PURSUANT to the Forests and Rural Fires Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Marlborough North Rural Fire District Order 1979.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after its notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires the "Act" means the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, "District" means the Marlborough North Rural Fire District.

PART I—CONSTITUTION OF THE MARLBOROUGH NORTH RURAL
FIRE DISTRICT

3. The area specified in the Schedule to this order is hereby constituted and declared to be a rural fire district to be known as the Marlborough North Rural Fire District.

4. The trees and other plants on the land, described in the Schedule to this order, are hereby specified as the property for the protection for which the district is constituted.

5. The period between the 1st day of October in any 1 year and the 30th day of September in the following year (both days inclusive) is hereby declared to be a restricted fire season in the district.

6. The Marlborough North Rural Fire District shall be administered for the purposes of the said Act by a committee consisting of nine members representing the New Zealand Forest Service, Marlborough Sounds Maritime Park Board, Marlborough County Council, Marlborough Forest Owners Association, Federated Farmers of New Zealand (this representative shall have territorial interests in the Marlborough North Rural Fire District), New Zealand Fire Services Commission, Marlborough Catchment Board, and a member of the Residents and Ratepayers Associations within the Marlborough North Rural Fire District.

WHEREAS, by the Order in Council dated the 30th day of July 1923*, made under the British Settlements Act 1887 of the United Kingdom Parliament, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of New Zealand for the time being (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) was appointed to be the Governor of the Ross Dependency, and all the powers and authorities which by the said order were given and granted to the Governor for the time being of the Dependency were thereby vested in him:

And whereas the Governor was thereby further authorised and empowered to make all such rules and regulations as might lawfully be made by Her Majesty's authority for the peace, order, and good government of the Dependency:

And whereas, by regulations made by the Governor on the 14th day of November 1923†, it was enacted that all persons appointed by the Governor for the time being of the Dependency should have such power and authority as might be granted them in due course of law, and might be em-

powered to do such things as might be necessary or desirable to ensure that the laws in force in the Dependency are duly observed and complied with in every respect, and to do all things necessary or expedient for the peace, order, and good government of the Dependency, and to safeguard and preserve Her Majesty's rights and sovereignty over and in respect of the Dependency:

And whereas it is expedient that the persons hereinafter named be appointed officers of the Government of the Dependency:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Keith Jacka Holyoake, the Governor-General of New Zealand, and as such the Governor of the Ross Dependency, hereby appoint

MICHAEL MAYNARD PREBBLE, Esquire

as an officer of the Government of the Dependency with effect from the commencement of the 8th day of October 1979 until the expiry of the 31st day of January 1980:

And I also appoint

CHARLES ASHLEY ROPER, Esquire

as an officer of the Government of the Dependency with effect from the commencement of the 1st day of February 1980 until the expiry of the 14th day of October 1980:

And I hereby confer on the said Michael Maynard Prebble and the said Charles Ashley Roper while they respectively hold office all the powers and authorities which may be exercised in New Zealand by a Justice of the Peace, and also the powers and authorities which may be so exercised by a Coroner:

And I also appoint

LEO BERNARD PATRICK SLATTERY, Esquire

as an officer of the Government of the Dependency with effect from the commencement of the 8th day of October 1979 until the expiry of the 14th day of October 1980:

And I hereby confer on the said Leo Bernard Patrick Slattery all the powers and authorities that may be exercised in New Zealand by a Postmaster:

The said Michael Maynard Prebble, Charles Ashley Roper, and Leo Bernard Patrick Slattery to exercise their functions at such places within the Dependency as may be directed by the officer for the time being appointed as an officer of the Government of the Dependency in whom is vested the general executive and administrative authority in preserving Her Majesty's rights and sovereignty and the laws and regulations in force in the Dependency:

And I hereby consequentially revoke the appointments of John Raymon Presland, Esquire, and Maurice Jack Challinor, Esquire, as officers of the Government of the Dependency (including the powers and authorities of a Postmaster conferred on the said Maurice Jack Challinor) with effect from the expiry of the 7th day of October 1979.

Decision No. Com. 5/79

Decision of the Broadcasting Tribunal

IN the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of a complaint under section 67 (1) by Patrick Gerard Curran:

WARRANT holder—Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand in respect of Television One and Television Two:

BEFORE THE BROADCASTING TRIBUNAL

Members: B. H. Slane (Chairman), L. R. Sceats (member), J. C. Somerville (member), N. L. Macbeth (co-opted member), G. R. Wear (co-opted member).

Hearing: Monday, 30 July 1979.

DECISION

The complaint concerns the coverage on television of news and current affairs relating to Northern Ireland.

Mr Curran has for some years followed the broadcasting coverage of Northern Ireland. He described himself as born in Southern Ireland "of catholic stock". He came to New Zealand in 1956 and became a New Zealand citizen. He is concerned that his personal views should be made perfectly clear. He supports the present policy of Britain in Northern Ireland, that it will maintain its military presence for as long as the majority of the population should wish it. He condemns all the violence perpetrated by both the protestant and catholic sides of the sectarian struggle there.

I wish it to be understood at the outset that I do not condone or support any of the terrorism or acts of violence conducted by the Irish Republican Army or any group claiming to be of catholic background, he told the Tribunal.

I am not concerned that the I.R.A. is shown in a bad light by television programmes and news items. I am concerned that the Corporation has failed to maintain standards of objectivity and impartiality of news presentation in that it reports the activities of one faction and ignores almost completely the equally atrocious activities of the other.

The Complaint

Mr Curran made a statutory declaration, on 21 November 1978, running to some eight pages in the course of which he set out his criticism of news coverage by television in New Zealand for the past two years. He had compared presentation of news items in news broadcasts with copies of news supplied by Reuters to the New Zealand Press Association. He claimed the television news broadcasts were consistent in their almost total exclusion of any items relating to acts of violence allegedly perpetrated by proscribed protestant organisations such as the Ulster Volunteer Force, the Red Hand Commandoes or the Ulster Freedom Fighters. Pre-eminence, he claimed, was given to incidents of violence by members of the Irish Republican Army and other pro-catholic groups. The effect of this practice was he said to give an unbalanced view of the sources of violence and terrorism. He gave a number of instances where a news item which he considered unfavourable to the I.R.A. was reported on television and another item which was unfavourable to a protestant faction was not reported.

He specifically complained about the lack of balance in a World Watch programme broadcast by T.V. 2 on 10 September 1978.

Mr Curran subsequently added some later news items to his complaints.

The Corporation considered his complaint which had been anticipated by earlier criticisms of television handling of events in Northern Ireland in 1976 and 1977.

At its meeting, on 13 February 1979, the Corporation considered the declaration he had forwarded and the subsequent letter from his solicitors. The following findings were made by the Corporation:

1. Although Mr Curran's affidavit and complaint referred to coverage of events over a two year period, the evidence he brought forward covered only selected months in 1978, and in some cases the affidavit did not cover all news items broadcast in these particular months. The Corporation felt, therefore, that the complaint in its overall form could not be sustained.
2. Nevertheless it found that the World Watch programme, of 10 September 1978, was unbalanced in its treatment of the I.R.A.
3. The Corporation also acknowledges that Mr Curran brought forward sufficient evidence to suggest that great care should be taken to achieve a balanced presentation of events in Northern Ireland, by a closer study of the merits of wire service reports in relation to filmed reports. On this point the Director-General of T.V. 2 has made specific acknowledgment of T.V. 2's error in not recognising the significance of the international wire copy relating to the incident raised separately in your letter of 15 January.

Mr Curran was told that the Corporation's finds and amplifying observations had been drawn to the attention of the appropriate staff by their Directors-General.

The 15 January letter referred to a report carried by T.V. 1 news which accurately reported an incident concerning a priest's information on a bombing campaign in Britain, making it clear that the priest had given the Northern Ireland Office the information that he had. The South Pacific Television report on T.V. 2 news had left the impression, in the opinion of the complainant, that the priest had known of the planned attack but had done nothing to warn the authorities. Mr Curran complained to the Tribunal that he was dissatisfied with the Corporation's decision. He said that in its presentation of news items and current affairs programmes concerning Northern Ireland, in the period July 1978 to December 1978 (inclusive), the Corporation failed to have regard in the items and programmes to the accurate and impartial gathering and presentation of news according to the recognised standards of objective journalism in breach of section 24 (1) (b), and failed to have regard to the principle that when controversial issues of public importance

are discussed, reasonable efforts are made to present significant points of view either in the same programme or other programmes within the period of current interest in breach of section 24 (1) (e).

It was also alleged that the items were in breach of certain broadcasting rules. Mr Curran claimed that the Corporation should have upheld his complaints.

Mr Curran, incidentally, was unhappy at the wording of paragraph 2 of the Corporation's findings. He was not concerned about the showing of the programme but noted the failure of television to give coverage of an event three or four days previously when a self-confessed member of the U.V.F., an illegal protestant terrorist organisation, had received 16 life sentences for a bomb attack in which 15 people had been killed. He felt the Corporation had not fully grasped the terms of his complaint or they would have found that it was "unbalanced in its omission of any reference to the criminal activities of the illegal protestant groups operating in Northern Ireland."

It is the general failure of the Corporation's television coverage of Northern Ireland to show that terrorism is carried out by protestant groups and to name those groups that concerns him as he considers it leaves the impression that the only terrorist organisation is the I.R.A. He also considers there to be some anti-catholic anti-Irish bias which we will refer to later.

In his submissions to us he summed up his dissatisfaction as follows:

- a. The Corporation finding that my "complaint in its overall form could not be sustained."
- b. The Corporation's failure in making its finding to answer any of the substantive issues raised in that complaint.
- c. The Corporation's failure after finding that the World Watch programme, of 10 September 1978 was unbalanced to take any effective steps to redress that imbalance.
- d. The Corporation's continued failure since that time to ensure:
 - (i) That the presentation of its television news broadcasts dealing with events in Northern Ireland has been objective and impartial.
 - (ii) That the presentation of other television programmes relating to those events (plays, documentaries etc.) has maintained a balance by presenting significant points of view on controversial issues of public importance.

The Tribunal was not aided in dealing with this complaint by the attitude adopted by the Broadcasting Corporation. We were given no information about the television channels' treatment of Northern Ireland matters. The Corporation indicated that it did not wish to add anything to its findings except "perhaps to point to the difficulty it faces in dealing with information that originates from overseas sources—particularly a troubled area like Northern Ireland." No arrangements were made for the Corporation to be represented at the hearing of the complaint on behalf of the Corporation.

At the request of the Tribunal, the Editor of T.V. 1 news, Mr Eckhoff, kindly appeared at short notice to give what assistance he could to the Tribunal which appreciated the trouble he went to. Mr Eckhoff gave the Tribunal information in two main fields; one was the way in which television news is obtained from overseas, selected and edited for presentation in New Zealand. In this respect it is clear that the basic supply of overseas news film is by way of a ten-minute daily satellite feed, the basic selection being made by Visnews in London. Visnews is a co-operative enterprise involving a number of news organisations and coverage in respect of Northern Ireland news comes mainly from the B.B.C. and sometimes from N.B.C.

Mr Eckhoff also investigated some particular news items referred to by Mr Curran and was able to inform Mr Curran that on a number of the occasions he referred to, where he considered television film coverage should have been given, no such film was received from London.

It is fair to say that Mr Curran is convinced that there is a pattern of broadcasting conduct ranging right across from the New Zealand *Listener* to the selection of plays and local productions that portrays catholic Irish interests adversely. The Tribunal finds no grounds for sharing that view.

It is also true that he brought to the attention of the Tribunal a number of significant news items in which protestant terrorist organisations or the protestant extremist element would have appeared (in his eyes, adversely) which were not reported in television news items.

Mr Curran is however, somewhat selective and is inclined to omit or give less weight to, items which do not fit in with his theory of television bias.

It was therefore not possible for the Tribunal to rely entirely on his analysis of balancing items as there were at

least two instances, one relating to drama and one news item (reporting the Rev. Ian Paisley disturbing the sitting of the European Parliament) which he did not mention although he had brought a number of items to our attention that were outside the period of his complaint.

On the other hand there was a difficulty as far as the Tribunal was concerned in that the Corporation, despite the number of complaints made by Mr Curran had not apparently instituted any method of keeping tallies of Northern Ireland coverage.

We intend to deal with the matters in the order in which he set out the issues in his submission to us.

- (a) We do support Mr Curran's contention that the Corporation's finding that his "complaint in its overall form could not be sustained" was an unsatisfactory method of delivering its decision on his complaint. In fact, the Corporation did find that there was a lack of balance in a World Watch programme and should have clearly upheld his complaint in part unless there was evidence of balancing material. We do not however find that there is sufficient evidence to sustain the view that the Corporation's television coverage generally is in breach of the statutory standards. The Corporation has the ability to find out if that was the position. It did not do so.
- (b) The Corporation could well have provided information from its television services as to the items in which Mr Curran specifically had some interest but apparently no attempt was made to give him the information as to the availability of certain news items to television which has now been obtained in part by Mr Eckhoff at our request.
- (c) Television Two should have taken reasonable efforts following the complaint to have balanced the material shown in the World Watch item. There is no information before us that any attempt has been made to do so. The finding of the Corporation has therefore had little practical effect from Mr Curran's point of view.

Several items referred to by Mr Curran as unpublished appear likely to have been available to television, but the Tribunal does not consider it appropriate to make a judgment that they should have been inserted in any particular bulletin without full knowledge of the news situation on that day and the other items available for presentation. There were some reports published and we can understand that it is difficult for a news organisation to appreciate Mr Curran's dissatisfaction with a news item which was heavily unfavourable to protestant elements but which did not name the organisations under which they operated in their terrorist activities and therefore did not meet his criterion for satisfactory reportage.

- (d) It must be remembered that the volume of wire service news into New Zealand far exceeds the capacity of even a newspaper to publish. Selections therefore have to be made but we think it is important in relation to issues such as Northern Ireland, the Arab/Israeli conflict and similar issues which arouse controversy in this country as well as overseas to keep some record of the treatment given and to review it from time to time. We do not know whether there was a breach of the statutory standards and we do not consider that the time and effort that would be involved in attempting to establish this would be justified. But neither does the Corporation know. The Corporation can, however, ensure that balance is achieved and that the proper efforts are made to do so. We are concerned that there is (at T.V. 1 anyway) no regular procedure for ensuring objectivity and impartiality in the treatment of overseas controversial issues. It should be possible to detect undesirable trends in coverage and to take positive steps to redress balance when necessary.

Mr Eckhoff told us that a watch is kept for distortion by too much coverage of one event and less of another in all news broadcasts, but only in certain matters such as New Zealand election campaigns is a tally of coverage kept in review. There is daily contact with Visnews editors in Sydney and through them contact can be made to London; sometimes there is direct contact with London. It is possible to supply a specific brief for coverage on particular topics. The general brief to Visnews as to coverage of Northern Ireland might need to be revised.

In addition, it is possible specifically to request coverage of certain known events or certain types of coverage. The Corporation's news editors should give consideration to taking some such steps if they detect imbalance occurring.

We reject entirely Mr Curran's thesis that in the presentation of its material generally, the Corporation is unbalanced. In support of this he suggested that within a short period of showing a documentary about a poor part of Ireland, local productions of the "God Boy" and "Shining with Shiner" were screened and there was an alleged "laxity" by Television One reporting of the Irish situation and having an Ulsterman from New Zealand report on Northern Ireland—all this occurring about an historically significant time of the year. This argument is untenable. In response to questions Mr Curran did not seriously suggest that plays ought to be balanced but did correctly consider that dramatised documentaries fell into that category.

We are satisfied that there is no censorship or particular emphasis in television programming intended to show a distorted view of the Irish situation. At the same time we are concerned that proper steps be taken by television to monitor its own news and current affairs activities and to ensure that should such criticism be made in the future, it will be possible to determine whether or not the coverage has been fair and balanced because television editors have been taking the necessary steps to see that it is.

Mr Curran's complaint is upheld in part.

Co-Opted Members

In accordance with section 67 (1) empowers the Tribunal to co-opt two members whose qualifications or experience are likely to be of assistance to the Tribunal in the determination of the complaint.

Mr G. R. Wear and Mr N. L. Macbeth were co-opted and took part in the hearing and the deliberations of the Tribunal. The decision in accordance with the Act is that of the permanent members.

DZ 5423 Retreading car and commercial vehicle tyres. (Superseding NZS 2219:1968.)

This is a complete revision of NZS 2219:1968. It specifies the minimum requirements for the retreading and repairing of car and commercial vehicle pneumatic tyres used in high-way service. It specifies certain constructional features; the examination, limits of damage, preparations and permissible repairs of the tyre carcass before processing; marking and inspection of the tyre after curing. Minimum performance

levels are also given. Except where otherwise stated, the requirements apply to both tubed and tubeless tyres.

In discussing the administration and organisation of education the principle followed is the maximum devolution of authority and responsibility to the agencies and the community, at for instance, school committee and district level.

Another in the series of the Best publications, it has been reprinted without revision so that the basic studies may be accessible in the original style.

This particular bulletin still remains the only comprehensive account of most aspects of Maori fishing. The descriptions of methods employed in fishing given here are still quite basic for any future studies in this field since no first-hand observations can now be made. The detailed fishing methods outlined are accompanied by descriptions of the artifacts used, together with associated chants, magic formulae, special observances, and fishing lore.

It will be of more general interest today than when first written, since it stresses so fully the uses made by the Maori people of their natural resources, and supplies basic material for further studies in ethnobotany and ethnozoology. The reverence which the old time Maori showed towards natural resources mirrors the modern concern for ecological principles.
