**NEW ZEALAND RAILWAYS CORPORATION: GENERAL SCALE OF CHARGES
NOTICE**

PURSUANT to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981 the New Zealand Railways Corporation hereby fixes the following scales of charges and imposes the following terms and conditions in respect of services carried on by the New Zealand Railways Corporation; and hereby declares that such scales of charges and terms and conditions shall come into force on the 18th day of July 1982.

PRELIMINARY**1. INTERPRETATION**

In this general scale of charges, unless the context otherwise requires:

- “Baggage” means wearing apparel and other similar personal belongings designed and usually carried by travellers for their personal use, and contained in a bag, box, portmanteau, suitcase, trunk, valise or any other article commonly used for the purpose, but shall not include merchandise or other goods or chattels which, though being carried with the passenger’s baggage, are not designed and carried for such use;
- “Checked baggage” means baggage checked or registered with the Corporation as baggage intended to be carried incidental to a contract for carriage of a passenger;
- “Corporation” means the New Zealand Railways Corporation;
- “Corporation booking office” means a place designated by the Corporation and open for the sale of tickets on all or some Corporation services;
- “Corporation service” means any transport service carried on by the Corporation, and includes a train, a railcar, an electric multiple unit coach, an omnibus, a coach, an aircraft and a rail ferry or any other vessel operated by the Corporation;
- “Goods” means goods, baggage, and chattels of any description; and includes animals and plants; and also includes money, documents, and all other things of value;
- “Guard” means any employee of the Corporation wearing any uniform of the Corporation who is in charge or apparent charge of any Corporation service; and includes any other employee wearing such uniform; and any person who has authority or apparent authority to examine or collect tickets whether on any Corporation service or elsewhere on a railway;
- “Guide dog” means a dog certified by the director of the Royal New Zealand Foundation for the Blind at Auckland as being a trained dog of quiet disposition;
- “Hand baggage” means baggage not being checked baggage;
- “Ordinary fare” means the full single fare for an adult or child as appropriate;
- “Person” includes a Corporation sole and also a body of persons, whether incorporated or not;
- “Station” includes any bus terminal, officered railway station, flag station, platform, stopping place, or crossing-siding, and also includes the area within the station limits as defined by the Corporation;
- “Ticket” includes any ticket, document, medallion, or pass issued by the Corporation or its agents in connection with the use of any Corporation service.
- “Wool bale” means an undumped unit of wool as packed in a standard wool press.
- “Wool, dumped” means two bales of wool pressed to the same volume as one undumped bale of wool and strapped together with wire.
- “Wool, medium density dumped” means two bales of wool pressed to approximately two-thirds the volume of one undumped bale of wool and strapped together with steel bands.
- “Wool, dense packed” means a package of scoured wool strapped in a single wrapper, as packed in a dense baling machine.

PART I : PASSENGER

2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS ON ALL SERVICES

2.1 Issue of tickets

Tickets which entitle passengers to conveyance on Corporation services shall be issued at the fares specified herein, or at fares determined as a condition of a licence issued pursuant to the Transport Act 1962, and shall be used subject to and in conformity with the terms and conditions imposed pursuant to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981.

2.1.1 Right to decline tickets: The Corporation may decline to issue or renew any tickets.

2.1.2 Where tickets may be purchased: Tickets may be purchased from a Corporation booking office or from an authorised booking agency on the day or in advance of the day the passenger desires to travel.

2.1.3 Tickets to be purchased before boarding: Tickets are to be obtained before boarding Corporation services *except that* at stations where there is no booking office tickets are to be purchased from the guard.

2.1.4 Tickets purchased on a service: When tickets are issued by a guard to passengers entering a service at any station where tickets are available for purchase a booking fee of 20 cents will be charged in addition to the ordinary fare. In the case of children under fifteen years of age the booking fee shall be ten cents. When the holder of a season ticket is unable to produce such ticket for the journey being made, the ordinary fare shall be paid but no booking fee shall be charged. Concession, ten trip or return tickets shall not be issued by a guard.

2.1.5 Issue of concession tickets: Tickets on which any concession is granted should be purchased no later than 30 minutes before the departure time of the Corporation service by which such tickets are intended to be used *except that* applications for season tickets that are not stocked at the booking office concerned must be lodged with the Corporation at least three clear days before the ticket is required. The Corporation reserves the right to decline any application for such tickets if these conditions are not observed.

2.2 Transfer of tickets

Tickets issued to one passenger are not transferable to another person; and if they are used by any other than the person to whom issued they will (without prejudice to any penalty to which the transferor or transferee or any other person may be liable) be forfeited *except that*:

2.2.1 Ten trip tickets: Ten trip concession tickets on rail are transferable but where two or more passengers are travelling on one ten trip concession ticket such passengers must occupy seats in the same compartment or carriage.

2.2.2 Bulk travel accounts: Tickets issued in respect of bulk travel accounts will be transferable.

2.3 Availability of tickets

2.3.1 Routes and services: Tickets are available for use only over the routes or on the services specified on the tickets.

2.3.2 Period of availability: Tickets other than season tickets will be available for an unlimited time *except that* tickets issued for use on a particular day or time of departure will be available only for the period of the journey specified on the ticket *and except that* tickets bearing an endorsement restricting the availability for use up to and including the date endorsed thereon will be available for use up to and including that date only.

2.3.3 Expiry of tickets: The availability of all tickets shall expire when used or at midnight on the last day of the period of their availability and must be surrendered to the Corporation (e.g. to any guard or stationmaster) on their date of expiry. Tickets not surrendered on their date of expiry shall be given up at any time thereafter on demand being made by any Corporation employee.

2.3.4 Break of journey: A passenger holding an ordinary ticket for a distance of over 16 kilometres may break the journey at any point at which the service is timetabled to stop after travelling 16 kilometres from the original starting station *except that* rail suburban, ten trip concession and sleeping berth tickets will not be available for a break of journey. A break of journey will, however, be allowed if necessitated by the Corporation's services.

2.3.5 Season tickets: Season tickets will be available for use between the stations endorsed thereon, including intermediate stations, from the first to the last day inclusive of a calendar month *except that* season tickets may be issued for a broken period as provided in clause 7.3 *and except that* special conditions relate to the availability of school season tickets as provided in clause 7.2.

2.3.6 Concession tickets: Unless otherwise provided as a condition of issue, tickets issued at concession fares will have the same availability as the corresponding tickets issued at ordinary fares.

2.4 Alternative routes

Passengers holding tickets between stations where there are alternative routes will, if they have paid fares for the shorter route, be allowed to travel by that route only; but if fares are paid for the longer route passengers may travel by either route.

2.5 Separate sections

The fares for each separate section of Corporation services shall be computed separately and separate tickets shall be issued.

2.6 Return journey

The fare for a return journey shall be double the single journey fare.

2.7 Liability of Corporation

The Corporation is not liable for any loss, damage, or expense due to delays in transit of passengers whether arising from act of God, civil commotion, Queen's enemies, strikes, lockouts, or other labour disturbances (whether of employees of the Corporation or of other persons), floods, fires, accidents, or cancellation, suspension, or alteration of any timetable.

2.8 Conduct of passengers

Passengers on any Corporation service shall comply with all notices relating to the conduct of passengers while travelling on such service.

2.9 Children

2.9.1 Concession: Except as provided below, children under four years of age in the charge of a responsible person travel free; and children four years of age and under 15 years of age travel at half the adult fare which in the case of rail suburban services, shall be rounded down to the next multiple of ten cents.

2.9.2 Ten trip tickets: No reduction in the charge for ten trip concession tickets will be made for children. One or two children four years of age and under 15 years of age travelling on a ten trip concession ticket will, however, count as one adult, and each additional one or two children will count as one adult.

2.9.3 Sleeping berths: A special scale of charges may be applied by the Corporation for children using rail sleeping berth services.

2.9.4 Boarding school pupils: Pupils attending a primary or secondary boarding school may be issued with tickets at the appropriate fares for children four years and under 15 years of age when travelling to and from boarding school at the beginning and end of each school term, mid-term break, or recognised public holiday period. A certificate signed by the principal of the school, certifying that the pupil is travelling to or from school must be presented when tickets are purchased.

2.10 Welfare beneficiaries' and blind persons' concession fares

2.10.1 Class 1 war pensioners: On presentation of the appropriate free pass issued by the Department of Social Welfare, Class 1 war pensioners, and their accompanying attendants if the free pass is so endorsed, are entitled to travel free *except that* an order issued by the Department of Social Welfare shall be required to obtain a rail ferry passenger ticket.

2.10.2 Beneficiaries: Passenger tickets shall be issued at half ordinary fares to beneficiaries who hold a current Certificate of Entitlement issued by the Department of Social Welfare and endorsed as valid for travel by Corporation services *except that* a special schedule of concession fares shall apply on Cook Strait rail ferry services. Such concession fares on tickets issued for use on rail suburban services shall be rounded down to the next multiple of ten cents.

2.10.3 Blind persons: Blind persons who present a certificate of eligibility issued by the Director of the Royal New Zealand Foundation for the Blind at Auckland, and, if their certificate is so endorsed, one accompanying attendant, shall be issued ordinary and ten trip passenger tickets at half fare, *except that* a special schedule of concession fares shall apply on Cook Strait rail ferry services. Such concession fares on tickets issued for use on rail suburban services shall be rounded down to the next multiple of ten cents. Guide dogs may accompany blind persons on Corporation services at no additional charge.

2.11 Corporation employees

2.11.1 Privilege tickets: Privilege tickets may be issued to present and retired Corporation employees, their spouses and their children. Conditions for the issue of privilege tickets are governed by the relevant sections of the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977 and the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981. The privilege fare for both adults and children four years of age and over shall be one-quarter of the ordinary adult fare.

2.11.2 Minimum charge: The minimum charge for privilege tickets other than privilege season tickets shall be 52 cents single or return.

2.11.3 Season tickets: Privilege season tickets, available for one month at one quarter of the fares for monthly season tickets, subject to a minimum charge of \$4.87, may be issued to Corporation employees as provided by the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977 and determinations made thereunder, and the regulations made pursuant to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981.

2.11.4. Privilege ticket orders: Privilege tickets will be issued only on presentation of the prescribed orders.

2.11.5. Change of route: Passengers holding privilege tickets who desire to travel by an alternative route will be charged at privilege ticket rates for the additional distance, if any, involved. Passengers holding privilege tickets for a longer route may be permitted to travel by a shorter alternative route.

2.11.6 Restrictions: Privilege tickets for use on the *Silver Fern* service shall be issued at the child fare. Privilege tickets are subject to restrictions as to availability that may be imposed by the Corporation from time to time.

2.11.7 Compliance with terms and conditions: Privilege tickets are issued subject to the same terms and conditions as other tickets.

2.12 Bulk travel accounts

2.12.1 Charges: Bulk travel accounts may be opened in multiples of \$100 subject to a minimum of \$200 at the following scale of charges:

2.12.2 Availability: Account holders shall be issued with books of bulk travel vouchers which may be used to purchase tickets to the value of travel purchased, for use on all Corporation passenger services *except that* vouchers may not be used to purchase tickets for rail or road suburban services, sightseeing trips, special tours, or for motor vehicle or day excursion trips on the Cook Strait rail ferries. Bulk travel vouchers shall not be used for the purchase of tickets at concession fares.

2.12.3 Extension of bulk travel accounts: Bulk travel accounts may be extended during use in multiples of \$100 travel value by payment of the prescribed amount as set out in clause 2.12.1 provided that the last voucher in the account book has not been used.

2.12.4 Application for account: Application for a bulk travel account may be lodged with any Corporation District Traffic Manager, Area Traffic Manager, Stationmaster, Road Services Branch Manager, or Officer in Charge of a Road Services Depot.

2.12.5 Issue of voucher books: Bulk travel voucher books will be issued in the name of a firm, person or Government department. They will not be issued for the purpose of resale of tickets.

2.12.6 Issue of tickets: Tickets will be issued on presentation of the bulk travel voucher book at Corporation booking offices and authorised booking agencies only. Tickets must be held by passengers for each journey to be made. Tickets purchased using a bulk travel account shall be transferable.

2.12.7 Deduction of fare: The actual fare is to be deducted from the bulk travel voucher book when tickets are issued.

2.13 Off season tourist pass

2.13.1 Conditions: An off season tourist pass may be made available by the Corporation for use in lieu of a ticket on all the Corporation's rail and road passenger services, and for purchasing Cook Strait rail ferry tickets.

2.13.2 1982 pass: A non-refundable tourist pass shall be available at a fare of \$140 for a consecutive 14 day period between 1 February 1982 and 14 December 1982. The pass may be extended to a maximum of 28 days at an additional charge of \$9.50 for each additional day. Children under four years of age accompanied by a responsible person travel free and children over four but under 15 years of age may be issued a tourist pass at half fare.

2.14 Refund and re-issue of tickets

2.14.1 Tickets presented for refund: To qualify for a refund, unused or partly unused tickets must be presented before their date of expiry; or, where a seat has been reserved, within 3 months of the date of travel shown on the tickets.

2.14.2 Bulk travel account: Where a ticket or unused portion of a ticket which was issued from a bulk travel account is presented for refund, any refund which may be allowed will be credited to the relevant bulk travel account.

2.14.3 Defaced tickets: The Corporation does not undertake to refund money or to make allowance in respect of any ticket which has been mutilated or defaced.

2.14.4 Season tickets: No refunds will be made on season tickets or tourist passes surrendered to the Corporation during their currency.

2.14.5 Sleeping berths: A passenger presenting an unused sleeping berth ticket for refund or re-issue must do so earlier than 4 hours before the departure time shown on the ticket, in which case the refund or re-issue entitlement is as set out in clause 2.14.6. No refund or re-issue will otherwise be made.

2.14.6 Refund or re-issue entitlement: A passenger presenting a rail or rail ferry ticket other than a sleeping berth ticket for cancellation is entitled to a refund or a re-issue of the ticket as follows:

At least 7 days prior to travel date on ticket.	Full refund; or re-issue of the ticket.
Less than 7 days prior to travel date on ticket but more than 30 minutes prior to departure time shown on the ticket.	Refund of fare paid less 10 percent subject to a minimum refund of \$1.25; or re-issue of the ticket.
Later than 30 minutes prior to departure time shown on the ticket but within 3 months of the date of travel shown on the ticket.	Refund of fare paid less 50 percent subject to a minimum refund of \$1.25; or re-issue of the ticket at an additional charge of 25 percent of the fare.

2.15 Lost tickets

2.15.1 Reserved seat or berth: Refunds on or the re-issue of lost tickets may be allowed on rail tickets issued for travel on services for which a seat or sleeping berth has been reserved provided that the loss is reported to the Corporation up to and including the date and time shown on the lost ticket and provided also that the information supplied by the applicant in respect of the original booking can be confirmed to the satisfaction of the Corporation. Commission as prescribed in clause 2.14 will be deducted by the Corporation from the value of the lost ticket if a refund is made but no charge will be made where a ticket is re-issued to replace a lost ticket.

2.15.2 Late reporting of loss: Refunds on or the re-issue of lost tickets shall not be allowed where the loss is reported after the date and time of travel shown on the original ticket.

2.15.3 Lost tickets issued from bulk travel account: The foregoing conditions will also apply to lost tickets originally issued from a bulk travel account, with the value of the lost ticket, less commission, being credited to the relevant bulk travel account.

2.15.4 Lost season tickets: Should a season ticket be lost, immediate notice must be given to the Corporation. The holder of the original ticket shall not be entitled to a duplicate ticket, but a duplicate ticket may, at the discretion of the Corporation, be issued on payment of ten percent of the value of the unexpired period for which the ticket is available subject to a minimum charge of \$3.10. For the purpose of this clause, the value of the unexpired period for which a monthly season ticket is available shall be calculated at one-thirtieth of the monthly fare for each day in the unexpired portion of the calendar month covered by the ticket.

2.16 Documents

All documents relating to the conveyance of passengers shall be issued subject to the provisions of the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981. All references to the Government Railways Act 1949 and the provisions thereof in such documents after the 1st day of April 1982 shall be deemed to be a reference to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981 and to the appropriate provisions thereof.

3. RAIL PASSENGER SERVICES : CONDITIONS**3.1 Reserved seats on trains**

3.1.1 Free reservations: On long distance passenger services, seat and sleeping berth accommodation may be booked free of charge.

3.1.2 Block bookings: The reservation of a whole or half carriage may be made by special arrangement.

3.1.3 Where to reserve: Seats and sleeping berths may be reserved at a Corporation booking office or at an authorised booking agency.

3.1.4 Time of application: Applications for the reservation of seats and sleeping berths will be received at the booking office at the station from which the train commences its journey not later than one hour before the timetabled time of departure of the train and at other booking offices not later than two and a half hours before the timetabled time of departure of the train from the original starting station.

3.1.5 Services on which reservation required: Passengers may not join the *Silver Fern*, *Northerner* or *Southerner* services without a seat or sleeping berth reservation. When accommodation is available, seat or sleeping berth allocations may be obtained up to the time of departure from each stopping station.

3.1.6 Sleeping berths: Sleeping carriages will, as far as possible, be reserved for the use of passengers holding sleeping berth tickets. The Corporation reserves the right to require passengers holding sleeping berth tickets to ride in the sleeping carriages throughout the journey. The Corporation also reserves the right to accommodate any passengers not holding sleeping berth tickets in the sleeping carriages until it is necessary to make up berths for the night, when passengers who have not been allotted sleeping accommodation must move to another part of the train.

3.1.7 Occupancy of berths: Except as provided below, not more than one person shall be permitted to occupy any one berth. In no case will more than two children be permitted to occupy the same berth. The following charges will apply when sleeping berths are occupied as shown:

3.2 Corporation's rights

Notwithstanding anything contained in these provisions, the Corporation shall have the right to reserve any railway carriage, compartment, or seat on any train for any person or persons for any distance. Regulation 25 of the New Zealand Railways Corporation (General) Regulations 1982 authorises the Corporation to cancel, alter or suspend timetables at any time, and the reservation of seats and sleeping berths will be made subject to such cancellation, alteration, or suspension.

3.3 Special trains

3.3.1 Application: Special trains may be run on application to the Corporation's appropriate District Traffic Manager.

3.3.2 Conditions and charges: Special trains will be subject to conditions and charges to be fixed by the Corporation, which may require the payment of a deposit, as a guarantee, of such sum as shall be determined.

3.3.3 Right of Corporation to decline to run special train: The Corporation reserves the right to decline any application to run a special train, and will run special trains only at its option.

3.3.4 Right of Corporation to forward ordinary traffic on special trains: The Corporation reserves the right to forward any of its ordinary traffic by any special train, provided that no traffic for which the special train was ordered is thereby prevented from being carried by such train. No reduction of the special train charges shall be made on account of the train being so used by the Corporation.

3.4 Ticket restrictions

Only tickets issued specifically for use on the train services listed below shall be available for use on those services:

5. LONG DISTANCE RAIL PASSENGER SERVICES : GROUP TRAVEL CONCESSIONS**5.1 Gatherings of 20 or more**

5.1.1 Concession and conditions: Tickets may be issued for travel by all long distance rail passenger services except the *Silver Fern* service at ordinary fares less ten percent to a group of at least 20 persons travelling from various stations to participate in a specific gathering or event (e.g. conference, competition, instructional, educational or recreational activity, etc.) and also to families of such persons who may be accompanying them.

5.1.2 Applications: Applications, specifying the dates between which the gathering or event will be held, and the name of the person who will sign certificates on behalf of the organising body, should be made to the Commercial Manager of the Corporation not less than two months before the date of commencement of the gathering concerned.

5.2 "Super groups" of six or more

5.2.1 Concession and conditions: Tickets may be issued for travel by all long distance rail passenger services except the *Silver Fern* service at ordinary fares less ten percent to groups of six to ten, 20 percent to groups of 11 to 20 and 25 percent to groups of 21 or more travelling together between any two stations, provided that where children are included in the group each will count as a half for the purpose of determining the number in the group. The journey must total 100 kilometres either as a single journey or, with at least 50 kilometres in each direction, as a return journey.

5.2.2 Availability: "Super group" concessions are not available during December or January, nor at Easter from the Wednesday before Good Friday until the following Tuesday.

5.3 Youth organisations

5.3.1 Concession and conditions: Tickets may be issued for travel by all long distance rail passenger services except the *Silver Fern* service at the ordinary fare less ten percent to members of the following organisations in parties of not less than six, including officers in charge of such parties, travelling in uniform to attend parades or instruction camps:

- Boy Scouts
- Boys' Brigade
- Girl Guides
- Girls' Brigade
- Navy League Sea Cadets
- Red Cross Cadets
- Red Cross Link Cadets
- St John Ambulance Brigade Cadets

5.3.3 Lone Scouts: Lone Scouts in uniform travelling to Scout Camps may also be granted the foregoing fare concessions with exemption from the minimum party number requirement. Application for tickets must be accompanied by a certificate in the foregoing form signed by the Dominion Commissioner for Lone Scouts, or the Secretary, Boy Scouts' Association (N.Z.) Inc.

5.4 Family tickets

5.4.1 Concession: Family tickets for return travel at five times the ordinary adult single fare may be issued to parents and their children travelling together for journeys of more than 50 kilometres on long distance rail passenger services.

5.4.2 Conditions: The children travelling on a family ticket must be under 16 years of age at the time of travel, and be accompanied by at least one of their parents. The number of children in any family who may travel on one ticket is unlimited. The names of the parents or parent and children must be declared at the time of booking, and only the persons whose names are so declared may travel using the ticket.

6. LONG DISTANCE RAIL PASSENGER SERVICES : MULTIPLE JOURNEY CONCESSIONS

6.1 Ten trip concession tickets

6.1.1 Conditions and fares: Ten trip concession tickets will be issued for long distance rail services for travel over distances not exceeding 43 kilometres for any journey which is not wholly within the boundaries of the suburban services specified in clause 8.1.

6.1.2 Restrictions: Such ten trip tickets may not be used on the following services:

6.2 "Super Six" travel vouchers

6.2.1 Concession: Five long distance passenger receipt ticket copies may be exchanged for a "Super Six" travel voucher to the value of 20 percent of the total fares paid.

6.2.2 Conditions: The five journeys must have been made within a three month qualifying period by the same person and each must have a minimum fare value of \$7. The tickets must have been purchased from a Corporation booking office or an authorised booking agency at ordinary fares. The travel voucher must be used in one transaction: there shall be no cash refunds.

6.2.3 Applications: Applications for "Super Six" travel vouchers should be made to the Corporation's Passenger Manager.

7. RAIL SEASON TICKETS

7.1 Conditions for use

7.1.1 Breach of conditions: A season ticket is liable to forfeiture if there is a breach of any condition governing its use or subject to which it is issued.

7.1.2 Discontinuance of service: The Corporation is not under any circumstances whatsoever to be held liable for the discontinuance, whether permanent or otherwise, of the running of any service, or for any consequences arising from such discontinuance.

7.1.3 Surrender on demand: A season ticket is issued on the condition that it is not available for any journey unless it is delivered on demand to any employee of the Corporation. If a season ticket is not so delivered the holder shall pay the ordinary fare for the journey involved.

Passenger 7.2/7.4

7.2 School season tickets

7.2.1 Conditions: School season tickets, available for each standard school term as notified by the Department of Education, or for any school term not exceeding 15 weeks fixed by any private school, will be issued only to primary or secondary school pupils under 21 years of age, exclusively engaged in their studies and not in paid employment. The fare for each school season ticket will be \$22.30.

7.2.2 Time and day of use: School season tickets are available for use by the holders only when travelling to or from school for the purpose of receiving tuition or attending school functions approved by the Department of Education. Unless endorsed "evening" at the time of issue or unless supported on each journey by a certificate in the form prescribed by the Corporation from the principal of the school that later attendance at school was necessary for tuition or for an approved school function, they will not be available for travel by trains scheduled to leave the joining station after 1900 hours. School season tickets will not be available for use on Sundays.

7.2.3 Distance limitation: School season tickets will not be issued for travel over distances exceeding 100 kilometres.

7.2.4 Certificates: Certificates in the form prescribed by the Corporation, signed by the teacher, must be produced when applications are made for school season tickets.

7.2.5 Reserved carriage or compartment: When any railway carriage or compartment in a railway carriage on any train has been reserved for the accommodation of school children, school season tickets shall be available only when the holder travels for the whole of the journey in that carriage or compartment.

7.2.6 Use of non smoking areas: When no railway carriage or compartment in a railway carriage on any train has been reserved for the accommodation of school children, school season tickets shall be available only when the holder travels for the whole journey in a carriage or compartment or part of a carriage or compartment not reserved for smoking.

7.2.7 Occupation of seat: School season tickets are issued subject to the condition that the holder does not occupy a seat when adult passengers are standing in the same carriage or compartment. A school pupil travelling on any such ticket who fails to give up a seat to an adult shall pay the ordinary fare for the journey.

7.2.8 Forfeiture of tickets: School season tickets may be forfeited at the option of the Corporation, without prejudice to any other penalty to which the holder may be liable, in the event of the holder committing any offence against any terms or conditions made pursuant to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981 governing the issue or use of such tickets; or in the event of the holder disobeying, obstructing or hindering any employee of the Corporation or damaging any railway carriage or interfering with or damaging any equipment or fittings therein, or being guilty of any other misconduct on the railway.

7.3 Broken periods

A monthly season ticket may be made available from any date after the commencement of a month to include the succeeding full month. The fare for such *pro rata* season tickets will be calculated at one thirtieth of the monthly fare for each day in the unexpired portion of the broken calendar month covered by the ticket plus the full fare for the succeeding month.

7.4 Defaced season tickets

Mutilated or defaced season tickets will not be recognised for travel. A charge of \$2.30 will be made for replacing each such ticket provided its validity can be determined. Where the validity of the ticket cannot be determined it will be treated as a lost ticket. (refer to clause 2.15.4).

7.5 Monthly season tickets

7.5.1 Long distance rail services: Monthly season tickets will be available for distances not exceeding 113 kilometres at charges as set out in the following clause on all long distance rail passenger services except the following:

7.7 Special tuition

7.7.1 Conditions: Season tickets, available for travel over any distance not exceeding 100 kilometres and for three months from the date of commencement of their availability for travel, will be issued to *bona fide* students attending classes conducted by music teachers registered under the Music Teachers Registration Act 1928, or such other tuition (including business college classes) as may be approved by the Corporation. The tickets will be available for use only when the holder is travelling between home and the class. If used for any other purpose the ticket will be forfeited. The days upon which tuition will be received must be stated on the certificate. The tickets will be issued subject to a roll of attendance open for inspection by any employee of the Corporation being kept at each school or class.

7.7.2 Certificates: Certificates in the prescribed form, signed by the teacher, must be produced when applications are made for tickets under this section.

7.7.3 Fares: Special tuition season tickets shall be charged as follows:

8.2.2 Combined ARA-NZR passenger tickets: Tickets issued at the fares fixed jointly from time to time by the Corporation and the Auckland Regional Authority for combined bus and rail travel shall be deemed to be Corporation suburban rail passenger tickets, and shall entitle the holders of such adult or child tickets to travel without the payment of any additional fare between Auckland and Wiri, either via Newmarket or Orakei, and any intermediate stations between Auckland and Wiri, and between Auckland and Ranui, and any intermediate stations between Auckland and Ranui, but such combined bus and rail tickets shall not be available for any other rail journey whatsoever, unless otherwise authorised from time to time by the Corporation.

9. COOK STRAIT RAIL FERRIES PASSENGER SERVICES**9.1 Tickets**

Tickets may be purchased for passenger travel on the Cook Strait rail ferry service between Wellington and Picton from a Corporation booking office or from an authorised booking agency. Bookings may be made in any calendar month for travel during the subsequent six calendar months.

9.2 Fares

Tickets which entitle the holders to travel on specific sailings of the Cook Strait rail ferry service shall be issued at the following fares:

9.2.1 Ordinary single fares:

9.2.2 Day excursion fares: Day excursion tickets, available for return travel on the Cook Strait rail ferries between Wellington and Picton on the day of issue only, shall be issued at the following fares only at the Corporation's Wellington and Picton wharf terminal booking offices.

9.2.3 Welfare beneficiaries and blind persons: Ordinary single and day excursion Cook Strait rail ferry tickets shall be issued at the following concession fares, and subject to the same terms and conditions as for tickets issued at full fare, to welfare beneficiaries, blind persons and attendants who are normally entitled to travel at half fare as provided in clause 2.10.

9.3 "Super Six" travel vouchers

9.3.1 Concession: Five Cook Strait rail ferry passenger receipt ticket copies may be exchanged for a "Super Six" travel voucher to the value of 20 percent of the total fares paid.

9.3.2 Conditions: The five journeys must have been made within a three month qualifying period by the same person. The tickets must have been purchased from a Corporation booking office or an authorised booking agency at ordinary fares. The travel voucher must be used in one transaction: there shall be no cash refunds.

9.3.3 Applications: Applications for "Super Six" travel vouchers should be made to the Corporation's Passenger Manager.

10. PASSENGERS' BAGGAGE**10.1 Carriage of Goods Act 1979**

Passengers' baggage is carried in accordance with the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

10.2 Free allowance

Passengers will be granted free conveyance, subject to the provisions of clause 11, relating to checked baggage, of their *bona fide* personal baggage as follows:

Per adult paying passenger—two items of baggage.

Per child travelling at half fare—one item of baggage.

Families travelling on family tickets (clause 5.4)—maximum of five items of baggage.

Invalids wheelchairs (motor or hand propelled) accompanying passengers.

Prams and pushchairs accompanying passengers.

Passenger 10.3/10.10

10.3 Corporation's right to determine free baggage

The Corporation reserves the right to determine whether any package or article (other than *bona fide* personal baggage) may be carried free as baggage under the provisions of clause 10.2. In particular, the Corporation reserves the right to levy additional charges for light and bulky packages of passengers' baggage. The Corporation may refuse any articles which, from their bulky or objectionable character it is inexpedient to carry as passengers' baggage. Such packages must be consigned, and will be carried and charged for at parcels or goods rates as may be appropriate.

10.3.1 Articles not accepted as free baggage: The following articles shall not be included in a passenger's free baggage allowance and shall be treated as excess baggage:

- Any package exceeding 100 kilograms in weight or 0.5 cubic metres in measurement,
- Bedsteads, mattresses and stretchers,
- Bicycles and power cycles,
- Bulky musical instruments,
- Carpets,
- Dogs (tethered or in boxes) other than guide dogs (refer to clause 2.10.3),
- Furniture,
- Glassware,
- House fittings,
- Kerosene and similar mineral oils,
- Linoleum,
- Liquor,
- Live poultry or livestock,
- Motor cycles,
- Sewing machines,
- Surfboards,
- Tents and poles.

10.3.2 Baggage to be personal property: No person shall send or carry as baggage any packages containing goods that are for sale or are other than his own *bona fide* property.

10.3.3 Dangerous goods: Packages of a dangerous character or liable to cause damage to other goods shall not be accepted for storage or carriage as baggage.

10.4 Employees' responsibilities

Corporation employees are not permitted to act as agents or to undertake the charge of or accept responsibility in respect of baggage left temporarily on Corporation premises, unless the baggage has been delivered to the custody of the Corporation at the baggage room.

10.5 Corporation's responsibilities

The Corporation does not undertake to forward baggage of any description by any particular Corporation service and will not be responsible for any baggage or parcels left about Corporation premises and not duly delivered to the custody of the Corporation at the baggage room.

10.6 Baggage taken into passenger compartment

No hand baggage shall be allowed to be taken into the passenger compartment of a Corporation service unless it can be placed in a rack without inconvenience to other passengers, nor shall any person take into or carry in a Corporation service any baggage which the guard may deem to be inconvenient or objectionable.

10.7 Destination

Except as otherwise provided no person shall send any baggage to any station beyond the destination station for which his ticket is available.

10.8 Packaging and addressing

Each package must be in good order and, when presented for carriage, be distinctly addressed with the name of the passenger and the destination station to which the passenger is travelling. All old labels must have been removed and each package locked or otherwise properly secured. The Corporation may refuse to accept for carriage any package of baggage that does not comply with the foregoing conditions. Trunks, suitcases, bags, and other baggage containers must be such as, in the opinion of the Corporation, will enable the packages to withstand the ordinary incidence of transport without sustaining damage.

10.9 Liability of passengers

Passengers shall make good all damage to Corporation property or other goods arising from baggage unfit for carriage or storage being handed to the Corporation.

10.10 Insurance

For insurance of baggage to be carried at "declared value risk" within the meaning of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979, see clause 20.

10.11 Hand baggage on Cook Strait rail ferries

Passengers embarking at Wellington or Picton for journeys by rail ferry only shall, when required to do so by the Corporation, deposit unchecked baggage on special baggage trailers or other vehicles situated at the wharf terminals for the conveyance of passengers' baggage. Unclaimed baggage shall be treated as lost baggage.

11. CHECKED BAGGAGE**11.1 Conditions**

Passengers may have their baggage checked for carriage from and to attended stations where facilities for checking baggage are provided to the extent of the rail, road and rail ferry tickets held as follows:

11.2 Liability

Subject to the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 the Corporation will not be liable for loss of or damage or delay to any checked baggage, if such loss, damage, or delay occurs after the same has been placed in the possession, custody, or control of any carrier other than the Corporation whether by land, water, or air, or of any harbour board, warehouseman, or other person, notwithstanding that the baggage may have been accepted for checking to a station on a different section of railway, or to a place that is not on the railway, nor will the Corporation be liable for any delay caused by failure to place any such baggage in the possession, custody, or control of any such carrier, harbour board, warehouseman or other person as aforesaid.

11.3 Presenting baggage for checking

Baggage to be checked must (without prejudice to the provisions regarding excess baggage) be delivered at least 15 minutes before the due time of departure of the service by which it is to be conveyed. The person presenting baggage to be checked must obtain a baggage check for each package.

11.4 Rail ferry checked baggage

Passengers embarking at Wellington or Picton for journeys by rail ferry only, may check their baggage at the railway station or wharf office prior to departure of the ship for collection at either the wharf terminal or the railway station at Picton or Wellington as the case may be. Baggage checked under this provision must be delivered to Wellington or Picton railway station as applicable not less than two hours before sailing time. Baggage checked at either wharf terminal office will be accepted up to 30 minutes prior to sailing time.

11.5 Delivery of checked baggage

Except as provided in clause 11.6 no checked baggage shall be delivered until the check has been surrendered. Delivery by the Corporation of any checked baggage to the person surrendering checks and acceptance of delivery by such person shall discharge the Corporation of any liability in respect of the baggage. The Corporation reserves the right to decline to deliver checked baggage at any station other than the original destination station of such baggage.

11.6 Lost checks

Any person claiming delivery of any checked baggage and who is unable to produce the check owing to it having been lost, may be required to make at his own cost, a declaration under the Oaths and Declarations Act 1957, setting forth the number of the baggage check lost, the description of such package and its contents, and such other information as the Corporation may require. Before delivery the claimant may be required to indemnify the Corporation against any loss or claim that may arise as a result of delivery and to furnish such other proofs of title to delivery of the baggage as the Corporation may require.

11.7 Storage

Checked baggage not claimed within five days of arrival at destination stations will be treated as lost baggage and stored in accordance with the provisions of clause 13.

11.8 Unclaimed baggage

Checked baggage not claimed within three months after arrival at destination may be sold.

12. EXCESS BAGGAGE

12.1 Liability for excess baggage

Excess baggage shall be charged at the rates set out hereunder computed on the distance as provided in the Corporation's published distance tables for the North and South Islands between the points of travel covered by the ticket(s) held. In the case of inter-island travel each island will be charged for separately. Excess baggage charges shall be payable in respect of the following:

12.1.1 Articles not entitled to be carried free: Articles which are not entitled to be carried free as a portion of a passenger's baggage allowance (refer to clause 10.3).

12.1.2 Excess articles: All articles in excess of the number entitled to be checked free in accordance with the fares paid (refer to clause 10.2).

12.2 Presentation in advance of departure

Baggage on which excess charges are payable must be presented at the station at least 30 minutes before the due time of departure of the service by which it is to be forwarded.

12.3 Charges to be prepaid

All charges payable on excess baggage must be prepaid and the person presenting such baggage must obtain an excess baggage ticket as a receipt for the charges paid, such ticket to be given up when the baggage is claimed. Passengers who fail to produce excess tickets for baggage on which excess charges are payable may be required to pay such charges before the baggage is delivered.

12.4 Payments to guard

In the case of baggage on which excess charges are payable being forwarded from a station where no provision is made for the excessing of such baggage, the excess charge must be paid to the guard who will issue a ticket for the amount received.

12.5 Excess baggage receipt

An excess baggage ticket is only a receipt for charges paid.

12.6 Bicycles, power cycles, motor cycles and dogs

Bicycles, power cycles, motor cycles or dogs (tethered or in boxes) accompanying passengers by rail, or road services will not be accepted as excess baggage and must be consigned at "owner's risk" as parcels traffic *except that* guide dogs may accompany blind passengers at no additional charge (refer to clause 2.10.3).

12.6.1 Bicycles on rail ferries: Bicycles, accompanying passengers, presented at the wharf terminal, Wellington or Picton, and ridden or wheeled on and off the vessel by passengers shall be conveyed at "owners risk" (bicycles not ridden or wheeled on to the vessel by passengers must be consigned as parcels traffic).

12.6.2 Power and motor cycles on rail ferries: Power and motor cycles accompanying passengers on the rail ferries shall be charged as vehicles as provided in clause 19.1.

12.6.3 Dogs on rail ferries: The charge for dogs accompanying passengers and led on and off the vessel by the passengers shall be as provided in clause 12.7.2 except that dogs may be left in the owner's vehicle at no charge as provided in clause 16.6.

12.7 Rates

12.7.1 Rail: Excess baggage on rail passenger services shall be charged at the following rates:

13. LOST BAGGAGE

13.1 Storage charges

Baggage or other packages or articles, left in a Corporation service or left unclaimed on Corporation premises, shall be treated as lost baggage and charged storage at the following rates:

13.2 Clearance of Corporation premises

Corporation premises and services shall be cleared after the arrival and departure of each service and all baggage, checked or excess, or other packages or articles found and not immediately claimed shall be treated as lost baggage except that checked baggage will be held subject to clause 11.7.

13.3 Sale of lost baggage

Baggage or other packages or articles left or left unclaimed on Corporation premises and to which the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 do not apply, and which are not claimed within three months after the time when first placed into storage as lost baggage, may be sold.

13.4 Liability of Corporation

The Corporation shall not be liable with respect to any package or article of lost baggage to which the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 do not apply.

14. LEFT BAGGAGE**14.1 Storage conditions**

Hand, checked or excess baggage, may be accepted for storage free of charge prior to, or immediately following a rail, road services or rail ferry journey as evidenced by presentation of an appropriate new or used rail, road services or rail ferry ticket.

14.2 Acceptance for storage

The Corporation reserves the right to decline to accept any article or package into its custody for storage.

14.2.1 Baggage not accepted: The following articles shall not be accepted:

- Articles of an inflammable, explosive, or dangerous nature,
- Articles which are wet or leaking,
- Articles emitting an offensive smell,
- Live animals or birds,
- Loaded firearms.

14.2.2 Inadvertent acceptance: Should any such articles be inadvertently accepted they may, on being found to be within the categories mentioned, be removed and stored, or otherwise suitably dealt with as the Corporation may determine, at the sole risk and cost of the depositor or owner.

14.2.3 Perishable articles: The Corporation does not undertake to accept perishable articles for storage, but where a person specially desires any perishable articles to be so stored they may be accepted subject to the special condition that the Corporation shall not be liable for any damage or loss that may arise in connection with such deposit.

14.3 Left baggage label

14.3.1 Issue of label: At the time of presentation of such baggage or articles to be left in the custody of the Corporation, a baggage label marked "left baggage" shall be issued which must be correctly filled in by the passenger or owner with name, address, and destination. The Corporation employee accepting such baggage shall attach the tie-on portion of the label to the article and hand the tear-off butt to the owner or passenger for retention.

14.3.2 Baggage label required: No article or package shall be considered as having been left in the custody of the Corporation for storage unless the person desiring to deposit such article or package shall have handed it over to the Corporation and received the tear-off butt of the left baggage label issued by the Corporation in respect of such article or package. The Corporation shall not be bound to hand over any article or package left in its custody for storage except on production of the butt issued in respect thereof and on payment of all charges which may have become payable.

14.3.3 Delivery: Delivery by the Corporation of any baggage left in its custody for storage to the person producing and surrendering the appropriate butt shall discharge the Corporation of its obligation in respect of such baggage.

14.3.4 Lost butt: Any person claiming delivery of any baggage that is in the custody of the Corporation for storage and who has lost the tear-off butt of the left baggage label applicable to such baggage may, before such baggage is delivered, be required to make at that person's own cost a statutory declaration setting forth the number of such lost butt, a description of the baggage and contents of which delivery is claimed, and such other information as the Corporation may require. The claimant may also be required to indemnify the Corporation against any loss or claim that may arise as a result of delivery to such person, and to furnish such other proof of title to such package as the Corporation may require. Should the information furnished by the claimant as proof of title be insufficient or unsatisfactory to the Corporation, delivery of such package may be withheld and the Corporation shall not be liable for any inconvenience or loss that may result from the delivery being so withheld.

14.4 Left baggage becoming lost baggage

Baggage, packages, or articles left in the custody of the Corporation for storage and not claimed within one week shall be treated as lost baggage and dealt with under the provisions of clause 13.

14.5 Liability of Corporation

The liability of the Corporation in respect of each article or package deposited as aforesaid, is hereby limited to \$200.00.

PART II : VEHICLES ON RAIL FERRIES

15. TERMS AND CONDITIONS**15.1 Service provided**

Subject to the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 and the terms and conditions relating to the carriage of goods in clause 20, and subject also to the terms and conditions contained in any rail ferry ticket or waybill relating to carriage on the rail ferries, motor vehicles, including trailers, caravans, motor cycles, power cycles, and motor scooters may be conveyed on their own wheels on the Cook Strait rail ferry service at the rates and on the conditions hereinafter specified.

15.2 Drivers required

Each motor vehicle must be accompanied by a driver who shall drive the vehicle on and off the ship. Once the vehicle has been positioned on the deck the driver and any accompanying passengers must move to the passenger accommodation and remain there for the duration of the voyage. The Corporation does not undertake the driving of motor vehicles to or from vessels except in a case of emergency when a charge shall be levied.

15.3 Trailers

Trailers and caravans must be towed on and off the ship and remain coupled to the towing vehicle throughout the voyage.

15.4 Passenger ticket required

Drivers, attendants and passengers accompanying motor vehicles must pay the appropriate fare and at least one adult passenger ticket must be issued for each vehicle except for those vehicles which have no driver accommodation (e.g. trailers, caravans, etc.).

15.5 Transfer of tickets and waybills

Tickets and waybills issued for road vehicles are not transferable. If the ticket or waybill is used for any vehicle other than the vehicle for which it was issued, the ticket or waybill shall (without prejudice to any penalty to which the transferer or transferee, or any other person, may be liable) be forfeited.

15.6 Transfer to other sailing

Motor vehicle tickets or waybills may be transferred from one sailing to another provided that the transfer is requested more than 24 hours prior to sailing time.

15.7 Registration required

Every vehicle conveyed on its own wheels on the Cook Strait rail ferry service must display a current registration licence issued under the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Registration and Licensing Regulations 1965.

15.8 Reservations

15.8.1 Other than commercial: Applications for reservation of deck space for other than commercial vehicles may be made at a Corporation booking office or at an authorised booking agency.

15.8.2 Commercial: Applications for reservations of deck space for commercial motor vehicles may be made at any railway station where there is an officer in charge.

15.8.3 Bookings in advance: Bookings may be made in any calendar month for travel in any of the subsequent six calendar months.

15.8.4 Space allocated: Motor vehicles shall be carried either on the upper decks or on the rail decks of the vessels at the discretion of the Corporation.

15.9 Refunds and re-issues

15.9.1 Tickets presented for refund: When a motor vehicle ticket or waybill is purchased and subsequently found not to be required, a refund of the amount paid less commission where applicable may be allowed, provided that the ticket or waybill with application for refund is lodged with the Corporation not later than three months from the date of travel shown on the original ticket or waybill.

15.9.2 Defaced tickets: The Corporation does not undertake to refund money or to make allowance in respect of any ticket or waybill which has been mutilated or defaced.

15.9.3 Refund entitlement: A passenger presenting a vehicle ticket or waybill for cancellation is entitled to a refund or a re-issue of the ticket or waybill as follows:

Ticket or Waybill Presented	Entitlement
At least 7 days prior to date of sailing.	Full refund; or re-issue for another sailing at no additional charge
Less than 7 days prior to date of sailing but more than 30 minutes prior to departure.	Refund of fare paid less 10 percent; or re-issue for another sailing at no additional charge.
Later than 30 minutes prior to departure but within 3 months after the date of sailing.	Refund of fare paid less 50 percent; or re-issue for a later sailing at an additional charge of 25 percent of the fare.

15.10 Lost tickets

Refunds or re-issue of lost vehicle tickets or waybills may be allowed on vehicle tickets or waybills issued for travel on rail ferry services for which space has been reserved provided that the loss is reported to the Corporation up to and including the date and time of sailing shown on the lost ticket or waybill and provided also that the information supplied by the applicant in respect of the original booking can be confirmed to the satisfaction of the Corporation. An administration fee of 10 percent shall be deducted by the Corporation from the value of the lost ticket or waybill at the time of refund. No such charge will be made where a ticket or waybill is re-issued to replace a lost ticket.

15.11 Tie downs required on heavy vehicles

Vehicles exceeding 3.5 tonnes gross weight must be fitted with tie-down and jacking points to enable them to be secured to the deck of the vessel.

16. RESTRICTIONS**16.1 Transport Act 1962**

The Corporation may refuse to accept or carry any vehicles on the rail ferry service which at the time of embarkation on any rail ferry is a passenger service or taxicab service or rental service or goods service vehicle within the meaning of the Transport Act 1962, which is being used to carry on any such service or which is being used to carry on a service deemed to be a goods service for the purposes of that Act, and which is being used for any such service otherwise than pursuant to the authority and in conformity with the terms of a passenger service licence or a taxicab service licence or a rental service licence or a goods service licence or is being used otherwise than in conformity with provisions of the Transport Act 1962 and the regulations made thereunder.

16.2 Unsafe vehicles

The Corporation may refuse to accept or carry any vehicle considered by the Corporation or the Master of a vessel to be insecurely loaded or in any other way not safe for transit.

16.3 Loose containers of hazardous substances

No loose containers of petrol or other flammable or hazardous substances are to be loaded in any vehicle.

16.4 Fuels other than petrol, diesel, L.P.G. or C.N.G.

When a vehicle is powered by fuels other than petrol, diesel, L.P.G. or C.N.G. it must be certified as safe and roadworthy by the appropriate authority. Any such vehicles may be subjected to inspection prior to shipment.

16.5 Livestock

The carriage of livestock in motor vehicles on the Cook Strait rail ferries is subject to the terms and conditions set out in clause 43.

16.6 Dogs, cats, birds, etc.

Dogs, cats, birds in cages, or other small domestic animals, the property of motor vehicle owners who are passengers on the vessel, will not be accepted for carriage, *except that* domestic pets of this kind may be left in the owner's motor vehicle free of charge at the owner's risk and must not be removed from the vehicle during the voyage.

16.7 Hazardous substances

The carriage of hazardous substances in motor vehicles on the Cook Strait rail ferries is subject to the terms and conditions set out in clause 72. With the exception of petrol, L.P.G. or C.N.G. carried in the fuel tanks, hazardous substances shall not be accepted for conveyance on any road vehicle without the prior authority of the Corporation's Manager, Air/Sea Services.

16.7.1 Empty road tankers: Empty road tankers, and similar vehicles used for the transport of motor spirit, or like commodity, shall not be conveyed on the Cook Strait rail ferries unless accompanied by a certificate, issued by a qualified industrial chemist, to the effect that the vehicle is gas free. Empty road tankers, and similar vehicles used for the transport of motor spirit or like commodity, not accompanied by a certificate issued to the effect that the vehicles and tanks are gas free, shall be treated as hazardous substances and conveyed on *Arahanga* only and subject to the approval of the Corporation's Manager, Air/Sea Services.

17. METHOD OF CHARGING**17.1 Rental vehicles**

The Corporation may require the contract of hire to be produced in cases where motor vehicles hired from a rental company are to be charged at table A rates (refer to clause 18.3).

17.2 Commercial vehicle measurement

Commercial vehicle charges shall be determined from declared measurements or, if practical, shall be measured.

17.2.1 Pantechincons and trailers: The measurement of pantechincons to be taken on overall length, bumper to bumper. If a trailer is towed, the overall length shall be measured from the front of the towing unit to the rear of the trailer (including any projection) and including the drawbar.

17.2.2 Average height of load: The formula for ascertaining the average height of load on a vehicle is:

$$\frac{\text{cubic measurement of load on tray}}{\text{square measurement of tray}} \quad (\text{i.e.; } m^3 \div m^2)$$

17.3 Motor car, station wagon, utility, and van lengths

Motor cars, station wagons, utilities and vans with projections such as baggage carriers and extra bumpers fitted additionally to standard models shall be charged on factory specification lengths.

17.3.1 Caravan and trailer couplings: Caravan and trailer couplings fitted to such vehicles will not be regarded as projecting fixtures. However, for charging purposes, the measurement of caravans and trailers shall include the towbar fitted to the front of the caravan or trailer.

17.3.2 Factory length unknown: If the factory specification length of a motor car, station wagon, etc., is not known, such vehicle shall be charged on either the declared overall length or, if practical, it shall be measured and charged on the actual overall length.

17.3.3 Attachments: Canoes, small boats, rowing shells, baggage, etc. attached to the top of a vehicle but not protruding beyond either end of the vehicle may be conveyed without any additional charge. However, if the attachment protrudes beyond either end, the charge for the carrying vehicle shall be based on the overall length of the vehicle and attachment.

PART III : GOODS

20. TERMS AND CONDITIONS ON ALL SERVICES

Goods shall be carried and incidental services performed on Corporation services at the charges specified hereinafter, or at charges determined as a condition of a licence issued pursuant to the Transport Act 1962 *except that* the Corporation may, as provided in the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981, fix special scales of charges and impose special terms and conditions in addition to or in lieu of the ordinary ones. Goods shall be carried in conformity with the terms and conditions imposed pursuant to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981 and in accordance with the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

20.1 Kinds of carriage

Section 8 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 provides as follows:

“8. Kinds of contract of carriage—(1) for the purpose of determining upon whom liability for the loss of or damage to any goods is to fall every contract of carriage shall be one of the following kinds:

(a) A contract for carriage “at owner’s risk”, under which the carrier shall not be liable for the loss of or damage to any goods, except where the loss or damage is intentionally caused by the carrier:

(b) A contract for carriage “at limited carrier’s risk”, under which the carrier shall be liable for the loss of or damage to any goods in accordance with sections 9, 14, and 15 of this Act:

(c) A contract for carriage “at declared value risk”, under which the carrier shall be liable for the loss of or damage to any goods up to an amount specified in the contract and otherwise in accordance with sections 9, 14, and 15 of this Act:

(d) A contract for carriage “on declared terms”, under which the carrier shall be liable for the loss of or damage to any goods in accordance with the specific terms of the contract.

(2) Subject to the succeeding provisions of this section, where in any contract of carriage the term “at owner’s risk” or the term “at limited carrier’s risk” or the term “at declared value risk” or the term “on declared terms” is used, the contract shall be deemed for the purpose of this Act to be one to which paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) or paragraph (c) or paragraph (d) (as the case may require) of subsection (1) of this section applies.

(3) Subject to the succeeding provisions of this section, the kind of contract of carriage to be entered into in a particular case is a matter for agreement between the parties.

(4) Where the contract does not purport to be of a particular kind, it shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to be a contract for carriage “at limited carrier’s risk”.

(5) No contract of carriage purporting to be a contract for carriage “at owner’s risk” shall have effect as such (but instead shall have effect as a contract for carriage “at limited carrier’s risk”) unless—

(a) The contract is—

(i) In writing; and

(ii) Expressed to be “at owner’s risk”; and

(iii) Signed by the parties or their agents; or

(b) Before or at the time when, the goods are accepted for carriage, the contracting party or his agent signs a statement in the following terms:

“These goods are to be carried at “owner’s risk”. This means that the carrier will pay no compensation if the goods are lost or damaged, unless he intentionally loses or damages them.”

For the purposes of this paragraph, that statement may be included in the consignment note or any other document relating to the carriage, but in that case the statement shall be conspicuous and shall be separately signed by the contracting party or his agent.

(6) No contract of carriage purporting to be a contract “at declared value risk” shall have effect as such (but instead shall have effect as a contract for carriage “at limited carrier’s risk”) unless the contract is in writing.

(7) No contract of carriage purporting to be a contract for carriage “on declared terms” shall have effect as such (but instead shall have effect as a contract for carriage “at limited carrier’s risk”) unless the contract is—

(a) Freely negotiated between the parties; and

(b) In writing; and

(c) Signed by the parties or their agents.

(8) Where, in any proceeding, the question of whether any contract of carriage was or was not freely negotiated is in issue, the Court in determining that question shall have regard to the following matters:

(a) The respective bargaining strengths of the parties;

(b) The course of dealing between the parties in respect of the particular transaction in question, and any other transactions between them;

- (c) *The value of the transaction;*
- (d) *Any extraordinary features of the goods to be carried or the route over which they are to be carried;*
- (e) *Any other matters that the Court considers may properly be taken into account—and either party may adduce evidence relating to any matter.”*

20.2 Liability

Sections 9, 14 and 15 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 provide as follows in respect of the liability of the Corporation:

20.2.1 “9. Liability of contracting carrier—(1) *Subject to the other provisions of this Act, a contracting carrier is liable as such to the contracting party for the loss of or damage to any goods occurring while he is responsible for the goods in accordance with the succeeding provisions of this section, whether or not the loss or damage is caused wholly or partly by him or by any actual carrier.*

(2) *The responsibility of the contracting carrier for goods begins when the goods are accepted for carriage in accordance with the contract.*

(3) *Subject to subsection (4) of this section, the responsibility of the contracting carrier for goods ends—*

(a) *In a case where the goods are to be delivered to the consignee—*

- (i) *When they are tendered to the consignee in the manner expressed or implied in the contract; or*
- (ii) *Where any amount by way of freight is due and payable to or on behalf of the contracting carrier at any time before, or at the time at which, the goods are to be tendered to the consignee under the contract and that amount has not been paid in full, when the contracting carrier or (as the case may require) the last actual carrier is capable of tendering the goods to the consignee in accordance with the contract and gives notice to any person liable to pay the amount or (as the case may require) the balance of the amount that he is so capable:*

(b) *In a case where the goods are to be collected by the consignee—*

- (i) *When the goods are collected by the consignee; or*
- (ii) *On the expiry of the 5th day (excluding any day on which the carrier's premises are not open for the collection of goods) after the date on which the contracting carrier or (as the case may require) the last actual carrier notifies the consignee that the goods are available for collection.*

(4) *In any case where, at the time when the contracting carrier or (as the case may require) the last actual carrier is able to tender the goods to the consignee in accordance with the contract, the consignee's whereabouts are unknown to that carrier, the responsibility of the contracting carrier for the goods ends when he or (as the case may require) the last actual carrier has taken reasonable steps to find the consignee and notify him of the matters referred to in paragraph (a)(ii) or (as the case may require) paragraph (b)(ii) of subsection (3) of this section.*

(5) *No notice referred to in subsection (3)(a)(ii) of this section shall take effect until it is received by the person liable to pay the freight.*

(6) *Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of this section, the responsibility of a contracting carrier who contracts for the carriage of goods to a destination outside New Zealand ends for the purposes of the Act at the time when the international carriage of those goods begins.*

(7) *Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of this section the responsibility of a contracting carrier who contracts for the carriage of goods from a destination outside New Zealand to a destination in New Zealand begins for the purposes of this Act at the time when the international carriage of those goods ends.”*

20.2.2 “14. Carrier not liable in certain circumstances: *Notwithstanding any of the other provisions of this Act, a carrier is not liable as such for the loss of or damage to goods occurring while he is responsible for them under a contract of carriage to the extent that he proves that the loss or damage resulted directly and without fault on his part from—*

- (a) *Inherent vice; or*
- (b) *Any breach of either of the terms implied in the contract by section 17 of this Act; or*
- (c) *Seizure under legal process; or*
- (d) *Saving or attempting to save life or property in peril.”*

20.2.3 “15. Limitation of amount of carrier's liability—(1) *For the purposes of this Act,—*

- (a) *The liability of the contracting carrier to the contracting party; and*
- (b) *The separate liability of any actual carrier to the contracting carrier; and*

(c) The joint liability of any actual carriers (where there are more than 1) to the contracting carrier; and

(d) The joint and several liability of every successive carrier under a contract to which section 13 of this Act applies,—

is limited in amount in each case to the sum of \$500 for each unit of goods lost or damaged or, in the case of contract “at declared value risk”, the amount specified in the contract.

(2) The limitation of amount for the time being specified in subsection (1) of this section does not apply to—

(a) Any liability for the loss of or damage to any goods intentionally caused by the carrier; or

(b) Any liability arising out of the terms of the contract for damages other than for the loss of or damage to the goods; or

(c) Any liability arising out of the terms of the contract for damages consequential upon the loss of or damage to the goods.”

20.3 Unit of goods

Section 3 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 in respect of a “unit of goods” provides:

“3. **Meaning of “unit of goods”**—(1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, “unit of goods” or “unit”,

(a) In relation to bulk cargo means the customary freight unit; that is, the unit of bulk, weight, or measurement upon which the freight for that type of cargo is customarily computed or adjusted:

Provided that, where the freight payable under a contract of carriage is computed or adjusted upon a specified unit of bulk, weight, or measurement, references in the Act to “unit of goods” or “unit” shall be deemed, for the purposes of the carriage of goods pursuant to that contract, to be references to that specified unit:

(b) In relation to goods contained in a container, means the container load of goods; and includes, where the container is provided by the contracting party, the container:

(d) In relation to goods loaded on a pallet, means the pallet load of goods; and includes, where the pallet is provided by the contracting party, the pallet:

(e) In relation to goods contained in a package that is not contained in a larger package or in a container, nor loaded on a pallet, means the package of goods:

(f) In relation to goods that are unitised for the purposes of carriage in any matter not referred to in any of the preceding paragraphs of this subsection, means the unit of goods as so unitised:

(g) In relation to goods (other than baggage) not referred to in any of the preceding paragraphs of this subsection, means each item of the goods:

(h) In relation to baggage, means each item of baggage.

(2) For the purpose of determining the limit of the liability of any carrier, the limit of liability prescribed by section 15 of this Act in respect of each unit of goods relates to the unit of goods as accepted for carriage by the actual carrier or, where the carriage is undertaken by more than one carrier, by the first actual carrier, whether or not that unit is subsequently packed, repacked, or unpacked, or otherwise aggregated with or segregated from any other goods, at any stage of the carriage.”

20.4 Warranty as to condition of goods

Section 17 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 in respect of the warranty by contracting to the condition of goods provides:

“17. **Contracting party to warrant condition of goods, etc.**— (1) In every contract of carriage there shall be implied on the part of the contracting party a term—

(a) That, except as disclosed in accordance with subsection (2) of this section, the goods are fit to be carried and stored in accordance with the contract in the condition and packed in the manner in which they are tendered for carriage:

(b) That, except as disclosed in accordance with subsection (2) of this section, the provisions of every other enactment (if any) that he is required to comply with relating to the consignment for carriage of the goods to be carried pursuant to the contract have been complied with.

(2) If, before the goods are accepted for carriage, the contracting party notifies the contracting carrier or the first actual carrier of any material particular that would otherwise constitute a breach of either of the terms specified in subsection (1) of this section, the carrier may refuse to carry the goods, or undertake to carry them subject to such reasonable terms and conditions as he may require having regard to the circumstances of the case.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in section 7 of this Act, the provisions of this section apply, with the necessary modifications, to contracts of carriage between contracting carriers and actual carriers, and between actual carriers, subject to any express term in the contract."

20.5 Actions against carriers

Section 18 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 in respect of actions against carriers provides:

"18. Notice of claim of damage or partial loss to be given within 30 days—(1) Subject to the succeeding provisions of this section, and except in the case of fraud by the carrier, no action may be brought against a contracting carrier for damage to or partial loss of goods occurring while he is responsible for them under this Act unless written notice giving reasonable particulars of the alleged damage or partial loss is given, in accordance with subsection (4) of this section, within 30 days after the date on which, in accordance with section 9 of this Act, the carrier's responsibility for the goods ceased.

(2) Subject to the succeeding provisions of this section, and except in the case of fraud by the actual carrier, no action may be brought by the contracting carrier against an actual carrier for damage to or partial loss of goods occurring while the actual carrier is responsible for them under this Act unless the contracting carrier, within 10 days after receiving notice of a claim under subsection (1) of this section, notifies the actual carrier of that claim.

(3) No notice is required if it is apparent from all the circumstances of the case that the carrier is or ought to be aware of the damage or partial loss.

(4) Notice for the purpose of subsection (1) of this section shall be given—

(a) Where the contract was performed entirely by the contracting carrier, to that carrier; or

(b) Where the contract was not performed entirely by the contracting carrier, to

(i) The actual carrier or, as the case may require, the last actual carrier; and

(ii) The contracting carrier, unless (where notice of the claim is to be given by the consignee) the identity of the contracting carrier is unknown to the consignee."

20.6 "Declared value risk" rates

20.6.1 Declared value over \$500: The rate for carriage of goods at "declared value risk" pursuant to the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 shall be the "limited carrier's risk" rate for the carriage of the goods, together with an additional amount of one percent of the declared value of the goods in excess of \$500.

20.6.2 Declared value under \$500: In respect of any carriage of goods other than a carriage of goods at "owner's risk" where it is desired that the limit of liability be less than \$500, then and in such case the goods may be carried pursuant to a contract for carriage on declared terms within the meaning of and subject to the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

20.7 Carriage at "owner's risk" rates

Where in this General Scale of Charges it is provided that the rates are "at limited carrier's risk" and will be reduced by 2 percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk", such reduction is subject to the consignor complying in all respects with the provisions of subsection (5) of section 8 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

20.8 Liabilities of Corporation

The Corporation shall not be liable for any loss of or damage or delay to an goods otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 and of the terms and conditions made pursuant to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981.

20.8.1 Consequential losses: It is a condition of every contract of carriage by the Corporation in respect of all its services that the Corporation is not liable for any consequential losses arising out of or in respect of any such contract and any liability specified in paragraphs (b) and (c) of subsection (2) of section 15 of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 is hereby expressly excluded.

20.8.2 Exemptions from liability: The Corporation is exempt from liability for any loss of or damage to or in connection with any goods—

- (i) Where goods are loaded, unloaded, secured, covered, or tallied at any place by persons other than employees of the Corporation; or
- (ii) In respect of goods held or stored by the Corporation as a warehouseman; or
- (iii) In respect of loss of or of damage or delay to goods while in the possession, custody, or control of any carrier other than the Corporation, or of any Harbour Board, warehouseman, or other person during transit; or
- (iv) In respect of goods consigned to or forwarded from a station where there is no stationmaster—

provided however that where such goods have been accepted for carriage at the option of the Corporation “at limited carriers risk” or “at declared value risk” the Corporation is liable to the extent of either the limited carriers risk or of the declared value risk only.

20.8.3 Limitation of liability: No person shall be entitled to recover from the Corporation or any employee, or from any agent of the Corporation for the purposes of the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981, for any loss of or damage to or in connection with any goods for any greater amount than \$500 or the amount of “the declared value” of the goods as provided for in the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

20.9 Acceptance of goods

20.9.1 Corporation’s option to accept goods: Goods are accepted for carriage subject to the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979. Goods tendered to the Corporation for storage shall be accepted only upon the express condition that the goods are warranted to be fit to be stored in the condition in which they are handed to the Corporation and not to be of a dangerous character. The Corporation may refuse to accept any goods for carriage.

20.9.2 Kinds of carriage: Except as otherwise provided in and without limiting the provisions of this General Scale of Charges, the Corporation will not accept for carriage goods mentioned in subparagraphs (i), (iii), and (iv) of clause 20.9.1, and in clauses 21.1.1, 33.3.3, and 59.1 unless such goods are consigned at either “owners risk” or “on declared terms” in accordance with the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

20.10 Inspection of goods

20.10.1 Right of Corporation: The Corporation reserves the right to inspect any goods before receipt or while the goods are in its custody, and for this purpose to call upon the owner to open any package for inspection at the expense of the owner.

20.10.2 Failure to inspect: Failure to inspect any goods or the acceptance of any goods improperly or insufficiently packed shall not impose upon the Corporation any liability for loss or damage arising from such failure or such improper or insufficient packing or otherwise, or in any way affect any warranty given in respect of such goods.

20.11 Sale of goods

Whenever any goods are sold under any of the provisions of this Scale of Charges the proceeds of such sale shall be applied in payment of any sums payable in respect of any such goods and the expense of selling the same, and the balance (if any) remaining after such payment shall be paid to the owner on application.

Goods 20.12/20.15.2

20.12 Consignment notes and other documents

20.12.1 Carriage of Goods Act 1979: All consignment notes and other documents relating to the carriage of goods shall, notwithstanding the terms thereof be issued subject to the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979. All references to the Sea Carriage Of Goods Act 1940 and the provisions thereof in any such consignment notes or other documents shall be deemed to be a reference to the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 and to the appropriate provisions of that Act. All reference to the Government Railways Act 1949 in all such consignments notes and other documents after the 1st day of April 1982 shall be deemed to be a reference to the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981 and to the appropriate provisions thereof.

20.12.2 General condition in written contracts: It is a condition of every written contract of carriage of goods hereunder which complies with the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 that the terms of the written contract prevail over any terms in any consignment note relating to those goods which are inconsistent with that written contract.

20.12.3 Special rate of charges for understatements: Where any consignment note, waybill, or other document required to be delivered in respect of any goods delivered for carriage by the Corporation there is any understatement of the quantity, weight, measurement, or value of the goods, or any misdescription of their nature, which, if undetected, might lead to their being charged for at less than the proper rate; then in lieu of charges at the ordinary rate, and whether the understatement or misdescription is wilful or not, there shall be payable in respect of all the goods referred to in such document double the ordinary rate of charges on the whole consignment, and these charges shall be payable irrespective of any fine that may be incurred under subsection (1) of section 25 of the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981.

20.13 Packing

20.13.1 Packing of goods: Where goods are described as "packed" it is intended that they shall be properly and securely packed in cases, casks, crates, or otherwise, for safe transit by rail in the manner in which such goods are usually packed in the trade. The Corporation reserves the right to decide whether any goods are packed within the meaning of this clause.

20.13.2 Insecure packing: The Corporation may decline to accept broken, damaged, leaky, defective, insecure, insufficient or improper packages or containers.

20.14 Nature of goods

20.14.1 Extra charge: In any case where the nature or condition of any goods is such as to require the payment by the Corporation either of a special wage rate exceeding the ruling rates of pay, or of special allowance in addition to the ruling rates of pay, for the handling, sorting, or carriage of such goods, then in addition to the charges that would ordinarily be payable to the Corporation there shall be payable the extra cost incurred by the Corporation as a result of the payment of the aforesaid special rate or, as the case may be, special allowance.

20.14.2 Cost in lieu of charges: In any case where the nature or condition of any goods is such that the charges prescribed are insufficient to meet the cost incurred by the Corporation in the receipt, sorting, handling, crantage, or delivery of the goods, the cost so incurred by the Corporation will be payable in lieu of the charges prescribed.

20.14.3 Perishable goods: Fruit, vegetables, fish, meat, and other goods which become, while still in the custody of the Corporation, offensive through putrefaction or other cause may be buried or otherwise disposed of by the Corporation without prejudice to the right of the Corporation to recover railage or other charges that may be payable thereon, and any such goods so dealt with shall be deemed to have been delivered to the consignee.

20.14.4 Hazardous goods: Poisonous, dangerous, or injurious substances may be refused for carriage unless securely packed. Without limiting the right of the Corporation to refuse to accept any goods for carriage, hazardous substances or dangerous goods will only be accepted for carriage subject to the completion of a dangerous goods declaration as prescribed from time to time by the General Manager of the Corporation.

20.15 Time of acceptance

20.15.1 Working hours: Except as otherwise provided, working hours shall be deemed to be between 0800 hours and 1700 hours Monday to Friday inclusive. Sundays and other days on which goods sheds are closed for the whole day shall be treated as *dies non*.

20.15.2 Holidays: Except where inconsistent with the context or otherwise specially provided, the following days or any day declared by the General Manager of the Corporation to be a public holiday and publicly notified as such, shall be public holidays;

New Year's Day,

Good Friday,

Easter Monday,

Anzac Day,

Sovereign's Birthday,

Labour Day,

Christmas Day,

Boxing Day,

Provincial Anniversary Day: the day so recognised in each provincial district.

20.16 Delivery

20.16.1 Delivery not taken: Goods which have arrived at destination and are not taken delivery of in terms of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 are thereafter held by the Corporation at the sole risk, in all respects, of the owner.

20.16.2 Responsibility of Corporation: The Corporation shall not be responsible for the delivery of goods by any particular or specified service or time, or in time for any particular market or sale (whether held daily or at intervals or otherwise), show, or exhibition.

20.16.3 Wharf sorting: Where goods for delivery to different consignees or destinations are delivered to the Corporation, from any vessel at any wharf in such a condition that the goods require to be sorted, before delivery to the various consignees or destinations can be effected, such goods shall be carried to the nearest station or place at which the Corporation provides labour and facilities for the sorting of cargo, will be there sorted, and carried thence to destination. In addition to any other charges, which may be payable in respect of such goods, there shall be payable charges for the carriage of such goods from the wharf at which they are received to their destination via the station or place at which the goods are sorted.

20.17 Cartage

Where cartage, collection, or delivery is undertaken by the Corporation, either itself or by a contractor for the purpose, any package exceeding the maximum weight or measurement as follows shall be carted by the Corporation only at its option and under special agreement which may provide, *inter alia*, for special charges for such cartage:

20.17.1 In the case of cartage by a contractor, or in any other case where the maximum is specified, as may be specified in the contract or in such other specifications.

20.17.2 In all other cases, 500 kilograms by weight or 2.5 cubic metres by measurement.

20.18 Fractional parts

20.18.1 Except where otherwise provided, in computing charges, fractions of one cent less than a half a cent in the final result shall be omitted; and half a cent or more in the final result shall be taken as one cent.

20.18.2 Where charges are prescribed to be increased or decreased and a fraction of one cent occurs in the charge as so increased or decreased, such fractions shall if less than half a cent, be omitted; and if half a cent or over shall be taken as one cent.

20.18.3 In computing charges at tonne rates, weights of less than ten kilograms shall be taken as ten kilograms.

20.18.4 In computing distance related charges, fractions of a kilometre amounting to 100 metres and over shall be taken as an additional kilometre; and fractions of less than 100 metres shall be omitted.

20.18.5 In computing measurement, the cubic content of any package shall be calculated accurately and the final result shall be rounded up to an accuracy of two decimal places.

20.19 Quotations

The Corporation shall not be responsible for quotations of rates or conditions of carriage, or particulars of freight charges given verbally or by telephone, unless confirmed in writing.

21. CONDITIONS OF CARRIAGE OF GOODS BY RAIL**21.1 Unmanned stations or sidings**

21.1.1 Acceptance and delivery at private sidings and unattended stations: The Corporation shall not accept goods consigned to or from private sidings and unattended stations unless the goods are consigned at either "owner's risk" or on "declared terms" in accordance with the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

21.1.2 Charges to be prepaid: Freight on goods consigned to a station or a siding where there is no stationmaster in charge must be prepaid unless the consignee has a ledger account with the Corporation.

21.1.3 Hazardous goods: Hazardous goods shall not be accepted at, or delivered to, a station or a siding where there is no stationmaster in charge unless by special arrangement with the Corporation.

21.2 Diversion of wagons in transit

A diversion charge of \$16.00 for each four wheeled wagon and \$32.00 for each bogie wagon shall be made where the destination of wagon loads of goods or livestock is altered by the consignor or consignee while the wagon is in transit.

21.3 Damage to wagons, etc.

Consignors should make good all damage to wagons, tarpaulins, or goods caused by or arising out of the absence of packing or out of consignments being tendered for transit in broken, damaged, leaky, defective, insecure, or improper packages or containers.

21.4 Wagon supply

Notices for the supply of wagons given by persons intending to consign goods or livestock will be accepted for fulfillment conditionally only upon its being found convenient to the Corporation to supply the wagons upon the due date. The Corporation shall not be responsible for any loss or damage arising through failure from any cause to have wagons available by any particular date or train.

Goods 21.5/22.3

21.5 Alterations to or specially constructed wagons

No article which requires for its carriage a specially constructed wagon, or any alteration to a wagon, shall be received and carried except under special arrangements.

21.6 Wagons overloaded or requiring adjustment of load

21.6.1 Wagons overloaded: Except as otherwise provided, where goods are loaded by a consignor or where a consignor has incorrectly stated the weight of the goods and the load of a four-wheeled wagon into which such goods are loaded is more than 500 kilograms in excess of the maximum carrying capacity marked on such wagon, or in the case of a bogie wagon where the load is more than one tonne in excess of the maximum carrying capacity marked on such wagon, the weight in excess of the maximum carrying capacity of such wagon shall be charged as a separate consignment with charges for the whole consignment being computed as though an additional wagon had been used for the whole journey. When the excess weight is removed to another wagon, the owner shall be charged for such removal at the rate of \$16.00 per tonne.

21.6.2 Wagons unsafe: The weight of a load shall be distributed as evenly as possible over the floor of a wagon and the load must not exceed the limits of weight, quantity and gauge for the wagon. When the loading of a wagon performed by a consignor is considered unsafe, the Corporation will reload the wagon or adjust the load at a charge of \$16.00 per tonne in the load subject to a minimum charge as for 3.5 tonnes. If a derailment should occur owing to any failure whatsoever on the part of the consignor to load the wagon in accordance with these provisions the consignor shall be responsible for any injury to any person or damage to any goods or property arising out of or caused or contributed to by such failure, and shall meet all claims arising therefrom.

21.6.3 Timber load adjustment: Minor timber adjustments which may be undertaken by the Corporation such as cutting off excess lengths of uprights and cross-ties, nailing insecurely fastened cross-ties, levelling off the top of the load, closing wagon doors, etc., in order to facilitate the prompt dispatch of wagons, shall be charged for at a rate of \$14.30 per man-hour subject to a minimum charge as for half an hour.

21.6.4 Computation: For the purpose of charging under the provisions of this section, the weight of timber shall be calculated as follows: hardwood, 0.80 cubic metre to the tonne; all other timbers, 1.00 cubic metre to the tonne.

21.7 Minimum wagon load

21.7.1 Sole use of wagon: Except where otherwise provided, the charges for consignments of goods which, by reason of their bulk in relation to weight or other circumstances connected with the nature of the goods, require the sole use of a wagon for their carriage, and which goods if properly loaded will not permit other goods to be loaded in the same wagon, shall be computed at the appropriate rate for the commodity at the minimum weights provided in clause 21.7.2.

21.7.2 Minimum weight: Per four-wheeled wagon 3.5 tonnes.
Per bogie wagon 7.0 tonnes.

21.7.3 Class G goods: The charge for class G goods which require the sole use of a wagon shall not be less than the charge computed in the above minimum at class C rates.

21.7.4 Minimum weight exemption: The minimum weight shall not apply to consignments which do not require the sole use of a wagon and which, if properly loaded, permit other goods to be loaded in the same wagon even though in the particular case the consignment may in fact have the sole use of a wagon; *except that* this exemption shall not apply to goods which, owing to their length, require the use of a bogie wagon, which goods shall be chargeable under the provisions of clause 64; *and except that* where sole use of a wagon is allowed at the specific request of a consignor, the minimum weight listed above for the type of wagon concerned shall apply.

21.7.5 Right to decline to accept: The Corporation may decline to accept for carriage, or may accept for carriage only under special arrangement, articles which by reason of their excessive length, bulk, weight, or other circumstances the Corporation considers to be unsuitable for carriage, or suitable for carriage only under special conditions.

21.7.6 Workload on Corporation: In the case of consignments of traffic charged at rate classes A, B, C, D, E plus 25 percent, E plus 50 percent, or G, the units of the consignment must be such as will not impose on the Corporation unreasonable work in handling or tallying the goods.

22. PARCELS : TERMS AND CONDITIONS ON ALL SERVICES**22.1 Definition:**

The Corporation shall undertake to convey at parcels rates, terms and conditions any package of 25 kilograms or less in weight, 0.30 cubic metre in volume and 2 metres measured in any one dimension. However, where any package of either a greater weight or a greater measurement is tendered for carriage at parcel rates it may be accepted at the option of the Corporation provided that the weight or dimensions are such as will not cause inconvenience in handling. Weight or measurement in excess of 25 kilograms or 0.30 cubic metre shall be treated as a separate consignment at the appropriate rate.

22.2 Rates to be prepaid

The charges on consignments forwarded as parcels must be prepaid.

22.3 Separate rates for each package

Except where otherwise provided, each parcel shall be charged for separately.

22.4 Parcels consigned inter-island

The zone rates for parcels traffic consigned inter-island include the sea or air charge, whichever may apply.

22.5 Hazardous substances

Hazardous substances shall not be accepted as parcels traffic.

22.6 Presentation in advance

Parcels must be presented at the station at least 30 minutes before the due time of departure of the train by which they are to be forwarded.

23. PARCELS CLASSIFICATION

Except as may be otherwise provided parcels shall be charged for carriage by Corporation services in accordance with the following alphabetic commodity classification. Where there is an option, the greater of the rates at either weight or measurement shall be charged.

24.2 "Owner's risk"

The rates in clause 24.1 are at "limited carriers risk" and will be reduced by two percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk".

24.3 Short distance traffic between adjacent zones

Parcels consigned between two adjoining zones, except between zones 5 and 6, for a total distance not exceeding 50 kilometres, shall be charged at the rates for parcels consigned solely within one zone.

24.4 Terminal charge

In addition to the rates in clause 24.1, a charge of \$1.20 for each 25 kilograms, or 0.30 cubic metres, or part thereof, shall be made for each parcel consigned to the following stations:

24.6 Definition of parcels zones

Zone 1: All that area of the North Island bounded to the east, north, and west by sea coast and to the south by a straight line extending from Woody Head on the west coast to the south end of Bruntwood railway station yard; thence in a straight line to Bowentown on the east coast.

Zone 2: All that area of the North Island bounded to the north by the sea coast, and by a line from Bowentown following the southern boundary of Zone 1 as far as the south end of Bruntwood railway station yard; thence in straight line to the summit of Mount Ruapehu; thence in a straight line to the Moawhango Dam; thence in a straight line to Matakaoa Point.

Zone 3: All that area of the North Island bounded to the west by the sea coast, and by a line following the southern boundary of Zone 1 from Woody Head to the south end of Bruntwood railway station yard; and the western and southern boundaries of Zone 2 from the south end of Bruntwood railway station yard to the Moawhango Dam; thence in a straight line to the southern end of Waiouru railway station yard; thence in a straight line passing through the south end of Manutahi railway station yard to the sea on the west coast.

Zone 4: All the area of the North Island bounded to the north and east by the sea coast and by a line following the eastern boundaries of Zones 2 and 3 from Matakaoa Point to the south end of Waiouru railway station yard; thence in a straight line to Cape Turnagain on the east coast.

Zone 5: All that area of the North Island bounded to the north by the lines following the southern boundaries of Zones 3 and 4 from the western sea coast to the southern end of Waiouru railway station yard and then to Cape Turnagain; and to the east, south and west by the sea coast.

Zone 6: All that area of the South Island bounded to the east, north and west by the sea coast and to the south by a straight line from Heaphy Bluff on the west coast to Lewis Pass; thence in a straight line passing through the north end of Hapuku railway station yard to the sea on the east coast.

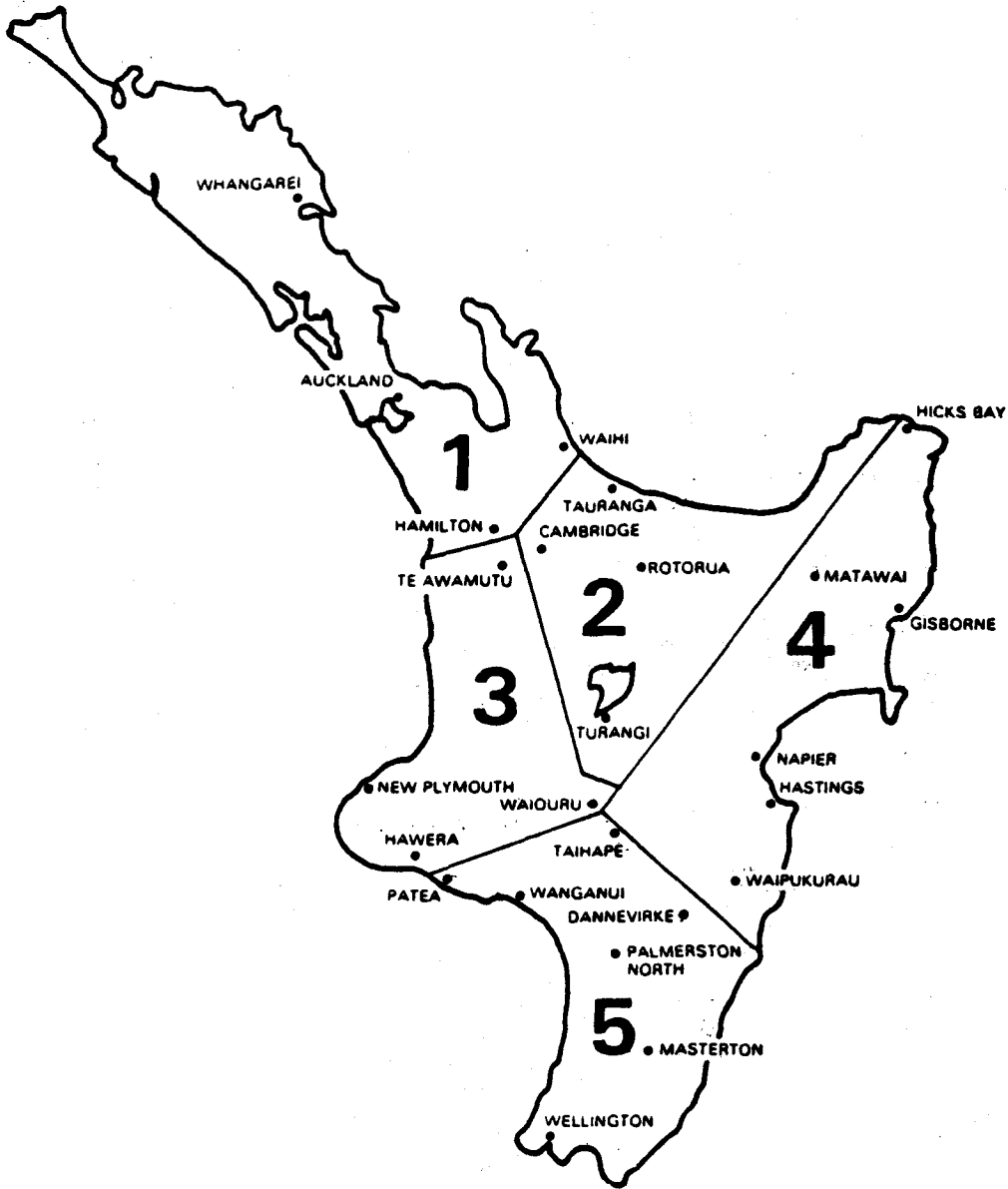
Zone 7: All that area of the South Island bounded to the east by the sea coast, and by a line following the southern boundary of Zone 6 from the eastern sea coast to Lewis Pass; thence in a straight line (passing between Arthurs Pass and Otira) to Mount Hooker; thence in a straight line to eastern sea coast passing through the central point of the South Island Main Trunk railway bridge over the Waitaki River.

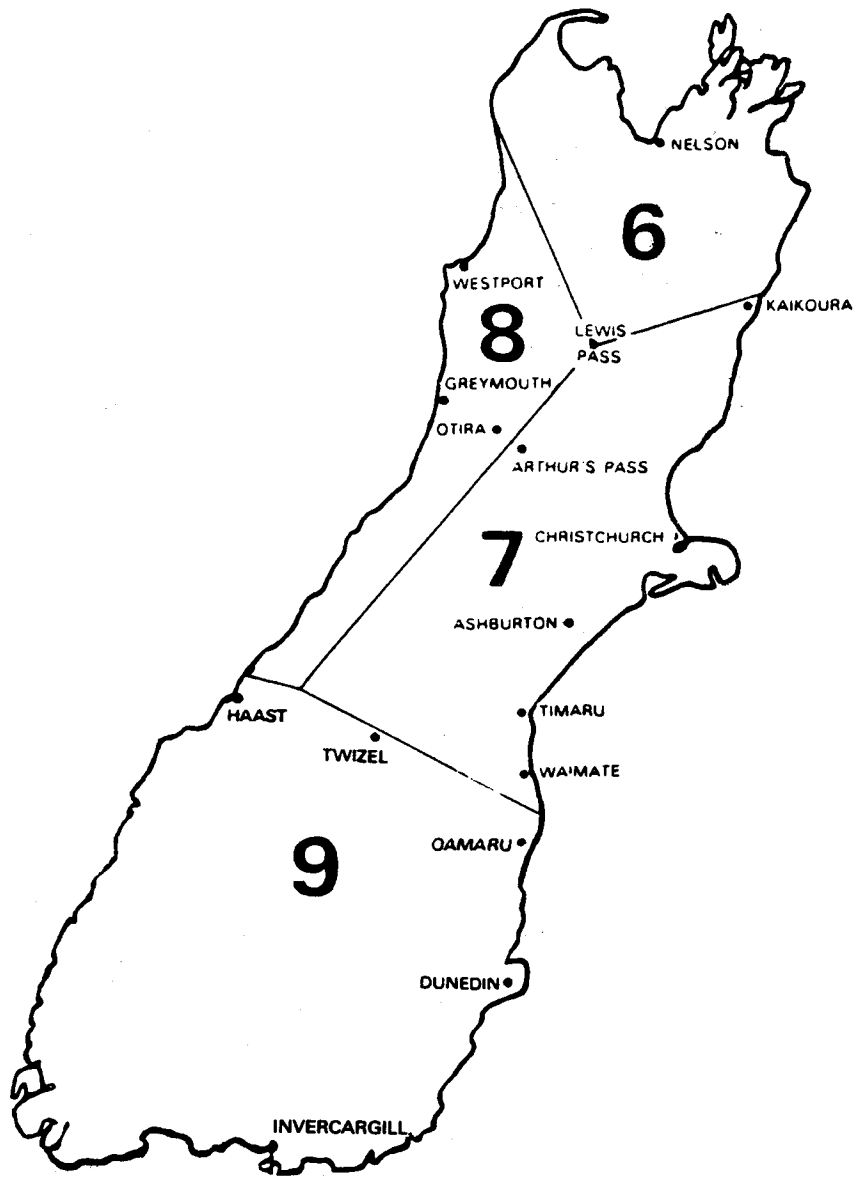
Zone 8: All that area of the South Island bounded to the west by the sea coast and to the north and east by a line following the entire western boundaries of Zones 6 and 7 from the Heaphy Bluff to Mount Hooker; thence in a straight line to Arnott Point on the west coast.

Zone 9: All that area of the South Island bounded to the north by a line following the entire southern boundary of Zones 7 and 8 from Arnott Point to the eastern sea coast, and to the east, south and west by sea coast.

25. STORAGE OF PARCELS**25.1 Charges**

Parcels traffic not delivered within the periods indicated shall be charged storage as follows:

25.2 Disposal

Parcels not claimed within six months may be sold.

26. FRESH FRUIT, FRESH VEGETABLES, FRESH MUSHROOMS, AND NUTS**26.1 Definition of vegetables**

Artichokes, beetroot, carrots, garlic, kumeras, marrows, melons, onions, parsnips, potatoes, sweet corn on cobs, and turnips are deemed to be fresh vegetables and shall be charged accordingly.

26.2 Definition of group weight

When more packages than one consisting of fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, fresh mushrooms, and nuts are consigned from one consignor to one consignee at the destination station, such packages shall be charged on the total weight of each consignment.

26.3 Charges

Fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, fresh mushrooms and nuts grown and packed in New Zealand (including Cook Islands or Niue), for the domestic use of the consignee, whether conveyed as excess baggage or consigned, shall be charged at half parcels rates on grouped weight except as specified in clauses 26.3.1 and 26.3.2:

26.3.1 Suitcases: Fresh fruit, vegetables, mushrooms or nuts in suitcases or similar containers are not considered "packed" in accordance with trade usage and shall be charged on group weight at parcels rates.

26.3.2 Adequacy of packaging: Fresh fruit, tomatoes and mushrooms packed in used cardboard boxes or in paper or plastic parcels shall be charged on grouped weight at parcels rates.

26.3.3 Terminal charge: The terminal charge specified in clause 24.5 shall apply in addition to the rates in clause 26.3 for each 26 kg or part thereof.

26.4 Domestic use of consignee

The clause 26.3 charges shall be applicable only to fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, fresh mushrooms, and nuts forwarded for the domestic use of the consignee, and shall not apply to fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, fresh mushrooms, and nuts forwarded for sale or to be used or dealt with by the consignee for any purpose other than the mentioned. In every case the consignor shall endorse the following on the face of the consignment note: "certified for domestic use of consignee only".

26.5 Carriage on passenger service

The Corporation reserves the right to decline to carry fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, fresh mushrooms, and nuts at clause 26.3 rates on any passenger services.

27. LIBRARY BOOKS**27.1 Charges**

Books for exchange forwarded between subscribers and recognised circulating libraries shall be carried at half parcels rates, with a minimum charge of 86 cents per package, subject to the following conditions:

27.1.1 Identification of sender: The sender's name must be shown on each parcel.

27.1.2 Declaration: A declaration must be given on the consignment note that the package contains books or other articles specially authorised by the General Manager of the Corporation.

27.1.3 Contents to be shown: A clear indication of the contents must be given on each package.

27.2 Other cases

The provisions for library books shall be applicable in other cases where authorised by the General Manager of the Corporation.

27.3 Terminal charge

The terminal charge specified in clause 24.5 shall not apply to parcels of library books. Consignees must take delivery at destination stations.

28. HOMING PIGEONS**28.1 Homing pigeons to be liberated**

Homing pigeons sent to a station to be liberated for a race or for training shall, on production of the prescribed certificate, be charged as follows:

- 28.1.1 Sent by ordinary goods trains:** Class C goods rates and conditions (refer to clause 73).
28.1.2 Sent by express goods or passenger trains: Ordinary parcels rates, computed on the separate weight of each container. (The weight in excess of 25 kilograms per container shall be charged separately at ordinary parcels rates).

28.2 Certificate

The required certificate shall take the following form and be signed by the secretary of the club to which the owners belong.

I hereby certify that the pigeons to the number of consigned from to on are the property of Club, and are being forwarded to for the purpose of competing in a race (or training).

28.3 Empty boxes, etc.

The empty hampers and boxes after pigeons are liberated shall be returned free to the sending station except that for inter-island consignments the rail air or rail ferry charges for empty returns conveyed inter-island are to be added to the charges for the outward journey.

28.4 Pigeons not to be liberated

Pigeons not forwarded for liberation shall be charged on weight or measurement at parcels rates plus 50 percent.

28.5 Terminal charge

The terminal charge as provided in clause 24.5 shall not be enforced for homing pigeons and such consignments shall not be delivered by the Corporation.

29 DOGS**29.1 Charges**

29.1.1 Parcels rates: The charges for the carriage of dogs at parcels rates shall be:

Dogs, tethered (each)	At the parcels rate for 20 kilograms
Dogs, in hampers, crates or boxes	At parcels rate plus 50 percent on actual weight, with weight in excess of 25 kilograms to be treated as a separate consignment.
Guide dogs, accompanying blind person	Free

29.1.2 Inter-island consignments of dogs: Dogs not accompanying passengers must be consigned as parcels and shall not be accepted or delivered at wharf terminals. Dogs accompanying passengers on the rail ferries shall be charged as provided in clause 12.7.2.

29.2 Terminal charge

In the case of dogs unaccompanied by a passenger the terminal charge at the stations specified in clause 24.5 shall be made in addition to the charges prescribed in clause 29.1.

29.3 Delivery

Passengers or consignees must take delivery of dogs immediately on arrival of the service at the destination point, failing which the dogs shall be held by the Corporation at the sole risk and responsibility of the owner. A charge of \$2.60 per day or portion of a day shall be made for each animal which is not taken delivery of immediately on arrival at the destination point. In addition to this charge owners shall be required to pay any charge that may have been incurred for food, veterinary charges, and the like.

29.4 Addressing and advance presentation

Dogs must bear a label showing distinctly the name and full address of the consignee and the destination point and, except when accompanying passengers, must be delivered to the Corporation and consigned not less than 30 minutes before the due time of departure of the service by which they are to be forwarded.

29.5 Confining of dog

The Corporation reserves the right to require that any dog presented for carriage shall be efficiently muzzled or confined in a cage, box or other suitable receptacle so as to prevent such dog from biting any person. The Corporation shall not be liable for the loss of any dog if such loss arises directly or indirectly from any tendency on the part of such dog to bite any person.

29.6 Tethering

Dogs not secured in hampers, crates, or boxes must be provided with efficient chains and collars, or other suitable means of tether. Dogs in hampers, crates, or boxes must be properly secured so as to prevent damage to other goods.

Goods 29.7/31.1.6

29.7 Dogs accompanying passengers

Passengers accompanied by dogs must consign the dog at least 15 minutes before the due time of departure of the service except that when the journey is by rail and commenced from a station at which there are no booking facilities the passenger shall arrange the consignment with the guard. Owners must see their dogs safely placed on the service.

29.8 Rail accommodation

With the exception of guide dogs accompanying blind persons, dogs will be conveyed by passenger trains only when there is sufficient space or facilities in the guard's van for their accommodation and shall not be allowed in carriages.

29.9 Corporation's liability

The Corporation shall not be liable for loss when a dog, whether accompanied by a passenger or consigned, escapes through the slipping of the collar or the breakage of the chain, collar, or such other means of tether by which it is secured.

30 CORPSES**30.1 Wagon charges**

The following wagon rates will be charged for the conveyance of corpses:

Per four wheeled wagon	Class M rates
Per bogie wagon	Double class M rates.

30.2 Passenger trains

The conveyance of corpses by passenger trains shall be at the option of the Corporation.

30.3 Packed casket

Where a casket containing a corpse is enclosed in a suitable outer packing case and the exclusive use of a wagon is not required, charges on gross weight as goods at class A rates shall apply.

31 NEWSPAPERS, PERIODICALS, AND STEREOTYPE CASTS**31.1 Charges**

Newspapers and periodicals shall be conveyed at the following rates:

31.1.1 Bulk consignments: Packages of newspapers and periodicals shall be charged at the rate of \$5.00 per 50 kilograms on the gross weight forwarded by the same consignor irrespective of the distance the packages are railed, provided that they are accompanied by a consignment note showing the number of packages for each station and the total weight of the whole consignment and subject to the following minimum quantities:

Periodicals	4 tonnes each 4 weeks

31.1.2 Small consignments: Newspapers and periodicals not complying with the minima prescribed above and also stereotype casts and type set up for reproduction purposes and consigned by or to newspaper or periodical printers and publishers, shall be carried at the following rates with charges being computed separately for each package:

31.1.3 Inter-island: The charges prescribed above cover carriage by rail in both the North and South Islands and, in the case of packages conveyed under the provisions of clause 31.1.2, inter-island journeys shall be deemed to be one continuous rail journey.

31.1.4 Single copies: Single newspapers shall be conveyed, irrespective of distance, at a uniform charge of 5 cents per copy.

31.1.5 Press matter: Letters for newspaper and periodical printers and publishers containing *bona fide* press matter for publication, when so endorsed, shall be conveyed, irrespective of distance, at the uniform charge of 40 cents per letter.

31.1.6 Declaration: A declaration that the packages do not contain other than the articles mentioned above must be printed or plainly written alongside the address on packages thus: "Newspapers only", "Periodicals only" or "Stereotype casts only" (as the case may be).

31.2 Books

Books shall not be accepted for conveyance as newspapers or periodicals.

31.3 Liability

The provisions above relate to packages being carried at "owner's risk" subject to and in accordance with the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 and the Corporation shall not be liable for damage, delay, detention, or loss. No receipts shall be given for the packages which must be delivered to and uplifted from the Corporation by the owners. Should it be desired that packages be conveyed at "limited carrier's risk" the appropriate parcels rate for that risk shall be charged.

32 COIN, BULLION, ETC.**32.1 Accompanied by passenger**

Packages containing bank notes, bullion, gold, silver, or bronze coin shall be accepted for conveyance when accompanied by a passenger as follows:

32.1.1 The passenger must pay the ordinary fare and hold a ticket.

32.1.2 Parcels rates shall be charged for any quantity of such goods and baggage in excess of 50 kilograms for every adult ticket held.

32.2 Unaccompanied by passenger

Packages containing bank notes, bullion, gold, silver, or bronze coin shall be accepted for carriage when unaccompanied by a passenger as follows:

32.2.1 Packages containing bank notes, bullion, gold, or silver shall be charged double the ordinary parcels rates.

32.2.2 Packages containing bronze coin shall be charged ordinary parcels rates.

33 BICYCLES AND POWER CYCLES**33.1 Assembled bicycles**

Assembled bicycles shall be charged as follows:

33.1.1 One rider: Bicycles, seated to carry one rider:

—as 15 kilograms at ordinary parcels rate.

33.1.2 Multiple riders: Bicycles, seating more than one rider:

—as 15 kilograms at parcels rates plus 50 percent.

33.1.3 Parcels carriers: Bicycles fitted with parcels delivery carriers:

—as 15 kilograms at parcels rates plus 50 percent.

33.2 Power cycles

33.2.1 Bicycles with motor propelling attachments and with total weight not exceeding 25 kilograms:

—as 15 kilograms at double parcels rates.

33.2.2 Power cycles exceeding 25 kilograms in weight shall be charged as for motor cycles (refer to clause 34).

33.3 Partially assembled and unpacked bicycles

Bicycles, partially assembled and unpacked, shall be charged as follows:

33.3.1 Each machine (consignors are to certify as to the number of machines in each consignment) to be charged separately:

—as 15 kilograms at ordinary parcels rates.

33.3.2 With parcels carriers attached each machine shall be charged separately:

—as 15 kilograms at parcels rates plus 50 percent.

33.3.3 Owner's risk: Unpacked bicycles and tricycles shall only be accepted for carriage at "owner's risk".

33.4 Packed bicycles

Bicycles or tricycles, partially or completely unassembled and packed in cases, cartons, cardboard envelopes, canvas bags, or crates shall be charged for their actual weight at parcels rates.

33.5 Tricycles

Children's tricycles shall be charged as 15 kilograms per tricycle at ordinary parcels rates. Other tricycles shall be charged as 15 kilograms at double parcels rates.

33.6 Suburban services

Provided suitable accommodation is available, bicycles accompanying passengers on suburban train services shall be charged at the equivalent of one ordinary fare for the single journey subject to a maximum charge of \$2.80. Charges are to be collected by the issue of one ordinary adult single ticket for the journey. Where a passenger presents a ten trip ticket for payment of the bicycle charge, one journey shall be nipped from the ticket for the conveyance of the bicycle.

33.7 Terminal charge

Terminal charges according to clause 24.5 shall apply to bicycles not accompanying passengers but shall not apply to bicycles accompanying passengers.

Goods 33.8/34.2.5

33.8 Charges to be prepaid

The charges on bicycles whether or not accompanying passengers must be prepaid.

33.9 Goods rates

Bicycles not accompanying passengers shall be charged at the rates specified in clause 33 above whether consigned as parcels or goods traffic.

33.10 Addressing and advance presentation

Bicycles and tricycles accompanying passengers by rail must be fully and legibly addressed with the name and destination of the passenger, and be presented at the station for booking at least 15 minutes before the due time of departure of the train by which they are to be carried. The Corporation shall not be responsible for the loss of bicycles unless this provision is complied with. Bicycles not accompanying passengers must be presented at least 30 minutes before the due departure time of the train by which they are to be forwarded.

33.11 Left bicycles

The Corporation shall not be responsible for bicycles left about its premises and not delivered into its custody. Any such articles found about the Corporation's premises shall be treated as lost baggage and charged for as provided in clause 13.

33.12 Break of journey

Bicycle tickets are not available for a break of journey.

33.13 Storage

Bicycles will be charged storage in accordance with the provisions of clause 25.

33.14 Disposal

Bicycles not claimed within six months may be sold.

33.15 Bicycles accompanying rail ferry passengers

Bicycles accompanying rail ferry passengers may be carried as provided in clause 12.6.1 and charged as provided in clause 12.7.2.

34. MOTOR CYCLES**34.1 Definition**

Motor scooters, and power cycles exceeding 25 kilograms in weight shall be conveyed as motor cycles.

34.2 Motor cycles accompanying passengers

34.2.1 Addressing: Motor cycles accompanying passengers by rail must be fully and legibly addressed with the name and the destination of the passenger, and be presented at the station for booking at least 15 minutes before the due time of departure of the service by which they are to be carried. Motor cycles shall not be carried on the *Silver Fern*, *Northerner* and *Southerner* services.

34.2.2 Charges: Motor cycles accompanying passengers shall be charged on the route covered by the passenger ticket held at the following rates, owners to load and unload:

34.2.3 Owner's risk: The foregoing rates are at "limited carrier's risk" and will be reduced by two percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk".

34.2.4 Trailers, sidecars, go-karts: Motor cycles with trailers or sidecars attached and go-karts accompanying passengers shall be charged at double the rate for motor cycles and shall be carried in guard's vans of passenger and mixed trains only at the convenience of the Corporation. Sidecars detached from motor cycles shall be charged on actual weight, at the rate for motor cycles plus 50 percent.

34.2.5 Limit to one motor cycle: Each passenger shall be allowed to take only one motor cycle at the above rates.

34.3 Motor cycles not accompanying passengers

Motor cycles unaccompanied by passengers must be consigned as goods traffic.

34.4 Preparation for transit

Motor cycles, when charged with petrol or any inflammable liquid, shall not be accepted for carriage. In addition, the battery leads must be disconnected from the battery and tied back in such a manner that they cannot touch the battery terminals while in transit.

34.5 Left motor cycles

The Corporation shall not be responsible for any motor cycle found about the premises of the Corporation and not delivered into its custody. Such motor cycles shall be treated as lost baggage, and charged for as provided in clause 13.

34.6 Storage

Motor cycles not claimed immediately after arrival at the destination station shall be allowed free storage on the day of arrival; but after that time they shall be charged for storage at the rate of \$1.50 per day or part thereof per motor cycle.

35. METHOD OF CHARGING FOR GOODS**35.1 Charges according to classification**

Except as provided in local rates and other special arrangements made by the Corporation, goods shall be charged for carriage by rail in accordance with the alphabetic commodity classification in clause 73.

35.1.1 Use of classification

Goods for which a class is shown shall be charged at the rate for that class as prescribed in clause 36; and goods for which no class is shown shall be charged according to the rates and conditions prescribed in the clause specified.

35.1.2 Plastic and perspex

With the exception of used empty containers, articles already classified in clause 73 which are manufactured from plastic or perspex shall be charged in accordance with the classification applicable to plastic or perspex.

35.2 "Owner's risk" and dangerous goods

The following goods shall be received, held, carried, delivered or otherwise dealt with at the sole risk in every respect of the owner unless a request is made that such goods be received, held, carried, delivered or otherwise dealt with at the risk of the Corporation under and subject to the provisions of clause 20:

All goods described in the following classification or elsewhere in this General Scale of Charges as being at "owner's risk" or "dangerous";

All goods other than those classified in clause 73 as classes A, B, C, D or E plus a prescribed increase and G.

35.3 Dangerous goods

The word "dangerous" used in relation to goods denotes that the goods will be carried under the regulations applicable to explosives and dangerous goods.

37.2.1 Owner's risk: The foregoing rates are at "limited carrier's risk" and will be reduced by 2 percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk".

38. COMPUTATION OF RAIL GOODS CHARGES**38.1 Separate consignments**

Except as otherwise provided, goods from different consignors to one consignee, or from one consignor to different consignees, shall be charged separately.

38.2 Mixed commodities

A package containing differently rated commodities shall be charged the rate applicable to the highest rated commodity.

38.3 Small lots

Small lots of goods of classes A, B, C, D, E and G, including goods chargeable at classes E or G subject to a percentage increase or decrease, shall be charged at the rates prescribed in clause 37. Such classes of goods consigned in quantities exceeding 250 kilograms shall be subject to a minimum charge as for 250 kilograms as provided in clause 37.

38.4 Grouped weights

Except where otherwise provided the weights of two or more commodities in any consignment chargeable at the same rate may be grouped for charging purposes, but two or more commodities chargeable at different rates must be charged separately, provided that goods of classes C and D not exceeding 250 kilograms in total weight may be grouped for charging purposes.

38.5 Minimum wagon loads

Goods chargeable on weight and/or timber consigned from one consignor to one consignee and loaded in the same wagon may be grouped for the purpose of meeting the minimum load per wagon; and the charges at the appropriate rates may be based on the actual weight of each commodity, subject to the minimum charge as prescribed in clause 37, under the following conditions:

38.5.1 The total weight charged for shall not be less than the highest minimum wagon load specified for any one commodity included in the consignment.

38.5.2 When the actual aggregate weight of all the commodities in the consignment is less than the highest required minimum wagon load, the weight required to make up the minimum shall be charged at the rate applicable to the lowest rated commodity in the consignment.

38.5.3 For this purpose timber shall be calculated as 1.00 cubic metres to the tonne.

38.6 Goods subject to an increase in rate

Where a local rate for class C goods applies, charges for goods of classes A or B are to be computed as follows:

38.6.1 If the goods are chargeable on weight:

For goods of class A the local rate shall be increased by 100 percent.

For goods of class B the local rate shall be increased by 50 percent.

38.6.2 If goods are chargeable on measurement the local rate is not to be increased.

38.7 Minimum quantity

Where a rate is specified as being for a minimum quantity and such minimum is not complied with it shall be permissible to charge as for the minimum quantity at the rate so specified if cheaper.

38.8 Alternative charge

Wherever an alternative charge is specified it is intended that the lower charge will be taken, unless otherwise provided.

38.9 Goods chargeable on weight or measurement

38.9.1 Charge on gross weight: All goods chargeable on weight shall be charged on the actual gross weight of the goods when received by the Corporation for carriage.

38.9.2 Packing to be included: When goods are packed for carriage, the weight or measurement of the consignment shall include the weight or dimensions of the case or packing used, provided that the charges shall not be less than for such case or packing when consigned alone.

38.9.3 Definition: Except when inconsistent with the context or otherwise expressly stated "measurement" means cubic measurement.

38.10 Bogie wagon rate

Except where otherwise specified, a rate per wagon refers to a four wheeled wagon and a bogie wagon shall, in computing charges at a rate per wagon, be charged at twice the rate for a four wheeled wagon (see also clause 64).

38.11 Explosives

Except as otherwise provided, goods of an explosive nature not permitted to be conveyed in wagons containing ordinary goods shall be subject to an additional charge of \$8.50 per consignment (irrespective of the quantity or the distance hauled) *except that the surcharge shall not apply to small consignments of explosives which are railed in portable magazines.* Where the Corporation is unable to supply a portable magazine on request and the consignor elects to load the consignment in a wagon the surcharge shall apply.

38.12 Goods consigned inter-island

Except as provided in the Local Rates Scale of Charges the charges for the rail journey in each Island shall be computed separately.

The Corporation shall not undertake to tally goods consigned under the foregoing provisions.

42.3 Owner's risk

The foregoing rates are at "limited carrier's risk" and will be reduced by two percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk".

42.4 Small lots

Small lots of timber or logs under 0.25 cubic metres may be charged on actual weight at class C if cheaper than the clause 42.2 charge for timber or logs in small lots.

42.5 Load under minimum on bogie wagon

42.5.1 Check wagon not required: Where a consignment of timber or logs is loaded on a bogie wagon and the quantity is less than the prescribed minimum load for the class of wagon used, the charges shall be based on such minimum or, if cheaper, on the actual quantity of timber at the above scale for small lots plus the charge for one check wagon.

42.5.2 Check wagon required: Where a consignment of timber or logs loaded on a bogie wagon also requires a four-wheeled check wagon, charges shall be based on the minimum load for one bogie plus the charge for one check wagon or, if cheaper, on the actual quantity at the small lots scale, plus the charge for two check wagons.

42.6 Less than minimum load

Any deficiency in quantity required to make up the prescribed minimum load is to be charged at the class K rate.

42.7 Grouping of consignments to determine minimum load

Separate consignments of timber or logs loaded in the same wagon from one consignor to various consignees at the same destination station may be grouped for the purpose of calculating the minimum load. Where the total quantity so loaded is less than the prescribed minimum wagon load the deficiency in measurement shall be shared proportionately by each consignment.

42.8 Measurement

42.8.1 Length: Except where otherwise specified, the length of timber or logs shall be measured in multiples of ten centimetres and fractional amounts less than ten centimetres shall be omitted. Sawn timber in pieces not exceeding two metres in length shall, except where otherwise provided, be charged on actual length.

42.8.2 Timber shorts: Timber pieces not exceeding two metres in length, shall be charged as provided in the goods classification in clause 73. Where the actual weight of timber shorts (chargeable on weight) and shooks cannot be determined by weighing, the weight may be computed on the basis of one cubic metre to the tonne.

42.8.3 Width and thickness: In computing the sizes of sawn timber, whether dressed or undressed, fractional parts less than one millimetre in width or thickness shall be reckoned as one millimetre. In computing the measurement of rusticated weatherboards, tongue-and-grooved flooring and lining boards, and all other boards of irregular width and thickness, the full overall measurement shall be charged for: i.e., the board shall be taken to measure as if its greatest width and thickness were uniform throughout the entire width and thickness of the board.

42.8.4 Volumes: Timber and log volumes shall be computed as provided in clause 20.18.

42.8.5 Round wood: The cubic measurement of round timber and logs, shall be computed according to the Railways Table of Metric Volumes for Round Timber, 1976.

42.8.6 Measurement not Corporation responsibility: The Corporation shall not undertake to measure or tally timber and logs.

42.9 Handling

The Corporation may require all loading or unloading to be performed by owners. For each loading or unloading done by the Corporation the following charges shall be made:

42.9.1 Each loading or unloading (without crange) \$11.35 per cubic metre
(minimum charge \$3.26)

42.9.2 Where the Corporation's lifting appliances are used:

Loose timber and logs \$3.82 per cubic metre
(minimum charge \$3.82)

Packaged timber \$2.71 per cubic metre
(minimum charge \$2.26)

43. LIVESTOCK**43.1 Conditions of carriage**

43.1.1 Documentation: Before livestock will be accepted for transit every consignor must provide a consignment note properly completed and any stock removal permits or other documents necessary in connection with the status or regulations (if any) concerning diseases of transportation of animals.

43.1.2 Notice to consignees: Consignors of livestock are required to give such notice to consignees regarding dispatch as will prevent delay in delivery at the destination station.

43.1.3 Freight to be prepaid: The Corporation requires freight on livestock to be prepaid.

43.1.4 Owners to load and unload: Loading and unloading must be performed by the consignor and consignee respectively. Subject to the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979 the Corporation shall not be responsible for any particular number of livestock specified as having been loaded into any particular wagon for carriage by rail.

43.1.5 Condition of livestock: The Corporation may refuse the transport of sick, wild, unmanageable, or fierce animals unless the freight has been paid and the carriage is at "owner's risk;" and it may refuse the transport of livestock when the animals, in the opinion of the Corporation employee in charge or guard, are not in a fit condition to travel.

43.1.6 Loading of wagons: The Corporation may restrict if necessary the number of animals which may be loaded in any wagon; and it may load other animals, vehicles, or goods from the same or different consignors to the same or different consignees in the same wagon.

43.1.7 Arrival time restriction: The Corporation may refuse to accept for transport any livestock that is timed to arrive at its destination between 1800 hours on Saturday and 1800 hours on Sunday, unless an undertaking in writing shall have been received from the consignee that the livestock will be unloaded and delivery taken thereof within three hours after arrival at destination.

43.1.8 Responsibility of Corporation: The Corporation does not under any circumstances accept any responsibility whatever for animals before they are placed into the wagon; or after the animals arrive at the station to which they are transported.

43.1.9 Loading and unloading facilities: The Corporation shall not be bound to receive any livestock for carriage to or from any railway station which is not equipped with platforms, yards, and other suitable facilities for loading and unloading livestock: provided that, at the option of the Corporation, livestock may be received for carriage to or from such places if the owners accept all the risk.

43.1.10 Feeding and watering responsibility: Livestock must be adequately fed and watered immediately prior to being tendered to the Corporation for transport, and a certificate may be required from the consignor that this has been done. Livestock may not be accepted for transport where this condition has not been complied with. Owners of livestock must in all cases make their own arrangements for feeding, watering, or tending stock. The Corporation does not accept any responsibility in regard thereto.

43.1.11 Offloading for feeding and watering: If desired by the owners, livestock may be off-loaded for feeding and watering at a station convenient to the Corporation between that from which they are forwarded and their destination, but they must not be detained more than 24 hours, otherwise the journey will be regarded as a new journey from the point where the stock was detained, and charges will be payable thereon accordingly.

43.1.12 Corporation may feed and water livestock: The Corporation may, whenever it considers it necessary, provide livestock whilst in its charge with food or water, or both (when practicable), at the expense of the consignees or consignors (as the case may be), and for such purpose the livestock may be off-loaded. In no case will any charge be made for the water supplied to such stock.

43.1.13 Reloading charge: When livestock has been off-loaded for feeding and watering, the Corporation may, whenever it performs the work of reloading, make an additional charge of \$12.59 per four-wheeled wagon n.o.s., \$16.77 per Hc or Jc wagon and \$25.19 per bogie wagon.

43.1.14 Loading and unloading: The consignor shall be responsible and shall pay for damage done by animals to wagons, enclosures, or other Corporation property while such animals are on the premises of the Corporation, unless he can prove that the damage is to be ascribed to the bad conditions of such wagon, enclosure, or Corporation property.

43.1.15 Deaths in transit: Animals which have died during their transport or before delivery to consignees, must be accepted by the consignor or consignee (as the case may be) if the carcass is tendered by the Corporation and such carcass must be removed forthwith from Corporation property, failing which the Corporation will take steps to have it removed at the cost of the consignor or consignee (as the case may be). If any animal has died whilst in transit and has been removed from the wagon the consignor or consignee (as the case may be) shall pay the cost of such removal and burial hereinafter provided without relieving consignees of the responsibility for taking delivery of dead animals found in wagons on arrival at destination. If animals die in wagons or railway enclosures in circumstances where it is found impossible, or in the opinion of the Corporation, not reasonably practicable to tender the carcass of such dead animals to the consignee, the cost of removing and burying such animals must be paid by the consignor (or consignee) at the following scale:

For each head of cattle, including calves (exceeding six months old), or	\$
horses	63.50
For each sheep, goat, dog, pig or calf (under six months old)	15.89
Plus cartage charges (if any).	

43.1.16 Unloading at destination: Livestock received by rail at stations must be removed within three working hours after their arrival, otherwise such stock shall be unloaded and held at the sole risk and expense of the owner. A charge of \$11.46 per four-wheeled wagon n.o.s., \$15.22 per Hc or Jc wagon, and \$22.93 per bogie wagon will be made for unloading such stock.

43.1.17 Delay in taking delivery: Except as may be otherwise provided, a charge of \$2.18 per head of cattle or horses, and 83 cents per head of sheep, goats, calves (under six months old), pigs, or other small stock, will be made for every eight hours or portion thereof after the expiry of the first three hours after arrival at destination station that the stock so remains in the custody of the Corporation in addition to any charge that may have been incurred for food, water, veterinary surgeon's charges, and the like. Should it be considered necessary, the livestock may, if practicable, at the option of the Corporation be sent for stabling or grazing at the sole risk and expense of the consignee, and any expense incurred by the Corporation in connection with the feeding maintenance, or custody of such livestock shall be deemed to be charges payable in respect of the carriage of such livestock.

Goods 43.1.18/43.4.2

43.1.18 Sale of undelivered livestock: Subject to the provisions of the New Zealand Railways Corporation Act 1981 any livestock not taken delivery of within one week after arrival at destination may, after notice to take delivery of same has been given to the owner or consignee or consignor, be sold by auction and the proceeds applied in payment of any sums payable in respect of such livestock and the expense of selling the same, and the balance (if any) remaining after such payment shall be paid to the owner on application. If neither the owner nor the consignor nor the consignee is known, or if they cannot be found, requests for delivery to be taken of the livestock published in any newspaper circulating in the district or posted for a period of not less than three days at the destination station of the livestock shall be sufficient notice.

43.1.19 Overcrowding, sickness, injury: Any animal that, through sickness or through injury received from other animals in a wagon, or through animals in a wagon being unduly crowded or other similar circumstances, is taken out of a wagon and subsequently transported to its destination in another wagon, shall be charged as a separate consignment from the station at which it was removed from the original wagon to such destination station. In addition, any other necessary expenses incurred in connection with such sickness, injury, or removal shall be charged. When livestock is unloaded and reloaded by the Corporation, owing to the wagons being overcrowded or the animals being down in the wagon, the charges for the services of unloading and reloading shall be based on the actual cost to the Corporation of the services performed.

43.1.20 Stoppage in transit: Should the transport of any livestock be stopped by order of any Government official at any point either before, during, or after transit and whilst still in the possession of the Corporation in consequence of any breach by the consignor or consignee of any regulations concerning diseases of animals, or in consequence of any law or regulation prohibiting importation of such livestock or the like, the Corporation shall, on receiving such order to stop, be taken and considered to have fulfilled its obligations to deliver the said livestock and may deal with the same accordingly. In such cases the Corporation shall not be liable to make any allowance of freight paid, and the consignor or consignee shall not be relieved from his obligation to pay freight.

43.1.21 Poultry: The Corporation shall not receive live poultry for carriage except in properly constructed coops, cases, or crates of a suitable size.

43.2 Wagon rates

43.2.1 Charges: The following wagon rates shall be charged for the carriage of livestock:

H wagons	Class M

43.2.2 Reconsigned wagons: If wagons of livestock consigned to one station are on arrival at that station reconsigned without being unloaded, railage charges shall be computed on the through journey from the original forwarding station to the final destination station. Diversion charges provided in clause 21.2 will also apply.

43.3 Mixed consignments

Mixed consignments of cattle, horses, ponies, foals, hounds, or drover's dogs loaded in the same wagon shall be charged separately for each class of animal or as one lot as "cattle", whichever is the cheaper. Where mixed consignments are carried and charged at the small lots scale, the first animal rate in clause 43.5.1 shall be charged for the highest rated animal in each wagon and the respective rates for the remaining animals.

43.4 Part wagons

43.4.1 Right of Corporation to fill wagon: When a wagon is only partially occupied by a consignment of livestock, the Corporation reserves the right to fill the wagon to its full carrying capacity with other livestock. If a whole wagon is specially required by the consignor, the wagon rate shall be charged, irrespective of the number of animals.

43.4.2 Multiple consignments: When one consignor, or two different consignors at one forwarding station, load sheep, calves, lambs, or pigs on separate decks of a Jc wagon to the same consignee, or different consignees at the one destination station, each consignment shall be charged at the small lots scale.

43.5 Small lots

43.5.1 Charges: Cattle, calves, sheep, pigs, horses (including ponies and foals), or goats carried loose in small lots shall be charged at the wagon load rate, or if cheaper (provided the consignee does not require the exclusive use of a wagon) at the following rates:

43.6 Livestock in crates

Written application for the concession must be made to the General Manager of the Corporation at least 14 days before the goods are presented for carriage.

52.2 Orphanages and Maori mission fields

In the case of food and clothing donated to New Zealand orphanages and Maori mission fields, the concession of half rates shall be granted subject to a certificate in the following form being endorsed on the consignment note:

*I hereby certify that the goods entered hereon are a free donation to the *....., to which they are consigned, and I request that these goods be consigned at "owner's risk".*

This means that the carrier will pay no compensation if the goods are lost or damaged unless he intentionally loses or damages them.

54.2 Owner's risk

The foregoing rates are at "limited carrier's risk" and will be reduced by 2 percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk".

54.3 Minimum wagon load

All tank wagons are to be loaded to their full carrying capacity.

54.4 Empty haulage

With the exception of shunting charges to or from private sidings (where applicable), no charge shall be made for hauling empty tank wagons.

54.5 Loading and unloading

All tank wagons are to be loaded and unloaded by the owners.

55.3 Owner's risk

The foregoing rates are at "limited carrier's risk" and will be reduced by two percent where consignors require that the consignment be carried at "owner's risk".

55.4 Minimum Charges

Any less quantity than the minimum wagon load shall be charged at such minimum, or on the actual weight at the class E rate plus 50 percent, whichever is cheaper.

55.5 Handling

All loading and unloading shall be performed by the owners.

56. GOODS LOADED IN CONTAINERS**56.1 Bulk powder and liquids**

Goods shall be charged a rate of 67 cents per tonne, in addition to the classified rates applicable to the commodity, based on the net weight of the contents, when carried in the following containers owned by the Corporation:

- Bulk flour
- Bulk powder (e.g. lime flour, pozzalan, salt cake, etc)
- Bulk liquids (including bulk tallow, tall oil, molasses etc)

56.2 Exceptions

Clause 56.1 is not applicable to goods carried in the Corporation's Gsw, Gsx and insulated containers, or petroleum products carried in Corporation owned tank wagons. For bulk cement conveyed in Corporation owned tank wagons—see clause 51.4.1.

56.3 Lightweight metal containers

Goods conveyed in the Corporation's lightweight metal containers will be charged as follows:

56.3.1 Method of charging: On the gross weight of the container and contents at the rail rate appropriate to the goods involved, subject to a minimum charge as for one tonne gross weight per container. Where goods classified at Class G are so conveyed, charges will be based on the gross measurement of the container.

56.3.2 Hire charge: A hire charge of \$11.00 per container shall be made in addition to normal freight charges.

56.4 Demurrage

Demurrage shall be charged on each container not discharged by owners and returned to the Corporation within 16 working hours as defined in clause 63 (from the time the container is available at destination station for delivery) as follows:

56.5 Privately owned containers

Except where otherwise provided, goods railed in specially constructed privately owned containers shall be charged as follows:

56.5.1 Loaded containers: Loaded containers shall be charged for the gross weight at the appropriate rail rate applicable to the goods involved. In the case of class G goods charges will be based on the gross measurement of the container.

56.5.2 Empty containers: Empty containers shall be charged for the actual weight of the container at class C rates *except that* collapsible containers which have conveyed goods on the outward journey shall, when collapsed, be returned to the original forwarding station free of charge. This provision shall apply only to specially constructed containers as may be approved by the Corporation and shall not include empty containers such as cartons, cases or crates.

56.5.3 Loaded "Seafreighters" or "Flats": Loaded "Seafreighters" or "Flats" shall be charged for the gross weight at the appropriate standard or local rate of the commodity loaded, subject to minima as provided in clause 21.7 or to minima required for the local or classified rate applicable to the commodity loaded.

56.5.4 Empty collapsed "Seafreighters" or "Flats": Empty collapsed "Seafreighters" or "Flats" shall be charged for the actual weight at class C rates, subject to the minima as provided in clause 21.7.

56.5.5 Storage and demurrage: Storage and demurrage on privately owned containers shall be charged under the provisions of clauses 62 and 63 respectively.

56.6 "Packed" containers

Goods loaded in containers shall be treated as being "packed" for the purposes of clause 56.

56.7 Cranage

A charge of \$2.78 per tonne on gross weight shall be made for the use of the Corporation's cranage facilities to lift containers and "Seafreighters".

56.8 Minimum loads for Corporation Gsw and Gsx containers**56.8.1 Container minima:**

- 2 tonnes per 3 metre container
- 4 tonnes per 6 metre container

The charge for class G goods which require the sole use of a container shall not be less than the charge computed in the above minima for class C goods.

56.8.2 Wagon minima: Where sole use of wagons is required the following minima shall apply:-

- Per 4 wheeled wagon: 4 tonnes
- Per bogie wagon: 8 tonnes

The charge for Class G goods which require the sole use of a wagon shall not be less than the charge computed in the above minima for class C goods.

Goods 57/58.4

57. HOUSEHOLD REMOVALS**57.1 Charges**

Bona fide household removals consisting of articles which have actually been in use in a household, including sewing machines, bicycles, pianos, organs, prams and push-chairs, shall be charged at class B rates.

57.2 Minimum consignment

The minimum weight charged per consignment shall be 2.5 tonnes. Household removals in lesser quantities shall be charged at such minimum, or on the actual weight at class A rate, whichever is cheaper. Persons desiring the exclusive use of a wagon for household removals may be allowed such exclusive use at a minimum charge as for 2.5 tonnes per four wheeled wagon at class B rates.

57.3 Liability

Liability in respect of household removals is in accordance with the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979, as set out in clause 20.

57.4 Handling

The Corporation may require all loading and unloading to be performed by the owners, but where the loading or unloading is performed by the Corporation charges as provided in clause 58 shall be made.

58. LOADING, UNLOADING, TALLYING OR COVERING OF GOODS**58.1 Loading and unloading:**

Where in respect of any goods it is specified that loading and/or unloading is to be performed by consignors and/or consignees and the loading and/or unloading is performed by the Corporation the charge for such handling, except where otherwise provided, shall be as follows:

58.2 Tallying

Except where otherwise specified, when senders who do their own loading, or consignees who do their own unloading, desire the Corporation to check and give receipts for goods in respect of which loading or unloading charges are prescribed, a charge at \$3.60 per tonne shall be made for tallying subject to a minimum charge as for one tonne. The Corporation reserves the right to decline to undertake the tallying of goods.

58.3 Covering

If the covering of any goods referred to in clause 58.2 is performed by the Corporation a labour charge of \$6.40 per tarpaulin shall be made irrespective of whether such goods are loaded by owners or the Corporation. The Corporation will not accept responsibility in respect of such goods on account of their not being covered by tarpaulins. Consignors who undertake the covering of any goods shall make good all damage to tarpaulins arising from such goods being insufficiently or negligently covered, secured, or protected.

58.4 Additional charges

Except as otherwise provided, in cases where the nature or condition of any goods (or the containers in which such goods are packed) is such that additional costs are incurred in the handling of such goods from or to railway wagons, or in any handling incidental thereto, such additional costs shall be borne by the consignor or consignee as the case may be.

59. PRIVATE SIDING TRAFFIC: HAULAGE, HANDLING AND TALLYING CHARGES AND WAGON MINIMA**59.1 Acceptance of private siding traffic**

Where the loading or unloading of traffic is performed by consignors or consignees at private stores or sidings, the Corporation shall not accept the goods for carriage unless such goods are consigned at "owner's risk" or on "declared terms" in accordance with the provisions of the Carriage of Goods Act 1979.

59.2 Minimum wagon loads

Except as provided in clause 59.5 or when wagons are fully loaded, the charges for wagons consigned to or from a private siding shall be computed at the appropriate rate for the commodity on the following minimum weights:

59.3 Shunting charges

In cases where provision is made for a shunting charge to be enforced in respect of traffic to or from a private siding and a wagon containing less than the prescribed minimum is hauled, the shunting or haulage charge shall, except as provided in clause 59.6 be enforced according to whichever is the greater.

59.4 Shunting charge in lieu of rental

In any case where the annual siding rental has been waived and a shunting charge imposed in lieu thereof, the shunting charge shall be enforced in addition to haulage charges where such are applicable.

59.5 Local haulage

59.5.1 Haulage charge: Where goods are hauled between private stores or sidings, railway sheds, or public sidings *at the same station with no other railage involved* the haulage charge shall be as follows:

59.6 Conditions

59.6.1 Topping up: The Corporation reserves the right to fill up at its sheds or yards any wagon not loaded to its full carrying capacity consigned to or from a private siding.

59.6.2 Responsibility of private siding holder: Holders of private sidings are held responsible for the safe custody of Corporation property of any kind while in their sidings, and must return such property to the Corporation in the same condition as when placed in the private siding.

Goods 60/61.3.6

60. WEIGHING**60.1 Weighing by Corporation**

The Corporation may accept consignor's declared weights for rail freight charging purposes but reserves the right to check weigh. Where the weight is not declared and it is necessary for the Corporation to weigh the traffic for the purpose of calculating the railage charges, no charge will be made for weighing unless the consignor or consignee requests a weight certificate.

60.2 Weighing charges

The charges for each wagon weighed by the Corporation at the request of the consignor, consignee or their agents shall be as follows:

60.2.1 Goods weighed in railway wagons:

60.2.2 Multiple weight certificates: When more than one copy of a weight certificate is required by the same person or firm for goods weighed on the Corporation's wagon weighbridges a charge of \$1.59 will be made for each certificate in addition to the first.

60.2.3 Other goods weighed: Goods weighed on cart weighbridges shall be charged \$2.40 per vehicle. The charges for other goods weighed by the Corporation shall be as follows:

60.3 Weigh at request of customer

60.3.1 Conditions: The Corporation will, at stations where weighing facilities exist, and when reasonably convenient, weigh goods at the special request of consignor or consignee. No liability shall rest on the Corporation for any omission to weigh any goods. Consignors should declare on the consignment note whether they require the goods weighed by the Corporation. The reweighing of goods in truck loads shall be at the option of the Corporation.

60.3.2 Right to decline to weigh: The Corporation may decline to supply weights.

60.3.3 Responsibility of Corporation: In no instance will the Corporation accept responsibility for or guarantee its weighing as between buyer and seller.

61. CRANAGE**61.1 Charges**

Except as otherwise provided, cramage charges for the use of the Corporation's cranes, forklifts, and similar mechanical lifting devices shall be as follows:

61.2 Haulage of cranes

When the weight of the consignment to be handled is beyond the lifting capacity of a crane at a station and a crane is, at the request of the owner of the goods, hauled from another station, the haulage and hire charges shall be by special arrangement.

61.3 Hire of mobile cranes and forklifts

Where a Corporation mobile lifting appliance is hired for lifts outside the station yard, the following hire charges shall apply:—

61.3.1 Capacity up to three tonnes: \$46.00 per hour including the wages of the crane driver only.

61.3.2 Capacity three to six tonnes: \$55.00 per hour including the wages of the crane driver only.

61.3.3 Capacity over six tonnes: But not exceeding ten tonnes, \$69.00 per hour including the wages of the crane driver only.

61.3.4 Period of hire: The hire charges shall accrue during the whole period the crane is absent from its headquarters and in every case shall be subject to a minimum hire charge for 30 minutes.

61.3.5 Absence from home station: The foregoing charges shall also apply for the time a mobile crane is absent from its home station performing lifts at other stations at the request of a consignor or consignee. Corporation Area Traffic Managers and Freight Terminal Managers will authorise the movement of cranes for this purpose.

61.3.6 Corporation operator only to be used: Mobile cranes on hire from the Corporation are not to be operated by any person other than the operator provided by the Corporation.

61.4 Cranage not assured by Corporation

The Corporation does not undertake to supply cranes, forklifts, or any other mechanical lifting appliance, nor does it guarantee the lifting capacity thereof, or of any equipment used in connection therewith.

61.5 Where cranage not available

The loading and unloading of heavy articles at stations or sidings not provided with suitable lifting appliances for the handling of such packages must be undertaken by the owners at their own risk and expense, and such articles will not be received for carriage from or to such stations or sidings, unless satisfactory arrangements shall first have been made by the owners for loading or unloading, as the case may be.

62. STORAGE**62.1 Inward goods**

Storage, at the rates prescribed in clause 62.4 will be charged on goods of the following categories which are not uplifted from Corporation premises within eight working hours from the time such goods are available for delivery:

62.1.1 Containers: On loaded and empty privately owned containers and "Seafreighters" (irrespective of the rating classification of their contents) when stored on Corporation premises after having been discharged from wagons.

62.1.2 Other goods: On all other goods, except those for which demurrage charges as prescribed in clause 63 shall apply.

62.2 Outward goods

Storage charges as prescribed in clause 62.4 shall be levied after eight working hours on goods brought to stations pending consignment, whether such goods form part of uncompleted consignments or not.

62.3 Working hours

For the purpose of calculating storage charges "working hours" and holidays shall be as provided in clause 20.15.

62.4 Rates for storage

Rates charged for storage of privately owned containers (including ISO import/export containers and "Seafreighters"), loaded or empty, shall be:

62.4.1 When stored on Corporation premises and not removed within the time specified:

62.4.2 Where containers or "Seafreighters" are held on wagons and are subsequently unloaded and stored, only one free period of eight working hours, calculated from the time the containers first became available for delivery from the wagon, shall be allowed in the calculation of storage and demurrage charges due.

62.5 Rates for storage of other goods

62.5.1 Charges: When not removed within the time specified goods other than containers shall be deemed to be stored and storage shall be charged at the rate of \$3.20 per tonne (or per cubic metre in the case of class G goods) for each succeeding eight working hours or part thereof subject to a minimum charge \$1.60 per eight working hours.

62.5.2 Goods stored in the open: When goods other than containers are stored in the open, half the rates prescribed for storage in clause 62.5.1 shall be charged subject to a minimum charge of \$1.60 per eight working hours. When tarpaulins are used to cover goods stored in the open, a charge of \$4.76 per tarpaulin for each succeeding eight working hours or part thereof shall be made in addition to the charge for open storage.

62.6 Hazardous substances

Explosives and dangerous goods must be removed from Corporation premises immediately they are available for delivery. If left on Corporation premises they shall be at the entire risk and responsibility of the owner and shall be charged at treble the prescribed storage rate. Such goods may be removed from its premises by the Corporation at its option and stored at the entire risk and expense of the owner.

62.7 Ships' goods

The storage charges on non-containerised goods ex-ship shall be computed in accordance with the provisions of clause 66.

62.8 Reduced rates

Goods charged at reduced rates for conveyance shall be charged the full rates for storage.

62.9 Goods at the risk of the owner

Goods remaining on hand in excess of the delivery times specified in the Carriage of Goods Act 1979, as set out in clause 20, shall be held at the risk of the owner.

62.10 Notice to consignee

Whenever goods are stored, notice will be given to the consignee wherever possible to the address shown on the goods or on papers relating thereto, but the omission to give such notice shall not affect the liability of the Corporation in respect of such goods, or its right to charge for the storage of the goods.

62.11 Storage services

The Corporation does not undertake the provision of storage accommodation for goods.

63. DEMURRAGE**63.1 When demurrage charged**

63.1.1 Undischarged wagons: On each wagon loaded with goods which it is the duty of the consignee to unload, and which is not completely discharged within eight working hours from the time that the wagon is available for unloading.

63.1.2 Delayed dispatch: On each wagon ordered and not loaded, or improperly loaded, or loaded and not ready for dispatch within eight working hours from the time such wagon is made available for loading.

63.2 Working hours

For the purposes of calculating demurrage charges "working hours" and holidays shall be as provided in clause 20.15.

63.3 Duty to unload

For the purpose of clause 63.1.1 it shall be deemed to be the duty of the consignee to unload goods in the following instances:

63.3.1 Wherever it is specifically provided "owners to unload" or words to that effect; and

63.3.2 Where goods, irrespective of classification are put off at a station or siding where there is no stationmaster in charge; or placed in a private siding; and

63.3.3 When goods, irrespective of classification are consigned in wagon lots from one consignor to one consignee; and

63.3.4 In all cases other than where storage charges apply in terms of clause 62.

63.4 Liability

Goods which in terms of clause 63.3 it is the duty of the consignee to unload, on hand awaiting delivery, shall be held at the owner's risk after eight working hours from the time when the wagon is available for unloading.

63.5 Charges for demurrage

Demurrage shall be charged as follows:

63.5.1 Four wheeled wagons: \$50.00 per wagon for each succeeding eight working hours or part thereof.

63.5.2 Bogie wagons: \$100.00 per wagon for each succeeding eight working hours or part thereof.

63.6 Privately owned containers

Wagons containing privately owned containers (including import/export containers and "Seafreighters") shall be charged demurrage irrespective of whether such containers are empty or loaded.

63.7 Corporation may unload

The Corporation reserves the right to unload wagons on hand in excess of eight working hours from the time that the goods are available for delivery, at the sole risk and expense of the owner or consignee.

64. CHECK AND EMPTY RAILWAY WAGONS: BOGIE AND SPECIAL WAGONS**64.1 Charges**

Check wagons and empty railway wagons (other than petrol tank wagons) hauled on their own wheels shall be charged as follows *except that* bogie wagons shall be charged at double the rates:

Except in the case of timber or as otherwise provided, where the use of a check wagon or a bogie wagon is necessary, owing to the length or other nature of goods whereby they cannot be loaded in a four wheeled wagon, the following methods of charging shall apply:

A consignment of 7.0 tonnes or more, loaded on a bogie wagon, or loaded on a four wheeled wagon and one check wagon provided. No extra charge shall be made on account of the check wagon or bogie wagon being necessary.

A consignment of less than 7.0 tonnes loaded on a bogie wagon, or loaded on a four wheeled wagon and one check wagon provided. Charged as for 7.0 tonnes at the appropriate rate for the commodity.

Check wagons additional to the wagons specified above. Charged for the additional check wagons used.

64.3 Grouping consignments

Separate consignments loaded on the same bogie wagon, or on a four wheeled wagon plus a check wagon, by the same or different consignors at the one forwarding station to the same or different consignees at the one destination station shall be grouped for the purpose of calculating the minimum of 7.0 tonnes as provided in clause 64.2. Any weight deficiency to make up the minimum is to be apportioned equally between the consignments which required the use of such wagon(s).

64.4 Special wagons

64.4.1 Empty petrol tank wagons: Empty petrol tank wagons shall be conveyed under the provisions of clause 54.4.

64.4.2 Plate glass: Consignments loaded on wagons specially designed for the carriage of plate glass shall be charged according to the classified rate for "glass plate", as provided in clause 73.

64.4.3 Well wagons: Well wagons (Ud and Udk class) are specially designed for the conveyance of unusually heavy and/or bulky articles. Where, owing to the nature of the goods, the use of a well wagon is required, railage charges shall be computed on the actual weight or measurement at the appropriate classified rate, or at the rate of \$3.60 per loaded wagon kilometre, whichever is the greater, with a minimum charge per wagon of \$507.43. The costs of any material supplied, and the costs incurred where it is necessary for an employee of the Corporation to specially accompany the load during transit, owing to the nature of the goods shall be an additional charge. The minimum charge of \$507.43 per wagon shall also apply to local traffic goods conveyed on well wagons and charged under the provisions of clause 69.4

65. LOADING BANKS USED FOR OTHER THAN RAILED GOODS

65.1 Charges: The following charges shall be made for the use of the Corporation's loading banks when used for handling goods or livestock other than those which have been received, or are to be dispatched, by rail:

65.1.1 For use of loading banks:

66. CHARGES ON SHIPS' GOODS**66.1 Method of charging**

Charges on ships' goods shall be computed on cubic measurement or on actual weight, whichever charge is greater, when conveyed on the port lines from Breakwater to New Plymouth, Lyttelton to Christchurch, Port Chalmers to Dunedin, or Bluff to Invercargill.

66.2 Definition

The term "ships' goods" for the purposes of this clause means and includes goods received direct from ships on to the railway, and, except where otherwise provided, refers only to goods of classes A, B, C, D and G (including such goods which are subject to a percentage or other increase).

66.3 Separate consignments

In computing the railage charges on goods ex-ship, each bill of lading shown on the manifest is to be treated as covering a separate consignment. In the event of there being more than one entry on the manifest for the same consignee, such entries shall not be grouped but the charges shall be computed separately.

66.4 Cashin Quay

Ships' goods railed from Cashin Quay berth, Lyttelton to Christchurch, shall not be charged under the provisions of this clause: such goods shall be charged at classified rates.

67. SHUNTING CHARGES ON LOADS FOR SHIPMENT

67.1 The classified or local rates or haulage charges on goods for shipment cover the placing of the wagons containing such goods at the ship's side. Where a request is made to the Corporation, either before or after the wagons are placed at the ship's side, for the wagons to be sorted for a particular hold or port of discharge, and such sorting necessitates additional shunting work beyond that which would ordinarily be required to place such wagons at the ship's side, or where, owing to a ship moving to another berth, wagons which have already been placed at the ship's side require to be moved to the ship's side in its new berth, the additional service shall be charged for at the rate of \$79.50 per hour, subject to a minimum charge as for half an hour for each service.

68. WHARVES AND PORT CONTAINER TERMINALS**68.1 Charges**

Except where otherwise specified the following rates and charges shall be levied in the case of employees engaged by the Corporation in shunting, supervising, or in any other way in connection with a ship, wharf, or port container terminal.

68.1.1 Ordinary working hours: No charges will be levied for employees engaged by the Corporation in shunting, supervising or in any other way in connection with the ship, wharf, or container terminal during the ordinary working hours.

68.1.2 Weekday outside ordinary hours: The ship or port container terminal shall be charged at the ordinary rate ruling for a senior shunter as determined by the General Manager of the Corporation, pursuant to the State Services Conditions of Employment Act 1977, for employees engaged by the Corporation in shunting, supervising, or in any other way in connection with the ship, wharf, or port container terminal between 0600 hours and 0800 hours and between 1700 hours and 2000 hours Monday to Friday inclusive, holidays excepted.

68.1.3 Saturday hours: The ship or port container terminal shall be charged at one and a half times the rate specified in clause 68.1.2 for employees engaged by the Corporation in shunting, supervising, or in any other way in connection with the ship, wharf, or port container terminal between 0600 hours and 1200 hours on Saturdays, holidays excepted.

68.1.4 Other times: Except as provided above the ship or port container terminal shall be charged at double the rate specified in clause 68.1.2 for employees engaged by the Corporation in shunting, supervising, or in any other way in connection with the ship, wharf, or port container terminal and an undertaking must in every case be given before work is commenced that payment will be made.

68.2 Working hours

For the purposes of this clause the ordinary working hours of the Corporation are as provided in clause 20.15.

68.3 Special Cargo

Where ships discharge any cargo which by reason of its nature or condition comes within any provision of any Waterfront Industry Tribunal's orders or any agreement made with the representatives of the New Zealand Waterside Workers Unions at the various ports whether or not such agreement is in substitution for any such order, and so requires the payment of a special rate exceeding the ruling rates of pay for the handling of such cargo, or for work deemed to be incidental to the discharging of the cargo, then in such cases, in addition to the rates that would be payable had they not been subject to such provisions or agreement as aforesaid, the ship or port container terminal shall be charged in respect of all employees engaged by the Corporation and entitled to such rate exceeding the ruling rate of pay the extra cost incurred by the Corporation for the shunting, supervising, or any other duties incidental to the handling of such cargo.

68.4 Agreement to payment

In every case where the shipowner does not have an office at the port where extra cost as referred to in clause 68.3 is incurred, it shall be a condition precedent to the work performed by the Corporation's employees, incidental to the handling of such cargo that the ship's agent shall be deemed to have agreed with the Corporation for the payment by such agent of such additional cost.

69. HAULAGE, HANDLING, SORTING AND TRANSHIPMENT CHARGES: PORT STATIONS**69.1 Sorting goods ex-ship**

69.1.1 Hauled: Goods ex-ship comprising two or more packages or articles hauled and charged for such haulage according to clauses 69.4.1 and 69.4.2, and which require to be sorted out for delivery or for redispach shall be charged \$14.46 per tonne, which charge shall include the handling charge specified in clause 69.4.3 subject to a minimum charge of \$3.21.

69.1.2 Not hauled: Goods ex-ship comprising two or more packages or articles which require to be sorted out for delivery or redispach shall be charged for such sorting at the following rates:

69.2.2 Dividing partial consignments: The charge on consignments divided for delivery or redispached to order will be enforced only on that portion of each such consignment as is subdivided for delivery or redispach.

69.3 Goods ex-ship for country stations

When goods landed ex-ship are consigned direct from the ship to a station other than the port sorting station and are handed to the Corporation so that they can be forwarded direct to destination, railage from wharf to destination shall be charged. However, when goods are not consigned direct from the ship to destination, or are landed in such a way that they cannot be forwarded direct to destination but first have to be sorted or otherwise dealt with at the usual sorting station for the port, haulage or railage between the wharf and the port sorting station shall be charged in addition to railage from the sorting station to the destination. The appropriate charges for handling, sorting, and dividing shall apply where incurred, in addition to the foregoing charges.

69.4.4 Assembled vehicles: Delivery of motor vehicles, motor-vehicle trailers, and tractors completely assembled on their wheels may, at the option of the Corporation, be given or taken by owners at the ship's side. Except as otherwise provided, the charge for each vehicle so received or delivered shall be \$32.00. Where receipt or delivery is or will be taken under the provisions of this clause the Corporation shall not be responsible for any damage howsoever caused or arising which may occur to any such vehicle after it has been placed upon the wharf.

69.5 Haulage of ship's ballast

Ship's ballast hauled from ship's side and tipping to spoil shall be charged \$15.35 per tonne subject to a minimum charge as for 10 tonnes.

69.6 Port transhipments

The Corporation reserves the right to decide whether wagons shall be supplied for goods to be hauled from ship to ship at a port. Except as otherwise provided, *bona fide* transhipments from one vessel to another at the same port shall be charged for haulage and storage at the following rates:

69.6.1 Reshipment within 36 hours: When the goods are received ex-ship into wagons and hauled to another ship for reshipment within 36 hours a haulage charge of \$15.90 per tonne subject to a minimum as for 5 tonnes per four wheeled wagon shall apply.

69.6.2 Reshipment after 36 hours or via shed: When the goods are received ex-ship into wagons and are not reshipped within 36 hours or are hauled to shed for storage and afterwards redelivered to ship, a transhipment charge of \$14.50 per tonne subject to a minimum charge of \$3.20 shall be made to cover handling in shed (or detention of wagons), and storage up to one week. In addition, charges totalling \$31.80 per tonne shall be made for haulage from the ship and to the ship as specified in clause 70.4 subject to a minimum charge \$158.90 per four wheeled wagon. After the expiry of one week, storage shall be charged at the rate ordinarily chargeable for storage at the station concerned.

69.7 Computation

69.7.1 Timber measurement: For the purposes of charging for reshipments, the weight of timber will be calculated as follows:

- Hardwood 0.82 cubic metres to the tonne
- All other timbers 1.00 cubic metres to the tonne

69.7.2 36 hour period: In computing the period of 36 hours referred to in clauses 69.6.1 and 69.6.2, the provisions of clause 20.15 regarding working hours and days shall apply.

69.7.3 Wool: Wool shall be computed at the rate of six bales not exceeding 205 kilograms each to the tonne.

69.7.4 Weight or measurement: The charges on ship's goods, as defined in clause 66, shall be computed on weight or measurement at the option of the Corporation.

69.7.5 Bogie wagons: Bogie wagons shall be charged at twice the rate for four wheeled wagons.

70. COOK STRAIT RAIL FERRY RATES FOR GOODS IN RAILWAY WAGONS

70.1 Method of charging

Except where otherwise specified, the charges for the conveyance of goods in railway wagons in respect of the sea portion of the journey shall be computed on actual weight or cubic measurement (ships measurement) whichever charge is greater. The charge for the sea journey covers wharfage, harbour improvement rate, handling to and from vessel, and all other incidental charges usually associated with the shipment of goods.

70.2 Minimum wagon charge

Where a request is made for the exclusive use of a railway wagon, or the nature or dimensions of the goods are such that they preclude other goods from being loaded in the wagon then, unless otherwise specified, the following minimum wagon charges shall apply:

Containers used for the carriage of livestock on the rail ferries will be accepted subject to the following requirements being complied with:

Fully enclosed and ventilated.

Constructed with sides and floor that are leakproof and the floor covered with suitable material to absorb any animal excreta for the duration of the sea voyage.

Constructed with the means of access to allow the animals to be attended to if necessary.

Robust in construction and have sufficient lashings and holding bolts used to ensure their safe carriage on the wagons or road vehicles.

A person competent to attend the animals during the sea voyage may be required to accompany them.

71.3 Acceptable livestock

The following classes of animals only shall be accepted for carriage by the Cook Strait rail ferry service:

Dogs on chains

Dogs and other small animals in boxes or other approved receptacle.

Guide dogs accompanying blind persons.

71.4 Corporation's discretion to accept other livestock

Livestock under the care of an attendant, who must hold a passenger ticket, and in approved crates, containers, or in special railway livestock wagons, will be accepted at the Corporation's discretion under special arrangement.

72. HAZARDOUS GOODS ON COOK STRAIT RAIL FERRIES**72.1 Conditions**

Hazardous substances and dangerous goods are prohibited from carriage on the Cook Strait rail ferries other than as provided for in the "International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code" (IMCO Regulations), and Shipping (Dangerous Goods) Rules 1979.

72.2 Information

Information as to the acceptance or otherwise of a hazardous substance may be obtained from any officered railway station, the Corporation's Manager, Air/Sea Services, or from the Ministry of Transport, Marine Division, at the following centres:

72.3 Classes of hazardous substances

Under the IMCO Regulations hazardous substances for carriage by sea are divided into the following classes:

Class 1	Explosives.
Class 2	Gases compressed, liquified, or dissolved under pressure.
Class 3.1	Flammable liquids having a flashpoint below -18°C (0°F) or possessing a low flashpoint in combination with some dangerous property other than flammability.
Class 3.2	Flammable liquids having a flashpoint of -18°C (0°F) up to, but not including, 23°C (73°F).
Class 3.3	Flammable liquids having a flashpoint of 23°C (73°F) up to and including, 61°C (141°F).
Class 4 (a)	Flammable solids
Class 4 (b)	Flammable solids, -or substances, liable to spontaneous combustion.
Class 4 (c)	Flammable solids, or substances, which in contact with water emit flammable gases.
Class 5 (a)	Oxidizing substances
Class 5 (b)	Organic peroxides
Class 6 (a)	Poisonous (toxic) substances.
Class 6 (b)	Infectious substances
Class 7	Radioactive substances
Class 8	Corrosives
Class 9	Miscellaneous hazardous substances, that is any other substances which experience has shown, or may show to be of such a hazardous character that the provisions of the IMCO Regulations apply to it.

72.4 Instructions on storage

Detailed instructions on the safe packing and stowage of hazardous substances acceptable for conveyance are available from any officered railway station, Manager, Air/Sea Services, or at the offices listed in clause 72.2 or from the Ministry of Transport, Marine Division.

72.5 Markings

Each receptacle containing hazardous substances shall be marked with the correct technical name (trade names shall not be used) and identified with a distinctive label or stencil of the label so as to make clear the hazardous character. Each receptacle shall be so labelled except receptacles containing chemicals packed in limited quantities and large shipments which can be stowed, handled and identified as a unit.

72.6 Documents

In all documents relating to the carriage of hazardous substances by sea where the goods are named, the correct technical name of the goods is to be used (trade names must not be used) and the correct description given in accordance with clause 72.3. The documents prepared by the consignor shall include a Dangerous Goods Declaration Form in triplicate certifying that the goods are properly packed, marked and labelled and in proper condition for carriage.
