New Zealand Wheat Board's and Agents' Selling Prices—Subject to the following provisions of this order, the maximum prices that may be charged or received by the New Zealand Wheat Board or its agents at the approved points of sale for any flour or wheatmeal to which this order applies, which is sold in not less than minimum quantity lots, shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts (provided that the prices charged shall include only that part of the following amounts which relates to the quantity sold!):

Officers of Government of Ross Dependency Appointed

DAVID BEATTIE, Governor-General

WHEREAS, by the Order in Council dated the 30th day of July 1923*, made under the British Settlements Act 1887 of the United Kingdom Parliament, the Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of New Zealand for the time being (hereinafter called the Governor) was appointed to be the Governor of the Ross Dependency, and all the powers and authorities which by the said order were given and granted to the Governor for the time being of the Dependency were thereby vested in him:

And whereas the Governor was thereby further authorised and empowered to make all such rules and regulations as might lawfully be made by Her Majesty's authority for the peace, order, and good government of the Dependency:

And whereas, by regulations made by the Governor on the 14th day of November 1923†, it was enacted that all persons appointed by the Governor for the time being of the Dependency should have such power and authority as might be granted them in due course of law, and might be empowered to do such things as might be necessary or desirable to ensure that the laws in force in the Dependency are duly observed and complied with in every respect, and to do all things necessary or expedient for the peace, order, and good government of the Dependency, and to safeguard and preserve Her Majesty's rights and sovereignty over and in respect of the Dependency:

And whereas it is expedient that the persons hereinafter named be appointed officers of the Government of the Dependency:

Now, therefore, I, The Honourable Sir David Stuart Beattie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, and as such the Governor of the Ross Dependency, hereby appoint

Peter Lewis Cresswell, Esquire

as an officer of the Government of the Dependency for the period beginning with the 3rd day of October 1984 and ending with the close of the 11th day of October 1985:

And I hereby confer on the said Peter Lewis Cresswell while he holds office all the powers and authorities which may be exercised in New Zealand by a Justice of the Peace, and also the powers and authorities which may be so exercised by a Coroner:

And I hereby also appoint

Leo Bernard Slattery, Esquire

as an officer of the Government of the Dependency for the period beginning with the 3rd day of October 1984 and ending with the 11th day of October 1985 or such earlier date as he shall leave the Dependency:

And I hereby confer on the said Leo Bernard Slattery while he holds office all the powers and authorities that may be exercised in New Zealand by the Postmaster:

The said Peter Lewis Cresswell and the said Leo Bernard Slattery to exercise their functions at such places within the Dependency as may be directed by the officer for the time being appointed as an officer of the Government of the Dependency in whom is vested the general executive and administrative authority in preserving Her Majesty's rights and sovereignty and the laws and regulations in force in the Dependency.

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General, as the Governor of the Ross Dependency, this 25th day of September 1984.

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976 and in the matter of applications for commercial FM sound radio warrants for Northland by: (1) SUNSHINE STEREO FM (MID-NORTH) LIMITED; (2) NORTHLAND FM RADIO LIMITED:

Chairman: B. H. Slane.

Members: L. R. Sceats and A. E. Wilson.

Co-opted Member: M. J. Henshall.

Counsel: D. D. Beer for Sunshine Stereo FM (Mid-North) Ltd.; R. L. Maclaren for Northland FM Radio Ltd.; J. M. Thompson for Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand.

THE Broadcasting Tribunal called for applications for commercial FM stations for Northland. Two applications were received.

We deal with each separately.

Sunshine Stereo FM (Mid-North) Limited

The applicant company is promoted by A. R. Lilley of Opua to operate a local FM station from 6 a.m. to midnight from a transmitter with a maximum effective radiated power of 1 kW at Mount Pokaka, a site 650 feet above sea level and situated south of Kerikeri and west of Waitangi.

The primary coverage area would take in Kerikeri, Ohaeawai, Waimate North and provide a secondary service to Waitangi, Paihia and Russell. The station would broadcast music for a predominantly rural and urban population drawn from the 20 to 45 age group but the applicant said the 10 to 20 and 45 and over age groups would not be forgotten. The music would be middle of the road with a large number of tracks taken from albums and would be played in brackets of approximately 8 to 10 minutes. Commercial content would be kept to a minimum and community involvement services would be provided. In addition rural reports, horticultural reports, fishing, tide, weather and college information as well as sports and the arts would be provided.

Before determining whether or not to grant the warrant, the Tribunal had regard to the provisions of section 80 of the Broadcasting Act 1976, so far as they are applicable.

- (a) The extent to which the proposed service is desirable in the public interest.
- (d) The needs of New Zealand or the locality or localities proposed to be served, in respect of broadcasting services.

The applicant's case was that there was a need for the service because the mid-north was not well served as far as radio was concerned. The proposed coverage area has as radio was concerned. The proposed coverage area has a population of 23 000 which, according to the applicant, was increased by 675 000 visitors to the Bay of Islands during the summer season. (It was not seriously contended that any such numbers were there at any one time). Current services available were the National Programme or Radio New Zealand's commercial programme which originates in Whangarei and which is transmitted through a transmitter at Kaikohe. From some positions with good receivers it was possible to pick up FM broadcasts from Auckland. The applicant's case was that establishment of Auckland. The applicant's case was that establishment of the station in Whangarei would not satisfy public demand in the area, because local people would not identify with

The proposal was for a local community service for people within about 35 kilometres of the site. As Whangarei people within about 35 kilometres of the site. As Whangaret news, and advertising and promotions were of little or no interest to the Bay of Islands, so a Bay of Islands station would hold little interest to people in Dargaville, Kaitaia and Whangarei. For that reason the promoters decided not to site a transmitter at Mount Hikurangi with other repeaters for transmission to those areas.

A petition signed by 400 residents supported the establishment of a mid-north community FM station.

Mention was made both of the VHF Planning Report and the Tribunal's report on FM development in relation to low power transmissions.

We have concluded that such a service would be desirable but that there are some deficiencies in the proposal. It appears to fall between provision for a low powered, low sited transmitter providing a local programme to a very local audience, to one encompassing quite a wide area but possibly without a sufficient population base to support the station. We shall allude to that later.

We have also to consider the desirability of this in comparison with a regional station based in Whangarei which would provide a service in the mid-north area. For convenience we have discussed that under another heading, but it also pertains to the desirability and the need for services in the area.

- (b) The economic effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates is likely to have in respect of broadcasting stations already in operation.
- (c) The effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates may have on broadcasting services provided by the Corporation in the public interest.

We consider that the effect would only be marginal in view of the small amount of the revenue obtained from country areas, and the likelihood that the revenue expectations would not reach the estimates of the applicants.

Only 12 percent of the Corporation's Northland revenue is gathered from the Kaikohe/Bay of Islands area, 58 percent came from Whangarei based advertising and 30 percent from national advertising.

For the past 5 years Radio New Zealand has established studios in Paihia and a transmitter at Russell to serve the needs of the permanent community and the estimated 300 000 visitors during the summer. The costs of establishing that service were insignificant for a 4 week period, but the return went some way towards maintaining a consistent commercial thrust for the remainder of the year as the area switched on and off according to the tourist flows, according to the Radio New Zealand manager L. J F. Borck. The existing station has been allowed breakouts since 1977 in Kaikohe and Kaitaia.

The mid-north population was 25 000 average equating with Oamaru or Ashburton where Radio New Zealand operated mini-stations with limited local hours. Even a limited hours operation, Mr Borck said, needed a town of not less than 10 000 people within that service area. The largest town, Kaikohe, has only 3 700. We accepted that evidence.

It is convenient here to consider the effect the existence of the proposed station would have on the establishment of the station to serve the whole of Northland. We have concluded that although the station would be unlikely to be successful, the revenue required to sustain a successful station would amount to \$350,000. This would lead to a loss of potential advertising for the regional FM station and to a lesser extent have an effect on Radio Northland's revenue. This station may, in fact, prejudice the viability of the regional station during its first years of establishment.

(e) The financial and commercial ability of the applicant to carry on the proposed service.

Mr Lilley has spent many years in radio as an announcer and has been involved in community promotions including the summer station Bay Radio, established by Radio New Zealand in the Bay of Islands over the summer holiday period. For the past few years he has been part of the team in that station and announcer in charge of promotions. He is a medical electronic technician.

Mr Pearce has an Electrical Trades certificate and for the last 6 years has been employed by the Bay of Islands Electric Power Board as an electrical technician working on telemetry systems, radio communications and laboratory testing. He was in charge of the installation at Kerikeri Airport and of a new radio telephone repeater at the summit of Mount Raetea.

In March, P. W. Byers, a chartered accountant, became a director of the applicant company. He is responsible for organising the overall management requirements for the company's operation, raising the capital and controlling the day to day financial management of the company. He is 40 years old and has many years experience in chartered accountancy. He is now a senior partner in an accounting firm in Kaikohe.

We had the opportunity of seeing both Mr Lilley and Mr Pearce giving evidence and of their being cross-examination. The accounting evidence was given by a partner of Mr Byers, A. E. Webber.

To some extent we also formed an opinion on the way in which the application was put together. Despite their technical background there were extensive amendments to the proposal and extensive criticism of the original proposals on technical grounds by other witnesses.

The application had not been thought out carefully as regards news and staffing, and none of the directors had any sales or marketing experience.

What is more it was not evident that Messrs Lilley and Pearce saw this lack as important. The way in which they would handle local news and information was unsatisfactory and the proposition appeared to be beyond their personal abilities and beyond the resources of the area, unless it were introduced and carried out by experienced broadcasters with both sales marketing and management experience. Mr Pearce who was to take responsibility in these areas had no sales experience or radio news experience.

(None of this reflects on Mrs Beer's presentation of the case which certainly made the most of it.)

We would have been more impressed with the application had the applicant's proposed a more modest siting and coverage area and shorter hours, although we cannot say that it would necessarily be successful.

We accept that Mr Byers is a capable accountant in private practice, but do not know whether he would have the level of commitment to the establishment of this business which might prejudice his personal time and involvement in his professional activities.

The survey material when probed was not impressive.

After hearing Mr Webber's evidence we considered that the research and budgeted figures are reasonable except in this respect. We do not consider the revenue projections can be attained on the small population base, even allowing for the summer influx. From 400 businesses this would require \$750 per annum sales to every one of them. There was no satisfactory evidence of advertising support.

(f) The likelihood of the applicant carrying on the proposed service satisfactorily.

Mr Lilley has some knowledge of programming but it appears to be limited. The resources of the station would not permit any extensive surveying of reaction to music programming and we doubt that the station could survive in its present form. It is more likely that the company would be taken over and run by some others on another basis who would then possibly ask for amendments to the warrant.

We believe that the task has been under-estimated by Messrs Pearce and Lilley and that their lack of management experience would show up in the difficult first 12 months of the establishment of the station.

There is not the breadth of ability in the 2 working directors to run a community station. There is a lack of experience to organise and manage sales.

(g) The results of any survey available to the Tribunal

The survey was referred to but it proved to be of no substance. It was informal and subjective. The material, when probed, was not impressive.

- (h) The requirement that frequencies be best utilized in the public
 - Mr R. B. Vernall, an engineer with the Regulatory Division of the New Zealand Post Office, pointed out that the proposed transmitter site did not comply with the costing policy, and had the potential for causing interference problems, namely:
 - 1. Excessive field strength causing domestic receiver overload for locations close to the transmitter.
 - 2. Picture impairment on TV Channel 1 receivers in nearby areas.
 - 3. General field strength and balance with the Hikurangi station.

However, Mr Vernall pointed out that because of the sparse population in the vicinity of the transmitter site, with a careful allocation of frequency and power the number and severity of the interference problems would be low. Because this area is at one end of the country the implications of non-cositing would be less important for frequency allocation. The Post Office would be prepared to certify the application up to 1 kW with omnidirectional aerials as a result of further information supplied. Mr D. J. Gatland said that if the most desirable frequency 89.0 MHz were allocated as the FM frequency in order to minimise interference with television reception, there may then be no suitable FM frequency available in the area for short term broadcast authorisations. Mr Gatland pointed out that the assessed population of 25 000 average was not consistent with the total mid-north regional television coverage from Hikurangi and Russell transmitting stations of about 24 000 based on the 1981 census.

Mr Gatland also noted that the site was an inefficient one providing a marginal service to important places such as Kaikohe (shaded by 12 foot hills 4 miles out of Kaikohe), Opua which was heavily shaded, Moerewa and Kawakawa which were heavily shaded.

By contrast the Hikurangi site used by television which had been criticised by the applicants was an efficient site requiring only one television translator in the proposed service area for Sunshine, namely at Russell. It is by no means certain in the view of Mr Gatland that a similar translator would be required for FM if Hikurangi was used as the mid-north area station. The 2 mV/m standard for a town like Kaikohe would be achieved from Hikurangi. He said that a lot of the coverage problems of Sunshine arose because the site was so low that it did not clear the surrounding hills. Only 1½ kilometres away to the southwest, there was a hill 50 feet higher whereas Hikurangi was 3 times the height, which meant that the station would only require one-tenth of the power to serve a similar coverage radius.

We accept that Mr Gatland's evidence casts doubt on the coverage proposed by the applicant. The reason for not wanting the Hikurangi site was expense and the fact that it would cover a wider area than was intended to be served by the applicant. While there is no doubt that the most efficient use of frequencies would be the use of the Hikurangi site, because of the location of the area no great harm would be done by having a non-cosited station, if the desirability of the service, its economic viability and its likelihood of fulfilling a need in the area weighed sufficiently in the balance.

 The desirability of avoiding monopolies in the ownership or control of news media.

The applicant would provide another source of information.

(j) The hours during which the applicant proposed to broadcast programmes.

The 18-hour period appears to us to be too ambitious and shows an attempt to provide a full station service to an area. A more modest proposal would have been more realistic.

(k) The extent of advertising matter which the applicant proposed to broadcast.

It is unlikely the extent of advertising would reach a level where there would be any disadvantage in the application to anyone.

(1) The proposed rates and charges to be made in respect of the advertising programmes.

The rates were too high. We accepted Mr Borck's comparisons with Radio Northland's rates as unfavourable to the applicant.

(n) All relevant evidence or representations received by it at the hearing.

There is undoubtedly support for the institution of the station but we had to weigh what that support would be in relation to the alternative available of a regional FM station in the area. Essentially the merit of this application would be the ability to broadcast local news and information and provide a local identity in the area. We do not believe that this application would succeed as a proposal if the application of Northland FM were granted. That station would undoubtedly attract most of the audience seeking FM stereo programming and its standard would ensure that it took the greater market share. The news and information elements of Radio Northland are strong and professional and this new station would be left providing a second grade local service with insufficient audience and selling power to attract adequate revenue to sustain the station.

To refuse the Northland application because of the merits of this application would be to deny the greater Northland area the benefit of an FM music programme choice. To deny it a Hikurangi repeater would probably be to destroy its regional character, its access to the Kaikohe region and yet not necessarily supply to Kaikohe a programme attractive and with an adequate signal strength. It may prejudice the extension of the programme further northwest towards Kaitaia.

(o) The policy of the Governemnt for the development of FM broadcasting as an integral part of sound radio broadcasting was taken into account, including the policy set out in the direction of the Minister of Broadcasting dated 27 October 1981.

Decision

The application is declined.

Northland FM Radio Ltd.

Northland FM Radio Ltd. applied for a warrant to provide a service for Northland from 4 transmitters; Parahaki in Whangarei with a 60 w transmitter; Horokaka, 23 kilometres south-west of Whangarei with a power of 1 kW; Hikurangi, 18 kilometres southeast of Kaikohe with 1 kW and Maungataniwha, 24 kilometres east of Kaitaia with a power of 2 kW initially and later 5 kW.

The station proposed to broadcast music with a contemporary rock-n-roll base highlighted by contemporary album oriented artists with a major appeal to all people aged between 18 and 39 years. The music would be familiar and consistent and there would be abalance of older and new music with particular emphasis on artists and groups who currently receive little exposure on the present AM station. The potential audience within the broadcast coverage area was about 100 000 but rose dramatically during the summer holiday period. It was proposed to provide a news service from Radio Pacific via a landline but it was not proposed that there would be any journalist on the station to provide local news.

Advertising was proposed to be limited to between 6 and 8 minutes but the applicant thought reasonable for the Tribunal "to impose a maximum of 10 minutes per hour average commercial content or at least a minimum of 8 minutes average".

Considerations

In considering the application for a warrant, the Tribunal before determining whether or not to grant the application, has had regard to the following matters, so far as they are applicable as required by section 80 of the Broadcasting Act 1976.

(a) The extent to which the proposed service is desirable in the public interest.

The proposal brings stereo FM broadcasting to the Northland audience although many in the southern part of Northland can already pick up the Auckland stations. This new service will be designed and provided to Northland by a company which has impressed the Tribunal with its determination to provide that service although it will be expensive to do so because of the capital cost of establishing the 4 transmitters required. It is a significant benefit of the proposal that it will bring this service to areas which are quite sparsely populated.

It is therefore easy to understand the support of the immediate past Mayor who is concerned about such matters as employment but sees a good future for Northland and who supported the application as another amenity for Northland people. However we have not considered the application on the basis of more buoyant economic conditions developing in the region.

The service will also bring a counterbalance to the heavily informational and highly successful Northland operation of Radio New Zealand. We do not accept that in this situation it is essential that the 2 stations target different markets as we believe the extensive services of Radio New Zealand will ensure for it a substantial audience and an audience which will listen to it for the services it provides. The music service provided in stereo FM by this station is an alternative, even if the music played is not

substantially different from a significant proportion of the music on Radio Northland. While the music on Radio Northland is said to be aimed at the same 18–39 age group Radio Northland's other content attracts an older age group as well. The advent of an FM music service for this age group is a complementary service.

We do not agree that the new station should be required to aim for a 15-24 age group.

- (b) The economic effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates is likely to have in respect of broadcasting stations already in operation.
- (c) The effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates may have on broadcasting services provided by the Corporation in the public interest.

There are no other services provided in the area other than those of Radio Northland and the National Programme, both owned and operated by the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand.

We do not consider that the establishment of the station will have any effect at all on the economics of the Auckland stations.

It will however have a substantial effect on Radio Northland. We estimate this effect as being approximately \$200,000 revenue a year. We have concluded that the benefit of the alternative service and the advent of stereo FM popular music programming to the area outweighs the effect it will have on the Corporation. We believe this will only be a pause in the development of Radio Northland and it may well find that its strength will ensure that the effect on its revenue is less than we estimate. We do not consider that that cost is an unreasonable one, having regard to the benefits a new service would bring.

(d) The needs of New Zealand or the locality or localities proposed to be served, in respect of broadcasting services.

The level of dissatisfaction with Radio Northland could not alone justify the application.

The Tribunal considers that stereo FM services can no longer be regarded as being in a luxury category. They are an integral part of sound radio broadcasting in New Zealand and should be developed as such. Whangarei is a city of some 40 000. Another service is needed there as well as in the more remote outlying areas.

It would be impossible for any other operator to provide a satisfactory service to the regions outside Whangarei were the applicant to have decided to serve only Whangarei. However, at considerable extra capital cost, the proposal to serve the wider Northland region will provide a first class music service to many outlying areas whose remoteness has in the past led to concern at the lack of services and in particular of radio and television services.

It was pointed out that, with about a quarter of the population Maori, little recognition of the need to provide for that community could be found in the application. The applicant should seek to find ways within its format of recognising different needs in its programming.

(e) The financial and commercial ability of the applicant to carry on the proposed service.

We consider here also the financial viability of the proposal.

The Tribunal does not consider that the establishment of this station will be easy. It is quite likely that greater losses will be sustained than the promoters anticipate. We have concluded however that the applicant's board of directors and its proposed manager have the commercial and financial ability to see the matter through to eventual success. Their estimates appear to be reasonable both as to the capital expenditure involved and as to operating costs. They have been practical in accepting certain programme deficiencies such as news which they cannot provide because of the economics of the operation at a local level.

The Tribunal is satisfied that the preparation analysis and local knowledge have resulted in an application that is soundly based and is supported by reasonable efforts to obtain likely revenue, audience and advertising potential.

The proposed funding is satisfactory. The high capital cost demands a high capitalisation. Otherwise costs appear to be reasonably estimated. But the profitability may be more delayed than has been estimated.

(f) The likelihood of the applicant carrying on the proposed service satisfactorily.

We deal with this in 2 respects. The first is directors and management.

The board provides a range of expertise, business ability and local knowledge which will be adequate to the challenge.

The proposed managing director has been a successful manager in private radio and we consider his management capability will attract staff of sufficient calibre to provide a good standard of programming, sales and service. Mr Colcord has the potential for the programme director role.

With regard to the programme quality, we note that there could be some difficulty over the quality of the signal due to the off air links proposed. But we accept them as a reasonable cost compromise. We believe however that the company is genuine in its determination to provide a good quality programme and accept that its intention is to provide more sophisticated links if off air arrangements prove unsatisfactory for any part of the coverage. It has the capability of doing this.

(g) The results of any survey available to the Tribunal.

A survey was carried out by Colmar & Brunton Research Ltd. of 18 to 39 year olds. Evidence was given by Ms Colmar. The survey was helpful but there are some limitations on its relevance to the hearing. We noted that dissatisfaction with Radio Northland was not high and that Ms Colmar concluded Radio Northland exploited only 40 percent to 60 percent of the revenue potential of the Whangarei area.

(h) The requirement that frequencies be best utilised in the public interest

We accept the criticism of off air linking and the attitude of the Post Office that this may not be possible with later allocations of frequencies. That is understood by the applicant. It is nevertheless a reasonable basis on which to start a service.

This proposal makes good use of frequencies given the size and difficulties of the coverage area.

(i) The desirability of avoiding monopolies in the ownership or control of news media.

The station will introduce another news source to the area by the use of Radio Pacific's national and international news services. It will not provide a local news service.

The owners of the Northern Advocate, the Whangarei daily newspaper, will have a shareholding in this company of slightly less than 20 percent. We have received detailed evidence about the shareholding and the cross-media arrangements.

There is no suggestion of a proper news service from the newspaper company. As no local news service will in fact be provided there will be no undesirable reduction in choices as a result of this shareholding.

It seems likely that sales combinations will result but we are not convinced that there will be any tendency towards monopoly by a modest shareholding in the radio company by a substantial newspaper owner.

However, in order that the Tribunal can retain some control of the situation there will be the usual restriction on news media company shareholding of 30 percent.

(j) The hours during which the applicant proposes to broadcast programmes

> The 24 hour service would not include any relays as the station intends to use the midnight to dawn period for training new announcers.

(k) The extent of advertising matter which the applicant proposed to broadcast.

There is some confusion on the part of the applicant or its counsel regarding advertising. It was described as being limited to between 6 and 8 minutes per hour but that the applicant thought it reasonable for the Tribunal "to impose a maximum of 10 minutes per hour average commercial content or at least a minimum of 8 minutes average

We are not certain what this means and we are not attracted to a proposal for control of average commercial content. The Tribunal considers the stations must in providing an alternative FM format be prepared to accept a lower commercial content. The Tribunal fixes the maximum advertising at 8 minutes per hour. This is not an average. It is a maximum amount permitted in any one clock hour.

(1) The proposed rates and charges to be made in respect of advertising programmes.

The rates as set out by the applicant were reasonable.

(m) Such matters as may be necessary for the purpose of imposing conditions under section 71.4 of this Act.

We considered the length of any warrant granted. In view of the technical, programme and other conditions it is appropriate to fix a term of 3 years.

It is intended to commence broadcasting simultaneously through all 4 transmitters but, to allow some flexibility, we fix 3 months as the period within which all 3 relay stations must be operating. As Mr Vernall requested relay stations may be added to the warrant for pocket translators in the Bay of Islands should the applicant seek to provide between coverage.

The exemptions from the technical rules will be granted but the usual condition will be inserted in the warrant.

(n) All relevant evidence or representations received by it at the hearing.

> A submission opposing newspaper shareholding was received and the points made have been dealt with earlier.

(o) Such other matters as may be prescribed in regulations in that behalf.

Regulation 15A as inserted by Regulation 5, Broadcasting Regulations 1977, Amendment Number 5, S.R. 1981/295

Regulations 1977, Amendment Trainest States and radio reads:
"15A(1) In considering any application for a sound radio warrant in respect of an AM broadcasting station or an FM broadcasting station the Tribunal, before determining whether to grant the application, shall have regard to the policy of the Government under which a frequency modulation broadcasting service is to be developed as an integral part of sound radio broadcasting in New Zealand.

(2) Nothing in this Regulation limits the provisions of paragraphs (a) to (n) of section 80 of the Act.

The application is consistent with Government policy for the development of FM stations. It is also consistent with the policy of the Government set out in the direction of the Minister of Broadcasting dated 27 October 1981.

Decision

We have no doubt that the desirability of this service outweighs the only outstanding disadvantage, the reduction of revenue to the Corporation.

We believe that reduction will not be as large as the Corporation fears. The limitation on the advertising minutes per hour will tend to provide some limitation on the competition it can offer Radio Northland while still permitting the new station to be viable.

The application is granted subject to conditions.

Conditions

The initial term of the warrant will be 3 years.

The usual conditions will be inserted in the warrant. The warrant will lapse unless it is taken up within 12 months of the date of this decision or of the date of the final determination of any appeal unless extended by the Tribunal.

The following conditions will be imposed:

- 1. Advertisements shall not be broadcast after 6 a.m. on Sundays, on Christmas Day, on Good Friday and on Anzac Day. When Anzac Day does not fall on a Sunday, advertising is also permitted from 1300 hours to 2400 hours.
- 2. Advertising will be limited to a maximum of 8 minutes in any clock hour.
- It is a condition of the warrant that relay stations be established and co-sited at Horokaka, Hikurangi and Maungataniwha within 3 months of the commencement of broadcasting. Transmission from Maungataniwha by a 2 kW transmitter will be authorised but will be subject to review at the end of 2 years. The coverage objectives will be modified until the full facility can be provided. Leave is given to make submissions on the wording and description of the interim and final coverage areas.
- 4. Subject to approval by the Post Office the warrant holder may establish such pocket translators as relay stations as may be desirable to extend or improve the coverage in the Bay of Islands. The location frequency and power will have to be approved by the Tribunal for endorsement on the warrant.
- 5. The warrant holder shall, unless exempted by the Tribunal, conform to and maintain the technical standards and rules as formulated by the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand in consultation with the Independent Broadcasters Association (N.Z.) Inc., including the furnishing of such technical returns as may from time to time be required by these rules and standards.

(The Tribunal grants the applicant the exemptions sought from the technical standards and rules for a period of 2 years from the date of issue of the warrant. An application for extension of exemptions should be made 1 month before that period expires.)

6. The mixed polarisation to be used will be slant.

Allocation of frequency will be made after the parties have had the opportunity to make any representations to the Tribunal.

7. The undertaking by the applicant to enter into a deed to guarantee editorial independence of the station on the same terms as approved for the Independent Broadcasting Co. Ltd. if required by the Tribunal will be incorporated in the warrant as a condition.

- 8. There will be a prohibition on networking in terms of section 71a (3) but with an exception as provided in most private warrants. This permits networking news.
- 9. Any prospectus to be issued by the applicant will require the prior approval by the Tribunal as to any references to the Tribunal and the grant of the warrant.
- 10. The warrant holder shall not substantially depart from the basic format and content of its proposed programmes or the type or the extent of the services intended to be provided at the time of the grant of the warrant without the prior consent of the Broadcasting Tribunal and subject to any conditions that the Tribunal might impose in the public interest.
- 11. A condition limiting news media company shareholding to 30 percent of the warrant holder will be in the form recently adopted by a number of stations.

The warrant will be issued when the station is ready to commence broadcasting.

M. J. Henshall was co-opted as a person whose qualifications and experience were likely to be of assistance to the Tribunal in determining the applications. He took part in the hearing and the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision is that of the permanent members.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 1984

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

General Accounting Policies

The measurement base adopted in the preparation of these accounts is that of historical cost modified by the revaluation of land and buildings. Reliance has been placed on the fact that the Trusteebank Southland is a going concern. Accrual accounting is used in the matching of expenses and revenue.

Particular Accounting Policies

Recognition of Income

Income reported in the profit statement was earned in the current income year and interest includes the amortisation of premiums and discounts on the purchase of Government and Local Authority

Interest earned from personal loans is taken into account using the rule of 78 method of allocation.

Depreciation

Fixed assets, except the data processing equipment, are depreciated by applying rates approved by the Inland Revenue Department including first year allowance where applicable.

Data processing equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis at rates estimated to write off the cost of the assets over their useful

The difference between the policy adopted and the straight-line basis for all assets is not considered to be material.

Principal rates used are-

Building 1% to 2% cost price Furniture, fittings and 10% to 20% diminishing value equipment 14% cost price. Data processing equipment

As the revaluation of buildings was effected as at 31 March 1984, depreciation has been calculated on the cost of the assets at 31 March 1983 and subsequent additions during the year.

Valuation of Assets

All current assets and investments are shown at cost with the Government and Local Authority Stock.
Government and Local Authority Stock is valued at cost, adjusted by the amortisation of premiums or discounts on purchases, calculated on a yield basis, over the terms of the stock.

Taxation

Provision for taxation against profits is the estimated expense relating to the results for the year.

Provision for deferred taxation relates to timing differences on accrued interest income, amortisation of premiums, depreciation and profits and losses on the sale of New Zealand Government Stock.

Changes in Accounting Policies

Land and buildings which were previously shown as cost (less depreciation for buildings) have been revalued this year to an independant valuation by a registered public valuer as at 31

The increase in the value of land and buildings on the book value at 31 March 1984 has been shown as part of Reserve Funds.

2. Provision for Deferred Maintenance

The provision of \$164,923 at 31 March 1983 to cover part of the cost of the redevelopment of the Don Street frontage of the Invercargill Branch has been credited against expenses as the redevelopment is now complete.

A provision of \$100,000 has been made in this year's Profit and Loss Account for the upgrading of the Gore premises which will be completed in the 1985 financial year.

3. Deferred Taxation

Deferred Taxation arises because of timing differences in respect of the increase in interest accrued \$153,664, the sale of Government Stock \$100,253, amortisation of premiums \$93,562 and depreciation \$6382.
