PURSUANT to the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the Otago Catchment District and included in the Waitaki Catchment Area.

PURSUANT to section 8A of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

ORDER

1. (a) This order may be cited as the Urewera National Park Board Lake Waikaremoana Waters Control Order 1979.

(b) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this order:

"The Act" means the Harbours Act 1950;

"The Board" means the Urewera National Park Board;

"Minister" means the Minister of Transport and includes any officer, person or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the board for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, the control of waters described in the First Schedule to this order, subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, and to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL the waters of Lake Waikaremoana situated in the Gisborne land district and containing 5210 hectares, more or less, and being all that land comprised and described in a freehold order of the Maori Land Court, dated the 6th day of June 1918, and registered in the provisional register, volume IB, folio 861, Gisborne Registry.

SECOND SCHEDULE

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers of the Government service acting in the execution of their duties shall, at all times, have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the waters described in the First Schedule to this order without payment.

2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the board to do, or cause to be done, anything repugnant to or inconsistent with, any law relating to the customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder that are, or may hereafter, be in force.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the board for and within the area of the waters described in the First Schedule hereto:

- (a) May by bylaw do anything which a harbour board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act;
- (b) May appoint officers and define or limit their powers or duties; and
- (c) Shall administer such regulations made pursuant to the Act as are applicable.

4. Bylaws made by the board under the authority of this Order in Council shall not come into force until they have been approved by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette*.

5. The said rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities may at any time be resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the board 6 calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the board in New Zealand.

Bulk supply at a nominal voltage of 33 000 volts and 11 000 volts shall be received from the Electricity Division of the Ministry of Energy's substations located near Kaikohe and Kaitaia, respectively, or from such other additional point or points of supply as may be arranged between the Minister of Energy and the licensee.

5. The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (j) of regulation 15 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1976. The primary distribution voltages shall be 33 000 volts and 11 000 volts between phases in the case of the system described in paragraph (f), and 11 000 volts between conductors in the case of the system described in paragraph (e). The system of supply authorised under paragraph (j) shall be a single conductor earth return system and the primary distribution voltages shall be 11 000 volts and 6350 volts between the conductor and the earth and the use of this system shall be subject to such terms and conditions as are from time to time laid down by the General Manager of the Electricity Division of the Ministry of Energy. The secondary distribution voltage shall be 400 volts between phases and 230 volts between any phase and neutral in the case of the three-phase four-wire system of supply, and 460 volts between outer conductors and 230 volts between each outer conductor and the middle conductor in the case of the three-wire system of supply, and 230 volts between conductors in the case of the two-wire system of supply.

6. This licence shall be deemed to come into force on the 1st day of April 1979 and shall continue in force for a period of 21 years from that date unless it is sooner lawfully determined.

Notice to Make Returns of Land Under the Land Tax Act 1976

PURSUANT to the Land Tax Act 1976, the Commissioner of Inland Revenue hereby gives notice as follows:

(1) A return of land held as at noon on 31 March 1979 is required from every person and company, whether a taxpayer or not, being the owner of land in New Zealand within the meaning of the Land Tax Act 1976, if the total land value as at noon 31 March 1979 exceeded \$175,000 and the land is not of the classes specified in paragraph (3) below.

(2) Land tax is dealt with by the Masterton office of the department and returns may be sent there or to any district office of the Inland Revenue Department, not later than 7 May 1979.

(3) Returns of land are not required for classes of land used solely or principally for the purposes of a business of:

- Animal husbandry (including poultry-keeping, and the breeding of horses); or
- Growing fruit, vegetables, or other crop-producing plants; or
- Horticulture; or
- Viticulture.

Provided that the exemption in this paragraph shall not extend to land used for the purposes of a racecourse, within the meaning of the Racing Act 1974, or to land used solely or principally for the purpose of forestry or silviculture.

(4) Return forms are available at all district offices of the Inland Revenue Department.

(5) Any person or company failing to furnish a return within the prescribed time is liable to a fine not exceeding \$500.

Exchange Rates

IN terms of section 25 (2) of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank today released outer limits for rates of exchange to be used in transactions involving the conversion of New Zealand currency into foreign currencies and foreign currencies into New Zealand currency when delivery of the foreign currency dealt in will be effected by telegraphic transfer. The following range of rates, for the main currencies used by New Zealand traders in settling foreign exchange transactions, will remain in force until replaced by a new schedule issued by the Reserve Bank. These rates do not apply to transactions for settlement after the expiration of two business days (forward transactions) or to transactions in which instruments are purchased which do not entitle the buyer to foreign currency balances in the foreign centre until the instruments have been delivered at the foreign centre. In the latter case interest at foreign centre rates may be deducted from the telegraphic transfer rate to compensate the purchaser for his loss during the transit period.

Where the extremes of temperature and rainfall have occurred more than once during the month, the date of the first occurrence is given.

WEATHER NOTES FOR JANUARY 1979

General—Pressures were slightly above normal over the North Island, but exceptionally low to the south of New Zealand during January. Winds were mainly westerly, stronger in the south than the north of the country, most of the country had warm, dry, sunny conditions, apart from areas on the West Coast, Otago, and Southland which were cooler and wetter than normal. Many farmers in the North Island reported that the continuing dry weather had affected grass growth and reduced dairy production by as much as 25 percent, some farmers only milking once a day. Conditions were good for haymaking, producing good crops in most areas.

Rainfall—The only areas with rainfall above normal for the month were parts of Westland, Fiordland, Otago, and Southland. Some districts in Southland were above by more than 150 percent. In parts of Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Hawke's Bay, Taranaki, Wairarapa, Wellington and Canterbury, many stations recorded less than 25 percent of their normal month's total. Some inland stations in Bay of Plenty and southern Hawke's Bay had less than 5 percent of their usual January rainfall. At Rangitaiki no rainfall was recorded throughout the month. At Christchurch Airport only 9 mm were measured, and this is the lowest recorded there in January since 1954 (8 mm).

A partial state of emergency was declared in Mātaura on the 27th when the Waimumu stream threatened to overflow its banks. Continuous heavy rain on the 26th and 27th caused many rivers in Southland to rise rapidly. The Te Anau-Milford road was closed, and the railway line between Dipton and Benmore was scoured out in places. At Gore 84 mm were recorded from 5 p.m. on the 26th to 9 a.m. on the 28th.

Temperatures—The only areas with below normal temperatures were the West Coast, Otago and Southland, where deficits were as much as 1°C to 1°C. Over the rest of New Zealand mean temperatures were above normal by at least 1°C. In some eastern districts of both islands they were above by 1½°C to 2°C.

On the 11th temperatures were considerably higher than usual in Poverty Bay and Hawke's Bay. The maximum temperature of 38.1°C recorded at Gisborne was the highest January temperature since the station began in 1938. Christchurch Airport recorded a maximum of 35.9°C on the 21st, and this has not been exceeded in January since measurements began there in 1954.

At Wairoa (Hawke's Bay) there were 7 days in the month with maximum temperatures above 30°C.

Sunshine—Sunshine hours were above normal over the whole country apart from the West Coast where they were slightly below. Many areas had between 30 and 60 hours more sunshine than usual. At Gisborne Airport a total of 316 hours was recorded and this is the highest January total since the station began. One of the largest departures above normal occurred at Christchurch Airport which had more than 30 percent excess, and the highest January total since 1957 for that station.

WEATHER SEQUENCE

At the beginning of January pressures were high in the Tasman Sea, with a ridge of high pressure extending onto the North Island. Early on the 2nd a cold front moved onto the South Island and brought heavy rain to the West Coast. Parts of Fiordland and Westland recorded more than 90 mm in 24 hours and there were moderate falls throughout the country as the front moved northwards. Temperatures were warmer than normal over most of

New Zealand. In Canterbury, Hawke's Bay and Poverty Bay by more than 6°C. By the 4th the anticyclone in the Tasman Sea had moved onto the country, but disturbances in the southwest airstream ahead of this system brought showers to some areas in both islands.

The anticyclone persisted until the morning of the 8th, when a cold front associated with a depression to the south of New Zealand moved onto the South Island. Moderate rain was reported in Fiordland, but as the front crossed the country it weakened, and only isolated showers were recorded in most districts. A warm front was moving towards the South Island during the afternoon of the 9th and this was followed by a cold front early on the 10th. As these fronts crossed the country, exceptionally heavy rain was recorded in Fiordland, Westland and parts of Southland. At Milford Sound more than 350 mm was measured in the 48 hours up to 9 a.m. on the 11th. Isolated showers were reported in parts of Wellington and Taranaki. Temperatures were very warm along the east coasts of both the North and South Islands on the 8th.

On the 12th the cold front had weakened and moved onto the North Island, and a further cold front had crossed onto the South Island. As this front moved northwards moderate falls were recorded throughout most of the country. Temperatures were very warm in Poverty Bay and Hawke's Bay on the 11th. Some stations in both districts recorded their highest ever maximum temperatures. Pressures were high over the North Island on the 14th, and low to the south of the country as a depression moved towards the South Island. Further heavy rain was recorded on the West Coast as the depression moved across Southland early on the 15th, and a cold front crossed the South Island. Light to moderate rain was reported throughout the southern half of the North Island.

An anticyclone had moved onto New Zealand by the afternoon of the 16th and covered the country until the morning of the 18th. Pressures were low to the north of New Zealand as a depression of tropical origin moved southwards towards the country.

A cold front moved across the South Island later on the 18th, rain being reported in Westland, Fiordland and parts of Southland. The depression north of the North Island weakened and moved west into the north Tasman Sea. A front associated with this depression did bring some moderate to heavy rain to Northland. By the 20th an anticyclone had moved onto New Zealand, and this brought fine weather to most of the country until early on the 26th. A few showers were reported on the West Coast and in parts of the North Island during this period.

Early on the 26th a cold front associated with a depression moving to the south of New Zealand passed onto the South Island. This was followed by another active cold front late on the 27th. Heavy rain was measured in Fiordland in the 48 hours up to 9 a.m. on the 28th. In parts of Southland flooding occurred when rivers overflowed their banks. Most of the South Island had moderate falls and in the North Island lighter falls were recorded west of the main ranges. Temperatures were very warm in Poverty Bay, Hawke's Bay, Wairarapa and Canterbury on the 27th and 28th.

On the 29th an anticyclone moved onto the country from the Tasman Sea, and this remained over New Zealand until the end of the month, most of the country having fine weather. On the 31st a weak cold front crossed the South Island, and some light rain was reported in Fiordland and Southland.

This revised edition of Mrs Stewart's book, which was first published in 1964, is a handy colourful guide to the 50 or more plants in New Zealand known or suspected to be toxic to man. The plants are listed in alphabetical order by their common names and each entry has a colour photograph identifying the poisonous part of the plant. The botanical name, a general description of the plant, the toxin, and the symptoms of poisoning are also given. Plants that are toxic if eaten, and touch irritants are dealt with in separate sections. A general instruction on what to do if poisoning occurs or is suspected is featured prominently at the beginning of the book for ready access in emergency. The material in the booklet is useful, succinct, and attractively presented. Although it has wide appeal generally, it is particularly valuable to parents of the young and curious.
