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*Import Licence Tendering—Call for Tenders: Round 16*

PURSUANT to the Import Control Regulations 1973 (S.R. 1980/246) the Secretary of Trade and Industry, acting under delegated authority is calling tenders for the goods specified below. Tenders close on 20 August 1984 at 5 p.m. and must be received by the Registrar of Tenders by then to be valid. Tenderers are advised that the item codes referred to relate to those shown in the Import Licensing Schedule 1984.

Instructions for tenderers and the general terms and conditions which apply to the submission and acceptance of tenders are set out in the Guide to Licence Tendering dated January 1984. Tenders should be addressed to the Registrar of Tenders, P.O. Box 3146, Wellington, or be delivered by hand to the First Floor of the Bowen State Building, Wellington. Tenders for Round 16 should reach the Registrar no later than 5 p.m. on 20 August 1984.

NOTE:

1. Tenderers should refer to the Customs Tariff and the Import Licensing Schedule for a definite description of the goods included in the list above.
2. Tenderers should be conversant with the various statutes and regulations which importing enterprises are obliged to comply with, such as the Food and Drug Regulations 1973, Safety Standards, Duties and Sales Tax, etc., where relevant.
3. Tenderers are reminded to use a separate tender form for each tender number. Bids may be sent in one envelope. The envelope must be marked Import Licence Tender.
4. Where two or more item codes are tendered under a single tender number, successful tenderers should nominate which item code(s) the licence(s) should be issued under when payment is made.
