WHEREAS, pursuant to section 43(4) of the Auckland Regional Authority Act 1963, the Auckland Regional Authority is entitled to exercise all the powers, authorities, and discretions vested in the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage Board by the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage Act 1960:

And whereas the said Auckland Regional Authority has petitioned His Excellency the Governor-General that certain portions of Waitemata City be included within the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage District, as described in the Schedules attached hereto.

Now therefore, pursuant to section 8 of the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage Act 1960, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

### ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage District Order (No. 1) 1986.

(2) This order shall come into force on 1 April 1987.

**2. Boundary Altered**—The boundaries of the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage District are hereby altered so as to include the portions of Waitemata City described in the First and Second Schedules.

**3. Determination of financial obligations**—The financial obligations and assessment under the Auckland Metropolitan Drainage District Act 1960 of the Waitemata City Council with respect to the land described in the Schedule to this order shall be determined on and from 1 April 1987.

PURSUANT to section 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the *Fiordland National Park Lakeshore and Lakebed Control Order 1986*.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of December 1986.

**2. Interpretation**—In this order—

"The Act" means the Harbours Act 1950;

"The Director-General" means the Director-General of Lands.

**3. Grant of Control**—There is hereby granted to the Director-General for a period of 21 years from the 1st day of December 1986 and ending with the 30th day of November 2007 control of the lakeshore and lakebed described in the Schedule to this order.

**4. Conditions of Grant**—The grant of control conferred by clause 3 of this order is subject to the following conditions—

(a) Suitably worded signs shall be erected at main public access ways to the lakeshore and lakebed described in the Schedule to this order indicating that control of the lakeshore and lakebed has been granted to the Director-General pursuant to section 165 of the Act.

(b) All money received by the Director-General in the performance or exercise of the functions, duties, or powers conferred on him by this order in respect of lakeshore and lakebed to which this order applies, shall, after the deduction of any expenditure incurred by the Director-General in the performance or exercise of those functions, duties, or powers, be applied to the construction, repair or improvement of facilities in respect of that lakeshore and lakebed and not otherwise.

ALL that part of the lakeshore and lakebed of Lakes Te Anau, Manapouri, Monowai and Hauroko, including the lakeshore of any island within the said lakes as shown on plan M.D. 11598 deposited in the office of the Secretary for Transport at Wellington.

This order establishes the Whanganui National Park. The park covers an area of 74230.9945 hectares and borders the Whanganui River. The bulk of the national park extends from Whakahoro in the north to Pipiriki in the south. The western boundary generally follows the ridgeline to the west of the Heao Stream, south to Mount Humphries, then generally south, then east, 5–10 km south of the Matemateaonga Range to Pipiriki. The eastern boundary from Whakahoro generally extends to Mount Dawson, to the Mangapurua Trig, down the ridgeline east of the Mangapurua Valley to the Whanganui River. The eastern boundary then generally follows the Whanganui River to Pipiriki.

In addition to the main area of the park, there are two outliers to the north and south. The northern area extends from Te Maire in the north to Whakahoro in the south while the southern area extends from the village of Ranana in the north to Atene in the south.

In this present revision there has been a change from subjective to objective carcass classification. The GR measurement applies to beef and sheep meat, while pig meat fat depth is measured by an intrascope. The GR criterion has been aligned to the export trade.

As carcass weight is the single most important measurement used in carcass trading a definition has been included.

Meat is no longer classed as "prime, choice, manufacturing and standard". The Meat Grades Committee recommended the abolishment of stripe marking of carcasses and has introduced a new scheme. *Indecent Publications Tribunal Minority Decision*

INDECENCY is a subject on which there is unlikely to be consensus. Members of the public have different views as to what is indecent. Judicial opinion, in both the High Court and the Court of Appeal in the 3 decisions that have reached those courts in the last 10 years, has reflected divergent points of view as to what is the appropriate test to be applied. The Indecent Publications Tribunal has nearly always been able to reach a unanimous decision. However in the case of these 3 magazines, *Australian High Society*, *Fiesta* and *Knave* considered in the light of the Lawrence decision (*Howley v. Lawrence Publishing Co. Ltd.* CA 77/84) we beg to differ from the majority of the Tribunal.

Both *Knave* (Vol. 17, No. 11 and 12, Vol. 18, No. 1) and *Fiesta* (Vol. 19, No. 12 and Vol. 20, No. 1 and 2) are edited, produced and printed in Britain. Both have been in production for 20 years, and are published monthly. They are a mixture of stories, coloured photographs, letters, cartoons and advertisements. They were submitted to the Tribunal at the request of the importer. The Tribunal had the advantage of examining the magazines, hearing considerable evidence from counsel for the importer and a brief submission on behalf of the Comptroller of Customs. Counsel did not attempt to disguise the fact that both magazines are predominantly about sex; and it is clear from section 2 of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 that the treatment of sexual themes in themselves is not indecent *per se*. Counsel also stated that the magazines do not infringe the "Tripartite Test" developed in relation to *Penthouse* magazine, and they urged upon the Tribunal a classification as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

*Australian High Society*, February 1986, Vol. 1, No. 1, is of a similar format and style to the other magazines, perhaps appealing to a slightly more expensive market. The Tribunal was submitted an advance copy by the importer for a decision prior to the arrival of a bulk shipment. The magazine is an Australasian edition of an American magazine which has been published for 10 years. It consists primarily of photographs of single models both naked and partially clothed. These pictorial features dominate the written content which consists of a short story, 3 articles, an interview and jokes.

*Lawrence* is the most recent authority on indecency. The case involved the importation of 20 illustrated calendars which showed coloured pictures of nude males. Under section 2 of the Act calendars are documents. The Indecent Publications Tribunal under section 10 of the Act only has jurisdiction over books and sound recordings. It had never made a determination on the calendars which were first considered by the District Court. The Comptroller of Customs thought them indecent in terms of the Act and seized them. The Court of Appeal in a 3 to 2 majority upheld the District Court judgment that they were not indecent and dismissed the Comptroller's appeal. The Court of Appeal did not see the calendars.

The legal issue arose from the definition in section 2 of "indecent". The majority in *Lawrence* held that the "injurious to the public good" requirement applied to all indecent matters, in other words to any subject matter, and that the test to be applied was the statutory test and the statutory test alone. It might appear, if *Lawrence* is followed, that the ordinary meaning test (*Police v. News Media Ownership* (1975) 1 NZLR 610) of "an affront to current standards of the community" is no longer available to the Tribunal.

It is significant that the division of the opinion in the Court of Appeal was not founded on censorship policy but on the doctrine of precedent. This it could be argued lessens its importance as a statement on the definitive legal test of indecency.

Cooke J. in one of the dissenting decisions of *Lawrence* appreciated the widespread impact that a retreat from the majority decision in *Police v. News Media Ownership* (1975) 1 NZLR represented:

Alleged pornography is hardly a subject that can be dealt with in an ethereal way. I do not think that this Court should consider changing the established tests without some insight into the practical consequences of its decision.

Similarly it might be helpful to know whether the majority decision in the *News Media* case has been found to cause any real difficulty in everyday practice. *Waverley Publishing Co. Ltd. v. Minister of Customs* (1980) 1 NZLR 631 was a case where the same result was reached on both the majority and the minority approaches. In argument in present case there was no indication that generally the majority approach has not been found workable by District Court Judges or the Indecent Publications Tribunal.

We share this point of view.

For the following reasons therefore we believe the present publications under consideration can be distinguished from those in *Lawrence*:

1. The decision concerned a 'document'. The Tribunal has jurisdiction only over 'books' (which are defined separately in section 2) and sound recordings.
2. Any appeals from a Tribunal decision can only be heard by the High Court (section 19). There is no way that a matter considered by the Tribunal can reach the Court of Appeal. This further reinforces the legal distinction (however illogical in its consequences) between 'books' and 'documents' because the latter are at first instance determined by the District Court, and appeals reach the Court of Appeal.
3. The document in *Lawrence* concerned male nude photographs. These books, *Knave*, *Fiesta* and *Australian High Society* contain predominantly female nude photographs, as does the majority of material which comes before the Tribunal.

4. The Court of Appeal did not even see the document in question. The Tribunal has the opportunity to examine all publications upon which it is required to deliberate, and does not usually make decisions on an ethereal basis.

As we have argued the *Lawrence* is not binding in this instance, what then is the basis for our decision on these 3 magazines? There are 2 arguments and we shall outline them separately.

Firstly these magazines deal with matters of sex in a manner that is injurious to the public good because of the manner in which the female nude form is depicted. In counsel's submission on *Knave* and *Fiesta*, it was argued that they created no demonstrable injury to the public good. Their responsible editorial policies were said to vigorously exclude any material identified by recent expert opinion in Britain and Canada as being potentially harmful. The British opinion referred to is that of the Williams Committee on Obscenity and Film Censorship which reported in 1979. However, commentators have since noted that the feminist attack on pornography has developed since that report was written (and this is certainly the case in New Zealand). Using guidelines based on that report therefore ignores some of the most recent arguments. We intend to take judicial notice of the feminist arguments, and we would welcome the opportunity in the future to have these arguments fully tested.

Some of the portfolios of women in these magazines are injurious to the public good because of: the contrived positions the women are placed in, women are in full labial display presumably for male viewers; the surrounding context of the photographs, and the symbolic representation of women depicted. Such portfolios promote social values which degrade, not just the single model posing, but all women as a social class. Women are portrayed as a subordinate who are always sexually available and have limited choice.

The dominant effect of the magazines (one of the matters to be taken into consideration by the Tribunal under section 11 (1) of the Act) is the subordination of women. The total effect of such presentation suggests that women have an inferior social status and lack autonomy: for example *High Society*, pages 28-33, "Baby Boobies", a sequence of photographs showing a woman in baby-like positions depicts women as childish or childlike and implies girls are available for sex.

In addition a number of portfolios dehumanise the adult female form, for example *High Society*, pages 51-57 "Some Like It Hot" sequence has one photograph of the fire-eating woman tethered about the neck, with suggestions that she is an animal.

When women are depicted for sexual purposes as either childlike or as pets/wild animals this degrades all women as a class of sexually mature adults. Such depiction promotes the value that women are there to be taken and used. Women's own self-determination is undermined. Publications which promote social values degrading a class or group of people would be considered harmful to the public good (and discriminatory) if that group were a racial or religious group. Similarly when the group is determined by sex.

We do not consider that for the requirement of injury to the public good to be satisfied, the harm must be manifest by action. Injury may occur in the province of attitudes or perceptions, particularly if these are widely shared, and consistently suggest that one class is less superior than another.

To those who would argue against the proposition that some of the portfolios in these magazines cause harm to women because they undermine women's dignity, self-respect and sense of control, and therefore the publications should be declared not indecent; we suggest that the onus on the Tribunal is to protect the most vulnerable—those to whom the injury may occur—and therefore these magazines should be declared indecent. It is possible that if it were men who were being revealed in such positions, they would also believe themselves as a class to be degraded. (In a volume of *Fiesta*, Vol 19, No. 12, the only photographs of nude men are shown with their faces hidden, in comparison with the photographs of women.)

Secondly even if the above argument is not available to the Tribunal, we believe these magazines to be indecent in the ordinary meaning as an "affront to the commonly accepted community standards".

These magazines are an affront because of some of the reasons already outlined, and also because women are presented dehumanised as sexual objects, similar to things or commodities, and women's body parts are exhibited such that women are reduced to those parts. This is an affront to at least half the community.

We note in passing that earlier copies of *Fiesta* (Indecent Publications decision 916, April 1979) were declared unconditionally indecent by the Tribunal, and were found to not provide the appropriate balance of serious and honest writing to redeem the rest of the content. Although not bound by previous decisions on the same publications we do not believe there has been a sufficiently discernible change in type of content in *Fiesta* for a different decision today.

We have argued that these magazines should be declared indecent. This is not to say that we would consider all books containing photographs of nude women in sexually explicit poses to be indecent *per se*. We believe that the question of whether material is degrading and demeaning of either sex could usefully be an additional matter which the Tribunal might be directed to take into consideration along with the other matters in section 11 of the Act.

DECISION

GORDON & GOTCH (NZ) LTD. imported copies of *Australian High Society*, Vol. 1, No. 1, and *Genesis Girls/Girls*, Spring 1986 into New Zealand with the intention of having those publications considered by the Indecent Publications Tribunal for a decision as to whether those publications are indecent or not and/or for a decision as to the classification of those publications.

*High Society*, Vol. 1, No. 1, is stated on its cover to be a collector's first edition and the publishers clearly have in mind that it should be distributed both in Australia and in New Zealand by Gordon & Gotch Ltd. as such distribution is referred to in the publisher's note on page 4 of that volume. The publisher does, however, in her note to readers refer to the introduction of this magazine to Australia and no reference is made in that introductory note to New Zealand.

It should be noted that there are major differences in the censorship laws of most Australian states and the Federal Territories to those which pertain in New Zealand by virtue of the Indecent Publications Act 1963.

The Comptroller of Customs pointed out the *Australian High Society* consisted primarily of photographs of single female models both naked and partially clothed. The Comptroller submitted that these pictorial features far outweighed the written content which consisted of an interview, jokes, 3 articles and a short story. That which the Comptroller suggested required the imposition of an age restriction on *Australian High Society* was that positioning of models in a contrived way and in such a position as to give maximum emphasis to the genitalia area.

Mr Ellis on behalf of the importer and potential distributor advised the Tribunal that the purpose of the importation was as indicated above to have the matter referred for decision and classification. Mr Ellis submitted to the Tribunal that there were many similarities between this publication and *Penthouse* magazine although it might be found that the quality of the written material and of the production itself was not up to that of the *Penthouse* publication. The comparison to be drawn between this publication and others was more closely related to the publication *Genesis* and in particular to those copies which were the subject of an R18 classification by the Tribunal in its decision No. 12/84. Although the dominant theme was the portrayal of female sexual organs Mr Ellis submitted that the publication had balance provided by its editorial content, its life style articles, its investigative journalism and its cartoons and humour. In this regard Mr Ellis submitted that the material came within the Tribunal's decision No. 1053 insofar as that decision classified the February, May, June, November, and December issues of *Penthouse* as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18. In reference to decision No. 1053 and also decision No. 1054 Mr Ellis submitted that this magazine did not offend against that which has been termed the "Tripartite Test" which is set out in both decisions 1053 and 1054 in the following terms:

1. Scenarios involving more than two models and in which sex and violence and intimacy and/or deviant aspects of sex are depicted among the models;
2. Multiple model scenes which depict lesbian acts;

3. Heterosexual scenarios in which there are a high degree of intimacy (e.g., fellatio or cunnilingus or intercourse) depicted in the couple's actions.

Mr Ellis submitted that if the Tribunal applied those tests to *High Society* it would be found that the publication did not offend against those tests.

Mr Ellis did concede that there was an element of multiplicity in an article about screen star Joan Collins but submitted that the photos which might otherwise offend the Tripartite Test were old photos which were in themselves unobjectionable and in terms of the overall nature of the article gave some social significance to the photographs. In any event Mr Ellis submitted there was not that "high degree of intimacy" mentioned in the Tripartite Tests of a kind which would have permitted a valid objection against the publication. Mr Ellis submitted that the photographs being of a well-known public figure should be considered as being presented more in an historical than indecent way. In the event that the Tribunal did find, for example, the photographic content objectionable then the Tribunal should, Mr Ellis submitted, apply the balancing exercise which it had frequently in the past applied, namely "what proportion of objectionable content there was in comparison with non-objectionable material?" When that test was carried out the answer he submitted was that the overall quality and content was such as to permit of a decision that a restricted classification only was required.

Two members of the Tribunal find that the publication justifies a classification of indecent and they reached that conclusion after having initially met following the original hearing to give full consideration to Mr Ellis's submission the members having previously read the publication. Later the Tribunal had a further meeting where it considered the affect of the Court of Appeals decision in *Howell v. Lawrence Publishing Company Ltd.*, CA 77/84 and at that further meeting it again gave very careful consideration to Mr Ellis's submission having once again looked at the material contained in the publication.

The Tribunal agrees with Mr Ellis that the document theme of the publication is the portrayal of the female nude with a concentration of photographs of the genitalia. The models are in many of the presentations depicted in contrived poses, the whole purpose of which is clearly to focus attention on the vaginal area. The Joan Collins article features a number of photographs of the actress with a male model although there is no patent sexual activity depicted in the bulk of those. What was more objectionable in the Tribunal's determination was a largely pictorial presentation under the title "Some Like It Hot" which depicts a female nude model in posed contortions with 1 and sometimes 2 fire torches. The Tribunal found that presentation lewd and suggestive and obscene to a degree where the term indecent as prescribed by the Act had real application.

When the Tribunal looked at the written content it found a predominance of material of an explicitly pornographic nature. This material far from balancing any of the objectionable pictorial material is in many respects in the Tribunal's finding at least equally and probably in some cases more objectionable than that pictorial material. A page of pars carrying the headline *Funny Boners* presented material of a kind which the Tribunal found to be grossly indecent. And finally, one cartoon on the final page before the book cover was found by the Tribunal to be so grossly obscene that it might well have by itself justified an indecent classification.

In a minority decision in respect of the publication *Fiesta* and *Knave*, decision No. 10/86, two members of the Tribunal give consideration of the classification to be placed on *High Society*. At page 4 in their decision the minority say:

The dominant effect of the magazines (one of the matters to be taken into consideration by the Tribunal under section 11 (1) of the Act) is the subordination of women. The total effect of such presentation suggests that women have an inferior social status and lack autonomy; for example, *High Society*, pages 23-33 *Baby Boobies*, a sequence of photographs showing a woman in baby like positions depicts women as childish or childlike implies girls are available for sex.

In addition a number of portfolios dehumanise the adult female form, for example, *High Society*, pages 51-57 "Some Like it Hot" sequence has one photograph of the fire eating woman tethered about the neck, with suggestions that she is an animal.

When women are depicted for sexual purposes as either childlike or as pets/wild animals this degrades all women as a class of sexually mature adults. Such depiction promotes the value that women are there to be taken and used. Women's own self-determination is undermined. Publications which promote social values degrading a class or group of people would be considered harmful to the public good (and discriminatory) if that group were a racial or religious group. Similarly when the group is determined by sex.

We do not consider that for the requirement of injury to the public good to be satisfied, the harm must be manifest by action. Injury may occur in the province of attitudes or perceptions, particularly if these are widely shared, and consistently suggest that one class is less superior than another.

The majority finds for the same reasons as expresses in its majority decision No. 10/86 in respect of *Fiesta* and *Knave* that it is not able to classify the publications *High Society* as indecent. The majority found that there were many features to the publication to which strong objection could be taken but on an overall appraisal of the publication the material did not call for a classification of indecent in terms of the Tripartite Test. In the light of the Court of Appeal decision in *Howell v. Lawrence Publishing Company Ltd.*, CA 77/84 the majority found that there was no evidence before it of the kind necessary to establish injury to the public good. The majority is satisfied however, on the criteria which has long been established before the Tribunal that the publication justifies that it be classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

The second publication *Genesis Girls/Girls* is in a different category to *High Society*. The publication consists almost entirely of pictorial presentations of 8 female nudes. A proportion of those presentations are of the sexually contrived pose but in the main they are not as explicit as many of the photographs in *High Society*. The literary content is trivial and largely unobjectionable. The Tribunal is satisfied that the explicitness of some of the poses justifies that it be classified as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18.

DECISION

THE magazines *Fiesta* and *Knave*, the subject of this decision were submitted to the Tribunal at the request of the importer Gordon & Gotch Ltd. for consideration and classification. We note that this particular importer and distributor frequently requests of the Comptroller that material be submitted in this way to the Tribunal and we comment that the importer is to be commended for its sensible and responsible approach to these matters.

The Tribunal in decision No. 916 of April 1979 classified Vol. 11, No. 12, of *Fiesta* magazine as being unconditionally indecent but as the Comptroller of Customs points out in his submission the magazines presently before the Tribunal for consideration and classification do in their favour "lack the lesbian pictorial sequences and more explicit letters from readers contained in the earlier magazine".

The Comptroller submits that the imbalance between sexual content and any redeeming serious writing contained in these publications is such that the magazine circulation could be restricted for sale by an age classification.

When these matters came on for hearing on the 29th day of March 1986 evidence was given before the Tribunal by Mr David Halliday the managing director of Galaxy Publications Ltd. Mr Halliday was questioned by members of the Tribunal following which a lengthy and detailed submission was presented by Mr Smith.

In a memorandum dated 2 May 1986 I advised the parties that the Tribunal had found there were some aspects of the publications upon which the Tribunal had been unable to reach a clear decision. The parties were advised that the Tribunal would reconvene in June of this year to further consider the publications.

When Parliament enacted the Indecent Publications Act of 1963 it provided for New Zealanders an unique system of censorship. In his book *Obscenity* published in London in 1979 Mr Geoffrey Robertson an English barrister commented to his readers that much



had been achieved by that enlightened legislation. There are two passages from Mr Robertson's book which deserve particular mention. Mr Robertson devotes chapter 11 to a consideration of "the future of obscenity" and at page 311 on that topic he has this to say:

"In New Zealand, however, a measure of openness and consistency has marked the operations of the Indecent Publications Tribunal, which is empowered, as an alternative to total prohibition, to classify 'indecent' reading matter as unsuitable for sale to persons under 18. Although material in this category may be publicly distributed and displayed, a criminal offence is committed by selling it to a minor. A ruling may be sought by publisher, police or Customs officers, and all parties are afforded an open hearing at which expert evidence, statements from readers and affidavits from authors are admissible."

And after considering the definition of indecency as set out in the Indecent Publications Act and the nature of the test to be considered by the Tribunal as likewise set out in that Act Mr Robertson goes on to say at page 312:

"These factors seem to protect serious literature, although the Tribunal has declined to approve many popular English 'men's magazines', even for restricted sale on the grounds that 'entertainment value' is not a consideration which can outweigh a finding of indecency. The few monthly magazines of this sort which are deemed acceptable are reviewed at 2-yearly intervals and a former 'clearance' may be revoked in the event of any marked deterioration in standard.

The New Zealand censorship model has worked in a more progressive fashion than its equivalents in South Africa and Eire, largely because of the provisions for public hearings and reception of expert evidence. There is no right of appeal to a jury, which might provide a more satisfactory touchstone of commonsense and common standards than 5 political appointees, who comprised in 1976 a solicitor, a university chaplain, the editor of the *New Zealand Listener*, a head mistress and a Maori housewife. The few 'indecent' magazines and books classified for restricted sale are granted competition-free monopoly of the market—*Penthouse* and *Playboy* leisurely compete for the custom of curious New Zealanders denied access to *Mayfair* and *Men Only*."

In fairness to Mr Robertson's thesis we should mention that he then goes on to evaluate the system which operates in South Australia and New South Wales and to relate that system of censorship as being:

"The only common law jurisdictions to have 'solved' the problem of censorship in a way which deserves emulation in England."

It is neither our intention nor is it our province to enter into a consideration of the merits or demerits of our system or any other system of censorship.

It is important to consider the climate in which the Indecent Publications Act of 1963 was enacted. For those who have a more scholarly interest in that subject we would refer them to *The Indecent Publications Tribunal A Social Experiment* by Mr Stuart Perry, a member of the original Tribunal set up following the passing of the 1963 legislation. Those who take the trouble to read Mr Perry's book will we feel sure echo the amazement of the members of this Tribunal at some of the earlier legislative provisions which gave voice to and reflected a puritanical protectionism of New Zealanders of amazing rigidity. Mr Perry's book contains details of those early cases dealt with by the Tribunal commencing with *Another Country* by James Baldwin, Tribunal decision 1 of the 18th day of March 1964, and concluding with decision 12 delivered on the 12th day of May of that year in which the Tribunal classified as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age the expurgated paperback edition of *Fanny Hill*. It is of historical significance to note that the decision No. 3 of the Tribunal was as is this decision a majority decision and it related to the book *Lolita* by Vladimir Nabokov. That decision by a majority was not prepared to impose an age restriction on the circulation of that particular publication.

The significance of the book *Lolita* in the history of New Zealand censorship is that it was controversy relating to a decision by the New Zealand Court of Appeal in respect of that book which prompted the enactment of our present legislation and the setting up of what was seen to be a specialised Tribunal. There is a touch of piquancy in the fact that the first president of the Indecent Publications Tribunal Sir Kenneth Gresson disqualified himself from participation in the *Lolita* hearing by the Tribunal as he had been a dissenting judge in respect of the Court of Appeal's decision on that book. Another original Tribunal appointee who likewise withdrew from the hearing was Professor I. A. Gordon who had been an expert witness in respect of the earlier Court proceedings in relation to that book.

On the face of it Parliament had achieved significant changes in the approach to censorship in New Zealand. Section 11 in particular prescribed a charter within the framework of which publications

could be tested and classified. There was no disguising Parliament's intention in enacting the legislation. It was clearly to circumscribe and to limit censorship.

Like "grandfather's axe" the Tribunal exists today as it did at its inception. Personnel have of course changed from time to time and it is many years since the last of the original Tribunal members retired. There has been in our respectful view a continuity in the decision-making functions of the Tribunal with its existing members being ever conscious of the whole history of its decision-making processes and of the vast input of representations from counsel and from others. Any detailed consideration of the decisions over the intervening years reveals that which will cause no surprise, namely, that material which would have earned an indecent or restricted classification in the 1960s was often deemed not indecent or perhaps available for limited distribution in later years. That this should be so, simply reflects the importance which the Tribunal has placed upon that charter provided by Parliament which is principally contained as previously noted in section 11 of the Act. It is patently evident from even a casual reading of the Tribunal's decisions that they have reflected what might in a general way be called changes in public attitude even regrettably perhaps changes in commonly perceived standards of morality and decency.

There is a whimsical feature to that which now divides this Tribunal in its decision in respect of these publications. The present Tribunal membership echoes the words and feelings of many of their more recent predecessors in bemoaning the fact that their censorship duties today consist almost entirely of a consideration of magazines depicting nude females, homosexual magazines and trashy and ill-written pseudo-Victorian novels. When we compare the material which we now consider with the material presented to that first Tribunal the two can only be stated as being diverse in the extreme. Mr Perry's book which sets out the Tribunal's first 12 decisions illustrates that diversity. The publications considered included:

1. *Another Country*.
2. *No Adam in Eden*.
3. *Lolita*.
5. *Dead Fingers Talk*.
6. Three novels—*Close of Play*; *Slippery Errors*; *Death by the Day*.
7. *De Sade and Apollinaire*.
8. *The Snake*.
10. *Lady Chatterley's Lover*.
11. *The Carpetbaggers*.
12. *Fanny Hill*.

The whimsy is this: Parliament clearly intended that the Indecent Publications Tribunal should confine its attention to those important aspects of literature which fell within the interpretation of "books". Again that which Parliament clearly considered as of less importance (being mainly documents) were not to trouble the Tribunal but were to be left with the Courts to determine whether they were indecent or not. Parliament could never have foreseen how that demarcation would in 1986 lead to major problems for the Tribunal in the carrying out of its classification function. That which would otherwise have provided at least one more vote to the dissenting members of this judgment was removed from my judicial consideration by the majority decision of the Court of Appeal in *Howell v. Lawrence Publishing Company Ltd.* CA 77/84 delivered on the 1st day of May 1986.

It is important that we detail here the history of that particular litigation. Lawrence Publishing Company Ltd. imported into New Zealand 20 copies of *Greystone Illustrated 1983* calendars on 21 October 1982. These were seized by the Comptroller of Customs on the grounds "that he had reasonable and probable cause to suspect that they should be forfeit to Her Majesty the Queen as being indecent documents within the meaning of the Indecent Publications Act 1963".

The importer purchased the calendars which contained photographs of nude males with their genitals clearly displayed. Its decision to import had been made after a consideration of other material which had been declared by this Tribunal not to be indecent. The importer contested the seizure by the Comptroller of Customs and because the calendars were documents and not books the issue for determination was sent not to the Tribunal but to the District Court in Auckland. The learned District Court Judge in his decision of the 28th day of April 1983 found that the calendars were not indecent as that term fell to be interpreted in the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and at the conclusion of his decision after reviewing what on the face of it were conflicting decisions of the full Court of the High Court and the Court of Appeal concluded with these words:

"Reviewing those findings it is my judgment that there is nothing in the *Greystone Calendar 1983* that is injurious to the public good and nothing that would cause a discernible injury to the public good. I accordingly acquit the goods which are the subject of this information."

The Comptroller of Customs appealed against that decision and in the light of the conflict between the decisions of the Court of Appeal and the full Court of the High Court the learned High Court Judge before whom the appeal was originally presented referred the matter for decision to the Court of Appeal.

In a 3 to 2 majority decision the Court of Appeal upheld the District Court Judge's decision that the documents were not indecent and in the course of their decisions some of the learned appellate judges gave consideration to the interpretation of the word "indecent" with particular reference to the statutory interpretation of that word as contained in section 2 of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 which is as follows:

"'Indecent' includes the describing, depicting, expressing, or otherwise dealing with matters of sex, horror, crime, cruelty, or violence in a manner that is injurious to the public good."

The majority of the Tribunal accepts that it is bound by that decision of the Court of Appeal and that they are unable to distinguish those publications which fall for its determination as to their classification in this decision in such a way as to avoid the very clear directions given by the majority in the Court of Appeal decision to both the Courts and to this Tribunal. As chairman of the Tribunal and clearly (as I know it will be accepted) without any criticism of the Court of Appeal decision I have to note that it is to be regretted that such a relatively unimportant document as a calendar depicting nude males should in the end result be the vehicle which provides for this Tribunal in all its future deliberations those important features of interpretation with which it must now work. I say that because there are clear indications in some of the learned appellate judges' decisions that all of the arguments which might have been presented were not perhaps as fully canvassed before the Court of Appeal as might have been thought necessary in a case where that Court's decision was going to have such important consequences for this Tribunal and for the future of censorship in general.

From time to time over its history the Tribunal has had occasion to say, in effect, that the publishers, importers and distributors of magazines depicting nude females have been pushing the line of acceptability with ever increasing force. The Tribunal has over many years established its own criteria within the clear prescriptions (as they have been interpreted) as set by Parliament in the Indecent Publications Act of 1963. In particular we would refer to that which has been given the rather exalted title of the Tripartite Test. That test has been set out in many of the Tribunal's decisions and it is sufficient for our purposes in this decision if we refer to one of those. Decision No. 1054 of the 17th day of March 1983, a decision dealing with certain issues of *Penthouse*, United States magazine. In that decision the Tribunal said:

"In summary, the Tribunal indicated that issues were likely to be classified as indecent if, in addition to their normal content, they contained pictorial scenes including the following:

1. Scenarios involving more than 2 models, and in which sex and violence and intimacy and/or deviant aspects of sex are depicted among the models;
2. Multiple model scenes which depict lesbian acts;
3. Heterosexual scenarios in which there are a high degree of intimacy (e.g. fellatio or cunnilingus or intercourse) depicted in the couple's actions."

Over the history of the Tribunal various decisions have referred to the Tribunal's concern at the increasing explicitness in the portrayal of the single female nude model and in particular the depiction of the genitalia. When the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta* were first circulated amongst the members of the Tribunal I found that I was faced with a concern that the so-called Tripartite Test had been formulated at a time when the explicitness in the depiction of the genitalia of the single female model in publications under review was substantially less objectionable as being indecent than it is today. There are many examples of such objectionable depiction of genitalia in the magazines *Knave* and *Fiesta*.

At the public hearing in respect of these publications the Tribunal, as has been mentioned, heard evidence from the English publisher. The Tribunal had previously been advised that Mr Geoffrey Robertson (the English barrister whose book *Obscenity* is earlier referred to in this decision) would be presenting the case on behalf of Galaxy Publications Ltd., the publisher of those 2 magazines. In the light of what was clearly a very important case for the Tribunal's determination we had anticipated that the Comptroller of Customs who had referred those magazines to the Tribunal for classification at the importers request would have been represented by senior counsel and that there might well have been evidence called by the Comptroller in respect of these particular publications. The Comptroller was in fact represented by one of his officers who as

the Tribunal understands it is not a legally qualified person nor one professing to have any special literary expertise. That officer presented the Comptroller's case to the Tribunal in a written submission which we set out in full as in so doing it highlights that feature which in the end altered the majority decision to one of a limited classification rather than a classification of indecent.

- "1. These magazines are sample copies and have been submitted to the Tribunal at the request of the importer.
2. In Decision 916 of April 1979 the Tribunal classified Vol. 11, No. 12 of *Fiesta* magazine as being unconditionally indecent.
3. These 6 magazines currently before the Tribunal are very similar to that magazine in many respects although in their favour they do lack the lesbian pictorial sequences and the more explicit letters from readers contained in the earlier magazine.
4. These magazines still retain the imbalance between sexual content and any redeeming serious writing that was present in *Fiesta*, Vol. 11, No. 12, however, as none of the content is blatantly offensive it is suggested that the magazines' circulation could be restricted only to the younger reader.
5. All 6 magazines have therefore been submitted under section 14 of the Indecent Publications Act 1963".

Mr Robertson was unable to attend the hearing due to illness but his brief was most ably presented to the Tribunal by Mr Justin Smith, counsel of Wellington.

In order to properly appreciate the dilemma which the Tribunal was placed in as a result of the Court of Appeal decision in the Lawrence case we deem it important to disclose how the Tribunal now functions.

There are 5 Tribunal members, 2 of whom reside in Wellington and 3 in various places in the South Island. Most of the work of the Tribunal comes from publications referred to it by the Comptroller of Customs. This can be either by way of reference to the Tribunal of publications which have been seized from travellers arriving in New Zealand or by way of commercial consignment. Our understanding is that the bulk of such literature is ultimately condemned and destroyed without ever coming to the notice of the Tribunal as there is no challenge to the Comptroller's seizure or destruction. Where the publisher and or importer or owner of the publication disputes seizure, condemnation and forfeiture the matter is accordingly referred to the Tribunal for a decision as to whether it is indecent or not or for a decision as to its classification.

Not infrequently responsible publishers or distributors have sample copies imported into New Zealand with the intention that they should be referred to this Tribunal at their request by the Comptroller of Customs and as previously indicated that is what occurred in the case of the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta*. Occasionally publications are referred to the Tribunal by the Courts and this is necessary as Parliament has given to the Tribunal the sole initial jurisdiction to determine indecency in respect of books and it is provided that the Courts in terms of section 12 of the Indecent Publications Act refer such questions to the Tribunal for decision and report.

As the Tribunal's present chairman I have regular contact with the officers of the Tribunals Division of the Department of Justice who supervise the working of the Tribunal and with them organise the distribution of the material presented for our consideration to the Tribunal members. All members receive all books and publications requiring decision well before the Tribunal meets in formal session. The members each read and consider those publications making evaluations in respect thereof which they note and record. When the Tribunal meets at its formal session as advertised in the newspapers and notified to all having an interest in the various publications for determination its members have a preliminary meeting prior to the formal hearing. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the various items for consideration but without any attempt being made to reach any consensus in relation to that material. On most occasions the formal sitting time of the Tribunal would be less than 1 hour with the majority of the submissions made on behalf of publishers, importers or owners of material seized being in written form and in the majority of cases there are no representations whatsoever. It is rare for the Tribunal to have the assistance as it had in the case of the *Knave* and *Fiesta* publications of submissions from counsel for the importer.

Immediately following the formal hearing the Tribunal meets to determine the character of any book submitted for its classification and to classify those books in terms of section 10 of the Act which provides as follows: 10 functions of Tribunal—The functions of the Tribunal shall be—

- (a) To determine the character of any book or sound recording submitted to it for classification;
- (b) To classify books and sound recordings submitted to it as indecent or not indecent or as indecent in the hands of persons under a specified age or as indecent unless their circulation is restricted to specified persons or classes of persons or unless used for a particular purpose, as the case may be:

(c) To hear and determine any questions relating to the character of a book or sound recording referred to it by a Court in any civil or criminal proceedings (including proceedings under section 25 of this Act), and to forward a report on its finding to that Court".

I am able to record that almost invariably the Tribunal reaches a consensus decision on classification. In the majority of the cases it is then my function to detail the reasons for that classification in a written decision.

It is pertinent at this point to record that in the event of an appeal against a Tribunal ruling that that appeal in terms of section 19 of the Act is to the High Court where it will be heard by "at least three judges" of that court. It is of considerable significance in the light of the Court of Appeal's decision in the Lawrence case to further record that there is no further right of appeal from the decisions of the full Court of the High Court to the Court of Appeal.

When the Tribunal deferred its decision in respect of the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta* it did so with the knowledge that the Court of Appeal decision in the Lawrence case would shortly be available for its consideration as in fact proved to be the case. Within the framework of the legislation as had been interpreted over the years both by the Tribunal and by the Courts I had reached a conclusion that subject to what the learned Judges of the Court of Appeal might direct in their decision that I would find that the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta* were indecent. I had on the occasion of the Tribunal hearing into those publications and on a subsequent occasion when the Tribunal was receiving submissions in respect of the publications *The Girls of Penthouse*, *Australian High Society* and *Genesis Girls/Girls Spring 1986* expressed the view that the publishers of magazines depicting female nudes were endeavouring to push the benchmark past a point where they could safely expect them to receive at worst a restricted classification and that the Tripartite Test was because of this much more explicit portrayal of the female nude either no longer relevant or in need of restatement. It would have been my finding that the interpretation of "indecent" in section 2 of the Act when considered together with the prescription contained in the other provisions of the Act (in particular sections 10 and 11) and measured against previous Tribunal and appeal decisions required the Tribunal to classify those publications as indecent.

Had that option been available to me it would have meant that there would have at least been a majority decision of 3 to 2 that these particular publications be classified as indecent. I say at least as it has been unnecessary for the 2 other members constituting the majority decision to declare themselves in relation to that matter. That I have seen fit to do so results from my personal concern that there are now major fetters created by the Lawrence decision to the continued efficient operation of the Tribunal. It is obviously important that I should detail how it is that that should be so.

In his decision in the Lawrence case the learned District Court judge highlights the problems which would arise if each individual Judge in applying the precepts contained in the legislation was to approach his or her determination as to indecency on a subjective basis. With that appraisal of the problem no member of this Tribunal has any quarrel. What has always presented some difficulty (and now since the Lawrence decision, as we see it, almost insurmountable difficulty) is to find that a particular publication is indecent in that its publication would be "injurious to the public good". The majority of the Tribunal in reaching their decision are satisfied that where the challenged publications fall outside what might be called the Tripartite Test cases that there can be no innovative or original finding of indecency or a change in existing prescriptions of indecency unless there is clear and explicit evidence that injury to the public good would result from such publications being either freely available or available subject to restriction.

During the last 12 months I have read a great deal of the literature available in this country on the subject of censorship, pornography and indecency. Included in that have been the findings of various commissions and committees of inquiry set up in other parts of the world. That reading together with discussions which have been held by the members of this Tribunal have led me to a clear conclusion that the concept of "injury to the public good" as now judicially interpreted by the Court of Appeal in the Lawrence case is one which in many cases would be almost impossible to prove to the degree necessary for new rulings to be made by the Tribunal. There is I believe a strong argument based on the Lawrence decision against the Tribunal even using as a benchmark its previous decisions on classification but until such time as that particular ruling is made in another jurisdiction this Tribunal will continue to regard itself as permitted to apply its earlier decisions and it does not intend to depart from those unless there is clear evidence that standards of indecency as publicly accepted have changed to the extent that the Tribunal has to modify its decisions in relation to particular publications.

On the occasion of the Tribunal's original meeting to consider the classification of the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta* and more particularly at the further meeting of the Tribunal called specifically to consider the effect of the Lawrence decision on the Tribunal's

determination another area of concern was raised for consideration by members of the Tribunal. This particular concern is one which has been mentioned in earlier decisions of the Tribunal but on each such occasion when that has occurred there has been a direct or implied finding that the issues raised are not within the scope of the Tribunal's jurisdiction.

The concern to which I refer is the view that in presenting in pictorial and or written form a representational view of women as the sexual play thing of men such presentation denigrates all women and because of that brings the publication within the scope and meaning of the term "indecent" as defined by section 2 of the Act. I am in no doubt that there would be from the Tribunal a majority if not a unanimous decision that the material in question is plainly denigrating in that way in respect of all women. The majority is satisfied however that the legislation as presently enacted does not give jurisdiction to the Tribunal to rule against that material on that ground. It is the majority view that the words used in defining "indecent" in that section do not permit such a finding.

In a consideration of much of the material which comes before the Tribunal a member or members is or are moved to express disgust or dismay at the unwholesome coarse, lewd and denigrating aspects of that which is portrayed particularly in picture or cartoon form. Those reactions are however, whilst no doubt justified and reflecting generally held community standards not necessary indicia as to whether a particular depiction or representation is indecent *per se*. One's emotional response although perhaps some sort of reasonable indicator as to the worthiness of the publication can never replace that interpretation which Parliament itself decrees shall be the test. That which has concerned the members of the Tribunal has been what it sees as the limiting features of the Lawrence decision which the Tribunal finds puts a much stricter more difficult to prove interpretation of "indecent" than that formerly accepted by the Courts. Therein lies the problem. When the publisher of these 2 publications gave evidence and in particular when Mr Smith presented the very carefully prepared submission on the matter to the Tribunal the distinction between that which may be unwholesome pornographic lewd or coarse on the one hand and that which is indecent as per the legislation on the other hand were seen as 2 quite different concepts. Whilst the latter would invariably include elements of the former the former by itself does not necessarily lead to a finding that the material is indecent in terms of the Act.

Those features in relation to the New Zealand position which Mr Geoffrey Robertson found as distinctive and worthy of support are largely to be found in the provisions of section 11 of the Act which provides as follows:

- "11. (1) In classifying or determining the character of any book or sound recording the Tribunal shall take into consideration—
- (a) The dominant effect of the book or sound recording as a whole;
  - (b) The literary or artistic merit, or the medical, legal, political, social, or scientific character or importance of the book or sound recording;
  - (c) The persons, classes of persons, or age groups to or amongst whom the book or sound recording is or is intended or is likely to be published, heard, distributed, sold, exhibited, played, given, sent, or delivered;
  - (d) The price at which the book or sound recording sells or is intended to be sold;
  - (e) Whether any person is likely to be corrupted by reading the book or hearing the sound recording and whether other persons are likely to benefit therefrom.
  - (f) Whether the book or the sound recording displays an honest purpose and an honest thread of thought or whether its content is merely camouflage designed to render acceptable any indecent parts of the book or sound recording.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, where the publication of any book or the distribution of any sound recording would be in the interests of art, literature, science, or learning and could be for the public good, the Tribunal shall not classify it as indecent.
- (3) When the Tribunal decides that any picture-story book likely to be read by children is indecent in the hands of children under a specified age that picture-story book shall be deemed to be indecent in the hands of all persons.
- (4) Where any Court is required to classify or determine the character of any document (other than a book) it shall take into consideration, with such modifications as are necessary, the matters set out in subsections (1) and (2) of this section."

In his decision in the Lawrence case the learned President of the Court of Appeal Sir Owen Woodhouse after setting out section 11 in full makes this finding at page 8 of his judgment:

"When all these provisions are taken together, including of course the important qualifying words of the definition in section 2, I am left in no doubt that whatever might be the influence of any one or more of them in some particular case, or the possible difficulty which might arise when attempting to weigh some of them in a sufficiently objective way against others, *there is a clear statutory intention to withhold the censorship weapon from material which falls short of being actually injurious.*" (emphasis mine).

What made the tasks of the Tribunal particularly difficult in relation to the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta* was the lack of any detailed submissions from the Crown and any evidence at all let alone evidence of the kind envisaged in the Lawrence decision as being necessary to establish the real likelihood of injury to the public good. As we have stated elsewhere in this decision the prospects of that sort of evidence being available for presentation to the Tribunal in a convincing way is in any event extremely remote. Such a proposition is not new and indeed was foreseen by Mr Perry and no doubt by the other members of the Indecent Publications Tribunal as first comprised. In that regard we refer to chapter 11 of Mr Perry's book which carries the title *Panic Measures*. At pages 44 through to page 46 particular reference is made by the author to the views of experts and the findings of committee all of which gives support to that which I have subsequently read namely; that it is an almost impossible task to prove the injurious effect of indecent material on the public good.

It is not for the Tribunal to judge whether it has in the years since its inception provided an effective method of literary censorship but there can be little doubt that the Lawrence decision has created and will continue to present major problems for those seeking to establish that any particular publication is or is likely to be injurious to the public good. As previously mentioned the Tribunal has unanimously accepted that it can draw a distinction between what might be called decisions on the moving benchmark of publicly acceptable material as against decisions which might be considered as novel or at least constitute a departure in a negative way from existing benchmarks. We have already indicated that we are conscious of the probability that even that limited interpretation will be tested on appeal and the Tribunal would certainly welcome from the superior courts a direction in relation to that matter.

The members of the Tribunal regret that there is no way, at least on our interpretation of the existing law, that this decision can ultimately be reviewed by the Court of Appeal which might for the reasons indicated be prepared to reconsider the matter in this much wider framework than that provided by the portrayal of a few naked men adorning calendars. Accordingly we the majority of the Tribunal find that we are unable to classify the publications *Knave* and *Fiesta* the subject of this decision as unconditionally indecent but do find that we are able to classify them as being indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.
