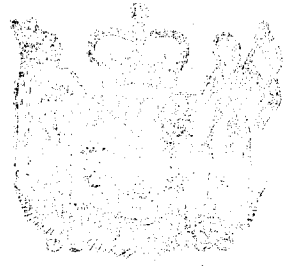
### *Appointment of a Parliamentary Under-Secretary*
