THESE publications were imported privately and seized at Auckland Airport on 1 March. Forfeiture has been disputed by the importer so that they have been forwarded to the Tribunal for classification.

Puritan No. 7 is apparently published quarterly and is subtitled Adult American Dream Book—Ultimate in Erotica. The articles are sexually orientated and explicit in their detail. The illustrations are largely of males and females, many in posed and contrived positions with emphasis on genitalia.

The Best of Puritan is once again almost completely sexually orientated and as its title would suggest, contains articles and photographs from its parents.

Hustler, Volume 8, No. 10, is not dissimilar in content to Puritan and once again the Best of Hustler contains supposedly the best articles and illustrations from its parents.

A general comment can be made about *Puritan* No. 7 and issue No. 10 of *Hustler*. There is a minimal amount of serious content and insufficient other matter to offer any redeeming

Swedish Erotica is supposed to be a complete full colour catalogue listing Adult Movies from the Swedish Erotica Series. There is little, if any, text; the bulk of the photographs being of men and women indulging in sexual activities in a variety of contrived and extraordinary positions.

It was the submission of the Comptroller that the 5 publications are predominantly concerned in arousing prurient interest, are likely to be injurious to the public good and are therefore indecent.

In his written submission the importer said:

(a) That he was a responsible adult.
(b) That the magazines would be read in privacy in his own home.

(c) The magazines would not be shown to minors and in fact any other person.

(d) The magazines would not be sold or lent to any other

person.

(e) The forfeiture of the magazines would be considered to be an invasion of his personal rights or freedom of choice.

Therefore he claimed he should be allowed to retain the volumes.

For the benefit of the importer it is useful to quote section 11 (1) and (2) of the Indecent Publications Act which reads:

"11. Matters to be taken into consideration by Tribunal or Court-

(1) In classifying, or determining the character of any book or sound recording the Tribunal shall take into consideration-

(a) The dominant effect of the book or sound recording as

a whole;
(b) The literary or artistic merit, or the medical, legal, political, social, or scientific character or importance of the book or sound recording;

- (c) The persons, classes of persons, or age groups to or amongst whom the book or sound recording is or is intended or is likely to be published, heard, distributed, sold, exhibited, played, given, sent, or delivered:
- (d) The price at whch the book or sound recording sells or is intended to be sold;
- (e) Whether any person is likely to be corrupted by reading the book or hearing the sound recording and whether other persons are likely to benefit therefrom:
- (f) Whether the book or the sound recording displays an honest purpose and an honest thread of thought or whether its content is merely camouflage designed to render acceptable any indecent parts of the book or sound recording,

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, whether the publication of any book or the distribution of any sound recording would be in the interests of art, literature, science, or learning and would be for the public good, the Tribunal shall not classify it as indecent."

The Tribunal bears in mind the comments of Jeffries, J., in Waverley Publishing Company Limited v. Comptroller of Customs 1980, 1 NZLR 631, where he said at page 646:

"Because of the universality of comprehension of the graphic form, with its concomitantly more direct and powerful emotional appeal, this medium has proved more vexing for those who must control indecency than the written word. Verbal indecency became a social issue with the rise in literacy following universal education. Perhaps that particular medium is now perceived as less potentially harmful than representational photography, and cinematic films. Confirmation of this observation is to be found in the Report Confirmation of this observation is to be found in the Report of the Committee on Obscenity and Film Censorship which had Professor Bernard Williams as its chairman. It reported in November 1979; Cmnd. 7772. Recommendation 6 of its general proposals is:

"The printed word should be neither restricted nor prohibited since its nature makes it neither immediately offensive nor capable of involving the harms we identify, and because of its importance in conveying ideas."

I recognise that representational photography, for those entrusted with the perplexing task of deciding between the acceptable and non acceptable is one of the nicest problems of the line drawing which must be faced.

I think that every item which comes before the Tribunal for decision must be measured against the definition of indecency, and the considerations contained in section 11 of the Act which are not exhaustive. However, I think that a book or sound recording is likely to be indecent and injurious to the public good if: to the public good if:

- 1. It is predominantly concerned with the prurient and lewd aspects of sex; and
- 2. The exact subject matter is described, depicted or expressed in a patently offensive manner so as to concentrate attention and reaction on the prurient and lewd aspects of sex; and
- 3. The work looked at in its entirety had negligible literary or artistic merit, and is otherwise not redeemed by its medical, legal, political, social or scientific character or importance.
- 4. The likelihood of corruption far outweighs possible benefit.
- 5. The sincerity of purpose which produced the item is gravely in question."

In the Tribunal's view these publications must be classified as indecent and injurious to the public good for the reasons mentioned by Jeffries, J.

### DECISION

In decision No. 936, the Indecent Publications Tribunal declared *Penthouse* (U.S.) published by Penthouse International Ltd. to be indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age and made a restriction order under section 15A

of the Indecent Publications Act.

That order expired on 21 December 1981 and in submitting the 3 present publications to the Tribunal, Mr Leloir stated that the Customs Panastment's number was to obtain stated that the Customs Department's purpose was to obtain from the Tribunal a further 2-year restriction order, thus avoiding the necessity of frequent applications for individual classification of *Penthouse* issues in the future. The basis of the Customs Department's application was that the standard of these 2 issues of Penthouse was comparable with the standard of the 3 issues of Penthouse

classified by the Tribunal in decision No. 936.

The broad format of Penthouse is similar to the 1979 issues. The magazine still contains articles and essays of social and literary merit, and this written content has not significantly and literary merit, and this written content has not significantly deteriorated either in quantity or text since the publication was last before the Tribunal. We must quality the remarks we have just made by stating that it would have been difficult for certain sections of the magazine (i.e. Forum and Call Me Madam) to deteriorate further.

A change has been noticed in the pictorial sections of the magazine. Generally Penthouse contains 3 such sections in any given issue. There is a Pet of the Month section, which is invariably found in the middle of the publication to permit a centrefold shot to be provided, and there are usually 2 other pictorial sections.

2 other pictorial sections.

In the three 1979 issues examined in decision No. 936 none of the total of ten pictorial sections featured more than 1 model. The photographs were frank and the Tribunal noted:

"It is apparent that there has been some change in the last 2 years in the photographic material, and there is now a greater emphasis on the vaginal area than before".

In 1981 the situation is different. There are roughly the same number of pictorial features as the 1979 issues and not only do those sections feature expicit genital detail, but also each magazine contains a pictorial section with 2 or more models.

It seems obvious to us that Penthouse is taking another major step forward in the kind of photographs it is presenting to its readers. This change has no doubt been brought about by Penthouse's desire to stay at the forefront of its competitors.

In these circumstances we cannot accept Mr Leloir's submission that the 1979 issues are comparable with those under consideration. We find it necessary to assess *Penthouse's* position anew.

The dominant effect, and literary and social merit of

Penthouse.

There can be little doubt that Penthouse is concerned primarily with the presentation of material on sex. In dealing with its main subject the magazine ranges from a sensible discussion of pertinent issues (e.g. the articles on male sexuality, Shere Hite, in the November 1981 issue) to objectionable extremity (e.g. Forum, Call Me Madam, and Sweet Chastity, in the same issue). Similar variation is evident in the photographic material. While some pictures are gross others are unexceptionable. In passing we note that our view of the 1981 issues almost exactly parallels the Tribunal's view of the same magazine in 1974 when in decision No. 830 the Tribunal stated: with its main subject the magazine ranges from a sensible

"The amount of material not concerned with sex varies among the scenes but at nowhere threatens to contest the dominance, in context and illustration, of the varied sexual fare. In its nature and in the tone of its treatment, some of the sexual material is more objectionable than the features of earlier issues on which the Tribunal commented."

Our view of the present issues is that the bulk of each magazine is tolerable in today's environment. Had the standard of the 1981 issues been the same as the 1979 issues (considered in decision No. 936)' we would have had little hesitation in accepting the Comptroller's submission and maintaining the status quo.

However, we are quite concerned by the emergence of the multiple model pictorial sections in each of the 1981 Penthouse issues. In favour of the publisher and distributor we should say we have reservations about prohibiting the circulation of *Penthouse* magazine because of a single portfolio of photographs in any particular issue. While the dominant effect of *Penthouse* is obviously to cover sexual matters, we feel that the photographic side of the magazine contributes only partially to the overall dominant effect.

We also accept in a situation where the particularly offensive

We also accept in a situation where the particularly offensive material is relatively brief in relation to the remaining content of the magazine or book, that we must be careful to ensure that there is good cause for declaring the whole

publication to be indecent.

On the other hand, we think we can justifiably declare a publication unconditionally indecent if, in bringing about part of its dominant effect, it carries a section too far. If this were not so *Penthouse* or any similar magazine could present a section or portfolio of gross photographs of any kind it wished, with complete immunity, because of the existence of the other material in the issue.

Bearing the above principles in mind we turn to examine the publications before us. As we have previously indicated, the marked deterioration we note is in the presence of the multiple model scenes and so we give these our particular attention. (This does not mean we are ignoring the remaining sexual content of any of the magazines but rather that we are considering the cumulative effect of the photographic sections on articles such as Forum, Sweet Chastity and Call Me Madam, in assessing whether the publication crosses the boundary of decency).

In the September issue of Penthouse the multiple scene concerns a young couple depicted in various positions in a

beach setting. While some of the photographs run close to the line of indecency we are not prepared to say that the scenes are so offensive that they are injurious to the public

good.

The October issue is more objectionable. In a pictorial section entitled *Mud and Money* 2 young women are seen fighting in a mud pit. In our view *Penthouse* is providing a bizarre and tasteless context for the usual set of photographs that one might expect to see of naked models. While we find this segment also runs very close to the line we are not prepared to condemn the whole issue because of it. We note however that had there been lesbian overtones to the porthowever that had there been lesbian overtones to the portfolio of photographs we would probably have found the material to have progressed from the crude and tasteless to that which was injurious to the public good. Indeed, in a context where that further element was provided (i.e. in the Caligula section of the June 1980 issue of Penthouse) we declared the publication to be unconditionally indecent.

The November issue however, in our view, crosses the line.
The particular segment of concern is 13 pages in length and entitled To Rush in with Love. It is a pictorial article using a James Bond—From Russia with Love scenario. The first photographs are concerned with scenes of violence, but are only a lead into scenes between a male and 3 female models.

We find that the scenes are not only offensive and tasteless but also that they are injurious to the public good because:

(a) of the mixture of sex and violence depicted;

(b) of the needless multiplicity of models and the degree of intimacy among them;
(c) of the lesbian and prurient aspects of sex presented.

Although the series of photographs is clearly meant to depict a fictitious incident, we are unable to say that the impact of the pictures is lessened in any way by the nature of the scenario. We make this comment because we note that in decision No. 881 (which concerned the February and July 1976 issues of *Penthouse*) the Tribunal referred to a section of photographs which set out, albeit fantastically, a sadistic and lesbian episode. The Tribunal stated:

"The presentation of nudity is not indecent if it is not prurient or salacious. Fantasy or fantastic presentation can lessen the indecency and sadism or other sexual matters which, in other ways of presentation, are obscene and pornographic".

We would be unimpressed in respect of such an argument applying to the November 1981 issue, as we see nothing in the sequence to indicate that the photographs were taken in an artistic way to present the viewer with a scene containing elements of imagery or fantasy not normally to be found in

the straight photography of nude models.

From the above it must be apparent that we would not be prepared to classify the September/October issues unconditionally indecent as a result of a consideration of their content. The remaining factors to be considered under section 11 (1) do not adversely or beneficially affect the classification

we are considering imposing on those issues and so we do not find it necessary to discuss those matters in detail.

The situation for the November issue is different, because unless there are other factors in section 11 (1) in this issue's favour, it is likely to be classified unconditionally indecent. We therefore turn to consider the remaining points in some detail.

The persons likely to read the issue: the likelihood of

corruption.

We accept that Penthouse is directed largely at adult readers (this point having been noted in previous decisions, e.g. Nos. 830 and 936) although we think because of its presentation and price it has considerable appeal to younger and less mature readers. On the most favourable view to the publisher we bear in mind that a relatively high level of tolerance is to be exercised if adult New Zealanders are not to be unduly inhibited in the material they wish to read. We have therefore exercised as much restraint as we could in relation to the September/October issues.

September/October issues.

We are not inclined to accept an argument that there is little likelihood of corruption because the material in the November issue is only slightly worse than other material which has appeared in *Penthouse*. We have inspected many of the previous U.S. issues of *Penthouse* that have come before the Tribunal. In our view the November 1981 issue

is clearly distinguishable from other issues in that it falls well below the normal standard of the magazine. We also accept with respect Lord Wilberforce's dicta on the subject of corruption in *D.P.P.* v Whyte (1972) 3 All E.R. 12. That case concerned charges brought pursuant to the Obscene Publications Act 1959 in England and one of the defences raised was that the readers of the pornography were already raised was that the readers of the pornography were already in such a state of depravity or corruption that there would, or could, be no further deterioration. Lord Wilberforce stated (p. 19 letter g):

"The Act's purpose is to prevent the depraving and corrupting of men's minds by certain types of writing; it could never have been intended to except from the legislative protection a large body of citizens merely because, in different degrees, they had previously been exposed, or exposed themselves, to the 'obscene' material. The Act is not merely concerned with the once for all corruption of the wholly innocent, it equally protects the less innocent from further corruption that additional content is the protection of the corruption of the corruptio from further corruption, the addict from feeding or increasing his addiction.'

In our view the portfolio of photographs referred to portrays a prurient and salacious view of sex likely to affect even adult readers (especially those in the 18 to 25 age group).

The price at which the issue is to be sold.

Mr Heron who appeared for the distributors, Messrs Gordon and Gotch submitted that with a contemplated increase in price for the new issues of *Penthouse* the volume of sales was likely to decrease as indeed it had over the part year or

The figures that Mr Heron produced to us show that Penthouse has risen in price from \$2.70 in November 1978 to \$5.55 in February 1982. The circulation figures (which Mr Heron asked us to keep confidential) support his submission that sales have dropped significantly as the price of the publication has increased. We think that Mr Heron's submission is correct, even although the American figures (which we requested) show that although *Penthouse* has risen in price from \$1.25 in 1975 to \$2.50 in 1981, the circulation figures have remained buoyant.

Although there has been a drop in circulation in New Zealand, the sales are nevertheless still substantial enough to show that a considerable degree of interest exists in the content of the publication. We do not feel that the circulation figures have dropped to the stage where *Penthouse* is unlikely to need close attention from the Tribunal because of its limited appeal to readers.

Although we accept that recent price rises could and have acted as deterrents to regular subscription to the magazine, its purchase price of \$5.50 is still within the range of almost all New Zealanders. We do not accept that Penthouse's price level is a significant factor in influencing our view of the November issue of the publication. In our opinion none of Tribunal to classify the November issue of Penthouse as anything other than indecent.

For all the above reasons the Tribunal refuses to make a

section 15A ruling, and makes the following classifications:

(1) That the September and October issues of Penthouse be declared indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

(2) That the November issue of Penthouse is indecent. W. M. WILLIS, District Court Judge Chairman.

#### DECISION

WE have before us the uncorrected proof (two volumes) and final edition of the above publication. We were informed by Mr McNeice that this publication was imported commercially and seized at Auckland in October 1981. As the importer has disputed forfeiture the Customs Department has referred the publication to the Tribunal for classification prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Both publications are paper back, the final edition measuring 155 mm × 235 mm and is 1,129 pages in length. According to the author's preface the book began in 1974, although it was not published until 1981. The annual study took 5 years of what the author described as "extremely intensive work". From the detail to be found in the book we have no reason

to doubt her.

The book is undoubtedly a serious study of male sexuality. The book is undoubtedly a serious study of male sexuality. Shere Hite is a person who might be called an authority the study of human sexual relations. Prior to this publication she was editor of Sexual Interest: By Women for Women, and is best known for her original work The Hite Report. This latter publication came before the Tribunal in November 1978 and was ruled upon in decision No. 913. The book was part and parcel of a large number of other publications covered in that decision. In its brief comment the Tribunal stated.

stated:
"Items 9 (The Hite Report) and 10 are both well-known publications, the first being the result of a widespread and apparently scientific investigation and the other a U.S. Federal Government Enquiry. Both we consider require an 18 years age restriction. In the case of the first because the explicitness and detail of *The Hite Report* make it unsuitable for younger persons." (Our parenthesis.)

Mr McNeice suggested that we impose a similar age restriction of the state of t

tion in respect of this publication. Before we discuss the particular classification of this book it might be appropriate to note that we often impose age restrictions on serious sexual text because of their frank analysis of the subject and because of the presence of accompanying photographs. The rationale is that younger readers might find the books attractive for the

wrong reasons (especially where photographs are provided).

The points in favour of imposing such a restriction for the above reasons in the present case are that at times the text is explicit, and diverse sexual practices are discussed. This is because of the author's approach of setting out actual extracts from responses she received from persons surveyed. If there were no restriction on the book then retailers could put the publication on open display and there is an element of danger that the book could attract a "browsing audience" of young and immature readers. We must note, however, that we do not see any real likelihood of corruption arising in this manner.

The points in favour of imposing no restriction are

numerous. The most compelling is that we think this publica-

"... would be in the interests of ... learning and would be for the public good . . ."

within the meaning of section 11 (2) of the Act. The Tribunal is aware that some care must be used in making such a finding, because once it is made, the provisions require the Tribunal to classify the book as not indecent notwithstanding the provisions of section 11 (1). We think that Hite put the importance of sexual understanding very aptly in her preface

when she said:
"Is men's view of the world changing? Are men changing their ideas of who they are, how they see the world, and how they would like the world to be—or is it more true to say 'The more needs change, the more they remain the same'? Is there a hope that men and women will begin to set aside the presiding cultural patterns that are clearly resulting in a mutual unhappiness? What do we want to create from here on? How can life be better for all of us, and how can relationships be closer and more satisfying, more loving and more deep? These are the questions to which this book is dedicated.

To discuss sex is to discuss our most basic views of who we are and what we want life to be, what kind of a society we believe in. The re-evaluation of the meaning of sexuality

and relationships can have enormous implications for how we construct our society, and how we live with other people and within ourselves."

In the environment of a growing concern for open discussion of issues of all kinds we think that this book should be freely available on retail book shelves so that it is accessible to members of the public who wish to purchase it.

We would probably have reached the same conclusion is relationable to classification if we had considered the publication in relation.

to classification if we had considered the publication in relation to the factors under section 11 (1). In case we are incorrect in saying the publication falls within the provsions of section 11 (2) we wish to make the following observations:

1. The price of the book will effectively preclude it from the reach of immature readers. Although we had no informa-tion from the publisher on this point we note that the price on the back of the final English edition is £9.95. This means

that the New Zealand sale price is likely to be in the \$25-\$40 range (probably in the upper reaches of that range). When we consider that a member of the public can purchase at least 4 *Penthouse* or *Playboy* magazines for \$25 we think it unlikely that impressionable persons would outlay such a large sum on the present text when cheaper more consumer orientated publications with glossy photographs are readily

- 2. There is no doubt that the book has strong social and scientific character and importance, and that this dominant effect is to put forward a censored discussion of sexual behaviour. It clearly has honesty of purpose.
- 3. The book is aimed at adults and it not presented in such a way that it would automatically attract younger readers (i.e., with photographs and drawings). Indeed, the lengthy text we feel would act as a deterrent to the less mature reader.
- 4. While there is a danger, if the book is on open display, 4. While there is a danger, if the book is on open display, that it will be read by younger persons who may be looking for the wrong point in the publication, we do not think that this aspect should be taken too seriously. In fact, we mention it only to indicate that it was an element we considered in reaching our decision. In our view it is extremely unlikely that young persons will be corrupted by the present publication through the practice of "browsing" through it in public bookshops. We think, pursuant to section 11 (1) (e), that the likely benefit of the book being on public display that the likely benefit of the book being on public display far outweighs the likelihood of corruption.

In deference to the Tribunal's earlier decision on The Hite Report (which imposed an age restriction of 18 on the publication in decision No. 913) we should like to express our reasons why we intend to rule the present report as not

The first point is that in the intervening period since the original report, Hite has become better known and more accepted as an authority in her field. Her reputation, therefore, properly justifies us in giving her work credibility. We are perhaps in a better position to assess her impact as a writer and researcher as a result of the lapse of time and subsequent developments than was the Tribunal when her original work first appeared before it.

Secondly, there is the feeling prevalent in our society (and already advertised to) that a sensitive issues, including sex, should be more fully and openly discussed so that misunder-standing and simple ignorance can to some extent be dis-pelled. We think it is proper that we should reflect that

For all the above reasons we declare The Hite Report on Male Sexuality to be not indecent.

Decision No. 1038 Reference No. Ind 8/81

#### DECISION

We were informed by Mr Leloir for the Comptroller of Customs that both these issue were privately imported by persons at Hamilton and were seized on 6 January 1981. As the importers disputed the forfeiture of these publications the Customs Department referred them to the Tribunal for a classification prior to the commencement of condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Customs Act 1966.

Initially the Tribunal gave an interim decision in which it indicated that it doubted its jurisdiction to consider the Comptroller's submission. The Tribunal sought to refer the problem to the High Court for its advice pursuant to section 13 of the

Indecent Publications Act. (Decision No. 1005).

However, in the intervening period it has become necessary for the Tribunal to reconsider *Penthouse* as a whole, after the

restriction order over it expired in December 1981. This we did in decision No. 936 and it seemed to us desirable that we could also indicate our views on the merits of the present publications so that if there is a dispute with our findings in either case it may be desirable that they could all be dealt with at once (since they concern issues of the same magazine).

All this has meant a substantial delay (which we regret) in the importers obtaining a ruling from the Tribunal, as we note the publications were seized on 6 January 1981, although

they did not come before us until 21 July 1981.

We deal now with the various issues raised by the consideration of the magazines.

Jurisdiction: It is common ground that in decision No. 936 (December 1979) the Tribunal made a restriction order under section 15A of the Act. This had the effect of automatically classifying all subsequent issues of Penthouse until 21 December 1981 as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

It can be seen that the 2 issues of concern fall within that time period (they being May and June 1980 issues).

The significance of the restriction order is that we received submissions from Mr Bruce Armstrong (an importer of the publications) to the effect that the Customs Department had made an application for a classification of *Penthouse* while the restriction order was still in force.

We take the thrust of Mr Armstrong's submission to be that the Tribunal had no jurisdiction to consider a separate classification of a publication which was under a restriction order, unless at the same time an application was made under section 15A (4) of the Act for the terms of the restriction

order to be revoked or varied.

It is clear that the Comptroller of Customs did not make any such application and Mr Armstrong stated in his submission that the Comptroller had not given him notification of whether the hearing was in respect of an application relating

of whether the hearing was in respect of an application relating to the restriction order, or whether it was merely to determine the indecency of each issue in question.

At the hearing (where only the Comptroller was represented), Mr Leloir conceded that an application under section 15A (4) had not been made. He sought leave (should it be necessary) to amend the Comptroller's application for a classification to include an application to revoke or vary the terms of the restriction order in respect of the present publications.

Neither the importers, nor the public, nor the distributors, had notice of the Comptroller's late application, nor was there anyone present at the hearing to oppose the application.

It is obviously fundamental to the principles of natural justice that an opposite party be fully and fairly informed of steps in proceedings in which he is involved. Those principles are really embodied in section 14 (4) of the Indecent Publications Act which requires the proceedings before the Tribunal to be advertised. In our view, the Comparative tender cannot be premitted to amond the proceedings of troller cannot be permitted to amend the proceedings at the hearing (unless by consent) in circumstances where an opposite party may be deprived of a prior opportunity of assessing and commenting on the application.

Although our ruling on this part of the Comptroller's submission is not necessarily an end of the considerations we must give to the issues, we have nevertheless made parti-cular reference to our views should a similar situation arise in

future.

In relation to the jurisdiction issue the Comptroller's primary submission was that even although a section 15A restriction order was in force, the Tribunal could still consider for classification the individual issues of magazines which were covered by restriction orders. He relied upon the Tribunal's previous decision in No. 845, which concerned circumstances in which more or less the same situation as at present arose. It may be helpful to set out at some length what the Tribunal said on that occasion.

"Mr Heron submitted that there being no formal application under section 15A (4) the Tribunal was not empowered to deal with any of the issues before it. Indeed, as we understand it, he submitted that while a restriction order remained in force, the Tribunal has no authority to deal with any issue of that serial publication except by way of an application under section 15A (4).

We reject Mr Heron's submission, although we agree that we are not empowered in the present state of this application to revoke or vary the restriction order already made.

The purpose of the restriction order is to provide an additional authority to the Tribunal for the purpose of giving a basis, for up to 2 years, for future dealings with a serial publication, for the guidance of those concerned and to avoid the necessity of frequent applications to the Tribunal for individual classifications. It does not, in our

view, take away or cut down the functions of the Tribunal under section 10 of the Act to determine and classify any individual issues. If this were not so, a classification less than indecent would be a charter to the publisher to do as he liked subject only to variation of the restriction order. The words (in section 15A (3) namely "(other than an issue whose character has been determined by the Tribunal issue whose whose character has been determined by the Tribunal issue whose whose whose whose whose whose whose whose whose whose

or the Supreme Court)") clearly imply that a separate and individual classification can be made in respect of an issue of a periodical subject to a restriction order."

As we have already mentioned, we had some hesitation in accepting the view adopted by the Tribunal in decision 845. This is because of the working of section 15a (2), which deems each issue to have the classification which has been determined by the restriction order. As that classification applies automatically to any single issue for the length of the restriction order, it seemed a matter of common sense that interesting the sense of the sense o that issues within that range should not be referred again

to the Tribunal for further classification.

However, after a close consideration of the wording of the Act, it appears to be an inescapable conclusion that the words in section 15A (3) (referred to by the Tribunal in the passage quoted above from decision 845) can only apply to the situation where issues within the time span of the restriction order have been referred to the Tribunal. This must be so, because there is no other way an issue could come before the Tribunal other than by reference for classification pursuant to section 14 of the Act. (The provisions of section 14x and section 20 do not contain procedures which affect our statement of the general position in relation to the wording in section 15A (3).)

For all the above reasons, we find therefore that even although a serial restriction order is in effect in respect of the 2 issues under consideration, we still have jurisdiction

to classify them.

The dominant effect of the magazine as a whole, and the literary and social merit and character of the magazine:

We have considered the broad issues in relation to *Penthouse* in decision No. 1033. We do not propose to reiterate what we said there. We would like to note that our view there that the pictorial side of the magazine has deteriorated is reinforced by the content of the present publications.

The unique feature of the present issues is their reference to the film Caligula, which was a joint production between Bob Guccione (the editor and publisher of Penthouse) and

filmmaker Franco Rossellini.

The most objectionable scene is in a 13-page portfolio at page 141 of the June 1980 issue. This set of photographs features lesbian love scenes between 2 young women. The photographs are grossly explicit. In the context in which they appear in the issue, the photographs have no literary or artistic merit.

In the context of the film, it appears that the scenes were included in the film because of a degree of subterfuge by Guccione. It appears that he shot the scenes with a skeleton film crew at night when the set was deserted. Guccione dis-

closes as much in the course of an unusually frank interview on the film at page 150 in the May 1980 issue of *Penthouse*. In the May 1980 issue, a less explicit, but still disturbing portfolio of photographs from the film is shown from pages 68-89. The film has not been shown in New Zealand and from our assessment of the photographs and theme and nature of the film, we think it unlikely that it would be permitted hereby for some time to come, if at all.

Although the Tribunal is to have regard to the literary or

artistic merit of the issues, we do not think we can be accused of adopting a philistine approach if we say that we are unimpressed with the photographs as alleged reflections of the tempestuous time of Caligula's reign.

The admissions made by Guccione in the course of the interview already referred to indicate that the splits that develop between him and the other persons heavily involved with the production (i.e. Franco Rossellini and Gore Vidal) resulted from his inclination to include explicit sex scenes unnecessary to the narrative of the film.

In the circumstances we have little hesitation in finding that (whatever the lack of honesty of purpose of the film) there is a distinct lack of honesty in the printing of the lesbian love scenes on their own in the June issue. We find in the same broad way as we did in respect of the November issue of *Penthouse* in decision No. 1033 that when the cumulative effect of the photographs is considered with the other extreme aspects of the publication the magazine crosses the bounds of decency and becomes injurious to the public good.

We also find the May 1980 issue of *Penthouse* indecent because of the sex and violence depicted in the *Caligula* excerpt at pages 68-89. At best the pictures are shown out of context. At worst they are some of the highlights from a film that

itself in the finish lacks honesty of purpose and ran off the rails of that which might be described as creative directorship. We do not known enough about the film (nor really is it our function) to condemn it. However, for the reasons and misgivings we have already expressed we think we have enough information before use to be able to classify the May 1980 issue as indecent.

Before concluding we should advert to the submissions received from Mr Smyth who was one of the importers. He received from Mr Smyth who was one of the importers. He complained that as an adult and as a regular subscriber to *Penthouse* he was not likely to be corrupted by reading the 2 present issues. This is a point often made by importers but it is enough to say that the Tribunal does not classify the publication for the benefit of the importer but for the community at large. As to the question of the reader's maturity, we refer Mr Smyth to our comments in the recent *Penthouse* decision where those matters are dealt with They Penthouse decision where those matters are dealt with. They

are directly applicable to the present case as well.

Mr Smyth also complained that the May 1980 issue of 
Penthouse was equally (if not more) forthright as the present 
issue. He argued that if the May issue had passed the Tribunal

we would have to pass this issue.

We have not at any stage seen the May 1981 issue of *Penthouse*. We have no power to rule on publications other than those specifically referred to us and as we have already said, the May issue was not.

It may be some answer to Mr Smyth's complaint of possible

discrimination that when we did have cause to examine some 1981 issues (in decision No. 1033) we noted with concern the marked deterioration in the photographic sections of the magazine, and in fact ruled one indecent, and said (stretching tolerance to the limits) that the others were close to the line. It is for the very reason that we are concerned about individual issues of the publication that we refuse to make a section 15A order to impose a general restriction on *Penthouse* for the next 2 years. If standards continue to decline further issues of *Penthouse* could easily be individually declared indecent.

The final point was that Mr Smyth complained about the action of the distributor in failing to import the magazine. He stated that they appeared to be more interested in prostated that they appeared to be more increased in protecting their profits (lest the banning of the present publications should prejudice further imports of the magazine) at the cost of the well-being of the subscribing public.

We think the opposite is the case. Gordon and Gotch appear

to be sensible distributors and importers. As a result of advice received by them on the standard of the 2 issues the subject of this decision they decided the risk of condemnation was too high. They were right (insofar as their assessment of the Tribunal's view was concerned). In the circumstances the distributor seems to have acted in an eminently responsible manner.

In conclusion we do not think it is necessary to traverse the remaining specific matters in section 11 (1) (b-f) in any detail. They have been taken into account, but cannot help to save the present issues. Much of what was said about subsidiary issues in decision No. 1033 is applicable to the present issues.

For the above reasons we declare Penthouse ((U.S. Edition) Volume 11, Nos. 9 and 10), (May and June 1980) to be

indecent.

### DECISION

This private importation was seized from the post in Auckland. It has been referred for classification because forfeiture is disputed. While some of the photographs are grotesque

(some could be said to be unobjectionable) the whole purpose of the magazine is to promote the bizarre. Bondage appliances feature entirely through the 146 pages while most of the products advertised depict nude or near-nude females attired in bondage gear. The Tribunal has had occasion recently to consider other bondage publications and it pointed out that in the wrong hands dangerous practices could result (decision No. 1026) No. 1026).

The Comptroller sought a classification of indecency but in a lengthy submission Mr Hewton finished by claiming the right as a citizen of New Zealand to make his own decision on what he could or should be able to read in his own home. That, of course, is the argument which has developed between those who maintain that there should be no censorship of books and the opposing view of those who consider that the views of this Tribunal are, if anything, too liberal. It is the Tribunal's function to administer the Act as it is drawn. The substance of decision No. 1026 has a direct relationship with some of the contents of this publication so that in the end result the Tribunal agrees with the submission of the Compresult the Tribunal agrees with the submission of the Comptroller that the magazine should be classified as indecent.

The work of numerous ethnologists, and more recently archaeologists, has critically examined many of the earlier concepts, confirming some, disproving others, and altering others to varying degrees. No one has yet produced a synthesis of the results of all this scholarship and there is still nothing as comprehensive as this book of Best's to give a general account of the Maori. This book was first published when Best was 68 and thus represents the accumulated knowledge of a lifetime. It has now become a classic introduction to Maori life. Its continued availability should help the reader to obtain a basic background to old time Maori life which can be extended by further reading.

The grave, goods, and bones of the ancient chief, prone in his gravel grave, with skull directed towards the setting sun, spoke with more authority regarding his race than the distorted memories of Maori tradition.

Although scholarly and technical, the book sustains throughout the drama of this archaeological discovery, and recreates from the evidence of bone and stone the life of our first Polynesians in the Moa-hunter period of Maori culture.
