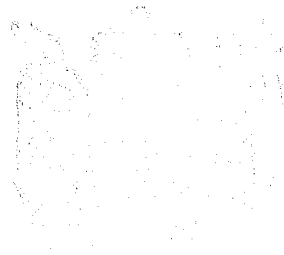

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS AND ARCHITECTS

The Board of Registration of Professional Engineers and Architects (BRPEA) has proposed amendments to its regulations regarding the licensure of professional engineers and architects. The proposed amendments are available for public review and comment.

The proposed amendments include changes to the requirements for licensure, including the addition of a new category of licensure for "Professional Engineer in Training" (PEIT) and the modification of the requirements for the Professional Engineer (PE) and Professional Architect (PA) examinations. The amendments also address the process for the renewal of licenses and the imposition of disciplinary actions.

The Board of Registration of Professional Engineers and Architects is a state agency created by Chapter 26A of the Massachusetts General Laws. The Board is responsible for the regulation and oversight of the professions of engineering and architecture in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The Board's primary mission is to protect the public interest by ensuring that all licensed professionals are qualified to practice their respective professions and to maintain the highest standards of professional conduct.

The proposed amendments are necessary to address the needs of the profession and to ensure that the regulatory framework remains current and effective. The amendments are based on the Board's ongoing efforts to improve the licensure process and to enhance the quality of the profession. The Board has conducted extensive research and consultation with the profession and the public to develop these proposed amendments.

The Board is committed to transparency and public participation in its regulatory process. The proposed amendments are available for public review and comment. The Board will consider all comments received and will make any necessary revisions to the proposed amendments before they are adopted. The Board's decision on the proposed amendments will be final and binding on all licensed professionals and the public.
