- (c) One member, who shall be a woman and be resident in the region serviced by the college, appointed by the Maori Women's Welfare League (Inc.);
- (d) One member, appointed by the Director-General of Education; after consultation, to represent the Samoan community;
- (e) One member, appointed by the Director-General of Education, after consultation, to represent the Cook island community;
- (f) One member, appointed by the Director-General of Education, after consultation, to represent the Tokelauan community;
- (g) One member, appointed by the Porirua City Council;
- (h) One member, appointed by the Tawa Borough Council;
- (i) Two members, one of whom shall be a woman, appointed jointly by the Kapiti Borough Council, Kapiti College Board of Governors, Paraparaumu College Board of Governors, the Gold Coast Promotion Council (Inc.), and the Waikeanae District Community Council.
- (j) One member elected by the governing bodies of Aotea College, Mana College, Porirua College, Tawa College and Viard College.
- (k) One member, who shall be resident in the region serviced by the college, appointed jointly by the Wellington District Council of the N.Z. Federation of Labour and the Combined State Unions;
- (l) One member, who shall be resident in the region serviced by the college appointed by the Porirua Business Development Council in consultation with associations of employers in local industries and commerce;
- (m) One member, who shall be resident in the region serviced by the college, appointed by the Wellington Hospital Board to represent the health related needs of the community;

(n) One member, who shall be resident in the region serviced by the college, appointed jointly by the Porirua and Kapiti Branches of the New Zealand Nurses Association (Inc.);

(o) One member who shall be the Principal of the Porirua Regional Community College;

(p) One member who shall represent the staff of the Porirua Regional Community College and who shall be elected by the full-time tutors and full-time ancillary staff employed by the Council and who shall be a full-time staff member employed by the Council;

(q) (i) One member, who shall be a student of the Porirua Regional Community College and who shall be elected by the students of the college;

(ii) The member appointed pursuant to subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall hold office from the 1st day of February in the year of his appointment until the 31st day of January in the subsequent year, and if on that date the appointment of a successor has not been notified to the Council that member shall continue to hold office until the date on which the appointment is notified;

(r) Not more than 4 members, co-opted by the Council itself, if and when it thinks fit.

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause and to the provisions of clause 4 (q) of this notice every member of the Porirua Regional Community College Council shall hold office for a term of 3 years but may, from time to time be reappointed or re-elected.

(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in sub-clause (1) of this clause every co-opted member of the Council shall be appointed for such term, not exceeding 3 years, as the Council thinks fit.

(3) Except in the case of a casual vacancy or as otherwise provided in this notice, every member shall hold office until the 15th day of November in the third year after that member's election or appointment, and if on the 15th day of November the appointment or election of the successor has not been notified to the Council, that member shall continue to hold office until the date on which that appointment of election is so notified.

(4) If any member—

(a) Dies; or

(b) Resigns office by giving written notice addressed to the Council or to the Chairman or the Secretary thereof; or

(c) Is absent without leave from the meetings of the Council for 3 consecutive months; or

Amendments to the Rules of the Royal Society of New Zealand

Section N. Publications

Rule N3 was amended to read:

N3. On application to the Executive Officer of the Society all Fellows shall be entitled to one copy free of charge of the Journal of the Royal Society of New Zealand. One copy of

Bulletins and other publications shall be available to Fellows at half price. The proceedings of the Society will be sent free of charge to all Fellows.

Section J. *The Encouragement of Research*

There was an addition made to this section as shown below:

JXI. The Thomson Medal and Fund.

1. There shall be a medal known as the Thomson Medal to commemorate the contributions made to science and the furtherance of science by George Malcolm Thomson and his son James Allan Thomson. It shall be awarded in recognition of outstanding contributions in the fields of the organisation, administration or application of science, or without restriction to the above, to the furtherance of science generally.

2. There shall be set up a fund, the interest from which shall meet the costs of an annual or periodic medal and of its engraving with the name of the recipient and of any other costs involved. A first charge upon the fund shall be the design and production of dies for the original medal.

3. The fund shall vested in the Society. The Council shall have the control of the said monies and may invest the same upon any securities proper for trust monies. The Council at any meeting may resolve that any part of the unexpended revenue from the fund shall be added to the capital thereof.

4. So long as sufficient funds are retained to meet the purposes of the award, the Society may from time to time devote any surplus to the general purposes of the Society.

5. The award shall be made annually until 1990 and thereafter in alternate years, or at such intervals, not being more than 3 years; as the Council may from time to time decide, provided a candidate of sufficient merit is proposed. The award shall be made in March and shall be presented to the recipient at the annual meeting of the Society.

6. At the first meeting after the annual meeting the Council shall appoint a Thomson Medal Committee to recommend the award for the coming year, except that in the first year of the fund the committee should be appointed as soon as these rules are accepted by Council. The committee shall comprise three persons for a 3 year term with stepped terminating dates, one of whom shall be the President and one a member of Council, to select and recommend to Council the recipient of the medal.

7. There shall be published in each volume of the Proceedings a complete list of recipients of the Thomson Medal.

(b) The term "machine" for the purpose of this licence shall be defined as an apparatus for applying mechanical power and shall include a "vehicle as defined by section 2 of the Transport Act 1962.

At all times while the licensee is operating a goods service requiring an exemption from section 109 of the Transport Act 1962 in terms of paragraph (A), (B) or (C) hereof, he shall carry a current rail exemption certificate or authorities in the name of Freightways Express Ltd. appropriate to the journey and class of goods being carried.

G2/528 C. & D. Webster Ltd: Amend Goods Service Licence No. 17541 by amending the existing special conditions to read—

One motor vehicle with exemption from section 109 (1) of the Transport Act 1962 for the carriage of own chilled, frozen and dry pet food. The goods shall be carried in an insulated van not exceeding 10 tonnes payload. The maximum quantity of dry goods shall not exceed 2000 kilograms. All goods to be carried for sale directly from the van to retail outlets. Areas 1, 2 and 3 Goods Service Districts.

DECISION

THE Tribunal called for persons who wished to apply for a commercial FM warrant for Christchurch to file applications but the Tribunal did not predetermine whether one or more warrants would be issued.

The Applicants—Canterbury FM Broadcasting Ltd. sought a warrant to broadcast from 6 a.m. to midnight Monday to Friday and for 24 hours on Saturday and Sundays. At the end of 2 years the station intended to broadcast 24 hours continuously.

The station was said to be musically oriented and would broadcast familiar consistent and contemporary music with a high ratio of current music and less reliance on old or "gold" records. It would not emphasise high profile personality radio. The company considered that FM in the early stages mainly attracted 18-39 age group by the nature of FM and its focus on music.

Because of the commercial risk of commencing FM in Christchurch it believed it could not "narrowcast" for the adventurous in its format. It considered the first FM radio stations in Christchurch would have to have broad appeal.

If there were to be 1 FM warrant, *Canterbury FM* would serve an 18-39 audience. If there were to be 2 warrants, one would cater for an under 25 audience, the other competing for the 20-35 audience with a spill-over up to 39. *Canterbury FM* would fulfil that role.

It said that *3ZM* had been appealing to young people in Christchurch but had succeeded largely by default as *Radio Avon* had targeted itself to more of a music/news radio station while *3ZB* remained the traditional community middle of the road operation.

Radio Avon's recent programme changes, it claimed, showed it was caught between the younger targeting of *3ZM* and the middle of the road *3ZB*.

If the application were successful the applicant company would increase its authorised share capital to \$550,000. The shareholders would be the Christchurch Press Co. Ltd. (publisher of *The Press* newspaper) holding 200 000 1 dollar shares, Metropolitan FM Broadcasting Ltd. holder of a commercial FM warrant in Auckland, 200 000 shares, and T. J. Ward, a proposed sales executive, G. T. Dowling and D. W. Cooper would each take up 50 000 shares. The directors of the company would be Messrs Ward and Dowling, R. A. Barker, and D. J. Broughton, respectively general manager and company secretary of the Christchurch Press Co. Ltd., and from Auckland the joint managing director of Metropolitan FM Broadcasting, R. L. McKay, and another director of Metropolitan, R. I. McMillan.

Radio Avon Ltd., the owner of an AM radio station in Christchurch, sought a warrant which would be issued to a new subsidiary company, for a station, *Music 90 FM*, which would play music in longer sweeps than is the case on commercial AM stations. It would present a wider range of music and a balanced mixture of songs and melodies including selections from the best quality stereo material of the nineteen fifties through to the hits of today.

It would be a contemporary sounding station but would reach beyond the normal AM diet of contemporary pop and golden oldies. It would play easy listening music appealing to a 25- to 44-age group.

The directors would be Messrs I. J. Kirkpatrick and N. Wesney, directors of Radio Avon Ltd., S. J. Bankier and A. F. Price, all of Christchurch.

Mr Wesney would be general manager and programme director of the company and would train an assistant to take over from him. The company would have a separate sales organisation from *Radio Avon AM*.

Radio Avon Ltd. proposed that it retain its existing warrant indefinitely.

The applicant favoured the grant of a warrant for *3ZM* on FM.

The Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand applied for a 24-hour a day popular music station, *3ZM FM*, directed towards the needs of an audience of 15-30 years which it said would complement other radio services available in Christchurch. The programme would, in broad principle, maintain the programming policies followed by *3ZM* an existing AM station operated by Radio New Zealand in Christchurch.

It expected its current audience share would not be duplicated in the short term; no change in the programming philosophy was indicated and the format changes proposed were not radical. The station would provide concise information, including specially prepared news bulletins from Radio New Zealand sources and sport and information packages.

The applicant proposed a period of 90 days to simulcast the new station on *3ZM AM* as a suitable duration to promote the use of the station's programme services on the new medium. At the end of that time the AM frequency would be relinquished.

3ZM-FM would maintain hourly commercial content at an estimated 6 minutes in the first year, 7 minutes in the second year and 8 minutes per hour in the third year. The present self-imposed maximum content is 12 minutes per hour.

Mainland FM Ltd.—The applicant proposed a company with a capital of \$500,000. The 3 promoters, Messrs G. W. Parsonage, M. L. Ballantine, K. Foley and G. G. McKay (all from Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd.) would hold 20 percent each and the remaining 40 percent would be held by Christchurch residents, management and staff. Directors from Christchurch would be P. C. Greenslade and D. J. Gilmore.

A 24-hour service for a target audience 15 to 35 was proposed, with some interest from listeners outside that age group. This audience was expected to embrace the FM service quickly.

The expertise and experience in Hawkes Bay would be used to set the style of the station. Mr Parsonage would be responsible for programming and promotion and would be on the air during the establishment of the station but not permanently.

The Applications—The consideration involved 2 applications from existing warrant holders, and two from new entrants. The BCNZ proposal was to convert station *3ZM* to FM after a short period of simulcasting. Radio Avon Ltd. wished to establish a FM station but pleaded special grounds to avoid surrender of its AM warrant.

There were two new entrants both involving partly local ownership and partly ownership from outside the area. Canterbury FM Ltd. proposal is a combination of the Auckland station Metropolitan Broadcasting (Magic 91) and the publisher of *The Press* newspaper which together would hold 80 percent of the shareholding and the balance of 20 percent would be held principally by a number of Christchurch shareholders.

Mainland FM was promoted by shareholders of Radio Hawkes Bay Ltd. which operates the private commercial FM station in Hawkes Bay. They too would combine with local capital.

In respect of formats, *3ZM* claimed it would appeal to a 15-30 age group but, if it were the only station to receive a warrant, would extend the format to embrace a wider age group of 15-39.

Radio Avon essentially was to serve an older audience, and we shall discuss the exact demographic proposed but essentially it would not appeal significantly to an audience under 30.

After hearing a tape which demonstrated the range of music we concluded the station would appeal mainly to an over 30 audience.

Canterbury FM had an 18-39 format and *Mainland FM* sought to serve a 15-35 age group.

Section 80—In considering the application and before determining whether or not to grant the application the Tribunal is required by section 80, Broadcasting Act 1976 to have regard to the following matters, as far as they are applicable:

- (a) *The extent to which the proposed service is desirable in the public interest*

The BCNZ application was an attractive one. It would provide a proven popular programme with some slight modifications for the FM band. It had won support as a result of attractive programming and effective marketing and its audience, predominantly between 15 and 30, would be a loyal one crossing readily to the FM band.

The station is a well targeted one and did not tend to stray beyond its target audience. It would have difficulty reaching its projected 20 percent of the potential audience 15-30 but would have a better chance than most stations of achieving its target because the younger age groups accept more readily the change in listening habits involved in the use of the FM band on their receivers.

Canterbury FM Ltd. proposed an 18-39 target age group. It claimed its programmes would be an alternative to AM programmes even if, as we commented in Northland, the music played was not substantially different. It emphasised consistency and familiarity in music selection.

The *Canterbury FM* submission opposed the grant of any other warrant but claimed it could survive and be complementary to warrants granted to either *Radio Avon* or to *3ZM*. It argued that its target age group would encompass people who would more readily change to FM than would *Music 90 FM*'s target audience.

A combination of *ZM-FM* programmes and the *Radio Avon* programming would provide little audience cross-over between the 2 FM stations which would limit the real choice of most listeners to 1 FM station. That argument centres on the desirability of two new FM stations each having a complementary programme but with some overlapping of audience so that many listeners have a second choice. It tends to strengthen the popularity of the FM band.

Mainland's preferred solution was to receive a warrant with *Radio Avon* as the other FM warrant holder provided *Radio Avon* did not continue its AM service.

It was opposed to a *ZM-FM* grant since *3ZM* did not propose to change its programming enough to suit the FM mode. It did not "hold the promise of vitality and enrichment and personal programming content. . ."

The target audience for *Mainland FM*, the 15-35 age group, would make it a directly competitive station with *ZM-FM*.

The *Mainland FM* application was criticised as being ill-prepared and the service likely to be carried on at a distance. The applicant's case was certainly less convincing than the *ZM-FM* case to serve a similar audience.

Music 90 proposed to introduce an audience described variously as 30 plus and 25-44.

After listening to the evidence we are satisfied that this audience would be principally a 30 plus audience and, while the service may be desirable in that it would attempt to tackle the higher end of the audience demographic served by FM stations in New Zealand, the difficulty of attracting an adequate audience casts doubts on the viability of the proposition.

Promoted on the air by *Radio Avon AM*, *Music 90 FM* would certainly provide a new service for an audience which would not be served adequately by *ZM-FM* or *Mainland FM*. Part of the audience would be served by *Canterbury FM*.

Radio Avon has an established commitment to news and the new station would provide a more substantial news service than most FM stations. However we concluded that it could probably survive in the first few years only with the cross promotion available from *Radio Avon AM*.

The grant of 2 warrants would extend a FM music service to a wide range of audience. The *ZM-FM* and *Music 90 FM* would provide the widest range. The narrowest range would be served by *ZM-FM* and *Mainland FM*. A combination of *ZM-FM* and *Canterbury FM* would serve an under 40 audience with a considerable number having a good second choice FM station. We found this combination convincing and viable.

The *Music 90 FM* application seems to the Tribunal to have the potential for a stultifying effect on the growth of radio in Canterbury. Its proposal to maintain *Radio Avon's AM* operation beyond the 4 years contemplated by the regulations smacks of undue caution. A foot in both camps reflected a lack of commitment to switch Avon to FM, perhaps a reluctance to give up what it has successfully run for 10 years.

If *Radio Avon Ltd.* had been confident of the need for a continued AM operation at the end of, say 4 years, it could have accepted a supplementary warrant for *Radio Avon AM* for a limited term and applied later for a new AM warrant. It was not prepared to do so.

Assuming *Radio Avon AM* continues along with *3ZB* there is a fair competitive choice for the public in the AM mode. Likewise with *3ZM* and *Canterbury FM* in the FM mode.

The Tribunal believes the public interest is likely to be best served by having choices between commercial stations on both FM and AM frequencies. After fully considering all the evidence and proposals of the various applicants it concludes the most desirable combination would be best achieved (albeit with some financial stresses) by *3ZM-FM* and *Canterbury FM Ltd.*

(b) *The economic effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates is likely to have in respect of broadcasting stations already in operation*

The grant of the Corporation's application would not adversely affect any other station.

We accepted Mr Egerton's evidence, for *Canterbury FM* that there was some room for increased revenue to be drawn from the market. *Radio Avon* predicted a real increase on the introduction of FM of about \$300,000. The extent of it is in doubt for the reasons given by the Corporation's witness, M. J. P. Dunlop.

His evidence for the Corporation was based on shares of the commercial audience: *3ZM*—32 percent, *3ZB*—45 percent, and *Radio Avon*—22 percent.

Mr Dunlop argued that an additional commercial station would impact adversely on existing operators. In Auckland there were currently 95 900 people per commercial station; 89 267 in Wellington and only 80 867 in Christchurch. A fourth warrant would reduce this to 60 650. He said that Christchurch retailers existed on a lower turnover per capita than both Auckland and Wellington and the Christchurch population had been declining since 1976. Christchurch radio currently extracted 17.5 percent more advertising revenue per capita than Auckland.

Mr Dunlop's calculation of the effect on each of the existing stations of the grant of an additional warrant was as follows:

If *Music 90 FM* were granted a warrant and gained a 9 percent share of the audience, the effect on *3ZB* would be \$134,542 loss of revenue. The impact of *3ZM* would be \$142,611. (The total effect on *Radio New Zealand* would therefore be \$277,153). The effect on *Radio Avon AM* would be \$228,829. (There was some evidence that suggested the effect on *Radio Avon AM* would be greater than that).

His estimates were based on *Music 90 FM* achieving half of its proposed revenue, i.e. \$505,982 instead of \$1,070,000. It would cause the least impact on the Corporation stations.

The grant of the *Mainland FM* application with a 15 percent audience share and an estimated income of \$656,680 (which was close to their projected \$692,000) would have an effect of \$427,000 on *3ZM* and \$228,000 on *Radio Avon*. There would be no effect on *3ZB*.

The *Canterbury FM* application achieving a 13 percent share would generate income of \$689,227 which is close to their estimate of \$600,000. The effect on *3ZB* would be \$134,542, on *3ZM*, \$249,576. The total impact on the Corporation would be \$384,118. It would however cause a loss of \$305,109 revenue to *Radio Avon*.

A grant to *Canterbury FM* would have the greatest effect on *Radio Avon* (\$305,000)

Mr Dunlop's figures cannot be a precise prediction in dollar terms but they do indicate a relative effect on each station of each scenario.

We are not certain that the audience shares predicted by Mr Dunlop would be sustained in the event. We accept some evidence which predicted a lower audience cross-over to *3ZM*—which would help *Avon AM*. And we do not expect *Canterbury FM* will attain 13 percent audience share for some time. The effect on existing stations will therefore be less than he predicted.

We believe *Radio Avon* has the potential to improve its present share of audience anyway. After FM starts up, with proper fine tuning, *Avon AM* could secure its profitable niche in the market with an AM format appealing to a younger demographic than *3ZB* and with an appropriate music/news/information mix. We expect in that case it should gain audience from *3ZM* and *3ZB* (audience it used to hold) and reduce the financial impact of the new FM station.

The effect of a *Canterbury FM* warrant on *3ZB* and *3ZM*, by Mr Dunlop's calculations, is only \$107,000 more than the effect of a *Music 90 FM* warrant on the *Radio New Zealand* stations.

Although *Mainland FM* would not affect *3ZB*, in Mr Dunlop's analysis, it would have the greatest effect on *3ZM* (\$427,000), the biggest effect on the Corporation (\$427,000) and the second greatest overall effect on existing stations (\$655,000).

The ultimate extent and distribution of the advertising dollar will depend on programme performance and appeal and cannot be accurately assessed, although there is no doubt that existing stations will lose some revenue when 4 commercial stations are competing instead of the present three.

We have concluded that the benefit of introducing another element of competition to the Christchurch market outweighs the adverse effect on the other stations' revenues. We also consider that the effect will take time as the FM stations will not at first attain the audience and revenue goals that, for instance, Mr Dunlop's analysis estimates.

- (c) *The effect which the establishment of the stations to which the application relates will have on broadcasting services provided by the Corporation in the public interest*

The Corporation did not oppose the grant of another FM warrant but it did oppose the introduction of a new operator. This means that the Corporation was not opposed to the *Music 90 FM* application.

Evidence was put to us by the new entrants suggesting that there was great potential in the market. For instance, Canterbury FM Ltd. suggested there was a potential growth of \$820,000. Mr Dunlop, for the Corporation, estimated that a 6 percent expansion would be required in the market or the new entrants would take money from existing stations and not attain their goals.

Mr Dunlop said that the four ZB stations contributed 44.7 percent of *Radio New Zealand's* income in 1970/71 and that had now declined to 33.7 percent over the 14 year period. With the erosion in the licence fee pressure was put on the Corporation's revenue.

The Corporation has the advantage in that it will operate a ZM-FM network with 2ZM in Wellington. Its present position is not a typical one. If *Radio Avon* were performing as well as it might (and has) *Radio New Zealand* revenue would already be considerably lower.

The Tribunal found that the attractiveness of the *Canterbury FM* proposal for Christchurch outweighed the effect on the Corporation, and on *Radio Avon*.

- (d) *The needs of New Zealand or the locality or localities proposed to be served in respect of broadcasting services*

All the applicants would bring to the area the added advantage of broadcasting in the FM mode. In the case of 3ZM there will be no other existing need met. (Balanced against that is the advantage that there would be no effect on the existing services by the grant of that application.)

Radio Avon's Music 90 FM fills a need among an older audience some of whom have been less well-served by current FM stations in New Zealand.

The *Mainland FM* application would be a rival for much of the audience of *Radio 3ZM*. In this sense that applicant brings fewer advantages and more disadvantages than 3ZM. It would, in our judgment not serve the market any better than 3ZM FM.

From past experience it is clear that in terms of needs the demand in fact comes from the younger age group in the sense that they will use the services when provided. The older age groups tend not to use such services immediately and probably growth in that area lies only with time and the ageing of the audience which has become used to tuning to FM. This could begin to change with the introduction of the *Concert Programme* on FM later.

Radio Avon proposes some concentration on news which is one of the requirements of the older audience, but the FM station would not hope to match the whole informational gamut of the AM stations such as *Radio Avon AM* and 3ZB.

A grant of a second Christchurch warrant to *Radio Avon Ltd.* would not stimulate the radio performance in that city. A grant to one of the new entrants will bring in some new aggression in programming.

A grant to a new entrant will promote and stimulate the development of FM broadcasting. The consequent combination would fill more needs than a possible future of 3ZB and *Music 90 FM* and 3ZM-FM.

Allowing *Radio Avon AM* to continue with *Music 90 FM* would mean there would be no new competitive element and could possibly deny another private operator access to the South Island.

- (e) *The financial and commercial ability of the applicant to carry on the proposed service*

We were impressed with Mr McElhinney and Mr Celmins, respectively manager and programme director of 3ZM. It is obvious that the skills of these men and other *Radio New Zealand* executives have set a standard for others to emulate in both programming and marketing in Christchurch.

The Corporation has displayed its financial and marketing abilities in Christchurch in recent years. The financial arrangements appear to be adequate.

Radio Avon Ltd. has displayed financial and commercial ability since its inception. It has been suffering lower ratings more recently but we are not inclined to take too much notice of the immediate position which tends to be cyclical and to depend on current management and programming activities rather than reflecting the financial and commercial ability of the applicant overall. It also reflects improved performance by *Radio New Zealand*.

Mr Wesley was the key man for *Music 90 FM*. While we were impressed with his background and experience, his recent radio programming activity was limited and the new station seemed dependent, not only on those skills but also on his capability as managing director which would involve marketing and other responsibilities. The management support resources for him seemed too slight.

With regard to *Canterbury FM Ltd.*, it relies on the expertise in radio of the Metropolitan/Magic proprietors in Auckland and of local directors including those with business experience of *The Press* newspaper company in Christchurch.

Likewise *Mainland FM* will use the experience of its successful operations in Hawkes Bay.

Both have had to meet intense competition but the extensive experience of Messrs McKay and Egerton will be invaluable.

To some extent both the new entrants depend on consultative expertise from the north. Since this also applies to some extent to *Radio New Zealand*, on balance nothing seems to rest on that aspect. Consultation with stations in other markets or people experienced in programming in other markets is a wise course which is adopted by many stations from time to time.

The *Mainland FM* application was not as well researched and the depth of expertise not as impressive as with *Canterbury*. Mr Parsonage is obviously capable but he would be rather too much the linchpin in Christchurch, and at the same time responsible for the station in Hawkes Bay. We did consider too much emphasis was placed on night-time revenue, mainly because the projections by Mr Ballantine lacked the depth of research and adequate time for reflection.

- (f) *The likelihood of the applicant carrying on the proposed service satisfactorily*

We are satisfied all the applicants are likely to carry on the service satisfactorily.

We are not satisfied on the evidence that the alleged failure of Metropolitan to adhere to its promised target audience in the Auckland market should be drawn into this application.

The likelihood of any applicant carrying on the proposed service satisfactorily does depend to some extent on financial results. In this respect we are somewhat concerned about the practicality of the audience share proposed for *Radio Avon Ltd.* in the initial years and would expect that the FM operation would be unprofitable for several years and could be a considerable drain on the AM operation.

We have some doubts about the ability of *Mainland FM* to attract the revenue that they anticipate. Of the non-Corporation applications, *Canterbury FM's* financial projections were the most convincing.

The likelihood of the ZM operation being carried on satisfactorily partly lies in the Corporation's size which enables it to absorb any initial losses. *Radio New Zealand* would provide 3ZM-FM with research staff and other resources.

- (g) *The results of any survey available to the Tribunal*

The evidence produced by the Corporation showed that 3ZM was supported mainly by 10-30-year olds and that 15-19-year olds are heavy listeners. There is a low level of dissatisfaction in Christchurch and a low level of changeover between stations. However, more of the 3ZM audience are keen for their station to shift to FM (70 percent) than is the case with 3ZB (49 percent), *Radio Avon* (47 percent) and YA (45 percent).

Their proposed format is reflected in the survey. The 15-30-age group were attracted by a top 40 format the contemporary album appealing more to the 20-24-year olds.

There was a strong view that there was room for improvement in sound quality.

The McNair Survey produced by *Canterbury FM* provided similar useful background information on the stations and their audience.

- (h) *The requirement that frequencies be best utilised in the public interest*

The ZM application will release an AM frequency which could be used in Christchurch for some other purpose in the future.

The Corporation proposed simulcasting for a period of 90 days.

We believe that this is a reasonable period in the circumstances for promotion of the FM station on the AM station and we will permit simulcasting for that period.

The *Radio Avon* application involves the retention of the AM operation.

Where grants have been made elsewhere, the applicant has accepted that it should cease operations within a period defined under the regulations not exceeding 4 years. The usual practice is to issue a new warrant in which the existing AM operation becomes a supplementary warrant and expires within a stated period.

In this case the applicant has proposed that on grounds of special circumstances it should be permitted to retain its AM warrant indefinitely.

We do not find those special circumstances made out but in view of the type of programming which is of a pioneering nature among an older audience, we would have considered it reasonable for the existing AM operation to continue for several years, as there would be a difference between the formats of the 2 stations.

(i) *The desirability of avoiding monopolies in the ownership or control of news media*

There is no question of a monopoly in any of the particular applications.

However, this is a convenient point to consider the media involvement.

The *Canterbury FM* application involves a 40 percent shareholding by both the publisher of *The Press* newspaper and Metropolitan FM Broadcasting, warrant holder of *Magic 91* in Auckland.

It has become customary in AM warrants to limit news media companies, which includes both newspaper companies and radio companies, to a maximum of 30 percent interest. However, it has been accepted that applications by newspaper companies for commercial FM warrants should be considered on their merits and this is indeed adopted as part of Government policy. The Tribunal's reasons for recommending this policy were clear in the FM report.

The 2 major shareholders were prepared to undertake to protect the editorial independence of the station and its editor, not to sell their shares without consent and not to take shares in each other.

In these circumstances and because the radio station is in another centre, we would impose a condition that the news media ownership limit be 30 percent but consent to the two named companies having a 40 percent interest each, for so long as

- (1) They do not take shares in each other (either directly or indirectly)
- (2) The ownership of those 2 companies does not change to the extent that any shareholder which is a news company (as will be defined in the warrant) gains a prescribed interest in the warrant.

As far as the ownership regulations are concerned, the company would have to ensure that compliance was achieved.

In relation to the *ZM* and *Radio Avon* applications there would be no new news service introduced.

In the case of the other 2 stations there is a possibility of an additional service, although it is also possible that the successful applicant may use a *Radio Avon* service.

Radio Avon has a significant financial interest in the companies holding the other 3 warrants in the South Island. The grant of their application would involve their having an interest in 5 warrants, this is a disadvantage of the *Music 90 FM* proposal.

(j) *The hours during which the applicant proposes to broadcast programmes*

The *Canterbury FM* proposal is for 18 hours on weekdays and for 24 hours in the weekends. The broadcasting hours would be increased to continuous broadcasting after 2 years. We do not believe the additional 6 hours to be so important as to require a condition.

The other applicants propose a continuous service.

(k) *The extent of advertising matter which the applicant proposes to broadcast*

3ZM estimated 6 minutes per hour in the first year, 7 minutes in the second year and 8 minutes in the third year. This was less than that proposed by *Canterbury FM* and *Radio Avon* and the same in the first year as *Mainland FM* in its establishment period.

Canterbury FM was prepared to accept a maximum of 8 minutes per hour.

If one FM warrant were granted the Tribunal would impose a limit of 8 minutes per hour. The grant of 2 warrants would make that statutory limitation unnecessary as we believe the competitive element would tend to limit the amount of advertising.

Music 90 FM would have a self imposed limit of 10 minutes.

We were persuaded that, if 2 FM warrants are issued, there should be no special restrictions on commercial content.

(l) *The proposed rates and charges to be made in respect of advertising programmes*

The *3ZM* rates appear to be generally lower than the others and the *Mainland FM* rate to be the highest which is in keeping with its proposal for the lowest commercial content.

(m) *Such matters as may be necessary for the purpose of imposing conditions under section 71A of this Act*

We have referred to the consents which would be required.

(o) *Such other matters as may be prescribed in regulations in that behalf*

The submission was made to use that Regulation 14A Broadcasting Regulations requires the Corporation, if granted a warrant for *3ZM-FM*, to surrender the warrant for *3ZB*.

It is convenient here to consider the effect of Regulation 14A. (S.R. 1981/295)

"14A. (1) A single sound-radio warrant may be issued in respect of—

- (a) A frequency modulation broadcasting station; or
- (b) Both a frequency modulation broadcasting station and an amplitude modulation broadcasting station.

(2) Notwithstanding section 72 of the Act, but subject to that proviso to that section and to regulation 16A of these regulations, every sound-radio warrant issued in respect of a frequency modulation broadcasting station shall, unless sooner revoked, continue in force for a period to be specified in the warrant, which period shall not exceed 5 years after the date of the issue of the warrant.

(3) Where—

(a) An applicant for a sound-radio warrant in respect of a commercial frequency modulation broadcasting station or in respect of both a commercial frequency modulation broadcasting station and a commercial amplitude modulation broadcasting station is the holder of a sound-radio warrant in respect of a commercial amplitude modulation broadcasting station; and

(b) The Tribunal is satisfied that the frequency modulation station serves or will serve a significant proportion of the same area as the amplitude modulation broadcasting station—

it shall, unless the Tribunal determines that there are special circumstances, be a condition of any warrant granted that the applicant surrender the warrant previously held in respect of the commercial amplitude modulation broadcasting station (whether or not the warrant granted authorises the operation of the commercial amplitude modulation broadcasting station).

(4) Notwithstanding subclause (3) of this regulation, where the Tribunal grants a sound-radio warrant that authorises the operation of a commercial frequency modulation broadcasting station and of a commercial amplitude modulation broadcasting station, the Tribunal may make it a condition of the warrant that the holder of the warrant shall surrender the warrant, to the extent that the warrant authorises the operation of a commercial amplitude modulation broadcasting station, at the expiration of a period to be specified in the warrant, which period shall not exceed 4 years from the date on which the commercial frequency modulation broadcasting station begins broadcasting.

(5) The Tribunal shall specify in every sound-radio warrant issued in respect of a frequency modulation broadcasting station or in respect of both a frequency modulation broadcasting station and an amplitude modulation broadcasting station, the coverage objectives of the frequency modulation broadcasting station to which the warrant relates.

(6) It shall be a condition of every sound-radio warrant issued in respect of a frequency modulation broadcasting station that the holder of the warrant observe in respect of that station the coverage objectives specified in the warrant in respect of that station.

(7) For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby declared that nothing in these regulations excepts sound-radio warrants issued in respect of frequency modulation broadcasting stations from the application of subsections (3) to (5) of section 71 of the Act."

Mr O'Brien's argument on the correct interpretation of regulation 14A was compelling.

We accept that 3ZM's AM warrant would otherwise have had to be surrendered within 4 years if the Corporation had not indicated that was prepared to surrender the warrant. We cannot accept that it was the intention of the regulations to require a warrant holder who was an applicant to divest itself of all commercial AM warrants held by that warrant holder in that area. Nor do we consider that is what the regulation says. The use of the singular "warrant" indicates that it is the 3ZM AM warrant which has to be surrendered.

The simulcasting is of short duration continuing for promotional reasons only it will be permitted.

It will be a condition of the grant of the warrant to the BCNZ for 3ZM that the AM warrant be surrendered from the commencement of broadcasting by 3ZM-FM. The Tribunal will grant a 90 day authorisation for the existing 3ZM operation. We consider this more appropriate than granting a FM warrant with a supplementary AM warrant for such a short period.

Radio Avon Ltd. may have needed to have consents in relation to directors having a directorship in more than one company.

However, the directorships proposed do not appear to create a problem.

Conclusion—The Tribunal considers the BCNZ application the best of the four. It had the least disadvantages and was viable.

Of the other 3 only the *Canterbury FM* application clearly commended itself. We consider the advantages of this applicant as an additional station outweighed the disadvantages which were primarily the effect on the existing stations—section 80 (b) and (c). For the reasons given the *Mainland FM* and *Music 90 FM* proposals were not as attractive.

Mainland FM would serve an audience on FM which 3ZM could better serve.

Music 90 FM had weaknesses which we have alluded to and its viability was doubtful.

For these reasons, and those given earlier in this decision, the Tribunal grants the BCNZ and *Canterbury FM* applications and declines the *Radio Avon* and *Mainland FM* applications.

Conditions:

We have decided not to rule on timing at this stage for commencement of FM broadcasting. The successful applicants may make submissions. Normally we would have left the parties to make their own pace but 2 other considerations may apply—

- (1) The BCNZ is to provide facilities for co-siting. Negotiations may take time and should not put *Canterbury FM* at a disadvantage.
- (2) Existing stations will be affected by the new entrant. It could be argued that 3ZM should be able to start on FM at the same time as, or earlier than, *Canterbury FM*.

A condition may be inserted to deal with these matters after hearing submissions, if the parties cannot agree.

Otherwise the usual conditions will apply including:

- (1) An identical definition of coverage objectives
- (2) Hours as applied for
- (3) Simulcasting of 3ZM AM-FM for 3 months
- (4) Adherence to promised formats
- (5) The usual clauses for networking and technical standards for *Canterbury FM*.
- (6) Warrants will lapse if not taken up within 18 months or such further time as the Tribunal may approve.
- (7) News media ownership in *Canterbury FM* (see earlier reference).
- (8) The initial term of the warrants will be 3 years.

Co-opted Member—The Tribunal co-opted Mr Henshall as a person whose qualifications or experience was likely, in the opinion of the Tribunal, to be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with the application. He took part in the hearing and the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision is that of the permanent members.

District Anglers (Southern Lakes Acclimatisation District) Notice 1985

PURSUANT to section 71 of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Department of Internal Affairs hereby gives the following District Anglers Notice.

NOTICE

1. Title and Commencement—This notice may be cited as the District Anglers (Southern Lakes Acclimatisation District) Notice 1985, and shall come into force on 1 September 1985.

2. Interpretation—(1) In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Boat" includes a launch or other vessel; and also includes any canoe, punt, or raft, and any aircraft or hovercraft on the surface of the water;

"District" means the Southern Lakes Acclimatisation District;

"Foulhook", in relation to any acclimatised fish, means to take the acclimatised fish with a hook otherwise than through the mouth;

"Landmark" means a black and yellow ringed post;

"Lure" means any natural or artificial fly, any natural or artificial minnow, any natural or artificial worm, any artificial crustacean, rodent, mollusc, creeper, huhu or matai grub;

"Natural fly" includes spiders and insects; but does not include anything the use of which is prohibited by subclause (1) of clause 5 of this notice;

"Take" and all references thereto includes taking, fishing for, catching, killing, or pursuing by any means or device; and also includes the attempt to take;

(2) Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in the Fisheries Act 1983 or the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983 shall unless the context otherwise requires have the meanings so defined.

3. Open season—(1) Except as provided in subclause (2) and subclause (3) of this clause fishing for acclimatised fish by licence holders shall be permitted during the open season which shall be—

(a) In respect of all rivers and streams flowing into Lakes Hawea, Wanaka, Wakatipu, Te Anau, Manapouri, Monowai, Hauroko, Poteriteri, and Hakapoua, and the lower Waiau River from Pearl Harbour to the eastern boundary of the district (excluding that part dealt with in subparagraph (d) (iii) of this subclause), or into any lake draining into those lakes, and the tributaries of those rivers and streams, except the Waiau River, from the 1st day of November in any year to the 31st day of May in the next succeeding year (both days inclusive);

(b) In respect of Lakes Hawea, Wanaka (excluding that part dealt with in paragraph (d) (i) of this subclause), Wakatipu (excluding those parts dealt with in paragraphs (d) (ii) and (iv) of this subclause), Hayes, Te Anau, Manapouri, Monowai, Hauroko, Poteriteri and Hakapoua, from the 1st day of September in any year to the 31st day of August in the next succeeding year (both days inclusive);

(c) In respect of Diamond Creek between its confluence with the Rees River (as indicated by a black and white striped marker post) and its outflow from Reid Lake, from the 1st day of November in any year to the 31st day of March in the next succeeding year (both days inclusive);

(d) In respect of all other waters in the district, including the Waiau River between Lakes Te Anau and Manapouri, Mill Creek (excluding that part dealt with in subparagraph (vi) of this paragraph), and the hydro-electric outfall from Lake Manapouri into Deep Cove, Doubtful Sound, but excluding those waters dealt with in subclause (2) and subclause (3) of this clause and the following waters;

(i) That portion of Lake Wanaka which lies within 150 metres of any part of the launch wharf at the township of Wanaka;

(ii) Queenstown Bay, Lake Wakatipu, inside a straight line drawn from the outermost point of the Tourist Park to the point where the south bank of One Mile Creek meets Lake Wakatipu;

(iii) That portion of the Waiau River which lies within 100 metres of any part of the wharf at the Fiordland Travel Company's Tourist Centre on the Waiau River, Lake Manapouri;

(iv) That portion of Lake Wakatipu that lies within 100 metres of any part of the wharf in Black Bay (commonly known as the Walter Peak Jetty);

(v) Mill Creek (which flows into Lake Hayes) from the Speargrass Flat Road bridge to the Falls.

(vi) All waters in which acclimatised fish are held in captivity for display, hatching, or other purposes, or from within a distance of 80 metres from such waters or other such distance as defined by landmarks.

from the 1st day of October in any year to the 31st day of May in the next succeeding year (both days inclusive):

(2) Fishing for trout by licence holders shall be permitted during the open season which shall be—

(a) in respect of that portion of the Moeraki River that lies upstream from Lake Moeraki, and the Windbag Stream, from the 1st day of September in any year to the 31st day of March in the next succeeding year (both days inclusive):

(b) in respect of all other waters draining into the Tasman Sea between Makawhio Point and Puysegur Point (but excluding all those waters draining into Deep Cove, Doubtful Cove, via the hydro-electric outfall from Lake Manapouri), from the 1st day of September in any year to the 31st day of May in the next succeeding year (both days inclusive).

(3) Fishing for quinnat (chinook) salmon by licence holders shall be permitted during the open season which shall be in respect of Lakes Moeraki and Paringa from the 1st day of March in any year to the 31st day of March next following (both days inclusive).

4. Restrictions on methods of fishing—(1) No licence holder shall take acclimatised fish by any means other than with one rod and running line, or use for the purpose of taking acclimatised fish—

- (a) Any strokerauling or foulhooking gear; or
- (b) Any hook which has a distance greater than 14 mm between the point and the nearest part of the shank or hook; or
- (c) Any lure having attached thereto more than 2 hooks, which may be either single hooks or multiple hook units; or
- (d) More than 2 lures; or
- (e) Any unsportsmanlike device:

Provided that this subclause shall not prohibit the use with artificial fly of a dropper having only 1 hook (which may be either a single hook or a multiple hook unit) or the use of a landing net to secure any acclimatised fish lawfully taken.

(2) No licence holder shall foulhook or attempt to foulhook any acclimatised fish.

(3) No licence holder shall take acclimatised fish with a set rod, unless—

- (a) He is fishing from a boat of which he is the sole occupant; or
- (b) Where there are 2 or more occupants of the boat, he has the actual physical control of the navigation of the boat; or
- (c) He remains within 15 metres of his rod.

(4) No licence holder who is actually fishing for acclimatised fish with a rod and running line from a boat shall have in his possession any other assembled rod.

5. Restrictions on lures—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, no licence holder shall, in fishing for acclimatised fish, use—

- (a) Any lure containing the feathers of any bird absolutely protected under the Wildlife Act 1953; or
- (b) With any lure, any medicated or chemical preparation other than—
 - (i) A preparation used solely for the purpose of floating a dry artificial fly; or
 - (ii) With a bait of natural minnow a chemical preparation in the nature of formalin or other preservative; or
- (c) Any mollusc, or the freshwater crayfish (koura), or the creeper, or the huhu or matai grub, or fish roe, or any imitation of fish roe:

Provided that the shell of any mollusc may be used in the preparation of an artificial minnow.

(2) No licence holder shall, in fishing for acclimatised fish, use in any water specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice any lures other than those specified for that water in column 2 of that Schedule:

6. Restriction on use of boats—(1) No licence holder shall fish for acclimatised fish from any boat in any of the following waters, unless the boat is securely anchored or otherwise secured, namely:

- (a) That portion of the Clutha River that lies within the district the upstream limit of which terminates at a point 400 metres downstream of the Lake Wanaka outlet launching

ramp breakwater on the true right bank as marked by landmarks on both banks:

(b) The Hawea River:

(c) Those portions of the Waiau River and its tributaries that lie within the district, with the exception of that portion of the river which is between Home Creek and the eastern boundary of the district:

(d) Lakes Moke, Kilpatrick, Reid and Dispute:

(e) That portion of Lake Te Anau that lies within 300 metres of the water's edge, commencing at a point known as Blue Gum Point north of the Te Anau township and extending along the eastern side of the lake to Marakura Yacht Club clubrooms:

(f) Within a radius of 200 metres from the midpoint of the meeting line of Windbag Stream and Lake Paringa:

(g) Within a radius of 200 metres from the midpoint of the meeting line of Moeraki River where it flows into Lake Moeraki, and Moeraki Lake.

(2) No person shall fish from, or tow or troll any lure from, any mechanically propelled or mechanically drawn boat on Lake Hayes or Lake Johnson.

7. Bag limit—(1) No licence holder shall on any one day take more than 3 acclimatised fish from any river flowing into any of the Lakes Hawea, Wanaka, Wakatipu, Te Anau, or Manapouri, or from the Nevis River.

(2) No licence holder shall take more than 2 quinnat (chinook) salmon in total from Lakes Moeraki or Paringa for the duration of the open season for quinnat (chinook) salmon in respect of those waters.

(3) In all other waters of the district, no person shall on any one day take more than 6 acclimatised fish of which not more than 3 may be American brook trout or char (*Salvelinus fontinalis*) or hybrid of the American brook trout and lake trout (commonly known as splake).

(4) For the purposes of this clause the expression "acclimatised fish" does not include perch (*Perca fluviatilis*).

8. Size limit—(1) No licence holder shall have in his possession—

- (a) Any Atlantic salmon (*Salmo salar*) that does not exceed 35 cm in size; or
- (b) Any other acclimatised fish that does not exceed 30 cm in size.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the expression "acclimatised fish" does not include perch (*Perca fluviatilis*).

9. Hours of fishing—(1) A licence holder may fish between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. in Lake Moeraki and Lake Paringa and any rivers or streams flowing into or out of those lakes during the month of March.

(2) Except as provided in subclause (1) of this clause a licence holder may fish in any waters during the open season at any time of the day or night.

10. Revocation—The notice published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, No. 143 of Thursday, 16 August 1984, on pages 3175-3177 titled District Anglers (Southern Lakes Acclimatisation District) Notice 1984, is hereby revoked.
