Before the Broadcasting Tribunal

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of complaints by (a) Ruth Anne Charters of Wellington, (2) Judith Anne Rankin of Wellington:

WARRANT HOLDER—Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand (2ZM):

B. H. Slane, Chairman; Lionel R. Sceats, Member; Susuan Boyd-Bell, and Shirley Easter, Co-opted Members.

DECISION

BOTH complaints concerned the 2ZM *Streetwalker Promotion*. The station broadcast invitations to people wishing to win money to approach a woman in the streets of Wellington between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Friday after picking out the clues from the radio station as to her whereabouts and identity to ask her whether she was the 2ZM streetwalker. The broadcast material made it clear that the term 'streetwalker' was not coincidentally chosen as was evidenced from the use of double entendre in the broadcast scripts. Shortly after the promotion started Radio New Zealand directed that it be taken off the air. This was done before the stage where formal complaints had been made.

Both complainants lodged formal complaints to the secretary of the Corporation and in each case the complaint was considered against the sections of the Act relating to standards of good taste and decency, the maintenance of law and order, and the privacy of the individual. The complaints were also examined against Radio Programme Rules concerning taste and decency, the effects any programme may have on children and standards of advertisements.

The Corporation acknowledged that an error of judgment had been made by Radio New Zealand in handling the promotion in the manner it did. It was a Wellington version of a promotion that had been run successfully elsewhere in New Zealand without complaint, as well as overseas, and offensive connotations were not foreseen.

In the circumstances the complaint was upheld in respect of section 24 (1) (c) of the Act and Programme Rule 1.1 (b) referring to standards of good taste and decency, Programme Rule 1.1 (c) referring to the effects of programmes on children, and Advertising Rule 1.3 (referring to propriety and goods taste). The Corporation said it had issued instructions to ensure no repetition of the promotion.

At the same time the Director-General of Radio New Zealand wrote to the complainants pointing out that the campaign was cancelled before the ground swell against the promotion reached the point where formal complaints were received.

"I can assure you that the 2ZM manager's surprise at public reaction was genuine. No offence had been registered in, for instance, Auckland when the promotion was run in a very similar guise and experience has not led Radio New Zealand to assume that attitudes

in different New Zealand population centres are so dramatically dissimilar."

"The complaints that arose from this 2ZM promotion have, nevertheless, provided a salutary lesson for Radio New Zealand and staff on stations around the country have been made aware of the dangers in any promotional idea that could in any way be interpreted as a breach of human rights or denigrating of any section of the community."

Ms Charters' complaint can be summarised—

1. Where the complaint was upheld the Corporation failed to specify its interpretation of the relevant grounds.
2. Where the complaint was not upheld it was ignored and no proper consideration was given to the grounds for the complaint or the evidence in support of it.
3. Having upheld the complaint on some grounds the Corporation failed to take any substantive steps to redress the balance or to ensure that similar breaches would not occur.

She considered that the decision should have provided interpretation of the grounds, it should have upheld the complaint on the grounds of breach of privacy and sufficient steps should have been taken to ensure that denigration of the personhood of women or encouragement of the uninvited invasion of their privacy should not occur.

Ms Rankin complained that no significant penalty was imposed to prevent further advertising of this nature being carried out by any BCNZ radio station.

She considered the complaint should have been upheld on the following grounds:

- (a) Maintenance of law and order. (It promoted conduct which could readily amount to offensive behaviour and an angry reaction by a woman could result in a breach of the peace.
- (b) Privacy. The right of Wellington women who were not the 2ZM streetwalker to go about in public without risking uninvited intrusions. Women who were approached were made involuntary participants in a commercial campaign.
- (c) The effect the broadcast may have on children.

She considered that the Corporation should have required 2ZM from its advertising budget to donate \$1,000 to every rape crisis centre and battered women's refuge in the greater Wellington listening region and appropriate steps be taken to ensure no future promotions for BCNZ services or their advertisers involved the stereotyping or denigration of women or an invasion of their rights of privacy, consent and individuality.

The Tribunal referred the complaints to the Corporation for comment and gave the complainants an opportunity to make further submissions after seeing the Corporation's response.

The Tribunal decided that it was not necessary to have an oral hearing of the matters raised, as they had been fully and capably argued by the complainants in some considerable detail.

The Tribunal considered the matter under the following headings:

Privacy—The Corporation did not uphold the complaint on the grounds of privacy. It was complained that the Corporation did not specifically state this in its reply. It would have been better if it had made that specific statement but it is clear from the letter that the complaint was not upheld on that ground.

The obligation of the Corporation in the Broadcasting Act was set out in section 24 which stated:

The Corporation shall be responsible for maintaining, in its programmes and their presentation, standards which will be generally acceptable in the community, and in particular it shall have regard to—

- (c) the observance of standards of good taste and decency;
- (f) the maintenance of law and order;
- (g) the privacy of the individual.

The Radio Standards and Rules 1.1 stated:

In the preparation and presentation of programmes broadcasters are required:

- (b) to take into consideration currently accepted norms of decency and taste in language and behaviour, bearing in mind the context in which any language or behaviour occurs;
- (c) to be mindful of the effect any programme may have on children during their generally accepted listening periods.

The complainants consider that the programmes broadcast resulted in a breach of the community standards regarding privacy and in particular the right of women not to be denigrated.

In applying the provisions of the Act, we must have regard to what we perceive to be community standards and not express our own personal views on what we might think is an appropriate standard of behaviour. It is clear that the elements relating to the denigration of women are properly dealt with under the provisions for good taste and decency.

As a number of occasions occur when people are stopped in the street by those doing surveys or even promotions which require

people to be identified, we do not think there is any community standard which in itself constitutes a bar to a radio station promoting itself by means of some competition or other promotion which involves stopping a person in the street. The circumstances in which this occurs in the present complaints is the context of the streetwalker element which requires a person to put a question which, to say the least, could easily be, or be interpreted as, offensive by the woman.

The fact that the stopping in the street was done by listeners not agents or employees of the station, created the circumstances in which a breach of standards could occur so easily.

We do not find that there is a privacy standard which prevent the stopping of people in the street. The mere stopping and speaking to the people is not, we consider, regarded by most people as a breach of their privacy.

We therefore cannot uphold the complaints on this ground.

This is not to be regarded as support for the promotion which was properly dealt with as in bad taste by Radio New Zealand and the Corporation. Promotions which invite listeners to approach people directly indeed have a potential for annoyance or offence.

Maintenance of Law and Order—Ms Rankin said the promotion promoted conduct which could readily amount to offensive behaviour. Any angry reaction by any woman could, she said, result in a breach of the peace.

It would be easy to condemn any programme for urging or displaying conduct which could lead to or be said to encourage a breach of the peace. On that basis much news coverage such as programmes about male homosexuality, a protest movement, or advocating tougher police action should not be shown because an offence or offences may be committed. We do not accept that.

We see this rule as rather protecting viewers from programmes which constitute a real threat to the maintenance of law and order. This promotion did not. The fact that it was a promotion rather than a news programme should not change the principle.

Action taken by the Corporation—The Act is silent as to what is appropriate action. We consider that in some cases the mere finding on the complaint will be adequate action. In this case, the Corporation states that staff had been advised of the upholding of the complaint and warned against promotions of a similar kind.

District managers and ZM station managers were told by Radio New Zealand on 22 February

- to beware of "sexually orientated promotional ploys"
- to cease the promotion
- the promotion was in "appalling taste"
- district managers should take an interest in ZM promotions.

We do not consider the Act contemplates the Tribunal being able to require the Corporation to make donations to organisations, nor that it publicly spell out new standards. We comment however, that it may be appropriate for the rules committee to consider in each case that a complaint like this occurs, whether or not any amendments might be required to the current rules and standards in the light of changing social conditions and attitudes. At the same time there are advantages in maintaining general rules rather than develop a new rule because of particular complaints.

It is also suggested that the Corporation should have dismissed the manager of 2ZM. It would be quite inappropriate for this Tribunal to become involved in the industrial relations of the Corporation with its staff or to recommend or stipulate any particular action be taken against an individual employee or contractor of the Corporation. Such people are not represented before the Tribunal, nor are staff representatives appointed to the Tribunal. Industrial relations is a matter quite separate from the rights of persons under the Broadcasting Act to have complaints publicly upheld.

We consider the provision for a complainant to be able to complain about action taken by the Corporation refers to any remedial statements, such as apologies or corrections that ought to be undertaken in relation to the complaint and any notification to staff which might be required to prevent further breaches of the same provisions in similar circumstances.

In any case, in view of the action taken on 22 February, the Corporation's action was sufficient.

The complaints are not upheld on this ground.

It would be reasonable to comment that broadcasters like all people in positions of responsibility will from time to time make mistakes. It would be unfortunate if the provisions of the Broadcasting Act were seen by complainants as an opportunity to carry out a specific action against individuals concerned. In the proper context of the Act the responsibility for what is broadcast is that of the warrant holder.

The Corporation's failure to stipulate its reasoning in upholding complaints—The complainants would have liked to have seen some statements by the Corporation which could be regarded as definitive for broadcasters in the future. They would have liked to have seen some statements that went beyond the existing complaint on the status of women. The latter is really a matter for the rules

committee rather than for the Board of the Corporation on the finding on a complaint.

It would be unnecessarily burdensome on the Corporation if, when upholding a complaint that a programme was in breach of a particular rule or provision in the Act that it had to consider 5 or 6 different arguments, some of which it may not agree with and define its attitude on each one. The right that the complainant has is for a ruling whether or not the programme breached the particular provision. In this case the Corporation has noted the provisions which it considers were breached and we do not consider it has to go any further than that.

Nor do we consider the Tribunal is obliged to deal with every argument for upholding a complaint. Once the complaint has been upheld on one ground in relation to one standard or rule, the Tribunal is not obliged to consider finding a breach of the same standard on other grounds. This would turn the procedure into a legalistic one.

It is in borderline cases that the Tribunal can usefully define limits and clear cases of breach are not always the best on which to base definitive judgments.

The Tribunal has a discretion to decide whether or not it should determine a complaint—In general terms the Tribunal may frequently decide not to deal with a complaint if the complaint has been upheld on one ground or another but the complainant seeks that it be upheld on a further ground. This is more likely to occur, when the station has itself dealt with the matter before formal complaints were made, as in the present case.

However in the case of these 2 complainants, they had raised a number of important points for consideration by the Tribunal in a detailed and closely argued fashion.

We thought it appropriate therefore to deal with the complaint and to try and define for the future some of the limitations inherent in the complaints procedure by dealing with what the complainants obviously feel is a very important social issue.

Sight must not be lost of the fact that the officers responsible withdrew the promotion very shortly after broadcasts commenced, that the Corporation upheld the complaints on a number of grounds and that steps were taken to advise staff of the situation and to warn them of the risks of this sort of promotion occurring again.

The complaints are not upheld.

Co-opted Members—Mrs Boyd-Bell and Mrs Easter were co-opted as persons whose qualifications or experience were likely, in the opinion of the Tribunal to be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with the complaints. They took part in the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision is that of the permanent members.

DECISION

THESE sample copies were imported through parcels post, Hamilton, and were seized in August 1982. Forfeiture was disputed so they were referred for classification.

The magazines consist entirely of full page colour photographs of nude or semi-nude females. There is no accompanying text. In Decision No. 1020, Look Nos. 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 were classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18. These publications are no different from those previously classified. It was the submission of the Comptroller that this appeared to be a suitable case for the Tribunal to consider the imposition of a restriction order under section 15A. The Tribunal, having had the opportunity to consider a number of these publications, concurs with this view. Look is therefore classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years. A Restriction Order is made pursuant to section 15A for a period of 2 years.

DECISION

THE above magazines were imported privately and seized at Rotorua parcels post in August 1982. The importer disputes forfeiture so that they have been referred to this Tribunal for classification prior to commencement of condemnation proceedings.

In Decision No. 1034, we considered *Escort*, Volume 1, No. 12; Volume 2, Nos 1 and 2. In Decision No. 1042, we considered *Escort*, Volume 2, No. 5. *Escort*, Volume 2, No. 7 is no different from its predecessors and as its name implies, the *Best of Escort* consists of excerpts from previous publications. As the Comptroller submitted, the articles are sexually orientated and there is no non-sexual material to offset its impact. In lengthy submissions, Mr Thomas suggested that these volumes should not be considered as indecent. He suggested that as certain films have been passed by the Film Censor and as a video cassette had been passed by the District Court this Tribunal should likewise pass this volume. We find no reason to change our view and for reasons set out in the decisions already quoted these two publications are both considered to be indecent. They are classified accordingly.

ORAL DECISION

The 16th day of December 1982

THE matter we had to consider was the complaint contained in paragraph (b) on page 2 of Mr Simpson's letter, dated 5 July 1982. There is provision under Rule 4 for sponsorship and we believe that many of the programme items transmitted are sponsored items in the sense that those taking part are making payment to Northern Television or to their producers, Kevin Moore and Associates, to appear at all, i.e. they are promoting themselves. Conversely those purveying the products either featured or mentioned in the items are paying for this. We presume you would be aware of this in terms of Rule 4.1 which requires direct control by yourselves. If our information is correct then either these items are advertisements, in which case they breach both Rule 1.1. and the Tribunal stricture on total advertising content, or they are straight sponsored programmes and this must be acknowledged in the programme credits as required by Rule 4.1.

The Tribunal has concluded that there has been no decision by the Corporation on that point. Instead the Corporation requested identification of particular programmes and the elements considered to infringe the rule. It is not then possible for the Tribunal to determine the complaint which can only be referred to us if the complainant is dissatisfied with the decision of the Corporation. There has such no such decision.

The Tribunal considers that Mr Simpson, if he wishes to pursue his complaint, should do so by reference to one or more days of broadcasting of the programme and the programme elements in

them if he considers they infringe the rules. Particulars were given of such matters in the same letter in relation to the Good Morning programme broadcast on 2 July.

The Tribunal does not consider that a wide-ranging inquiry can be invoked by simply making a general allegation in relation to a series of programmes.

As we normally state, the co-opted members took part in this hearing and the deliberations of the Tribunal, but the decisions are those of the permanent members.

Before the Broadcasting Tribunal

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of a complaint by Leo David Leitch of Lower Hutt:

WARRANT HOLDER—Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand, Radio New Zealand (2ZB);

B. H. Slane, Chairman; Lionel R. Sceats, and Anne E. Wilson, Members; Gordon C. Ell, and Robert Boyd-Bell, Co-opted Members.

DECISION

Mr Leitch complained of obscene language used on 2ZB on Wednesday, 7 July at approximately 7.37 a.m. The offence, he said, occurred in the context of a joke.

He claimed that in the punch line of the joke the word "fuckin'" had been used. The Corporation did not uphold the complaint saying that the line was "I don't wanta your Fokker Friendship". Mr Leitch was dissatisfied with the outcome of his complaint and referred it to the Tribunal but accepted that the word he complained of may not actually have been used. He claimed however that it sounded similar.

He said that the humour of the joke depended on the Italian's misunderstanding of what he was offered by a rescue service and this was at least directly implied obscenity. He supplied another joke which used a foreigner's accent and a misunderstanding without any obscene words being explicitly pronounced, saying that there were many such jokes and ditties.

The Tribunal has listened to a tape of the programme and is satisfied that the word was clearly pronounced as Fokker and was not slurred or spoken in a way that could reasonably be misheard. However, as stated by Mr Leitch, that was the point of the story.

It was told in a series broadcast as a contest. None of the other jokes were complained about.

The question the Tribunal had to consider was whether or not the broadcast of this transgressed the standards.

The Tribunal had regard to the time and context in which the joke was told. Considering the time placement and the medium the "joke" was inappropriate. It falls below the standards which should apply to a breakfast programme directed to a family audience. The breach is not a serious one since the word relied upon for the humour was not spoken.

The complaint is upheld.

Co-opted members—Messrs Boyd-Bell and Ell were co-opted as members of the Tribunal for the purposes of this complaint. The decision is that of the permanent members.

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of a complaint by Clifford Reginald Turner:

WARRANT HOLDER—Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand (1ZH);

B. H. Slane, Chairman; Lionel R. Sceats, Member; Susan Boyd-Bell, and Gordon C. Ell, co-opted Members.

DECISION

Mr Turner complained to the Corporation about a commercial broadcast on 1ZH Hamilton on 5 June 1982, the text of which was:

"The Winter Show's always interesting, always informative, and this year, one of the most intriguing stands is that of Villa

Maria Wines Ltd. They have a special tasting of reisling at the show. Over 20 odd years, Villa Maria Wines Ltd. have risen to the top in table wine quality. Find out why, and how, on the Villa Maria Wines Ltd. stand at the Waikato Winter Show."

Mr Turner claimed that the commercial was in breach of the following standards and rules:

- 1.11.2 Advertisements other than those referred to in 1.11.1 made by or on behalf of any person or persons or body corporate who manufacture, distribute or sell alcoholic liquor, or whose name is associated with the manufacture, distribution or sale of alcoholic liquor, may be broadcast if they meet the following requirements:
- 1.11.2 (1) The advertisement does not make any reference to the availability of alcoholic liquor for sale.
- 1.11.2 (2) The advertisement does not include references to brand names of alcoholic liquor as such except to the extent that the brand name is incorporated in or identical with the name of the advertiser.
- 1.11.2 (3) No descriptions of the qualities of the alcoholic liquor manufactured, distributed or sold by the advertiser are included in the advertisement:

The complainant claimed that the whole commercial was laden with the implication that Villa Maria Wines were available for sale. It did not matter, he said, that the wines were not available for sale at the company's stand at the Winter Show. There was nothing in the rules about where the liquor was available. If the commercial makes it apparent that a name brand of liquor was available for sale somewhere then, he contended, rule 1.11.2 (1) had been broken.

The Corporation did not uphold his complaint.

The rule refers to an advertisement not making any reference to the availability of alcohol liquor for sale. The advertisement does not make any reference to it being available for sale. In this respect the complaint is not upheld.

Mr Turner alleges a breach of 1.11.2 (2) because the word reisling did not appear in the Company's name. The Corporation submitted that reisling was not a brand name but a type of wine and therefore that rule had no bearing on the matter. The Tribunal agrees. The complaint is not upheld in this respect.

The third part of the complaint was that the advertisement was in breach of 1.11.2 (3). The Corporation said in answer to this that the statement related specifically to the company rising to the top because of production excellence. It submitted that the fair and generally accepted understanding of the rule requirement "no descriptions of the qualities of the alcoholic liquor" was to exclude such aspects as colour, bouquet, taste, smell and other aspects which were widely accepted as constituting wine qualities. There was no reference in the advertisement to these aspects and it was the company and not the actual definable nature of its product which was being extolled.

The advertisement refers to Villa Maria Wines Ltd. having risen "to the top in table wine quality".

The question is whether the general reference to top quality can be construed as a description of one of the qualities of the wine. There are two meanings of quality referred to in Heinemann's New Zealand Dictionary:

- "1. A characteristic.
2. Character with respect to excellent: 'meat of the highest quality is very expensive'."

The use of the plural "qualities" in the rule must limit its use to the first meaning. For the advertisement to have been caught by the rule, the rule would have had to ban descriptions of the quality of the alcoholic liquor and the qualities (i.e. the characteristics) of the liquor.

We do not consider that the invitation to listeners to "find out why and how" is a description of those qualities.

The complaint is not upheld in this respect.

The result is that Mr Turner's complaint is not upheld.

Co-opted Members—Mrs Susan Boyd-Bell and Mr Gordon Ell were co-opted as persons whose qualifications or experience would be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with the complaint. They took part in the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision is that of the permanent members.

In the latter case interest at foreign centre rates may be deducted from the telegraphic transfer rate to compensate the purchaser for his loss during the transit period.
