# PROPOSED ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES: 1982

Proposed Boundaries and Classifications of the General Electoral Districts of New Zealand

The Representation Commission appointed in pursuance to section 15 of the Electoral Act 1956 hereby publishes, in accordance with the provisions of section 18 of the said Act, the proposed boundaries of the electoral districts of the North and South Islands of New Zealand and of the classification of those districts required for the purposes of the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977 and further gives notice that written objections, to the same, will be received by the undersigned, the Chairman of the Commission, at the office of Surveyor-General, Department of Lands and Survey, Private Bag, Wellington, not later than Friday, the 10th day of December 1982 for consideration by the aforesaid Commission. If objectors wish to appear before the Commission they must say so in their written objections.

Maps of the proposed districts may be seen at the office of any city or borough council, district or county council, district community council, or town board; or the office of the Chief Surveyor at Auckland, Hamilton, Gisborne, Napier, New Plymouth, Wellington, Blenheim, Nelson, Hokitika, Christchurch, Dunedin, and Invercargill or the office of the Chief Electoral Officer at Lower Hutt, all electorate offices, and district courts.

Counties, districts, wards (ridings), cities, boroughs, district communities, and town districts where mentioned in this notice shall unless otherwise stated, be existing on 24 March 1981.

#### **SCHEDULE**

#### BAY OF ISLANDS

Population: 32 329 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Comprises the counties of Mangonui, Whangaroa, Hokianga, and Bay of Islands, all internal boroughs, adjacent islands and the islands of Three Kings.

#### WHANGAREI

Population: 33 002 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Comprises the city of Whangarei.

#### KAIPARA

Population: 32 449 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Comprises the counties of Hobson, Whangarei, and Otamatea and that portion of Albert Arai Ward of Rodney County to the east of No. 1 State Highway extending from Wellsford to Te Hana Creek; and including all internal boroughs and town districts, adjacent islands, Hen and Chicken island group, the Mokohinau Islands, and Poor Knights Islands.

#### RODNEY

Population: 32 766 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at the mean high water mark on the northern boundary of the East Coast Bays City and following westerly along that boundary and the back of the sections on the north side of Sunset Road, along No. 1 State Highway, and Schnapper Rock Road to the mean high water mark at Lucas Creek; thence along that mean high water mark, Riverhead Road, Deacon Road, to Old Main North Road; thence northerly along the Riverhead State Forest boundary to Chatham Road; thence westerly along that road and the northern boundary of Kumeu Ward (crossing the North Auckland Railway at Wharepapa) to the mean high water mark of the sea; thence northerly along that water mark to the Kaipara Electoral boundary; thence easterly along that boundary and the mean high water mark of the sea to the boundary of the City of East Coast Bays including adjacent islands.

#### GLENFIELD

Population: 32 635 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing on the main high water mark of Lucas Creek and proceeding easterly along Schnapper Rock Road and easterly, southerly and westerly along the Rodney, East Coast Bays, Northshore, and Birkenhead Electoral District boundaries to the mean high water mark of the sea; thence northerly along that water mark to Schnapper Rock Road

#### EAST COAST BAYS

Population: 31 751 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Comprises the East Coast Bays City and that part of Takapuna City to the north of a line commencing at Forest Hill Road and proceeding easterly along that road, Richards Avenue and along the back of the sections between Richards Avenue and Selwyn Crescent to East Coast Road, along Dewsbury Street, Parr Terrace, Seaview Road, Marama Street, Rahopara Street and its extension to the mean high water mark of the sea.

#### BIRKENHEAD

Population: 32 652 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of the Birkenhead City boundary and Eskdale Roads and proceeding easterly along that road, Glenfield road, Pupuke Road, Ocean View Road, Eban Avenue across open space and along the back sections fronting Uppingham Crescent and along the back of sections fronting Lynden Avenue to the Northcote Borough boundary; thence easterly along that boundary, northerly along Stenway Street, and easterly along Coronation Road and its extension to the North Shore Electoral Boundary; southerly along that boundary and westerly along the Northcote Borough and Birkenhead City boundaries to Eskdale Road.

#### NORTH SHORE

Population: 32 309 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the mouth of Hillcrest Creek near the Esmonde Road interchange and proceeding north-westerly along the Northcote Borough Boundary and the western boundaries of A.F. Thomas Park to Archers Road, along that road, the Auckland-Waiwera Motorway, the northern boundary of Becroft Park, Becroft Drive, Havelock Avenue, Forest Hill Road, Seine Road, Knightsbridge Drive, the southern boundary of East Coast Bays Electoral District and the mean high water mark of the sea to Hillcrest Creek.

#### WEST AUCKLAND

Population: 32 675 Classification Partially Urban and Partially Rural

Commencing at the mean high water mark of Waitemata Harbour at Riverhead Road, and proceeding southerly along the electoral district boundary of Helensville, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, the Henderson Borough Boundary, Sturges Road, Henderson Valley Road, Gum Road, and its extension to the Helensville Electoral Boundary, aspreviously described, then generally westerly along that boundary, northerly along the mean high water mark of the sea and easterly along the Rodney electoral boundary to the Waitemata Harbour.

#### WAITAKERE

Population: 33 347 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of Sturges Road and the Henderson Borough Boundary and proceeding south-easterly along that boundary, Millbrook Road, Wattie road, View Road, Great North Road, West Coast Road, Rua Road, Croydon Road, Titirangi Road, Golf Road, and the boundary of the Waitakere Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, to the mean high water mark of Manukau Harbour; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly along that electoral boundary to Forest Hill Road; thence northeasterly along the boundary of the West Auckland Electoral District to Sturges Road.

#### TE ATATU

Population: 32 645 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Huruhuru Creek and proceeding easterly and southerly along the boundary of the electoral district of Te Atatu, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, to Great North Road; thence westerly and northerly along the boundaries of Waitakere and West Auckland Electoral Districts to Huruhuru Creek.

#### NEW LYNN

Population: 32 212 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Wairau Creek and proceeding north-easterly along the boundary of New Lynn Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, to New North Road; thence southerly along that road, Blockhouse Bay Road, Terry Street, Whitney Street, Donovan Street and Lewis Street to the mean high water mark of Manukau Harbour; thence westerly along that water mark and northerly along the boundaries of the electoral districts of Waitakere and Te Atatu to Wairau Creek.

#### MOUNT ALBERT

Population: 33 144 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Meola Creek and proceeding easterly along the electoral district boundary of Mt. Albert, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, to the boundary of St. Josephs School; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the Auckland-Kumeu Motorway; thence easterly along that motorway, Alexander Street and its extension to Dominion Road; thence south-westerly along that road, Balmoral Road, Arabi Road, Tranmere Road, Sandringham Road, and Mt. Albert Road to the existing boundary of Mt. Albert Electoral District as previously described; thence westerly and northerly along that boundary to Meola Creek.

#### ROSKILL

Population: 32 619 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of New North Road and Oakley Creek and proceeding easterly along the existing boundary of Roskill Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, to

Mt. Albert Road, along that road and south-westerly along Hillsborough Road, Cape Horn Road, and its extension to Waikowhai Bay; thence westerly along the mean high water mark of the Manukau Harbour and northerly along the boundary of the New Lynn Electoral District of New North Road.

#### **EDEN**

Population: 32 144 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of Dominion Road and the northern boundary of Mt. Eden Borough and proceeding easterly along that boundary to the Auckland-Hamilton Motorway; thence southerly along that motorway, Broadway, Manukau Road and westerly along Mt. Albert Road to the boundary of Mt. Albert Electoral District; thence northerly along that boundary to Dominion Road.

#### AUCKLAND CENTRAL

Population: 32 858 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Comprises the Auckland Central Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, together with that portion of Arch Hill to the north of the boundary of Mt. Albert Electoral District.

#### ONEHUNGA

Population: 33 423 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of Manukau Road and Green Lane West and proceeding easterly along Green Lane West, the Auckland-Hamilton Motorway, Main Highway, Ladies Mile, Abbotts Way, Whitley Avenue, and the boundary of Auckland City and Gollan Road; thence southerly along that road, Harding Avenue, Ellerslie-Panmure Highway, Barrack Road, Penrose Road, and Great South Road to Ann's Creek; thence westerly along the mean high water mark of Manukau Harbour and north-easterly along the boundaries of the electoral districts of Roskill and Mt. Eden to Green Lane West.

#### REMUERA

Population: 32 317 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Point Resolution and proceeding easterly along Tamaki Drive, the shore of Hobson Bay and Purewa Creek to a point in line with Tipene Place; thence southerly along that place, Going Drive, Dorchester Street, St. Johns Road to an accessway linking Norman Lesser Drive near the eastern boundary of St. Johns Theological College, along that accessway, Norman Lesser Drive, Grand Drive to Abbotts Way; thence westerly along the boundary of the electoral district of Onehunga and northerly along the boundaries of the electoral districts of Eden and Auckland Central to Point Resultion.

#### Tamaki

Population: 32 854 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Hobson Point and proceeding easterly, southerly, and westerly along the boundary of Tamaki Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, to College Road, thence northwesterly along the boundaries of Onehunga and Remuera Electoral Districts to Hobson Point.

#### **PANMURE**

Population: 31 777 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Omaru Creek and follows up the shore of the Tamaki River crossing Panmure Bridge and follows down the shore of the Tamaki River to the eastern boundary of St. Kentigern College, thence southerly along that boundary and easterly along Pakuranga Road to a point in line with Udys Road; thence southerly along that road, Gossamer Drive, Ti Rakau Drive, to Pakuranga Creek; thence southerly along the shore of that creek and the Tamaki River to the Tamaki Bridge; thence westerly along Great South Road and Mangere Road to the North Island Main Trunk Railway; thence northerly along that railway and the boundaries of the Onehunga and Tamaki Electoral Districts to Omaru Creek.

#### **PAPATOETOE**

Population: 32 224 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of the Tamaki River and the Auckland Hamilton Motorway and proceeding southerly along that motorway to the boundary of Papatoetoe City near Preston Road, thence south-westerly along that boundary, Roscommon Road, Puhinui Stream to the shore of Manukau Harbour; thence north-westerly along that shore to Waokauri Creek near Waokauri Place; thence north-easterly to and along Winthrop Way, Raglan Street, Buckland Road, Massey Road, Mangere Road, and the boundary of Panmure Electoral District to the Auckland Hamilton Motorway.

#### MANGERE

Population: 32 060 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Waokauri Creek and proceeding westerly, northerly, and easterly along the shores of Manukau Harbour to the boundary of the Panmure Electoral District, thence southerly along that boundary and the boundary of Papatoetoe Electoral District to Waokauri Creek.

#### MANUREWA

Population: 33 045 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the Auckland Hamilton Motorway near Preston Road and proceeding southerly along that motorway to the shore of Pahurehure Inlet; thence north-westerly along the shore of Manukau Harbour and north-easterly along the boundary of Papatoetoe Electoral District to the Auckland Hamilton Motorway.

#### **PAPAKURA**

Population: 32 147 Classification Partially Urban and Partially Rural

Commencing at the intersection of the Auckland Hamilton Motorway and Alfriston Road and proceeding south-easterly along that road, Mill Road, Cosgrove Road to the boundary of Papakura Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, thence southerly and westerly along that boundary to Patumahoe; thence westerly along Mission Bush Railway and northerly along Gearon Road, across country to Klipsch Road and along that road to the shore of Manukau Harbour, thence north-easterly along that shore and the Auckland Hamilton Motorway to Alfriston Road.

#### **PAKURANGA**

Population: 33 141 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the mean high water mark of the sea at a point in line with Island View Road and proceeding south-westerly to and along that road, Granger Road, Liston Crescent, Selwyn Road, Picton Street, Ridge Road, Botany Road, Bradbury Road and its extension to Cascades Road, along Cascades Road to Pakuranga Creek, along the shore of that creek to the boundary of Panmure Electoral District, thence northerly along that boundary and easterly along the mean high water mark of the sea to the point near Island View Road.

#### **OTARA**

Population: 32 696 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at Maungamaungaroa Creek and proceeding southerly along that creek and the boundary of Otara Ward, Manukau City to the Auckland Hamilton Motorway; thence northerly along that motorway and the boundary of Papatoetoe Electoral District to the Tamaki River, thence north-easterly along the shore of Tamaki River, Pakuranga Creek and the boundary of Pakuranga Electoral District to the mean high water mark of the sea near Howick Beach; thence southerly along that water mark to Maungamaungaroa Creek.

#### FRANKLIN

Population: 31 776 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at the mean high water mark of the sea and the Otara Electoral District boundary and proceeding easterly and southerly along that water mark to Miranda, thence westerly along the boundary of Franklin County to the mouth of the Waikato River; theoretherly and easterly along the mean high water mark of the sea and Manukau Harbour to Klipsch Road; thence southerly, easterly, and northerly along the boundary of Papakura Electoral District to the Auckland-Hamilton Motorway, thence northerly along that motorway and easterly and northerly along the boundary of Otara Electoral District to the mean high water mark of the sea.

#### RAGLAN

Population: 31 762 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Comprises the County of Raglan, the Newcastle, Tuhikaramea, Rukuhia and Kaipaki Wards of Waipa County and that portion of Hamilton City west of the Waikato River that is not included in the Hamilton West Electoral District and the Borough of Ngaruawahia.

The division of Waipa County generally follows Mangaotama Stream, North Island Main Trunk Railway, along a line easterly through Sowerby Road through the Moanatuatua Swamp to Wallace Road and its extension to the Waikato River near the Mangawhero Stream.

#### Hauraki

Population: 32 966 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Comprises the Hauraki Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, excluding that portion of Waikato County that has now been included in Waikato Electoral District.

#### HAMILTON WEST

Population: 31 716 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of the Waikato River and the boundary of Hamilton City near Peacocke Road and proceeding southerly, westerly, and northerly along that boundary to a point in line with Dingdale Road; thence northerly along the extension of the boundary of the Hamilton City to a point in line with Ellicott Road; thence north-easterly to and along that road, Forest Lake Road, Te Rapa Road, Vercoe Road, Portal Crescent, Beerescourt Road, Minchin Crescent and its extension to the Waikato River; thence up that river to the boundary of Hamilton City.

#### HAMILTON EAST

Population: 31 600 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the intersection of the Waikato River with the northern boundary of Hamilton City and proceeding easterly and southerly along that boundary to Ruakura Road; along the proposed motorway to Clyde Street, along that street, Knighton Road, Cambridge Road, Cobham Drive to the proposed motorway; thence southerly along that motorway to the Waikato River, thence down that river to the boundary of Hamilton City near Braithwaite Park.

#### WAIKATO

Population: 31 362 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Comprises County of Waikato, that portion of Hamilton City to the east of the Waikato River that is not included in Hamilton East Electoral District and the Borough of Huntly.

#### **MATAMATA**

Population: 32 184 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural comprises the Matamata Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, together with the Pukeatua Ward of Waipa County.

County.

The Pukeatua Ward is the south-eastern portion of Waipa County generally bounded by the Parawera-Wharepapa Road, Mell-sop Road, Monckton Road, the Mangahoi Stream, then north-easterly along a leading ridge between Kairangi and Pukeatua to the Matamata County boundary.

#### Tauranga

Population: 32 614 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Comprises the City of Tauranga excluding therefrom the suburb of Maungatapu, i.e., that area to the north and east of the Hairini Bridge and approaches.

#### Kaimai

Population: 32 841 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at trig 17 on the mean high water mark of the sea at the eastern extremity of Papamoa Beach and following due south to Bell Road; thence westerly along that road No. 2 State Highway, Welcome Bay Road, Reid Road to Upper Papamoa Road; thence southerly along a leading ridge through Trig Stations Wharetetarakeho, Otawa, and Otanewainuku to the boundary of Kaimai Electoral District, N.Z. Gazette, 20 June 1977, page 1701, thence southerly, westerly, northerly, and south-easterly along that boundary to Papamoa Beach excluding therefrom the electoral district of Tauranga.

#### WAIPA

Population: 32 774 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at the intersection of the southern boundary of Matamata Electoral District and Waikato River and proceeding up that river and the Maraemanuka Stream and along Marotiri Road and No. 32 State Highway to the boundary of Taupo County; thence north-westerly along that boundary and the Otorohanga District boundary to the boundary of the Raglan Electoral District; thence easterly along that boundary and easterly and southerly along the boundaries of Waikato and Matamata Electoral Districts to the Waikato River near Lake Arapuni.

#### ROTORUA

Population: 32 146 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Comprises the Rotorua ward of Rotorua District.

#### **TARAWERA**

Population: 31 849 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at the mouth of Whakatane River and proceeding up that river to a point in line with the northern boundary of the State Forest near Downard Road; thence westerly to and along that boundary to Maunder Road, and along the northern boundary of Tarawera Ward to the Rangitaiki River; thence up that river and along No. 30 State Highway, Kawerau Road and the northern boundary of the Kawerau Borough and its production through State Forest land to the boundary of Rotorua District; thence southerly

and westerly along that boundary and along No. 38 State Highway, Old Waiotapu Road to its intersection with No. 5 State Highway; thence along right lines to Maungaongaonga to Paeroa, Te Waro and thence to Orakei Korako; thence northerly along the boundaries of Rotorua District and Kaimai Electoral District to Papamoa Beach; thence easterly along the mean high water mark of the sea to the Whakatane River excluding therefrom Rotorua Electoral District.

#### **TONGARIRO**

Population: 32 716 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at Orakei Koraro and proceeding up the Waikato River to Wairakei; thence westerly through the Wairakei Geothermal area to the intersection of Poihipi Road and Oruanui Road; thence southerly to and along Tukairangi Road to a point due west of Punatekahi; thence westerly along a right line to the intersection of Mapara Road and Whakroa Road; thence south-westerly along Mapara Road and its extension to Whakaipo Bay; thence southeasterly along the shore of Lake Taupo to Otuteto Point and along the northern and eastern boundary of Rangitoto Ward of Taupo County to the boundary of the said county; thence westerly along that county boundary to Mt. Tongariro; thence down the Wanganui River to the boundaries of the said borough; thence along the southern and western boundaries of the said borough and up Ongarue River and the North Island Main Trunk Railway to the boundary of Waitomo County; thence easterly along that boundary and along the southern and eastern boundary of Waipa Electoral District and western boundary of Tarawera Electoral District to Orakei Koraro.

#### EAST CAPE

Population: 33 354 Classification Rural or Predominantly Rural Commencing at the mouth of the Whakatane River and proceeding easterly and southerly along the mean high water mark of the sea and westerly along the boundary of Waiapu and Waikohu Counties to the southern boundary of Waimana Ward Whakatane District; thence westerly along that boundary passing through Te Rangaaruanuku to the south-western corner of Waimana Ward near Te Koikoi; thence due north to a point in line with Oputara near the Whirinaki River; thence westerly to and down that river to a point in line with Cemetery Road near Murupara; thence southerly to the boundary of Murupara Borough and westerly along the northern boundary of the said borough to No. 38 State Highway; thencealong that State Highway to the boundary of Whakatane District; thence northerly along that boundary and the boundary of the Tarawera Electoral District to the mouth of the Whakatane River.

#### GISBORNE

Population 33 219 Classification Urban or Predominantly Urban Commencing at the southern boundary of Napier Electoral District and proceeding southerly along the mean high water mark of the sea to the southern boundary of Hawke's Bay County; thence westerly and notherly along that boundary to the boundary of Waikaremoana Electoral District; thence easterly along that boundary and the southern boundary of Napier Electoral District to the mean high water mark of the sea; excluding Hastings Electoral District.

Counties, districts, wards (ridings), cities, boroughs, district communities, and town districts where mentioned in this notice shall unless otherwise stated, be existing on 24 March 1981.
