Before the Broadcasting Tribunal

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of a complaint by Keith Graham Cullimore.

WARRANT HOLDER: Radio Pacific Ltd.

B. H. Slane, chairman, Lionel R. Sceats, member, Janet C. Somerville, member, Graham R. Wear, co-opted member, Gordon C. Ell, co-opted member.

DECISION

Mr Cullimore's complaint arises from a promotion, "Tucker's Turf Analysis", conducted by Radio Pacific Ltd. Mr Cullimore considered the promotion was illegal. Subsequently the Department of Internal Affairs came to the conclusion that the prize scheme was a lottery, but was not a legal lottery because it was not conducted for an authorised purpose. Radio Pacific suspended the promotion computing affair it was Pacific suspended the promotion some time after it was referred by Mr Cullimore to the Department of Internal Affairs and after obtaining legal advice.

Partly as a result of Mr Cullimore's strong feelings on this topic and the frequency and nature of his calls to the station, he fell out with members of the station staff which led to his principate to the Committee of Private Predestates with his

bringing to the Committee of Private Broadcasters a number

of other matters.

He alleged impolite language and abuse directed by Mr Bickerstaff and in particular the use of the words "You are a bloody bore", by Mr Bickerstaff during one talk-back

programme.

The Committee found that the language used was within the context of the particular programme concerned. Mr Bickerstaff, the Committee said, had a reputation as a commentator and talk-back programme host using what could be called strong and direct language. He had a reputation for being brief and to the point and the use of colourful language seemed to be a feature of his particular programme. The Committee said a programme of that type would have limited appeal and a limited audience. Mr Cullimore must have been aware of Mr Bickerstaff's reputation as he had been broadcasting in Auckland for several years and his reputation was well known. In getting involved in the programme, Mr Cullimore should have expected this type of reaction from Mr Bickerstaff. The language although borderline was considered by the Committee to be within the context of the staff, the Committee said, had a reputation as a commentator

programme. The Committee of Private Broadcasters found there was no breach of the radio standards and rules.
Rule 1.1 (b) provides that broadcasters are required "to

take into consideration currently accepted norms of decency and taste and language and behaviour bearing in mind the context in which any language or behaviour occurs".

Mr Cullimore also complained about a breach of

agreement by Radio Pacific to allow him time to (as he put it) balance the programme. It appears that Radio Pacific did agree to allow Mr Cullimore to put forward his comments on the programme and it appears that this agreement was not adhered to. The Committee found that the station did not therefore deal justly and fairly with Mr Cullimore, in breach

of Rule 1.1 (e).

The third point raised by Mr Cullimore was that he considered that Radio Pacific had prevented him from providing a balanced programme and the Committee came to the conclusion that that would have been a breach if indeed he had been cut off before being able to provide a balance.

The original cause of the situation arose from the offending promotion which Mr Cullimore considered was clearly illegal and should never have been broadcast. The station admitted the programme did carry on for a few days after the station heard of the investigation by the Internal Affairs Department heard of the investigation by the Internal Affairs Department but the Committee did not consider that of any great significance. Mr Cullimore also complained about the use of the word "report" rather than "investigation" in reference to the activities of the Internal Affairs Department. The Committee pointed out that the letter from the Minister of Internal Affairs Mr Highest referred to both investigation and report Affairs, Mr Highet, referred to both investigation and report and the Committee considered there was no real significance in the overall context of the matter.

The Committee observed that Mr Cullimore described the programme as being illegal and that he was obtaining a legal ruling from the Minister of Internal Affairs. The Committee pointed out that it was not possible for the Minister to give a legal ruling—that could only be done by a court of competent jurisdiction. All that the Minister had done was to seek an opinion from his department which showed that the programme probably did not constitute a legal lottery because

it was not conducted for an authorised purpose.

The last complaint dealt with by the Committee of Private Broadcasters was that there was no breach of privacy of the individual by the identification of the name Cullimore in a discussion between Mr Bickerstaff and Mr Tucker who had been concerned in the racing promotion in question, The Committee found that even though the reference was probably inadvertent on Mr Tucker's part it was a breach of the Act.

The Committee recommended to Radio Pacific that it write

a letter of apology to Mr Cullimore covering the three areas where it considered Radio Pacific was in breach of the Radio Standards and Rules and/or the Broadcasting Act 1976. A copy of each letter of apology was to be furnished to the

Committee for its records.

The Committee of Private Broadcasters observed that if Radio Pacific had perhaps been a little more responsive and sensitive in its attitude to Mr Cullimore at an earlier stage then perhaps the matter may have concluded without the Committee getting involved. The tone of the letter from Mr Gordon Dryden, Managing Director of Radio Pacific Ltd., to Mr Cullimore on 5 March 1980 and in particular the first paragraph was not helpful. Clearly Mr Cullimore and made his point when the programme was abandoned and perhaps his point when the programme was abandoned and perhaps Radio Pacific could have been a little more gracious in the loss of its promotion in the circumstances.

Finally the Committee pointed out that it had no legal power to award damages to Mr Cullimore.

No letter of apology was sent as requested by the Committee. Mr Cullimore first asked for a review of the Committee's findings and then referred the complaint to the Broadcasting Tribunal. He summarised his complaint as follows:

"1. Illegality.

- 2. Insulting language directed to a person identified and identifiable.
- 3. Failure to rectify a matter to the 60,000 people to whom the abuse was directed against me.
- 4. Failure to comply with the Committee's recommendations to apologise in writing.
 - 5. Advertising on a Sunday children's programme.
- 6. Encouraging youngsters to discuss betting merits on
- 7. Inducing people to subscribe to a scheme which could see them convicted.
- 8. Inaccurate and irresponsible gathering and reporting of news

9. Imbalance of programme and complainant by Mr. T. Bickerstaff." censorious attitude to

In further correspondence with the Tribunal, Mr Cullimore identified four matters which he wished the Tribunal to deal with:

- 1. The failure of Radio Pacific Ltd. to tender the recommended apologies.
- 2. That written apologies are inadequate. Apologies should be given publicly over the sports programme by Mr Bickerstaff.
- 3. That the Tribunal find in his favour in respect of the matters in which he failed before the Committee of Private Broadcasters, namely-

- (a) The illegal nature of the programme.(b) The poor standard of objective journalism which was shown in the broadcasts dated 19 March 1980.
- (c) The disregard for the enticement of listeners onto an illegal promotion . . ."

4. The advertising of an illegal enterprise over a children's

programme on Sunday 17 February.

A hearing was held to enable Mr Cullimore to put his views to the Tribunal and at the hearing he confirmed that the above matters were those which were outstanding and which

concerned him.

The hearing was attended by Mr Michael D. Jack, who had been appointed station manager for Radio Pacific. It was clear that Mr Jack was not in possession of the background and history of the matter. The Tribunal decided to give Radio Pacific seven days after the hearing to make further submissions to the Tribunal and to forward a copy of them to Mr Cullimore who would then be given an opportunity of

responding to the Tribunal.

Radio Pacific took the view that two of the decisions of the Committee of Private Broadcasters were highly questionable. They said Mr Cullimore was given a fair opportunity to state his case on Mr Bickerstaff's programme and in fact did anything the called the first time. However, he then called the so when he called the first time. However he then called on two other occasions to make exactly the same point. It was on the third occasion that Mr Bickerstaff referred to him as

'a bloody bore".

"a bloody bore".

Radio Pacific did not consider that the rules could be interpreted as being a licence for unrestricted access by all and sundry to discuss whatever takes their fancy and particularly to make the same point over and over again.

The Tribunal was told that the Committee of Private Broadcasters' decision had been received at the station but had inadvertently been filed without having been seen by either the managing director, Mr Dryden, or the station manager, Mr Jack. Steps were being taken to see that that did not happen again.

happen again. The letter written to Mr Cullimore falls far short of that which was contemplated by the Committee of Private Broadcasters. The letter had the effect of reviewing the Committee of Private Broadcasters' decision rather than tendering Private

apologies.

The Radio Pacific's letter said this-

"Although the use of the terminology may be questionable, I am unable to determine with any accuracy exactly in what context the phrase was used. However, at the in what context the phrase was used. However, at the time the statement was made, you were not identified by name, and had some rectification been attempted by Radio Pacific on air, then this could well have compounded the alleged injustice. Although Radio Pacific can obviously not apologise for the personal opinions of Mr Bickerstaff, we do express our regret at Radio Pacific being the means of conveying that opinion."

The Tribunal does not consider that that constitutes an adequate apology. It must be acknowledged that the station was not required by the Committee to apologise because Mr Bickerstaff's language breached Rule 1.1 (b), for that com-plaint was not upheld. It did find that Mr Cullimore was not treated justly and fairly. The apology was to be tendered to him for the way Mr Bickerstaff appeared to have behaved towards him on the air.

The station must assume responsibility for the conduct of the hosts of programmes. Radio Pacific Ltd. is the warrant holder. It has the obligation and legal responsibility for what is broadcast by the station. It can therefore apologise for the actions of Mr Bickerstaff and it should have done

Mr Bickerstaff's style may well be described as abrasive Mr Bickerstaft's style may well be described as abrasive. But the remark he made about Mr Cullimore was calculated to be insulting rather than to be a comment on Mr Cullimore as programme material. The station, having encouraged Mr Bickerstaff's programme style, must take responsibility for breaches of rules which follow. It was clear Mr Bickerstaff had developed an animus against Mr Cullimore and

took advantage of his own position as host to cut him off. As to the "imbalance", the Committee upheld Mr Cullimore but the station did not accept the decision. Mr Jack in his letter of apology on behalf of Radio Pacific said, "Accordingly, it is equally difficult for me to objectively deter-

"Accordingly, it is equally difficult for me to objectively determine at this stage whether we gave you a 'fair go'. If in fact, we didn't, then the station regrets that this occurred." That is not an apology. The Committee upheld Mr Cullimore. The station has apparently not accepted that decision. The Tribunal has found no reason to interfere with the finding of the Committee. Mr Cullimore deserved an apology.

With regard to the use of Mr Cullimore's name on the air by Mr Tucker, Radio Pacific wrote: "This should not have occurred, although in fairness to Mr Tucker, it was not done with malicious intent. Mr Tucker was at that stage, relatively inexperienced in talk-back radio. Radio Pacific, however, unreservedly apologises for this occurrence and for any embarrassment it may have caused."

The Tribunal does not see those statements as an unreserved

The Tribunal does not see those statements as an unreserved

apology; there was an attempt to excuse itself. Mr Cullimore was entitled to an unreserved apology.

The station raised a point which had already been dealt with by the Committee. So clearly the station did not accept the finding of the Committee in this respect. It can therefore hardly proffer unreserved apologies and maintain its position in the same letter.

The Tribunal observes that the use of inexperienced people is not in itself an excuse for a warrant holder to condone

is not in itself an excuse for a warrant holder to condone breaches of radio standards and rules. Care should be taken by the station to exercise sufficient editorial control at all times to ensure that such lapses do not occur. When they do occur the station should unreservedly accept its responsibility. The Committee of Private Broadcasters constitutes an important element of self-regulation in the Broadcasting Act. Put in a similar position to that of the Board of the Broadcasting Corporation dealing with complaints about Radio New Zealand stations, the Committee of Private Broadcasters consists of two persons nominated by private broadcasters consists of two persons nominated by private broadcasting stations with an independent chairman.

While a station may wish to reserve its position when a complaint is referred to the Tribunal and to debate and argue its case there, when a finding has been made against the station by the Committee of Private Broadcasters the station should be prepared to carry out the recommendations of that body in the spirit required.

While we were told that due to a clerical error action was

while we were told that due to a cierical error action was not taken initially, when a letter of apology was sent it proved to be quite unsatisfactory.

We strongly endorse the view of the Committee of Private Broadcasters that this mater should have been dealt with differently from the start. In particular, Mr Dryden could have replied without sarcasm to Mr Cullimore. Since there was substance in Mr Cullimore's complaint the treatment was substance in Mr Cullimore's complaint, the treatment he received was unfortunate.

We do not consider there is anything in his complaint about the use of the word report instead of the word investigation in relation to the Internal Affairs Department. Both words were used in the Minister's letter and the Committee of Private Broadcasters rightly rejected that complaint. There was no breach of the standard of objective journalism.

was no breach of the standard of objective journalism. The Tribunal does not uphold the complaint by Mr Cullimore in relation to the illegality of the programme. The Tribunal is not in a position to determine the question of the legality of the promotion. Unlike Mr Cullimore it does not see an opinion of the Internal Affairs Department as a final legal ruling on the topic (nor did the Minister in his letter). Furthermore the station dropped the promotion before the view of the Department of Internal Affairs was made known. The station may well, as a result of this experience, consider obtaining the department's or other advice before embarking on such promotions.

ence, consider obtaining the department's or other advice before embarking on such promotions.

The Tribunal wishes to add one observation. A station may, on quite reasonable grounds, find that a complaint has become a nuisance. It is quite possible that because of his persistence, his prolific correspondence and his repetitive telephone calls Mr Cullimore had become a nuisance (in a programme and administrative sense) to Radio Pacific Ltd. However, if complaints are dealt with properly and courte-However, if complaints are dealt with properly and courte-ously in the first instance, the complaint is less likely to be a cause of annoyance to the station. Mr Cullimore is entitled to have his complaints properly dealt with and, as it will be seen from this decision, there was substance in them. He might assist by keeping his correspondence concise and to the point, however.

By nature of the types of programmes it conducts Radio Pacific is likely to attract complaints and complainants. Even if complaints are made of a frivolous or vexatious nature they have to be dealt with by the station, but the Tribunal will in appropriate cases which come to it identify publicly

those complaints which it considers to be frivolous, vexatious

or malicious.

It is noted that Mr Cullimore accepted Radio Pacific's explanation in respect of the admitted broadcast of an advertisement on Sunday. This was not raised before the Committee of Private Broadcasters and is not therefore a matter on which the Tribunal can make a formal decision.

1. The Tribunal upholds the complaint that Radio Pacific Ltd. failed properly to carry out the recommendation of the Committee of Private Broadcasters.

2. It does not uphold the complaints about the illegality of the promotion, the alleged breach of standards of objective journalism or the enticement of listeners into an allegedly

illegal promotion.

Mr Cullimore was unhappy that he did not win an on-air apology for his original complaint. We consider it proper that an appropriate statement should now be made on Mr Bickerstaff's programme by Radio Pacific Ltd. That should conclude the matter.

Co-opted Members

The Tribunal co-opted Messrs Wear and Ell as persons whose qualifications and experience were likely to be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with the complaint. They took part in the hearing of the complaint and the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision, in accordance with the Act, is that of the permanent members.

Mr Turner complained about a radio commercial for the Auckland Racing Club. The following is a transcript of the type of advertisement complained about:

This Saturday at Ellerslie, the Auckland Racing Club's Air New Zealand Meeting. Derby winner Ring the Bell, Auckland Cup winner Drum and a top field clash in the country's richest weight-for-age race: The Air New Zealand Stakes. On selected races the McWilliams Wine Consolation offers a free wine to those with tickets on the fourth horse. First race starts at 5 past 12 this Satur-day at Ellerslie. Thoroughbred racing at its finest. Presented by the Auckland Racing Club.

Mr Turner's complaint was that it was in fact an advertise-

Mr Turner's complaint was that it was in fact an advertise-ment for McWilliams Wine.

The Corporation did not uphold his complaint saying the advertisement was not in the true sense an advertisement which had been "designed to encourage and/or promote the general consumption of alcoholic liquor". Its intent was to attract people to a race meeting. The fact that ticket holders are bases which come fourth were to be offered a glass of on horses which came fourth were to be offered a glass of wine was not considered as providing an inducement which

would promote the general consumption of liquor.

The Corporation did not consider the commercial fell within the ambit of the rule relating to advertisements associated

with alcoholic liquor.

Mr Turner referred the complaint to the Tribunal. He said

he believed the commercial, while purporting to be for the Auckland Racing Club, was in fact for McWilliams Wine.

The Broadcasting Corporation told the Tribunal that the intent and tenor of the advertisement clearly placed it outside the definition of advertisements associated with alcohol.

The advertisement was designed to attract people to the races. Should they have the misfortune to invest on a horse which came one away from returning a dividend then they may receive a consolation "prize" of a drink of wine. The Corporation believed that the "prize" could hardly be interpreted as providing an inducement which would "encourage and/or promote the general consumption of alcoholic liquor" as racegoes did not invest on horses in the hone that they as racegoers did not invest on horses in the hope that they would consistently come fourth.

But the test is not whether or not the advertisement is "designed to encourage and/or promote the general consumption" (although that is said to be the broad intention of the rule). The test is whether or not the advertisement complies with every one of the specific requirements (1) to (6). This one does not.

The Corporation said that no payment had been made whether in money or otherwise by McWilliams Wines to the Corporation which, the Corporation said, supported the con-

tention that it was not an alcohol associated advertisement. It is, in the opinion of the Tribunal, an advertisement which promotes a product to the commercial benefit of the manufacturer and thus is an advertisement for the wine.

It may be thought that the prohibition applies only to advertisements for the sale of alcoholic liquor. Yet plainly the rule is not so limiting. It also applies to those which mention alcoholic liquor or are associated with it tion alcoholic liquor or are associated with it.

The advertisement is therefore caught by the rule because

it does mention alcoholic liquor and it is associated with

alcoholic liquor.

After stating its "broad intention" rule 1.11 goes on:

"Therefore, only those advertisements which conform with the following requirements may be broadcast: (2) Advertisements must not use brand names as such." This advertisement does use a brand name (McWilliams) as such.

The complaint is therefore upheld.

We wish to make it clear that the Tribunal has already criticised the form of the rule and that the Tribunal is not responsible for the form or the substance of the rule.

The Tribunal has recently upheld two complaints by Mr Turner against the use of brand names. One related to radio advertising of Lion Breweries, the other to an advertisement for Dunhill on television.

Mr Turner was also justified in making this complaint. The advertisement clearly offended the spirit of the rules which

were intended to prevent brand name advertising.

DIRECTION PURSUANT TO SECTION 83 (1)

The Tribunal has been asked a number of times by The Tribunal has been asked a number of times by Mr C. R. Turner to take action under section 83 (3) Broadcasting Act, against the Broadcasting Corporation following breaches of liquor and other advertising rules. This section empowers the Tribunal to notify the holder of a warrant that it proposes to impose a monetary penalty on him or to revoke or suspend the warrant on the ground that the broadcasting station to which the warrant relates is not being carried on in conformity with the terms and conditions of the warrant of the warrant.

Subsection (4) provides that if the Tribunal is of the opinion that the station has not been carried on in conformity with the warrant it may, revoke or suspend the warrant for such period as it thinks fit or reduce the term of the warrant or may impose on the holder a monetary penalty not exceeding \$500.

Subsection (5) provides that no warrant held by the Corporation in respect of any broadcasting station can be

corporation in respect of any broadcasting station can be suspended or revoked except on the request of the Corporation or with the approval of the Minister.

The Tribunal is not satisfied that penal action under section 83 (3) should be instituted but it has examined the position up to date. The Corporation has itself upheld two complaints by Mr Turner. We have this year upheld his complaint in relation to Lion Breweries racing as well as a complain relating to the broadcasting of the brand name Dunhill in breach of another advertising rule. A complaint about the breach of another advertising rule. A complaint about the

use of McWilliams wines brand name on 1ZM has also been

upheld.

Several complaints by Mr Turner were upheld in a decision given by the Tribunal on 16 May 1980 (Decision 3/80). At that time the control of liquor advertising was contained in the rules and in Regulation 14 (3) and (4) Broadcasting Regulations 1977 (S.R. 1977/11), as inserted by Amendment No. 3 (S.R. 1978/71). The text of the regulation was also incorporated in the rule.

Following the decision the regulation was revoked (S.R. 1980/120) and the Broadcasting Rules Committee amended the rule. Immediately the Corporation resumed Lion Breweries advertisements and other types of advertising which had previously been ruled as in breach of the regulation or the

rules.

It is clear that irrespective of those instances where it could be said a conscious decision had been taken to broad-cast material in the belief that it was permitted (although subsequently ruled to be contrary to the rules and standards), there were other cases where the advertisements were care-

The Corporation had misdirected itself as to the effect of the new rule which the Rules Committee had passed.

For both reasons therefore the Corporation television and

commercial radio stations have been operated contrary to the programme rules. Under section 83 (1) the Tribunal may give to a warrant holder such directions in writing as the Tribunal thinks necessary to ensure that the rules are complied with, if it appears to the Tribunal that a station is being operated in a manner contrary to the rules made under

The Tribunal has already given a direction to the Corporation under section 83 (1) in the decision of 16 May 1980 (Decision 3/80). The Corporation was directed to notify staff responsible for accepting advertisements that the spirit of the responsible for accepting advertisements that the spirit of the rules ought to be observed. A direction was also given that the warrant holder notify staff responsible for accepting advertisements of the limitations imposed by the then regulation 14 and the Radio Rules and Standards. The Tribunal is satisfied that the necessary circulars were sent to the staff concerned.

However the rules were then changed and there has obviously been confusion as to what the letter of the rule

was let alone the spirit.

However breaches of the present rule relating to liquor advertising have occurred. The Tribunal has therefore resolved that it is necessary that the following further direction be given to the Corporation:

1. No advertisements associated with liquor or mentioning liquor or including a liquor brand name or the name of any vendor of liquor shall be broadcast unless the text thereof has first been approved personally by one of the following persons:

(a) The Director-General of Radio New Zealand;
(b) The Advertising Manager of Radio New Zealand;
(c) The Director-General of Television New Zealand;
(d) The Advertising Manager of Television New Zealand;
(e) A person for the time Berney acting as deputy for any

of the abovenamed persons. 2. All staff responsible for accepting advertisements shall be informed of this direction and that if any doubt exists as to the application of this direction to any advertisements submitted for broadcast, then approval should be obtained from the person named in paragraph 1 of this direction.

It appears to the Tribunal that the Rules Committee may

have known what it wanted to have as a rule but failed to enact it. There is an appearance of setting out with a highminded rule which is later interpreted in practice to include

unstated exceptions such as corporate image advertising.
Following the series of successful complaints by Mr Turner last year the Corporation reinstated the Lion Breweries racing advertisements immediately Regulation 14 (3) and (4) was revoked by the Government and the rules amended by the Rules Committee.

It took no steps to acquaint Mr Turner with the reasons why it considered the advertisement complied with the new rule. It compelled Mr Turner to use the complaints procedure again. If it had referred such a reply to its solicitors it may have been recognised that the advertisement offended against the new rule. against the new rule.

Mr Turner referred the matter to the Tribunal which considered further action under section 83. Since Mr Turner had lodged a number of formal complaints however, it was decided to await the outcome of the complaints and to see the basis of the Corporation's reasoning that the rule permitted the advertising complained of.

We have since ruled that the Lion Breweries advertisement was in breach of the rule.

We do not consider the Corporation should be tempted to follow the same course again. It should have to satisfy the Tribunal that any Lion Breweries advertisement does comply before it is broadcast. The following direction will therefore be given to the Corporation in respect of all its commercial sound radio warrants:

3. No advertisement containing the brand name or corporate

title Lion or Lion Breweries shall be broadcast without the prior consent of the Tribunal.

All three directions will take effect 14 days after the date hereof. This with enable a full review of all existing advertising to be undertaken.

Failure to comply with the directions or the broadcasting of any matter contrary to the directions is deemed to be a breach of the conditions of the relevant warrant. The procedure which can follow is referred to earlier in this decision.

Mr Turner has now proved a number of breaches of advertising rules by the Corporation, some for the same advertisement or the same type of advertising. It is not a record of which the Corporation can be proud. He complains, as well, that he has been fed "an orchestrated rigmarole of rubbish" by Radio New Zealand, Television New Zealand and the Corporation. We understand his annoyance.

We consider our direction, which is unprecedented, is

sufficient comment.

Exchange Rates

In terms of section 25 (2) of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank today released outer limits for rates of exchange to be used in transactions involving the conversion of New Zealand currency into foreign currencies and foreign currencies into New Zealand currency when delivery of the foreign currency dealt in will be effected by telegraphic transfer. The following range of rates, for the main currencies used by New Zealand traders in settling foreign exchange transactions, will remain in force until replaced by a new Schedule issued by the Reserve Bank. These rates do not apply to transactions for settlement after the expiration of 2 business days (forward transactions) or to transactions in which instruments are purchased which do not entitle the buyer to foreign currency balances in the foreign centre until the instruments have been delivered at the foreign centre. In the latter case interest at foreign centre rates may be deducted from the telegraphic transfer rate to compensate the purchaser for his loss during the transit period.

Notice Setting Out the Requirements for the Importation of Fresh Fruit and Vegetables (Notice No. 2620, Ag. 12/2/14)

PURSUANT to the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973, the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title—This notice may be cited as the Importation of Fresh Fruit and Vegetables Notice 1981.
- 2. The importation of seeds, stock food and related dried products is covered by the Importation of Seeds Notice 1980.
- 3. General Conditions—(i) Pursuant to the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973, the importation of fresh fruit and vegetables into New Zealand for consumption is subject to the presentation of satisfactory evidence to the Director-General prior to the introduction that the fruit or vegetable can be imported without pest or disease risk.

- (ii) The Director-General may specify any treatment to be given to fruit or vegetables prior to importation.

 (iii) Any fresh fruit or vegetable imported into New Zealand must be packed in clean new packages unless exempted by the Director-General, and accompanied by an International Health Certificate issued in accordance with the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973.
- 4. No person or company may introduce fresh fruit or vegetables into New Zealand unless in accordance with the conditions of this notice, except with the prior written approval of the Director-General and subject to compliance with any condition specified in the approval.
- 5. Custom Prohibition Orders—Under these orders the importation of bananas, grapes, citrus fruit and pineapples is restricted to Fruit Distributors Ltd., P.O. Box 171, Wellington.
- 6. Apple and Pear Marketing Act 1971—Under this Act the importation of apples and pears is restricted to the Apple and Pear Marketing Board, P.O. Box 9348, Wellington.
- 7. This notice sets out the conditions under which fresh fruit and vegetables may be imported from specified countries or regions. The Director-General may, for plant health reasons, prohibit the importation of any items specified or vary the conditions for entry without prior notice. Alterations, additions, and deletions to this notice will be notified by the issue of amendment notices.
- 8. On arrival in New Zealand fresh fruit and vegetables will be inspected by an Agriculture Quarantine Officer. If a consignment does not comply with the conditions of this notice or with the prior written conditions issued by the Director-General, or is found to be infested with pest or disease, the fruit or vegetable must be reshipped, destroyed, treated or detained as directed by the inspector, at the expense of the importer.
- 9. Persons wishing to be put on the mailing list for subsequent amendments to this notice should send their names and addresses to the Officer-in-Charge, Plant Health and Diagnostic Station, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Private Bag, Levin.
- 10. Revocation—The Importation of Fresh Fruit and Vegetables Notice 1980 (Notice No. 2347, Ag. 12/2/21, New Zealand Gazette No. 49, 1 May 1980, pages 1290 et seq.) issued pursuant to the Introduction and Quarantine of Plants Regulations 1973 is hereby revoked.

NOTES TO THE SCHEDULE

- 1. This Schedule sets out the conditions for the importation of fresh fruit and vegetables.
- 2. Unless stated to the contrary no prior permit to import is required for the fruit and vegetables listed in this Schedule as approved for importation from a specified region or country, providing the conditions of the Schedule have been complied with.
- 3. Where there is no entry in the Schedule against a fruit or vegetable from a particular region or country the Director-General has not given approval to import. Applications to import such produce, or produce not listed in the Schedule or produce from a region or country not listed in the Schedule shall be made to: The Officer-in-Charge, Plant Health and Diagnostic Station, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Private Bag, Levin, stating:

Name and address of the importer.

(ii) The name of the fruit or vegetable. If new or unusual, include the botanical name if possible and the part of the plant to be imported e.g. root, stem, leaves, or fruit.

(iii) State of the produce, i.e. fresh or dried. Specify any treatment given before export. (iv) Quantity.

(v) Country of origin—i.e, where the produce was grown. For large countries specify the state, province or region of origin.
(vi) Country of export, if this is not the country of origin.

(vii) Purpose of importation if not for human consumption.

(viii) Method of transport to New Zealand—e.g., cool or ordinary storage, ship or aircraft. (ix) Port of arrival in New Zealand.

(x) Period of the year when import is likely to take place.

An application to import a fruit or vegetable may necessitate a considerable amount of checking by the ministry of the pest and disease risk involved, including correspondence with the country of origin. Importers must allow for this delay when making application.

EXPLANATION OF THE COLUMNS AND SYMBOLS USED IN THE SCHEDULE

Column 1, common name—Lists produce in alphabetical order by the name by which it is commonly known, with the botanical name beneath. The importation of produce marked with an asterisk (*) is restricted to designated importers—see paragraphs 5 and 6 of the notice.

Columns 2-13—Each column specifies a region or country from which importation has been considered. The Pacific Island regions are identified as follows:

Pacific Is. I -- means Cook, Norfolk, Niue and Tokelau Islands, Western Samoa, American Samoa and Tonga.

Pacific Is. II—means New Caledonia, French Polynesia (Tahiti), Vanuatu, Solomon Islands.

Note—Where no entry is made in columns 2-13, no approval to import has been given. See note 3 to the Schedule. 5 / 12 J 3

Symbols Used Within the Schedule

C-means importation is subject to additional certificates being endorsed on the International Health Certificate. See Appendix for details of endorsements-C1 to C8.

I-means importation is subject to inspection on arrival and treatment if necessary.

P-means import is normally prohibited.

T—means importation is subject to the produce being treated before arrival in New Zealand. See Appendix for details of treatment T1 to T9. Details of the type and dosage of treatment must be endorsed on the International Health Certificate.

Letters in brackets—e.g. (a)—refer to notes that qualify or amplify the import conditions. See Appendix for details of notes (a) to (j).

Statement of Accounting Policies—The particular accounting policies adopted by the Bank which significantly affect the measurement and the reporting of its results and financial position on an historical cost basis, modified by the revaluation of certain assets, are as follows: (a) Foreign Currency Conversions—Overseas assets and liabilities at balance date are converted to New Zealand currency using appro-

(a) Foreign Currency Conversions—Overseas assets and liabilities at balance date are converted to New Zealand currency using appropriate telegraphic transfer rates ruling at that date.
(b) Investments—Overseas investments are shown in the balance sheet at cost. A market value is not available for the majority of investments held, the maturity value is \$NZ10.2 million, 1980 \$NZ9.9 million. New Zealand investments are shown at the lower of cost or market value (market value \$309.6 million, 1980 \$452.4 million).
(c) Exchange Rate Fluctuations—The profit or loss arising from appreciation or depreciation of the Bank's net overseas assets due to movements in basic exchange rates is settled with Treasury in terms of Section 26 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964. The loss in respect of the year ended 31 March 1981 subject to such settlement was \$9.5 million, 1980 \$14.6 million.
(d) Fixed Assets and Depreciation Policy—The Bank's buildings at Wellington and Christchurch, along with other fixed assets, are written off over their estimated economic lives on a straight line basis as follows:

1 per cent per annum. **Buildings** Other Fixed Assets.. 20 per cent per annum.

The Bank's existing building at Auckland has been fully written off.

- (e) Changes in Accounting Policies—During the year the Bank changed its accounting policy in regard to buildings and separate building reserves are no longer being kept. As a result a total of \$24.2 million was transferred to the General Reserve.

 Land held at Christchurch and Wellington, previously written off in the year of acquisition, has now been revalued to the July 1979 Government valuation creating a revaluation reserve of \$2.6 million which is included in "Other Reserves".

 In previous years all other fixed assets, with the exception of buildings, were written off in the year of acquisition. Other fixed assets purchased during 1980/81 are being written off over five years.
- 2. Contingent Liability—In respect of an investment of 250,000 one pound sterling shares in the Commonwealth Development Finance Co. Ltd. of which 50p per share is uncalled (New Zealand equivalent \$307,000, 1980 \$287,489).
- 3. Capital Commitment—The estimated cost of the new Auckland building is now \$15.7 million, of which \$11.1 million has been paid to date.
- 4. Exchange Contracts—As at 31 March 1981 the Bank had entered into Exchange Contracts for the purchase and/or sale of overseas currency totalling \$NZ1,188.4 million, 1980 \$NZ812.1 million. (The risk on these contracts is covered by the indemnity described in Note 1(c).)

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended $31~\mathrm{March}~1981$

Statement of Accounting Policies

- 1. (a) General Accounting Policies—The General Accounting Policies recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of results and financial position under this historic cost method of accounting have been adopted on a basis consistent with the previous year, except as explained in note 2 below.
- (b) Recognition on Income—The income earned is recorded on an accrual basis. Interest on personal loans is calculated according to the rule of 78.
- (c) Valuation of Investments—All investments are shown at cost with the exception of New Zealand Government Stock.

On the basis that Government Stock will normally be held to maturity the Bank considers it appropriate to record such stock at nominal value. Differences between cost and nominal value are immaterial and have been transferred to interest received or interest paid at the date of purchase.

- (d) Fixed Assets and Depreciation—Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation has been charged using the straight line method based on the economic life of the assets.
- (e) Taxation—No taxation is payable on this year's profit. The income tax effect of all timing differences between accounting and taxation records is included under the heading "deferred taxation" with the exception of those timing differences, the reversal of which are not expected to give rise to a liability for some considerable period ahead.
- 2. Changes in Accounting Policy—Interest accrued on investment accounts has been calculated at the full rate payable on the assumption that deposits will continue unbroken to maturity. In previous years interest accrued had been calculated at a lower rate which allowed for investments that did not reach maturity. The effect of this policy change is that \$12,125 has been added to the interest expense and interest accrued on investment accounts. Net profit has been decreased by a similar amount.
- 3. Prepayments—In previous years prepaid expenditure has been taken into account but not disclosed separately because the amounts were not material. This year prepayments have increased significantly and accordingly are shown separately.
- 4. Commitments—Mortgages approved, but not yet uplifted \$304 829

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The general accounting principles recommended by the New Zealand Society of Accountants for the measurement and reporting of profits on an historical basis have been followed. Particular accounting policies used which significantly affect the measurement of the Bank's profit and its financial position, are set out below:

(a) Depreciation—Fixed assets are being depreciated on a straight line basis at rates which will write off the cost over their estimated useful lives to estimated residual values. The principal write-off periods are:

In recognition of changed circumstances, certain computer equipment which was previously depreciated over 10 years, has been depreciated over 5 years to its estimated residual value at the end of that period.

- (b) Personal Loan Interest—Interest on personal loans is apportioned over the term of the loan, using the rule of 78 method.
- (c) Taxation—Taxation charged against net profit includes both current and deferred tax. Deferred taxation arises from timing differences related to:
 - (i) Interest accrued on investments;
 - (ii) Depreciation charges;
 - (iii) Interest accrued included in the purchase price of New Zealand Government securities.
- (d) Valuation of Investments—New Zealand Government and local authorities securities are stated at cost, excluding interest accrued at date of purchase. Such securities are normally held to maturity and the value on redemption approximates cost.
 - (e) Valuation of Land and Buildings—The latest Government valuation of land and buildings at 31 March 1981, totalled \$19,820,750.

3. Other Investments—All investments, other than Government stock are shown at cost price, and all are expected to realise the reported amounts at maturity.

(a) Interest on Investments: interest on investments and mortgages is brought into revenue during the period in which it is earned, rather

than the period during which it is received.

(b) Personal loans: The policy is to add interest to the full advance at the commencement of the loan, and this amount is brought into revenue during the appropriate financial year by applying the "Rule of 78".

(c) Investment accounts: interest accrued on depositors' investment accounts has been calculated at the full rate payable on the assumption

that all deposits go through to maturity.
