in Westland, more than 60 mm in 24 hours. By the evening of the 8th a warm front associated with a depression in the Tasman Sea had moved onto the South Island. Early on the 9th the cold front ahead of this depression had also moved onto New Zealand. As this system moved slowly across the country from the 9th to the 11th many areas in both Islands had moderate to heavy falls, the greatest being on the West Coast and in the Wellington district. More than 100 mm was recorded in the 24 hours to 9 a.m. on the 9th in Westland, and in excess of 50 mm the following day. Temperatures were warmer than usual on the east coast of the North Island on the 10th and 11th.

By the evening of the 11th a weak ridge of high pressure extended onto the country, and pressures had fallen to the south of Tasmania as a depression developed. This depression moved to the south of New Zealand, and the cold front associated with it moved onto the South Island on the 13th, bringing heavy rain to most of the country as it crossed slowly eastwards. Twenty-four hour falls

of between 30 and 50 mm occurred in Waikato, Bay of Plenty, Taranaki, Wellington, Canterbury and the West Coast. On the 17th/19th a small depression with associated cold front moved eastwards from the Tasman Sea and crossed the North Island. Heavy rain was recorded in Northland and Auckland with moderate falls in many areas in the northern half of the North Island. Isolated showers were also reported along the east coast of the South Island. Temperatures were cold in Canterbury, Otago and Southland on the 19th.

A depression developed in the north Tasman Sea on the 19th and began to move slowly southeast towards New Zealand. A ridge of high pressure covered most of the country until the 22nd when it moved eastwards. The depression moved to the north of the North Island, and a trough of low pressure moved onto the South Island early on the 23rd. Rain was recorded in most areas of the West Coast. Another depression had formed off the Australian coast on the 23rd, and by the 24th had moved rapidly towards New Zealand and was lying to the west of the North Island. A warm front associated with this depression brought heavy rain to the West Coast, some areas recording more than 150 mm in the 24 hours up to 9 a.m. on the 24th. As the depression crossed the North Island parts of Northland, Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Taranaki and Wellington had falls in excess of 30 mm in 24 hours.

On the 26th a weak ridge of high pressure covered most of the country and a depression developed to the south of Australia and started to move east. By the 28th this depression was lying to the west of the South Island and the ridge had moved away from New Zealand. The cold front ahead of this depression moved northwards over the country, bringing rain to most areas west of the main ranges. Temperatures were considerably colder than normal on the east coast of both Islands from the 25th to the 27th.

On the 29th and 30th a ridge of high pressure covered the country, but isolated showers were reported in many areas.

Special attention is given also to the relationship between the school and the community, the need for close mutual support and co-operation, including understanding and respect for minority cultures.

A key to the quality of education is the people involved in it. Teacher education, the availability of advisory and ancillary staff, as well as resources for materials and research, have a chapter devoted to them.

Since education is seen as a lifelong activity, this is considered at some length. Facets such as accessibility, transfer of credits, and the role of existing institutions are discussed, together with ways in which continuing education could be provided for the whole community.

In discussing the administration and organisation of education the principle followed is the maximum devolution of authority and responsibility to the agencies and the community, at for instance, school committee and district level.

Acknowledged to be one of the finest of the native races within the British Commonwealth they have long been celebrated for their splendid physical appearance, their proud bearing, their aristocratic spirit, their fluent oratory, and above all for their prowess in war. This book contains an account of the social and economic organisation of the Maori people before the organisation was transformed by contact with Western civilisation. It is a major scientific contribution to economic anthropology and has now become a standard work.
