Amending Notice to the Boundary of Lake Maraetai Closed Game Area

THE Minister of Internal Affairs hereby gives notice that the notice published in the supplement to the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 43, of 21 March 1984 at page 830 relating to the boundary of the Lake Maraetai closed game area is amended as follows:

Delete:

- (28) The Kopakorahi Stream, from its outlet into Lake Maraetai to the bridge on the Whakamaru - Taupo Highway (Mangakino Road), and all land within 100 metres of its banks.
- (29) All that part of Lake Maraetai, extending 50 metres into the lake and 50 metres back from the shoreline, from a point at the eastern end of the area known as Sandy Bay, and generally along the western and southern sides of Lake Maraetai to the Maraetai Dam; including the Mangakino Stream to a point upstream of the Mangakino - Whakamaru Road (State Highway 30) bridge, as marked by white posts; and the area known as Matekuri Island.

Add:

- (30) All of Lake Maraetai (and extending 50 metres inland from the shoreline) with the exception of: an area of lake edge and extending 100 metres into the lake, commencing from a point marked by a white post to the east of the New Zealand Forest Products Water Intake and generally in a southerly direction along the eastern side of Lake Maraetai (including all embayments and the Twin Lakes area) to a point marked by a white post opposite Sandy Bay. The closed game area shall include all of Kopakorahi Stream from its outlet into Lake Maraetai to the bridge on the Whakamaru - Taupo Highway (Mangakino Road) and all land within 50 metres of its banks, and the Mangakino

Stream to a point upstream of the Mangakino - Whakamaru Road (State Highway 30) bridge, as marked by a white post.

The Te Kauwhata Irrigation District Order 1984

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 30th day of April 1984.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 208 of the Public Works Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

1. This order may be cited as the Te Kauwhata Irrigation District Order 1984.

2. The Minister of Works and Development is hereby authorised to construct, maintain and control water supply works described in the First Schedule hereto to serve the land described in the Second Schedule hereto. On completion of construction The Waikato County Council shall administer the scheme on behalf of the Minister.

3. The area of land described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby constituted as an irrigation district, to be known as the Te Kauwhata Irrigation District (hereinafter referred to as "the district").

4. It is hereby declared that the annual basic charge payable on all irrigable land within the district shall be \$138.00 an irrigable hectare and the water availability charge shall be \$127.00 per 1000 m³ (thousand cubic metres). This is based on an average irrigation seasonal water requirement of 2660 m³ (cubic metres) per irrigable hectare. Water use in excess of 2660 m³ per irrigable hectare per season shall be defined as surplus water. The rate charged for the first 1240 m³ per irrigable hectare of surplus water will be the same as the ruling annual water availability charge for that irrigation season. Any additional surplus water in excess of 1240 m³ per irrigable hectare will be charged at a rate equal to 125% (one hundred and twenty-five percent) of the full ruling water availability charge for that irrigation season and is not subject to reductions during the first 6 seasons of supply. The rates charged for surplus water will be reviewed annually and if necessary adjusted accordingly. Reductions shall be made to annual basic charge and the water availability charge during the first 6 irrigation seasons so that the charges for the first 6 seasons of supply shall be as set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. It is hereby declared that on the commencement of water supply and from the end of the sixth season of water availability both annual basic and water availability charges may be adjusted annually to take into account variations between the estimated and actual construction costs, variations between estimated and actual costs of operation, maintenance and renewals, and variations in quantity of water or subject to availability agreements.

6. The charges payable shall be for a period of 20 consecutive seasons commencing at the start of the first year of supply for the scheme as determined and notified according to section 217 of the Act.

7. The supply of water will be subject to the water right granted by the Waikato Valley Authority in its capacity as the Regional Water Board. This right (No. 4467) is for up to 22 900 m³/day (twenty-two thousand nine hundred cubic metres per day) of water to be taken from the Waikato River at or about map reference NZMS1 N52 577945.

8. The irrigation season shall extend from 15 September to 30 April inclusive.

9. The minimum aggregate area of land occupied that shall be included in the irrigation scheme shall be 2 hectares.

FIRST SCHEDULE

WATER SUPPLY WORKS

THE Te Kauwhata Irrigation works by which means water can be drawn from the Waikato River by a piped water supply to a storage reservoir from which point the said water will be either gravity fed or pump reticulated to each property through a control valve as appropriate to enable trickle irrigation for horticultural plantings.

The said works include all reservoirs, electrical supply equipment, piping, gauges, boxes, valves, pumps, filters, meters and all other works incidental to or required for the construction, maintenance and control of the said works for the irrigation of the district.

SECOND SCHEDULE

S. 13096; thence southerly along the western boundary of Lot 2, D.P. S. 13096, westerly along the northern, and southerly along the south-western boundaries of Allotment 403, Parish of

Whangamarino to a point on the northern side of Churchill East Road; thence proceeding easterly along the northern side of Churchill East Road to a point in line with the southern boundaries of part Section 9 and Section 10, suburbs of Rangiriri, and proceeding along the aforesaid southern boundaries of part Section 9 and Section 10, suburbs of Rangiriri to the old State highway No. 1 roadside (Te Wheoro Street); thence in a northerly direction along the western side of old State highway No. 1 (Te Wheoro Road) to its intersection with the new State highway No. 1 (R.S. 393/17.00) northwards along the western side of State highway No. 1 to its junction with Te Kauwhata Road (R.S. 393/15.98); thence in an easterly direction by a right line to and along the southern side of Te Kauwhata Road to the western corner of Lot 1, D.P. S. 30341; thence southerly along the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. S. 30341 to its southern corner; thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of part Section 86, Block XV, Maramarua Survey District to the northern shore of Lake Kopuera; thence proceeding in an easterly direction along the generally southern boundary of part Section 86, Block XV, Maramarua Survey District, to the N.I.M.T. Railway; thence northerly along the western boundary of the N.I.M.T. Railway to the Wildlife Refuge (*New Zealand Gazette* 1961, page 837) following around the south-western boundary of the said refuge to the Te Kauwhata road by a right line to proceed in a northerly direction along the eastern boundaries of part Sections 3 and 91, Block XV, Maramarua Survey District to Travers Road and to cross the said Travers Road by a right line; thence proceeding in a south-easterly direction along the eastern side of Travers Road and easterly along the northern side of Te Kauwhata Road to the eastern-most corner of part Lot 1, D.P. 31797; thence proceeding in a northerly direction along the eastern boundaries of part Lot 1, D.P. 31797 and Lot 2, D.P. 25379 to the north-western corner of Lot 1, D.P. S. 8589; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 8589, Eccles Road and Lot 7, D.P. S. 2027; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of Lots 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 of D.P. S. 2027, part Lot 1 and Lots 2 and 3 of D.P. 35372; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 33483 to the N.I.M.T. Railway (Te Kauwhata Station); thence proceeding northwards along the western side of the N.I.M.T. Railway, past the end of Paddy Road, to the northern-most corner of Lot 1, D.P. S. 15708; thence westerly and southerly along the northern and western boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. S. 15708 to Paddy Road, to cross Paddy Road by a right line and proceed westerly along the southern side of Paddy Road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of part Allotment 155, Parish of Whangamarino (certificate of title, Volume 19, folio 266); thence to, and northerly along the eastern boundary of part Allotment 155, Parish of Whangamarino (certificate of title, Volume 19, folio 266), to its northern end; thence westerly along the northern boundary of part Allotment 155, Parish of Whangamarino (certificate of title, Volume 19, folio 266) and part Section 39, Block XV, Maramarua Survey District, to Whangamarino Road (old State highway No. 1); thence in a south-westerly direction along the side of Whangamarino Road to State highway No. 1 by a right line to the point of commencement.

Direction Not to Disclose Information

PURSUANT to section 32 (4) of the Official Information Act 1982, a copy of the direction to the Secretary of Labour made under section 32 (1) (a) of that Act and set out in the Schedule below, together with the grounds for the direction and the source and purport of any advice on which the direction was based (which are also set out in the Schedule below) are hereby published.

SCHEDULE

SECRETARY OF LABOUR

1. This is to advise you that I have decided that the information sought by K. Johnston and recommended to be released by the Chief Ombudsman, pursuant to section 30 (1) of the Official Information Act 1982, concerning labour market forecasts and estimates of unregistered unemployed, should not be made available to him and accordingly direct you pursuant to section 32 (1) (a) of the Official Information Act 1982 not to release it.

2. The grounds for the direction are that pursuant to section 9 of the Official Information Act, and notwithstanding the opinion of the Chief Ombudsman, the release of the information sought would undermine the constitutional conventions as to the neutrality of officials and the confidentiality of their advice. It would also undermine the free and frank expression of opinion between Ministers and officials and the protection of officials from improper pressure or harassment.

3. More specifically:

- (a) In the matter of forecasts and estimates of unregistered unemployed, the opinions of departmental officials on the labour market outlook and, implicitly on the effectiveness of current policies for dealing with it, could well be at variance with those of the Government. In itself this need not be unhealthy. However, it is not unreasonable to expect that such differences of opinion if released publicly, would be aired and indeed exploited. This would naturally draw officials into the public debate and the distancing of officials from such debate is an important constitutional convention designed to maintain their political neutrality.
- (b) By virtue of the fact that existing policy forecasts and estimates of unregistered unemployment imply a commentary on the effectiveness of those policies, release of such material would necessarily breach that constitutional convention which allows officials to tender confidential advice to Ministers of the Crown.
- (c) Occasions are envisaged when under conditions of particular uncertainty, officials may refrain from preparing forecasts or generating estimates of unregistered unemployment if there exists a possibility of misrepresentation or misuse in the political arena or in the course of public debate or use for purely political or ulterior purposes. This would clearly serve to constrain the "free and frank expression of opinions" by officials of the department to its Minister and would thereby undermine the effective conduct of public affairs.
- (d) Circumstances are envisaged under which departmental officials may be placed under some pressure during the course of the public debate to modify their opinions as to the labour market situation and outlook.

4. The question of whether there are other considerations which render it desirable, in the public interest, to make that information available has also been considered. No such considerations have been identified.

5. The advice on which this direction is based has been received from the Secretary of Labour in the form of a summary of the department's position in relation to its labour market forecasts and estimates of unregistered unemployed and their use. The purport of the advice is as set out in paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

DECISION

THE Tribunal is called upon to consider Penthouse International and on this occasion our attention is directed to the issues of June, July and August 1983. Mr D. F. Hall of Gisborne disputed forfeiture of the June issue; Mr D. W. Devine of Invercargill disputed forfeiture of the July and August issues; Mr H. Pleace of Dunedin disputed forfeiture of the July and August issues; Mr L. C. Timberlake of Auckland disputed forfeiture of the July issue. Penthouse International, the publishers of the magazine were represented by Mr Robertson of the English Bar. No submissions were made by Mr Hall and Mr Devine while Mr Pleace wrote a letter suggesting that as he imported the magazine for his own use the magazines seized should be restored to him to enable his subscription to be continued unhindered.

Mr Robertson's submissions were directed to having an age restriction placed on the publication with the restoration of restriction order under section 15A.

Mr Timberlake in his submissions condemned censorship and wanted the publication classified as not indecent.

We deal with Mr Robertson's submissions later in the decision.

No publication has received more consideration by this Tribunal than *Penthouse*. Apart for earlier hearings some issues of each year have been drawn to our attention since 1979. In April 1982 we had issues of September, October and November 1981. In December

Notice to Make Returns of Income Under Income Tax Act 1976

PURSUANT to the Income Tax Act 1976, the Commissioner of Inland Revenue gives notice as follows:

(1) Returns of income for the year ended 31 March 1984 (or other approved balance date) are required from:

- (a) All companies, all partnerships, all persons in business (including farming) or in a profession, all persons in partnership, all trustees, executors and administrators, notwithstanding that by reason of a loss being incurred for the year or carried forward from a previous year, no taxation is payable.
- (b) Every person whose total income from employment exceeded \$11,500.
- (c) Every person whose total income from employment was less than \$11,500 but has either operated a special tax code or an incorrect tax code during the year.
- (d) Every person who derived income from employment, the whole or any part of which was not taxed at source.
- (e) Every person who derived interest and/or dividends, exceeding \$200.
- (f) Every person who derived assessable income other than income from employment, except that no return is required where the total income did not exceed \$200 and consisted exclusively of interest and dividends.
- (g) Every person who paid provisional tax in respect of income for the year ended 31 March 1984.
- (h) Every person who received withholding payments.
- (i) Every person who was entitled to the family rebate and, where applicable, the spouse or any other person comprising the family within the meaning of section 53C of the Income Tax Act 1976.
- (j) Every person who derived any income as a shearer.
- (k) Every incorporated and unincorporated body which derived assessable income.

(2) Returns may be furnished by posting or delivering the same to the office of the Inland Revenue Department nearest to the place of residence of the taxpayer, or if the taxpayer's records are held in another office of the department, then to the latter office.

1982 we had occasion to consider each of the 12 monthly issues of that year. In March 1983 we were asked to consider the issues for January, February and March of 1983 and although the current hearing is technically in respect of June, July and August 1983 we have had supplied to us the remaining issues for 1983. The end result is that every issue for 2 years, ended in December 1983, will have received our consideration. We do not think it necessary to reiterate what was said in earlier decisions and in particular in decisions 1033, 1038, 1053, and 1054.

A perusal of these decisions will indicate clearly the Tribunal's view of this publication. It was noted in 1979 in Decision No. 936 that "this magazine remains on the borderline". The position has not changed since 1979. Indeed as our decisions indicate, the borderline was crossed in the issues of May and June 1980, the issue of November 1981, the issues of January, March, April, July, August, September and October 1982, and the issue of January 1983. All these issues were classified as being indecent.

We have taken the opportunity of again looking at the issues previously classified. This has been done to ensure that some degree of uniformity is achieved. However, we must comment that, as we have noted previously, there is a lack of consistency in these publications which, if anything, appear to be getting worse rather than better.

Before considering the specific issues it is useful to record that the format of each is maintained along the same lines, as *Penthouses* previously considered by the Tribunal. The magazine usually contains 200 pages which, curiously, include the back and front covers. There are advertisements, some of full page and other less than full page, spread throughout. They occupy roughly 25 percent of each issue. The last 40-50 pages contain the advertisements for sexual aids and for ancillary publications, some of which we suspect could be classified as indecent. *Forum* and *Call Me Madam*, both of which are concerned with sexual matters, appear near the beginning of each issue and may be continued in later pages. The serious articles occupy about 25 percent of each issue but one has, in many cases to hunt for the remainder of each article towards the end of the issue. Features such as "Vietnam Veteran Advisor" and "Advise and Dissent Comment" appear regularly. Cartoons, most of which are sexually orientated occupy about 15-20 pages. They are of varying size, some being full page and other to a third to a half page.

There are normally three pictorial sections which occupy 40-45 pages. Unlike the articles which are segmented, the pictorial sections are not. The publication is so constructed that the reader is almost compelled to look at the pictorial sections.

Mr Robertson made lengthy submissions and set out the background to the present situation. He said that Decision 1038 was concerned with the May and June issues of June 1980 which can be called conveniently *Caligula Issues*. He accepted that these particular issues were uncharacteristic and unlikely to be repeated. He then went on to say "the shadows cast by the strictures on that occasion should not cloud the present issue." This hearing concerns regular editions of the magazine which have been refused entry by Customs because they appear to conflict with the guidelines provided by the 'Tripartite Test' developed in Decisions 1033, 1053 and 1054. He accepted that our reasons for developing the guidelines were to allow the distributor and Comptroller to know where they stood in relationship to particular issues. He went on to say that the guidelines selected have been expressed in a way which has hardened into a rigid rule, the automatic application of which can be unfair to the magazine as a continuing publication.

Mr Robertson then said that a second problem emerged from the words of the test itself. We quote from his written submissions because it seems to use better to do so rather than attempt to precis.

"A second problem emerges from the wording of the test itself. Its basis appears to be the view that *Penthouse*, in its general mix of contents, is of borderline acceptability: it is "tipped over the brink" by the appearance in the portfolios of scenes of a specified nature which are deemed to be injurious to the public good. The test describes such scenes in very general terms, and in words which make no allowance for the tone or mood of the pictorial or of its actual impact upon adult readers. The test selects certain aspects of the pictorials: multiplicity of models, lesbianism, mixtures of sex and violence and high degrees of intimacy, and deems these incidents to be injurious to the public good. Whether or not they are so injurious, however, must depend on more than an automatic application of a verbal test to the portfolio in question. Each category of the test pivots on the word "depiction". But what sort of emphasis, or explicitness, is required to amount to "depiction"?"

Unlike hardcore pornography, actual sexual connection is never photographed (sic) in *Penthouse*: some acts may be simulated or suggested, but are never actually committed in front of the camera. The "degree of intimacy" is never actual intimacy. "Violence" may appear as a theme in a pictorial, but it is never more than a story peg, presented in stylized fantasy rather than realistically. The same point could be made in relation to what are described as "lesbian acts". The test, by focusing upon the physical incidents present in the photographs, begs the question

of how the depictions, in the hand of adults, actually injure the public good. Mere multiplicity of models cannot of itself work injury, and it cannot be asserted that a magazine appealing to men would work directly to promote lesbianism.

It is against this background that the publishers respectfully invite the Tribunal to consider a broader and more contextual approach to *Penthouse* magazine, considering it as an overall package in the hands of adults and bearing in mind its established reputation as an international publishing enterprise. It is submitted that such an approach is justified pursuant to section 11, with its emphasis on the political and social character and importance of the publication, its dominant effect and honesty of purpose, and its contribution to the interests of learning. It is submitted that a 15A order does not constitute a finding of approval, let alone of respectability, but amounts to an objective recognition of the fact that it cannot be proven to be injurious to the public good according to the statutorially enumerated tests."

In Decision 1053 we expressly refrained from laying down hard and fast rules and in Decision 1054 we described the Tripartite Test as setting 'broad guidelines'. This was expressly because of what was said in *Waverly Publishing Company v Comptroller of Customs* 1980 1, NZLR 631 at page 641, line 37, Jeffries J said:

"The importance of Waverley is that it was an early decision which analysed the central thrust of the Act in its definition of 'indecent', and the directions of section 11. It also set out to give practical future guidance by itself defining categories into which publications could be placed. No doubt the Tribunal thought this course necessary as the definition of 'indecent' was not particular, and the direction of section 11 general. I realise its usefulness in the practical functions of the Tribunal, noting how frequently it has been applied since 1968. However, there are observations which now need to be made. First, convenient, easily applied categories, can, gradually, usurp the directions of Parliament contained in the Act. Interpretation cannot become itself legislation, and the law reports abound in comments of that nature. Secondly, the general words of the Act give it a timelessness which enables it to be current in deciding standards at any one time. The Waverley decision is now 12 years old, and if there is one statement that has been consistently made in the last 4 to 5 years it is how much community standards of acceptability, or otherwise, have changed. A point I expand later is that the word 'indecent' in the statute has a wide meaning embracing subjects not necessary included in the dictionary meaning of the word. Thirdly, the decision was, as this one is, concerned with individual publications each of which must have its calibration against the Act, not another decision concerned primarily with other publications. Fourthly, the decisions themselves were directly concerned with naturist publications with which this decision is not. Those last two points have relevance, I think, in this case because appellant's counsel in argument attempted to trace easing, or liberalising, of standards through the application of Waverley over the years."

The reason for our reference to guidelines was because of the uncertainty which existed in the mind of the importer. Therefore broad guidelines were laid down. It would be unfortunate that having laid down guidelines for the benefit of the importer it should now be suggested that we have now become too rigid in our approach in this matter and in particular in our approach to this publication. The rigid approach which we are suspected of using is simply because the publication itself maintains a somewhat rigid format.

The serious articles which we accept as being of a very high standard occupy only about 25 percent of the publication compared with somewhere between 30-40 percent of the publication concerned with items of a sexual nature. If the advertising content of a sexual nature were added it can be claimed with justification that the publication is dominantly concerned with sex. If the serious articles were increased in volume and the pictorial sections were reduced or alternately made of such a character that we would be prepared to classify them with an age restriction then it may well be not only that such a classification would be more or less automatic but what is far more important so far as the publishers and distributors are concerned a restriction order would probably be available.

Indeed a perusal of our decision relating to *Girlie* type magazines clearly indicates a flexible approach in the classification of this type of publication.

In our view the dominant effect on readers must of necessity relate more to sexual content than to the serious articles. The construction of the publication almost necessarily makes that so.

Dealing with the second problem it was Mr Robertson's submission that the Tribunal's view of *Penthouse* was that because of its general mix of content—which was of borderline acceptability—it was tipped over the brink by the pictorial sections of the nature mentioned in the earlier decisions. We have already given our reasons for classifying as indecent those issues which contain pictorials with a "multiplicity of models, lesbianism, mixtures of sex and violence and high degrees of intimacy". We have also indicated why we consider those issues as injurious to

the public good. Mr Robertson suggested that actual sexual connection was never photographed in *Penthouse*. We drew his attention to the July issue and in particular to the pictorial sections on pages 119-123. If the intimacy shown in those photographs was not actual intercourse it gives every appearance of being just that.

From time to time—we can almost say regularly—we have for consideration publications which consist sometimes entirely of photographs and sometimes a minimal amount of text. On those occasions quite plainly the pictorial content is the only matter for consideration. A review of decisions will indicate that we have prepared to classify them with an age restriction as long as there are no features such as we mention in Decisions 1053 and 1054.

Perhaps the most important submission Mr Robertson made to us was in relation to the dominant effect of the publication. He argued both orally and in his written submissions that the dominant effect was to provoke and stimulate thought in the reader over a wide number of areas. Sex was one of those areas, Mr Robertson conceded, but although vital was not the predominant part of the magazine.

We do not accept this submission. We think the approach suggested is too academic. The Tribunal, over a 10-year period, during which time its composition has changed, has consistently found that the predominant effect of the magazine is to deal with sexual matters in a manner which hovers on the borderline of indecency. For example in 1974 in Decision No. 830 the Tribunal stated:

“The amount of material not concerned with sex varies among the 6 but at nowhere threatens to contest the dominance, in text and illustration, of the varied sexual fare. In its nature and in the tone of its treatment, some of the sexual material is more objectionable than the features of the earlier issues on which the Tribunal commented.”

In December 1976 the Tribunal in Decision No. 881 stated:

“Clearly in both text and photographs there is a predominant emphasis, in each magazine, on sexual matters.”

In Decision Nos 1033 (8 October 1982) and 1053 (16 March 1983) similar sentiments are expressed in the sections of the decisions that deal with the dominant effect of the magazine.

Mr Robertson's argument invites use to consider too narrow a spectrum. While we accept his argument that certain aspects of *Penthouse* would be thought provoking and stimulating to the reader, we feel it is a conceptual argument that could be applied to all but the most simple type of publication. Consequently we have no doubt that books and magazines dealing with matters of sex, horror, crime, cruelty or violence could be covered by the same argument as is advanced by Mr Robertson, on this point.

Accordingly, we feel that this argument carried little interest.

We reject the submission that the publication has great political and social character or is of great importance in the political and social field.

It makes some contribution to learning but its dominant effect remains sexual. We also suggest that there is room for doubt as to honesty of purpose. We pose the question—if the publication has received universal and international acceptance because of its investigative journalism and thought provoking articles why go to the extreme of including the sections to which we have objected? We refer to the pictorial sections in particular and to a lesser extent features such as *Forum* and *Call Me Madam*.

Mr Robertson produced to us a photocopy of an affidavit from Professor Haward who is the Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at the University of Surrey, a photocopy of what appears to be an unsworn affidavit from John Mortimer, QC and a statement from Mr Blom-Cooper, QC of London. Professor Haward suggests that the content of the issues of July to December 1983 inclusive are not indecent. He said that *Penthouse* magazine has been used for the diagnosis of psychosexual problems and for their subsequent treatment by behaviour therapy. He then went on to relate that a Medical Conference in 1972 had recommended the use of sex magazines for psychiatric purposes.

We are aware of a number of what we have called sex manuals which are available in New Zealand with or without an age restriction. We have classified a number of these in recent years and feel that they are more appropriate for the purpose mentioned by Professor Haward. So far as the affidavit of Mr Mortimer and the statement from Mr Blom-Cooper are concerned we note that they refer to the Obscene Publications Act 1959. We are not concerned with that Act but rather with the New Zealand Indecent Publications Act 1963. As we understand the position in the UK matters of obscenity come before a jury whereas under the New Zealand Act this Tribunal is charged with the duty of classifying books and sound recordings in accordance with the provisions of the Act. It may well be that should such issues call to be decided by a jury no conviction would result for one of 2 reasons.

Firstly, the jury might be satisfied that the publication is not indecent. Alternately there may be disagreement amongst members of a jury in which case, of course, no conviction would follow. We

are aware that there is a body of opinion in New Zealand and doubtless elsewhere, which is opposed to any form of censorship. We are also aware that there is also a body of opinion which would impose a stricter form of censorship than currently exists. The existence of these two lobbies could well be a reason for a jury failing to agree.

The fact remains that this Tribunal remains the judge of indecency in respect of books and sound recordings. Mr Robertson conceded as much, although he did say that as a Tribunal, we had a wider discretion to accept such evidence than perhaps a Court might have. In general Courts have been reluctant to accept expert evidence on the issue of whether a publication has a tendency to deprave and corrupt. Leading cases dealing with such issues are *DPP v Jordan* [1977] AC 699, *Buckley v Wathen* [1973] VR 51 (Victorian Supreme Court, full court).

Mr Timberlake's submissions do not sit easily with those made on behalf of the publishers who would accept an age restriction. Mr Timberlake's objection is to censorship. That issue is not one for us to decide. It is our function to carry out as best we can censorship of books and sound recordings in accordance with the terms of the Statute.

As we have mentioned earlier only 3 issues are before us namely those for June to August inclusive. We have had the opportunity of perusing those 1983 issues not already submitted for classification. Because the 3 issues before us contain multiple scenes they are classified as indecent.

Other issues for 1983 were handed to us as a basis for comparison. However, we have not been asked to classify them so that the distributors may have to decide for themselves what to do.

We have been asked again by Mr Robertson to make a restriction order pursuant to section 15A. Because all issues vary from 1 month to the next and for reasons which we have already given in earlier decisions, we are still not prepared to make a restriction order. Were we so minded and because of the variable nature, such a restriction order might be one declaring the publication as indecent. We have been informed, however, that the 1984 issues are markedly different from those of 1983. We have not yet seen them but if there is an improvement which is sustained over a period, it might be possible to make a restriction order once the publications have been submitted for classification.

Before the Broadcasting Tribunal

IN the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of an application by the OTAGO RADIO ASSOCIATION INCORPORATED to amend Warrant AM-1/4XD:

Hearing: Wellington, 3 April 1984.

DECISION

THE applicant applied for 2 amendments to the warrant.

One was to permit the rebroadcasting of Radio New Zealand News bulletins which may at times contain sports results.

The other was to extend hours of broadcast on Sundays from 0900 hours to 1200 hours and from 0600 hours to 1100 hours to broadcast continuously from 0900 to 1100 hours.

In support of the application evidence was given by J. A. A. Tonkin the honorary secretary of the association. In evidence given by affidavit Mr Tonkin said it was the intention of the association to use the additional broadcast hours to provide a programme at present unavailable on Sunday afternoons in Dunedin. He described it as “light and bright musical” including music and songs, popular and the past, together with recent and new releases in the ‘ballads’ and ‘country’ styles collectively described generally as ‘easy listening’.

The association believed the programme would fill a gap on Sunday afternoons between the predominantly rock music from commercial stations and the national programme's lighter music and spoken programmes.

Information supplied with the application indicated that the station had sufficient number of people capable of presenting the programmes.

The association said that it may, after assessing the success of the extended broadcasts, apply for daytime broadcasting on public holidays and possibly Saturday afternoons.

The association approached Radio New Zealand with a view to rebroadcasting Radio New Zealand news bulletins to which Radio New Zealand agreed. The news bulletins are recorded and then

rebroadcast. It is now thought that the clause prohibiting networking may prohibit this type of broadcasting or at least put it in doubt.

To put the matter beyond doubt the warrant will be amended in this respect to provide the usual prohibition against networking but to make it clear that Radio New Zealand bulletins including those containing sports news may be broadcast by the station.

With regard to the extension of hours the extension seems to fulfil a useful purpose in programming for the Dunedin audience.

No objections have been received to either aspect of the application.

The tribunal will grant the application and at the same time to make the position clear insert the usual prohibition regarding networking but with the proviso that the warrant holder may, notwithstanding any prohibition contained or implied in the warrant, form or join in forming or enter into or be or become a member of any network of broadcasting stations for the purpose of rebroadcasting Radio New Zealand news bulletins including bulletins which contain sports news.

The hours will be amended by deleting the present provision for the hours of transmission on Sundays and substituting; Sundays 0900-2300.

Price Order No. 276 (Butter)

PURSUANT to the Commerce Act 1975, I, Wayne Eric Scanlan, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Trade and Industry, hereby make the following price order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 276, and shall come into force on the 4th day of May 1984.

2. (1) Price Order No. 232* and Special Approval No. C2047† are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said price order and the said special approval shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

(3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 232 and Special Approval No. C2047, any approvals given under clause 13 of that price order or any approvals deemed by clause 3 of that price order to continue to have effect or any approvals given under clause 14 of that special approval shall continue to have effect as if the said price order and the said special approval had not been revoked.

3. (1) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—“the said Act” means the Commerce Act 1975; “the said regulations” mean the Butter and Cheese Marketing Regulations 1948‡.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, or in the said regulations, when used in this order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by the said Act or by the said regulations, as the case may be.

4. The prices in this order shall apply to Creamery and Continental style butter, the standard of quality of which is not less than category 3 and to whey butter, the quality of which is not lower than category 2. The categories referred to mean:

- (a) Categories assigned at a grading store; or
- (b) Categories assigned in a manufacturing dairy prescribed by regulation 26 of the said regulations; or
- (c) Categories constructively assigned pursuant to subclause (4) of regulation 26 of the said regulations.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

5. This order applies with respect to all sales in New Zealand by way of wholesale, or retail, of any butter (within the meaning of the said regulations) manufactured in New Zealand, except butter sold as ships' stores for vessels sailing beyond New Zealand.

MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICE OF BUTTER TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

6. (1) The maximum wholesale price of butter to which this order applies shall be:

- (i) \$1.13 a 500 gram pack of salted creamery butter.
- (ii) \$0.5831 a 250 gram pack of salted creamery butter.
- (iii) \$1.16 a 500 gram pack of unsalted creamery butter.
- (iv) \$2.23 per kilogram of salted creamery butter in bulk.
- (v) \$2.3155 per kilogram of unsalted creamery butter in bulk.
- (vi) \$2.1754 per kilogram of salted whey butter in bulk.
- (vii) \$1.1027 a 500 gram pack of salted whey butter.
- (viii) \$1.3140 a 500 gram pack of continental style butter.

7. Any butter sold in pursuance of the provisions of clause 6 of this order shall be delivered freight free into the purchaser's premises.

8. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, the price for any parcel of butter sold, whether in bulk or in pats, in a quantity of less than 20 kg, by way of sale by wholesale, being butter of one of the kinds and standards of quality set out in clause 6 of this order, may (at the option of the vendor) be the sum of 5c per parcel more than the appropriate price prescribed for butter

of that kind and standard of quality by the foregoing provisions of this order, and the said sum of 5c shall be added to the rates referred to in clause 11 of this order for the purpose of that clause.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF BUTTER TO WHICH THIS PRICE ORDER APPLIES

9. (1) The maximum retail price of butter to which this price order applies shall be computed at the rate of:

- (i) \$1.24 a 500 gram pack of salted creamery butter.
- (ii) \$0.64 a 250 gram pack of salted creamery butter.
- (iii) \$1.28 a 500 gram pack of unsalted creamery butter.
- (iv) \$1.21 a 500 gram pack of salted whey butter.
- (v) \$1.49 a 500 gram pack of continental style butter.

(2) If, in respect of any lot of butter sold by a retailer, the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of cents, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the nearest whole cent.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

10. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this price order and subject to such conditions, if any as he thinks fit, the Secretary, on application by any trader, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any butter to which this price order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges are incurred by the trader. Any authority given by the Secretary under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of butter or may relate generally to all butter to which this Price Order applies sold by the trader while the order remains in force.

Trading Bank Reserve Asset Ratio

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank, acting with the approval of the Minister of Finance, hereby gives notice that as from the close of business on the 1st May 1984 and until further notice each trading bank shall maintain during each calendar month balances at the Reserve Bank plus holdings of Reserve Bank notes, of New Zealand coin,

and of New Zealand Government securities, such that the aggregate of the averages of those balances and holdings during that calendar month (determined in accordance with clauses 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this notice) equals or exceeds the aggregate of:

31.0 percent of that trading bank's average demand and time deposit liabilities in New Zealand in the immediately preceding calendar month (determined in accordance with the provisions of clause 5 of this notice);

Provided that a trading bank may make up its balances and holdings as aforesaid for a calendar month to the amount hereinbefore required for that calendar month by way of borrowings from the Reserve Bank made during the next following calendar month and on terms and conditions to be determined by the Reserve Bank and the proceeds of all such borrowings shall be credited to the account of that trading bank with the Reserve Bank termed "Contra Deposit Account" and on terms and conditions to be determined by the Reserve Bank.

For the purposes of this notice:

- (1) Balances held by a trading bank at the Reserve Bank shall (subject to clause 6 of this notice) include both demand deposit balances and time deposit balances of that trading bank.
- (2) The average of a trading bank's holdings of Reserve Bank notes and of New Zealand coin for a calendar month shall be the average of the figures shown in all weekly returns of Banking Statistics by that trading bank under the Statistics Act 1975 received during that calendar month.
- (3) The average of a trading bank's balances at the Reserve Bank and holdings of New Zealand Government securities for a calendar month shall in each case be the average of the figures for balances and such securities held by that trading bank on each day during that calendar month.
- (4) Government securities held by a trading bank shall consist of Government stock and Treasury bills (all at nominal value) held by that trading bank.
- (5) The average demand and time deposit liabilities of a trading bank in a calendar month shall be the average of the figures for days within that calendar month, as shown in that trading bank's weekly returns of Banking Statistics under the Statistics Act 1975.
- (6) The proceeds of any borrowings made by a trading bank pursuant to the proviso to this notice shall be deemed to be a part of and be included in the balances held by that trading bank at the Reserve Bank on the last day of the preceding calendar month;
