Exemption of Certain Motor Vehicles Owned by Air New Zealand Ltd. from Particular Equipment Requirements While Used on Specified Roads

NOTICE

PURSUANT to powers delegated to me by the Secretary for Transport under section 9 of the Ministry of Transport Act 1968, I, Robert Norman Abram, hereby exempt the vehicles of the classes specified in the First Schedule hereto from the requirements of regulations 58 to 64 (inclusive), regulations 68–76 (inclusive), regulations 78, 81 and 82 and regulations 84–87 (inclusive) of the Traffic Regulations 1976*, subject to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

1. This exemption applies to the specified classes of vehicles when they are being used within the airport and roads within the environs of the airport being a reasonable access to terminal buildings and facilities necessary for the effective operation of the airport functions.

2. *Maintenance*

That all tractors, trailers, and trolleys herein exempted have a maintenance schedule and are checked against the schedule periodically. Records are to be kept and made available to Ministry of Transport officers on request.

3. *Lights*

Tractors at all times while in operation shall display one or more revolving or flashing amber light fitted as high as practicable behind the driver, visible in all directions, and they shall be fitted with an efficient operating audible warning device. No tractor, trailer, or trolley shall be operated on any road during the hours of darkness unless it displays at least three lamps, the light from which is visible from 100 metres under normal atmospheric conditions. Two of these lamps shall be placed so as to display a white light to the front and shall wherever practicable give an indication of the vehicle width. The third lamp shall be placed so as to display a red light to the rear of the tractor, trailer or trolley.

4. *Brakes on Tractors*

(a) Every tractor towing any combination of trailers or trolleys specified in paragraph 5 of this notice shall have a service brake capable of bringing the combination of fully laden vehicles to a standstill within a distance of 7 metres from a speed of 15 km/h without assistance from the compression of the engine.

(b) Every tractor shall have a parking brake capable of bringing all combinations of fully laden vehicles so specified to a standstill within a distance of 18 metres from a speed of 15 km/h or is capable of holding the whole combination of vehicles fully laden at rest on a grade of 1 in 5.

5. *Reflectors*

All trailers and trolleys shall display approved red or amber reflective materials along the sides of the vehicle or three red or amber approved reflectors evenly spaced along the sides of the vehicle and red or amber reflective materials across the full width of the rear tray or two approved red reflectors, one either side of the rear tray. The approved reflectors may be fitted as well as the reflective materials.

6. *Towing*

A tractor shall tow no more than a rake of either:

- (a) Six fully loaded container trailers.
- (b) Six fully loaded baggage trolleys.
- (c) Three fully loaded cargo or flat top trailers; or
- (d) Six unloaded cargo or flat top trailers on any road.

7. *Operational Speeds*

The speed of any tractor, trailer or trolley shall not exceed 15 km/h on any road.

8. *Conditions of Operation*

No tractor, trailer, or trolley shall be on, or operate on, any road during the hours of darkness unless it is clearly visible at a distance of 50 metres by artificial street lighting.

The text has been reproduced unchanged but the originals of some of the figures could not be traced and these have been replaced with similar illustrations. There have been many advances in our knowledge of Maori life since this book first appeared. The work of numerous ethnologists, and more recently archaeologists, has critically examined many of the earlier concepts, confirming some, disproving others, and altering others to varying degrees. No one has yet produced a synthesis of the results of all this scholarship and there is still nothing as comprehensive as this book of Best's to give a general account of the Maori. This book was first published when Best was 68 and thus represents the accumulated knowledge of a lifetime. It has now become a classic introduction to Maori life. Its continued availability should help the reader to obtain a basic background to old time Maori life which can be extended by further reading.

The grave, goods, and bones of the ancient chief, prone in his gravel grave, with skull directed towards the setting sun, spoke with more authority regarding his race than the distorted memories of Maori tradition.

Although scholarly and technical, the book sustains throughout the drama of this archaeological discovery, and recreates from the evidence of bone and stone the life of our first Polynesians in the Moa-hunter period of Maori culture.

The title for this book was provided by Nopera Panakarero, a Kaitaia chief of much influence, who, in May 1840, believed that only the "shadow of the land" had gone to Queen Victoria whilst the substance remained with the Maoris. Less than a year later he revised this opinion convinced that only the "shadow" would be the Maori portion.

The author examines the British acquisition of New Zealand, the Maoris, trust in the Treaty of Waitangi, and their confidence that its terms would be honoured and explains it was only by accident that the Maoris were guaranteed the possession of their lands and ancient privileges.

It is under these circumstances that the book considers the use of military force in New Zealand, analyses the arguments surrounding the provision of troops and concludes that, beyond any reasonable doubt that there was never an attempt to govern by "moral suasion".

New Zealand followed the normal nineteenth century British pattern of territorial acquisition.

The book is an essential introduction to the Maori wars of a later date.

Printed without textual alteration, the work provides an important basis for any study of old-time Maori economics and perhaps more important of his attitude to what was a major part of his environment. It will be more of general interest today than when first written, since it stresses so fully the uses made by the Maori people of their natural resources, and supplies basic materials for further studies in ethnobotany and ethnozoology. The reverence which the old time Maori showed towards natural resources mirrors the modern concern for ecological principles.

First published in 1925 this bulletin is one of the series originally written by Elsdon Best, and has been reprinted without textual alteration.

Elsdon Best described it as "An account of various exercises, games, and pastimes of the natives of New Zealand, as practised in former times; including some information concerning their vocal and instrumental music".

Includes an account of musical instruments and Maori song together with games and pastimes of a relaxing nature as well as those involved in ritual and training.

Contents include: Military exercises and games, Aquatic games, Children's games, Introduced games, Maori songs and Musical instruments.

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
