As a result of the establishment first on a temporary basis and then permanently of a stereo FM transmitter for the Concert Programme at Mount Erin, 2ZK had ceased this relay service. The Tribunal authorised by means of short term authorisations, the broadcasting of advertising programmes between 5 p.m. and midnight. This course was opposed by Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd.

The Corporation now sought to make the change permanent.

In a decision dated 24 August 1984 (Decision No. 18/84) the Tribunal gave its reasons:

"2ZK had rebroadcast the Concert Programme in the evenings and on Sundays and this service was not needed with the establishment of the FM stereo service from Mount Erin. The Corporation intimated that it had plans to apply for that station to extend its commercial hours which at present cease at 5 p.m. on weekdays. Radio New Zealand applied for an authorisation to permit advertising during the Monday to Saturday hours on which the Concert Programme had previously been broadcast. As far as the 2ZK application is concerned, the Tribunal was in effect permitting advertising. If the Tribunal had refused the application the station would not have rebroadcast the non-commercial programme with the BCNZ. In fact, for programme purposes, it is clear the station would have continued to broadcast a popular music programme without commercials. We do not see that that situation in the short term was of any advantage to other stations."

The correct course to be followed, the Tribunal said, was for the Corporation to await the YC decision and then to have applied for an amendment to the 2ZK warrant. That application is now being considered.

This application was heard in conjunction with an application by Radio Hawkes Bay (BRO. 90/84) and by consent the evidence adduced in respect of each application was available for consideration in the other case.

In support of the application E. B. Pike, manager of station 2ZK, claimed the Corporation now provided listeners with a range of programme choices comparable with those which it offers in the three main centres. The cost of providing these services has to be met largely from revenue. The costs referred to are about \$89,000 for the extra hours of local transmission and the cost of the Concert Programme transmission at Hawkes Bay at \$50,000 per annum.

Allowing advertising in the evenings has resulted in an estimated income of about \$93,000.

Opposition to the application came from the Independent Broadcasters' Association in a written submission claiming that the station had developed into a ZM type of operation without having the desirability of its service tested before the Tribunal. The Independent Broadcasters' Association considered the use of the authorisations to establish its case for advertising was a misuse of the short term authorisation procedure.

The Tribunal had rejected an application from Radio Hawkes Bay for a commercial AM warrant but had later granted an FM warrant to Radio Hawkes Bay which almost doubled the amount of commercial time available on radio in Hawkes Bay within 12 months.

G. W. Parsonage giving evidence for Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd, pointed out the potential advertising revenue which could be obtained from the maximum advertising time permitted, even though the station limits the commercial content below that level. Mr Parsonage claimed that certain undertakings were given as to the target audience and these have not been kept by 2ZK. These allegations were denied by the Corporation.

Radio Hawkes Bay considered that the programme material should be different, that it would be an opportunity to provide a service to a significant number of Maori people in Hawkes Bay and to provide material for other suitable programmes for the times vacated by the Concert Programme.

Mr Pike denied that the format was inconsistent and said that the format had been discussed at the Hawkes Bay FM application and that the same format had now been broadcast for two years. He gave details of average selling rates and said there had been no change of rates. He said that the station's target audience was 20-23 and it had previously been 25-54. He said the station had not been much affected by Radio Hawkes Bay and it was still a community station.

The station had simply been repackaged in February 1984 and the station had to establish that it broadcast something other than the Concert Programme in the evenings. He said that 2ZK led in the 10-25 age group and was second in the 33-46 age group. In some respects it was like ZM in that it had more music than talk but it was not true that it was a ZM station rather than a community station. Mr Parsonage agreed that although 2ZK had been broadcasting commercials in the evenings during the period, Radio Hawkes Bay may nevertheless exceed its estimates for the first year.

Mr Pike pointed out that Bay City Radio had been the station most affected by 93 FM, that 2ZC had dropped 14 points, 2ZK 3 points, the National Programme 2 points, which accounted for the 19 points increase of Radio Hawkes Bay.

The Tribunal has no jurisdiction to direct the Corporation as to the format to be adopted on 2ZK. It cannot require any other material to be broadcast. It has authority only to decide whether or not there will be advertising during the hours vacated by the Concert Programme.

As has been said already, we cannot see that forbidding advertising during this period would necessarily be of great assistance to Radio Hawkes Bay when it might have to compete even more for audience against 2ZK which it says is providing head-on competition. On the AM station there would be no advertising and on 93 FM there would be.

Clearly the only options available to the Tribunal are to refuse the application or to grant it, with or without conditions. There was no case put for the granting of the application with conditions.

The Tribunal considers the applicant has made a case to gain some revenue in return for additional services offered in the area. It is not satisfied that the additional revenue will adversely affect Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd. (It has been able to do very well in its initial trading). But if that did prove to be the case it would be better dealt with by increasing the revenue potential of Radio Hawkes Bay than by forcing the applicant into a period without commercials without the Tribunal being able to direct the nature of the programming, if it should wish to do so.

The application is granted.

DECISION

Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd. sought an amendment to the warrant to increase from 6 minutes to 8 minutes the maximum advertising content per hour.

The applicant submitted—

1. The present limitation was unsatisfactory for an adequate advertising service to clients.
2. The limitation caused difficulty at peak advertising times.
3. No limitation of advertising time of a similar nature applied to holders of FM warrants in metropolitan centres.
4. The FM warrant issued to Radio Waikato Ltd. contained a limit of 8 minutes per hour.
5. No detriment would be suffered by either of the other two commercial radio stations operating in the district.

The FM warrant for Hawkes Bay was granted in a decision of the Tribunal dated 31 August 1983.

The application had been opposed by the Corporation which sought a limit on the advertising minutes permitted per hour to protect the Corporation's existing commercial revenue for the stations 2ZC Napier and 2ZK Hastings. The applicant had been willing to adopt a self-imposed limit of 8 minutes per hour.

The Tribunal had to consider the effect on the Corporation and on the revenue of the stations already operating in the area. The Tribunal considered that the effect on the Corporation would be to the order of \$150,000 in the first year and the Tribunal considered that this was not so significant as to outweigh the benefit of the provision of a popular commercial stereo FM broadcasting programme service in Hawkes Bay.

The Tribunal said (at page 4):

"The Tribunal acknowledges however that at least in the initial stages some consideration should be given to limiting the effect.

"The Tribunal has had regard to the case made by the Corporation and in particular in the evidence made by G. M. L. Storry.

"The Tribunal has considered the evidence given and the confidential figures supplied by the Corporation. We accept there will be additional costs as well as an effect on the revenue of the Corporation. But we do not believe there will now be a potential to obtain substantial additional revenue well beyond target which Mr Storry feared, because it would exacerbate the economic effect on the Corporation's stations. The condition as to advertising content will limit that.

"Overall we considered the desirability of the service outweighs the economic factors raised by the Corporation."

At page 7 the Tribunal considered the extent of advertising matter which the applicant proposed to broadcast.

"A self-imposed limit of 8 minutes advertising per hour is proposed by the company which it says would enable it to reach its income projections. There is no reason to suspect that the station would depart from this, but programme rules at present permit advertising of up to 18 minutes per hour. Commonly AM stations broadcast up to 12 minutes per hour.

"The Tribunal considers that an adequate revenue can be obtained by limiting advertisements to 6 minutes in any 1 hour and a condition to this effect would limit the impact on the other stations. This will only affect peak time revenue but will assist Radio New Zealand stations. The applicant could reconsider its proposed rates for advertisements."

The station commenced broadcasting during December 1983. The application to amend the warrant was filed about 6 months later on 15 June 1984.

Evidence was given by G. W. Parsonage and M. L. Ballantine.

This application was heard in conjunction with an application by the Corporation in relation to 2ZK and by consent the evidence adduced in respect of each application for amendment was available for consideration in the other case. This course was adopted to save unnecessary repetition of evidence in chief and of cross-examination.

The applicant did not put forward a dearth of revenue or hardship in support of its application. What the applicant said was that the restriction had gone on for long enough and it should only apply for a few months while the station is starting broadcasting. It also said that it had now developed to the level where most weeks in the month the station was fully sold in peak zones—6 to 10 a.m. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and 10 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday and Thursday and from 7 to midnight on Thursday. Other zones on Tuesdays and Saturdays were said to be usually fully or heavily sold.

We heard a considerable amount of evidence about the high advertising content of the Corporation stations and allegations that 2ZK was endeavouring to direct its format towards the same audience as the applicant's station 93 FM. The applicant also claimed that it needed to spend more money for advertising and promotion. The applicant's case was that it pitched its prices at the highest level possible.

We can sum up this evidence as saying that the company could increase its revenue considerably by having more time to sell during peak hours. Mr Parsonage agrees that, in hindsight, the imposition of the condition has been good for the establishment period as the low commercial content has created an opportunity for a greater amount of programme content to be broadcast so that music and announcer comment reaches 46 minutes 45 seconds.

The figures on a monthly basis showed that while the breakfast session was fully sold, there was still room for further sales in the 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to midnight.

Those figures were supplied on a confidential basis.

Mr Parsonage confirmed that the station would operate profitably in the first year but would earn nothing like a 10 percent return on capital. In opposition, Mr Hudson for the Corporation, said that the applicants had failed to make a case and that there were inconsistencies in their evidence. For example they claimed that the advertising rate from 2ZK was too low but on the evidence of the manager of 2ZK, Mr Pike, that was not the case. FM stations hold their audiences longer during the day and are better able to spread their advertising than AM stations. There was a lack of financial evidence of any substance and the revenue figures were begrudgingly introduced.

Although the justification for the application was to obtain funds for promotion, the exact nature of such promotion was not put forward and its purpose was to promote the station not FM as such:

The Tribunal has considered the case and had decided that the application is, to say the least, premature. The Tribunal did not impose the condition with a view to it being lifted in a few months. The station is making a profit which is a happy result in the first year. If, after several years, ("the early stages") it was clear that the station was unable to obtain an adequate return for its shareholders or there were other appropriate reasons, the Tribunal would be prepared to reconsider the limitation imposed.

However, the reasons must be recalled. The purpose of the limitation was to limit the effect on the BCNZ's revenue. The effect therefore must be to limit the revenue of Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd.

The Tribunal has had to have regard to the effects on the Corporation of a number of new stations opening.

The situation in the Waikato was not comparable and the limitation imposed there is not applicable in Hawkes Bay.

In the more varied market in the metropolitan areas, the FM stations have not had any limitation imposed where there is more than one FM station operating in each area.

If the Tribunal found that the Corporation was taking an unfair advantage of the situation and pitching some of its rates very low in order to unfairly compete with the FM station, the Tribunal might reconsider the position. The Tribunal did not consider that the evidence produced convinced it of the need to alter the present limitation now.

The application is declined.

REASONS FOR DECISION

The applicant's governing director, J. C. Burnside, was to have overall responsibility for the establishment of the station which was to be managed by Paul Harrisman who worked with Radio Taupo, Goldfields Radio and other stations. Mr Burnside is a journalist working for the Taupo Weekender. He said the aim of the station was to promote Taupo. It would provide an alternative station for both visitors and residents of Taupo.

It was proposed to broadcast from 4 December 1984 to 28 January 1985 from 6 a.m. to midnight, Monday to Friday and for 24 hours on Saturdays and Sundays. The music was to be commercial popular music through to classics. The company was to be funded by \$8,000 cash on hand to cover initial expenditure, but it was expecting that advertising revenue of \$50,000 would cover total costs of \$44,000, including wages for five staff of \$8,000.

Radio New Zealand submitted that the application should be refused. It was an attempt by an entrepreneurial group who saw short term broadcasting as a quick way to make money with scant consideration for the long term effect on the radio listener. It suggested that the Tribunal should examine the quality and nature of the proposed alternative station. The family programme offered was of a programme music mix which was unlikely to succeed and the information segments offered less than those already provided by IZA Taupo.

Taupo at present has a choice of IZA and a National Programme repeater, IYT, both of which broadcast 24 hours a day for 365 days a year.

The Corporation submitted that with an investment of only \$8,000 the applicant would wrest \$50,000 from the available Taupo advertising pool. It was anticipated that the applicant would have to take a large proportion of the revenue from the existing Radio New Zealand service to earn \$1,042 per commercial day.

The Corporation said that 25 percent of the annual income for their station IZA, was taken during the peak holiday period, December and January.

The Corporation had experienced short term authorisations previously. They had had an effect on the Corporation's returns from the Taupo station.

Decision

The Tribunal was given no confidence from the applicant's supporting material and additional material sent later that the operation would be satisfactorily conducted. No specific experience, for instance, was stated for the manager.

The Tribunal does not accept from the programming material supplied that a successful format had been devised or that the station would provide so desirable an alternative service that it ought to be granted an authorisation despite the effect on the Corporation.

The revenue implications were considerable for the Corporation and the Tribunal would want to be satisfied that the merits of the application outweighed the disadvantages accruing to the Corporation's revenue.

The Tribunal has given a number of decisions on this type of application. Those who apply should not regard the matter as an automatic right and should consider the factors the Tribunal is required to take into account and those which it has referred to in past decisions.

For instances, the applicant wishes to broadcast from 3 December. The Tribunal has made it clear in other decisions that it would be unlikely to grant an application for commercial broadcasting before 17 December. This would make the economics of the proposition at least doubtful.

The Tribunal does not consider the applicant had made out a case for the grant of the short term broadcasting authorisation.

The application was declined.

INTERIM DECISION

THE applicant applied for amendments to the warrant for 2YC. The station under warrant AM-7 is used principally to originate the Concert Programme in medium frequency transmissions from 1YC Auckland, 3YC Christchurch and 4YC Dunedin and through some National Programme transmitters in other areas for short periods. Three amendments were applied for:

1. To provide for the establishment of frequency modulation relay stations of 2YC on the VHF band at Waiaatarua, Te Aroha, Mt Erin, Wharite, Mt Egmont, Kaukau, Sugarloaf, Mt Cargill and Hedgehope. These are the television transmission points chosen for FM broadcasts to Auckland, the Waikato, Hawkes Bay, Manawatu, Taranaki, Wellington, Canterbury, Dunedin and Southland respectively.

2. To remove the present ban on advertising programmes and to provide for advertising provided it does not exceed 6 minutes per hour and subject to the usual condition preventing advertising during certain hours on Friday, Christmas Day, and Anzac Day and Sundays.

3. To authorise the progressive extension of the hours of transmission until the station broadcasts from 6 a.m. until midnight.

In support of the application the Corporation stated that the application was made as required by a direction to the Corporation from the Minister of Broadcasting dated 23 December 1982. A copy of that direction to the Corporation is annexed to this decision.

Relay Stations

The direction required the Corporation to apply for warrants for FM stations but the Corporation did not follow that course. It gave its reasons. In the development phase, the Corporation said, the transmitters would relay the existing YC-AM programme. The transmitters outside the 4 main centres were unlikely in the foreseeable future to originate local programmes on a local basis. The FM transmitters in the main centres were not expected to provide a service for all listeners who could receive the AM signal and the actual deficiency and methods of remedying them could not be established until the transmitters had been established in those centres.

The Corporation referred to a decision of the Tribunal which it said indicated that the Tribunal did not consider a warrant should be granted to a station which was not going to originate programmes in the area it served.

So the Corporation decided not to follow the direction but to provide the coverage to which the direction relates by means of the establishment of relay stations.

The application covered what the Corporation described as the "initial phase of development" which would cover 80 percent of the population by the end of 5 years. In the first year Mt Erin and Te Aroha, in the second year Waiaatarua and Hedgehope, in the third year Kaukau and Wharite, in the fourth year Mt Egmont and Sugarloaf and in the fifth year Mt Cargill.

The Corporation proposed to simulcast in the 4 main centres between the existing AM transmitters and the new proposed FM transmitters because they would not give comparable coverage in the primary coverage areas of the existing stations, particularly in Christchurch and Wellington.

The Corporation said that that was recognised by the direction which stated that simulcasting may be permitted to ensure continuity of service.

(The term simulcasting is used to describe the broadcast of the same programme on both AM and FM transmitters serving substantially the same areas simultaneously.)

Advertising

As to advertising it was stated that the amount of advertising would be limited and it was not intended that the station should become commercially viable. The expected revenue would only offset the cost of developing and maintaining the service. The nature of the programme, the composition and probable audience size and the fact that the programme would be networked would restrict the appeal to advertisers, and it was unlikely that any private organisation would ever seek to establish a comparable programme on a commercial basis.

The advertising would be likely to consist of a mixture of spot sales and programme sponsorship and would be limited to no more than 6 minutes in each hour. Placement would be dependent on the programme and would not interrupt accepted formats and conventions of continuity. The Corporation said the style, production and presentation of the commercials would be matched with the style and content of the surrounding programme.

The Corporation said programming policy would not be changed.

Applications were also made to amend the warrants for 1YC, 3YC and 4YC to allow advertising on those stations and to extend their hours.

It was revealed in the course of evidence by Miss Wakem, Controller of Programmes for Radio New Zealand, that it was not intended to simultaneously broadcast continuously between the YC-AM programme and the FM transmitters. The Corporation decided after the application had been lodged that it was inappropriate to transfer speech based programmes such as Sports Roundup, the education programmes and the broadcast of Parliament to the new medium. Those programmes would continue to be broadcast on the AM stations and separate programmes would be broadcast from the FM stations at those times.

In the interim phase at these times the FM station would either close down or would carry a sustaining concert music programme originating at the network centre. In addition, until there was provision for local breakouts from the FM network (for which there was no plan) the current schedule of local artists breakouts would continue to be carried on the AM transmitters in the 4 metropolitan centres.

Hearing

The Tribunal heard evidence from witnesses for the Broadcasting Corporation, from the Music Federation of New Zealand and the Friends of the Concert Programme.

A large number of written submissions were made, nearly all opposing the advertising proposals but many of them making no specific submissions on the other amendment proposals.

YC Network Content

Miss H. A. Young, manager of the Concert Programme, gave evidence of the present hours of transmission. The existing stations broadcast from 6 a.m. to 10.30 a.m. and from 5 p.m. until midnight, Monday to Thursday, from 6 a.m. to 10.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. until midnight on Friday, 8 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. to midnight on Saturday, and from 8 a.m. to midnight on Sunday.

In Hawkes Bay 2ZK join the network each weekday evening at 7 p.m., on Saturday at 5 p.m. and for the full day on Sunday. In Southland 4ZG join at 6 p.m. on Monday to Saturday inclusive and all day Sunday. On Saturday and Sunday evenings some other regional stations for the National Programme also join the network.

In addition the network is currently on the air for Sports Roundup for the summer months and sports commentaries are broadcast during the winter on Saturdays and Sundays plus the occasional mid-week match. The daytime sittings of Parliament are broadcast from 1YC and 4YC and pre-school and correspondence school programmes on the morning network.

The network is normally originated in Wellington, but it originates from Auckland on Saturday and Sunday mornings from 10.30 a.m. and each YC programme breaks out from time to time to broadcast concerts or cultural events of significance. On Sundays the 4 YC programmes break out between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. to broadcast local artists or ensembles who have not yet reached national status.

The Concert Programme (with its non-sports programmes) caters for an admittedly small but significant section of the population which no other station serves. From the areas of the country without the service the educated minority is also "a vociferous group unwilling to be fed majority audience programmes". The audience ratings are small compared with a mass audience but for those who listen to serious music to a significant degree it is an essential service.

The music, covering the entire history of composition, is the principal (approximately 75 percent) ingredient of the Concert Programme and includes both live and recorded music from New Zealand and abroad. The emphasis is on the standard repertoire, but specialist areas such as early music avant-garde, jazz and rock have their place in the overall content. However performances must be of the highest standard and the most authoritative available.

The Concert Programme acts as organiser and entrepreneur for other notable events when Radio New Zealand studios and the Symphony Orchestra studio in Wellington attract sizeable audiences and participants. The music department undertakes the commissioning of studio programmes from individuals and groups, commissions new works and relays (live or delayed) prestigious public performances including almost 100 percent coverage of concerts by the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, and soloists and chamber music groups brought from overseas to New Zealand by the Music Federation of New Zealand.

Spoken programmes including talks, interviews and documentaries which develop understanding of our society, and which are not tied to news or news support, make up 25 percent of the content. Programmes also look at overseas cultures for alternative ways, ideas and models and to develop understanding of them as our neighbours and trading partners. Special emphasis is given to New Zealand literature and the arts.

About 75 percent of the Concert Programme drama output is written by New Zealanders and this is played in addition to the best of overseas material, mainly from the BBC. Current affairs do not have a place on the programme, except occasionally as part of the spoken features output.

The station broadcasts both Radio New Zealand and BBC news. Miss Young summarised the whole Concert Programme as providing programmes of entertainment, information and education of the highest quality for discriminating listeners whose interests lie in specialist areas of the performing and literary arts and the whole body of human knowledge.

Extension of Hours

Miss Young said the extension of transmission hours would be progressive over a period of 5 years, and when the hours were increased in the period between 10.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. classical music would remain the principal ingredient of the programme, but lighter elements would be introduced from time to time, including music from the shows together with more specialised forms of music such as jazz and rock. At all times the best performances available would be drawn upon to ensure the highest possible standards of quality. Miss Young emphasises that it was not intended that the lightening of the programme content would in any way compromise the performance or technical standards. It was made clear in evidence that the lighter programming would occur only during the extended hours. The format of a 1 week broadcast (1 to 8 October) during National Music Week would be a guideline for future FM broadcasts.

Although live music and production of drama would continue in the FM stereo mode only a limited number of specialised spoken programmes would continue. Radio New Zealand and BBC bulletins would continue so that listeners did not have to turn to another network for that service.

Advertising Rules

Miss B. A. Wakem, Controller of Programmes for Radio New Zealand, emphasised that advertisements would require approval prior to broadcast over and above the standard approval procedures. She produced what was referred to as a set of house rules which read:

"All Rules established by the Broadcasting Rules Committee, together with any general Radio New Zealand House Rules on Advertising, will also apply to YC-FM. There will be the following additional provisions:

"1. All advertisements will require approval prior to broadcast and, because of the "different" sound of this network, particular care will be given with advice and approvals.

"2. The style and presentation of the advertising must be closely matched to the style and content of the surrounding programmes. They must reflect the intelligent way in which the programming is approached.

"3. To meet the needs of this particular audience, advertisements are to be informational rather than loosely emotive. They should concentrate on benefits to be derived from the product or service.

"4. While Radio New Zealand is prepared to consider any serious proposition from clients, it is likely that the only advertisements acceptable will be:

- * Announcer read in the normal YC-FM style
- * Without music of any type
- * Broadcast live (not pre-recorded)
- * Written or re-written by the Network, to achieve the necessary style

"Support:

"The writing or re-writing of advertising copy will be undertaken by the Network at no additional charge for Direct Clients and those using Advertising Agencies. The agreement of the client or agency will be sought before broadcast."

Friends of the Concert Programme

The Friends of the Concert Programme preferred that there be sponsorship type statements only and considered the 6 minutes an hour, proposed by the Corporation, too high a commercial content. Evidence was given by Dr W. G. Hopkins on behalf of The Friends of the Concert Programme ("the Friends") an Auckland based organisation, and submissions were also made by the Christchurch Friends of the Concert Programme and a number of other individuals and organisations opposing the advertising provisions.

Dr Hopkins said his organisation had over 5000 members and argued that the hearing was an appropriate forum to launch a complete and thorough examination of the future of non-commercial public radio in New Zealand. The Tribunal does not consider these applications, limited to specific amendments, provided the appropriate occasion for the sort of thorough going enquiry (encompassing also the non-commercial National Programme) which was sought by the Friends. Such an enquiry may well be desirable before fundamental changes are made, but we have to deal with the applications. Therefore some of the information produced by the Friends was not relevant to the hearing.

Dr Hopkins disputed the argument that advertising would help to maintain the existing service or fund the conversion to FM on the basis that the revenue obtained would be negligible compared with the Corporation's overall income. He considered the Concert Programme listeners were opposed to advertising which they found offensive and they would therefore not listen to a programme which included advertising. He feared that commercial pressure for ratings would downgrawde the programme's quality and that the application was the thin edge of the wedge for commercial encroachment in terms of the remaining public non-commercial radio services.

Members of the Friends were prepared to accept name-only credits for sponsorship for live or taped performances, but nothing more. Such sponsorship was acceptable to the Friends only if the revenue derived is paid to the artists, composers and performers and not to the Corporation.

Dr Hopkins advocated financing the FM concert network from the Corporation's surplus, a small temporary increase in the licence fee, a Government grant, a voluntary subscription or a Consumer Price Index linked broadcasting licence or annual Government grant.

He proposed that music, informed comment, drama, literature, and news programmes should be broadcast on FM. Parliament broadcasts to schools and sport should stay on AM. The daytime National Programme would be transferred to the new FM network, these programmes having a high musical content and being suitable for FM. While he would like to see the present quality of the Concert Programme maintained during extended hours of transmission on an FM network he would concede the interests of more people would be served for less cost if the weekday and Saturday afternoon National Programme was transferred to the FM network, which would allow Parliamentary schools and sports broadcasts to remain on AM.

Rural areas not yet receiving the Concert Programme should be first to receive the new FM network, and he submitted, when the existing programmes are converted to FM there should be a period of simulcasting for listeners who do not own or cannot afford FM receivers. Dr Hopkins was concerned about the lightening of the format. He pointed out the proposed rules for advertisements, described as "likely" not definite, were too loose. He was concerned that the Corporation was "prepared to consider any serious proposition from clients". He was also concerned about the updating of those rules. He considered that advertising would reduce the mana of the Concert Programme.

Dr Hopkins said the opposition should not be seen as selfish views of an egocentric Auckland based minority and that is why the group has prepared "A future for non-commercial public Radio New Zealand" in white paper or booklet form.

Other points made by objectors were that advertising of any kind is an anathema to the Concert Programme listeners. The Concert Programme, many claimed, is a sanctuary where it was possible to escape the commercial and social pressures predominating in society. Further requests for advertising would follow and the programmes would lose their unique character.

The Friends also proposed a re-constitution of the 2 networks (National and Concert) with switches of programme at different times between the AM and FM transmitters. The proposals were criticised by Miss Wakem. We doubt whether it is for us to consider such sweeping changes but if we did we would have to be convinced the result would be good radio.

Music Federation of New Zealand

The Music Federation of New Zealand ("the Federation") made its case through its president Mr D. M. Wylie. The Federation has 8000 members (subscribers) and many local societies and groups throughout the country from Kaitaia to Invercargill are affiliated. Its activities attract an audience of about 200 000 each year.

The Federation supported the extension of the Concert Programme network through its conversion to FM. For years it had been aware of the dissatisfaction arising from the limitation on satisfactory reception and it had made representations. If the only way to achieve the goal of extended coverage and improved reception was through restricted advertising then the Federation accepted that, provided the conditions proposed by the Corporation were fully adhered to. The Federation was greatly encouraged by what it described as the very clear statements in the opening address of the counsel for the Corporation, Mr O'Brien, about the style, production and presentation of commercials, that programme policy would not be changed, and that the YC stations would not be commercial stations in the sense usually understood in New Zealand. The Federation pointed out that the proposal was not for a commercialisation of the stations in the sense that that term is normally used.

Mr Wylie said that as a nationwide federation it had with much reluctance given this kind of qualified acceptance of the Corporation's proposals in order to given priority to those who at the present time either do not receive (or receive only in a limited and unsatisfactory way) the present Concert Programme. The fact that a Te Aroha transmitter could provide the Concert Programme to a population of over 300 000 in a Waikato Bay of Plenty area who do not at present receive the AM transmission was a significant increase in the service, and only in Wellington would the AM coverage be significantly greater than that provided by an FM service. The Federation doubted that the very limited advertising/sponsorship proposal would in fact attract any significant degree of revenue, but recognised the problem as a political one—the refusal of the Government to raise the licence fee for the last eight years.

The Federation said there appeared to be little case for opposing a FM network, the extension of the Concert Programme or opposing the notion that some priority ought to be given to providing the

service to major areas in New Zealand to which no AM service is satisfactorily provided at present.

Financial Considerations

Mr W. P. Foster, Director of Corporate Planning for the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand, said the BCNZ's financial objective was to achieve a return on assets generally not less than the average achieved by the public and private sector companies—about 10 percent. The rate of return on assets in 1981/82 had been 6.7 percent and in 1982/83 it has been 11.7 percent.

The improvement was assisted by the effect of the wage and price freeze. The surplus was \$16.4 million in 1982/83. He produced a funds statement from the 1982/83 report and an analysis of additional costs of income relating to the YC-FM development broken down by year.

The current operating surplus was being used in financing the higher capital programme being undertaken, additional debtors and stocks and initial payments for the Olympic Games.

Mr Foster pointed out that the Corporation had to look to its ability to meet the future cash flows arising from investment decisions, and whether future income could support the level of resulting operating costs. He pointed out that non-commercial services of the Corporation cost \$49.9 million last year while net licence fee income was \$33.9 million, the difference being made up from income from commercial operations. With the prospect of private sector competition in television, the Corporation could not plan on the basis of Television New Zealand continuing to contribute to the costs of non-commercial radio activities. The real value of the licence fee with no prospect of an increase was dramatically illustrated by its ratio with the total net income. In real terms it had dropped 37 percent over the last five years.

The increasing costs of the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra required a subsidy from licence fees of about \$4.3 million in the 1983/84 year. So the availability of income for non-commercial radio activities would be restricted to a share of the declining real licence fee and the surplus that could be earned by commercial radio.

Without growth in commercial income the BCNZ would have to cut back services or commercialise traditional non-commercial services. The development could not be supported on the income estimated by Radio New Zealand from only 6 minutes of limited sponsorship commercial advertising. The net value of the cost of the development, including extension to 18 hours a day, was \$5.2 million requiring an income of over \$600,000 per annum to make it possible to proceed with planned development.

The Corporation had however accepted that the whole of the development cost could not be recovered from advertising and was prepared to commit itself to carrying the rest.

There was confusion in the submissions made by the Friends who isolated liquidity at balance date and assumed that this was surplus to requirements and would be available for capital development. We are satisfied from Mr Foster's evidence that the basis of this submission is fallacious.

It is reasonable that increased revenue will be required to assist in the cost of capital development. We believe that the Corporation should be prepared to carry the programme costs which should not be significant burden.

Statutory Considerations

Section 81 (4) Broadcasting Act 1976 provides that the Tribunal may amend or revoke any of the terms or conditions of the warrant or add any new terms and conditions which in its opinion are necessary in the public interest.

In considering an application to amend a warrant section 78 (6) provides that the Tribunal shall have all the powers, duties and authorities conferred on it by this Act in respect of applications for new warrants, and the provisions of the Act and regulations as far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications apply accordingly.

Regulation 16 (2), Broadcasting Regulations 1977 (S.R. 1977/11) also provides that in considering any amendment or revocation of any of the terms or conditions of a warrant or the addition of any new terms or conditions under section 81 (4) the Tribunal shall have regard to such of the matters referred to in section 80 as are relevant.

Therefore, before determining whether or not to grant the applications, the Tribunal had regard to the following matters under section 80 Broadcasting Act 1976, so far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications accordingly.

(a) *The extent to which the proposed service is desirable in the public interest*

We revert to this consideration again later.

At present the YC transmissions provide a good service to only 60 percent of the population concentrated primarily in and around the four main centres.

It is part of the policy of the Government that the YC programme should be extended and the only opposition to this extension came from those who thought the development created the need for advertising on the programme and that was too high a price to pay. There were some listeners who are getting an adequate service from the YC-AM stations who would prefer to have no change at all.

Those people (and others) would prefer that the development be financed from licence fees. While the Tribunal has on a number of occasions indicated that it considers that to be desirable there is no indication that the licence fee will be increased for this purpose. The indications have been to the contrary.

Previously an application for advertising on the Sports Roundup programme broadcast on YC stations was made and declined, but the Tribunal indicated that an application could be made again should there be no increase in licence fees.

The Tribunal considers that the disadvantages of broadcasting advertising are outweighed by the advantages of this development. But the advertising should continue only for that purpose which will be completed in five years. At that stage the advertising should also stop.

The Tribunal does not consider that a proposal for subscriptions as a method of funding the YC programme is practicable or likely to produce any substantial sum. Nor is there any indication that there will be any other source of public funding.

(b) *The economic effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates is likely to have in respect of broadcasting stations already in operation*

A submission was made but no evidence was given suggesting adverse economic effect on other stations. In view of the nature of the advertising market aimed for, we consider that the effect will be minor. A much greater impact will be caused by the introduction of any new television stations with regional advertising potential.

Mr R. K. Wilkinson, Director of Sales and Marketing for Radio New Zealand, estimated that about one third of the \$400,000 revenue in the first full year would be drawn from public relations budgets. He considered it unlikely that any of the revenue would affect the income of existing private radio stations. The estimate was based on a 3 minutes per hour average.

(c) *The effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates may have on broadcasting services provided by the Corporation in the public interest*

The case for this application largely rests on two premises. One is that it can help provide the funds for development of the Concert Programme and secondly, that the Corporation would not otherwise be able to proceed at the same pace on the available funds. It therefore follows that failure to grant the application would have the effect of diminishing the development pace but not of affecting any other stations conducted by the Corporation. The extraction of revenue from the market is unlikely to have any significant effect on radio or television revenues.

(d) *The needs of New Zealand or the locality or localities proposed to be served, in respect of broadcasting service*

A very strong case has been put for the development of FM services for the Concert Programme. Many of the areas have devoted Concert Programme listeners who have to listen to the programme on less than adequate signal strength.

Based on the 1976 census the daytime coverage of the 4 YC stations would be 61.9 percent of the population. At night time it was estimated this could decrease to 55 percent as the result of interference from distant New Zealand or overseas stations on the same or adjacent channels.

This would be balanced by the coverage from 2ZK Hawkes Bay and 4ZG Southland which broadcast at night time and whose coverage area comprises 6.2 percent of the population.

One of the major benefits is of course the introduction of a quality stereo service both to areas which do not have any service at all at present and to those adequately covered by the AM service.

(h) *The requirement that frequencies be best utilised in the public interest*

A number of submissions, such as the Music Federation's advocated simulcasting until the FM network was completed.

The Corporation wishes to simulcast on the grounds that in some areas the coverage would not be exactly the same. The Tribunal starts from a different point and believes that there have to be some changes and a recognition that a small number of people may lose a good service and get a poorer one on FM because a larger number of people will benefit. Generally 2 transmitters and frequencies should not be used to provide the same programme to substantially the same audience.

While it is obvious that the removal of service from a small number of people at any time will be regarded unfavourably, we do not believe it is possible to justify in most areas a continuation of both AM and FM service. This is accentuated by the comparatively small number involved.

We believe that an argument for simulcasting cannot be sustained at all on the grounds that there are people who will not at present have the appropriate equipment. The availability of FM receivers in households is known to be increasing. We have no doubt that one effect of simulcasting is to postpone the day on which a decision is made to switch to FM. Simulcasting, we are satisfied, does not provide the incentive for change which the imminent loss of service on AM does.

While simulcasting for a short period at the time of changeover may be justifiable, or on a longer term basis in some areas where, as the ministerial direction contemplates, there is a necessity to provide continuity of service, because of different services areas, the reasons for the simulcasting should be made clear from the beginning. When, for instance, reasonable coverage is obtained on the FM network then the AM programme broadcasting should cease.

The difficulty is compounded by the Corporation's inability to plan for the full development of available frequencies, partly for financial reasons and partly because of the inherent corporate desire of the BCNZ to retain all existing frequencies for developing its own services, rather than to make them available for others.

Nevertheless there is a case for the continuation of YC programmes for sports, education and Parliamentary broadcasts—indeed in Auckland there is justification for YC programme broadcasting Parliament at night to provide a reasonable service, which is not available from 2YA.

This will require either short term authorisations or a warrant for the FM transmitters to carry separate programmes.

The Tribunal will therefore only consider simulcasting on a case by case basis where it is satisfied there are cogent reasons for continuing the service on both frequencies. It does not consider it appropriate to use 2 frequencies to serve one audience until the personal receiving equipment of all listeners has expired of old age and has been replaced by more modern equipment with VHF-FM capability.

The Ministers's direction that simulcasting may be permitted until the final establishment of the FM network is completed is interpreted as permissive and as an exception to the general policy. It is also seen as limited to allowing continuity of service to areas outside the immediate FM coverage area in the same city, not to provide a dual service for many years to those who could receive FM.

(j) *The hours during which the applicant proposes to broadcast programmes*

The Tribunal found the proposal to increase the hours vague and unsatisfactory. The Tribunal prima facie favours the extension of hours for a service but it would be presented with specific proposals and the hours proposed from time to time.

The Tribunal therefore in respect of this part of the application signifies a general approval but defers any amendment of the warrant until it has been satisfied by the submission of specific proposals for programme material and the hours proposed. It believes this is particularly important in view of the suspicions of many objectors that some watering down of the quality of the total service is behind the development.

(k) *The extent of advertising matter which the applicant proposes to broadcast*

The Tribunal agrees with the proposed 6 minute limit. As Mr O'Brien in his opening indicated this will produce in fact about 3 minutes (or slightly more) average advertising time per hour. Advertisers also will not consistently fill all the schedules.

Mr Wilkinson said the advertising would not alter the character of the programming. Advertising placement would not interrupt accepted conventions of continuity for musical works and live broadcasts. For example, if a relay of a concert were broadcast advertising would be confined to prior to the start and at the end.

The Tribunal agrees with the line taken by the Corporation as to the style and content of advertising and its relationship to the programme material. Material to be broadcast on Sports Roundup can be of a different nature than that broadcast during the Concert Programme.

The Tribunal has considered the in-house "rules" but when analysed they are seen to be guidelines of a fairly broad kind rather than a detailed set of rules.

The Tribunal has considered whether it should impose conditions as to advertising but has decided that it would be wrong to fix an exact definition. It simply imposes a condition limiting the total advertising to 6 minutes each clock hour and says that the format and style of advertising should be appropriate for the programme material at the time being broadcast.

(l) *The proposed rates and charges to be made in respect of advertising programmes*

At July 1983 Mr Wilkinson estimated the base rate to range from \$50 to \$20 with \$120 to \$80 for a sponsored hour of programming. The advertising would offer radio as a means of reaching an "upper demographic specialist national" audience.

(n) *All relevant evidence of representations received by it at the hearing*

The Tribunal received a large number of representations, and has read all of them. It has also heard lengthy evidence and submissions at its hearings. The Tribunal has been concerned that financial and economic pressures have forced the Corporation into a policy which has obviously upset a large proportion of its listeners to the YC network.

On the other hand the Tribunal does not consider that the programme material itself is inherently and fundamentally entitled to be free from association with any advertising material.

It is more likely that the reality of the objections lies in the nature of the YC music listener who tends to be a person less likely to receive commercial messages voluntarily. But it must be recalled that many of those who advised us that cricket was a sport with which it was quite impossible to have any commercial material associated will have to acknowledge that that has been done on television, and what is more, has been done without the enormous objection that occurred when it was proposed in relation to cricket radio commentaries.

What is clear however is that the advertising material and the nature and style of it needs to be carefully tailored to the programme material, and needs to respect the type of listener. It must also be recognised that some sacrifice in this respect might need to be made in order to allow people who live in areas not at present served to enjoy the programme so much admired and enjoyed by metropolitan listeners. The selfishness which underlay some of the submissions made to us, needs to be acknowledged.

On the other hand we consider the Music Federation of New Zealand's submission a thoughtful and positive one which was more concerned with the major priorities of establishing the Concert Programme on FM stereo throughout New Zealand rather than the personal tastes of the individual listeners, as far as advertising was concerned.

The stated purpose of permitting advertising was to provide revenue for use for capital development. The Tribunal has therefore indicated its intention not to permit the advertising to outlast the purpose. The maximum period justifiable would appear to be 5 years.

(o) *Such other matters as may be prescribed in regulations in that behalf*

The regulations require the Tribunal to have regard to the Government's policy for the development of FM broadcasting in New Zealand as an integral part of sound radio broadcasting. It is convenient to note here the statement of Government policy in the direction to the Corporation and the previous statements of Government policy contained in directions given by the Minister of Broadcasting. For convenience the ministerial directions will be appended to this decision.

The Tribunal has had to take account of Government policy anyway, simply because it is the policy of the Government not to increase the licence fee. That led to the policy to finance the development in part by advertising.

We take the point that we should not give equal weight to the ministerial direction on its own, and we do not give equal weight to it with the other factors under section 80. In some respects and in some aspects of the application the Government policy carries considerable weight. This is particularly so in relation to the extension of services to provincial areas and the extension of hours.

In others we have not been convinced that it is a factor which should outweigh other considerations.

(It is necessary to note, because it has been overlooked in the past, that Regulation 15A (Broadcasting Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 5, S.R. 1981/295) requires that the Tribunal have regard to the policy of the Government under which a FM broadcasting service is to be developed as an integral part of sound radio broadcasting in New Zealand. That policy becomes a section 80 consideration.)

We also note that the Corporation has adapted Government policy to its own objectives. Having recommended the policy it now decides not to adopt it, to resist conversion and to favour additional transmitters to add to those at present held by the Corporation.

The Issues

The applications fall into two major issues. To develop the network by FM transmission and to finance this in part by advertising. (The extension of hours has already been referred to.)

The proposal to advertise was hotly contested and is dealt with separately:

Network Development

The other proposals generally brought support from listeners to the Concert Programme but we noted a lack of enthusiasm by existing listeners in the main centres (as represented by Friends of the Concert Programme). Those who already had the programme on the existing AM service placed less importance on extending the

service. (There was even an element of elitism in the tone that was taken.) Those who were not receiving an adequate signal placed a far greater emphasis on the importance of developing the service beyond the reach of the existing metropolitan transmitters.

In fact the Corporation (correctly, in the view of the Tribunal) stressed the need to extend the YC service to major non-metropolitan areas rather than give priority to a conversion to a FM service in the metropolitan areas. In order to carry out this development it sought revenue from advertising. That we will deal with shortly.

At this stage however it is necessary to comment on the form of the application. The Corporation said its application was based on a direction from the Minister of Broadcasting. That direction was sought by the Corporation. The origins of the policy are clear.

It is also clear however that the purpose of Government policy was to see a conversion of the YC programme from AM to FM. For reasons which we suspect are based largely on the wish to retain the YC-AM transmitters, the Corporation has favoured both the relay station approach and simulcasting for extensive periods together with a retention of some elements of YC programming on YC-AM only rather than on YC-FM.

Furthermore, the Corporation has left its actual timetable vague both as to the development of new stations and the extension of hours.

To the extent that the applications are granted, it will necessarily be a condition of the grant that the Tribunal approve the precise proposed programme development for longer hours and the proposed dates for the establishment of relay stations.

It will also be a condition that the Tribunal specifically approve applications for simulcasting in each case in which the Corporation says it is required.

The Tribunal does not, on the basis of the information available at present, consider that simulcasting is necessary, for instance, in Auckland.

For the proper development of broadcasting, it is necessary that not only the broadcasters but also the listeners adapt to the necessary change.

We do not accept the argument that the YC audience is incapable, reluctant or unable to afford the change to the FM mode and given the long notice of impending changes we consider the Corporation should eschew simulcasting for those reasons.

The Corporation is at present opposing the use of the one spare AM frequency in Auckland because of future developments it wishes to make and also appears to want to retain the YC frequency for a considerable period partly for simulcasting there.

However, the Tribunal makes no final ruling on the matter, leaving it for a specific application to be made at the time when the applicant can state a date for the establishment of an FM transmitter in Auckland.

As far as Hawkes Bay and the Waikato are concerned, the application to establish the stations is granted, effective immediately.

The issue of simulcasting does not arise there, except in the sense that the YC programme from 2YC is inadequately received within the catchment area of the FM transmitter, which is at present operating on a short-term broadcasting authorisation.

The application amounts to permission to establish a network and as the priorities have varied and may vary in other ways from time to time according to factors which the Corporation might like to take into account, we think it is best that the procedure we propose should be followed.

Advertising

The Tribunal gave thorough consideration to an application for advertising in the Sports Roundup programme which is broadcast on the YC stations. (Decision 6/81) The Tribunal traversed at length the considerations which led it to decline that application. We do not intend to traverse in detail all the arguments that were carefully considered there. They have been taken into account in arriving at this decision.

It is however reasonable to refer to one part of the decision where we said on page 10:

"The Tribunal considers that the Corporation ought to consult the Government and determine whether or not there is an established policy as to the support of non-commercial broadcasting by means of licence fees in the future. It should be possible for the Government to indicate its general policy, either publicly or to the Corporation. The Corporation is entitled to have some indication of the Government policy on the extent of licence revenue it can anticipate in the next 5 years. The Corporation can then decide whether to make an application again within a short period in the knowledge of that policy or even in the knowledge that the Government is not prepared to establish a policy.

"If that is the case the Tribunal will be prepared to consider this application and any other application the Corporation puts forward to develop revenue to support non-commercial

radio broadcasting services. The Tribunal would consider this application in the light of the Corporation's statement of all the options open to it and the arguments it puts forward in following whatever course it chooses to adopt. Such an application could properly be made after March 1982."

It cannot be said that the Corporation or the Tribunal have rushed the matter. What can be said is that there is no policy appropriate for the development of commercial revenue and that we find that it is reasonable for the Corporation in all the circumstances to seek such revenue.

We do not intend to detail all the individual submissions which ranged from the protection of mental health to broad statements of philosophy. We record simply that many cogent arguments were put by those very many people, articulate and educated, who so value this programme in its present form. They were carefully weighed.

This aspect of the proposals caused considerable concern to the Tribunal, both from the programme point of view and the financial justifications. The Tribunal took some time over arriving at a decision, which it has not found easy. It has also had to take into account other applications that had been lodged and which would themselves have an economic effect on the Corporation. As the decisions have effectively been made in respect of those applications and will issue shortly after this application, the Tribunal considers itself in a better position now to make the decision than it would have been immediately upon the receipt of final submissions at the end of 1983.

The Tribunal has, with some reservations and conditions, decided to grant the application in relation to advertising.

The Tribunal considers that it is not in a position to establish the order of financial priorities which the Corporation should have within its own financial and programme planning.

What the Tribunal is entitled to do is to consider whether on the face of it the Corporation has assessed the situation and actually established some priorities, the effect of those decisions and their necessity or desirability. We do not think it is appropriate for the Tribunal to substitute its own view of the priorities, for instance, as between the development of the Concert Programme and the development of TV2 network.

Furthermore, the Tribunal does not have the evidence on which such matters could be based since no evidence is generally given by any Board member and the witnesses brought before us either have limitations relating to the service for which they work, either radio or television, or the office they hold if they are employed in the Corporation's central services.

It would be helpful to all concerned if there were some national guidelines or priorities established as a result of a broadcasting policy widely debated and accepted.

The Tribunal has detailed earlier some of the considerations in relation to section 80 of the Act.

Three points are clear.

First of all, it is agreed on all sides that the Concert Programme broadcast from the YC stations is of excellent quality judged by any world standards.

Secondly, it is accepted that in the normal course of events the Corporation would wish to retain this as a non-commercial service.

Thirdly, the Corporation has been denied increases in television licence fee (a proportion of which is available for radio) despite inflationary increases in costs. The Corporation has been subsidising its non-commercial activities from commercial surpluses earned by television or radio. Those surpluses are also used for capital development and for capital expenditure not covered by depreciation.

The Tribunal understands and sympathises with the objections that are made by listeners to the commercial intrusion into the type of programme in which they are so involved. But it does accept that there is a difference between the proposed commercial intrusion into this type of programme and a wholly commercial format which is the most popular type of broadcasting drawing the vast majority of listeners.

The Tribunal considers that the impact of advertising in the Sports Roundup programme would be far less. Having regard to its previous decision in that respect, a case can be made out more readily for utilising the Sports Roundup broadcasts for the gaining of commercial revenue than for the music programmes and other spoken content of the YC broadcasts.

The Tribunal accepts that the Corporation's proposed restrictions on advertising are reasonable. Advertising is to be limited to a maximum of 6 minutes per hour, not an average of 6 minutes. Because of the programme format, the nature of the advertising and the audience levels, a lower average amount of advertising per hour than is the case on "commercial" stations with a similar time restriction would be broadcast.

The Tribunal listened to a demonstration tape of the type of advertisements, which we must point out would also include

advertisements for the performances of organisations such as the Music Federation as well as more "commercial" advertisers. We believe that the advertisers attracted will tend towards institutional and image building advertisements and will not wish to offend the audience.

The Tribunal considered imposing a condition that incorporated the decisions already made by the Corporation as to the advertising format. But the so-called house rules are in some respects only an indication of what is "likely" to be acceptable.

Detailed rules should be passed. From our experience some Radio New Zealand staff are adept at finding ways around the spirit of their own rules. The rules should be clear and firm. But they are best left as house rules.

As the proposal is essentially to make 2YC the originating station for an FM network, it is appropriate to consider the imposition of a format condition, the Tribunal has decided that it is desirable in respect of what amounted to virtually new broadcasting stations that the format be established as that of the existing YC programme format and it will impose a condition that the FM broadcast be in accordance with the existing style and format of YC programme (with the addition of any limited advertising) and that the format for any extended hours be in accordance with the proposals made to the Tribunal and the evidence given to it by the Corporation's witnesses.

There was some argument before us as to the power of the Tribunal to impose any such conditions. We say first that we consider it necessary to have this condition as it is a requirement of section 81 that any new condition imposed on a warrant be necessary in the public interest. We consider it is necessary, not for the purpose of continuing the 2YC AM programme, but because it is originating the FM programmes for what amounts to new stations which are initially being established as relay stations and will together constitute an extensive major network.

The desirability of the condition we have already discussed. It is essential that the position be clearly defined in the warrant in the public interest.

The legality of such a condition was challenged by Mr O'Brien on the basis that it infringed section 71A(1)(e), Broadcasting Act 1976 which permits conditions if they are not in conflict with the provisions of the Act imposing duties or conferring powers on the Corporation. His argument was that the Corporation has a duty under section 24(1)(a) to provide a range of programmes which will cater in a balanced way for the varied interests of different sections of the community. Therefore any warrant condition, he submits, would be in conflict with the duty and power of the Corporation.

In support of that he points to the different statutory provision for private broadcasters who do not have this obligation. Mr O'Brien submitted that the duty was on the Corporation, not on the Tribunal. The Corporation should decide what the range of programmes should be.

As Mr Giles, for the IBA, has put it, the latter argument takes the matter no further. In fact we consider it points up the fact that this obligation is on the Corporation *as a whole*—not on an individual station nor on each service. Therefore it is possible to restrict the format of any particular station by condition imposed by the Tribunal to ensure that that programme is maintained on that station and that is the only effect. Or it may simply ensure the Corporation carries its obligation to do what it has promised to do at the hearing. It does not conflict with the Corporation's duties. We cannot see that this sort of condition prevents the Corporation from carrying out its tasks and the condition can hardly conflict with the Corporation's duties. It may affect how it carries out its duties.

It is always open to the Corporation to apply for an amendment if circumstances change and it desires to fulfil its statutory function another way.

In view of the fact that the expected advertising revenue of some \$400,000 estimated per annum is being raised solely to assist in the development of the FM network, we do not consider it appropriate to leave the condition open-ended as to time. We note that the Corporation relied solely on this needs for funds for development as the basis for the application. We do not therefore intend that the advertising be permitted indefinitely.

It may also be that conditions will change and the Corporation will no longer require the advertising from this source or may not require it to the same extent.

The Tribunal's condition as to advertising will therefore state that the advertising is to continue until December 1985 and for such further period or periods as the Tribunal may determine but not beyond 31 August 1989. This will also provide an opportunity for any objections to the format or style of advertising to be voiced and may encourage restraint.

Decision

The Tribunal indicates its approval for the FM development plan prepared by the Corporation.

The Hawkes Bay (Mt Erin) and Waikato (Mt Te Aroha) applications are granted.

The other applications will have to be submitted to the Tribunal with specific timetables and proposals for any simulcasting.

The application for advertising is approved on the following terms:

- (a) Advertising shall not exceed 6 minutes in each clock hour.
- (b) Except during the times when the station is broadcasting Parliament or broadcasts to schools, advertising is permitted during the hours of broadcast, until 0600 hours on Sundays, Good Friday, Christmas Day and Anzac Day. Where Anzac Day does not fall on Sunday, advertising is also permitted from 1300 hours to 2400 hours.
- (c) The approval is effective until 31 December 1985 or to such extended date or dates as the Tribunal may from time to time approve at the request of the warrant holder but not later than 31 August 1989.

In view of Miss Wakem's evidence that it is not intended to broadcast continuously the same programme on 2YC and the FM transmitters, it will be necessary for the Corporation to apply for short term authorisations for the separate FM programmes or for warrants.

The following condition will apply to 2YC's warrant:

The warrant holder shall not substantially depart from the basic format and content of its present programmes or the type or extent of the services provided at the time of the amendment of the warrant without the prior consent of the Broadcasting Tribunal and subject to any conditions that the Tribunal might impose in the public interest provided that for any extended hours approved the format and content shall be in accordance with proposals made to and approved by the Tribunal.

It does not appear necessary to impose the condition on the warrants of 1YC, 3YC and 4YC as there is no intention to have them depart from the 2YC format.

Application for extended hours is approved in principle but the specific hours and dates of commencement must be submitted with programme formats.

NOTE: The application did not include any provision for advertising on National Programme stations during relays of the YC programme.

Direction to Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand in Connection with the Development in New Zealand of a Frequency Modulation (FM) Broadcasting Service

To the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand

WHEREAS the Minister of Broadcasting (by a notice which was dated the 27th day of October 1981* and which was given pursuant to section 68(1) of the Broadcasting Act 1976) gave the Broadcasting Tribunal notice, inter alia, that it is part of the general policy of the New Zealand Government in relation to broadcasting—

- (a) That a frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting service be developed as an integral part of sound-radio broadcasting in New Zealand; and
- (b) That frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting be introduced in New Zealand without delay; and
- (c) That the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand should, by the use of frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting, extend its Concert Programme to provincial areas in which radio reception of that programme is not at present satisfactory; and
- (d) That the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand should, as its resources permit, progressively convert the YC stations (which are the stations from which its Concert Programme is transmitted) to frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting.

And whereas I have been advised by you that worthwhile progress by you in the development of the YC stations on the basis of frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting can only be assured if some of the costs are offset by commercial YC revenue gained by a combination of sponsorship and a limited level of advertising:

Now, therefore, pursuant to that advice and section 20(1) of the Broadcasting Act 1976 (as enacted by section 4 of the Broadcasting Amendment Act 1982), I, Ian John Shearer, the Minister of Broadcasting,—

- (1) Give you notice that it is part of the general policy of the New Zealand Government in relation to broadcasting that the development and operation of the YC stations on the basis of frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting be financed, in part, by the introduction of advertising on the YC stations; and

(2) In pursuance of the general policy set out in my said notice dated the 27th day of October 1981 to the Broadcasting Tribunal paragraphs (a) to (d) of which notice are set out in the preamble to this notice) and in pursuance of the general policy set out in clause (1) of this notice, direct that you, the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand, shall—

- (a) Apply to the Broadcasting Tribunal for warrants for FM stations for the purpose of enabling the coverage of the YC stations to be extended beyond the four main centres and of enabling the progressive conversion of the existing YC stations of FM; and
- (b) Without delay make an application to the Broadcasting Tribunal for the amendment of the terms and conditions of the sound-radio warrants that you hold in respect of the YC stations so that—
 - (i) Advertising content, of not more than 6 minutes per hour, may be permitted on each of the YC stations; and
 - (ii) A progressive extension of the hours of transmission over the YC stations may take place with a view to those hours being, at the end of that progression, from 6 a.m. to midnight; and
 - (iii) Simulcasting (to ensure continuity of service on the existing YC-AM network) may be permitted until the final establishment of the YC-FM network is completed.

Direction to Broadcasting Tribunal in Connection with the Development in New Zealand of a Frequency Modulation (FM) Broadcasting Service

to the Broadcasting Tribunal

IN PURSUANCE to section 68 (1) of the Broadcasting Act 1976, I, Warren Cooper, the Minister of Broadcasting—

- (1) Give you notice that the Government has considered your report to me on the Development of Frequency Modulation Broadcasting in New Zealand; and
- (2) Give you notice that it is part of the general policy of the New Zealand Government in relation to broadcasting—
 - (a) That a frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting service be developed as an integral part of sound-radio broadcasting in New Zealand; and
 - (b) That frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting be introduced in New Zealand without delay; and
 - (c) That the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand should, by the use of frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting, extend its Concert Programme to provincial areas in which radio reception of that programme is not at present satisfactory; and
 - (d) That the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand should, as its resources permit, progressively convert the YC stations (which are the stations from which its Concert Programme is transmitted) to frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting; and
 - (e) That short-term frequency modulation (FM) broadcasting authorisations be authorised under section 76 of the Broadcasting Act 1976 for community purposes; and
 - (f) That, outside the larger urban areas, local groups should be encouraged to establish locally owned radio broadcasting stations (on a commercial or non-commercial basis or on a basis that is partly commercial and partly non-commercial) to relay programmes from other warrant holders as well as to develop some elements of local broadcasting for limited periods; and
 - (g) That the development envisaged in paragraph (f) of this clause should be facilitated by networking arrangements that permit local programming as well as a choice of network programmes; and
 - (h) That except where, without simulcasting, an economically viable service to an area would not be feasible for many years and except as provided in paragraph (i) of this clause, simulcasting by AM and FM stations covering the same areas should not be permitted; and
 - (i) That simulcasting of news, current affairs, special events, and simulcasting with television should be permitted; and
 - (j) That holders of warrants in respect of existing stations shall be permitted to hold warrants or interests in warrants in respect of FM broadcasting stations; and
 - (k) That applications by newspaper companies for sound-radio warrants in respect of FM broadcasting stations should be considered on their merits together with applications of other applicants; and

(3) Give you notice that, included within the recommendations in respect of which the Government has still to formulate its general policy, are the recommendations set out on pages 11 to 15 of your report and numbered (2), (9), (43), (45), (46), (47), (55), (56), (57), (58), and (59); and

(4) In pursuance of the general policy of the Government as outlined in clause (2), direct that you shall,—

- (a) Call without delay for applications for sound-radio warrants in respect of 2 commercial frequency modulation broadcasting stations to be established in Auckland; and
- (b) Invite prospective applicants for sound-radio warrants in respect of commercial frequency modulation broadcasting stations to be established in areas outside Auckland to file with you notice of intention to apply for such warrants; and
- (c) After considering any representations made by prospective applicants, establish the order for warrant hearings having regard to the notices of intention received; and
- (d) Thereafter call progressively for applications for sound-radio warrants in respect of commercial frequency modulation broadcasting stations to be established in areas outside Auckland; and

(5) In pursuance of that policy, direct that you shall, in carrying out the direction contained in clause (4), note that—

- (a) Frequency modulator broadcasting should be developed first in the band 88–93 MHz, and then in the band 94–100 MHz as other services are cleared; and
- (b) The frequency assignment plan, which is to be based on 50 kHz channel spacing, is to be prepared and maintained by the Post Office; and
- (c) Channel spacing is to be reviewed in 1986; and
- (d) It is to be a principle, in relation to the frequency assignment plan, that some frequencies are to be kept unassigned to permit later developments in FM broadcasting that may not be foreseen at present; and
- (e) A frequency is not to be assigned to any frequency modulation broadcasting station or amplitude modulation broadcasting station simply because that frequency is available; and
- (f) As a general principle and subject to paragraph (g) of this clause, the recommendations of the International Telecommunication Unions' International Consultative Committee on Radio (CCIR) on signal strength standards for reception should be the basis for determining coverage objectives and the effective radiated power of proposed frequency modulation transmitters; and
- (g) You may, in consultation with the Post Office, vary the standards referred to in paragraph (f) of this clause where you consider it necessary but, in making any such variation, you shall have regard to the importance of conserving frequencies and of avoiding interference with other services; and
- (h) Subject to paragraph (l) of this clause, FM transmitters should be co-sited, where practicable, with television transmitters; and
- (i) Where co-siting is not practicable and paragraph (l) of this clause does not apply, siting of an FM transmitter within approximately one kilometre of a television transmitter is to be preferred; and
- (j) As a general principle medium and high powered FM transmitters should be located at efficient transmission sites outside urban areas; and
- (k) It is envisaged that where difficulties arise between a warrant holder and the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand in establishing a mutually acceptable co-siting agreement, the difficulties should be settled by arbitration; and
- (l) Low-powered transmitters need not be co-sited with television transmitters; and
- (m) The location of transmitters not co-sited shall be chosen with regard to achieving compatibility with other services and efficient use of FM broadcasting frequencies; and
- (n) The same sense slant polarisation shall be used for all FM broadcasting but you may, in your discretion, permit a different type of mixed polarisation if it is justified for any particular transmission; and

(6) Hereby revoke the notice which was dated the 23rd day of February 1981 and which was given to you under section 68 (1) of the Broadcasting Act 1976*.
