Altering the Boundaries of the West Coast and Buller Electric Power Districts

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, I, Sir Keith Jacka Holyoake, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby alter the boundaries of the West Coast and Buller Electric Power Districts by excluding the area, described in the First Schedule hereto, from the Buller Electric Power District, and by including that area in the West Coast Electric Power District, and further, I hereby declare that the boundaries of the West Coast and Buller Electric Power Districts, shall be those described in the Second and Third Schedules hereto respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Nelson Land District, Buller County, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the southern and westerly boundaries of Block III, Inangahua District, and proceeding northerly along the western boundary of Section III, Inangahua Survey District, to its northernmost point thence northerly along the western boundary of Block XVI, Orikaka Survey District, to a point due west of the northern boundary of Section 2, Block XVI, aforesaid, thence easterly to the boundary of that section at its westernmost point; thence generally southerly along the western boundary of the said Section 2, the northern and western boundaries of Section 15, Block XVI, aforesaid, the western boundary of Section 11, Block XVI, aforesaid, and the northern and western boundaries of Section 8, Block III, Inangahua District to its south western corner, thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of the said Section 8, and Section 10, Block III, aforesaid, and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the middle of the Buller River; thence generally south westerly down the middle of that river to the northern boundary of Block VI Inangahua Survey District, thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said Block VI, to the point of commencement. The Auckland Regional Authority Foreshore and Waters Control Order 1979

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 17th day of April 1979.

THE RT. HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 8A and 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (a) This order may be cited as the Auckland Regional Authority Foreshore and Waters Control Order 1979.

(b) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this order:

"the Act" means the Harbours Act 1950;

"the authority" means the Auckland Regional Authority;

"foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore or banks of the tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tide;

"Minister" means the Minister of Transport and includes any officer, person or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the authority for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order; subject to the provisions of sections 8A and 165 of the Act and to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule to this order, the control of the foreshore, waters, and sea bed as described in the First Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL those areas of foreshore, sea bed, and waters adjacent to the Tawharanui Peninsula on the east coast of the County of Rodney, bounded by a line commencing at mean high water at Pukenihihi Point and proceeding due north for a distance of 800 metres, thence proceeding initially in a south east direction and continuing along a line 800 metres from high-water mark ordinary spring tide until it reaches a line drawn due north from the unnamed prominent point approximately at the 174° 52' East meridian, thence due south along that line until it reaches a distance of 200 metres from mean high-water mark thence proceeding initially in a south easterly direction and continuing along the line to 200 metres from mean high-water mark ordinary spring tide until it meets a line drawn due south from Matatuaha Point thence due north along that line to mean high-water mark ordinary spring tide at Matatuaha Point, thence along mean high-water mark ordinary spring tide, initially in a north eastward direction and proceeding along that mark to the point of commencement, as more particularly shown on plan numbered MD 15939, and deposited in the office of the Ministry of Transport at Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the areas described in the First Schedule to this order without payment.

2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the authority to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the customs or with any regulations made thereunder that are or may hereafter be enforced.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this order in council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore and sea bed required for the securing of the shore end of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the area described in the First Schedule to this order.

4. The authority may enclose any part or parts of the areas described in the First Schedule to this order for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games or may by resolution fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts: provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the authority to remove or cause to be removed any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister first being obtained.

6. Suitably worded signs shall be erected at main public access ways to the foreshore, sea bed and waters as described in the First Schedule to this order indicating that control has been granted to the authority pursuant to sections 8A and 165 of the Act and that bylaws are in force.

7. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the authority for and within the area of water described in the First Schedule to this order:

- (a) May by bylaw do anything which a harbour board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act.
- (b) May appoint harbourmasters and other officers and define or limit their powers and duties.

8. All money received by the authority in respect of the Tawharanui Peninsula in exercise or performance of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities conferred on it by this order, shall, subject to the deduction of any expenditure incurred by the authority in exercise or performance of those powers, functions, duties, and authority may be applied to the improvement of facilities in or in respect of the reserve and not otherwise.

9. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the authority 6

calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the authority in New Zealand.

It is not a dictionary in the ordinary sense but is rather an encyclopaedia with pictures and photographs which describes and explains almost every facet of human sexuality.

It is obviously a serious and sensible publication which in a careful and accurate way but with good humour provides a great deal of information on sexual matters generally.

While some parts of the text and illustrations in isolation might be considered indecent the book as a whole displays an honesty of purpose and a dominant effect of instruction and explanation. Having considered all the matters which the Tribunal is required to have regard to under section II of the Act, the Tribunal is of the view that the book deals with sex in a manner that is not injurious to the public good, and that in this case there is no need to make any age restriction.

Anais Nin, who died in 1977, was born of mixed Spanish and French parentage, spent part of her formative years in the United States and did most of her writing in English. She lived in France between the two world wars, and returned to America at the beginning of World War II. She is known for several novels, poems, and other literary works, and a multi-volume diary covering some 35 years. She could be described as a minor literary figure of the 20th century, but of particular interest to feminists. The stories collected in *Delta of Venus* were written in 1940-41, at a time she and a group of her friends were hard up in New York and had an opportunity to write frankly erotic stories for the money. In spite of this genesis, the stories are easily distinguished from run-of-the-mill pornography by their literary character. This is illustrated both by the style and by the characterisation of the persons whose stories they tell: they are real individuals, not simply puppets who proceed straight from one lurid sexual adventure to the next. There is certainly frankness in the description of sexual encounters, and for this reason we place an age restriction on the book, which should certainly otherwise be available. The Tribunal classifies *Delta of Venus* as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

This magazine was privately imported into New Zealand, seized by Customs and comes before us on a disputed forfeiture.

The magazine is published in the United States bi-monthly and is somewhat similar in general style to the *Playboy* and *Penthouse* type except that as its title suggests it is a homosexual magazine. It includes a number of photographs of naked males and a number of articles which are predominantly homosexual.

This is not a publication which falls within the categories set out in the 1968 "Waverley" decisions but falls, to be considered, in the category of magazines such as the two mentioned above and other similar ones which have come before the Tribunal. We think however that the homosexual emphasis and the approval of homosexual activity, which is criminal in New Zealand, affect the whole consideration of this magazine. Taking into account all the matters set out in

section 11 of the Act with particular consideration of the effect of the magazine as a whole we conclude that it is indecent.

The Tribunal therefore classifies this magazine as indecent.

DECISION

This group of publications comprises four magazines and a manufacturer's catalogue.

All are published in the United States and are almost wholly concerned with the use, sale and purchase, cultivation, and distribution of various kinds of drugs. The magazines contain a number of articles about matters of interest to drug users and advertisements of accessories and equipment for keeping, using, and growing drugs. The catalogue has no text but is a photographic display, with prices and directions for purchase, of equipment for drug users.

The dominant effect of the magazines is the approval and encouragement of the use of all kinds of drugs with passing reference to methods and equipment to avoid detection. While not all that is contained in these magazines could be said to be indecent under the Act the effect as a whole in each and every case is to describe, depict, or otherwise deal with matters of crime in New Zealand in a manner which the Tribunal considers is injurious to the public good.

Having considered all the matters under section 11 there is not any sufficient redeeming feature in these magazines to qualify the decision as to indecency under the Act.

There are more than three issues of this magazine before us, all published within a period of 12 months and it is appropriate that there should be a serial publication restriction order.

Glass Head we consider to be in a different category. While it is intended to encourage purchase of articles for using drugs, it is in itself, as a photographic display, innocent. Purchases or attempted purchases through its means might well be criminal but the effect of the catalogue as a publication appears to us to be not injurious to the public good and not an affront to commonly accepted standards of decency.

The Tribunal therefore classifies *Glass Head* as not indecent and classifies each issue of *High Times* as indecent. In respect of *High Times* it makes a restriction order under section 15A of the Act for a period of 2 years applying to every issue of that publication each issue to be treated as indecent.

Decision of the Films Censorship Board of Review

IN the matter of the Cinematograph Films Act 1976, and in the matter of an application by Twentieth Century Fox Film Corporation (N.Z.) Ltd., for a review of the feature film "The Pom Pom Girls".

THE FILMS CENSORSHIP BOARD OF REVIEW

Messrs A. B. Beatson, S.M. (chairman), W. Colgan, R. Tanner, Dr R. A. Sharp, Mrs M. T. Cole, Professor E. M. Dalziel, C.B.E. (Mrs V. Forbes, was absent).

Review: 2 March 1979.

DECISION

The board conducted a review of the film *The Pom Pom Girls* on the application of the distributor on 2 March 1979 pursuant to the powers vested in it by section 84 (5) of the Cinematograph Films Act 1976 and the Cinematograph Films Regulations 1977 section 11 (2) (e). No submissions were made on behalf of the distributor and the Chief Censor accordingly was not called upon. The board's decision was reached after viewing the film and discussing it at length. All members of the board other than Mrs Forbes (who was granted leave of absence) were present.

The decision of the board was to approve the film for exhibition, to classify it as approved for exhibition to those aged 16 years and over, and to direct the Chief Censor to enter the board's decision in the Register of Films. The decision however was subject to the film being cut in part one of it after the titles when one of the youths in the film was portrayed running round the perimeter of a football field muttering "fuck you" in response to his coaches exhortation to "move it, move it". It was felt that this cut was necessary to bring the film within the language guide lines set by the censor in other decisions. Such a cut would not effect the continuity or meaning of the film in any way.

In coming to its decision as to whether or not the film was likely to be injurious to the public good the board took into account the matters set out in section 26 (2) (a) (b) (c) (d) and (e) of the Act. In considering subsection (b) the board was unanimous in considering the film had little or no artistic merit or value or importance for social, cultural, or other reasons. It was considered to be a fairly slight teenage romp which was likely to appeal mainly to relatively young audiences.

The film was not particularly well made or tastefully made and if the board were to be the arbiter of public taste it would no doubt have considered that there was little merit in the film at all. However that is not the test.

What was considered was (a) the extent to which the film depicted anti-social behaviour, cruelty, violence, crime, horror, sex, or indecent or offensive language or behaviour and (b) the extent to which the film denigrated any particular class of the general public by reference to the colour, race, or ethnic or national origins, the sex, or the religious beliefs of the members of that class. In considering (a) (i.e. section 26 2 (c) of the Act), the board considered each of the episodes which no doubt would have caused concern to the censor in coming to his decision to ban the film. In particular there was a flick knife scene. The board considered this to be more comical than frightening. The youth's handling of the knife was so unskilled and his "disarming" so ironic as to make him appear ridiculous. The board considered this scene in itself could not be considered as frightening as the knife episodes in other films including *West Side Story* and that the conduct displayed was not likely in its context to promote imitation and thereby be injurious to the public good. Nudity in the film was considered unexceptionable and unobjectionable in its context. Indeed it was not nearly as explicit as in many other films approved for general release.

There were two episodes of cannabis smoking shown in the film. The first related to a number of students smoking reefer whilst being addressed by the headmaster. The second depicted two of the school's football team having a reefer before a football match. While it is agreed that such conduct cannot be condoned by the board it was not considered in the context of the film to be likely to be injurious in the wider sense to the public good.

DECISION

This book is a collection of erotic pictures which were originally produced for the edification of young couples of the Ming period. There are 53 prints, accompanied by a selection of Chinese love poems, some written as early as 100 A.D. and translated by American Orientalists with the help of the Chinese artist-poet Walasse Ting who is known for his translations of Chinese classics into contemporary idiom.

Dr Franzblau, Emeritus Professor of Pastoral Psychiatry of the Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, New York, and now on the psychiatric staff of Mount Sinai Hospital, says in his introduction, "These prints clearly are not pornography, whose goal is only sexual arousal, but represent a valid form of instruction in the techniques of conjugal love." Professor Franzblau surveys the social and cultural milieu in which the sexual practices shown in the prints existed; thus giving the whole work a sound historical perspective.

Erotic Art of China is a serious contribution to artistic and cultural history. Its study of unfamiliar sexual mores is scholarly and humane, and both prints and poems are tastefully presented. The Tribunal classifies this book as not indecent.

DECISION

Anais Nin, who died in 1977, was born of mixed Spanish and French parentage, spent part of her formative years in the United States and did most of her writing in English. She lived in France between the two world wars, and returned to America at the beginning of World War II. She is known for several novels, poems, and other literary works, and a multi-volume diary covering some 35 years. She could be described as a minor literary figure of the 20th century, but of particular interest to feminists. The stories collected in *Delta of Venus* were written in 1940-41, at a time she and a group of her friends were hard up in New York and had an opportunity to write frankly erotic stories for the money. In spite of this genesis, the stories are easily distinguished from run-of-the-mill pornography by their literary character. This is illustrated both by the style and by the characterisation of the persons whose stories they tell: they are real individuals, not simply puppets who proceed straight from one lurid sexual adventure to the next. There is certainly frankness in the description of

The scene which probably caused the censor most problems was the final scene in the film. This was the "chicken game" which involved the racing of two cars towards a cliff edge. One of the cars went over. After the initial feeling of horror that one of the contestants had gone over with the car he was subsequently seen to be strolling back to the jump off point having rolled out of the door of the car prior to its going over the cliff. This type of activity is highly dangerous and has previously caused concern in the film *Rebel Without a Cause*. However that film of course was shown in this country a decade ago and some of the members of the board could remember it subsequently having been shown on television to an unrestricted audience. In *Rebel Without a Cause* the chicken scene was performed against the background of a serious challenge between two youths and one of the participants was killed. In this film the scene occurred at the end of the film when all of the audience realised that the film was little more than a spoof. In addition the attitude of the majority of the students in the film was that such an activity was "old hat". The two protagonists were displayed as fairly infantile and the board was unanimous and conclusively of the opinion that the scene itself was not likely to be injurious to the public good in that it would not be likely to cause imitation amongst audiences likely to be seeing the film in New Zealand.

In considering (b) (i.e. section 26 2 (d)), the only matter which could possibly have caused concern in the board's view was the way in which those in authority were to some degree denigrated. However after considering this aspect of the matter it was not considered that the teachers in particular were unduly put down. If anything the approach taken by the pupils in the television programme *Welcome Back Kotter* can be considered more objectionable and it was certainly unlikely to promote such behaviour in the restricted audiences likely to see the film.

In considering the dominant effect of the film as a whole and its likely effect on those of the age of 16 years and above there was nothing which the board considered was likely to be injurious to the public good when applying the statutory tests laid down.

Notice to Make Returns of Income under Income Tax Act 1976

PURSUANT to the Income Tax Act 1976, the Commissioner of Inland Revenue gives notice as follows:

(1) Returns of income for the year ended 31 March 1979 (or other approved balance date) are required from:

- (a) All companies, all partnerships, all persons in business (including farming) or in a profession, all persons in partnership, all trustees, executors and administrators, notwithstanding that by reason of a loss being incurred for the year or carried forward from a previous year, no taxation is payable.
- (b) Every person whose total income from employment exceeded \$2,600, except that no return is required where the only income derived was from National Superannuation.
- (c) Every person who derived income from employment, the whole or any part of which was not taxed at source.
- (d) Every person who derived interest and/or investment or building society dividends, and whose total income (after deducting interest exemptions) exceeded \$462.
- (e) Every person who derived assessable income other than income from employment, and whose total income exceeded \$462, except that no return is required where the total income did not exceed \$1,149 and consisted exclusively of dividends.
- (f) Every person who paid provisional tax in respect of income for the year ended 31 March 1979.
- (g) Every person who received withholding payments. Note, however, that a return is not required where a person does not come within any of the classes referred to in (a) to (f) above inclusive, and the only withholding payments received were:
 - (i) Juror's or witness's fees, and/or
 - (ii) Not in excess of \$24 in the aggregate and consisting of one or more of the following classes: honoraria; fees for contributions to newspapers, journals, etc., or for radio and stage presentations; modelling or demonstrating goods or appliances; theatre, stage, concert, and radio performances; payments for election-day services.

(h) Every incorporated body which derived assessable income.

(i) Every absentee who derived income from New Zealand.

(2) Returns are required to be furnished by posting or delivering the same to the office of the Inland Revenue Department nearest to the place of residence of the taxpayer, or if the taxpayer's records are held in another office of the department, then to the latter office.

(3) Returns are due on:

(a) 7 June 1979 in any case where income was derived from salary, wages, superannuation (including National Superannuation), pensions, taxable allowances, etc., and

- (i) No other income whatsoever was derived, or
- (ii) The other income derived consisted exclusively of not more than \$500 in total from dividends, net rents, interest (after the interest exemptions).

(b) 7 August 1979 in all other cases or within 2 months of balance date, whichever is the later. No action for failure to furnish a return due on 7 August 1979 will be taken if it is furnished by 7 September 1979.

The return to be used is IR 5 (green print) in the case of paragraph (3) (a) above, and the IR 3 (black print) in the case of (3) (b) above.

In addition to return IR 3, farmers are to complete supplementary return IR 3F, and persons in business or in a profession are to complete supplementary return IR 3B. (The supplementary returns are not required if a copy of the annual accounts is furnished with the return.) Companies are to use IR 4, and estates and trusts IR 5A. Each form indicates the classes of taxpayers who are to use that form, and, where applicable, the due dates for payment of provisional tax.

(4) Return forms and guides have been mailed to all taxpayers. Additional forms are available from Inland Revenue and Post Offices.

(5) Any person or company failing to furnish a return within the prescribed time is liable to a fine not exceeding \$500.

(6) Any person who is not required under paragraph 1 to furnish a return and who has derived income from employment may elect to furnish a return using IR 5 if an adjustment is required because of:

- (a) Life insurance premiums paid.
- (b) Additional rebates or exemptions which were not included in the tax code during the year.
- (c) The standard deduction from salary/wages of \$52 (reduced to 2 percent of salary/wages if below \$2,600), or deductible employment related expenses.

(7) Any person furnishing a return of income who derived income taxed at time of payment should securely attach all tax deduction certificates (IR 12, IR 13) to the return form.

Trading Bank Reserve Asset Ratios

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank, acting with the approval of the Minister of Finance, hereby gives notice that as from the close of business on 1 May 1979, and until further notice each trading bank shall maintain, during each calendar month, balances at the Reserve Bank plus holdings of Reserve Bank notes, and of New Zealand Government securities, such that the aggregate of the averages of those balances and holdings during that calendar month (determined in accordance with clauses 1, 2, 3, and 4 of this notice) equals or exceeds the aggregate of:

- 17 percent of that trading bank's average demand deposit liabilities in New Zealand in the immediately preceding calendar month (determined in accordance with the provisions of clause 3 of this notice); plus
- 20 percent of that trading bank's time demand deposit liabilities in New Zealand in the immediately preceding calendar month (determined in accordance with the provisions of clause 5 of this notice);

Provided that a trading bank may make up its balances and holdings as aforesaid for a calendar month to the amount hereinbefore required for that calendar month by way of borrowings from the Reserve Bank made during that calendar month or during the first 10 business days of the next following calendar month, and on terms and conditions to be determined by the Reserve Bank and the proceeds of all such borrowings shall be credited to the account of that trading bank with the Reserve Bank.

For the purposes of this notice:

- (1) Balances held by a trading bank at the Reserve Bank shall (subject to clause 6 of this notice) include both demand deposit balances and time deposit balances of that trading bank.
- (2) The average of a trading bank's holdings of Reserve Bank notes for a calendar month shall be the average of the figures shown in all weekly returns of Banking Statistics by that trading bank under the Statistics Act 1975 received during that calendar month.
- (3) The average of a trading bank's balances at the Reserve Bank and holdings of New Zealand Government securities for a calendar month shall in each case be the average of the figures for balances and such securities held by that trading bank on each day during that calendar month.
- (4) Government securities held by a trading bank shall consist of Government stock and Treasury bills (all at nominal value) held by that trading bank.
- (5) The average demand deposit liabilities and the average time deposit liabilities of a trading bank in a calendar month shall in each case be the average of the figures for days within that calendar month, as shown in that trading bank's weekly returns of Banking Statistics under the Statistics Act 1975.
- (6) The proceeds of any borrowings made by a trading bank pursuant to the proviso to this notice shall:
 - (a) in the case of a borrowing made during a calendar month to make up balances and holdings for that calendar month, be included in the balances held by that trading bank at the Reserve Bank during the calendar month for which that borrowing is made; and
 - (b) that in the case of a borrowing made during the first 10 business days of a calendar month to make up balances and holdings for the preceding calendar month, be deemed to be a part of and be

included in the balance held by that trading bank at the Reserve Bank on the last day of the preceding calendar month;

and the proceeds of any such borrowing shall not be included in the balances held by that trading bank at the Reserve Bank during any other calendar month.

"Ohakune Mountain Road" means that portion of the public road from Ohakune Junction to its terminus at 1616 metres above mean sea level on Mount Ruapehu commencing at the Ranger Station operated by the Tongariro National Park Board and finishing at the said terminus.

"Transport Station" means a place designated by the county by means of a painted signboard with a background of yellow on which is painted in black lettering not less than 3 cm in height the words "Chain Fitting Service" such place being a rectangular portion of the roadway one side stretching a distance of 8 metres on either side of such signboard and the other parallel thereto and situate at a distance of 5 metres from the first mentioned side.

3. No person, whether acting on his own account, or as the servant of another person, shall on the Ohakune Mountain Road engage in the business of offering to the public a chain fitting service without having first obtained a licence from the county so to do.

4. Every licence issued under the provisions of this bylaw shall be in such form as the county may by resolution from time to time prescribe.

5. Every licence holder under the bylaw shall within 7 days of being asked so to do by any Police officer, traffic officer or authorised officer of the county produce the same for inspection.

6. Every licence issued under this bylaw shall be issued subject to such conditions as this bylaw prescribes.

7. Should the holder of any licence granted pursuant to this bylaw be convicted of any offence thereunder the county may immediately thereupon revoke such licence or suspend the same for so long as it may think fit.

8. No licence holder shall be permitted to operate under his licence earlier than 0830 hours or later than 1630 hours New Zealand Standard Time.

9. Every licence holder shall operate his business only from a transport station designated by the county as a tyre chain fitting area and upon being requested so to do by any Police officer or traffic officer or duly authorised officer of the county, and as often as so requested, shall alter his position from the transport station from which he is then conducting his business to such other transport station indicated by such officer.

10. Every holder of a licence while exercising or carrying on such business shall have affixed on some conspicuous place on the exterior of every vehicle which he uses for such purposes a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licenced Chain Fitting Operator" legibly painted thereon in letters not less than 3 cm in height.

11. Any person who shall obstruct any Police officer, traffic officer or authorised officer of the board in the exercise of any powers herein conferred upon such officer or not being the holder of a licence shall park a vehicle on or in any manner obstruct a transport station between the hours specified in clause 8 hereof otherwise than for the purpose of having chains fitted to adjusted on or removed from such vehicle shall be guilty of an offence under this bylaw.

12. Any person who shall do or cause to be done or knowingly permits or suffers to be done, or is concerned in doing anything whatsoever contrary to this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence under this bylaw.

This bylaw was made by way of Special Order passed at a meeting of the council held in Raetihi on the 19th day of April 1979.
