At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of June 1979

#### Present ·

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

## ORDER

1. (a) This order may be cited as the Mangonui County Council Foreshore Control Order 1979.

(b) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Gazette.

2. In this order-

"the Act" means the Harbours Act 1950;

"the council" means the Mangonui County Council; "foreshore" means such part of the bed, shore, or banks

of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides;

"Minister" means the Minister of Transport, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the council for a period expiring on 30 September 1998, subject to the provisions of section 165 of the Act, and to the conditions described in the Second Schedule to this order, control of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that portion of foreshore of Rarawa Beach commencing at a point on the north western side of the mouth of Ngataki Stream thence generally north westerly to the southern bank of the mouth of Tauwhiu stream as more particularly shown coloured red on plan M.D. 15943 and deposited in the office of the Ministry of Transport at Wellington.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE

#### CONDITIONS

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order without payment.

2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the customs or with any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder that are or may hereafter be in force.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges, conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may at any time be laid down within the area described in the First Schedule to this order.

4. The council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order for the bylaw, fix a charge for admission to any such enclosed part or parts: provided that the total number of days on which any particular part of that foreshore is enclosed shall not exceed 6 in any 1 calendar year. exceed 6 in any 1 calendar year.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the council to remove or cause to be removed from the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent in writing of the Minister first being obtained.

6. The said rights, powers, and privileges conferred on the council by this order may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General without payment of any compensation whatsoever, on giving to the Council 6 calendar months notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the council in New Zealand. address of the council in New Zealand.

This was an application by Twentieth Century Fox Film orporation (NZ) Ltd., for a review of the film "The Magic This was an application by Iwentieth Century Fox Film Corporation (NZ) Ltd., for a review of the film "The Magic Garden of Stanley Sweetheart", which the Chief Censor of Films had refused to approve for exhibition. "The Magic Garden of Stanley Sweetheart" is a rigorously plotless film about the emotional life of a white, middle class dropout. The hero is an earnest, non-smoking film student with a passion for making movies, but who has yet to work out a stance towards vice; particularly vice as represented by the passion for making moves, but who has yet to work our a stance towards vice; particularly vice as represented by the world of drugs and drug-taking. An obviously low-budget American production, it was completed in 1969.

In terms of section 26 (2) (b) of the Act, it was felt that the film had little artistic merit, and was of no value

or importance for social or cultural reasons.

So far as section 26 (2) (c) is concerned, the Board was of the opinion that the film presented sufficient evidence of anti-social behaviour to consider the film likely to be injurious to the public good. Such plot as exists is certainly open-ended. It is hard, however, to escape the conclusion that the drug-scene in which the youthful hero, Stanley, becomes increasingly involved, is glamourised by the makers of the film. And nowhere could the board find any suggestion that film. And nowhere could the board find any suggestion that the drug-habit is an increasingly expensive one which somehow has to be paid for by those indulging in it. In discussion of the dominant effect of the film as a whole, and its likely effect on the audience viewing it, members gave particular attention to one point. This was the disturbing and increasing problem of drug-addiction and drug-dependency being experienced among young people throughout New Zealand at the present time. The Board was unanimous in the opinion that to allow exhibition of "The Magic Garden of Stapley Sweetheart" at the present time would be injurious of Stanley Sweetheart" at the present time would be injurious of section 84 (5) (a) to approve the film "The Magic Garden of Stanley Sweetheart" for exhibition.

#### DECISION

HAVING conducted a review of the film "The Fruit is Ripe" on 27 April 1979, and in accordance with its authority under the Cinematograph Films Act 1976, section 84 (5), and the Cinematograph Films Regulations 1977, Reg. 11 (2) (e), the Films Censorship Board of Review decided to the film of the film of the films Censorship Board of Review decided to the film of the film of the films Censorship Board of Review decided the film of the films Censorship Board of Review decided the films of the film unanimously to approve the film for exhibition, to classify it as approved for exhibition to those aged 18 years and over and to direct the Chief Censor to enter the Board's decision in the Register of Films. The Board understands that the Chief Censor would have been prepared to approve the film for general exhibition subject to certain cuts, with an R16 certificate but that the applicant was not prepared

an Rio catherage out that the applicant was not proported to agree to any cuts.

"The Fruit is Ripe" is a West German production in which the young heroine leaves Munich and travels to the Greek Islands for what she describes as an odyssey of selfdiscovery. In the course of her largely amorous adventures, she confides her inner thoughts to a tape recorder at intervals.

she confides her inner thoughts to a tape recorder at intervals. The film is dubbed into English dialogue.

In reaching its decision as to whether or not the film is likely to be injurious to the public good (section 26 (2)) the Board took into account particularly matters specified in (a), (b), and (c). In considering section 26 (2) (b), the Board agreed that, apart from its inclusion of a series of well-composed and attractive views of predominantly tourist interest, the film is artistically unexceptionable; the plot is tenuous, the characters are of cardboard thinness, the dialogue is stilted, lip synchronisation for the dubbed English dialogue is not always well achieved, and the acting is only adequate. is stitled, in synchronisation for the dubbed English dialogue is not always well achieved, and the acting is only adequate. As such the film is no better, and no worse, than many others of its kind. Turning to section 26 (2) (c), Board members concentrated on the two of several aspects detailed in the locitleting as likely to be considered as injurious to in the legislation as likely to be considered as injurious to the public good; viz: anti-social behaviour and sex. In the category of anti-social behaviour, members discussed at length the sequence in which, to arouse sexually a male they both dislike, and whom they correctly surmise to be a homo-sexual, two young women simulate a lesbian relationship. In a cafe they dance closely in front of him, fondling each other and, strolling in the nude along the foreshore, turn to embrace as the man follows at a distance. The question to be asked is whether the theme or the apparently overt depiction of a lesbian relationship constitute anti-social, or indecent behaviour of such a nature as to be injurious to the public good.

Until the 1950's, lesbianism was unthinkable as a subject. It was not until Lillian Hellman's "The Children's Hour" was refilmed as "The Loudest Whisper" in 1962, and even more notably in "The Killing of Sister George", which appeared in 1968, that the subject was accorded open and frank film treatment. In each of the productions referred to, lesbianism was central to the theme of the film, and such included account of correlation to the theme of the film, and each included scenes of considerably more intimate details than occurs in the film under review. "The Killing of Sister George' has, moreover, been seen recently on local television, albeit with cuts of the more explicit parts. Clearly, therefore, lesbianism per se as a subject cannot be considered as necessarily constituting anti-social or indecent behaviour and therefore injurious to the public good. In "The Fruit is Ripe" there is the added fact that the audience will be aware that a trick is being played and will consider it as such and as containing absolutely no suggestion of depicting a serious lesbian relationship. At worst, the scene could be said to be in poor tasts.

said to be in poor taste.

The Board was divided however on whether or not to trim the "lesbian" scene. Four members voted to retain the sequence intact. Three (Mrs Forbes, Professor Dalziel, and Mr Beatson) voted to reduce the length of the scene, considering it over-long, even prurient out of the context of the film as a whole.

The majority decision, however, prevailed.

That leaves the extent and degree to which and the manner in which the film depicts sex. Four scenes, in particular, call for comment. The first involves the heroine's meeting and for comment. The first involves the heroine's meeting and spending the night in a small tent with a sexually liberated young man and woman. While much may seem to be suggested, little is shown to which exception can be taken. Of more concern, taking the four scenes in chronological sequence, is that of the love-making on the yacht between the heroine and the young journalist whom she meets and with whom she begins to develop what looks likely to be a genuinely loving relationship. Their love-making is observed by a frankly searching but never prurient camera. The entire scene, which lasts some three or four minutes. takes place scene, which lasts some three or four minutes, takes place to the accompaniment of a suitably romantic musical sound-track, and though less soft-focussed and more explicit hother trend-setting "Hiroshima Mon Amour" of twenty years are it in no more so than what has been viewed in numerous ago, it is no more so than what has been viewed in numerous

films since 1959. Members were unanimous that the manner in which the sequence was presented gave no grounds for any decision to excise or curtail it. Fellatio is certainly suggested in the beach frolic of the same couple shortly afterwards. The sequence is, however, so brief and generally so discreetly photographed as almost not to be noticed by the innocent among the audience. Again the brief passage in which the heroine is bedded by the Greek she has met casually in a bar, was held to be essential to the development of the narrative in that it takes place immediately after a "tiff" that separated the lovers temporarily, and shows the young woman to be utterly unreceptive to the man's ardent advances.

The Board did, however, have serious reservations about allowing the trailer for "The Fruit is Ripe" to be shown, tagged only with an R18 certificate. By its compression of a number of obviously more "juicy" sequences into the space of only a few minutes, it could give prospective audiences an impression that the film was one uninterrupted series of sexual encounters. As a result, the Board unanimously decided to curtail the opening scene in the trailer where decided to curtail the opening scene in the trailer where the heroine reclines topless in a deckchair; to excise completely the sequence in which she is seen, gratuitously as it appears, to be slipping out of her jeans; and also to excise completely a third sequence, in which she poses nude on the deck of a luxury yacht while holding on to the

rigging.

The Board therefore voted to approve the "trailer" for exhibition with an R18 certificate subject to the two excisions

and one shortening of sequence as indicated.

### WEATHER SEQUENCE APRIL 1979

The depression and cold front that crossed the North Island at the end of March continued to move north-east, and an anticyclone had moved onto New Zealand by the morning of the 1st. This anticyclone persisted until the 4th when it began to move eastwards, but a ridge of high pressure covered most of the country until the morning of the 5th. A cold front associated with a depression to the south of the country moved onto the West Coast early on the 5th and brought heavy rain to Fiordland, Westland, and parts of Buller, with light showers being recorded west of the main ranges in other parts of both Islands. Temperatures were above or near normal in most eastern districts of New Zealand.

On the morning of the 6th a depression which had formed near Tasmania began to move eastwards towards New Zealand, and by the 7th was lying to the west of the South Island. As the cold front ahead of this depression moved north-east across the country heavy rain was recorded in Westland, with light to moderate falls throughout most of the South Island and parts of the North Island. Some areas on the West Coast had more than 200 mm in 48 hours and many stations in Westland and Buller had between 50 mm and 150 mm in this period. The only areas without rainfall were east of the main ranges in the North Island.

By the 10th a cold front had moved onto the South Island, and a small wave depression had formed on a front in the North

Tasman Sea. The depression moved south-east towards central New Zealand and brought heavy rain to Taranaki, and moderate falls to most of the North Island. Rain was recorded in the South Island west of the main ranges. During the morning of the 11th a complex depression formed in the Tasman Sea and moved slowly across the country on the 12th and 13th. Heavy rain was reported in most northern districts of the North Island and in parts of the West Coast and Southland. 24 hour falls of more than 50 mm were measured in Taranaki and central districts. Temperatures were very cold throughout most of New Zealand on the 13th and 14th. In some regions maximum temperatures were below normal by more than 5°C.

On the 13th an anticyclone in the Tasman Sea had begun to move towards the country, and by the 15th was situated over New Zealand. A weak cold front moved across Fiordland on the 17th bringing some rain, but most of the country had only isolated showers. On the 18th a depression had formed near Tasmania and had started to move eastwards towards New Zealand. By the afternoon of the 20th the anticyclone had moved away to the east and extended a ridge of high pressure onto the North Island. A cold front associated with the depression, which had moved to the south of the country, crossed onto the South Island

and this was followed by a trough of low pressure on the 22nd. Heavy rain was reported in Fiordland and Westland with lighter falls throughout New Zealand in areas west of the ranges. Temperatures were slightly cooler than usual from the 15th to 20th

Pressures were high to the north and low to the south of the country on the 23rd, and disturbances in strong westerly flow onto New Zealand brought rain to most western districts of both Islands. The heaviest falls were in Fiordland and Westland where some areas recorded 50 mm to 90 mm in 24 hours. An anticyclone moved onto the country from the Tasman Sea early on the 26th. A depression which formed on a front in the Tasman Sea moved towards the country and by the afternoon of the 27th was crossing the South Island. As this system moved across New Zealand, rain was reported in most areas, apart from Hawke's Bay and parts of Canterbury. By the morning of the 29th a ridge of high pressure extended onto the country from the Tasman Sea.

A strong south-west flow ahead of the ridge of high pressure persisted until the end of the month, and disturbances in this flow brought showers and rain to many districts of the South Island, and western areas of the North Island. In most places temperatures were cooler than usual towards the end of the month.

### STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The general accounting principles as recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of profits on an historical basis have been followed. Particular accounting policies used which significantly affect the measurement of the bank's profit and its financial position, are set out below:

1. Government Stock—(a) Government stock is recorded at face value. Where parcels of Stock have been purchased at a discount the discount is written off to revenue over the period of the investment. Where contracts exist for the resale of parcels of stock at less than face value, the future loss is provided by an annual charge against the appropriation account.

Unexpired discounts and accumulated provisions for losses are deducted from the face values.

- 2. Other Investments—(a) All investments, other than Government stock are shown at cost price, and all are expected to realise the reported amounts at maturity.
- 3. Interest—(a) Interest on investments. Interest on investments and mortgages is brought into revenue during the period in which it is earned, rather than the period during which it is received.
- (b) Personal loans. The policy is to add interest to the full advance at the commencement of the loan, and this amount is brought into revenue during the appropriate financial year by applying the "Rule of 78".
- (c) Investment Accounts. Interest accrued on depositors' investment accounts has been calculated at the full rate payable on the assumption that all deposits go through to maturity.

4. Depreciation—(a) Depreciation is calculated on a straigh line basis. The principal write off periods in use for fixed assets are:

- (b) Head Office land and buildings were revalued in 1975 and depreciation is written off the buildings on the basis of that valuation. All other fixed assets are included at cost.
- 5. Taxation—The liability for deferred taxation arises from timing differences related to:
  - (a) Accrued interest;
  - (b) Depreciation allowances;
  - (c) Discounts on Government Stock;
  - (d) Computer landing charges.

The full amount of taxation on the recorded profit is charged against the revenue account. The portion of that tax payable during the current financial year is shown as a current liability and the balance is included in a provision for future taxation.

- 6. Computer Equipment-Landing charges paid during the year have been written off against revenue.
- 7. Stock on Hand-The stock on hand shown in the balance sheet represents bulk stationery supplies which have been valued at cost.
- 8. Contingent Liabilities—There are outstanding letters of credit totalling \$55,000 held by various trading banks to facilitate day to day transactions of our branches.
- 9. Commitments-Mortgages approved but not yet paid out totalled \$760,930 at 31 March 1979.

Fifty years of public demand since this book was first published resulted in the need for reprints in 1934 and 1952. The text has been reproduced unchanged but the originals of some of the figures could not be traced and these have been replaced with similar illustrations. There have been many advances in our knowledge of Maori life since this book first appeared. The work of numerous ethnologists, and more recently archaeologists, has critically examined many of the earlier concepts, confirming some, disproving others, and altering others to varying degrees. No one has yet produced a synthesis of the results of all this scholarship and there is still nothing as comprehensive as this book of Best's to give a general account of the Maori. This book was first published when Best was 68 and thus represents the accumulated knowledge of a lifetime. It has now become a classic introduction to Maori life. Its continued availability should help the reader to obtain a basic background to old time Maori life which can be extended by further reading.
