APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF ISLAND BANANAS

(a) When sold by a retailer carrying on business in any of the metropolitan areas of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, or in any of the Cities or Boroughs of Whangarei, Hamilton, Tauranga, Rotorua, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Stratford, Hawera, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Napier, Hastings, Masterton, Blenheim, Nelson, Greymouth, Timaru, Westport, Oamaru, Balclutha, Gore, Alexandra, or Invercargill—

\$1.00 a kilogram.

(b) When sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere—

\$1.02 a kilogram.

(3) If in respect of any lot of bananas the price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of cents, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest whole cent.

PROVISIONS FOR SPECIAL PRICES

6. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as he thinks fit, the Secretary, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any Island bananas to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. (d) For beer served in a container manufactured to a capacity of 340 ml and having a capacity of not less than 335 ml, 49 cents.

(e) For beer served in a container manufactured to a capacity of 300 ml and having a capacity of not less than 295 ml, 45 cents.

(f) For beer served in a container manufactured to a capacity of 285 ml and having a capacity of not less than 280 ml, 42 cents.

- (g) For beer served in a container manufactured to a capacity of 225 ml and having a capacity of not less than 220 ml, 34 cents.
- (h) For beer served in a container manufactured to a capacity of 200 ml and having a capacity of not less than 195 ml, 33 cents.
- (i) For beer served in a container manufactured to a capacity of 140 ml and having a capacity of not less than 135 ml, 27 cents.
- (j) For beer served in a jug manufactured to a capacity of 1 litre and having a capacity of not less than 990 ml:
— \$1.33 for low strength beer;
— \$1.38 for standard strength beer.
- (k) For beer served in a container other than those specified in paragraphs (a) to (j) of this clause, a price authorised by the Secretary or a price calculated as follows—

Provided that if the price so calculated contains a fraction of a cent the price shall be rounded to the nearest whole cent.

- (m) For beer sold in bottles containing less than 745 ml the authorised price a bottle ruling at the particular premises on 18 June 1981, increased by 1 cent a bottle.
- (n) For beer sold in cans:
(i) In the case of 340 ml cans, the authorised price a can ruling at the particular premises on 18 June 1981, increased by 2 cents a can.
(ii) In the case of 460 ml cans, the authorised price a can ruling at the particular premises on 18 June 1981, increased by 2 cents a can.

Decision

These publications are sample costs imported commercially and seized at Auckland in September 1980. The importer disputed forfeiture so they have been referred for classification. *Young Girls in Colour* is, in fact, No. 27 issue of *Tabu* with a different cover page. It seems appropriate that all should be considered in the same light.

The series have an average size of 8 inches by 10 inches on glossy paper and with coloured photographs. Most are photographs only of the girlie type portraying nude or semi-nude females. In the main the photographs are not blatantly offensive, indeed some are attractive. Extensive emphasis on the genitalia is absent in most of the studies. Where there is some text, it is in German. The Comptroller made separate submissions in respect of *Tabu* and *Young Girls in Colour*, but frankly, the Tribunal can see no reason to differentiate between the publications. While the Comptroller suggested an age restriction for *Tabu* he suggested that *Young Girls in Colour* should be held indecent. For the reasons already stated and because the publications are in reality the same, the Tribunal intends to suggest an age restriction. In doing so, it bears in mind the recent ruling of the High Court in *Waverley Publishing Co. Ltd. versus Comptroller of Customs*.

All books are therefore held to be indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

Decision

All these publications were sample copies imported commercially and seized in Auckland in August 1980. The importer has disputed forfeiture so that the Tribunal has been asked to classify each book. The Comptroller made the general submission which would have application to each of these volumes that they lack literary merit, that they appeal to the prurient and that the public good would not be served by allowing their free circulation. As already stated, no submissions were made by the importer.

Daughters of Pan—This is a paper back published by the Down Under Publishing Co. It is a weird story of witchcraft heavily oriented to sexual episode. Not only does it portray an exceedingly warped mind of the author, but it expresses in detail extreme violence with its sexual and witchcraft episodes. A totally crude and unpleasant book and one which is certainly considered to be injurious to the public good.

Just the Two of Us and *The Velvet Trap*—While the above-named books are by different authors and from different publishing houses; they are both lesbian orientated so will be dealt with together. Both stories are sordid and while appearing to be given over to lesbianism only, this is only a camouflage. The stories include deviate sex as the normal practise, and multiple rape with violence is graphically described in several episodes. Both books are designed to appeal only to readers with prurient interests and have no honesty of purpose whatsoever. The Tribunal finds both indecent.

The Adventures of Foxy Marten—This is a story set in Australia, and purports to cover escapades in the crime world there. Foxy Marten is a female capable apparently of anything. The book explains in explicit detail many deviate

sexual episodes, and, as may be imagined, having been set in the world of crime, the scenes of violence and retaliation are quite horrific. An unpleasant story, totally devoid of literary merit and certainly injurious to the public good. The Tribunal has no hesitation in classifying this book indecent.

The Acid Eaters—Another paper back book purporting to be the story of a film made some time ago in America. Several crude black and white photographs are sandwiched between the pages of lewd text. The story is only a string of sexual episodes, while the couples are either totally or partially drugged or drunk. The author ventures into fantasy several times, describing the hallucinations some of the characters experienced, while under the throes of drugs. The weekend orgies begin on motor bikes leaving the city at high speed and the females appear semi nude even at that stage. Continuing into the country to swim and indulge in more drug taking with sexual episodes in every other page. A quite unpleasant book; devoid of any literary merit, and certainly injurious to the public good, appealing only to the prurient. The Tribunal finds this publication indecent.

Sensuous Sirens and *Photo Book of Big Busts*—These photo books were sample copies, and among other paper back books seized by Customs last year. The former has no author or publisher named and the Tribunal is not surprised that there is no pride in the product. Both books have very little text, but what there is, is sexual and crude. There seems no honesty of purpose with the compilation of these books. The whole purpose has obviously been to arouse the salacious interest of the reader. In the latter publication emphasis is emphatically on the breasts as the title implies. The poses and photographs are crude to say the least with no dignity at all to the female form. Both books have only been published to appeal to the prurient minded of the public and certainly have no artistic merit. The Tribunal classifies these books as indecent.

Decision

These 5 publications were commercially imported by sea cargo and seized in Auckland in June of last year. The importer has disputed forfeiture so that the books have been referred to the Tribunal for classification. There was no appearance of the importer who did, however, write to say that the consignment was directed to send the books to Australia.

Each book is a paperback, published by the same firm in New York. At the back of each copy there are advertisements for other titles and a brief synopsis of each book and an accompanying mail order form.

Society Hooker, *The Joy of Hooking* and *Martinis, Manhattan or Me* are 3 similar books about prostitutes and their way of life. All 3 are but a collection of sexual encounters in explicit detail. The Tribunal would agree with Mr Leloir in that none of these 3 books have any literary or other merit and all are devoid of any redeeming features which might outweigh their salacious nature. Each book is classified as indecent.

The book *Where Have All the Little Girls Gone?* claims to be a novel exposing the true hell of life in a Mexican bordello. It also claims to be the true story of young girls forced to pass their short lives in total degradation and despair. There are graphic details of systematic rape, terror,

sadistic brutality, butcherous abortions and murder. Mr Leloir submitted that the book is injurious to the public good. The Tribunal agrees and classifies the book as indecent.

The Wild White Witch is a story set about the turn of the nineteenth century. The purpose of the principal character's journey is to be trained to take over his uncle's estate and so become his heir. The story unfolds through episodes of sex and violence. Sexual episodes are not as explicit as in the 4 previous books, but the episodes of violence are unnecessarily detailed. The book is described as a bizarre novel of sexuality and evil. The Tribunal sees the book as having no literary or other merit and lacking any honesty of purpose. For these reasons it is classified as indecent.

We the undersigned, being the auditors of the South Canterbury Savings Bank appointed in terms of section 29 (3) of the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948, report that: We have examined the balance sheet and accompanying financial statements and notes to the accounts for the year ended 31 March 1981. Our examination was made in accordance with the general principles of auditing and included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

In accordance with an accounting policy of the bank, depreciation on fixed assets has been calculated to reduce each asset to its estimated residual value by the end of its probable useful life. The rates used are those approved by the Commissioner of Inland Revenue. It is considered that the amount charged in the profit and loss account does not differ materially from that which would result from calculating depreciation had the straight line method been adopted.

We have obtained all the information and explanations that we have required and in our opinion proper books of account have been kept by the bank and the accompanying balance sheet together with the profit and loss account and the notes attached thereto give a true and fair view of the financial position of the bank as at 31 March 1981 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

Notes Forming Part of the Annual Accounts for Year Ended 31 March 1981

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

THE general accounting principles as recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of profit on an historical cost basis have been followed by the bank with the exception that depreciation is not calculated on the straight line basis.

The following particular accounting policies which materially affect the measurement and reporting of profit and the bank's financial position have been consistently applied:

1. Revenue Recognition—

- Interest received from investments includes interest accrued to 31 March 1981.
- Personal loans have been adjusted for interest yet to mature as shown in the balance sheet. The bank's policy is to add interest to the full advance at the commencement of the loan. This amount is brought into revenue during the appropriate financial years by applying the "rule of 78".
- Interest paid and accrued on depositors' investment accounts has been calculated at the full rate payable on the assumption that all deposits will reach maturity.

2. Fixed Assets and Depreciation—

- The fixed assets, other than the computer equipment, have been depreciated at ordinary depreciation rates as approved by the Inland Revenue Department. Computer equipment has been depreciated at the first year rate of 25 percent of cost price and thereafter at 20 percent of the diminishing value each year. All assets still in use are included in the books and it is calculated that the depreciation rates being used will write off the items over the period of their useful lives. In accordance with the bank's established policy no additional depreciation as provided for in the rates set by the Inland Revenue Department on the purchase of assets (other than the computer equipment) have been claimed for taxation purposes.

3. Investments—The New Zealand Government stock and local authority securities are shown at face value and are generally held to maturity. The premium redemption due on maturity of Government stock purchased under par is shown as a reserve to be brought into income either upon maturity or sale of the stock concerned. Similarly the premium paid during the year on the purchase of Government stock which is shown in the balance sheet will be written off as a loss on maturity or earlier sale of the particular stock.

4. Mortgages—Mortgage applications approved but for which the funds have not been uplifted at 31 March 1981 amount to \$1,611,305.

5. Property—The bank owns property in Timaru, Temuka, Fairlie, Methven and Waimate, and leases premises in Ashburton, Geraldine, Tinwald, Pleasant Point, Methven and Timaru. The leases have been negotiated to provide long-term tenancy options.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

Accounting policies

The accounting policies which the bank considers appropriate for the measurement of its results and financial position under the historical cost convention are as follows:

(a) *Recognition of income*—Income shown in the profit and loss account is earned in the current year. In the case of personal loans the policy is to add interest to the advance at the commencement of the loan, and to bring this interest into revenue during the appropriate financial years in accordance with the "Rule of 78".

(b) *Expenditure*—(1) Interest credited to depositors—Interest on open accounts at 31 March represents the interest paid for the year. Accounts which are credited with interest during the year have had an appropriate adjustment made for the interest accrued to 31 March.

(2) Other expenses—Other expenses, including expenditure on computer programme development, are charged to the accounts in the year in which the expenditure is incurred.

(3) Depreciation—Fixed assets, other than freehold land, are generally depreciated on a straight line basis at rates estimated to write off the cost less residual value over the useful life of each class of asset. The principal annual rates in use are:

Buildings 1 percent to 2.5 percent.

Office furniture and equipment 10 percent to 15 percent.

(4) Taxation—Taxation charged against profits for the year is the estimated expense for the year. Tax allocation accounting has been adopted by the bank for significant timing differences in respect of accrued investment income, depreciation, and capital profits and losses on Government stock purchases and sales.

(c) *Valuation of assets*—Current assets and investments—All current assets and investments are shown at cost with the exception of New Zealand Government stock.

On the basis that Government stock will normally be held to maturity, the bank considers it appropriate to record such stock at face value. Differences between cost and face value are transferred to the reserve fund at the date of purchase.

Capital expenditure—Capital commitments at balance date totalled \$1,055,000.

DIRECTIONS FOR EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

A REPORT PREPARED BY THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON EDUCATIONAL PLANNING

141 p. 1975. \$2.50

This report marks the culmination of the activities of the Educational Development Conference. The Advisory Council has recommended the directions it considers New Zealand education should go in the next 5 or 10 years.

Five principal areas are identified as requiring attention.

Education is seen as a lifelong activity, and emphasis is therefore placed on the "foundations"—early childhood education, the school curriculum and special provisions for special needs, and parent education.

Special attention is given also to the relationship between the school and the community, the need for close mutual support and co-operation, including understanding and respect for minority cultures.

A key to the quality of education is the people involved in it. Teacher education, the availability of advisory and ancillary staff, as well as resources for materials and research, have a chapter devoted to them.

Since education is seen as a lifelong activity, this is considered at some length. Facets such as accessibility, transfer of credits, and the role of existing institutions are discussed, together with ways in which continuing education could be provided for the whole community.

In discussing the administration and organisation of education the principle followed is the maximum devolution of authority and responsibility to the agencies and the community, as for instance, school committee and district level.

EFFECTIVE DISCUSSION

52 p. \$1.15 plus 35c p & p

Although originally written for staff training purposes in the Public Service, this booklet became popular with outside organisations as a guide to the conduct of meetings. FOREST LORE OF THE MAORI*By Elsdon Best*

Printed without textual alteration, the work provides an important basis for any study of old-time Maori economics and perhaps more important of his attitude to what was a major part of his environment. It will be more of general interest today than when first written, since it stresses so fully the uses made by the Maori people of their natural resources, and supplies basic materials for further studies in ethnobotany and ethnozoology. The reverence which the old time Maori showed towards natural resources mirrors the modern concern for ecological principles.

GAMES AND PASTIMES OF THE MAORI*By Elsdon Best*

The grave, goods, and bones of the ancient chief, prone in his gravel grave, with skull directed towards the setting sun, spoke with more authority regarding his race than the distorted memories of Maori tradition.

Although scholarly and technical, the book sustains throughout the drama of this archaeological discovery, and recreates from the evidence of bone and stone the life of our first Polynesians in the Moa-hunter period of Maori culture.
