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## PROPOSED ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES: 1986

*Proposed Boundaries of the Maori Electoral Districts in New Zealand*

The Representation Commission appointed in pursuance of Section 15 of the Electoral Act 1956 hereby publishes, in accordance with the provisions of section 23 of the said Act the proposed boundaries of the four Maori electoral districts in New Zealand, and further gives notice that written objections, to the same, will be received by the undersigned the Chairman of the Commission at the office of the Secretary of Justice, Department of Justice, Private Bag, Postal Centre, Wellington not later than Monday the 8th day of December 1986 for consideration by the aforesaid Commission. If objectors wish to appear before the Commission they must say so in their written objections.

The Commission will hear objections in Wellington Christchurch and Auckland commencing late January 1987. If objectors wish to appear before the Commission they must say so, indicating the venue they wish to be heard at, in their written objections.

Maps of the proposed districts may be seen at the office of any city or borough council, district or county council, district community council, or town board, or the office of the Chief Surveyor at Auckland, Hamilton, Gisborne, Napier, New Plymouth, Wellington, Blenheim, Nelson, Hokitika, Christchurch, Dunedin and Invercargill or the office of the Chief Electoral Officer at Lower Hutt, all Registrar of Electors offices and District Courts.

Counties, districts, wards (ridings) cities, boroughs, district communities and town districts where mentioned in this notice shall unless otherwise stated, be those existing on 4 March 1986.

**SCHEDULE**

**NORTHERN MAORI—Population 37 280**

Comprises the existing Northern Maori Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424.

**EASTERN MAORI—Population 36 975**

Comprises all the existing Eastern Maori Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 together with that portion of the existing Western Maori Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, immediately south of the proposed Northern Maori Electoral District and bounded to the west and south west by the Auckland/Hamilton Motorway, Pahurehure Inlet of the Manukau Harbour, The Furlong, Great South Road, Glenora Road, North Island Main Trunk Railway, Walters Road, Mill Road, Hamlin Road, Clevedon Road, Papakura Cleavdon Road, Clevedon Kaiwaka Road, Wairoa River, Tourist Road, Monument Road and the roads South to Hunua and linking Hunua Papanui and Mangatawhiri and No 2 State Highway east of Mangatawhiri to the existing boundary of the Eastern Maori Electoral District.

**WESTERN MAORI—Population 37 123**

Comprises all the existing Western Maori Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, together with the County of Horowhenua and boroughs of Levin and Otaki and excluding that portion above described as included in the proposed Eastern Maori Electoral District.

**SOUTHERN MAORI—Population 36 488**

Comprises the existing Southern Maori Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, excluding the County of Horowhenua and boroughs of Levin and Otaki.

*Proposed Boundaries and Classification of the General Electoral Districts of New Zealand*

The Representation Commission appointed in pursuance to Section 15 of the Electoral Act 1956 hereby publishes, in accordance with the provisions of section 18 of the said Act, the proposed boundaries of the electoral districts of the North and South Islands of New Zealand and of the classification of those districts required for the purposes of the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977 and, further gives notice that written objections, to the same, will be received by the undersigned, the Chairman of the Commission, at the office of the Secretary of Justice, Department of Justice, Private Bag, Postal Centre, Wellington not later than Monday the 8th day of December 1986 for consideration by the aforesaid Commission.

The Commission will hear objections in Wellington, Christchurch and Auckland commencing late January.

Objections relating to any electorate will be heard in Wellington. Objectors in relation to the electorates north of and including the electorates of Waipa, Tarawera, Matamata and East Cape may choose to have their objections heard in Auckland. Objectors in

relation to the South Island electorates may choose to have their objections heard in Christchurch.

If objectors wish to appear before the Commission they must say so, indicating the venue they wish to be heard at, in their written objections.

Maps of the proposed districts may be seen at the office of any city or borough council, district or county council, district community council, or town board; or the office of the Chief Surveyor at Auckland, Hamilton, Gisborne, Napier, New Plymouth, Wellington, Nelson, Blenheim, Hokitika, Christchurch, Dunedin and Invercargill and the office of the Chief Electoral Officer at Lower Hutt, all Registrar of Electors offices and District Courts.

Counties, districts, wards (ridings), cities, boroughs, district communities, and town districts where mentioned in the notice shall unless otherwise stated, be those existing on 4 March 1986.

The Higher Salaries Commission required districts to be classified as Group A, Group B, Group C and Group D in accordance with the following criteria:

(a) The purpose of the classification is to assist in the determination of allowances under the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977.

(b) Regard is to be had to the difficulty or otherwise of travel within a member's electorate, Group A comprising those electorates within which travel is the least onerous in terms of time and distance.

Group D comprising those electorates within which travel is the most onerous in terms of time and distance, and Groups B and C comprising electorates which fall between those two extremes, Group B being more closely comparable to Group A, and Group C being more closely comparable to Group D.

(c) For the purposes of classifying electorates in accordance with (b) above, the Representation Commission shall not take into consideration islands which are more than 100 kilometres distant from either the North Island or the South Island.

**BAY OF ISLANDS**

Population: 33 482

Classification: Group D

Commencing at the entrance to the Hokianga Harbour and proceeding easterly up the middle of that harbour, the Waihou River and State Highway 1 to and generally southerly along the west boundary of the Bay of Islands County, thence easterly along the north boundary of the Mataraua Riding of the Bay of Islands County to the point of intersection with the Okaihau Branch Railway, thence easterly generally along that Railway and southerly generally along the North Auckland Railway to its intersection with the west boundary of the Towai Riding of the Bay of Islands County, thence southerly along that boundary to the existing Bay of Islands Electoral District boundary as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, thence generally easterly along that boundary to the mean high water mark, thence generally northerly and southerly along that water mark to the point of commencement and including the Three Kings Islands and all other adjacent islands.

**HOBSON**

Population: 33 513

Classification: Group D

Commencing at the entrance to the Kaipara Harbour and proceeding northerly along the mean high water mark of that harbour and west bank of the Wairoa River to and generally westerly along the northern boundaries of the Arapohue and Omana Ridings of the Hobson County along the southern boundary of the Whangarei County and the northern boundary of the Mangapai Riding of the Whangarei County to its intersection with Mangapai Road, thence southerly generally along that road, Monk Road, Mangapai Caves Road and Waipu Caves Road to its intersection with the north boundary of the Waipu Riding of the Whangarei County, thence easterly along that boundary to and northerly along the mean high water mark to its intersection with the proposed boundary of the Bay of Islands Electoral District, thence westerly generally along that boundary to the entrance to the Hokianga Harbour intersection with the high water mark, thence southerly along the mean high water mark to the point of commencement including the Poor Kings, Hen and Chicken, Mokohinau and all other adjacent islands, excluding the proposed Whangarei Electoral District.

**WHANGAREI**

Population: 33 449

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of the Whangarei City boundary and the Nihoteatea Stream, thence easterly generally along that

stream, the Waiponamu Stream and the Raumanga Stream to and southerly along Otaika Road to its intersection with Arcus St, thence east to and south along Limeburners Creek to its intersection with the existing Whangarei Electoral District boundary as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, thence generally easterly, northerly and southerly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

## KAIPARA

Population: 33 256

Classification: Group C

Commencing at the mouth of the Kaipara Harbour and proceeding generally northerly and easterly along the south boundary of the proposed Hobson Electoral District to its intersection with the mean high water mark on the east coast, thence southerly along that water mark to the mouth of the Waiwera River, thence westerly up that river to and southerly along the eastern boundary of the Wainui Riding of the Rodney County to and generally southerly along the East Coast Bays Road, Wrights Road, SH1 and State Highway 18 to its intersection with the Rangitopunui Stream, thence down that stream and up Brighams Creek to and generally westerly along SH16, Kumea River, Trotting Course Drive, Waitakere Road, Access Road, Tawa Road, Motu Road, Trigg Road, westerly to and along School Road, Hinau Road, Cable Road, Valley Road and the Okiritoto Stream to its intersection with the mean high water mark, thence northerly along that mean high water mark to the point of commencement, including Kawau and other adjacent islands.

## ALBANY

Population: 33 132

Classification: Group B

Commencing at the mouth of the Waiwera River being a point on the boundary of the proposed Kaipara Electoral District and proceeding generally southerly along that boundary to the point of intersection of Brighams Creek and mouth of Totara Creek thence southerly up the last mentioned creek to and westerly along Hobsonville Road, to and southerly along Don Buck Road, to and easterly along Royal Road to the middle of Henderson Creek, thence generally north easterly to and along Hellyers Creek, to and north easterly along the south boundary of Albany Urban Ward of Takapuna City to its intersection with East Coast Bays Road, thence northerly along that road to and easterly along the northern boundary of East Coast Bays City to its intersection with the mean high water mark, thence generally northerly along the mean high water mark to the point of commencement and including Tiritiri Matangi Island.

## EAST COAST BAYS

Population: 34 084

Classification: Group A

The existing East Coast Bay Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, but excluding the portion of Takapuna City to the north of the northern boundary of East Coast Bays City.

## NORTH SHORE

Population: 32 885

Classification: Group A

The existing North Shore Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424.

## BIRKENHEAD

Population: 33 708

Classification: Group A

The existing Birkenhead Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, but excluding that portion of the northern boundary bounded by Lynden Avenue, Coronation Road, Hillcrest Avenue and Sylvia Road.

## GLENFIELD

Population: 33 266

Classification: Group A

The existing Glenfield Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 and including that portion on its southern boundary bounded by Lynden Avenue, Coronation Road, Hillcrest Avenue and Sylvia Road but excluding the area of Albany Urban Ward of Takapuna City now included in the proposed Albany Electoral District.

## WEST AUCKLAND

Population: 33 369

Classification: Group B

Commencing at the mouth of the Okiritoto Stream being a point on the boundary of the proposed Kaipara Electoral District and proceeding generally easterly and southerly along that boundary, the boundary of the proposed Albany Electoral District and the boundary of the proposed Te Atatu Electoral District to the intersection of the Henderson Borough Boundary with Bruce McLaren Road, thence southerly generally along that road, Parris Cross Road, West Coast Road and Glengary Road to and southerly along the Glen

Eden Borough boundary and Sharpe Stream for approximately 1 km, thence to and southerly along Scenic Drive, Shaw Road and the boundary of Waitakere Urban Ward of Waitemata City to a point on Exhibition Drive approximately 1 km from Huia Road, thence southerly along that drive and Huia Road to a point approximately 100 metres north east of the Lower Nihotupu Reservoir outlet, thence southerly, to the mean high water mark thence generally westerly along that water mark to the point of commencement.

## TE ATATU

Population: 33 063

Classification: Group A

The existing Te Atatu Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 and including the area bounded by Sturges Road, the Henderson Borough Boundary, Opanuku Stream and a line from a point on the Opanuku Stream approximately 100 metres south west of the north western corner Henderson Valley Reserve, running north west to Sturges Road.

## TITIRANGI

Population: 33 215

Classification: Group A

Commencing at a point on the mean high water mark in Big Muddy Creek being the eastern boundary of the proposed West Auckland Electoral District and proceeding northerly along that boundary and easterly along the southern boundary of the proposed Te Atatu Electoral District to the mean high water mark of the Wairau Creek in the Waitemata Harbour, thence generally easterly along that water mark to a point in line with the extension of the eastern part of Cobham Crescent, thence southerly to and along that Crescent, Brains Road and Archibald Road, to its intersection with the Glen Eden Borough boundary, thence generally southerly along the boundary of that borough and New Lynn Borough to its intersection with the boundary of the existing Waitakere Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, on Titirangi Road, thence generally southerly, easterly and westerly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

## NEW LYNN

Population 32 939

Classification: Group A

Commencing at Te Whau Point in Blockhouse Bay being a point on the mean high water mark of the Manakau Harbour and coinciding with the boundary of the existing New Lynn Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1434, thence westerly along that boundary, to and generally northerly along the eastern boundary of the proposed Titirangi Electoral District to a point on the mean high water mark at the extension of the eastern portion of Cobham Crescent, thence generally north easterly along that water mark to a point near the intersection of the North Western Motorway and Great North Road, thence easterly along that road, southerly along Carrington Road, Woodward Road and Richardson Road to its intersection with Oakley Creek, thence westerly along that creek to its intersection with the boundary of the existing New Lynn Electoral District, thence southerly along that boundary to its intersection with Donovan Street, thence easterly along that street, to and southern along Gilletta Road to the mean high water mark in Lynfield Cove, thence westerly along the mean high water mark to the point of commencement.

## MT ALBERT

Population: 33 148

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of Richardson Road and Oakley Creek being a point on the boundary of the proposed New Lynn Electoral District and proceeding generally northerly along that boundary to the mean high water mark near the intersection of the North Western Motorway and Great North Road, thence generally northerly along that water mark to its intersection with the west boundary of the Grey Lynn Ward of Auckland City, thence southerly along that boundary to and generally easterly along Old Mill Road, Surrey Crescent, Williamson Avenue, Harcourt Street, Great North Road and Bond Street to its intersection with the northern boundary of the existing Mt Albert Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, thence generally easterly, southerly and westerly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

## ROSKILL

Population: 33 027

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of Richardson Road and Oakley Creek being a point on the boundary of the proposed Mt Albert Electoral District and proceeding easterly along the southern boundary of that district, to and along the northern and eastern boundaries of the existing Roskill Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 to its intersection with Goodall Street, thence south easterly along that street to the mean high water mark, thence westerly along that water mark to and generally northerly

along the eastern boundary of the proposed New Lynn Electoral District to the point of commencement.

#### AUCKLAND CENTRAL

Population: 33 098

Classification: Group B

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark and the west boundary of the Grey Lynn Ward of Auckland City being a point on the boundary of the proposed Mt Albert Electoral District, thence easterly along the northern boundary of that Electoral District to and easterly, northerly and westerly along the southern, eastern and northern boundaries of the existing Auckland Central Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, to the point of commencement including Kermadec, Great Barrier, Waiheke and other adjacent islands.

#### EDEN

Population: 32 988

Classification: Group A

The existing Eden Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424.

#### REMUERA

Population: 33 045

Classification: Group A

The existing Remuera Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, and including that area bounded by Green Lane West, Auckland Hamilton Motorway, Walpole Street, Main Highway and Great South Road.

#### TAMAKI

Population: 33 240

Classification: Group A

The existing Tamaki Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, but excluding that portion bounded by Grand Drive, Norman Lesser Drive, Merton Road, the North Island Main Trunk Railway, the Auckland City boundary, College Road and Whitley Avenue.

#### ONEHUNGA

Population: 33 195

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark and Goodall Street in Hillsborough Bay being a point on the eastern boundary of the proposed Roskill Electoral District and proceeding generally northerly along that boundary and generally easterly and northerly along the southern boundaries of the proposed Eden and Remuera Electoral Districts to the northern boundary of the existing Onehunga Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, at Grand Drive, thence generally easterly and southerly along that boundary to its intersection with Boakes Road, thence generally westerly and southerly along that road, Harwood Road, Almond Road, Panorama Road, the east-west portion of Leonard Road and its western extension to the boundary of the Ellerslie Borough, thence southerly along that boundary to and generally southerly and westerly along the boundary of the existing Onehunga Electoral District to the point of commencement.

#### PANMURE

Population: 33 027

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark and Great South Road being a point of the southern boundary of the existing Panmure Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, and proceeding generally northerly along the southern and western boundaries of that district, the eastern boundary of the proposed Onehunga Electoral District and the southern boundary of the proposed Tamaki Electoral District to the mean high water mark on the west bank of the Tamaki River at Omaru Creek, thence southerly along that water mark to the point of commencement and also including that portion of land commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark on the north bank of the Pakuranga creek and Ti Rakau Drive and proceeding generally north westerly along that Drive, Gossamer Drive, Riverhills Ave, Udys Road, Lewis Road and westerly along Pakuranga Road to a point in line with the western boundary of the recreation reserve on the west side of Kentigen Close, thence northerly to and along that boundary to the mean high water mark, thence generally southerly along that water mark to the point of commencement.

#### PAKURANGA

Population: 33 156

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark of Pakuranga Creek and Ti Rakau Drive being a point on the boundary of the proposed Panmure Electoral District and proceeding generally north westerly along that boundary to the mean high water mark on Tamaki River, then generally northerly and southerly along that water mark to its intersection with the west boundary of Howick Borough, thence southerly along that western

boundary to its intersection with the boundary of the existing Pakuranga Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, on Bradbury Road, thence southerly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

#### OTARA

Population: 32 742

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark and the west boundary of Howick Borough and proceeding generally southerly along that boundary to its intersection with the boundary of the existing Otago Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, at Bradbury Road, thence generally southerly along that boundary to a point on the Auckland Hamilton Motorway at its intersection with Preston Road, thence generally north easterly along that road, Dawson Road, Chapel Road, Point View Drive, Caldwell's Drive and its extension easterly to Maungamaungaroa Creek, thence generally northerly along that creek and the mean high water mark to the point of commencement.

#### MANGERE

Population: 33 364

Classification: Group A

The existing Mangere Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 but excluding that portion on the eastern boundary bounded by Massey Road, Buckland Road, Raglan Street, Winthrop Way and John Street.

#### PAPATOETOE

Population: 32 999

Classification: Group A

The existing Papatoetoe Electoral District, as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, and including the area excluded from the proposed Mangere Electoral District but excluding that portion in the south west bounded by the mean high water mark, Waokauri Creek, Manurewa Ward boundary, Papatoetoe City boundary, Roscommon Road, McLaughlins Road and Puhinui Creek.

#### MANUREWA

Population: 33 326

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of Preston Road and the Auckland Hamilton Motorway and proceeding southerly along that motorway, and Papakura Stream to and northerly along Great South Road to and westerly along Mahia Road East, Siska Place and its extension to the mean high water mark on Waimahia Creek, thence generally north westerly along that water mark to the southern boundary of the proposed Papatoetoe Electoral District, thence easterly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

#### FRANKLIN

Population: 32 988

Classification: Group B

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark in the Firth of Thames and the southern boundary of Franklin County at Miranda and proceeding westerly along that boundary to and along Mangatangi Road and State Highway 2, to Jeff Road thence generally north westerly along Jeff Road, Lyons Road, a private road to a sawmill and its production to the boundary of the Drury Riding of Franklin County, thence westerly and northerly along the southern and western boundaries of that riding to its intersection with the Great South Road, thence northerly along that road to its junction with Ambush Road, thence easterly to and then northerly along the Auckland Hamilton Motorway to and westerly along Ararimu Road to and northerly along the Great South Road and the Auckland Hamilton Motorway to its intersection with the southern boundary of the proposed Papakura Electoral District, thence generally northerly, easterly, northerly and westerly along that boundary, to and along the mean high water mark, to and generally northerly along the eastern boundaries of the proposed Manurewa and Otago Electoral Districts to the mean high water mark, on the Maungamaungaroa Creek, thence generally easterly and southerly to the point of commencement.

#### PAPAKURA

Population: 33 133

Classification: Group B

Commencing at the intersection of the mean high water mark and the northern boundary of Papakura City and proceeding generally easterly, southerly and westerly around that boundary to its intersection with the Auckland Hamilton Motorway, thence southerly along that Motorway to and easterly along Drury Creek to and generally south westerly along Great South Road, Karaka Road and Glenbrook Road to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the Waikato Riding of the Franklin County, thence southerly along that riding boundary to and south westerly along the Franklin County Boundary to the mouth of the Waikato River, thence generally

northerly southerly and easterly along the mean high water mark to the point of commencement.

#### MARAMARUA

Population: 32 929

Classification: Group C

Commencing at the intersection of the south bank of the Waikato River and the east boundary of the Waiuku Riding of the Franklin County being a point on the eastern boundary of the proposed Papakura Electoral District and proceeding generally northerly and easterly along that boundary and the southern boundary of the proposed Franklin Electoral District to the mean high water mark at Miranda, thence generally easterly along that water mark to a point just north of Tararu being a point of the western boundary of the proposed Coromandel Electoral District, thence southerly along that boundary to its intersection with the southern boundary of the Hauraki Plains County, thence westerly along that boundary to and westerly along Mangapiko Valley Road, Waterimu Road, Tahuna Road and its extension to the Waikato River, thence generally down that river to the point of commencement.

#### RAGLAN

Population: 32 855

Classification: Group D

Comprises the Raglan Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, but excluding the Pukemiro Riding of the Raglan County and that portion of the Waingaro Riding of the Raglan County situated between the Waikato River and the eastern boundary at the Pukemiro Riding and also excluding that portion of Hamilton City bounded by Mitcham Avenue, Storey Avenue, Te Rapa Road and Forest Lake Road.

#### WAIPA

Population: 33 167

Classification: Group D

All of the existing Waipa Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424.

#### HAMILTON EAST

Population: 33 508

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of the existing boundary of the Hamilton East Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 and Knighton Road and proceeding northerly along that road to and westerly along the Hamilton City Boundary to the existing boundary of the Hamilton East Electoral District, thence generally northerly, southerly and northerly again along that boundary to the point of commencement.

#### HAMILTON WEST

Population: 32 978

Classification: Group A

Commencing at the intersection of Te Rapa Road and Storey Avenue and proceeding generally south easterly along that Avenue and Mitcham Avenue to the existing boundary of the Hamilton West Electoral District as defined by *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, thence generally southerly, easterly, northerly and southerly again along that boundary to the point of commencement.

#### WAIKATO

Population: 33 622

Classification: Group C

#### TIMARU

Commences at the mouth of the Opihi River and proceeds up that river to its intersection with the existing boundary of the Timaru Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424; thence southeast along that boundary to the mean high water mark and thence northerly along that water mark to the point of commencement.

Commencing at the mean high water mark of the sea south of Oamaru Borough being the existing south boundary of Waitaki Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983, p 1424 and proceeds northerly along that boundary, the Oamaru Borough boundary and the west boundary of the Papakaio Riding of the Waitaki County to and along the north boundary of the Waitaki County to the northwest boundary of the existing Waitaki Electoral District; thence northeasterly along that boundary to and along the proposed southwest boundary of the South Canterbury Electoral District to the mean high water mark; thence south along that water mark to the point of commencement and excluding the proposed Timaru Electoral District.

Commences at the intersection of the north boundary Dunedin City and the mean high water mark of the Otago Harbour and

proceeds westerly along that city boundary to the existing boundary of the Otago Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424; thence west and north along that boundary to the eastern boundary of the Dunstan Riding of the Vincent County, northerly, westerly and easterly along the boundaries of that riding to and along the west boundaries of the Earnsclough Riding, to and along the existing Otago Electoral District boundary to the north boundary of the Southland County, south westerly and northerly along that boundary, to and along the existing Otago Electoral District boundary and the proposed south western boundary of the Waitaki Electoral District to the mean high water mark and south along that water mark to the point of commencement.

#### DUNEDIN WEST

Commenced at the intersection of the mean high water mark and the existing western boundary of Dunedin West Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424 and proceeds north, east and south along the boundaries of that district to and east along Kaikorai Valley Road, Stuart Street, Arthur Street and York Place to the existing boundary of Dunedin West Electoral District, south along that boundary, to and along Neidpath Road, Eglinton Road, Haywood Road, the production of Haywood Road to and along Dacre Court, Forfar Street, Oakwood Avenue, Forbes Street and Mornington Road to the existing boundary of Dunedin West Electoral District, south along that boundary to the mean high water mark and west along that water mark to the point of commencement.

#### DUNEDIN NORTH

Classification: Group A

Commences at the intersection of the north boundary of Dunedin City with the mean high water mark of the Otago Harbour and proceeding northwesterly and southwesterly along the city boundary to and along the proposed boundary of the Dunedin West Electoral District, to the existing boundary for the Dunedin North Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424; thence westerly along that boundary to and along the mean high water mark of the Otago Harbour to the point of commencement.

#### ST KILDA

Commences at the intersection of the mean high water mark and the proposed eastern boundary of the Dunedin West Electoral District and proceeding north and east along the Dunedin West boundary and the proposed south boundary of the Dunedin North Electoral district to the mean high water mark of the Otago Harbour, thence follows that water mark generally southeast and west to the point of commencement.

#### CLUTHA

Commences at the intersection of the mean high water mark and the eastern boundary of the Southland County and proceeds northerly along the county boundary, westerly along the north boundary of the Toetoes Riding and north along the Mataura River and Waikaka Stream to a point approximately 500 metres south of Willowbank Waikaka Road; thence northeast across country to and north along the Southland County Boundary to the existing boundary of the Clutha Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, north west along that boundary to the proposed southwest boundary of the Otago Electoral District; thence northerly and generally southeasterly along that boundary to the proposed west boundary of the Dunedin West Electoral District, south along that boundary to the mean high water mark and south west along that water mark to the point of commencement.

#### INVERCARGILL

Commencing at the intersection of Waihopai River and the east boundary of Invercargill City and proceeding southeasterly along that city boundary to Oteramika Road; thence along that road, Rockdale Road and westerly along Tramway Road to its intersection with Elles Road; thence generally northwesterly along the old railway line to the intersection of Selwyn Street and Bluff Road, thence across the Bluff Branch Railway to and along the mean high water mark of the New River Estuary to and along Bond Street and west along Stead Street to the middle of the Waihopai River; thence north and east along that river to the point of commencement.

Commences at the intersection of the mean high water mark in Big Bay and the existing boundary of Wallace Electoral District, *NZ Gazette* 1983 p 1424, thence easterly along that existing district

boundary to and along the proposed western boundary of the Otago Electoral District, south and east along that boundary to and along the proposed western boundary of the Clutha Electoral District, to the existing boundary of the Wallace Electoral District, thence west and south along that boundary to the mean high water mark, thence west and north along that water mark to the point of commencement, including adjacent islands.

## AWARUA

Population: 32 850

Classification: Group D

Is bounded by the proposed Wallace and Clutha Electoral Districts and includes Campbell Island, Stewart Island and adjacent islands, but excludes the proposed Electoral District of Invercargill.
