- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Examinations Notice.
- (2) This notice shall come into force on the day of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Approval of scheme of examination—The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby approves—
The schemes submitted by the Examining Board of the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Incorporated, with the authority of the said Institute, for the examination of candidates for:

- (a) Certificates, diplomas and diplomas with honours in horticulture (amenity horticulture) as set out in the First Schedule hereto; and
- (b) Certificates, diplomas and diplomas with honours in horticulture (fruit production) as set out in the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (c) Certificates, diplomas and diplomas with honours in horticulture (vegetable production) as set out in the Third Schedule hereto; and
- (d) Certificates, diplomas and diplomas with honours in horticulture (nursery production) as set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto; and
- (e) Certificates, diplomas and diplomas with honours in horticulture (floriculture) as set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto.
- 3. Revocation—The Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Examinations Approval Notice 1971* is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

FIRST SCHEDULE

Scheme for the Examination of Candidates for the National Certificate in Horticulture (Amenity Horticulture), the National Diploma in Horticulture (Amenity Horticulture), and the National Diploma with Honours in Horticulture (Amenity Horticulture) of the ROYAL NEW ZEALAND INSTITUTE OF HORTICULTURE INCORPORATED

- 1. In this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - "Amenity horticulture" means the use of flowering and foliage plants, trees, shrubs and turf areas for the betterment of the environment in conjunction with natural and artificial
 - "Amenity plants" is to be interpreted in its widest sense, and includes seeds, trees, shrubs, and any flowering or nonflowering plant grown outdoors or under cover for decorative (as opposed to commercial) purposes.

- "Certificate" means the National Certificate in Horticulture (Amenity Horticulture) granted by the Institute.
- 'Diploma" means the National Diploma in Horticulture (Amenity Horticulture) granted by the Institute.
- "Diploma with Honours" means the National Diploma in Horticulture with Honours (Amenity Horticulture) granted by the Institute.
- "Examining board" means the Examining Board of the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Incorporated
- "Identification" in relation to each of plants, weeds, insects, diseases and other pests, which occur in New Zealand, means the assigning thereto of its scientific name and a commonly used name.
- "Institute" means the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Incorporated.
- "Pest" means any mammal, bird, arthropod, mollusc, nematode or other worm, fungus, bacterium, virus or mycoplasma injurious to horticultural plants.
- "Planthouse" means any glasshouse, greenhouse, shade house or similar structure in which plants are grown.
- "Practical experience" means horticultural employment approved by the Examining Board.
- "Weed" means a plant growing where it is not wanted.

Award of Certificate, Diploma and Diploma with Honours

- 2. The Institute, on the recommendation of the Examining Board, may issue to a candidate who complies with all the conditions and requirements herein prescribed:
 - (a) A Certificate to a candidate who has passed all the subjects 1 to 14 listed in 3 (1).
 - (b) A Diploma to a candidate who has passed all the subjects 1 to 20 listed in 3 (1).
 - (c) A Diploma with Honours to a candidate who has passed all the subjects 1 to 21 listed in 3 (1).

Subjects of Examination

- 3. (1) The subjects for the Certificate, Diploma and Diploma with Honours examinations shall be-
 - Horticultural Botany

 - (2) Plant Pests and Disorders(3) Soil Properties and Processes
 - (4) Horticulture Practices

 - (5) Plant Classification
 (6) Weed Control and Horticultural Chemicals
 (7) Soil Management
 (8) Amenity Horticulture I
 (9) Work Record Report
 - (10) Vegetable and Fruit Culture
 - (11) Plant Protection (Amenity Horticulture)
 - (12) Amenity Horticulture II

 - (13) Machinery and Structures (Amenity Horticulture) (14) Oral and Practical Examination I (Amenity Horticulture)
 - (15) Horticultural Plant Science

 - (16) Amenity Horticulture III (17) Engineering (Amenity Horticulture) (18) Management (Amenity Horticulture)
 - (19) Project
 - (20) Oral and Practical Examination II (Amenity Horticulture)
- (21) Thesis
- (2) The oral and practical examination shall be combined, and shall be designed to test the candidate's practical ability in horticulture and appreciation and understanding of horticultural
- (3) Each of the subjects 1 to 8, 10 to 13, 15 to 18 shall be examined by one three-hour written examination.
- (4) Candidates must demonstrate a knowledge of safe practices in all examinations.

Conduct of Examination

4. The examinations for the Institute's Certificate, Diploma and Diploma with Honours shall be held at such times and at such centres as shall be decided by the Examining Board. All examinations other than oral and practical examinations shall be held in November. Oral and practical examinations may be held in November or in any other months specified by the Examining Board.

Examination Fees

5. Every candidate for any examination for the Institute's Certificate, Diploma and Diploma with Honours conducted by the Institute shall pay to the Institute such fee as the Board may prescribe in respect of each subject the candidate wishes to be examined in. The fee may not exceed \$120 for each subject.

Equivalent Status

- 6. For the purpose of the award of a certificate, diploma or diploma with honours the Examining Board may, at its discretion:
- (a) Except with respect to oral and practical examinations, accept a pass in an equivalent or higher examination, or in subjects of such an examination held by some competent public authority as equivalent to a pass in one or more corresponding subjects of the Institute's examinations. The Examining Board will consider the horticultural content of such examinations when making its decision.
- (b) Waive any of the conditions of the examination, including a period of practical experience, if the Examining Board is satisfied that substantially equivalent conditions have been complied with by the candidate.
- (c) Adopt a system of cross-crediting whereby a candidate, having obtained a pass in any subjects in the Schemes of Examinations held under the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Examinations Approval Notice No. 1954/207, 1957/149, 1961/122, 1968/122 and 1971/231, or any other examinations conducted by the Institute, may be credited with a pass in any one or more corresponding subjects examined under this scheme.

General Comments

- 7. (1) In order to sit examinations conducted by the Institute, a candidate shall:
 - (a) Be a member of the Institute.
 - (b) Register with the Institute by 31 May in the year the first registration fee which shall not exceed \$50.
 - (c) Be aged 15 years or over.
 - (d) Submit evidence of being or having been engaged in horticulture when registering with the Institute.
 - (e) Submit for the approval of the Examining Board on such occasions as it may require evidence of appropriate practical experience, in a form as required by the Examining Board.
 - (f) Give written notice to the Examining Board of intention to sit examinations in such manner as the Examining Board may determine not later than the 31st day of July preceding the date fixed for the conduct of the examinations. Such notice shall be accompanied by payment of the prescribed fee.
- (2) One or more subjects may be taken at a time, and a candidate may be credited with a pass in one or more subjects.
- (3) The Certificate may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 14 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 3 years full-time (5400 hours) practical experience, of which 2 years (3600 hours) has been obtained in amenity horticulture.
- (4) The Diploma may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 20 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 5 years full-time (9000 hours) practical experience, of which 4 years (7200 hours) has been obtained in amenity horticulture.
- (5) The Diploma with Honours may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 21 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 5 years full-time (9000 hours) practical experience, of which 4 years (7200 hours) has been obtained in amenity horticulture.
- (6) Where the required period of practical experience will end not later than the 31st day of May in any year it may be assumed, but only for the purpose of entering for an examination, to have ended on the 31st day of October of the preceding year if the candidate undertakes to continue in his or her employment until the required period of practical experience is completed.
- (7) In the event of a candidate producing evidence to the Examining Board, in such a form as it shall consider sufficient, of an intention to leave New Zealand to pursue horticultural studies, the Examining Board may approve of the candidate taking either of the oral and practical examinations although the candidate's practical experience is up to 1 year (1800 hours) less than that prescribed for the examination. If in any such case the candidate passes the examination, the pass shall be provisional only and the appropriate certificate or diploma shall not be issued until the candidate produces, to the Examining Board, satisfactory evidence of having completed the required period of practical experience.
- (8) The Work Record Report (subject 9 in clause 3 (1)) shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than the 31st day of October in the year the candidate wishes to be examined for this subject.

- (9) The Oral and Practical examination I shall not be taken until the candidate has passed subjects 1 to 9 inclusive, and has had at least 5400 hours of appropriate practical experience as provided for in 7 (3).
- (10) The Oral and Practical examination II shall not be taken until the candidate has passed subjects 1 to 14 inclusive, and has had at least 9000 hours of appropriate practical experience as provided for in 7 (4)
- (11) A candidate shall not take a second or third stage of a subject until having passed the previous stage of that subject except with the consent of the Examining Board.
- (12) The Project (Subject 19) must be on a horticultural topic of the candidates own choice. When the Project is submitted for exam-ination the candidate shall be required to declare that the Project is substantially the candidate's own work in a form as required by the Examining Board. The Project must be submitted not later than 31 October in the year in which it is to be examined.

Thesis

- 8.-(1) Every candidate for the Diploma with Honours shall submit a thesis dealing concisely with a selected aspect, or with some portion of a selected aspect, of amenity horticulture. The candidate's topic must be submitted for the approval of the Examining Board at least 12 months before the date of examination
- (2) In the thesis the candidate shall describe some original work undertaken by the candidate personally. The Examining Board will appoint an advisor whom the candidate may consult at any time regarding the thesis material and who may suggest to the candidate appropriate approaches to thesis-related matter and the presentation of material. The credit to be assigned to the thesis shall depend upon the candidate's ability to summarise previous knowledge, carry out research work, make independent observations, and to present results accurately, clearly and concisely.
- (3) Two copies of the thesis, together with a statutory declaration by the candidate (in a form as required by the Examining Board) to the effect that the thesis is substantially the candidate's own work, shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than the 30th day of September in the year of examination. In exceptional circumstances, a candidate may be granted approval by the Examining Board to submit the thesis after the 30th day of September but not later than the 31st day of October in the year of examination
- (4) Each copy of the thesis presented to the Examining Board must be typed and permanently bound within a cover so that the sheets cannot be lost or displaced.
- (5) The Examining Board shall examine the thesis, and decide whether it is satisfactory. One copy of the thesis shall be returned to the candidate as soon as the decision of the Examining Board is made. The top copy shall be deposited in a library determined by the Examining Board.

Prescription of Subjects

An elementary knowledge of plant pests. Identification of important horticultural pests and the damage they cause.

Identification of symptoms of common physiological disorders that affect horticultural plants and plant parts. The safe use of chemicals used for plant protection.

Plant quarantine in New Zealand.

A DETAILED KNOWLEDGE OF SPECIFIC LIFE CYCLES IS NOT REQUIRED.

(3) Soil Properties and Processes

Soil formation and development.

The major physical, chemical and biological soil properties of significance to horticultural production. Soils of New Zealand (an elementary knowledge only).

(4) Horticultural Practices

Safety on horticultural properties.

The scope and location of amenity and commercial horticultural production in New Zealand.

Measures used to improve environmental conditions for horticultural plant growth.

Introduction to plant propagation (methods—sexual and asexual propagation; propagation media and equipment). Principles of plant pruning and training.

Amenity, orchard, vegetable production, nursery and flor-

icultural practices throughout the year. (A detailed knowledge of crop production is NOT required. However candidates should demonstrate a general knowledge of the type of work and equipment on different types of horticultural properties.)

record keeping, including diaries and Elementary specimens.

(5) Plant Classification

Systematic botany and taxonomy. Elementary knowledge of horticultural nomenclature and botanical terms-used in

Plant identification. Use of simple keys. A general outline of the classification and diversity of plants with emphasis on important horticultural families. Canwith emphasis on important norticultural families. Candidates shall be required to classify horticultural plants according to a classification system approved by the Examining Board. (In each case the candidates will be expected to know the general characteristics of plant families, to have studied closely one or two examples of each and to be able to refer to some of the more important genera and species cultivated in gardens. Examiners will bear in mind that some examples may not be common in all districts. Candidates will not be expected to know in all districts. Candidates will not be expected to know in infinite detail all the characters of each family, but rather those which would enable them as horticulturists to recognise certain family characters.)

(6) Weed Control and Horticultural Chemicals

Weed identification. Weed control principles. Legislation relating to weed control. Herbicides and their uses.

(Candidates should demonstrate a good knowledge of weed control practices suitable for the type of property they are working on.)

Chemicals used for plant protection purposes—formula-tion, mode of action and use. Legislation governing the storage and use of plant protection chemicals.

(7) Soil Management

Soil water management—drainage and irrigation principles. (A detailed knowledge of specific equipment and instal-lation and operating procedures is NOT required.) Soil and plant nutrient testing.

Fertilisers and their use.

Soil tillage.

Suitability and management of soils for horticultural use.

(8) Amenity Horticulture 1

A general knowledge of trees and shrubs commonly used for amenity, urban forestry, hedging and shelter including transporting, planting, transplanting, general management, pruning and tree surgery. The use and cultivation of annual, biennial and perennial plants, and the provision of seasonal displays.

The preparation, sowing and laying, and maintenance of turfed areas.

The cultivation of ornamental plants in plant houses.

(9) Work Record Report

Candidates must submit to the Examining Board a copy of the diary entries they have made over any 12-month period of the candidate's choice.

Candidates shall also present a property report of a type and in a form as required by the Examining Board.

(10) Vegetable and Fruit Culture

The culture, harvesting and storage of common home garden grown fruits and vegetables including the selection of suitable cultivars and crop management practices.

-Candidates should demonstrate they are able to answer the type of question a home gardener may ask about the culture of fruit and vegetable crops grown in New Zealand home gardens. A detailed knowledge of commercial production techniques is NOT required.

(11) Plant Protection (Amenity Horticulture)

The control of common pests of amenity plants and turf grown both outdoors and under cover, including a knowledge of ecology, life histories and host-parasite relationships. Pest management.

The design of spray schedules for amenity plantings and turf.

The correction of common physiological disorders of turfed areas and amenity plants.

(12) Amenity Horticulture II

The propagation of plants used for amenity purposes including methods, media and conditions necessary for successful propagation. The use of rootstocks for amenity plants. Seed collection and storage.

Plant-house management.

Selection and use of shelter plants for amenity purposes. Elementary surveying and levelling. Equipment and methods for determining areas, levels and grades. Labour supervision and the organisation of labour.

supervision and the organisation of labour.

(13) Horticultural Machinery and Structures (Amenity Horticulture) The types, selection, use and maintenance of machinery and equipment used in amenity horticulture.

The types, construction and maintenance of plant-houses, simple buildings, fences and artificial shelters.

Concrete making. Block and brick laying (a working

knowledge only).

The types, selection, use and maintenence of machinery and equipment used for controlling the plant-house

(14) Oral and Practical Examination (Amenity) (1 day-two 3-hour examinations)

The care and use of tools, machines and implements (including those motor driven) used in amenity horticulture.

The care and use of plant-house equipment.

The care and use of plant-house equipment. Common amenity horticultural operations, for example, preparing media; seed sowing; pricking out; hardening off; potting up and potting on; care of plant-house plants; digging and other forms of cultivation; lining out; planting; transplanting; wrenching; preparing seed beds; staking and tying plants; propagation of common plants; pruning trees and shrubs, hedges and shelter; tree surgery; preparing, sowing, turfing and maintaining lawns; planning and implementing seasonal display outdoors and in planthouses. houses.

A report on a topic of the candidate's choice, subject to the requirements in clause 7 (12). The report should be approximately 3000 words in length, and of a standard suitable for submission to a horticultural journal.

(20) Oral and Practical Examination II (Amenity Horticulture) (1 day-two 3-hour examinations)

A more advanced knowledge of subject 14 topics. Plant propagation—techniques, facilities and equipment. Media disinfestation.

Instruments and equipment used in mapping, surveying

and levelling and their use and care.

Methods employed and preparation of estimates for constructional work, e.g. the cut and fill required to level a given area, the amount of material required for a specified path, road, wall, etc.

Drainage—types, installation.

Tree maintenance, transplanting, staking and surgery.

Pruning of plants used in amenity horticulture.

Preparing and packing flowers and nursery stock for transit.

Harvesting and storing seeds.

SCHEME FOR THE EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE NATIONAL CERTIFICATE IN HORTICULTURE (FRUIT PRODUCTION), THE NATIONAL DIPLOMA IN HORTICULTURE (FRUIT PRODUCTION), AND THE NATIONAL DIPLOMA WITH HONOURS IN HORTICULTURE (FRUIT PRODUCTION) OF THE ROYAL NEW ZEALAND INSTITUTE OF HORTICULTURE INCORPORATED

- 1. In this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Certificate" means the National Certificate in Horticulture (Fruit Production) granted by the Institute.
 - "Diploma" means the National Diploma in Horticulture (Fruit Production) granted by the Institute.
 - "Diploma with Honours" means the National Diploma in Horticulture with Honours (Fruit Production) granted by the Institute.
 - "Examining Board" means the Examining Board of the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Incorporated
 - "Fruit" means apples, pears, quinces, peaches, nectarines, apricots, plums, cherries, kiwifruit, tamarillos, passionfruit, avocados, all citrus fruits, babacos, casanas, cherimoyas, feijoas, loquats, persimmons, sapotes, guavas, grapes (wine and dessert), currants (black, white and red), raspberries, brambles, strawberries, blueberries, gooseberries, walnuts, chestnuts and any other kind of fruit that the Examining Board may from time to time declare to be fruit for the purposes of this Schedule.
 - "Identification" in relation to each of plants, weeds, insects, diseases and other pests which occur in New Zealand, means the assigning thereto of its scientific name and commonly used name.
 - "Institute" means the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Incorporated.
 - "Orchard" means any area of land greater than 4000 square metres on which fruit bearing plants are grown for the purposes of producing fruit for sale, whether the trees have come into bearing or not.

- "Pest" means any mammal, bird, arthropod, mollusc, nematode or other worm, fungus, bacterium, virus or mycoplasma injurious to horticultural plants.
- "Practical experience" means horticultural employment approved by the Examining Board.
- "Weed" means a plant growing where it is not wanted.

Award of Certificate, Diploma and Diploma with Honours

- 2. The Institute, on the recommendation of the Examining Board, may issue to a candidate who complies with all the conditions and requirements herein prescribed.
 - (a) A Certificate to a candidate who has passed all the subjects 1 to 14 listed in 3(1).
 - (b) A Diploma to a candidate who has passed all the subjects 1 to 20 listed in 3(1).
 - (c) A Diploma with Honours to a candidate who has passed all the subjects 1 to 21 listed in 3(1).

 - (17) Engineering (Fruit Production)(18) Management (Fruit Production)

 - (19) Project
 - (20) Oral and Practical Examination II (Fruit Production)
 - (21) Thesis
- (2) The oral and practical examinations shall be combined, and shall be designed to test the candidate's practical ability in horticulture and appreciation and understanding of horticultural operations and activities normally carried out on orchards.
- (3) Each of the subjects 1 to 8, 10 to 13, 15 to 18 shall be examined by one 3-hour written examination.
- (4) Candidates must demonstrate a knowledge of safe practices in all examinations.

Conduct of Examinations

4. The examinations for the Institute's Certificate, Diploma and Diploma with Honours shall be held at such times and at such centres as shall be decided by the Examining Board. All examinations other than oral and practical examinations shall be held in November or in any other month specified by the Examining Board.

Examination Fees

5. Every candidate for any examination for the Institute's Certificate, Diploma or Diploma with Honours conducted by the institute shall pay to the institute such fee as the Board may prescribe in respect of each subject the candidate wishes to be examined in. The fee may not exceed \$120 for each subject.

Equivalent Status

- 6. For the purpose of the award of a Certificate, Diploma or Diploma with Honours the Examining Board may, at its discretion:
 - (a) Except with respect to oral and practical examinations, accept a pass in an equivalent or higher examination, or in subjects of such an examination held by some competent public authority as equivalent to a pass in one or more corresponding subjects of the Institute's examinations. The Examining Board will consider the horticultural content of such examinations when making its decision.
 - (b) Waive any of the conditions of the examination, accept a pass in an equivalent or higher examination, or in subjects of such an examination held by some competent public authority as equivalent to a pass in one or more corresponding subjects of the Institute's examinations. The Examining Board will consider the horticultural content of such examinations when making its decision.
- (c) Adopt a system of cross-crediting whereby a candidate, having obtained a pass in any subjects in the schemes of examinations held under the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Examinations Approval Notice No. 1954/207, 1957/149, 1961/122, 1968/122 and

1971/231, or any other examinations conducted by the Institute, may be credited with a pass in any one or more corresponding subjects examined under this scheme.

General Requirements

- 7. (1) In order to sit examinations conducted by the Institute, a candidate shall:
 - (a) Be a member of the Institute.
 - (b) Register with the Institute by 31 May in the year the first examinations are to be taken, and pay the prescribed registration fee which shall not exceed \$100.
 - (c) Be aged 15 years or over.
 - (d) Submit evidence of being or having been engaged in horticulture when registering with the Institute.
 - (e) Submit for the approval of the Examining Board on such occasions as it may require, evidence of appropriate practical experience in a form as required by the Examining Board.
 - (f) Give written notice to the Examining Board of intention to sit examinations in such manner as the Examining Board may determine not later than the 31st day of July preceding the date fixed for the conduct of the examinations. Such notice shall be accompanied by payment of the prescribed fee.
- (2) One or more subjects may be taken at a time, and a candidate may be credited with a pass in one or more subjects.
- (3) The Certificate may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 14 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 3 years full-time (5400 hours) practical experience, of which 2 years (3600 hours) has been obtained on one or more orchards.
- (4) The Diploma may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 20 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 5 years full-time (9000 hours) practical experience, of which 4 years (7200 hours) has been obtained on one or more orchards.
- (5) The Diploma with Honours may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 21 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 5 years full-time (9000 hours) practical experience, of which 4 years (7200 hours) has been obtained on one or more orchards.
- (6) Where the required period of practical experience will end not later than the 31st day of May in any year it may be assumed, but only for the purpose of entering for an examination, to have ended on the 31st day of October of the preceding year if the candidate undertakes to continue in his or her employment until the required period of practical experience is completed.
- (7) In the event of a candidate producing evidence to the (7) In the event of a candidate producing evidence to the Examining Board, in such a form as it shall consider sufficient, of an intention to leave New Zealand to pursue horticultural studies, the Examining Board may approve of the candidate taking either of the Oral and Practical examinations although the candidate's practical experience is up to 1 year (1800 hours) less than that prescribed for the examination. If in any such case the candidate passes the examination, the pass shall be provisional only and the appropriate certificate or diploma shall not be issued until the candidate produces satisfactory evidence to the Examining Board, of having completed the required period of practical experience.
- (8) The Work Record Report (subject 9 in clause 3 (1)) shall be submitted to the examining board not later than the 31st day of October in the year the candidate wishes to be examined for this
- (9) The Oral and Practical Examination I shall not be taken until the candidate has passed subjects 1 to 9 inclusive, and has had at least 5400 hours of appropriate practical experience as in 7 (3).
- (10) The Oral and Practical Examination II shall not be taken until the candidate has passed subjects 1 to 14 inclusive, and has had at least 9000 hours of appropriate practical experience as provided for in 7 (4).
- (11) A candidate shall not take a second or third stage of a subject until having passed the previous stage of that subject, except with the approval of the Examining Board.
- (12) The Project (subject 19) must be on a horticultural topic of the candidate's own choice. When the project is submitted for examination the candidate shall be required to declare in a form as required by the Examining Board that the project is substantially the candidate's own work. The project must be submitted not later than 31 October in the year that it is to be examined.

Thesis

8. (1) Every candidate for the Diploma with Honours shall submit a thesis dealing concisely with a selected aspect, or with some portion of a selected aspect, of fruit production. The candidate's

- topic must be submitted for the approval of the Examining Board at least 12 months before the date of examination.
- (2) In the thesis the candidate shall describe some original work undertaken by the candidate personally. The Examining Board will appoint an advisor whom the candidate may consult at any time regarding the thesis material and who may suggest to the candidate appropriate approaches to thesis-related matters and the presenta-tion of material. The credit to be assigned to the thesis shall depend upon the candidate's ability to summarise previous knowledge, carry out research work, make independent observations, and to present results accurately, clearly and concisely.
- (3) Two copies of the thesis, together with a statutory declaration by the candidate (in a form as required by the Examining Board) to the effect that the thesis is substantially the candidate's own work, shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than the 30th day of September in the year of examination. In exceptional circumstances, a candidate may be granted approval by the Examining Board to submit the thesis after the 30th day of September, but no later than the 31st day of October in the year of the examination.
- (4) Each copy of the thesis presented to the Examining Board must be typed and permanently bound within a cover so that sheets cannot be lost or displaced.
- (5) The Examining Board shall examine the thesis, and decide whether it is satisfactory. One copy of the thesis shall be returned to the candidate as soon as the decision of the Examining Board is made. The top copy shall be deposited in a library determined by the Examining Board.

Prescriptions of Subjects

 - (5) The Fruit Industry in New Zealand-Areas of fruit production in New Zealand-relationship to locality and potential

Recent and new developments in the industry.

Industry structure—grower, servicing, research and marketing organisations.

Marketing local produced fruit in New Zealand and over-seas—fruit maturity, packaging and presentation, trans-portation, advertising and promotion. Labour supervision. Labour relations.

Recording and budgeting on orchards (an elementary knowledge only).

- (6) Weed Control and Horticultural Chemicals-As prescribed for Weed Control and Horticultural Chemicals in Schedule 1, clause 9 (1).
- (7) Soil Management—As prescribed for Soil Management in Schedule 1, clause 9 (7).
- (8) Fruit Production I-Selection of land, crops, rootstocks and fruit cultivars.

Orchard layout (including buildings, roading, and shelter).

Fruit plant propagation (principles only). Crop production practices—planting, training, pruning, orchard floor maintenance, thinning, fertiliser use, irrigation.

(Specific knowledge of machinery and equipment is not

required at this stage.)

Harvesting-fruit maturity, post harvest physiology and

- A DETAILED KNOWLEDGE OF THE PRODUCTION, HARVESTING AND MARKETING OF ANY PARTICULAR FRUIT CROPS IS NOT REQUIRED.
- (9) Work Record Report—As prescribed for Work Record Report in Schedule 1, clause 9 (9).
- (10) Horticultural Plant Science—As prescribed for Horticultural Plant Science in Schedule 1, clause 9 (15).
- (11) Plant Protection (Fruit Production)—The control of common pests of fruit crops including a knowledge of ecology, life histories and host-parasite relationships. Pest management.

The design of spray schedules for orchards.

- The correction of common physiological disorders of fruit crops.
- (12) Fruit Production II—The commercial production, harvesting and marketing of the following fruit crops in New Zealand:

- Apples, pears, peaches (including nectarines) apricots, plums, cherries, kiwifruit, citrus, raspberries, brambles, strawberries, grapes and such other crops as from time to time may be prescribed by the Examining Board.
- (13) Machinery and Structures (Fruit Production)—The types, selection, use and maintenance of tractors, machinery, implements and equipment used on orchards. Labour organisation and management. Staff training. Commercial and other laws affecting orcharding.

Project costing, development budgeting and machinery replacement.

Use of computers in orchards.

- (19) Project—A report on a topic of the candidate's choice, subject to the requirements in clause 7 (12). The report should be approximately 3000 words in length, and of a standard suitable for submission to a horticultural journal.
- (20) Oral and Practical Examination II (Fruit Production)-(1 day—two 3-hour examinations)—A more advanced knowledge of subject 14 topics. The candidate must submit a plan (own work) of an ideal orchard growing a range of fruit for discussion on planning, design and layout.
- (21) Thesis—As prescribed in clause 8 of this scheme.

 - (b) Waive any of the conditions of the examination, including a period of practical experience, if the Examining Board is satisfied substantially equivalent conditions have been complied with by the candidate.
 - (c) Adopt a system of cross-crediting whereby a candidate, having obtained a pass in any subjects in the schemes of examinations held under the Royal New Zealand Institute of Horticulture Examinations Approval Notices No. 1954/207, 1957/149, 1961/122, 1968/122 and 1971/231, or any other examinations conducted by the institute, may be credited with a pass in any one or more corresponding subjects examined under this scheme.

General Requirements

- 7. (1) In order to sit examinations conducted by the Institute, a candidate shall:
 - (a) Be a member of the Institute.
 - (b) Register with the Institute by 31 May in the year the first examinations are to be taken, and pay the prescribed registration fee which shall not exceed \$100;
 - (c) Be aged 15 years or over;
 - (d) Submit evidence of being or having been engaged in horticulture when registering with the Institute;
 - (e) Submit for the approval of the Examining Board on such occasions as it may require, evidence of appropriate practical experience in a form as required by the Examining Board.
 - (f) Give written notice to the Examining Board of intention to sit examinations in such manner as the Examining Board may determine not later than the 31st day of July preceding the date fixed for the conduct of the examinations. Such notice shall be accompanied by payment of the prescribed fee.
- (2) One or more subjects may be taken at a time, and a candidate may be credited with a pass in one or more subjects;
- (3) The Certificate may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 14 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the

- equivalent of 3 years full-time (5400 hours) practical experience, of which 2 years (3600 hours) has been obtained on one or more floricultural units.
- (4) The Diploma may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 20 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 5 years full-time (9000 hours) practical experience, of which 4 years (7200 hours) has been obtained on one or more floricultural units.
- (5) The Diploma with Honours may be awarded only to a candidate who has passed all subjects 1 to 21 in clause 3 (1) of this scheme and has satisfied the Examining Board of having completed at least the equivalent of 5 years full-time (9000 hours) practical experience, of which 4 years (7200 hours) has been obtained on one or more floricultural units.
- (6) Where the required period of practical experience will end not later than the 31st day of May in any year it may be assumed, but only for the purpose of entering for an examination, to have ended on the 31st day of October of the preceding year if the candidate undertakes to continue in his employment until the required period of practical experience is completed.
- (7) In the event of a candidate producing evidence to the Examining Board, in such a form as it shall consider sufficient, of an intention to leave New Zealand to pursue horticultural studies, the Examining Board may approve of the candidate taking either of the Oral and Practical examinations although the candidate's practical experience is up to 1 year (1800 hours) less than that prescribed for the examination. If in any such case the candidate passes the examination, the pass shall be provisional only and the appropriate Certificate or Diploma shall not be issued until the candidate produces, to the Examining Board, satisfactory evidence of having completed the required period of practical experience.
- (8) The Work Record Report (subject 9 in clause 3 (1)) shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than that the 31st day of October in the year the candidate wishes to be examined for this subject.
- (9) The Oral and Practical examination I shall not be taken until the candidate has passed subjects 1 to 9 inclusive, and has had at least 9000 hours of appropriate practical experience as provided for
- (10) The Oral and Practical examination II shall not be taken until the candidate has passed subjects 1 to 14 inclusive, and has had at least 9000 hours of appropriate practical experience as provided for in 7 (4).
- (11) A candidate shall not take a second or third stage of a subject until having passed the previous stage of that subject, except with the approval of the Examining Board.
- (12) The Project (subject 19) must be on a horticultural topic of the candidate's own choice. When the project is submitted for examination, the candidate shall be required to declare in a form as required by the Examining Board that the project is substantially the candidate's own work.

Thesis

- 8. (1) Every candidate for the Diploma with Honours shall submit a thesis dealing concisely with a selected aspect, or with some portion of a selected aspect, of floriculture. The candidate's topic must be submitted for the approval of the Examining Board at least 12 months before the date of examination.
- (2) In the thesis the candidate shall describe some original work undertaken by the candidate personally. The Examining Board will appoint an adviser whom the candidate may consult at any time regarding the thesis material and who may suggest to the candidate appropriate approaches to thesis-related matters and the presentation of material. The credit to be assigned to the thesis shall depend upon the candidate's ability to summarise previous knowledge, carry out research work, make independent observations, and to present results accurately, clearly and concisely.
- (3) Two copies of the thesis, together with a statutory declaration by the candidate (in a form as required by the Examining Board) to the effect that the thesis is substantially the candidate's own work, shall be submitted to the Examining Board not later than the 30th day of September in the year of examination. In exceptional circumstances a candidate may be granted approval by the Examining Board to submit the thesis after the 30th day of September but not later than the 31st day of October in the year of examination.
- (4) Each copy of the thesis presented to the Examining Board must be typed and permanently bound within a cover so that sheets cannot be lost or displaced.
- (5) The Examining Board shall examine the thesis, and decide whether it is satisfactory. One copy of the thesis shall be returned to the candidate as soon as the decision of the Examining Board is made. The top copy shall be deposited in a library determined by the Examining Board.

 - (3) Soil Properties and Processesl Properties and Processes—As prescribed for Properties and Processes in Schedule 1, clause 9 (3).
 - (4) Horticultural Practices—As prescribed for Horticultural Practices in Schedule 1, clause 9 (4).
 - (5) Plant Classification—As prescribed for Plant Classification in Schedule 1 clause 9 (5)
 - (6) Weed Control and Horticultural Chemicals-As prescribed for Weed Control and Horticultural Chemicals in Schedule 1,
 - (7)Soil Management—As prescribed for Soil Management in Schedule 1, clause 9 (7).
 - (8) Floriculture I-Areas of floricultural production in New Zealand.

Relationship to locality and potential markets.
The structure of the floricultural industry in New Zealand.
The layout of properties producing floricultural crops (including buildings, roading and shelter).

Floricultural production practices—outdoor and plant

house production practices.

Propagation management and planning. The selection, collection and preparation of propagating material.

Marketing—marketing channels, packing, presentation, transport, storage, promotion.

Exporting.

Recording and budgeting (elementary knowledge only).

A DETAILED KNOWLEDGE OF THE PRODUCTION, HARVESTING AND MARKETING OF ANY PARTICULAR FLORICULTURAL CROPS IS NOT REQUIRED.

- (10) Horticultural Plant Science—As prescribed for horticultural plant science in Schedule 1, clause 9 (15).
- (11) Plant Protection (Floriculture)—The control of common pests of floricultural crops including a knowledge of ecology, life histories and host-parasite relationships. Pest management. The design of spray schedules for floricultural units.

The correction of common physiological disorders of floricultural crops.

- (12) Floriculture II—The commercial production, harvesting, marketing, and utilisation of the major floricultural crops grown in New Zealand:
