PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Tokoroa Rural Fire District Order 1948, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the order constituting the Tokoroa Rural Fire District Order made on the 17th day of November 1948* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

2. This order shall come into force from the date of its notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

3. The principal order is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto and substituting the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

SOUTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT—AUCKLAND AND ROTORUA CONSERVANCIES

ALL those areas in the South Auckland Land District, Tauranga and Matamata Counties, Otorohanga and Rotorua Districts and Taumarunui and Taupo Counties containing approximately 199 000 hectares and described generally as follows:

"Firstly": All that area situated in Oputihi, Otanewainuku, Maketu, Tapapa East, Patetere North, Patetere North-east, Rotorua, Wharepapa, Patetere South, Horohoro West, Horohoro, Ngautuku, Ranginui, Whakamaru, Atiamuri, Ngongotaha, Marotiri, Tuhingamata West and Tatua Survey Districts, bounded by a line commencing at a point being the easternmost corner of part Kokako Block, in Block XVI, Patetere North Survey District, and proceeding thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of that block to the south-eastern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 32267, thence north-easterly along that boundary and its production to the centre line of Te Whetu Road, thence generally north-westerly along the centre lines of Te Whetu and Ngatira Roads to the right bank of the Oraka Stream, thence generally north-westerly along that bank to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Lot 9, D.P. 19039, in

Block XI, Patetere North Survey District, thence south-westerly to and along that boundary and its production to the centre line of Pinedale Loop Road, thence generally north-westerly and north-easterly along the centre lines of Pinedale Loop Road, State Highway No. 1, Domain Road, the Rotorua Branch Railway, a public road, being the western boundary of Lot 3, D.P. S. 3749, in Block XI, Patetere North Survey District, and Harris Road to the southern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. S. 4690 in Block XII, Patetere North Survey District, thence generally easterly along that boundary and its production to the right bank of the Waihou River, thence generally north-westerly along that bank to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 8, Block VIII, Patetere North Survey District, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and its production to the centre line of Leslie Road, thence easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Lot 2, D.P. 29456 in Block VIII, Patetere North Survey District, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the south-western boundary of Whaiti Kuranui 2A2B5B Block, thence south-easterly along that boundary to and south-easterly, north-easterly and north-westerly along the south-western, south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Whaiti Kuranui 2A2B5A Block to the westernmost corner of Whaiti Kuranui 2E2 West 4D2A Block, thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of Whaiti Kuranui 2E2 West 4D2A, part 2E2 West 4, 2E2 West 4B and part 2C Blocks and part Lot 1, D.P. 654 and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the centre line of State Highway No. 5 in Block IV, Patetere North Survey District, thence generally south-easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 49, Block IV, Patetere North-east Survey District, thence northerly to and along that boundary to the northernmost corner of the said Section 49, thence generally north-easterly along the generally north-western boundary of the part of State Forest 3 leased by New Zealand Forest Products Ltd. to the southernmost corner of Paengaroa part No. 1 Block in Block IX, Patetere North-east Survey District, thence generally northerly along the generally western boundaries of that block and Lot 1, D.P. S. 26254 to the northernmost corner of the said Lot 1, thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of Paengaroa No. 2 Block, Whaiti Kuranui 5A and part 5D2 Blocks and Section 123, Block III, Tapapa East Survey District, to the right bank of the Heretataua Stream (near the southernmost corner of part Lot 2, D.P. S. 3716 in Block VI, Opoutihi Survey District), thence northerly along that bank and the right bank of the Kaukumouti Stream to the south-western boundary of part Lot 2, D.P. 28320, thence south-easterly along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of Lot 2 and part Lot 1, D.P. 29669, and their production to the centre line of Soldiers Road, thence north-easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 7, Block V, Otanewainuku Survey District, thence south-easterly to and along the south-western boundaries of Sections 7 and 9, Block V aforesaid, and their production to the right bank of the Opuiaki River thence generally north-easterly along that bank to its junction with the left bank of the Mangapapa River, thence generally southerly along that bank to a point in line with the southern boundary of part Allotment 344, Te Papa Parish, in Block V, Otanewainuku Survey District, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and its production to the centre line of McLaren Falls Road, thence generally southerly along that centre line to its junction with the centre line of Omanawa Road, thence generally north-easterly along the centre lines of Omanawa Road and Omanawa Falls Road and the south-eastern boundary of part Allotment 579, Te Papa Parish, to the left bank of the Omanawa River, thence generally southerly along that bank to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Allotment 586, Te Papa Parish, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and its production to the centre line of Taumata Road, thence generally south-easterly along the centre lines of Taumata Road and Pyes Pa Road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 24, Block XV, Otanewainuku Survey District, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the easternmost corner of the said Section 24, thence by a right line due south to the centre line of Mangatoti Road, thence generally easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the western boundary of part Section 8, Block XVI, Otanewainuku Survey District, thence southerly to and along that boundary and its production to the right bank of the Te Rerenga Stream, thence generally easterly along that bank to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 14, Block XVI, Otanewainuku Survey District, thence southerly to and along that boundary to and, by a right line, across Whataroa Road, to and again southerly along the western boundary of the said Section 14 and its production to and thence along the western boundary of Section 16, Block XVI, Otanewainuku Survey District, and its production to the centre line of Te Matai Road, thence north-easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 8, Block IV, Rotorua Survey District, thence south-easterly to and along that boundary to and generally easterly along the northern boundaries of Section 8 aforesaid and part Section 7, Block XIII, Maketu Survey District, thence south-easterly along that boundary and its production to the right bank of the Mangorewa River, thence generally westerly along that bank to the right bank of the Pipikarihi Stream (being the north-western boundary of part Section 2, Block IV, Rotorua Survey District), thence generally south-westerly along the bank to

the eastern boundary of Section 42, Block IV, Rotorua Survey District, thence generally northerly and westerly along the generally eastern and northern boundaries of the said Section 42 and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the centre line of the Tauranga Direct Road, thence generally southerly along the centre lines of the Tauranga Direct Road, Lagoon Road and Roy Road to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 9, Block III, Rotorua Survey District, thence south-westerly to and along that boundary to the north-eastern boundary of Mangorewa Kaharoa 6E3 No. 1 A Block, thence south-easterly and south-westerly along the north-eastern, and south-eastern boundaries of that block to the north-eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. S. 12297, thence south-easterly, southerly and westerly along the north-eastern, eastern and southern boundaries of the said Lot 1 to, and westerly along, the northern boundaries of parts Section 9, Block VII, Rotorua Survey District to the western boundary of the (western) part Section 9, thence southerly along that boundary to the northern boundary of Lot 2, D.P. 24742, thence westerly along that boundary and the northern boundaries of Section 7A, Block XI Rotorua Survey District, and Lot 1, D.P. S. 18745 to the eastern boundary of Section 8A, Block X, Rotorua Survey District, thence southerly along that boundary and its production to the centre line of Oturoa Road, thence generally westerly along the centre lines of Oturoa Road and State Highway No. 5 to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 7, Block IX, Rotorua Survey District, thence southerly to and along that boundary and the western boundaries of Sections 4, part 3, 3C and 3A, Block IX aforesaid, and their production to the centre line of Clinkard Road, thence generally south-easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the western boundaries of parts Section 2, Block XIII, Rotorua Survey District, thence southerly to and along those boundaries and their production to the centre line of the Rotorua Branch Railway, thence easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the eastern side of Bayley Road (unformed), thence southerly to and along that roadside to the southern boundary of Section 16A, Block XIII, Rotorua Survey District, thence easterly along that boundary to the western boundary of Section 1, Block I, Horohoro Survey District, thence southerly along that boundary and its production to the left bank of the Mangakotaha Stream, thence generally south-easterly along that bank to the western boundary of Section 8, Block II, Rotorua Survey District, thence southerly along that boundary and its production across Cochrane Road to the eastern boundary of Section 5, Block I, Horohoro Survey District, thence southerly along that boundary to and thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said Section 5, to and thence along the northern boundary of Section 9, Block II, Horohoro Survey District, and its production to the centre line of South Road thence southerly along that centre line to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 10, Block II aforesaid, thence easterly to and along that boundary to the western boundary of Rotohokahoka D South 15 Block, thence south-easterly along that boundary to, and thence north-easterly along, the south-eastern boundaries of Rotohokahoka D South 15 and 16 Blocks to the centre line of Aorangi Road, thence generally south-easterly and south-westerly along the centre lines of Aorangi Road and Great West Road to a point in line with the western boundary of Kaitao Rotohokahoka 3A4 Block, thence south-easterly to along the south-western boundaries of Kaitao Rotohokahoka 3A4 and 3A5 Blocks to the north-western boundary of Horohoro 2A Block, thence south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of Horohoro 2A Block, Rotomahana Parekarangi part 1C3, part 1C6, part 1C7, part 1C8, part 1C9, part 1C14, part 1C12, part 1C11, part 1C13 Blocks, Te Rimu Horohoro Block, Horohoro Block and Rotomahana Parekarangi 1A Block to the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned block, thence south-easterly and generally southerly along that boundary and the generally north-eastern and eastern boundaries of Sections 37 and 36, Block XIV, Horohoro Survey District, Lot 2, D.P. S. 15314, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the right bank of Rahopakapaka Stream, thence generally southerly along that bank and the right bank of the Taahunaatara Stream to the centre line of State Highway No. 30, thence south-westerly along that centre line to a point opposite the eastern boundary of part Lot 5, D.P. S. 1533, in Block III, Atiamuri Survey District thence northerly to and along that boundary to and thence generally south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of part Lot 5 and part Lot 4, D.P. S. 1533, to and southerly along the western boundary of the said part Lot 4 and that boundary produced to the centre line of State Highway No. 30, thence westerly along that centre line to a point in line with the western boundary of Section 5, Block III, Atiamuri Survey District, thence southerly to and along that boundary and the western boundary of Section 56, Block III aforesaid, and its production to the left bank of the Whangapoa Stream, thence generally north-easterly along that bank to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 39, Block III, Atiamuri Survey District, thence south-easterly to and along that boundary and the south-western boundary of Section 29, Block III aforesaid, and its production to the centre line of Ohakuri Road, thence southerly along that centre line to a point in line with the generally western boundary of Section 6, Block VII, Atiamuri Survey District, thence to and generally southerly along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of Sections 8 and 12, Block VII aforesaid, to the southernmost corner of part Lot 3, D.P. 16299,

thence by a right line due south to the left bank of the Waikato River (Lake Atiamuri), thence generally south-easterly along that bank to the Ohakuri Power Station, thence southerly by a right line to the intersection of the Ohakuri Dam and the left bank of the Waikato River (Lake Ohakuri), thence generally south-easterly along that bank to a point due east of the northern end of the centre line of Orakei Korako Road, thence by a right line due west to and thence southerly along that centre line to the centre line of Tutukau Road in Block III, Tatua Survey District, thence westerly along that centre line to a point in line with the western boundary of part Te Hukui North Block, thence south-westerly to and along that boundary to the north-eastern boundary of Tatua East 9D Block, thence north-westerly along that boundary to and thence north-westerly and south-westerly along the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of Tatua East 25 Block to and thence south-westerly along the north-western boundary of part Tatua East 8 Block and its production to the centre line of State Highway No. 1, thence southerly along that centre line to and thence south-westerly along the centre line of Oruanui Road to and thence north-westerly along the centre line of Forest Road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Tatua East 16B Block, thence south-westerly to and along that boundary and the north-western boundary of Pakuri Block to and thence generally westerly along the generally northern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. S. 4078, to a legal road, thence by a right line across that road to and south-westerly along the north-western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. S. 13176, to the eastern boundary of part Waipapa 4 Block, thence northerly along that boundary and the eastern boundaries of Waipapa 6 Block, part Pouakani B6F1B, parts CD2 and B6F1C Blocks to and by a right line across Forest Road to and again northerly along the eastern boundaries of Pouakani B6F1C and part B6F2 Blocks and Tuaropaki D1 Block to and thence westerly along the northern boundaries of Tuaropaki D1 Block and part Pouakani B6F2 Block to the centre line of Paerata Road, thence generally northerly along the centre lines of Paerata Road and Tirohanga Road to and thence westerly along the centre line of Okama Road to a point in line with the generally eastern boundary of Section 35, Block IX, Atiamuri Survey District, thence generally northerly to and along that boundary and its production to the left bank of the Waikato River (Lake Whakamaru), thence generally westerly along that bank to the Whakamaru Dam in Block XI, Whakamaru Survey District, thence by a right line to the left bank of the Waikato River (Lake Maraetai), thence generally westerly and northerly along that bank to a point in line with the centre line of Lake Road (Mangakino Township), thence generally westerly to and along that centre line and the centre lines of Mangakino Road and Waipapa Road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of part Pouakani No. 2 Block (1936.4208 hectares in Block I, Whakamaru Survey District thence south-westerly to and along that boundary to the right bank of the Waiteti Stream, thence southerly along that bank to the centre line of McLean Road, thence westerly along that centre line to the centre line of Ranginui Road, thence north-westerly, northerly and easterly along that centre line to a point beneath the westernmost high tension powerline (Map reference N.Z.M.S.1, sheet N.84/169789), thence north-westerly along the route of that powerline to its intersection with the right bank of the Te Hui Stream (Map Reference N.Z.M.S.1, sheet N.84/123847), thence north-easterly along the right banks of the Te Hui and Mangawhio Streams to the left bank of the Waikato River (Lake Arapuni), thence northerly along that bank to a point due west of the south-western corner of part Section 10, Block V, Patetere South Survey District, thence due east by a right line to that corner and thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said part Section 10 and the southern end of Waotu South Road, to and thence easterly and northerly along the southern and eastern boundaries of Section 11, Block V, Patetere South Survey District, to the southern boundary of the southern part Matanuku 3 Block, thence easterly, northerly and westerly along the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of parts Matanuku 3 Block to and thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Lot 4, D.P. S. 25485, to the south-western boundary of Waotu South 9C2 Block, thence south-easterly along that boundary to and thence south-easterly and north-easterly along the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Waotu South 9C1 Block and the latter boundary produced to the centre line of the Wiltsdown Road, thence south-easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Waotu South 13 Block, thence northerly to and along that boundary to the southern boundary of part Section 41, Block XIV, Patetere North Survey District, thence westerly, northerly and easterly along the southern, western and northern boundaries of part Section 41 aforesaid and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the centre line of Old Taupo Road, thence north-westerly along that centre line to a point in line with the northern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 29981 in Block XIV, Patetere North Survey District, thence easterly to and along that boundary and the northern boundary of Lot 2, D.P. S. 17151 and its production to the right bank of the Waioraka Stream, thence generally northerly along that bank to its junction with the left bank of the Pokaiwhenua Stream, thence generally south-easterly along the left banks of the Pokaiwhenua and Ngtuwera Streams to the centre line of the Kinleith Branch Railway, thence southerly along that centre line to the centre line of Wiltsdown Road, thence generally south-westerly along that centre line to the

right bank of the Waioraka Stream, thence generally southerly along that bank to the southern corner of part Pakuranga 2C Block in Block VI, Patetere South Survey District, thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of that block and its production to the centre line of Old Taupo Road, thence south-easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 21, Block VII, Patetere South Survey District, thence south-westerly and south-easterly to and along the north-western and south-western boundaries of that section to the western boundary of part Lot 5, D.P. S. 12209, thence southerly along that boundary to the right bank of Waioraka Stream, thence generally southerly along that bank to the northern boundary of Lot 44, D.P. 18172 in Block XI, Patetere South Survey District, thence easterly along that boundary, to and southerly along the eastern boundary of the said Lot 44 and its production to the centre line of Maraetai Road, thence generally easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 23251, thence generally south-easterly to and along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of Lots 3 and 4, D.P. 23251 and the production of the latter boundary to the centre line of Whakamaru Road, thence southerly along that centre line to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Lot 5, D.P. 32253, in Block XI, Patetere South Survey District thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of Lot 2, D.P. S. 17124, and its production to the centre line of Old Taupo Road, thence generally south-easterly along that centre line and the centre lines of Kinleith Road and State Highway No. 1 to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 24, Block VII, Ngautuku Survey District, thence generally easterly to and along that boundary and the southern boundaries of Section 18, 20 and 21, Block VII aforesaid, thence generally northerly along the eastern boundaries of Section 21 aforesaid, Matarawa Road and Sections 15 and 14, Block V, Ngautuku Survey District, thence westerly along the northern boundaries of Sections 14, 13, 12, 11, 5, 19, and 18, Block V aforesaid and Section 8, 7 and 12, Block XII, Patetere South Survey District, and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the centre line of State Highway No. 1, thence northerly along that centre line to a point in line with the southern boundary of Lot 2, D.P. S. 1514, thence easterly to and along that boundary to and thence generally north-westerly along the eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. S. 1514 aforesaid, part Lot 1, D.P. S. 1514 and Lot 3, D.P. 18690, part Lot 14, D.P. 27597 and the land in D.P. S. 2883 (Amisfield) to the southern boundary of part Lot 5, D.P. 23421, thence generally easterly along that boundary and the southern boundaries of the land in D.P. S. 16055, Lots 1 and 2, D.P. S. 16812, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and part Lot 5, D.P. 27069 to and thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of part Lot 5, D.P. 27069, aforesaid and D.P. S. 16731 and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the centre line of Mossop Road, thence easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Lot 2, D.P. S. 1659, thence generally northerly to and along that boundary and the eastern boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. 24874 and Lot 1, D.P. S. 1659, thence generally westerly along the northern boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. S. 1659, Lot 2 and part Lot 1, D.P. 35645, part Lot 17, D.P. 8318 to and thence southerly along the western boundary of the said part Lot 17, D.P. 8318 to and thence north-westerly along the right bank of the Whakauru Stream to and thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of part Lot 11, D.P. 22967, Lot 2, D.P. 23166, part Lot 11, and part Lot 12, D.P. 22967 and Lot 3, D.P. S. 16941, and the last-mentioned boundary produced to the centre line of Newell Road, thence easterly along that centre line to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Lot 11, D.P. 20030, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and its production to the right bank of the Pokaiwhenua Stream, thence generally north-westerly along that bank to a point in line with the north-western boundary of part Section 46, D.P. 19761, thence south-westerly to and along that boundary and its production to the centre line of State Highway No. 1, thence northerly along the centre lines of State Highway No. 1 and Te Rere Road to the left bank of the Ngtuwera Stream, thence generally easterly along that bank to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of part Kokako Block, thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the point of commencement.

"Secondly": All that area situated in Tatua and Takapau Survey Districts bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the right bank of the Orakonui Stream and the left bank of the Waikato River, in Block III, Tatua Survey District, and proceeding thence generally easterly, southerly and westerly along the left bank of the Waikato River to the north-eastern boundary of part Tahorakuri 4 Block, thence north-westerly along that boundary and the north-eastern boundary of Section 19, Block XI, Tatua Survey District to, and by a right line across State Highway No. 5 to and north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 13 and 14, Block XI, Tatua Survey District, to and thence generally westerly along the generally northern boundaries of Sections 14, 6 and 5, Block XI aforesaid and Sections 20 and 47, Block X, Tatua Survey District, to and thence northerly along the eastern boundary of Tahorakuri A1 Section 4 Block to and thence westerly along the northern boundaries of Tahorakuri A1 Section 4 and A1 Section 25 Blocks to the eastern boundary of Tahorakuri Y Block, thence northerly and westerly along the eastern and northern boundaries of the principal part of that block to and thence westerly along the

northern boundary of Pokuru North Block to and thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of Te Hukui South Block to and again north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of Section 1, Block VI, Tatua Survey District, to and south-easterly along the south-western boundary of part Tahorakuri 3 Block and its production to the right bank of the Orakonui Stream, thence northerly along that bank to the point of commencement.

"Thirdly": All that area situated in Blocks XIV and XV, Whakamaru Survey District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the centre line of State Highway No. 32 opposite the westernmost corner of Lot 2, D.P. S. 13179 in Block XIV, Whakamaru Survey District, and proceeding thence generally north-easterly to and along the generally southern and eastern boundaries of Lots 3 and 1, D.P. Before the Broadcasting Tribunal

DECISION

MR Simpson lodged a complaint with the Broadcasting Corporation concerning the Morning Report programme broadcast on the National Programme on Friday, 27 July 1984. The item concerned a report of the opening of the New Zealand diplomatic post in New Delhi and included a voice report by an Indian journalist and a short interview with the Indian caretaker of the New Zealand High Commission land. At the conclusion of the item the announcer added "and we swear Peter Sellers was nowhere in sight."

MR Simpson expressed his complaint thus:

"The well known comedian, the later Peter Sellers, considered it amusing to imitate the accents of Indian speakers of English which he apparently thought were *ipso facto* funny and this was in its turn a reference in the Morning Report item to the interview which had just taken place. Clearly your announcer thought that it too was *ipso facto* funny because of the nature of the pronunciation used."

Section 24 of the Broadcasting Act 1976 provides:

(1) The corporation shall be responsible for maintaining, in its programmes and their presentation, standards, which will be generally acceptable in the community, and in particular it shall have regard to—

(c) The observance of standards of good taste and decency;

(d) The accurate and impartial gathering and presentation of news, according to recognised standards of objective journalism;

Mr Simpson considered both those requirements had been breached. He said he did not believe it amusing or acceptable to make fun of the manner of speaking of particular individuals. He said the announcer would be deeply hurt if an English person were to poke fun at the "colonial" way in which the announcer spoke. Whatever may have been the acceptability of humour in the original joke of Peter Sellers, it is no longer regarded as anything but very bad taste to make "jokes" of this sort, he said.

Mr Simpson also offered the view that it was the announcer's job to present the news and no part of his task to add extraneous comments of one sort or another.

The corporation did not uphold the complaint. It had regard to the continued acceptance among the public of recordings of the late Peter Sellers in which he portrayed "Indian" accents.

In referring the application to the Tribunal Mr Simpson claimed the corporation had failed to understand the nature of the complaint.

"While the public at large might find the portrayal of Indian accents amusing it is not in their amusement or lack of it that the failure of taste lies. If I may suggest a parallel circumstance in Germany between 1933 and 1945, jokes of an anti-Semitic nature were probably perfectly acceptable to the public at large. But they were not acceptable to an important minority group, i.e. the Jewish religionists of Germany. In this matter similarly. The mark of a civilised society is to recognise that what we might find entertaining might be extremely hurtful to a minority of our fellow citizens. In this case I am sure that people of Indian extraction or culture can see nothing funny about the way they speak being gayed by a radio announcer. That in my view is unacceptable and is regarded as bad taste by the community at large."

In a submission to the Tribunal the Broadcasting Corporation noted that the item updated a report well established in the public consciousness, i.e. that the then new New Zealand Government was to reinstate diplomatic representation in India. The report presented a mainly human interest aspect, said the corporation, together with a subsidiary element of local reaction. In tone and thrust it was a lighter though factual "down the bulletin" type of story. Bearing that in mind and taking the scripted introduction and actuality as one report, the corporation found it difficult to see that the obiter dictum of the presenter which is the substance of the complaint did detract from accuracy and impartiality.

With regard to good taste and decency the corporation said that the mere mention of the name of Peter Sellers was sufficient to evoke in the minds of listeners a complete frame of humorous reference, the satirical aspects of which were rarely unkind. It also noted the long standing and widely acclaimed performances of Peter Sellers.

The recordings continue to be requested and their playing was not accompanied by written or oral complaint alleging infringements of good taste and decency. The presenter's aside coming after nearly 2 minutes of heavily Indian accented English might also be said to have added a nice touch, said the corporation. If it is possible to say anyone has a smile in their voice, a close listening to the tape will discern that the presenter has just that. There was no element of racial denigration in the item to warrant the upholding of a taste and decency charge, said the corporation.

The corporation observed that Radio New Zealand's Morning Report presenters were deliberately called presenters as distinct from newscasters. They have scope to make light or whimsical comment as may seem appropriate especially when the news may happen to be heavy or dreary. The corporation added that the days when radio news bulletins could be branded as stiff and starchy were long since gone and it was such innocent *ad libitum* comment, such as that which was the subject of this complaint, that had helped to give today's report programmes life and an appreciative audience.

The humour of the situation had been picked up by a Wellington suburban newspaper which made a similar allusion.

The complainant's drawing upon anti-Semitic jokes for comparison purposes was not considered exact or tenable by the corporation.

There had been no phone or written complaints following the programme apart from Mr Simpson's. In view of the not inconsiderable resident ethnic Indian population in New Zealand it was not unreasonable to expect an adverse reaction had the remarks been interpreted and been seen by them and the community at large in the way the complainant alleges. The corporation said it was understood that there were many of Indian extraction who had found the Peter Sellers imitations of their manner of speaking to be highly amusing.

The difficulty Mr Simpson faces is that he had presumed to complain on behalf of the Indian population of New Zealand not about a mimicry of an Indian New Zealander's accent nor indeed of mimicry of an Indian's use of English. He has complained about a reference to a comedian who among other things is known for his now rather dated mimicry of the intonation of English when spoken as a second language by some Indians. If some particular mimicry may have been offensive it is certainly difficult to see that a mere reference to Peter Sellers could have evoked the memory in such a vivid way as to infringe standards of good taste and decency.

Mr Simpson's dislike of the use of asides in the report programme is a matter of style. It is not a matter for the Tribunal to consider on a formal complaint.

The Tribunal cannot see that the presenter's reference in any way affected the impartiality or objectivity of the report. The Tribunal cannot uphold the complaint in that respect.

The Tribunal is of course concerned that on the one hand the freedom of speech and indeed the freedom of humour should not be circumscribed by perceived slights or stereotypes whether it be by mimicry or caricature. Are lawyers to be offended because of pompous voices used to suggest that the lawyer is speaking, or judges to complain because the stereotype of the judge is of a somewhat absentminded, unwordly old man?

In India, English has been adapted. Mr Fali S. Nariman, a senior advocate of the Supreme Court Bar of India, wrote recently (1985 NZLJ 8 at page 9):

"The legal system in India has much in common with the English language—both were originally imported from abroad. Over the course of over 300 years, each has become distinctively Indian. The language as spoken and written in India has the same alphabet and conforms to the same rules of grammar—but the idioms, the expressive phrases and even the pronunciation of words are different. Many new words have crept in.

We have institutionalised and localised the English language; as some wit said, it has become English. So with the legal system."

The Tribunal considers there is a danger to our freedom of speech if we are not able to speak English with a French accent to tell a joke about a French person, or to imitate any accent of any other nationality for humorous effect. It is only when such behaviour is destructive that there is a breach of good taste. That is not the case here.

The New Zealand and Australian use of English is often lampooned.

Any attempt to impose personal concepts of good taste and decency are a dangerous precedent to others with narrow views on particular conduct to impose their own personal tastes and moral codes on viewers and listeners.

Any attempt to impose sectional moral standards on other members of the community via broadcasting when they do not reflect broadly based community attitudes needs to be resisted in the interests of both broadcasters and those who listen to them.

The complaint is not upheld.

Co-opted Members

The Tribunal co-opted Messrs Kerekere and Pradhan as persons whose qualifications or experience were likely to be of assistance to the Tribunal in dealing with the complaint. They took part in the deliberations of the Tribunal but the decision is that of the permanent members.

Warrant Holder: Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand (Television One);

Chairman: B. H. Slane.

Members: A. E. Wilson and R. Boyd-Bell.

RULING ON JURISDICTION

Mr Simpson complained that on 1 June as part of a scheduled sporting item on "Sport on One", Television One broadcast live coverage of the first rugby test between New Zealand and England. Mr Simpson complained that the broadcast was not in accordance with section 24 (1). The relevant portions of section 24 read:

"24. Responsibility of corporation for programme standards—

(1) The corporation shall be responsible for maintaining, in its programmes and their presentation, standards which will be generally acceptable in the community, and in particular it shall have regard to—

(a) The provision of a range of programmes which will cater in a balanced way for the varied interests of different sections of the community;

(b) The need to ensure that a New Zealand identity is developed and maintained in programmes;

(c) The observance of standards of good taste and decency;

(d) The accurate and impartial gathering and presentation of news, according to recognised standards of objective journalism;

(e) The principle that when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made to present significant points of view either in the same programme or in other programmes within the period of current interest;

(f) The maintenance of law and order;

(g) The privacy of the individual."

Mr Simpson complained that the broadcast was in breach of section 24 (1) (a).

"It seems to me that taken in conjunction with the total amount of time devoted in your broadcast to rugby football and others of the same ilk retailing the activities of the same sport fails to meet the criteria of range, balance and variety. I say this because I believe it is the responsibility of the corporation to reflect in its programmes the leisure interests of the community (which includes sport) and that rugby is taking up far too great a proportion of the programming. This means conversely the exclusion of other activities which might as validly feature but which are rarely seen or heard in your programmes if at all."

He then quoted some figures to support his argument and pointed out that "knitting, which emerged as being as popular as rugby, has never been featured as far as I am aware." He then dealt with other sports and their coverage.

Section 95B governs formal complaints about the corporation's programmes.

95B. *Formal complaints about corporations' programmes:*

(1) It shall be the duty of the Broadcasting Corporation—

(a) To receive and consider formal complaints about any programme broadcast by the corporation where the complaint constitutes, in respect of that programme, an allegation that the corporation has failed to comply—

(i) With the obligation (imposed by section 24 (1) of this Act) to maintain in its programmes and their presentation, standards which will be generally acceptable in the community;

(ii) With the obligation (imposed by section 24 (1) (c) of this Act) to have regard to the observance of standards of good taste and decency;

(iii) With the obligation (imposed by section 24 (1) (d) of this Act) to have regard to the accurate and impartial gathering and presentation of news, according to recognised standards of objection journalism;

(iv) With the obligation (imposed by section 24 (1) (e) of this Act) to have regard to the principle that when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made to present significant points of view either in the same programme or in other programmes within the period of current interest;

(v) With the obligation (imposed by section 24 (1) (f) of this Act) to have regard to the maintenance of law and order;

(iv) With the obligation imposed by section 24 (2) of this Act in respect of the broadcasting in cinematograph films:

(b) To establish procedures for investigating any complaint under paragraph (a) of this subsection and any complaint under section 950 (1) (b) of this Act.

(2) Every complaint under subsection (1) (a) of this section shall be lodged in writing with the secretary.

(3) Nothing in subsection (1) (a) of this section applies in respect of—

(a) An alleged failure to comply with the obligation imposed by paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) or paragraph (g) of section 24 (1) of this Act; or

(b) A complaint to which section 950 (1) (b) of this Act applies.

Subsection (3) of section 95B clearly states that an alleged failure to comply with section 24 (1) (a) of the Act is excluded from the formal complaints procedure. Mr Simpson accepted the corporation's response to that effect. But he noted that under 95B (1) (a) (i) he was entitled to complain about an alleged failure to comply with the obligation to maintain in its programmes and their presentation, standards which will be generally acceptable in the community. Mr Simpson argued that those standards required balance and variety in what was broadcast.

He referred the complaint back to the corporation which did not uphold it.

The corporation noted that 1 031 000 viewers aged 5 and over or nearly a third of the population watched the game about which he complained. It also said an analysis of coverage given to all sports events in 1984-85 showed that rugby coverage amounted to 6.06 percent of the output which was not considered excessive or unacceptable. His complaint was not upheld. Mr Simpson claimed that the response was not a proper one, writing again to the corporation stating:

"My complaint did not deal with the appropriateness of carrying rugby football items *per se*. It dealt with the relative coverage of that sporting activity in comparison of the coverage of other activities both sporting and more generally in the field of leisure. It was in relation to these that it was remarked that the coverage of rugby football was disproportionate, i.e. excessive in that sense rather than as an isolated phenomenon."

The corporation would not again reconsider the complaint and suggested Mr Simpson exercise his right to refer the complaint to the Broadcasting Tribunal.

On 9 September 1985 Mr Simpson filed a formal complaint with the Tribunal. However Mr Simpson made no further attempt to articulate his complaint, merely referring the Tribunal to the correspondence—an unsatisfactory approach—and the Tribunal has first to decide whether or not it has any jurisdiction to deal with the complaint.

Section 24 (1) sets out the responsibility of the corporation generally to maintain standards which will be acceptable in the community. It then requires the corporation in particular to have regard to the matters listed (a) to (g).

Part XIA provides a code for complaints. Section 95A sets out some principles which include:

Broadcasting attracts complaints.

Warrant holders have a responsibility to deal with them and must establish a proper procedure to do so.

An independent complaints procedure must also be available.

Complaints based merely on a complainant's preferences are not, in general, capable of being resolved by a complaints procedure.

Section 95B sets out the corporation's obligations in relation to formal complaints. It must receive and consider formal complaints about any programme broadcast by the corporation where the complaint constitutes an allegation that the corporation has failed to comply with the obligation imposed by section 24 (1) of the Act to maintain in its programmes and their presentation the standards which will be generally acceptable in the community. This is a general obligation.

But subsection (3) of section 95B provides that nothing in section 95B (1) (a) applies in respect of an alleged failure to comply with the obligation imposed by section 24 (1) (a)—the provision of a range of programmes which will cater in a balanced way for the varied interests of different sections of the community.

That paragraph exactly describes the complaint which Mr Simpson made. Indeed Mr Simpson specifically made the complaint because of that provision. He agreed, when it was pointed out to him, that it was not a provision about which a formal complaint could be lodged. He then endeavoured to bring the complaint within the general standard suggesting that the disproportionate amount of rugby broadcasting was a breach of the standards which are generally acceptable in the community.

This cannot be done. The substance of the complaint is one which the Act specifically provides may not be dealt with as part of the complaints procedure.

To do so would create another body (ultimately the Broadcasting Tribunal by reference) which would be responsible for the programming of the stations. The corporation clearly has that responsibility and can deal with informal complaints, objections or preferences that Mr Simpson might lodge with it.

But the formal complaints procedure is not available to him.

There is therefore no complaint which the corporation need have considered under the Act. That being the case there is no basis for referring the complaint to the Broadcasting Tribunal.

The Tribunal therefore will not determine the complaint. It has no power to do so.

DECISION

THE Broadcasting Tribunal called for applications to be filed for commercial FM warrants for the Horowhenua area and two were filed. Two applications for AM warrants were also filed and the Tribunal resolved to deal with all the applications at one set of hearings.

Applicants

Radio Horowhenua Ltd. applied for an AM warrant to operate from studios in Levin and Paraparaumu through a transmitter sited at Otaki. The station proposed to broadcast a programme with local content provided through the 2 studios on weekdays between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. From 7 p.m. to midnight it would rebroadcast 2ZM's programme. From midnight to 5 a.m. Radio Horowhenua would rebroadcast the Radio New Zealand community network All-Nighter. From 5 a.m. to 6 a.m. it would rebroadcast the ZM network Breakfast Show. All these programmes originate from Wellington.

On Sundays the station would broadcast the Radio New Zealand community network from 5 a.m. to 8 a.m. and would switch to local origination from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. From 5 p.m. to midnight it would take up the 2ZM programme and from midnight to 5 a.m. the Radio New Zealand community network All-Nighter.

The programmes locally originated would primarily serve the 15-44 age group.

Estimated sales in the first year would result in gross revenue of \$612,360 which, after expenses, would produce a trading profit of \$22,218. After deducting pre-operating expenses the anticipated first year loss is \$173,482.

The station expected to produce a profit of \$60,864 in the second year in which inflation was estimated at 13 percent. In the third year a profit of \$117,817 was predicted on a 10 percent inflation factor.

The applicant proposed to broadcast on 1377 kHz.

Golden Coast Radio Ltd. applied for an FM warrant. The station proposed to broadcast 18 hours a day from 6 a.m. until midnight playing a wide range of popular music: selections from the early '50s to hits of the day, but including easy listening music and other forms beyond that of a normal AM station's contemporary golden oldies and pop. The station anticipated gross revenue in the first year of \$460,000, and after expenses, a net trading profit of \$21,072.

United Broadcasters Ltd. proposed an FM station operating 24 hours a day. From 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. it would originate its own programmes and outside those hours it would rebroadcast 2XS Palmerston North. It would also rebroadcast the 2XS programme on Sundays. During the daylight saving period in the summer, the station would broadcast locally sourced programmes from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday to Saturday and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays.

It would include a heavy concentration of adult album-oriented music. The programme would be diverse, including music from classical through jazz, gospel and country to contemporary music during the 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. period.

The site of the transmitter would give good coverage to the Kapiti area right through to Levin and north.

Capital City Radio Ltd., warrant holder for Radio Windy in Wellington, applied for an AM warrant to broadcast a 24 hour service with local origination from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily. For the remaining hours the station would rebroadcast Radio Windy's programme.

The station would be based in Levin and would serve Levin and surrounding districts and would not aim to serve the Kapiti coast area.

The station would aim to provide an extremely varied programme format—an "all things to all people" approach. Music would not be the dominant element of the programme format but music research would be carried out.

Manawatu—At the conclusion of the hearings of the present applications, the Tribunal had to consider applications for FM warrants for the Manawatu region. It was necessary to consider the applications in that area and make a decision on them before the present decision, since the Tribunal needed to know what other programme services were to be available in much of the Horowhenua region. The reason is that the transmissions of FM programmes by VHF from Mount Wharite will extend down the coast where a considerable part of the population, notably in Levin and coastal regions south of Levin, will be able to obtain a stereo programme from Palmerston North.

As the Tribunal has resolved to grant both Manawatu applications, there will be two programmes of equal signal strength available providing FM programmes originating in the one case in Palmerston North, and in the other case partly in Palmerston North and partly by network from Wellington.

This does have an effect on the issue which was argued before us as to the respective merits of local stations broadcasting in AM or FM.

Consideration—Two of the applicants proposed FM programmes. For reasons which we examine in detail, it became clear that the Golden Coast case was the weaker. No evidence in support of the application was produced beyond verification of the information filed with the application.

The AM contenders argued for AM as the best way to satisfy the needs of the region. The FM contenders argued for FM as a new service needed in the region. These arguments are examined later.

The Tribunal has to say that of the two AM applications and the United application there were a number of balancing factors which has made the decision a difficult one. Each had a number of advantages which it would bring by undertaking a broadcast service to the area, but each of the applications also had some disadvantages.

Section 80—In considering the applications the Tribunal, before determining whether or not to grant the applications, had regard to the following matters set out in section 80 of the Broadcasting Act 1976, so far as they were applicable.

(a) *The extent to which the proposed service is desirable in the public interest*

Radio Horowhenua proposed a station with twin studios at each end of the coverage area and good AM coverage over the Levin and Kapiti areas. The station claimed it would tend to unite the area which had recently changed in local government administration to a united council region. It saw the Kapiti market as promising but wished to provide a programme on a regional basis over the whole area.

It saw its link with the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand through an affiliation agreement as a strengthening factor, as was its access to specialist programme elements from Radio New Zealand which it could use in periods of local origination.

It would rebroadcast Radio New Zealand programmes from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Its original plan was to rebroadcast 2ZM's programme. However the grant of the warrant for 2ZM to change to FM in Wellington and now the Tribunal's decision to grant a ZM-FM station in Palmerston North, means that Radio Horowhenua would have to rebroadcast some other service of Radio New Zealand. This may be the 2ZB programme up to 9 p.m. and thereafter the Tonight Show and then the All-Nighter programme.

AM applicants argued that the high level of community news and information provided makes AM the appropriate way of getting through to the mass audience and that it provides a better service to motorists.

Capital City Radio also supported AM broadcasting but would base it on a Levin operation. The programme would be aligned to the needs of Levin whose population is somewhat older than the national average.

Besides a local news service which all the applicants offered, there would be the introduction into the area of the Radio Windy news—an alternative to the services of Radio New Zealand and 2XS. This would not be the first alternative news since the news service from 2XS would include national and international news supplied by Radio Avon.

Capital City Radio took the view that Levin was the primary market, that programming should be directed towards that market and that it was not practicable to attempt to serve the whole diverse region. The southern end of the region was more Wellington oriented and the combination would not make a coherent market. The essentials of the Capital City case were that it would provide in all respects no duplication of existing services and would be a well programmed station. When local programmes were not being originated the station would rebroadcast the Radio Windy Wellington programme.

United proposed a service which would initially provide 7 hours a day of local origination but with longer hours in the summer and with an increase in the second year.

The station would rebroadcast the 2XS programme. This AM signal at present reaches most of the area but does not cover some significant parts of the Kapiti area. The FM service from Wharite will be better but not complete. The United programming appeared to provide for a younger age group in the breakfast session, changing to a 40 plus audience in the morning but later returning to the 2XS transmission which is described as 15-44.

We gained the impression that the applicants were really more oriented to the older age group and we considered that this sharp change in programming might cause practical problems in audience support. We found the evidence of Mr McPherson for United somewhat confusing on programme proposals, as he appeared to want to convince the Tribunal that he could produce music that would appeal to all age groups at the same time.

Golden Coast Radio would have a range of music from the 50s to current hits, with an emphasis on easy listening but claimed a contemporary sounding image. We are not convinced that the programming style had been completely defined by the promoter and there was no evidence produced to support the application. We were thus not able to examine their programme proposals in detail with those who conceived them or would put them into effect.

The advantage of the United FM proposal diminishes with the grant of the warrants in Palmerston North which necessarily produce a signal which will be strong enough to provide stereo reception in much of the area. But neither Palmerston North programme will be intended to serve this area specifically with locally oriented material. United would provide that service and would provide in addition an acceptable signal to those parts of the southern end of the area which are geographically masked from the Wharite transmissions.

The United station itself would be oriented towards the southern end of the region and may have had difficulty marketing itself in the Levin area. While normally we might have felt the emphasis should be on providing a stereo FM music service, we did not consider that the programme elements which they would introduce for the area outweighed the desirability of the services produced by the AM applicants.

Of the two AM applicants, in programming terms each brought a community station approach (as indeed would United) that is well known and accepted. The principal difference was that the Radio Horowhenua applicant proposes, through the split studio operation, to provide programmes which have sufficient local orientation to appeal while covering the whole region. We are not necessarily satisfied that the twin studio approach is essential to success in serving the whole region but we considered that there was, on balance, a marked advantage in providing a service to the whole area. This was not proposed by Capital City Radio although its signal would probably be adequate in all parts of the region. (We cannot be sure of this because the exact location of the transmitter had not been confirmed.)

The essence of the Capital City application was an "all things to all people" service for the borough of Levin and environs. The primary target area is important not just from a marketing point of view, but also from the point of view of the attractiveness of the service to people in the region. It was no secret that the Capital City witnesses did not expect the station to draw much support from the Kapiti region. They would not be directing their programming or their marketing far in the southern direction.

This attitude is illustrated by the acceptance of the possibility of an FM applicant being granted a warrant for the Kapiti area.

Radio Horowhenua's connection with Radio New Zealand had both its advantages and disadvantages. It would duplicate programmes between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. from other Radio New Zealand stations which can already be received in the area. On the other hand, Capital City Radio's rebroadcast of Radio Windy would be an additional service.

Having regard however to the listening audiences available during these hours, we did not think this factor should be given undue weight.

This is particularly so having regard to the fact that, in most of the area the younger listener who was likely to make up most of the audience at that time, and who looks for a music service, will be able to receive a ZM-FM programme from either Mount Kaukau or Mount Wharite. As well as that the 2XS-FM programme will be available to those within reach of the Wharite signal.

Capital City Radio pressed on us the advantages to the industry of the training role the Levin station would perform. We did give that some weight but do not consider it should, in this case, be regarded as a decisive factor. That role, to a greater or lesser extent, has been traditional at smaller stations, although the more active involvement of private station executives is a new factor. While we would not like to discourage such initiatives in the private industry towards training—as they have been rare—we must observe that the training aspects to some extent would occur with other applicants' proposals.

(b) *The economic effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates is likely to have in respect of broadcasting stations already in operation*

The BCNZ did not oppose the applications on the ground of an effect on 2ZA. Nor was any evidence produced of the estimated effect.

Mr L. Summerville gave evidence of the revenue taken by station 2XS from the Levin area which was about \$70,000 per annum. He said that the establishment of another station in the area would not diminish the interest of 2XS in servicing the area, but there were limits to the service it could provide to advertisers in view of the size of the market.

(c) *The effect which the establishment of the station to which the application relates may have on broadcasting services provided by the Corporation in the public interest*

The corporation did not suggest there would be any adverse effect caused by any of the proposed stations on the broadcast services it provided. The grant of the application to Radio Horowhenua Ltd. would produce some revenue for Radio New Zealand which would contribute to the cost of producing broadcasting services in the public interest.

(d) *The needs of New Zealand or the locality or localities proposed to be served, in respect of broadcasting services*

The predominant need the Tribunal saw in the area was for the provision of a locally oriented service both reflecting and involved in the community's activities and providing information and news to listeners in the area. All the applicants claimed to provide such services.

United would provide a continuous service in FM and extend the FM coverage to those areas in the south where it is not reached by main transmitters. That service would however duplicate for much of the day the signal of 2XS.

Golden Coast Radio would provide FM coverage for 18 hours daily.

The Capital City Radio proposal would meet the local programming needs in the Levin area, but would not provide a service further afield.

Radio Horowhenua would provide a service over the whole area. While there is obviously some merit in the argument that the size of the region makes it difficult for a station to target its news and information directly to the immediate concerns of all its audience, we felt on balance that the communities of the region were not so distinct and separate that the station could not provide a good regional service for the area.

AM radio also has advantages in serving local events in outside broadcasts since the FM mode tends to highlight the deficiencies in sound quality which can arise in temporary outside broadcasting, but this was not a decisive factor.

(e) *The financial and commercial ability of the applicant to carry on the proposed service*

We were not satisfied that Golden Coast Radio had sufficient financial and commercial ability and we had no opportunity to examine the directors or management on their proposals.

It appeared to us that a good deal of revenue could be derived from the Levin area by a successful station's marketing. There was some debate as to whether or not sufficient revenue could be drawn from Levin to sustain the Capital City Radio project. On balance we are not prepared to dismiss Mr Gold's estimates. We find that the revenue would be adequate.

However, we are also satisfied that there would be additional revenue available over the whole region without any diminution of Levin revenue. The result is that the Radio Horowhenua application should have the potential to attract more revenue.

The AM stations will have a greater set penetration and therefore the ability to attract—initially anyway—a higher revenue because of the reach to listeners.

This would not have been a sufficient factor for us to reject the United application since we believe it is only a matter of time before the set penetration will place FM stations on a nearly equal basis with AM in such situations.

With the exception of Golden Coast Radio, we found all the applicants had the necessary financial and commercial ability. The obvious ability of Mr Gold and other executives of Radio Windy had however to be considered in the light of their proposal to operate the station to some extent as a training operation with younger and less experienced staff. The support and experience of Radio Windy staff would tend to minimise this disadvantage.

Mr D. A. Campbell of Radio Horowhenua has had experience working in short term broadcasts and has proved to have put together a detailed and well researched application which indicates both financial backing and a commercial ability to carry on the proposed activity.

The United application also met these requirements.

(f) The likelihood of the applicant carrying on the proposed service satisfactorily

We have, in fairness to other applicants, to take into account the fact that Capital City Radio Ltd. has not always carried on its services satisfactorily. Its last warrant was renewed for less than the maximum period of 5 years because of a breach of warrant condition.

There was no other reason to expect that the service would not be carried on satisfactorily.

We did not have confidence in the Golden Coast Radio applicant in this respect. We did not have an opportunity to hear evidence from any of those, other than Mr Little, who would be concerned with the operations of the station.

It is no reflection on Mr Little to say that the evidence as to management left us in no position to be satisfied that the applicant had the ability to so carry on the service.

We concluded all the other applicants would carry on their proposed services satisfactorily.

(g) The results of any survey available to the Tribunal

Horowhenua Reactions to FM Radio, a research paper prepared by McComish Research Ltd., was produced on behalf of United Broadcasters Ltd. It related to the trial broadcasts during the 1982/83 short term authorisation.

While too much reliance cannot be placed on the survey, based as it was on a short term broadcast period, it did show a considerable interest in FM broadcasting by listeners in the area. One in four said they would listen to their favourite music station more if it broadcast in stereo FM and 80 percent said that if another station were to broadcast in stereo FM they would listen to it instead of their present station.

The survey was confined to respondents aged over 25 years.

Most of the respondents will be able to receive FM broadcasts under the new proposals and we consider that the present predominant interest in that mode by younger audiences is likely to be met by the transmissions from the major sites.

A survey was also prepared arising out of Radio Kapiti's short term broadcasting authorisation the same summer. It was to determine the proportions of people listening to 2XL and its listenership. Radio Horowhenua is a descendant of Radio Kapiti.

Likewise we put only limited weight on this survey for the reasons above stated.

(h) The requirement that frequencies be best utilised in the public interest

The Radio Horowhenua and Capital City Radio applications do involve the commitment of an AM frequency but one is available.

On balance the Tribunal would have preferred to have seen the FM spectrum used to serve the area but considers that programming considerations should predominate. In the case of each applicant one frequency would be used.

(i) The desirability of avoiding monopolies in the ownership or control of news media

None of the proposals would have produced a monopoly or tendency to monopoly. It is however convenient here to discuss news matters.

The Windy news service would be provided through Capital City Radio with a local bulletin added to a national and international news bulletin edited in Wellington.

United would provide a local news service, supplying the news to the 2XS newsroom for editing. During periods of local origination, local bulletins would be broadcast. Outside those times some local news would be fed to 2XS for inclusion in their local bulletins. One full-time and one part-time journalist would work under the supervision of Radio 2XS's News Editor.

Radio Horowhenua proposed to take a national and international service from Radio New Zealand, with local bulletins prepared by its own staff based in Levin and Paraparaumu.

(j) The hours during which the applicant proposes to broadcast programmes

Golden Coast Radio would broadcast for 18 hours a day.

The other stations would all broadcast for 24 hours a day but the periods of local origination varied.

The lowest was United which would provide 7 hours a day on weekdays and no local origination on Sundays. It would however increase the local origination during daylight saving time to 10 hours. In the second stage of development, not later than 3 years after starting broadcasting, the hours of local origination would be increased from 7 to 10.

Radio Horowhenua would provide local programming from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday to Saturday. On Sundays the station would broadcast locally from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Local origination would be increased 3 hours daily in the summertime from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.

Capital City Radio proposed 13 hours local origination from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily. The hours would be reviewed after one year with a view to increasing them.

The advantage to the local listeners of locally originated programmes would arise from the grant of a warrant to either Capital City Radio or Radio Horowhenua Ltd. There is a slight advantage with Radio Horowhenua because of the proposed increase during the summer periods.

(k) The extent of advertising matter which the applicant proposes to broadcast

In each case the extent of advertising matter during links with other stations would be governed by the advertising policies of those other stations.

United proposed a smaller content—6 minutes per hour—than would be the case on 2XS when it was being rebroadcast.

Capital City Radio claimed that there was an advantage in a local community station having a high advertising content.

No applicant had an unusually high or low proposed level of advertising.

We do not find any advantage to any particular application on this ground.

(l) Proposed rates and charges to be made in respect of advertising programmes

The Golden Coast rates were out of line with the others.

The other rates and charges appeared to have been carefully considered but we do not find that there is any particular advantage as far as the Tribunal is concerned in one or other of the stations' proposed rates.

It should of course be noted that one of the advantages of local programming is to provide a service at a reasonable price for local advertisers which is not at present available from nearby larger stations.

(m) All relevant evidence or representations received by it at the hearing

There were no matters requiring special consideration under this heading. All relevant evidence and representations received at the hearing have been considered under the other headings.

(n) Such other matters as may be prescribed in regulations on that behalf

Regulation 15A of the Broadcasting Regulations requires the Tribunal to have regard to Government policy for the development of FM broadcasting as an integral part of sound broadcasting in New Zealand. The Tribunal has carefully considered this and regards it as a factor of some importance.

However, in considering this particular region and its present needs and its existing lack of any community radio station, the situation is not typical. In addition, FM services from Mount Wharite and Mount Kaukau will provide stereo service into most of the area.

We should observe at this stage that it may well be that some relay stations should be established at the Mount Field site proposed by United to provide a good FM service to that end of the region. Whether it would be practicable or not to do that with some local origination would need to be assessed by United or any other potential applicant. We do consider however that Radio Horowhenua will have to be prepared to accept that the need to provide some FM service in that specific part of the region might best be met by such an approach. The Tribunal has an open mind.

The Tribunal decided the revenue available to be drawn from the area would not at this stage support the grant of the United application as well as the Radio Horowhenua application.

Neither could the combination of the United FM service from Kapiti and the Capital City AM service from Levin be sustained by available revenue in the region. A more modest FM application based on a lower revenue input with lower hours of origination may have some appeal in the future.

An argument put to us is appropriately considered under this heading. It relates to the effect of Regulation 20 of the Broadcasting Regulations 1977. It was argued that one shareholder of Capital City Radio Ltd. (Brierley Investments) had the maximum number of prescribed interests allowed under the regulations and that the grant of another one would be impossible. It was submitted for Capital City Radio that the Tribunal should deal with the matter on its merits and if necessary get Capital City Radio to consider a different structure which would not offend the regulations.

However, we have been able to make our decision on the merits of the applications and the various factors involved, rather than on the basis of whether or not there is a legal bar. In any event the Tribunal would have had to consider the request by Capital City Radio mentioned above. We would also have had to decide the effects of extending the interests of that shareholder.

The Tribunal has concluded that the application of Radio Horowhenua Ltd. should be granted and the other applications declined.

In spite of the evidence of Mr Rayner about the twin studio approach, we are satisfied the successful applicant will serve the region well and efficiently. The duplication of Radio New Zealand programming was a factor we gave considerable weight to, but nevertheless found overall this proposal the most suitable.

The application will be granted on the following conditions:

1. The warrant will lapse if not issued within 18 months or such later period as may be allowed by the Tribunal.
2. The station may network with Radio New Zealand stations.
3. A limit of 15 percent on news media shareholders.
4. Minimum hours of origination will be as applied for. The increased hours will apply from the beginning of year two.
5. Other usual conditions.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. *Statement of Accounting Policies—*1.1 *General Accounting Policies*

The going concern concept has been adopted in the preparation of these accounts, with historical cost as the measurement base.

Accrual accounting is used to match income expenses.

1.2 *Particular Accounting Policies*(a) *Current Assets and Investments*

All current assets and investments are shown at cost with the exception of government and local authority stocks. Government and local authority securities are regarded as long term investments and are redeemable at maturity at their face value. These securities are valued at cost, adjusted by the amortisation of the discount or premium on purchase, on a straight line basis over the term of the stock. The discount or premium is calculated after adjusting for interest accrued in the purchase price.

The realisable value of fixed interest securities fluctuates with movement in market yields and it is customary for such fluctuations to be disregarded in the reporting of the results of the long term institutional investor.

(b) *Personal Loans*

The Bank's policy is to add interest to the advance at the commencement of the loan. The 'rule of 78' method of accounting for income is used to apportion the income between accounting periods. The effect of this method is that income earned over the term of the loan represents a level rate of return on the declining loan balance outstanding. The personal loan investment is net of unearned interest.

(c) *Depreciation*

Fixed assets are depreciated on the straight-line method at rates which will write off the cost over their estimated useful lives. The principal rates are:

(d) *Taxation*

The charge for income tax is the amount of the tax liability in respect of the accounting profit for the year and includes both current and deferred tax.

The liability for deferred taxation arises from items of income and expenditure being included in taxation calculations in periods different from those in which they are dealt with in the financial accounts. The significant timing differences relate to accrued interest income, discounts earned and premiums paid on Government Securities and depreciation.

1.3 *Changes in Accounting Policies*

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in prior years.
