The Waikato Region Constitution Order 1980

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 25th day of August 1980

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Local Government Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Waikato Region Constitution Order 1980.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day of October 1980, except in so far as it is necessary for the constituent authorities to proceed prior to that date with the appointment of the first members of the Council in terms of clause 6 of this order, and for matters incidental thereto.

2. Waikato Region—(1) There is hereby constituted a region to be called the Waikato Region (hereinafter referred to as "the Region").

(2) The constituent districts of the Region shall be the districts of:

- (a) The County of Raglan;
- (b) The County of Waikato;
- (c) The Borough of Huntly;
- (d) The Borough of Ngaruawahia;
- (e) The County of Waipa;
- (f) The City of Hamilton;
- (g) The Borough of Cambridge;
- (h) The Borough of Te Awamutu;
- (i) The County of Matamata;
- (j) The Borough of Matamata;
- (k) The Borough of Putaruru;
- (l) The Borough of Tokoroa;
- (m) The District of Otorohanga;
- (n) The District of Waitomo.

3. Waikato United Council—The council for the Region shall be a united council described as "The Waikato United Council" (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

4. Membership of Council—The Council shall consist of 16 members of whom:

- (a) One shall be appointed by the Raglan County Council;
- (b) One shall be appointed by the Waikato County Council;
- (c) One shall be appointed by the Huntly Borough Council;
- (d) One shall be appointed by the Ngaruawahia Borough Council;
- (e) One shall be appointed by the Waipa County Council;
- (f) Three shall be appointed by the Hamilton City Council;
- (g) One shall be appointed by the Cambridge Borough Council;
- (h) One shall be appointed by the Te Awamutu Borough Council;
- (i) One shall be appointed by the Matamata County Council;
- (j) One shall be appointed by the Matamata Borough Council;
- (k) One shall be appointed by the Putaruru Borough Council;
- (l) One shall be appointed by the Tokoroa Borough Council;
- (m) One shall be appointed by the Otorohanga District Council;
- (n) One shall be appointed by the Waitomo District Council.

5. Administering authority—The administering authority of the Council shall be the Hamilton City Council.

6. First appointment of members—(1) Each constituent authority shall, not later than 1 month after the date of the commencement of this order, appoint the first member or the first members of the Council which that authority is to appoint under clause 4 of this order.

(2) The members of the Council appointed pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause shall come into office on the day of the first meeting of the Council.

(3) Each constituent authority shall, not later than the 14th day of November 1980, give the names of the person or persons appointed by it pursuant to subclause (1) of this clause to the principal officer of the administering authority.

(4) The principal officer of the administering authority shall not be prevented, by any failure to comply with sub-clause (3) of this clause, from convening the first meeting of the Council in accordance with clause 7 of this order.

7. First meeting of Council—(1) The first meeting of the Council shall be held not later than 2 months after the date of the commencement of this order.

(2) The principal officer of the administering authority shall convene the first meeting of the Council and shall preside at that meeting until the election of the Chairman.

(3) That principal officer may do all things necessary for the convening of that meeting.

8. Committees—(1) Subject to section 104 of the Local Government Act 1974, section 6 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1977, and subclause (2) of this clause, the Council may appoint such committees as it thinks fit.

(2) The Council shall appoint and maintain a Civil Defence Committee which committee shall include a nominee of the Director of Civil Defence and a nominee of the Commissioner of Works.

9. Finance—(1) For the purposes of and subject to section 123 of the Local Government Act 1974, the net expenditure of the Council for each financial year shall be apportioned among the constituent authorities of the Region on the following basis:

Raglan County Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Waikato County Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Huntly Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Ngaruawahia Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Waipa County Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Hamilton City Council shall pay three-sixteenths;
 Cambridge Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Te Awamutu Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Matamata County Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Matamata Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Putaruru Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Tokoroa Borough Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Otorohanga District Council shall pay one-sixteenth;
 Waitomo District Council shall pay one-sixteenth.

(2) For the purposes of section 123 of the Local Government Act 1974 the functions of regional planning and civil defence shall be deemed to be functions for the benefit of the whole Region.

The Auckland Technical Institute Notice 1980

PURSUANT to section 69 of the Education Act 1964, the Minister of Education hereby gives the following notice:

NOTICE

1. (1) This notice may be cited as the Auckland Technical Institute Notice 1980.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 20th day of October 1980.

2. There shall be a Board of Governors to be known as the Council of the Auckland Technical Institute which shall control the Auckland Technical Institute.

3. The Council of the Auckland Technical Institute shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) Two members appointed by the Association of Employers in local industries listed in the First Schedule to this notice.
- (b) Two members appointed by the Association of Employees in local industries listed in the Second Schedule to this notice.
- (c) One member appointed by the Auckland Branch of the New Zealand Institute of Architects.
- (d) One member appointed by the Auckland Branch of the New Zealand Institute of Engineers.

- (e) One member appointed by the Auckland Branch of the New Zealand Society of Accountants.
- (f) One member who shall be the Chairman of the Auckland Regional Council for Technical Education.
- (g) One member appointed by the Auckland City Council.
- (h) One member appointed by the Council of the University of Auckland.
- (i) One member appointed by the Northern Region of the New Zealand Secondary School Boards' Association to represent the controlling authorities of secondary schools in the area in which the institute is situated.
- (j) One member who shall be the Principal of the Auckland Technical Institute.
- (k) One member who shall represent the staff of the Auckland Technical Institute and shall be elected by full-time teachers employed by the Board of Governors and who shall himself be a teacher employed by the Board.
- (l) One member who shall represent the full-time non-teaching staff of the Auckland Technical Institute and shall be elected by full-time non-teaching staff employed by the Board of Governors and who shall himself be employed by the Board.
- (m) (i) One member who shall be a representative of the students of Auckland Technical Institute and who shall be elected to a term of office of 1 year by students of the institute and who shall himself be a student of the institute.
(ii) For the purposes of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (m) of this clause a "student of the institute" shall be defined as any student enrolled in a course of study at the Auckland Technical Institute at the time of the calling of nominations for the election of the student representative.
- (n) Not more than three members may be co-opted by the Board of Governors itself, if and when it thinks fit.

4. The Regional Superintendent of Education, Auckland, or his deputy, shall be an associate member of the Council of the Auckland Technical Institute and shall be entitled to be present at any meeting of the Council, or of any committee of the Council and to speak at the meeting; but he shall not be entitled to vote at any such meeting.

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and the provisions of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (m) of clause 3 of this notice, the members of the Council of the Auckland Technical Institute shall hold office for a term of 3 years but may from time to time be reappointed.

(2) Every co-opted member of the Council shall be appointed for such term, not exceeding 3 years, as the Council thinks fit.

(3) Except in the case of a casual vacancy or as otherwise provided in this clause every member shall hold office until the 1st day of December in the third year after his appointment and if on the 1st day of December the appointment of his successor has not been notified to the Council, he shall continue to hold office until the date on which that appointment is notified.

(4) If any member dies, or resigns his office by writing under his hand addressed to the Council or the Chairman or the Secretary thereof, or is absent without leave from the meetings of the Council for 3 consecutive months, or while holding office becomes ineligible to remain a member by reason of disability, insolvency, neglect of duty or misconduct, the casual vacancy so created shall be filled as soon as practicable thereafter by the appointment of a member in the manner in which the vacating member was appointed and the member appointed to fill the vacancy shall hold office for the residue of the term of office of the member whom he replaces.

(5) The powers of the Council shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof.

Decision

Sample copies of these publications were imported by a commercial importer and were seized at Auckland. The importer, Waverly Publications, disputes forfeiture so that the Comptroller has referred them to the Tribunal for classification. Written submissions in respect of each publication were made by the importer who suggests that age restrictions in each case would be appropriate.

Cover Girl—These are the first 3 issues of what appears to be a monthly publication. The editorial to Volume 1, No. 1, says this:

Cover Girl is the sort of magazine a man can be proud to buy and have in his living room—it is a complete magazine with features of such sports and interests as golf, horse racing, football, boxing, motor car and cycle racing, cricket, drinking and other adult entertainment.

Each number is similar in style and purports to contain articles of the nature referred to in the editorial. Each has a large number of photographs of women in various stages of dress and undress and there are a number of articles of a sexual nature. The photographs are, in the main, contrived poses of the same nature of many girly-type magazines. Despite its claim to have articles of the nature mentioned, it is apparent that these are only a small proportion of the publication. Each number has 98 pages. Number 1 has 12 pages devoted to matters of general interest, number 2 has 17, and number 3 has 8. As stated the remaining articles are of a sexual nature which have no literary merit and which quote the alleged sexual experiences of the author in a variety of extraordinary situations. Despite its claim in the editorial, the whole tenor of the magazine is directed towards sexual themes, mostly in unhealthy terms. Its appeal is to the salacious and the public good almost demands that the magazines should be classified as indecent. They are classified accordingly.

The Delicate Art of Love—This is sub-titled An Illustrated Aid to Sexual Techniques. It contains a number of photos and a fair proportion of textual matter. The curious thing is that the text bears no relation to the pictures nor do the captions have any relevance to them. It has no literary merit

and lacks honesty of purpose. The pictures in the main are contrived sexual poses and once again the appeal is to the salacious. This book is also classified indecent.

Decision

It is common ground that these publications were single copies of a private importation seized at Auckland in October 1979. As the importer apparently disputed the forfeiture of the publications, the Customs Department referred the publications to the Tribunal for classification prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

A Guide to British Psilocybin Mushrooms—

Book type and length: This document is a soft covered booklet, 16 pages long. Its introduction (p. 2) describes it as relating to the cultivation, processing, and consumption of three species of hallucinogenic mushrooms (psilocybe semilanceata, psilocybe cubensis, and panaeolus foeniculii) which grow in England.

The author describes his purpose as:

To help you find and identify these particular mushrooms, to give some idea of what dosage to take, and to explain to you how to dry the mushrooms you find for later use.

The submissions made on behalf of the importer suggested that his interests lay in the book as a student of natural foods and as a vegetarian interested in edible fungi. It was suggested that the booklet's emphasis was on the mushrooms' biological characteristics as well as the fact that the booklet concerned a British species of mushroom, which it was suggested was unique to that country.

The Tribunal is unable to accept those submissions. It is manifest that the purpose of the booklet is to educate the reader as to the hallucinogenic properties of the three named species of mushrooms. It would appear that the species of mushrooms are not unique to Britain because one of the three (psilocybe cubensis) is a "prohibited plant" within the definition of those words in s. 2 of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975. Cultivation of that plant would be an offence under s. 9 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act, the cultivator being liable to a penalty of 7 years imprisonment.

Nor can the Tribunal accept the booklet's emphasis is on the species' biological characteristics. The booklet's interest lies in the chemical characteristics of the species. The chemical content of the mushrooms is important in that in their natural state all three types of mushrooms contain the active hallucinogenic ingredients of psilocin and psilocybin. Psilocin and psilocybin are classified as Class A controlled drugs in the First Schedule to the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975. Further, regulation 8 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1977, prohibits the cultivation of, *inter alia*, psilocybe cubensis for the purpose of the production of either psilocin or psilocybin.

The Tribunal considers that the booklet provides a measure of expert advice on activity which could constitute serious offending under a number of different provisions of the Misuse of Drugs Act.

As well as all those matters, there is the inherent danger that the advice provided in the booklet might encourage any of its readers to experiment with the consumption of toxic species of mushrooms in order to seek an hallucinogenic effect. Such an adventure might well be fatal or seriously injurious to health.

It also should be noted that in Decision No. 904 (*New Zealand Gazette*, Thursday, 12 October 1978, No. 86 p. 2771), the Tribunal considered publications relating to the cultivation of psilocybin mushrooms. The Tribunal on that occasion declared the material dealing with psilocybin mushrooms as indecent.

For all the above reasons the Tribunal classifies *A Guide to British Psilocybin Mushrooms* as indecent.

Home Grown—

Book type and length: The document is a magazine, 42 pages long, with a number of different articles on drug related topics. The publication holds itself out to be "Europe's first dope magazine". The articles in this magazine are quite varied. The editors of the magazine seek the legalisation of the possession and use of cannabis; there is information to drug users relating to different types of drugs, among which are cocaine, psilocybin, and cannabis. There are also sundry other drug-related articles of historical or general interest, i.e. an historical narrative of the police involvement in the breaking of possibly the world's largest LSD manufacturer; a discussion of the C.I.A.'s involvement in drug experimentation; and a discussion of the use in America of the drug laetrile in the war against cancer.

The submissions made on behalf of the importer were to the effect that this publication had the intent "of developing an historical and cultural understanding of the cannabis plant, with particular reference to its place in modern society and the law". It was also submitted that there would be no harm to New Zealand society should the Tribunal classify the publication as not indecent in the hands of persons over the age of 21 years.

While the Tribunal would agree that there are articles of general or what might loosely be described as "historical" interest, the dominant purpose of the magazine is clearly to encourage the use of various kinds of drugs, such use in New Zealand being contrary to the provisions of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975. Publications dealing with drugs have been dealt with by the Tribunal on numerous previous occasions—see Decision 904 (*New Zealand Gazette*, Thursday, 12 October 1978, No. 86, p. 2771); Decision 922 (*New Zealand Gazette*, 3 May 1979, No. 37, p. 1405); Decision 935 (*New Zealand Gazette*, 7 February 1980, No. 7) and Decision 942.

Almost all these drug related publications have been classified as indecent by the Tribunal.

The following extract from Decision 922, relating to three issues of the magazine *High Times* (which is a similar publication to the present magazine) is the rationale behind the Tribunal's classification of the publications as indecent:

The dominant effect of the magazines is the approval and encouragement of the use of all kinds of drugs with passing reference to methods and equipment to avoid detection. While not all that is contained in these magazines could be said to be indecent under the Act, the effect as a whole in each and every case is to describe, depict, or otherwise deal with matters of crime in New Zealand in a manner which the Tribunal considers is injurious to the public good.

Since the Tribunal is unable to agree with the submissions made on behalf of the importer, and since the provisions of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975 apply to all persons over the age of 14 years, the Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

Decision

This publication was referred to the Tribunal by the District Court (then the Magistrate's Court), Christchurch. Initially it was set down for hearing on 11 March 1980, but because of inclement weather Mr McDonald was unable to reach Wellington in time for the hearing. It was set down again for hearing on 22 April 1980.

On behalf of the Police it was submitted that the publication was "of such a nature in its entirety as to merit being classified as unconditionally indecent". A prosecution was commenced in July 1979 following complaints by several adult members of the community. Mr McDonald made submissions on behalf of the Students' Association and related that 51,000 copies out of 65,000 printed were sold. Out of the proceeds \$3,100 was donated to deserving charities. In the Tribunal's view the ends in this case do not justify the means. This however does not assist in determining classification.

The Tribunal says at once that the publication can by no means be called indecent "in its entirety". There is a significant proportion of the work to which no exception could be taken. As for the rest it has to be said that it is firmly in the students capping magazine tradition. It is taken up with jokes, spoofs, skits, cartoons. It is sometimes funny, usually vulgar, and always designed to startle and if possible to shock its readers. The Tribunal considers that while some members of the public may indeed be shocked there is no reason to suppose that *Ram* will have any effect which can be injurious to the public good.

Student magazines have been considered by the Tribunal on three earlier occasions. The first time in 1969 and the last time in November 1971. It is significant that the 1971 decision was in relation to *Pizzle Rot* also produced by the Lincoln College Students' Association. In the view of the Tribunal there has been a significant change in community standards since 1971 such as to render different considerations being applied to this publication. It bears in mind that in 1969 *Masskerade* was considered indecent in the hands of persons under 17. *Pizzle Rot* was similarly classified in November 1971 while *Capping Magazine Auckland 1969* was considered not indecent. Opportunity has been taken to look as *Masskerade 1969* and the *Auckland Capping Magazine of 1969*. Unfortunately a copy of *Pizzle Rot* is not available for perusal. It seems to the Tribunal that there is no significant difference between the publications of 1969 and 1970 from that of 1979. However, in view of the change in community standards since 1971 it seems clear that what was unacceptable in whole or in part in 1971 is now not viewed in the same light. On TV, in films and on the live stage there are now portrayed scenes which 10 years ago would not have been in contemplation, but which are now accepted, if not completely without comment then at least with only minor disapprobation. The Tribunal finds the publication not indecent.

Decision

This collection of books was referred to the Tribunal for classification from the District Court at Christchurch. Mr Bates for the Police made the very simple submission that these books were so plainly indecent that no further elaboration was required. The books and magazines have been grouped in numbered sections.

1. These publications contain no text and comprise a series of photographs showing both males and females having sexual relations with a donkey.

2. These are apparently published at regular intervals and deal essentially with sado-masochism. The text is a mixture of English, Swedish, and German and the photographs are all of a homosexual nature.

3. These are apparently published at regular intervals and are sub-titled "Pornography In Colour". They largely comprise photographs but in two cases (numbers 83 and 85) there is a text in two languages. The text is minimal. Some are lesbian and some are heterosexual.

4. These publications are a collection of photographs but all except *Lesbian Quartet* contain some text. The titles sufficiently explain the nature of the publications.

5. These are homosexual publications, largely photographs, but in some cases having an appropriate text. In one case (*Slide Into Love*), the text is printed in three languages—English, Swedish, and German.

6, 7, 8, and 9. These are publications dealing with heterosexual activities. In two cases (*Black C* . . . and *Cherries*), there is an accompanying text, included no doubt, to impart an aura of respectability.

10 and 11. These publications contain a collection of very young girls dressed and undressed in posed and natural positions. There is no text.

12. This booklet, without text, contains a series of photographs of a homosexual relationship.

The brief descriptions of these publications do not give any real indication of their nature. The dominant effect of each is to arouse feelings of utter revulsion. The titles of some are in themselves disgusting and the illustrations in most cases are likewise disgusting. As some have no text there can be no claim to literary merit. It would be no injustice to say that none of the others have any literary or artistic merit. No one is likely to benefit from any publication and it seems to the Tribunal that there is a lack of honesty of purpose. Indeed it would seem that they have a clear dishonesty of purpose to corrupt any reader. They are patently offensive with a plain concentration upon the prurient. They have no redeeming features and could be called the "Rolls Royce of Pornography".

In the public interest and for the public good these publications are classified as indecent.

The other volume is concerned mainly with oversized breasts but there is a significant number of photographs of the genital area, some in contrived positions. There is no artistic merit in the book. It concentrates on prurient and lewd aspects of sex and quite distinctly has a dishonesty of purpose. It is likewise classified as indecent.

With the exception of *Bushland Seduction* which has minimal text, these comprise pictures of nude or near-nude females. It was submitted by the Comptroller that the publications are devoted solely to the exploitation of the female form and that many of the pictures are artificial or contrived. The importer, Waverley Publishing Co. Ltd., made written submissions in respect of these publications. It was submitted on behalf of the importer that these publications were similar to those recently classified R18 by the High Court. The Tribunal must, of course, have due regard for decisions of the High Court and it appears to the Tribunal that where pictorial matter consists of simple nudity without undue emphasis on genital areas, an age restriction of some sort should be the classification attached to them.

In these particular cases, although there is a good deal of photography relating to the genital area few, if any, are really contrived and in most cases, consist merely of frontal nudes.

Each of these books is classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

Decision

This publication was seized by the Auckland Police earlier this year from a person who had it in his possession for the purpose of resale. It has been referred to the Tribunal for classification by the Auckland District Court.

It is printed on poor quality paper and consists of photographs of females in most cases partially dressed. There is little or no photography of the vaginal area and the publication in many respects resembles some of those recently considered by the High Court. In this case the publication which first appeared in 1972 was in the hands of somebody who had it in his possession for the purpose of sale. The Tribunal is not aware of whether he is the importer or whether he had bought it overseas and was attempting to sell it in New Zealand.

The Tribunal is inclined to classify the book as not indecent but in view of the recent decision and in view of the fact it was held for sale it feels it ought to be classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

This publication comes before the Tribunal as a result of a complaint being made to the Police by an adult member of the public. He had bought the magazine and referred it to the Police because he believed it to be indecent. Prosecution was commenced but the publication was referred to the Tribunal by the District Court in Wellington.

The publication is essentially a book of pictures with minimal text but with photographs concentrating on women with oversized breasts. There are also the usual collection of photographs of the genital area. As a matter of interest two publications are advertised, namely *Foxette* and *Big Juicy Jugs* both of which have been classified as indecent not only by this Tribunal but by the High Court. The publication concentrates on prurient and lewd aspects of sex. As there is little text there could be no claim to literary merit, nor is it otherwise redeemed. Sincerity of purpose is much in question.

The Tribunal classifies the magazine as indecent.

Decision

These two publications were imported commercially and were seized at Auckland in November 1979. Forfeiture was disputed and the Tribunal has now to consider a classification.

Swinging Nudes consists of a number of photographs in contrived positions, mostly female, but containing two frontal male nudes. The photographs concentrate on the genital area.

Nude Figure is a series of photographs with a small amount of text but, in the main, the photographs concentrate on the genital area with contrived poses.

The first publication has some text (allegedly referring to the photographic art) whilst the second publication also has minimal text. It cannot be said of either publication that it has any literary or artistic merit, nor is it redeemed by any feature relating to scientific matters. The Tribunal does not consider either has any honesty of purpose. The dominant effect is by no means to the public good.

Both books are classified as indecent.

Exchange Rates

IN terms of section 25 (2) of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank today released outer limits for rates of exchange to be used in transactions involving the conversion of New Zealand currency into foreign currencies and foreign currencies into New Zealand currency when delivery of the foreign currency dealt in will be effected by telegraphic transfer. The following range of rates, for the main currencies used by New Zealand traders in settling foreign exchange transactions, will remain in force until replaced by a new Schedule issued by the Reserve Bank. These rates do not apply to transactions for settlement after the expiration of 2 business days (forward transactions) or to transactions in which instruments are purchased which do not entitle the buyer to foreign currency balances in the foreign centre until the instruments have been delivered at the foreign centre. In the latter case interest at foreign centre rates may be deducted from the telegraphic transfer rate to compensate the purchaser for his loss during the transit period.

Trading Bank Reserve Asset Ratio

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank, acting with the approval of the Minister of Finance, hereby gives notice that as from the close of business on 1 October 1980, and until further notice each trading bank shall maintain during each calendar month balances at the Reserve Bank plus holdings of Reserve Bank notes and of New Zealand Government securities, such that the aggregate of the averages of those balances and holdings during that calendar month (determined in accordance with clauses 1, 2, 3, and 4 of this notice) equals or exceeds the aggregate of:

23.5 percent of that trading bank's average demand and time deposit liabilities in New Zealand in the immediately preceding calendar month (determined in accordance with the provisions of clause 5 of this notice).

Provided that a trading bank may make up its balances and holdings as aforesaid for a calendar month to the amount hereinafter required for that calendar month, by way of borrowings from the Reserve Bank made during the next following calendar month, and on terms and conditions to be determined by the Reserve Bank, and the proceeds of all such borrowings shall be credited to the account of that trading bank with the Reserve Bank termed "Contra Deposit Account" and on terms and conditions to be determined by the Reserve Bank.

For the purposes of this notice:

- (1) Balances held by a trading bank at the Reserve Bank shall (subject to clause 6 of this notice) include both demand deposit balances and time deposit balances of that trading bank.
- (2) The average of a trading bank's holdings of Reserve Bank notes for a calendar month shall be the average of the figures shown in all weekly returns of Banking Statistics by that trading bank under the Statistics Act 1975 received during that calendar month.
- (3) The average of a trading bank's balances at the Reserve Bank and holdings of New Zealand Government securities for a calendar month shall in each case be the average of the figures for balances and such securities held by that trading bank on each day during that calendar month.
- (4) Government securities held by a trading bank shall consist of Government stock and Treasury bills (all at nominal value) held by that trading bank.

(5) The average demand and time deposit liabilities of a trading bank in a calendar month shall be the average of the figures for days within that calendar month, as shown in that trading bank's weekly returns of Banking Statistics under the Statistics Act 1975.

(6) The proceeds of any borrowings made by a trading bank pursuant to the proviso to this notice shall be deemed to be a part of and be included in the balances held by that trading bank at the Reserve Bank on the last day of the preceding calendar month;

and the proceeds of any such borrowing shall not be included in the balances held by that trading bank at the Reserve Bank during any other calendar month.

NOTES

1. Statement of Accounting Policies—

The general accounting principles as recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of profit and financial position on an historical cost basis have been followed by the Bank.

The following particular accounting principles which materially affect the measurement and reporting of profit and financial position have been applied.

(A) Taxation:

The charge for income tax is the amount of tax liability in respect of the accounting profit for the current year.

Timing differences between accounting and taxation records are included under the heading "Provision for Deferred Taxation", with the exception of timing differences which, on the basis of reasonable probability, are expected to continue in the future. (Refer Note 14).

(B) Investments:

(a) The Bank's one third shareholding in the Northern Trustee Computerbank Limited as at the company's 31 May 1979 balance date has been treated on an equity accounting basis.

(b) Discounts and premiums on the purchase of government stock have been calculated to bring the cost price less accrued interest on purchase to nominal value by maturity.

(c) Profits and losses on the sale, purchase and issue of securities have been charged in the current year, except for losses on the sale of government stock sold to invest into new issues which have been amortized over the life of the stock purchased.

(d) A prior year provision on an estimated future loss on securities has been adjusted by amortizing the difference to Reserve Funds over the next three years (Refer note 14).

(e) Other investments are recorded at cost plus accrued interest.

(C) Fixed Assets and Depreciation:

Land is recorded at the higher of original cost or the 1976 Government valuation. All other assets are recorded at cost less depreciation to date. The cost of lease goodwill has been spread evenly over the terms of the leases. Straight-line depreciation as recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No. 3 has not otherwise been applied and maximum rates of depreciation as approved by the Commissioner of Inland Revenue have been used. This is not considered to have a significant effect on the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 1980.

(D) Changes:

There have been no changes in accounting principles used that would significantly affect profit or financial position.
