#### Notice

- 1. Short title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Customs Exchange Rates Notice (No. 8) 1988.
- (2) This notice shall come into force on the 11th day of April 1988.
- 2.   - (g) The tare weight of the container.
- 2. That they be clearly marked or labelled to indicate that the container is suitable for use with LPG.
- 3. That they be provided with valve threads and fittings which provide the following functions:
  - (a) Filling connection incorporating a non return valve.
  - (b) Service valve incorporating an excess flow valve.
  - (c) Contents gauge.
  - (d) Pressure relief valve.

- (f) Automatic fill limiter which prevents the container being filled beyond 85 percent of the total cylinder capacity.

### **Broadcasting Act 1976**

Decision No. 3/88 BRO 11/85

#### Before the Broadcasting Tribunal

In the matter of the Broadcasting Act 1976, and in the matter of an application by Radio Bay of Plenty Ltd. for a commercial FM broadcasting sound radio warrant for the Eastern and Central Bay of Plenty:

Chairman: B. H. Slane.

Member: Robert Boyd-Bell.

### Interim Decision

Dated the 25th day of February 1988.

The applicant is at present the holder of the warrant for station 1XX, an AM station operating from Whakatane with a relay station at Murupara.

The company sought an FM warrant for the purpose of broadcasting to its existing target audience from Mount Edgecumbe. The station intends to broadcast its existing programme through an FM transmitter. It would broadcast simultaneously through the AM transmitter for a limited period of 6 months. (This is referred to as simulcasting.) The applicant would then surrender its AM warrant and broadcast solely from the FM transmitter.

### Previous application

The applicant had previously made an application to the Broadcasting Tribunal for a warrant to broadcast on the FM band. That application provided for simulcasting for a period of up to 2 years and proposed transmitting from a site on Mount Manawahe. The Tribunal declined that application and set out its reasons in decision No. 29/84. The Tribunal concluded its decision as follows:

The Tribunal has carefully considered the application but is not able to grant it in its present form. If the applicant decides it wants to broadcast on FM the broad conclusion we have arrived at is that it could be permitted to do so, that the transmission should be engineered to reduce (as far as is

reasonable) the propagation of signal towards Tauranga, that the site would be Mount Edgecumbe and that the need for any translator should await the commencement of transmission. Simulcasting should be limited to a short period not exceeding 6 months which could be used intensively to promote a new medium.

As the essence of the application was to transmit from Mount Manawahe it is not appropriate to grant the application with a condition to broadcast from another site. It seems more appropriate to indicate that if the applicant wishes to lodge a different application the Tribunal would be prepared to consider it promptly and give an early decision. This we do.

This present application does not satisfy us that its desirable elements outweigh the undesirable elements and therefore it must be declined.

The further application was filed by the applicant on 5 March 1985. It was duly advertised. There were no objections.

Evidence was given on the same lines as had been given in the previous hearing and we do not need to detail it here.

It is sufficient to say that we would give the application the same weight for its desirability. The question of the effect on the neighbouring station 1ZD Tauranga operated by Radio New Zealand for the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand was not raised during the hearing but was referred to in submissions. The Corporation did however raise technical matters which we shall refer to later.

The essence of the application was that it was desirable to provide an FM service to the area and, as it would not be economic for a second local station to be established, it followed that either 1XX had to convert or people in the Eastern Bay of Plenty would not have a FM service providing stereo coverage for this popular local commercial programme.

We were satisfied that the proposed programme would meet some of the needs for an FM service and we were satisfied with the financial and commercial ability of the applicant to carry on the proposed service and the likelihood that it would be carried on satisfactorily. These factors, which we are required to take account of, have caused no concern because of the good record of service of the applicant to the audience in the district.

We arrived at the situation where the Tribunal was prepared to grant an application for a service from Mt Edgecumbe.

#### Technical evidence

The application however seemed to reflect to a considerable extent the previous ambition of the applicant to provide a signal strength in the target area higher than that required to achieve the CCIR standard which has been accepted as the basic standard for New Zealand.

Part of the problem grows from the concerns of the applicant—

- 1. To get a very high standard of signal into the principal urban area of Whakatane.
- 2. To provide from Mount Edgecumbe an adequate signal for some of the more difficult locations, notably Ohope Beach, Opotiki and Murupara.
- 3. To provide a signal that would be adequate for a summertime audience likely to be beach oriented.
- 4. To provide programmes on one frequency for people moving through the area listening to car radios.

The proposal made by the applicant was amended 3 times as the New Zealand Post Office declined to certify the application. There was also opposition to the engineering proposals from the Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand.

The applicant called no technical evidence but we did hear evidence from Mr R. B. Vernall, Supervising Engineer, Radio Regulatory Operations, New Zealand Post Office. Mr Vernall who had an extensive career in engineering broadcasting coverage before he joined the Post Office 2 years earlier, considered that the proposal involved establishing a station with an unnecessarily strong signal.

The application originally provided for a maximum effective radiated power (e.r.p.) of 40 kW. Following discussions with the Post Office the applicant filed a first amendment which had the effect of proposing that the maximum e.r.p. would be whatever was required to provide a field strength of 66 dB uV/m in key areas of the target coverage area. These were:

Whakatane and Ohope Beach, Opotiki, Murupara, Te Puke and Te Kaha.

It was also proposed that such field strength should be provided as a minimum within an area marked on the plan included in the application.

It was proposed with the first amendment to halve the base power of the transmitter.

As a result of further discussions a second amendment was filed to provide for compliance with the requirements set out by the New Zealand Post Office in RB 20 and to change the field strengths mentioned above to read:

Whakatane, excluding Ohope Beach - 72–81 dB uV/m
Opotiki - 66
Murupara - 66
Te Puke - 66
Te Kaha - 61

It was then accepted that it may be necessary to provide Ohope Beach with a translator.

Finally, at the hearing Mr Mortlock sought to file a *third* amendment to the application to provide for a mean effective radiated power of 10 kW. The antenna would be directional producing a quasi cardioid horizontal radiation pattern with the major lobe in the general direction of Ohope Beach and Te Kaha with the maximum e.r.p. in that direction not more than 20 kW.

The proposal was that the transmitter would produce such power as was necessary to provide the effective radiated power required to achieve the above objective.

The applicant proposed to conduct tests within 3 months.

Mr Vernall's evidence to us was first that there was no regulatory value in the description of the *mean* effective radiated power which is simply the average power radiated in

all directions. From a regulatory point of view the power to be defined is the maximum e.r.p.

Mr Vernall also expressed the view that the following median field strengths were appropriate:

Whakatane - 66 dB uV/m

 Opotiki
 - 66

 Murupara
 - 66

 Te Puke
 - 66

 Te Kaha
 - 54

In this respect he differed from the assessment of the BCNZ witness Mr Gracie who would have rated Opotiki for 60 dB and Murupara for 54 dB. He also differed from the applicant in agreeing with Mr Gracie that, having regard to its population density, 54 dB was adequate for Te Kaha. He considered that if that field strength was achieved in Te Kaha the median field strength in Whakatane would be more than 66 dB.

He also said that 54 dB would be achieved at Te Kaha if 66 dB was achieved at Opotiki. He advocated the directional pattern of the antenna be changed to be directed towards Opotiki rather than Ohope Beach.

The field strength target for Opotiki would obviously give a bonus for Whakatane coverage in terms of higher field strengths.

As far as tests were concerned he did not consider it would make any difference what mast was used on Mount Edgecumbe, either the BCNZ or the Electricity Department, as once it was a reasonable height it was not the height above the ground level at the site that was effective but the height above sea level.

He thought that the BCNZ tests which had been taken at thousands of positions could be converted from the TV Band III and scaled to give coverage by reasonable deduction.

The final stages of approval by the Post Office involved the verification of performance and proof of the performance of field strengths and allowed for adjustments to be made to meet the original objectives. These adjustments may be up or down.

He also considered it necessary to see a polar diagram which adequately describes the horizontal radiation pattern from the transmitter.

Mr Vernall said that what was essentially being considered was a variety of proposals. The proposal by the BCNZ was a practical cost effective one in the Corporation's view and involved in simple slant panel array on one corner of the television transmitter tower. The weakness of this signal would be towards Murupara and he could not disagree with the wish of the applicant to improve the signal into Murupara to 66 dB.

The Broadcasting Corporation of New Zealand was concerned that excessive signal did not enter the Tauranga area which was the base for their station 1ZD. This had been referred to by the Tribunal in its earlier decision.

Mr Gracie's calculations showed that a proposal to use a comparatively low power transmitter on the BCNZ tower would have brought an adequate signal to Whakatane but a less than adequate signal to Opotiki, Murupara and Te Kaha.

We accepted that there should be some increase in the effective radiated power which would involve either a different radiation pattern or a higher power to produce a higher e.r.p.

We did not however accept the case for the applicant that it should be granted a maximum effective radiated power towards Opotiki of  $20\ kW$ .

The BCNZ's concern partly arises from the fact that it may well be using the same transmission point for later FM services into the area. The FM technical rules require emissions from a common site to provide approximately equal field strengths for similar coverage objectives. The proposal to use a stronger transmitter power than was generally accepted as needed for the area would then force the BCNZ to have similar power for

any other service. This adversely affects the capital and operating costs of future services. We were not so concerned about this aspect in view of the fact that there were specific commercial objectives for this applicant's service and quite proper reasons for not radiating the signal so much towards Tauranga for instance. The same objectives may not apply to other services, particularly because coverage from Te Aroha and elsewhere could influence the desired aerial pattern for broadcasts from Mount Edgecumbe.

The Tribunal however is concerned from a conservation point of view that excessive power is not demanded by warrant holders for commercial reasons. The implications of this are not only to cause expense for other operators in the area but also to limit the efficient use of frequencies.

It appeared from Mr Vernall's evidence that the applicant was attempting to use increased signal strength to meet the coverage deficiencies caused by the topography. His evidence was that the problems arising from the topography, such as multipath signals, would not be solved by increased power as the interfering mechanisms would increase by a like proportion.

He therefore considered that there was no point in increasing the power to try to cover the difficult areas in Whakatane or for instance Ohope Beach. He considered that Ohope Beach could only be covered with a quality signal by the use of a translator. The beach areas generally could suffer in any event from problems such as "back scatter" and other severe impairments could not be overcome by power increases.

The problems that the station was attempting to deal with were problems relating to the quality of signal reception and not of power. The magnitude of signal would not guarantee a high quality service, he said.

The correct policy for VHF-FM coverage, for mobile listeners as with other listeners, is to provide a local low powered translator where necessary. Motorists will have to re-tune from one frequency to another as they pass through the district. This is one of the disadvantages of VHF transmissions compared with medium frequency transmissions.

#### Procedural Path

The application had been filed on 5 March 1985. The hearing took place on 25 June 1985. Thereafter Mr Gracie's affidavit was to be filed and, if he was not required for cross-examination, final submissions would be filed  $10\,$  days thereafter.

By leave no final submissions were filed by the applicant until 16 December 1986.

However, the technical objections were not adequately dealt with. The Tribunal received submissions from the BCNZ and the New Zealand Radio Frequency Service (formerly New Zealand Post Office), the latter indicating further information was required from the applicant. In June 1987 the applicant's counsel lodged further submissions but requested the matter be not placed before the Tribunal until the Corporation made new submissions. On 24 July the Corporation did so, reiterating its position regarding the power sought by the applicant. On 28 September 1987 counsel for the applicant requested that the matter be placed before the Tribunal.

It was still not clear that outstanding technical details had been resolved. As at 21 July 1987 the New Zealand Radio Frequency Service had still not been prepared to certify the application citing power and polarisation as precluding that step which is required before the grant of a warrant. The applicant's counsel subsequently urged the Tribunal to give a decision as the matter of certification had, he said, been delayed by the absence of Mr I. R. Hutchings of the NZRFS in Geneva.

On 8 January 1988 the Tribunal was informed by the New Zealand Radio Frequency Service that the Service had still to receive a concise statement by the applicant as to the

polarisation proposed. The Service considered the antenna horizontal radiation pattern satisfactory, but a letter from Mr Mortlock on 21 August 1987 had created further doubt about the polarisation intended. Although a copy of the Service's letter of 8 January 1988 was sent to Mr Mortlock, the Tribunal has not been informed of a resolution of the matter.

As to power, the Service maintained that the proposed  $5\,kW$  transmitter power was more than was required to meet the applicant's objectives and that a power of  $1\,kW$  giving maximum e.r.p. of not more than  $10\,kW$  would be satisfactory.

It appeared to us that the application was still not in an appropriate form to be granted. On the other hand we could indicate the median coverage to be achieved in accordance with Mr Vernall's evidence and we have now accepted that this is the best course to follow.

We therefore indicate that, if the application is amended to accord with the technical requirements of the NZRFS and thus gains certification, the Tribunal will grant the application on the following conditions:

- 1. That the applicant surrender the AM warrant for 1XX within 180 days after the commencement of FM broadcasting.
- 2. For the period of 180 days both stations may broadcast the same programmes.
- 3. The present conditions of Radio Whakatane's warrant relating to networking will apply.
- 4. The applicant is authorised to establish low powered relay stations required to improve signal strengths within the coverage area as may be authorised by the New Zealand Radio Frequency Service. Such relay stations shall be notified to the Tribunal for endorsement on the warrant.
- 5. There will be no limit on advertising content. (The Broadcasting Rules provide a maximum of 18 minutes per hour.)
- 6. The maximum effective radiated power in any direction shall be not more than is necessary to provide 66 dB uV/m median measurement of signal strength in Whakatane, Opotiki, Murupara and Te Puke and 54 dB uV/m for Te Kaha.
- 7. The Tribunal will require to approve the final proposed pattern and in this respect determines that there shall not be excessive signal (more than is necessary to provide a service to Te Puke) in the direction of Tauranga.
  - 8. Polarisation will have to be approved by the Tribunal.
- 9. The warrant will lapse if not taken up within 18 months of the date of final decision or any further extended period approved by the Tribunal.
- 10. The news media ownership condition will apply in the form now inserted by the Tribunal in warrants in substitution for the present condition.
- 11. Otherwise the conditions which applied to the 1XX warrant as appropriate will be applied to this warrant.

Leave is given to the applicant and the other parties to make submissions on the definition of the coverage area.

#### Delays

We note the extraordinary time taken to give a decision on the conversion of Whakatane's AM station to FM. There were 3 principal reasons for this:

- 1. The applicant's decision to apply to broadcast from Mount Manawahe which was dealt with in the first decision of the Tribunal.
- 2. The time taken to conclude satisfactory arrangements to use Mount Edgecumbe.
- 3. The applicant's determination to press for excessive power, contrary to the clear weight of technical evidence, and its inability to resolve comparatively straightforward technical matters quickly.

The applicant's inflexible and often confrontation approach to

reasonable technical regulatory and conservation concerns, together with its own decision not to seek an early commencement of a technically satisfactory service because that did not accord with its own technical assessment of its needs, were the fundamental reasons for the lengthy time which has elapsed. As early as 8 May 1985 the New Zealand Post Office refused certification which is a prerequisite to the grant of a warrant. It said, "The proposed maximum e.r.p. of 40 kW is grossly excessive for the coverage objectives published by the Tribunal". Despite amendments, certification has still not been obtained. The applicant should not seek to blame regulatory procedures or this Tribunal since its amendments have not met the technical objections.

This Tribunal was ready to consider its decision very shortly after the hearing on 24 June 1985. It trusts that this interim decision may clear the way to an early certification and final decision.

#### Decision

Dated the 18th day of February 1988.

This complaint arose from the broadcast on Television One on Tuesday 18 November 1986 of a documentary entitled "The Triple Crown—The Paradox of Papacy", written and presented by novelist, Morris West. The broadcast preceded the Pope's visit to New Zealand, which began on Saturday 22 November 1986.

#### The Complaint

Mr Alexander Tod lodged a formal complaint with the BCNZ on 12 January 1987. Mr Tod submitted that the Corporation had breached the provisions of section 24 (e) of the Act which provides for

"The principle that when controversial issues of public importance are discussed, reasonable efforts are made to present significant points of view either in the same programme or in other programmes within the period of current interest."

Mr Tod also submitted that the Corporation had breached the terms of programme rule 1.1 (g) which requires broadcasters

"To show balance, impartiality and fairness in dealing with political matters, current affairs, and all questions of a controversial nature."

Mr Tod explained that he had telephoned the Controller of Programmes for TVNZ before the documentary was screened "to express my concern that the West documentary to be screened the following night would be partial and one-sided, given Morris West's dissenting position within the Catholic Church and his previous invective and vituperation against the Papacy". He had agreed to withhold judgment until he had seen the programme, but subsequently determined formal complaint was justified.

Mr Tod advanced 2 basic grounds for his complaint—that the documentary itself was not balanced in its view of the Papacy,

nor was it balanced by a separate programme presenting a different view. He variously described the documentary as "thoroughly tendentious and partisan", "a series of insidious attacks", "an apologia for dissent in the Church", "a hatchetjob on an institution", and a "2-hour diatribe against the Papacy".

### The Corporation's Response

The Corporation advised Mr Tod on 12 March 1987 that his complaint had been considered by the Board but not upheld. In his letter to Mr Tod the Secretary of the Corporation, Mr McLean, said the documentary had to be placed in the context of all the other material broadcast in connection with the Pope's visit to New Zealand. It was a personal viewpoint and an 'essay' type of programme.

The Board had noted the professional credentials of the makers of the documentary including the producer, Mr Peter Montagnon, who was the person behind the "Heart of the Dragon" and "Civilisation" series for which he had won a British Academy of Film and Television Arts Award. He had also won other international broadcasting awards. Mr McLean said that while the documentary may have been provocative to some, no member of the Church hierarchy complained and no other complaints were received.

### Reference to the Tribunal

Mr Tod was not satisfied and referred his complaint to the Tribunal on 25 March 1987. He claimed that the Corporation had misdirected itself, that the documentary was clearly controversial and that "such a partisan and controversial presentation needed to be balanced by a positive view of the Papacy in general and Pope John Paul II in particular". Mr Tod requested a hearing before the Tribunal but not earlier than June 1987 as he would be out of the country during the intervening period.

### The Corporation's Submission

The Corporation lodged submissions with the Tribunal dated 17 August 1987, drawing attention to the provisions of rule 1.1 (g), which does not require that balance, impartiality and fairness be achieved in one programme. Section 24 (1) (e) of the Broadcasting Act expressly provides that significant points of view may be presented over a period of current interest. The Secretary of the Corporation attached a schedule of TVNZ programmes relating to Pope John Paul II's visit totalling more than  $13^{1/2}$  hours, excluding news coverage.

He submitted that TVNZ provided ample opportunity in a variety of broadcasts for viewers to see "a contrary presentation of the Papacy", much of it by direct representation.

### Mr Tod's Response

Mr Tod responded to the Corporation's submissions on 21 September. He said he was gratified at the very generous coverage given during the Pope's visit to New Zealand but that "such coverage is quite irrelevant to the question of balancing the West documentary by screening a contrary personal appraisal of the Papacy by someone sympathetic such as Muggeridge". Mr Tod submitted that neither the programme rule nor the Act was concerned with how well-produced the documentary was, but rather with balance, impartiality and fairness.

He also said that "Everything about West's tone, body language, leading interviews, historical and theological selectivity betrayed unmistakeable contempt for the institution of the Papacy and Pope John Paul II".

Mr Tod submitted a schedule of radio and television programmes and *Listener* articles and claimed that the Corporation gave disproportionate coverage to opponents of the Papacy in programmes and articles "all saturated with anti-papal bile".

#### The Hearing

All members viewed the programme complained of before the oral hearing on Tuesday, 3 November 1987, attended by Mr Tod and Mr B. Hudson for the BCNZ. Mr Tod reiterated his previous submissions. While conceding that the aim of the documentary was laudable and that it was very professional and well-produced he insisted that the subject was controversial and ought to have been balanced by another programme. He did not accept that any of the 13½ hours of programme time devoted by TVNZ to the Papacy and the Pope's visit to New Zealand effectively balanced the 2-hour documentary. Mr Tod submitted that Morris West was a "dissenter" with antipathy towards the Papacy and Pope John Paul II.

The Tribunal declined to accept additional material purporting to represent Mr West's views on the Papacy and the Catholic Church on the grounds that the complaint had to be considered in the specific context of the programme material broadcast.

For the Corporation, Mr Hudson submitted it was dangerous to assume that the documentary represented solely Mr West's views, as producers of reputation do not allow performers to parade prejudice. He said the documentary was of relevance to non-Catholics as well as Catholics, that it was as difficult to define a "period of current interest" for the Papacy or the Catholic Church as it was for royalty, and that the schedule presented demonstrated TVNZ had transmitted many hours of "unedited adulation" during the Pope's visit.

#### Decision

The Tribunal has concluded that Mr Tod was not able to substantiate his views and there was no basis for his complaint. The Tribunal considers the documentary "The Triple Crown—The Paradox of Papacy" to have been a thoroughly professional production, reflecting high production values which include balance and fairness. The very aim of the programme was to contrast the world of the Vatican with that of the most populous Catholic nation on earth. That was the paradox alluded to in the title. The programme pursued its theme without sensationalism and the Tribunal could find no evidence of the motives Mr Tod ascribed to the programme, or its writer and presenter Morris West.

The Tribunal found the programme thought-provoking and illustrative of the dilemma facing a large international institution with a long history also facing the problems of the modern world.

There is no evidence that the Vatican or the Papacy took any exception to the programme, and Mr Tod was unable to produce any.

The Tribunal noted the collaboration of senior Vatican officials in the programme, both as participants and as advisers listed in the programme credits.

They were obviously aware of the programme and involved in its preparation.

If there had been a viewpoint of the Papacy in the programme adverse to the Pope which needed to be balanced in another programme, the schedule of programme material broadcast by Television New Zealand during the period surrounding the Papal visit to New Zealand in 1986 (including both live broadcasts and other programmes) would certainly have achieved the necessary balance.

The Tribunal finds the complaint demonstrates the difficulty the complainant had in divorcing his strong antipathy to Mr West's published views from the actual programme and his reading much more into some aspects of the programme than could possibly be justified. Unfortunately, Mr Tod could not see that his strongly held views on the Papacy and on Mr West predetermined his judgment of the documentary.

The complaint is not upheld.

#### Co-opted Members

Father John Coleman and Mr J. A. Kelleher were co-opted as persons whose qualifications and experience were likely to be of assistance in dealing with the complaint. In accordance with the Act, they took part in the discussions but the unanimous decision is that of the permanent members.

### Reasons for Decision

Dated this 19th day of February 1988.

#### Background

On 27 August 1987 the Tribunal received an application from the BCNZ for a short-term broadcasting authorisation (STBA) to operate a hit-music and lifestyle radio station on the AM band in the Bay of Islands based at Paihia during the post-Christmas summer period from 26 December 1987 to 16 January 1988.

The Corporation said the proposed broadcast was similar to those operated over the previous 7 summers, the hours of local origination would be from 0600–1800 daily, except Sunday when they were to be 0700–1300. Outside those hours the station would relay Radio New Zealand's commercial network evening and all-night programmes. Advertising content of up to 10 minutes per hour was sought. The run-of-station rate would be \$20 plus G.S.T. The estimated income was \$60,000 with an estimated excess of income over expenditure of \$22,900. The application was referred to Northland FM for comment by 22 September 1987. No comment or objection was received, and the authorisation was approved by the Tribunal on 28 September.

On 28 September 1987 the Tribunal separately received an application from Northland FM Radio (Whangarei) Ltd. (Northland FM) for a STBA in the Bay of Islands to operate from 26 December 1987 to 17 January 1988 on the FM band.

This applicant also proposed extensive local origination from 0800–1800 daily, except Sundays when the local hours would be 1200–1800. For the balance of the time the station would relay programmes originated from KCC-FM Northland studios in Whangarei and broadcast from its Northland transmitters.

The applicant proposed a maximum advertising content of 8 minutes per hour, a run-of-station rate of \$20 plus G.S.T., and estimated its income at \$41,000 with an estimated excess of income over expenditure of \$16,000.

Northland FM said its financial projections had been calculated in the expectation that application BRO 58/87 by the BCNZ would be approved by the Tribunal.

The Northland FM application cited support from several businesses and commercial organisations in the Bay of Islands.

It was referred to the BCNZ for comment by 26 October 1987.

On 23 October the Tribunal received an objection from the BCNZ to the grant of an STBA to Northland FM. The Corporation gave the following grounds for its objection:  $\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{$ 

1. While previous STBAs conferred no exclusive rights to

any operator, some protection was sought by the Corporation in view of its 7 year history of summer STBAs in the Bay of Islands.

- 2. The Northland FM proposal amounted to a duplication of the Radio New Zealand "Bay Radio" authorisation and added no value other than a choice of transmission.
- 3. Approval of the Northland FM proposal would adversely affect the BCNZ revenue base.
- 4. Any deficiency in Northland FM's coverage could be resolved by the installation in the Bay of Islands of a permanent relay of its Whangarei-based programme.

The BCNZ objection was referred to Northland FM for a comment by 25 November.

The Tribunal received on 27 October a separate submission expressing some concern over the prospect of 2 summer radio stations operating side by side in the Bay of Islands, with the risk of neither being sufficiently profitable to encourage future years' activity.

- On 9 November the Tribunal received Northland FM's response to the BCNZ objections, which made the following points:
- 1. Northland FM agreed with the BCNZ view that there were no exclusive rights to STBAs. There was also precedent from the summer of 1979–80 for 2 operators undertaking concurrent STBAs in the Bay of Islands, although on that occasion both operators were AM stations.
- 2. Northland FM was committed to the extension of its service to Northland, including a specialist service to the Bay of Islands, which was forshadowed in its original application.
- 3. FM transmission of a music-based programme had superior characteristics which amounted to more than simple duplication of an AM service. Many tourists and holiday-makers from Auckland and the Waikato would be familiar with the choice between AM and FM services.
- 4. Northland FM had not opposed the Corporation's application but the Corporation had produced no evidence of the adverse affect on its revenue base from the proposed FM broadcast.
- 5. Both AM and FM coverage had deficiencies in the Bay of Islands. Northland FM was in the process of improving its permanent FM service to the area as provided for in its warrant, but a relay of the Whangarei-based programme would ignore the influx of holiday-makers and the increase in local events in the Bay of Islands over the summer period.

The Northland FM application was approved by the Tribunal on 11 November and confirmed after reconsideration on 26 November. On 22 January 1988 the Tribunal received a request from the Corporation for a written statement of its reasons for granting the authorisation to Northland FM.

#### Reasons for Decision

These applications were somewhat different from previous instances when the Tribunal has been called upon to rule between competing applicants for STBAs during the summer holiday period.

Both applicants are permanent warrant holders in the area, both sought to augment their permanent services on the AM and FM band respectively with short-term authorisations in the Bay of Islands.

Both proposed significant local origination while relaying other programme services during off-peak hours.

Both applicants accepted the Tribunal's frequently stated policy that previous STBAs confer no exclusive rights to any operator. Nor, in this case, was there any element of a new operator seeking to "warm-up" the area with a view to a subsequent permanent warrant application.

Nor did either applicant seek to broadcast in the pre-Christmas

peak advertising period, when the Tribunal has seen some justification in protecting the revenue expectations of the permanent operator in a market.

In considering the application by Northland FM the Tribunal had to have regard to the fact that it had already approved the authorisation sought by the BCNZ and to consider whether that approval of itself justified the rejection of the application by Northland FM.

To confer the protection sought by the Corporation in the light of its 7-year history of summer broadcasts in the Bay of Islands would be to confer a right to previous STBA operators which the Tribunal has consistently declined. But that issue was reconsidered in respect of the present instance.

We concluded that no prior rights have been acquired by previous authorisations or by an early application in the Bay of Islands.

To accept the argument that an FM music-based programme added no value to the audience other than a choice of transmission would be to deny the whole thrust of the development of FM services in New Zealand, contrary to the Tribunal Report on FM broadcasting and subsequent government policy.

While approval of the Northland FM application may have had some adverse effect on the BCNZ revenue base, the Corporation proffered no evidence on this.

As for extension of Northland FM's service into the Bay of Islands by the installation of a permanent relay of its Whangarei-based programme, the Tribunal considered the summer authorisation might well encourage and advance such development. (This has subsequently proved to be the case.)

Considering the application in terms of section 80 of the Broadcasting Act, the Tribunal determined that the public interest and the needs of the locality would be best served by approving both applications, leaving to the operators the final decision on whether to proceed under the terms of their authorisations.

The Tribunal had been offered no evidence of the economic effect on the warrant holders' normal operations. The effect on the holder of the authorisation which happened to have been granted earlier but was not yet operating was not regarded as a prime issue.

## Radio Interference Notice

## Radio Regulations 1987

## The Radio Interference Notice 1988

Pursuant to regulation 36 of the Radio Regulations 1987\*, the Acting Secretary of Trade and Industry hereby gives the following notice.

## Notice

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Radio Interference Notice 1988.
- (2) Except as provided by subclause (3) of this clause, this notice shall come into force on the day after its publication in the *Gazette*.
- (3) Clauses 7 and 8 of this notice shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1988.
- **2. Interpretation**—(1) In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,—
  - "CISPR" means the International Special Committee on Radio Interference of the International Electrotechnical Commission:
  - "Noise field" means the radio frequency energy generated by and directly radiated by an electrical device as a result of its operation:

- "Test site" means an area suitable for interference evaluation as defined in CISPR publication 11, 1975.
- (2) A reference in this notice to a CISPR publication includes a reference to every amendment to that publication, which is in effect on the date on which this notice comes into force.
- (3) The limits specified in this notice shall be applied using the following interference measuring apparatus and measurement methods conforming to the specifications of CISPR:
- (a) Interference shall be measured by equipment employing a quasi-peak type detector conforming to the characteristics defined in section 1 of CISPR publication 16, 1987.
- (b) Voltage measurements in the frequency range 0.15 MHz to 30 MHz shall be made using an artificial mains V-network conforming to the requirements defined in section 2 of CISPR publication 16, 1987.
- (c) Power measurements in the frequency range 30 MHz to 1000 MHz shall be made by using an absorbing clamp placed around the mains supply cord of the apparatus at a point of maximum absorption and calibrated by substitution with a known source, as defined in section 2 of CISPR publication 16, 1987.
- (d) Field strength measurements of directly radiated interference shall be made using the antenna characteristics and methods defined in section 3 of CISPR publication 16, 1987.
- 3. Limits within which interfering equipment to which CISPR publication 14, 1985 applies must be

- suppressed—(1) Interfering equipment to which CISPR publication 14, 1985 applies by virtue of clause 1 of that publication (being household electrical equipment, portable tools (excluding those with a power in excess of 2 kW) and other electrical apparatus which may cause interference to radio reception, such as office machines, cine or slide projectors, electric toys, recording apparatus, milking machines, motor-driven electromedical apparatus, etc., but not being those producing high frequency radiation for heating and therapeutic purposes or separate motors sold as such), shall, to the extent that that publication applies to the equipment, be suppressed so as to comply in all respects with the provisions of that publication.
- (2) For the purpose of determining whether interfering equipment to which subclause (1) of this clause applies complies with subclause (1) of this clause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 14, 1985.
- 4. Limits within broadcast sound and television receivers to which CISPR publication 13, 1975 applies must be suppressed—(1) Interfering equipment to which CISPR publication 13, 1975 applies by virtue of clause 1 of that publication (being broadcast sound and television receivers), shall, to the extent that that publication applies to the equipment, be suppressed so as to comply in all respects with the provisions of that publication.
- (2) For the purpose of determining whether interfering equipment to which subclause (1) of this clause applies complies with that subclause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 13, 1975.
- 5. Limits within which overhead power lines to which CISPR publication 18-2, 1986 applies must be suppressed—(1) Overhead power lines to which CISPR publication 19-2, 1986 applies by virtue of clause 1 of that publication shall be suppressed to the limits specified in the First Schedule to this notice.
- (2) For the purpose of determining whether interfering equipment to which subclause (1) of this clause applies complies with that subclause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 18–2, 1986.
- 6. Limits within which industrial, scientific and medical radio-frequency equipment to which CISPR publication 11, 1975 (including supplement 11A, 1976) applies must be suppressed—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, interfering equipment to which CISPR publication 11, 1975 (including supplement 11A, 1976) applies by virtue of clause 1 of that publication (being industrial scientific and medical radio-frequency equipment, but not being radio-frequency excited arc welding equipment), shall, to the extent that that publication applies to the equipment, be suppressed so as to comply in all respects with the provisions of that publication.
- (2) For the purposes of subclause 4.4 of CISPR publication 11, 1975 (including supplement 11A, 1976) the free-radiation frequencies applying for the purposes of subclause (1) of this clause shall be as specified in the Second Schedule to this notice.
- (3) Except as provided in subclause (4) of this clause, for the purpose of determining whether interfering equipment to which subclause (1) of this clause applies complies with that subclause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 11, 1975 (including supplement 11A, 1976).
- (4) For the purpose of determining whether microwave ovens to which subclause (1) of this clause applies (being microwave ovens with radio frequency power of 5 kW or less) comply with that subclause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 19, 1983.

- 7. Limits within which fluorescent lamps and luminaries to which CISPR publication 15, 1985 applies must be suppressed—(1) Interfering equipment to which CISPR publication 15, 1985 applies by virtue of clause 1 of that publication (being fluorescent lamps and luminaries), shall, to the extent that that publication applies to the equipment, be suppressed so as to comply in all respects with the provisions of that publication.
- (2) For the purpose of determining whether interfering equipment to which subclause (1) of this clause applies complies with that subclause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 15, 1985.
- 8. Limits within which information technology equipment to which CISPR publication 22, 1985 applies must be suppressed—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, interfering equipment to which CISPR publication 22, 1985 applies by virtue of clause 1 of that publication (being information technology equipment as defined in subclause 2.1 of that publication), shall, to the extent that that publication applies to the equipment, be suppressed so as to comply in all respects with the provisions of that publication relating to class B equipment.
- (2) Notwithstanding that interfering equipment to which this clause applies does not comply with subclause (1) of this clause, if the Secretary is satisfied that the interfering equipment complies in all respects with the provisions of CISPR publication 22, 1985 relating to class A equipment, the Secretary may issue a certificate of compliance under regulation 37 of the regulations in relation to the interfering equipment, subject to such conditions as to the uses to which such interfering equipment may be put, and the locations at which such interfering equipment may be installed, as the Secretary thinks fit.
- (3) For the purpose of determining whether interfering equipment to which this clause applies complies with this clause, the equipment shall be tested, and the results of such tests shall be interpreted, in accordance with CISPR publication 22, 1985.

Explanatory Note

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice prescribes limits within which radio frequency energy produced by interfering equipment (as defined in regulation 35 of the Radio Regulations 1987) of the classes specified in the notice must be suppressed. With the exception of clauses 7 and 8, the notice comes into force on the day after it is published in the *Gazette*. Clauses 7 and 8 come into force on 1 September 1988.

The notice prescribes limits by reference to standards issued by the International Special Committee on Radio Interference of the International Electrotechnical Commission.
